

According to the plants, it's almost spring...

Here we are in the middle of January and the signs are undeniable: spring is upon us. Or is it? If the plants are right, then we are now looking at early March, as the pearly everlastings are breaking out of the ground, several clematises (clemati) have flushed out succulent new growth, the filberts are about to bloom, and the anemones have put out about four inches of foliage. If all of these characters, (not to mention the rambunctious bulbs bursting out of the soil) are on cue, then we've made it through the worst that this winter had to offer, and it wasn't really hard to take, now was it? Why the primulas and the fall-winter blooming autumnalis cherry (Prunus subhirtella "Autumnalis") have been blooming without interruption for the last two months. They just picked up where the annuals left off. The Chinese witch hazels (hamamelis mollis) have been in bloom for the past couple weeks with their striking golden, fragrant blossoms unfurled to welcome the return of spring. Let's hope it's here.

With all of this warm weather, the buds of several shrubs and trees have started to swell and the sap appears to be rising, so now is a good time to carry out your dormant season pruning. As mentioned earlier, clematis is breaking bud, so now is the time to give those varieties of the jackmanii type (flower on new wood only) a hard pruning, leaving only two to three buds of stem on wood grown in 1986. Don't prune your Clematis montana nor your Clematis armandii until just after blooming has finished in spring. Likewise, hold off pruning the winter-blooming jasmine (Jasminum nudiflorum) until blooming is done.

Normally February would be the month to prune your Buddleia and P.G. hydrangeas, but the buddleias never really stopped growing this year and the P.G. hydrangeas are about to resume activity, so seize the moment and cut them back hard, leaving only

three to four buds (or in the case of buddleias, fresh new leaf clusters) on each of the shoots grown in 1986. It always seems severe, but well worth the effort, as they flower only on the new wood. This same severe pruning should be carried out on your established grape vines to ensure a heavy crop and well-balanced plants.

Avoid pruning your flowering currants, quince, spring-blooming spireas, and any other shrub that blooms in the next few months on

last year's wood, as any pruning will merely be taking from your flower show.

Fruit tree pruning can be undertaken during the next several weeks, and remember to prune out the oldest wood of your gooseberry plants, and wood on your currants that is over three years old (productivity declines after this point). Dormant season spraying should be undertaken before too long, as it should be completed before the buds swell and start to open, usually somewhere around mid-March. But this year, who knows? Choose

a day when there is little or no wind and the temperature is above 40 degrees Fahrenheit. It shouldn't be raining (naturally) when you spray, but as long as the spray has time to thoroughly dry, then the treatment will be effective regardless of the rain. If a spraying of fixed copper is required to control a fungal or bacterial problem, then do so before the lime-sulphur-dormant oil application. If it's done out of sequence, the copper won't be pruned now as they're resuming growth) and your lilac shrubs, but avoid spraying lime-sulphur on your apricots as it can do serious damage to them.

The temperatures are right but the soil is very wet, and it is a tad early. However, if you're a risk taker, why not venture a first sowing of sweet peas, early peas, and broad beans (no risk there) to take advantage of this early season? If caution prevails, start the sweet peas up late in the month, in deep pots and keep them under glass until they're well started.

Take a little time to check your lifted and stored plants, tubers, corms, etc. for any sign of rot, shrivelling or insect pest problems. Take remedial action to stop the spread of any problem. Also take time to check any stored vegetables and fruits for drying or rotting too.

If time and opportunity permit, apply lime to your lawns, gardens and orchard areas, to raise the pH and permit the plants to function at their best. Liming will also improve the effectiveness of any fertilizers that you may apply in the months ahead.

Since we have had such gorgeous weather, there have been few opportunities to be an armchair gardener this winter, so that familiar activity of pouring over the seed catalogues and planning out the new garden has suffered. But I see that the seed racks are already going up in garden centres and seed stores. This too must mean that spring is

upon us, or is it just wishful thinking? Regardless of how the next few weeks turn out, gardening

out of doors should still be possible, so until next week, happy gardening.

