## Galiano 'connection' surfaces at Summer Festival of the Arts

Salt Spring's Summer Festival of the Arts unveils a Galiano Island connection later this week.

The festival has scheduled an evening of poetry featuring current Galiano resident Dorothy Livesay, and a one-woman stage show written and performed by Carolyn Sadowska, a former Galiano resident.

The evening of poetry will be held at Off Centre Stage on Sunday, July 19, beginning at 8:30 pm. Tickets are \$5.

Livesay, a poet of powerful social commitment and human compassion, will highlight the evening. A major voice in Canadian poetry, she has won many awards, including the Governor-General's Award — twice — for her books, *Night & Day* and *Poems for People*. To date, she has published 20-plus books.

The Festival of the Arts program says Livesay's writings combine "both passion and form, and her range in poetry moves easily from eloquent lyric to the dramatic, narrative sequence."

Born in Winnipeg in 1909, Livesay saw her first poem published in 1922. She later worked as a journalist, teacher, social worker, editor, broadcaster and university professor.

The *Evening of Poetry* will also feature a performance piece written and performed by Patricia Young, Jill Swartz, Linda Rodgers and Gail Harris.

Their work, *Heart on the Run*, was originally produced under the stage direction of Kathleen Foreman and first performed in April, 1987, at the Grand Central Cafe in Victoria. It later appeared as a part of Theatre B.C.'s Mainstage 87 festival.

"These four poets," the Festival of the Arts program notes,

"are determined to get those words off the page and make them come alive in their wildly theatrical and passionately poetic story of a runaway heart."

Carolyn Sadowska brings her show, *Elizabeth In The Sky With Diamonds*, to Off Centre Stage this Thursday and Friday, July 16 and 17. On the same bill will be *Preparing*, a one-woman performance starring Jolanta Pyra and directed by Keith Digby. Showtime is 8:30 pm, tickets are \$6.

Sadowska's *Elizabeth In The Sky With Diamonds* is a one-woman show which presents the audience with an unusually candid Queen of England. Considered to be one of the best impersonators of Queen Elizabeth II, Sadowska has made a profession out of her portrayals of Britain's reigning monarch. Royal Family historian Hugh Montgomery-Massingbeld describes Sadowska's Queen to be "extraordinarily good, remarkable."

Born in England and raised in Quebec, Sadowska is multi-talented. Along with her impersonation skills, she is an improvisational comedian, commercial illustrator and poet.

*Preparing*, written by Beverly Simms, is a one-woman exploration of a changing world. Jolanta Pyra, who grew up in Poland and arrived in Victoria via Toronto in the late 1970s, unites humour and pathos in her 30-minute portrayal of Jeannie, a woman moving from childhood to old age preparing for the highlights of her life.

Following in the tradition established earlier this month by Conrad Flapps and his extraordinary flying machine, and by Norman Foote's puppets and songs, Serret brings to life a delightful and whimsical character, *Le Capitaine Santoor*, who will welcome audiences aboard a musical flying carpet for a trip to the world of dreams.

Serret takes to the stage at the Salt Spring Elementary School Activity Centre this Saturday, July 18, beginning at 1 pm. Tickets are \$3 and available at *et cetera*.

The matinee program continues the following Saturday — July 25 — with Gumboot Lollipop, and concludes August 1 with *Tales of the Orient*, presented by Kaleidoscope Story-telling Theatre. All performances are \$3.

A new display of local artworks has been set up at Off Centre Stage, in conjunction with the Salt Spring Island Summer Festival of the Arts.

On display in the gallery-bistro

There, a number of 10-foot by three-foot banners have been arranged to enhance the space. The banners are the work of local artists, who volunteered their time and efforts to contribute to the festival's physical setting.

## Donovan, Connie Kaldor highlight third week of island arts festival

Concerts by Connie Kaldor, Donovan and Tony Bird are among the highlights of the third week of performances presented by the Salt Spring Island Summer Festival of the Arts.

• Kaldor, with six albums and a Juno award nomination to her credit, plays tonight (Wednesday, July 15) at 8:30 pm in the Salt Spring Elementary School Activity Centre. Admission is \$8.50.

A multi-talented artist, Kaldor is a former actress turned singer-songwriter. Her last two albums, *One of These Days* and *Moonlight Grocery*, were released on her own label, Coyote Records.

• Donovan, whose mystical music was a hallmark of the flower-power philosophy of the 1960s, takes to the Activity Centre stage on Saturday, July 18. Opening for Donovan is Delta blues guitarist Ken Hamm, accompanied by Bruce Everett on harmonica and flute. Showtime is 8:30 pm, tickets are \$12.50 — and still available at *et cetera*, despite rumours to the contrary.

Donovan, whose hits included *Mellow Yellow* and *Sunshine Superman*, once dressed in love beads and flowing white gowns and played on stages strewn with flowers. Now in his 40s, his voice is still strong and his music still enjoyable.

Hamm, meanwhile, has made several appearances on Salt Spring Island, entertaining audiences with his superb command of the blues.

• Tony Bird, a native of Malawi, South Africa, entertains at Off Centre Stage on Wednesday, July 22, beginning at 8:30 pm. Tickets are \$7.

Moving to England in the early 1960s, Bird became a part of the country's then-dynamic folk circuit. He later travelled through the Mediterranean, the Persian Gulf and around the coast of Africa before returning home to Malawi.

Bird's music reflects those

diverse experiences, combining influences from the African music he heard in his youth and the sounds of his later travels. The *Festival of the Arts* program notes that Bird's songs are of love — of a woman, a country, mankind. They are not strictly protest songs, but illuminate the problems of Africa, humanity and human rights.