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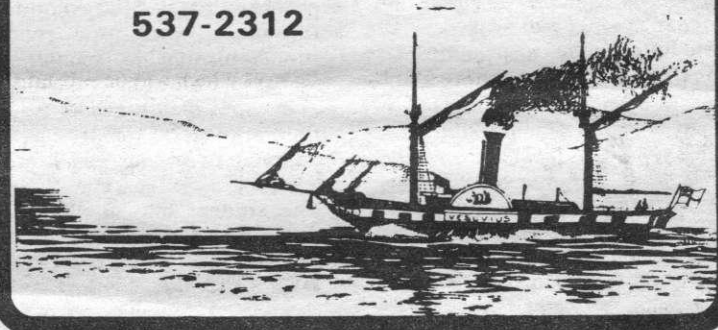

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Reporter joins staff of *Driftwood*

A new reporter joined *Driftwood* staff last week, taking over coverage of Outer Islands news.

Mike O'Brien replaced Jane Hamilton, who has returned to the University of Victoria to continue her studies. As part of the University's Co-operative Education program, both O'Brien and Hamilton obtained temporary positions with *Driftwood*.

The Outer Island position is 23-year-old O'Brien's fifth and final work term through the co-op program. He has also worked on newspapers in the Williams Lake, Smithers, Colwood and Goldstream areas.

"After several years of city life, I'm looking forward to the slower lifestyle," says O'Brien of his Pender Island base.

O'Brien has just completed his university degree, majoring in history. His other interests include martial arts, fishing and travel. He can be reached on Pender Island at 629-6449.

The *Driftwood* has been involved with UVic's Co-operative Education program for almost two years. It began placing students in the reporter's position on Salt Spring in the summer of 1985 and last May placed an additional student on Pender Island.

The Salt Spring position has since been filled with a full-time, permanent reporter, but *Driftwood* will continue to hire students for four month work terms on the Outer Islands.

The Co-operative Education program has a large base at UVic, but also exists in other Canadian universities. While several departments have co-ops, the *Driftwood* and other newspapers deal with the university's Creative Writing department.

The co-op program provides students with on-the-job experience in their field of study while they attend school. They are expected to pay a \$180 co-op fee and write a work term report before returning to school. In most cases, the students alternate four or eight month school terms with work terms of the same duration in their last two years of school.

The student may then do an optional fifth work term after he has completed his degree.

UVic's Creative Writing Co-op offers jobs in newspaper work, publishing houses and public relations to over 100 students a year.

School board announces addition to Galiano school

Two new classrooms will be added to Galiano school this year to keep up with continuing enrolment increases, Gulf Islands school board announced last week.

The project, approved by the ministry of education as a capital expenditure, will add two classes and a new library, in addition to allowing some grounds improvement and freeing up current space for special education and a

staff room.

District superintendent Mike Marshall said Galiano's enrolment has risen to 75 students, an increase of approximately 10 this year. The last expansion was in 1982. "It's grown by about 50 per cent since then," Marshall said.

The district has asked for construction bids. Marshall said the work should be completed by September.

Galiano principal Elizabeth

Brinson said the additions will meet the current need. "It looks as though we'll pretty well have it filled as soon as we start next year."

"Right now our learning assistance takes place in a room in a basement," Brinson said.

Marshall attributed the continued enrolment increases to a "suburban effect" of families that moved to the island but work in Vancouver.

Shipping foul-up postpones workshop

A transport mix-up has caused the postponement of a five-day workshop on the construction of soapstone fireplaces.

The workshop, originally scheduled to start January 8, would have brought Albie Barden of Maine Wood Heat company — a leading builder of wood-fuelled stoves — to Galiano Island for the construction of a Finnish soapstone fireplace. Inuit carver Abraham Anghik was expected to carve intricate designs upon the soapstone.

Workshop organizer Edrie Holloway said the shipment of Finnish soapstone and castings was unloaded in Seattle along with some U.S.-bound goods, and requires approval from U.S. customs officials before it can enter Canada.

Holloway said the shipping documents for the stone were mixed up, probably in Finland. "As soon as we hear from American customs we'll know if we can get it or if we have to start over again."

Customs approval could bring the stone to Galiano in three weeks, she said. Otherwise she will order another shipment from Finland, which would take about eight weeks.

Both Barden and Anghik will

be available for the later workshop, as will at least seven of the ten people who signed up, Holloway said.