Bird, who now lives in New York City and tours the U.S. and Canada extensively, has released two albums on the CBS label: *Tony Bird* and *Tony Bird of Paradise*.

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# Lautrec play gives viewer snapshots of a tortured life

I'll bet you know it when you see it: dancing girls, Moulin Rouge, Chat Noir, Montmartre, the lively life of the city of light.

We romanticize the images this man has left us of the Belle Epoque — the celebration of culture and life which was crushed by the Great War. But nowhere in his images do we see moral judgement or sentimentality — simply a joy in the eccentric individuals which made up the substrata, the "low life" of bars, music halls and bordellos of Paris in the 1880s - 1890s.

Lautrec does not paint the sordid side of these lives; he was one of them, and from this life drew inspiration. His work is the diary of the insider, not the prying anthropologist but the poet or storyteller of the tribe.

Salt Spring Festival of the Arts presented the play *Lautrec* last weekend at Off Centre Stage. The work, in two acts, was written by Harvey Ostroff and *Lautrec* was played by Paul Beckett. If we are to believe the portrayal, we find that the artist was a willing inmate of disreputable environs. He was a refugee from the privileged class which, in its rigid social structure, had no role for a disabled dwarf with his artistic temperament.

The first act introduces us to the artist at one of his favourite bars, where we learn of his disability, his passion for women, his dismal self-esteem and need to be recognized and accepted as a great artist. We see his creative energy gradually dissipating as he is caught up in self-destruction.

In the second act he has returned from the sanatorium where he had been persuaded to go to purge his alcoholism and to mend his ways. Although he has finally achieved some recognition he is not content to draw conventional pretty pictures and soon resumes his past behaviour, to his eventual destruction. Paul Beckett, in this role, cannot be accused of lacking intensity, and the script certainly gives us the portrayal we are expecting of a tormented artist sacrificing everything for his work. Although everyone seemed delighted by the performance, one must ask if they were due to sympathy for the stereotyped character or as they should be for an insightful script.

There was something missing here. Cross-sections of this man's life — snapshots — are too superficial to keep the

performance fresh in our minds for days. Perhaps it is because so much of who this artist was is wrapped up in the people he was close to. Failing to make them more tangible sabotages our appreciation.

Although colourful graphics and slide projections helped, it is still not flesh and blood, and Paul Beckett's able storytelling did not fill up the blanks in a script that lacked depth.

## Beaver Point art school to run August program

A summer art school for children will be set up in early August at the Beaver Point Hall on Salt Spring Island.

The school will feature five sessions from Monday, August 10, to Friday, August 14. Sessions will operate from 9 am to noon, and each will follow a different theme:

- Monday, August 10 — Creating with found materials.
- Tuesday, August 11 — Print-making.
- Wednesday, August 12 — Creating with clay and plaster.
- Thursday, August 13 — Mask-making.
- Friday, August 14 — Self-created environment.

Organizers say the emphasis of the school will be on individual and group creativity, "not on, for instance, producing specific pieces of pottery."

Each session will be conducted as a workshop, and entry will be limited to a maximum of 20 participants. The preferred age range is six to 13 years; younger children must be accompanied by a parent.

Cost per session is \$5, while the price for all five workshops is \$20.

Instructors for the course are: Ian Thomas, an art teacher at Camosun College; Naomi Potter, a recent Gulf Islands Secondary School graduate whose artistic endeavours earned her a Com-

munity Arts Council award at the school's graduation ceremonies; and Bonnie Kreye, who teaches art in the local school system.

Pre-registration for the five sessions takes place at Beaver Point Hall on August 4, between 7:30 pm and 9 pm. In addition, registrations will be accepted at the hall between August 10 and 14 for workshops taking place the same day — provided the limit of 20 students per session has not been reached.

Organizers note that all basic art supplies will be provided at the hall. However, they ask that participants bring with them a brush, scissors, old work clothes, a cardboard box and a snack.

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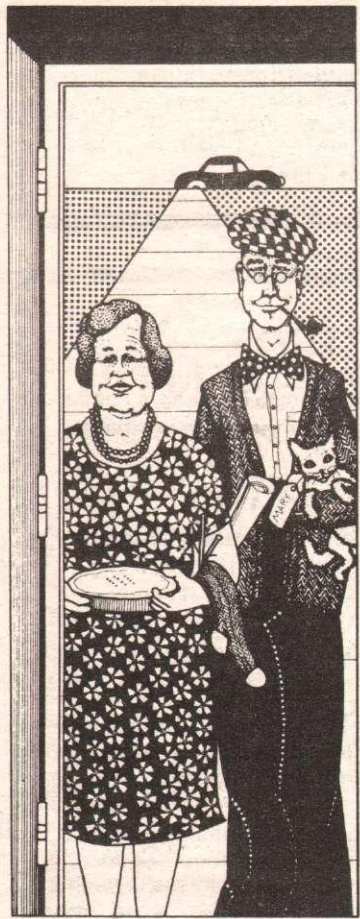

# Transportation major problem facing senior citizens



The greatest difficulty facing senior citizens living in B.C.'s smaller communities is a lack of adequate transportation services, says a university professor studying the needs of the elderly in outlying areas of the province.

Gerald Hodge, a professor with the University of B.C.'s School of Community and Regional Planning, was commissioned by the provincial ministry of municipal affairs to identify difficulties faced by senior citizens in smaller communities, and to examine how well those problems are being solved by government and service agencies.

The study's findings, based on surveys and interviews with senior citizens, government officials and public agencies in small towns throughout B.C., pinpointed four major problems facing the elderly in outlying regions:

- availability of transportation;
- access to medical care;
- help with home maintenance and repairs; and
- provision of information.

Of those four difficulties, Hodge said inadequate transportation services is the most pressing, since it contributes directly to the other three problems.

"The need for transportation is

overwhelming because it's linked to so many other activities," he said. "In 98 per cent of B.C.'s small towns, no public transportation or taxi services exist. When the nearest doctor is in the next town and food stores are located miles away, this becomes a serious problem for elderly citizens."

The study, Hodge noted, found that at least one-quarter of senior citizens do not own or drive a vehicle.

**'One quarter of seniors do not drive.'**

When transportation becomes a difficulty, Hodge continued, seniors lose easy access to medical care. They must also depend heavily on services like *Meals On Wheels* and home nursing care which, in some parts of the province, cannot meet demands.

Equally important, the professor noted, is that inadequate transportation services can remove seniors from the mainstream of community life. House-

bound, they are cut off from the information network that can supply them with leads to various types of services, from home repairs to lawn upkeep.

Lack of adequate transportation can even force some seniors to abandon smaller communities in favour of larger centres, which offer a greater range of services, Hodge indicated. But this can be upsetting for seniors from smaller communities, since most of them have been born and raised in small towns.

Hodge told *Driftwood* that while his study did not cover unincorporated areas of the province, he believes the difficulties facing seniors in smaller towns and cities may be magnified in regions not governed under a municipal structure.

"The reason is that a municipal government is a pipeline for funds and support from the province," he said. "Provinces and municipalities have a constitutional linkage which can channel funds and other resources to community groups to provide services for the elderly."

However, he added that municipalities in general have done a poor job of providing services to senior citizens. "Although there

are exceptions, we found that the needs of the elderly are not being met very effectively in most small communities. Little communication exists between the local government and community groups who provide services for the elderly, and in most small towns resources for seniors programs are very limited."

Hodge noted that the needs and concerns of seniors often go unheard or unanswered in the province, even though the elderly make up as much as 40 per cent of the population in many small towns.

## Former director dies

Former regional director for Salt Spring Island, Victor Howard (Mike) Clement, died suddenly on Wednesday, July 8, while on a brief holiday. He was 71 years of age.

He was engaged in the construction industry all his life and as quantity surveyor and estimator he was associated with a number of major projects in Canada and the United States, as well as in England.

Following his service in the British army during the Second World War, he moved to Canada with his family and except for one break, when he returned to England for a number of construction projects, he was in British Columbia.

He took an active interest in local affairs on Salt Spring Island and, earlier, in Saanich municipality. He was named to the Salt Spring Island seat on the Capital Regional Board following the death of the previous incumbent, Jim Bryce.

His death marks the loss of the second former island regional director in two weeks. The late George Heinekey had filled that role several years previously.

He leaves his wife, Josephine, at home, Rourke Road, Ganges; two sons, Andrew and Ian, and a daughter, Ann; three granddaughters and a sister-in-law, Margaret, of White Rock.

Funeral service took place in St. Mark's Church, Central, on Sunday, July 12, with the Rev. James Koester officiating. Interment followed in the Anglican Cemetery, Upper Ganges Road.

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# Five bands slated to perform at upcoming country music fest

Country music fans in the Gulf Islands will have the opportunity to hear five bands at the upcoming Salt Spring Island Arts and Crafts Country Music Festival.

The festival, to be held on the Henry Caldwell property at Walker Hook, is slated to get underway August 1, according to organizer Reg Young. The list of festival performers includes Elmer Tippy and Super Country, Marilyn Schedel and Family Tradition, Wayne Peters and Home Brew, the Reload Band and Night Shift — all of whom are from the Lower Mainland and Vancouver Island.

Young, a Salt Spring resident, is no stranger to the concert business. He has his own band, Duke and the Ducktails, and has organized successful concerts in Victoria. The Salt Spring Arts and Crafts Country Music Festival is the second concert he has organized on this island.

Young's first Salt Spring concert featured rock and roll performers, but he is now convinced a larger portion of the island's population enjoys country and western music.

Young wants to involve islanders in the two-day festival, and that's why he is inviting local

craftsmen to sell their works there — free of charge.

"One criticism last time was that there wasn't enough involvement by islanders," he said last week. "That's why I'm trying to get the arts and crafts people involved in this one. They're invited to set up stalls at the concert, which is something we're not letting off-islanders do. We've got local people to sell food at it as well, although we had to bring in a few from off-island because there simply weren't enough here."

To date, between eight and 10 island craftsmen have indicated they will 'set up shop' at the festival, but Young hopes more will participate. Anyone interested should contact him at 537-4279.

Young — who needs attendance of approximately 800 to "break even" on the festival — hopes to draw more than 1,000 to the island for the two-day event, which is being advertised throughout Vancouver Island and the Lower Mainland. Tickets are available at VTC-CBO ticket outlets, the Hillside Ticket Centre in Victoria, the Rutherford Mall in Nanaimo, *et cetera* on Salt Spring, and from Young (P.O. Box 673, Ganges).

There is free parking for campers, tents and trailers on the festival site, and off-shore boat mooring is available.

To date, according to Young, feedback from the Nanaimo ticket outlet has been good. He said he has not yet contacted other outlets for their totals.

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## CAPITAL REGIONAL DISTRICT

Pursuant to Section 769 of the Municipal Act, the following By-law No. 1552, cited as "Noise Suppression By-law (North and South Pender Island) No. 1, 1987", is hereby published as at third reading and prior to submission to the Ministry of Municipal Affairs.