Only one of the enrollees is from the Gulf Islands; the rest came from around the province. Holloway said most of the participants are accomplished masons who want to learn how to build the Finnish stove under the man who introduced them to North America.

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Bird count a success

Twenty-three observers took part December 19 on Mayne, Saturna and the Pender Islands in this year's annual Audobon Christmas Bird Count.

A total of 10,496 birds and 75 species were counted including on Mayne Island, a first-ever cattle egret.

Unusual sightings for the time of

year were a house wren, and Heerman's gull on Saturna. Where in past years sometimes no more than two red-breasted nuthatch have been seen, this year's total of 169 is exceptional.

Calm waters, excellent visibility and a sunny day made the count a happy and rewarding event for all concerned.

While still a teenager, he drove a team of six horses and wagon hauling freight between Ashcroft and Horsefly. He then worked as an assayer for Bralorne Mines, one of the first mining companies in B.C. When imported engineers failed to construct a flume in steps

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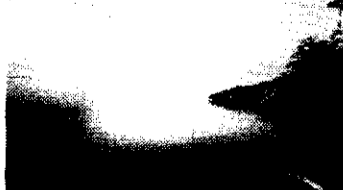

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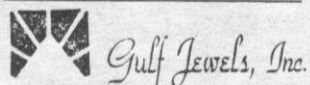

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Therapist prepares radio, television work

Salt Spring Island therapist Ariadne Sawyer helps people harness the untapped potential of their minds. She has operated a private practice here and in Vancouver for the past several years, and is now taking her teachings to a larger audience.

Sawyer has developed a new kind of therapy that utilizes unconscious, conscious and neuro-linguistic programming. With help from fellow islander and associate David Smith, she is preparing newspaper columns, mail order courses and commercial programs for television and radio. These items will teach people more about the brain and how to unlock and use its full potential.

with CBC-TV and Worldwide T.V. for a series of 60-second television mini-capsules, which she expects will be aired this spring. They could eventually be seen all over the world, she added.

The radio mini-capsules are between 60 and 90 seconds in length, and are designed so that advertisers can sponsor them. They all use what she terms "whole brain techniques" and are directed at people between 25 and 49.

Sawyer, who carefully researched all her publications and mini-capsules, said she some-

times found it difficult to 'boil down' all her knowledge on a subject into a short article or 90-second radio production.

"I've used all my training, and I had to pare it all down," she noted. "They (the articles and mini-capsules) were all created from four books and two research papers, plus all my own papers. I get research papers from universities all over. This is just the bare bones."

Sawyer indicated that to date, she has had "wonderful feedback" on her proposals. "Really, these are the commercials of the

future," she said. "Rather than tell people to purchase cat food or a car, it provides them with information on how they can better use their minds and lets the advertiser tag his name on to it."

Sawyer hopes her programs will "catch on," and is excited by the prospects they offer. She feels society is placing increasing emphasis on full use of the mind, and says her work and teachings tie in with this "new direction."

According to Sawyer — who possesses a Bachelor of Arts degree from the University of Costa Rica, and a Masters degree in counselling psychology from Norwich University — these courses, columns and "mini-capsule" programs will help people cope in today's changing world. They offer tips on everything from memory skills to the reduction of stress, and will even help an artist struggling to overcome a "creative block."

Sawyer said the mail order course will likely be available in approximately two weeks. It is accompanied by a tape, and the first lesson deals with how people can use more of their brains.

The newspaper column, entitled the *Daily Brain Bulletin* will be published in a group of weekly newspapers. It will range in length from between eight and 12 column inches, and will deal with a variety of topics.

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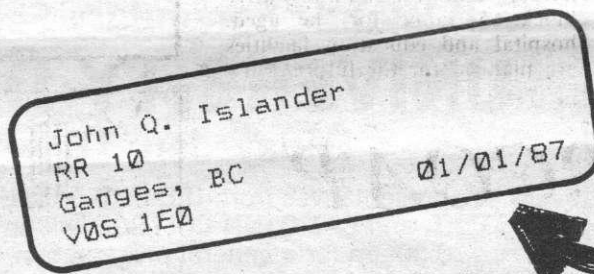
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Trip proves interesting

Salt Spring couple visit Baha'i temple in India

Joyce and Allan McLean have returned from attending the dedication of the Baha'i House of Worship in Delhi. "It was the experience of a lifetime," they said. "No words of ours can remotely describe the beauty and spirituality of that exquisite place. We feel enormously privileged to have been able to attend."