### A BY-LAW TO PROVIDE FOR THE ABATEMENT AND CONTROL OF OBJECTIONABLE NOISE IN THE ELECTORAL AREAS OF THE CAPITAL REGIONAL DISTRICT

**WHEREAS** the Capital Regional District pursuant to Section 932(c) and (d) of the Municipal Act is empowered to regulate or prohibit the making or causing of noise or sounds as specified therein within the Electoral Areas of the Capital Regional District;

**AND WHEREAS** the Capital Regional District was granted Supplementary Letters Patent dated 3rd September, 1981, to exercise the powers of a Municipal Council in respect to the powers set out under the above sections of the Municipal Act;

**NOW THEREFORE** the Board of the Capital Regional District in open meeting assembled, enacts as follows:

- In this by-law:
    - "Animal" includes a dog, cat or other domestic animal but does not include a farm animal.
    - "Electoral Areas" mean that portion of the Outer Gulf Islands Electoral Area consisting of North Pender Island and South Pender Island including all foreshore.
    - "Foreshore" means that area of the shoreline between the mean high tide mark and the mean low tide mark.
    - "Bird" includes ornamental bird, pigeon, dove and show-bird, but does not include poultry.
    - "Person" includes a corporation, partnership or individual.
  - Within the electoral areas:
    - No person shall shout, use a megaphone or make other noise in, or at, or on, streets, wharves, docks, piers, railway stations, or other public places which disturbs or tends to disturb the quiet, peace, rest, enjoyment, comfort or convenience of the neighbourhood or of persons in the vicinity thereof.
    - No person shall make, cause to be made, or continue to make, any noise or sound in or on a highway or elsewhere in the Electoral Areas which disturbs or tends to disturb the quiet, peace, rest, enjoyment, comfort or convenience of the neighbourhood or of persons at or near the source of such noise or sound.
    - Without limiting the generality of the prohibition contained in Section 2 hereof:
      - No person shall play any radio, phonograph, television receiving set, tape, cartridge, musical instrument or sound amplification device whether in or upon private premises or in any public place in such a manner or with such a volume as to disturb the quiet, peace, rest, enjoyment or comfort of individuals or the public.
      - No person shall keep or harbour any animal or caged bird which by making frequent or loud noise disturbs or tends to disturb the quiet, peace, rest, enjoyment or comfort of individuals or the public.
      - No person shall operate on private property any automobile, truck, motorcycle, trail bike, bus, motorized hang glider, or other vehicle which by reason of disrepair, lack of a sufficient muffler, or any other cause, creates noise or sound tending to disturb the quiet, peace, rest, enjoyment or comfort of individuals or the public.
    - No person shall operate a compressor, steam engine, or internal combustion engine which, through lack of sufficient muffler or any other cause, creates noise or sound tending to disturb the quiet, peace, rest, enjoyment or comfort of individuals or the public.
    - No person shall load or unload any truck, wagon, or motor vehicle in or upon any public or private place or premises in such a manner as to disturb the quiet, peace, rest, enjoyment or comfort of individuals or the public before the hours of 7 o'clock in the forenoon or after sunset or 9 o'clock in the afternoon, whichever is the latest.
    - No person shall construct, demolish, alter or repair a building, or excavate or fill any land in such a manner or with such volume as to disturb the quiet, peace, rest, enjoyment or comfort of individuals or the public before the hours of 7 o'clock in the forenoon or after sunset or 9 o'clock in the afternoon, whichever is the latest.
  - The provisions of this by-law shall not apply to:
    - any vehicle of the Police or Fire Department or of any other public body, or any ambulance or any public service or emergency vehicle while engaged in a service of public convenience or necessity;
    - the sounding of a horn or other signalling device where such sounding is properly and necessarily used as a danger or warning signal;
    - the use, in a reasonable manner, of any apparatus or mechanism for the amplification of the human voice or of music in a public park or square in connection with any duly authorized public meeting, public celebration or other public gathering;
    - the use of bells or chimes by churches, schools or any public body;
    - the operation, in a reasonable manner, of farm equipment.
  - No person, and including but without limiting the generality hereof, no owner, tenant or occupier of private premises, shall do any act or suffer or permit any act or thing to be done in contravention of this by-law.
    - Every person who contravenes this by-law by doing any act which it forbids, or omitting to do any act which it requires to be done, is guilty of an offence and is liable, on summary conviction, to a fine of not more than \$500.00. A separate offence shall be deemed to be committed upon each day during and in which the contravention occurs or continues.
    - The penalties imposed under subsection (2) hereof shall be in addition to and not in substitution for any other penalty or remedy imposed by this by-law or any other statute, law or regulation.

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## Galiano weavers' exhibition noted for hand-made crafts

The summer exhibition and sale of the Galiano Weavers and Spinners is noted for its selection of hand-made items in a variety of crafts. Those with foresight may stock up on Christmas gifts from knitted, sewn and woven goods ranging from children's toys to traycloths, hand towels, afghans and rugs.

It is always exciting to see a new craft and this year a stall was devoted to a beautiful display of more than 40 Japanese dolls, all exquisitely made by Mina Silver. Mina lived in Japan from 1968 to 1979 while her husband, Doug, was a pilot for Canadian Pacific and later Japan Airlines.

A Japanese teacher with little knowledge of English would come to Mina's home and demonstrate how to make dolls' heads, hands and feet, and then clothing which could be either painted, embroidered or decorated with glass beads.

For a Westerner, life in Japan can be difficult to understand. The Japanese personality is complex and the Japanese language complicated, as it varies according to the many different classes in Japanese society and also the sex of the speaker: for example, there are 27 ways to count to 10, depending on who is talking and the subject of the conversation.

Mina's dolls mirror many facets of Japanese life in the past. There are musicians, actresses, samurais, mistresses and prostitutes, old people and many children. The dolls and the Japanese furniture in her Cayzer Road home will continually remind of those 11 years spent in Japan.

## Willful deceit

I was wrong. Not another British farce. British, yes, as fish and chips wrapped in newspaper. But hard to categorize. A whodunit, a mystery, a comedy, a period piece — to some extent, all of these — but first and foremost a melodrama. Celia Challoner's first production was wisely and very successfully played for the laughs. Murder is treated as a joke. A full house roared with laughter, hissed at the villains and thoroughly enjoyed seeing local notables play the fool. Kathy Sharp as Angelique provided the continuity which held the play together. Perhaps a little more 'ham' would have been permissible.

Stars of the evening were John Hales as a lisping, not-as-dumb-as-he-looks leading man, and Jim Ripley as a died-in-the-black,

villanous butler. Supporting these three were Tona Von Rezori, Margaret Howell, Ian Hooley and a most unthinkable British Bobby, played by veteran Bill Callaway.

Parental guidance is advised for this play. Parts of the script bordered on the bawdy. Children should advise their parents that if their ideas about crime and morality are old-fashioned, they might be shocked by the dialogue. However, since a number of children at the opening night had allowed one of their parents to actually be in the play, it is unlikely that the modern Galiano child would really forbid their parents to attend *Willful Deceit*.

Bill Norton. In second was the duo of Dorothy Henshaw and John Dempster.

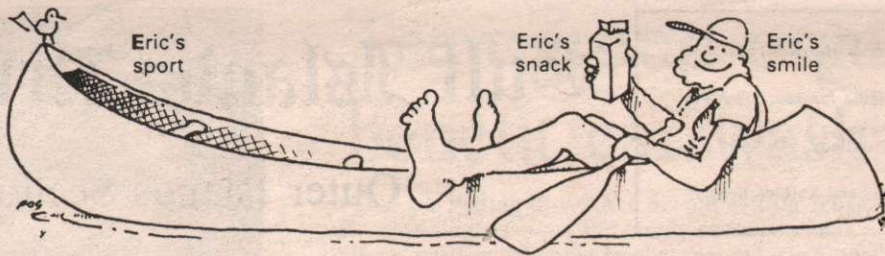

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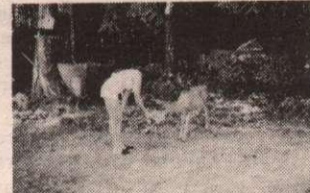

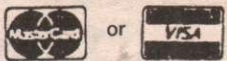

## Aquaculture topic of six local meetings

A series of six public meetings called to discuss aquaculture in the Islands Trust area continues this week on four Gulf Islands.

Two of the six meetings have already been held — on Salt Spring Island (Monday) and Mayne Island (Tuesday).

The remaining meetings are set for today (Wednesday) on Pender Island, Thursday on Galiano Island, Friday on Denman Island and Saturday on Lasqueti Island.

The Pender Islands meeting is at the North Pender Community Hall, from 2 pm to 8 pm. Thursday's Galiano Island meeting is at the South Galiano Community Hall from 1 pm to 7 pm.

The meetings are part of a study commissioned by the provincial ministry of forests and lands. They follow the collection of opinions on possible foreshore conflicts and will lead to production of a map showing suitable and unsuitable locations for aquaculture ventures within the Trust area.

The first stage of the process — collecting opinions — involved asking various foreshore users to designate on large maps of the Trust region those areas they believe would be suitable for aquaculture, and areas where they believe a fish farm would conflict with their uses of the foreshore.

Groups participating in that stage of the process included sailing clubs, recreational canoeists, commercial fishermen and the Council of Forest Industries.

The public meeting stage now underway seeks opinion about the areas user groups have marked as either suitable or unsuitable for aquaculture. Input collected from the meetings is to be used for a final drafting of the map.

The study is expected to be completed at the end of July. At that time, a moratorium on the issuing of new aquaculture licenses within the Trust area is to be lifted by the provincial government.

The moratorium, and the study now underway, were initiated by the provincial government following last winter's Gillespie inquiry into the aquaculture industry.

## Air show on target

Preparations are underway for the first major airshow in 30 years at Victoria's Pat Bay Airport.

Also included on the event agenda is the all-Canadian aerobatic team, the *Ray Ban Golds*, who fly Pitts S-2B biplanes.

Air show organizers said recently they plan to offer tickets to the event through a Salt Spring outlet, although arrangements have yet to be confirmed. For further information, contact the air show office at 655-1144.

## Wood heat a bonus

Homeowners using certain types of wood-heating systems will qualify for a discounted rate for interruptible electricity, the provincial government said last week.

The announcement, from the office of Energy Minister Jack Davis, expands the rate discount program beyond gas and propane heating systems.

Details of the program are still being developed by B.C. Hydro, in consultation with industry and producers of wood-burning heating systems, the province said. However, it added that an application to establish the discount system will be made to the B.C. Utilities Commission early this September, to allow implementation of the program by November 1, 1987.

The energy ministry said conversions of home heating systems to include wood-burning backups would also become eligible for a \$2,500 financing program operated by Hydro.