According to the McLeans, Baha'i Houses of Worship throughout the world are renowned for their beauty and architecture and this newest link in a chain of Baha'i temples that encircle the globe is another stunning example of excellence.

The architect, a naturalized Canadian named Fariburz Sahba, was 28 when commissioned by the Universal House of Justice of the Baha'i world community to design the temple in 1976. He was selected from among forty architects world-wide. Sahba searched for a design that would reflect the fundamental unity of all religions as well as the uniqueness of India's spiritual heritage.

To find inspiration he travelled throughout the country and saw the recurring symbol of the lotus flower everywhere. Sahba was inspired to state: "The lotus ... is probably the most perfect flower in the whole world. It is symmetrical. It is exquisitely beautiful. It grows in a swamp and it raises its head out of the slime — absolutely clean and perfect. Because of its manner of growth, it represents the manifestation of God Who, although born in a material world, is undefiled by the corruption of

Readings from the Hindu, Zoroastrian, Buddhist, Christian, Islamic and Baha'i scriptures were interspersed with music from three choirs — English, Hindi and Persian, a blend of 150 voices.

Music was especially composed for the occasion by celebrated sitar virtuoso Ravi Shankar. It was the first time in India's history that a house of worship has been inaugurated with holy scriptures from all revealed religions.

Construction USA has referred to the temple as "an engineering and construction feat that will set standards for centuries." It has been hailed as an aesthetic rival to the Taj Mahal, which moved one Indian scholar to comment that the Taj Mahal was built with the power of a king but the Baha'is have raised this majestic edifice with the power of love. "It is a silent but visible teacher of unity, welcoming peoples of all faiths, races, cultures and classes through its doors for prayer and the worship of God."

Baha'is believe that the culture of no race nor nation is intrinsically superior to others and that peace must be based on international cooperation, upholding the fundamental principle of unity in diversity, not unity in uniformity.

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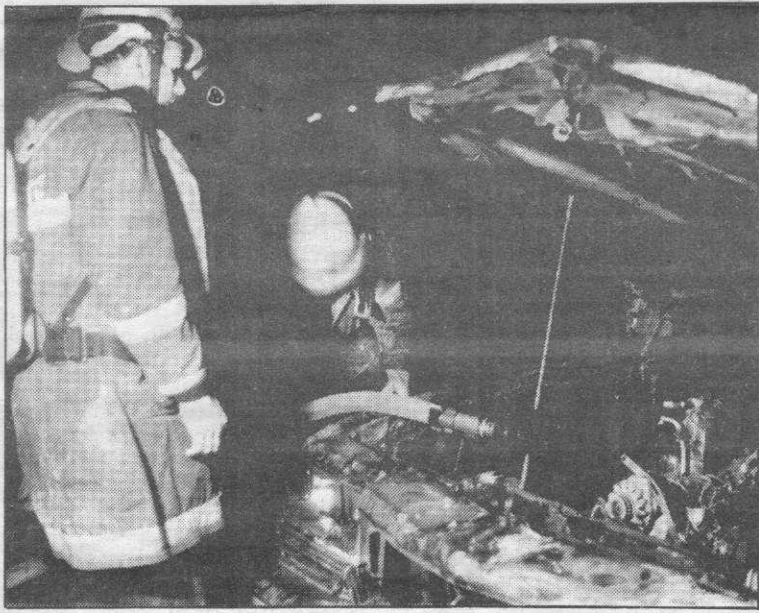

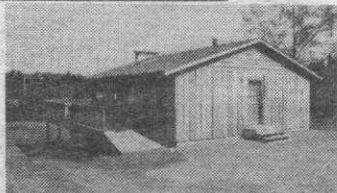

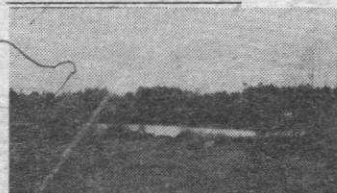