To qualify for the electricity discounts, customers will have to install a separate meter to record consumption of interruptible electricity supplies for water and space heating. Homeowners must also have a wood-burning heating system which can provide "essential backup capability," the ministry said.

Customers using wood as a backup will also be required to sign a waiver accepting all responsibility for any difficulties arising when the electricity is interrupted.



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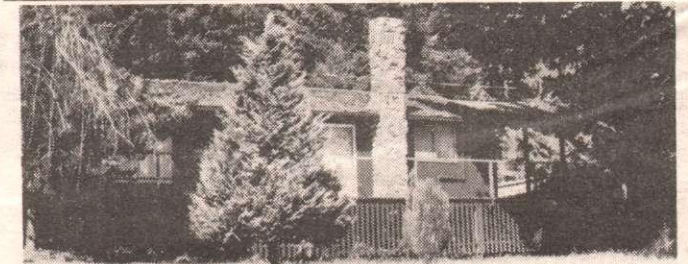
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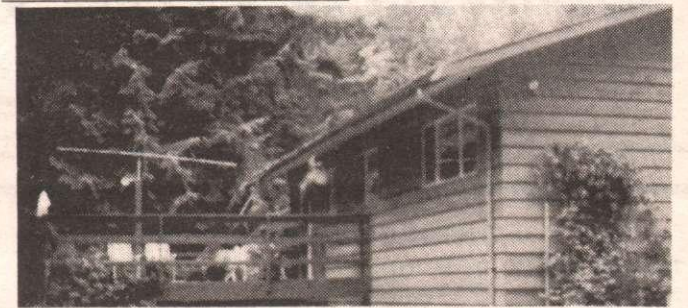
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## Victoria residents bring experience to Salt Spring recreation programs

The day camps being offered on Salt Spring this summer are open to children between the ages of six to 12 years. They operate Monday through Friday from 8:30 am to 3 pm at a number of local schools. The camps have three counsellors.

According to Mahoney, these camps are not only fun but educational. In addition to playing games, the children participate in drama and crafts.

Last week they went fishing for crabs and shiners, and are also learning about wilderness survival. "They are always learning something," Mahoney noted.

In addition to summer camp, local children have the option of taking a variety of swimming classes this year.

Twenty-four year old Mark Dodd is the recreation commission's aquatic director this summer. He first became interested in teaching swimming while working in Fort Nelson.

"I got into it by accident, actually," he says. "I took a Bronze Medallion class because they needed an extra person."

Dodd enjoyed the course so much that he elected to make a career in the field of aquatics. He comes to Salt Spring from Victoria, where he has worked for both the Oak Bay and Panorama pools as a lifeguard and assistant.

Dodd encourages local residents to participate in the Salt Spring swimming program. He notes that the recreation commis-

sion is offering the complete Red Cross swimming program for all types of swimmers. There are even classes for pre-schoolers and adults.

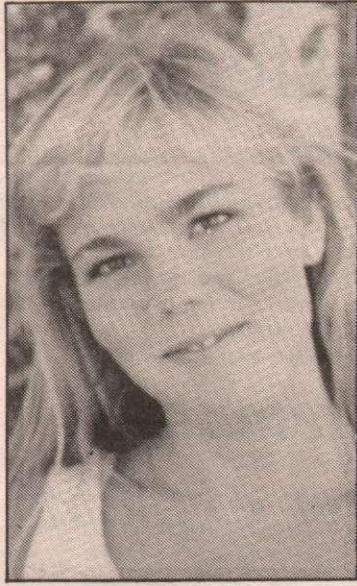
"We're getting into adult classes now, everything from beginners to advanced swimming," he said.

All swimming instruction is being carried out at private pools. Island residents have donated the use of their pools to the swim program, which in turn pays for chemicals used in the pools.

Dodd said that to date, response to the Salt Spring swimming programs has been "great".

"Over the summer, we should have a couple of hundred people involved," he noted.

Both Mahoney and Dodds plan to return to Victoria at the end of the summer. Mahoney will be returning to school and Dodds will continue his career in aquatics. "I'll stay in the field," he says. "It's the only job I've had where I liked going to work."

# Hydro asked to rescind staff, workload transfers

A Salt Spring Island group wants B.C. Hydro to cancel its pending transfer of some Gulf Islands employees and operations to Nanaimo.

The group, organized by realtor Arvid Chalmers and operating as a sub-committee of the Salt Spring Island Chamber of Commerce, met last week in Ganges to assess the implications of the transfers and to prepare arguments it hopes will lead Hydro to retain current local staffing levels.

The group's formation follows Hydro's recent announcement that an unspecified number of its Gulf Islands employees will be transferred to Nanaimo over the next year to 18 months.

The transfers are part of an on-going, province-wide reorganization of the Crown corporation's field operations. District offices, which primarily serve individual communities, are being phased out in favour of area offices covering large districts.

Vancouver Island — the last region in B.C. to face implementation of Hydro's reorganization plan — will see a string of district offices replaced by area offices in Victoria, Nanaimo and Campbell River.

The new Nanaimo area office will be responsible for operations on the Gulf Islands. Hydro plans to leave line crews, a line supervisor, meter readers and some clerical staff at its Ganges office. The remaining employees — primarily office staff — will move to Nanaimo.

Chalmers said the group organized to lobby against the relocation is concerned that it will mean a lower standard of service for the Gulf Islands, a loss to the local economy of about \$200,000 in salaries paid to Hydro employees being transferred, and a further erosion of Salt Spring's role as an administrative centre for the Gulf Islands.

Realtors and building contractors are especially concerned about service, Chalmers indicated. He said both groups now receive swift attention in matters relating to easements and locating of hydro poles, and that the response time may be unduly lengthened if Hydro employees handling those tasks must be sent over from Nanaimo.

Chalmers added that the cost of sending Hydro employees from Nanaimo to serve customers on the Gulf Islands may offset any savings gained through centralization of services in the Vancouver Island city.

Another concern, Chalmers said, is that the loss of even a part of Hydro's local operation signals a subtle shift of government services away from the Gulf

Islands. The moves began four years ago with the transfer of area tax assessors, he said, and could continue through to loss of B.C. Ferries Corporation employees or hospital administration staff currently stationed on Salt Spring Island.

Arguments in favour of retaining Hydro's current level of operations on the Gulf Islands will be collected and honed over the next three weeks, Chalmers said, then turned over to the Chamber of Commerce for presentation to Hydro officials.

## Service to be retained, Hydro manager explains

No drastic erosion of local service will result from relocating some B.C. Hydro employees and operations to Nanaimo, a spokesman for the Crown corporation said last week.

Responding to word that Hydro will be lobbied to retain current staffing and workload levels in its Ganges office, Bill Stockton said the utility feels its Gulf Islands customers will still enjoy good service after the transfers take place.

Stockton, the former manager of Hydro's district office in Duncan, is now in charge of the corporation's area office in Nanaimo, which will be responsible for the Gulf Islands.

"I can understand why people may be concerned (about the relocation)," Stockton said Friday, "but we feel we will be able to serve Gulf Islands customers" just as well from Nanaimo as from Ganges.

Stockton pointed out that Hydro will leave its line crews, a line supervisor, meter readers and "one or two clerical people" — probably in the engineering department — stationed in Ganges. The employees and operations to be transferred to Nanaimo are mainly connected with clerical work, he added.

The most noticeable effect of the transfers will be closure of the clerical office in Ganges, Stockton continued. The closure will mean customers cannot walk into the office to pay their bills, or telephone a local office. However, Hydro plans to establish local pay stations and set up a toll-free line to the Nanaimo office, he said.

As for service to realtors and contractors, Stockton said retention of line crews and — possibly — an engineering department employee should ensure their needs are answered.

Stockton added that the move to lobby Hydro for retention of current staff and workload levels could be a result of the corporation not spelling out its intentions clearly enough. He said he may make arrangements for a visit to Salt Spring Island to discuss Hydro's planned move in person with local residents.

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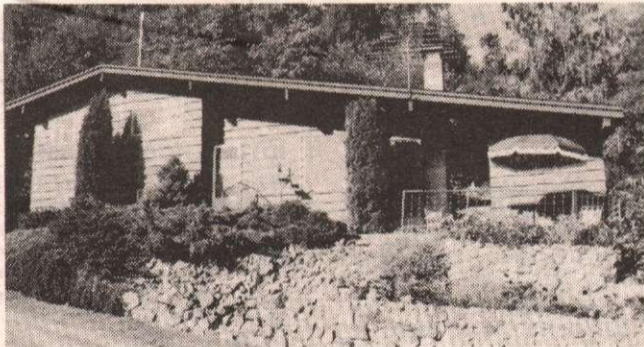

# Gulf Islands' swimming holes get passing grade from CRD

The Gulf Islands' most popular swimming holes were given a relatively clean bill of health last week by Capital Regional District (CRD) community health services branch.

None of the beaches tested on Salt Spring or Pender Islands had fecal coliform counts above 40. The internationally-accepted standard for water used for swimming purposes is a maximum 200 fecal coliform per 100 ml of water.

As of July 8, fecal coliform counts at local beaches were as follows: Blackburn Lake, 6; Cusheon Lake, 5; Collins Road Beach, 15; St. Mary Lake, 6; Stowell Lake, 6; Vesuvius Beach, 39; Weston Lake, 6; Port Browning (Pender), 10.

According to Jim McFarlane, operations manager for the CRD, swimmers need not fear pollution levels at any of the beaches tested.

McFarlane explained that fecal coliform counting is a lab test used to determine water contamination by sewage, animal waste and other sources. He explained that fecal coliform is a group of bacteria common in the waste of all warm-blooded mammals — bacteria that are not necessarily harmful to humans.

Because it is so common in human and animal waste — and

is thus easy to detect — coliform is a good indicator of contamination by sewage. McFarlane noted that although coliform is not necessarily harmful to humans, pathogens (disease-carrying bacteria) can be dangerous in nearly undetectable amounts and are often present in sewage. Thus, by testing for coliform, health officials are able to gauge the likelihood of dangerous micro-

organisms also being present in water.

"Coliform in itself is not harmful, which is good because otherwise we'd all be dead," he explained. "It's the other microorganisms that can also be present in sewage. Coliform is an indicator that pathogens may be present. It's like the old saying: *Where there's smoke, there's fire.*"

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## down through the years

### Twenty-five years ago

• An afternoon of unusual thrills and excitement awaited Salt Spring Island residents and visitors in early August, when the famous Indian War Canoe Races were to be held at Lakeridge Camp (the Bullock estate).

Four of the 52-foot, 11-man racing canoes were scheduled to compete in the event on a 27-acre lake at Lakeridge. For the first time ever, whites would be invited to ride in the canoes as well.

• From Tent Island to East Point, from Porlier Pass to Moresby Island and from Ganges Harbour to Sansum Narrows, coho and spring salmon were being caught by the dozens.

Limit catches were being reported from all areas, and a 40-pound fish was caught off Lone Tree Island near Galiano.

• Salt Spring volunteer firemen were called out to extinguish an attic fire at the home of an island couple.

The fire, discovered by another resident, was believed to have been started by spontaneous combustion. Estimated damage to the home was \$5,000.

• At the Highland Games in Nanaimo, only the Canadian champion — Yvonne Breendon — could beat Salt Spring's Sandra Smith in the 100 yard dash.

Breendon ran the race in 11.3 seconds, just .4 of a second faster than Smith.

### Twenty years ago

• Plans were finalized for Saturna Island children to visit Expo 67.

The Saturna Island Community Club agreed to donate \$500 to the Centennial committee to meet the cost of the children's tickets. Twenty children and six adult chaperones were scheduled to make the trip.

• Trustees of the Gulf Islands school district approved a third presentation of its building program.

The decision was made at the board's regular meeting on Mayne Island. The district hoped to add to district facilities, but needed the approval of Gulf Islands taxpayers.

The proposal had already been defeated three times.

• The weather was kind, the raspberries delicious and the company pleasant at the raspberry tea held in the home of Geoff Emsley of Stowell Lake.

The tea, sponsored by the Women's Institute, opened with the presentation of corsages to Bea Hamilton and Mrs. Emsley.

• Last rites were observed at St. George's Anglican Church for Melvin Ernest Peever of Tripp Road.

Peever died in his home at the age of 69. He was seriously wounded in the First World War, when — at the age of 19 — he was one of the valiant Canadians who took Vimy Ridge. His wounds were so serious that he spent the remainder of his life in and out of veterans' hospitals.

### Fifteen years ago

• The Salt Spring Chamber of Commerce wanted to see more jobs created on the island.

The chamber's members approved a recommendation from their employment committee seeking a government grant to launch a comprehensive survey of the island's potential. The organization was also seeking the establishment of a local employment agency.

• Charles Baseley took first prize in the Salt Spring Island Rod and Gun Club fishing derby with his eight-pound catch.

The largest cod — an 11-pound, nine-ounce fish — was reeled in by Ron Lee. In the ladies' category, first prize went to Mrs. Kelly for her seven-pound, 14-ounce catch.

• New construction in Ganges was almost at a standstill, and the problems with sewage disposal were blamed for the drop.

The hospital was adequately served by its new sewage disposal system, but many of the other systems in the village either had failed their efficiency tests or were expected to do so. A community meeting was planned to discuss the subject.

### Ten years ago

• Tourism Minister Grace McCarthy opened the Salt Spring Island Chamber of Commerce tourist booth.

McCarthy commended the chamber of commerce for the way in which the organization's members pressed for the booth. She and Pat Baines, chairman of the chamber's tourist committee, participated in the official ribbon-cutting ceremony.

• Two Salt Spring marksmen came back from Vancouver with trophies from a trap-shooting competition.

Dan Reynolds, who already placed high at provincial competitions, brought back the Canadian Trap Shooting Championship in the open handicap Junior D Class. He shot 92 out of 100.

Sharing national honours was George Moulton, who brought back the Open Single D Class trophy for all Canada. He shot 192 out of a possible 200.

• Dissatisfaction was being expressed by Salt Spring Islanders

over the lack of progress being made at Portlock Park.

Regional director George Heinekey told *Driftwood* it was "all volunteer work" that was going into the preparation of the park area. He suggested anyone dissatisfied with the park's progress should "get out there and go to work."

### Five years ago

• Fluoride is a trace element in almost all ground water and it doesn't matter where the mineral comes from — but how much of it is concentrated in the water.

Those were the words of various experts contacted by *Driftwood* after it was learned that island water supplies contained levels of fluoride well above the Canadian maximum. Dr. Gary Dirkson, chairman of the fluoridation committee for the College of Dental Surgeons of B.C. expressed surprise over the findings and said it represented not only a dental hazard but a general health hazard.

• A reward was being considered to help solve a hit-and-run accident that left Dr. Nona Rowat of Vancouver with compound fractures to one leg and a compression fracture of the vertebrae.

Peter Rowat, the woman's husband, said she would be confined to a wheelchair for at least a year. Nona was riding a bicycle up Ganges Hill when she was suddenly struck from behind by a vehicle. The driver fled the scene.

• A 28-year-old Vancouver woman drowned Saturday while scuba diving at Galiano Island.

Police said the woman died as a result of a diving accident of Alcala Point near Porlier Pass. She was pronounced dead on arrival at Royal Jubilee Hospital in Victoria after being flown there by a Canadian Forces Labrador helicopter from CFB Comox.

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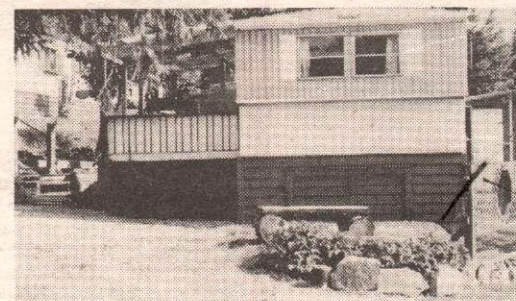

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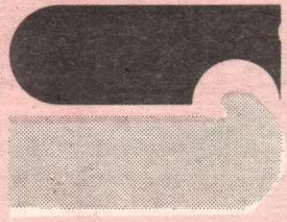
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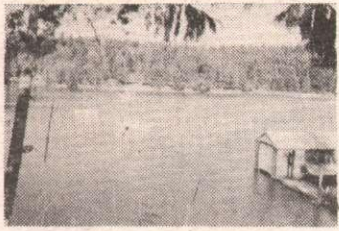
