Sadler, Van Beneden arrive on Salt Spring

Rotary Exchange students arrive from Belgium

Krista Sadler and Veronique Van Beneden have a lot in common.

Both girls are 18 years old and are Rotary Exchange students. They also recently arrived on Salt Spring from Belgium.

However, for Van Beneden — a native of Belgium — this is her first trip to the island. She arrived on August 16, and is currently staying at the home of Rotary member Trevor Turner and his family.

Van Beneden, who hails from the western portion of Belgium, said Friday she finds this country "very pretty."

"I've never seen anything like this," she said. "The landscape is so different from where I live. There, it's flat. The trees are different here, too."

Van Beneden noted that the population density of her country is also a lot higher than that of Canada. Though approximately the size of Vancouver Island, Belgium is home to 10 million people.

She is also finding Canadian cuisine quite different.

"Here, you eat a lot of food that is already prepared," she said. "A lot comes in boxes."

Belgium's climate, she added, is different from that of Salt Spring. Belgium receives a lot of rain; judging from her first two weeks on Salt Spring, she said, this island receives more sunshine than her native land.

As an exchange student, Van Beneden — who lists her hobbies as sports and reading — will stay on Salt Spring for a year. She will attend Gulf Islands Secondary School.

Sadler is the other Rotary Exchange student who arrived on Salt Spring recently. The island isn't new to her, though; she grew up here.

Sadler, a graduate of GISS, returned to Salt Spring on July 13 after spending a year in the Flanders region of Belgium.

On her arrival in Belgium, Sadler was immediately faced with the prospect of learning a new language. Although a significant portion of those who live in Belgium speak French, the people of Flanders speak Dutch.

"It (Dutch) is a totally different language," she noted. "When I first heard it, it sounded like jibberish. But I eventually learned enough to get by."

One of the first things that surprised Sadler about Belgium was its topography. The Flanders region, she noted, is completely flat.

"There's no nature there, either," she noted. "Belgium is like one big city, with many old buildings. The sense of history is incredible. There are castles; one we visited was from the 10th century."

"Belgium," she continued, "is 326 times smaller than Canada, but only has a population 2.5 times smaller."

While overseas, Sadler attended a Catholic all-girls private school. The school had a student population of 1,000, and all who attended it were required to wear the school uniform.

It was, as Sadler noted, quite different from Gulf Islands Secondary School.

"It was very strict," she noted. "They didn't have much fun there, I don't think — not until I got there. I'd tell them about the

things we used to do at school here, and they'd say: *Stop, stop, don't tell us anymore. It sounds like a dream.*

"In class, the teacher would do all the talking, and the students would just write it all down. No one asked any questions. In one French class I had, for example, the woman would just stand up at the front of the class and talk, and you'd have to write down every word she said in French."

Another major difference between Belgium and Canada, she noted, was entertainment-related. Television in Belgium, for example, is different from television here. On Belgium TV, there were Italian stations, German stations, the British Broadcasting Corporation and others. Sadler, when she watched TV, generally tuned in to the BBC.

"It was strange," she said with a chuckle. "I even saw *The Beachcombers* in Italian, and *Batman*. There were no television commercials (in the middle of programs), either. They'd have a half-hour of commercials at one time, then you'd see another entire show."

"They had *Dallas* and some shows like that over there. The funny thing was, they thought all of us actually lived like that. They'd ask me *Is it really like that over there? Do you people live like that?* I'd say no, and they couldn't understand it."

"It (television programming) wasn't on all the time, either. They also had something called *Meditative Moment*, where they'd suddenly put on music and show nothing but pictures of churches and that sort of thing."

Sadler found the cost of living high in Belgium. The exchange rate, she noted, was 33 francs to the dollar when she arrived in the country, but only 28 francs when she left.

"It was quite expensive," she said. "Mailing letters, for example, cost a lot. One single-sheet letter cost more than a dollar to mail. When I first got there, I wrote this long letter on regular paper, and it cost 60 francs to mail — about \$2, in other words."

"The food was good. I actually found I like Belgium cuisine more

than French cuisine. But it was expensive. For a family of four kids, for example, a meal would cost 2,000 francs. There was a McDonald's there, and a Burger King, but we didn't go there much.

"One thing, though, is that French fries were invented there. They have little stalls on the streets where you can buy French fries, and they had about 50 different sauces to put on them

besides ketchup. So, when you got hungry, you'd go and get some fries."

While in Belgium, Sadler stayed with three host families. She enjoyed her year overseas, and recommends the Rotary Exchange program to other students.

"You really learn a lot," she said. "You're with a host family, but you learn independence."

Park talks on at Montague, Ruckle

A summer-long series of outdoor education talks continues this week at two provincial parks in the Gulf Islands region.

The sessions, sponsored by the ministry of environment and parks, are held at Ruckle Provincial Park on Salt Spring Island and Montague Harbour Marine Park on Galiano Island. Talks are free and open to the public.

This week's program includes:

RUCKLE PARK

- *Standing Dead?*, Friday, September 4 at 8:30 pm. A slide show on the animals of the Gulf Islands and one of their most critical habitat components. "A talk for the visitor and the Gulf Islands landowner alike," the parks branch says.
- *Low tide stroll*, Saturday, September 5 at 8:30 am.
- *Parks With A Porpoise*, Monday, September 7 at 8:30 pm. Marine mammals of our marine parks; come and hear killer whales.

MONTAGUE HARBOUR

- *Lip-plugs, clamshells and garbage*, Sunday, September 6 at 2 pm. A talk and walk looking at the middens of Montague.
- *Legless, lungless and croakers*, Sunday, September 6 at 9 pm. An illustrated slide show.
- *No, they aren't all Dickey Birds*, Monday, September 7 at 7 am. A park birding talk. Note the early start time.

• *The Tree Story*, Sunday, September 6 at 1 pm, by the boat launching ramp. Puppeteer Daphne Mennell directs a demonstration of how trees link the earth with the sky. The show is designed for school children but will be appreciated by adults as well.

The above schedule is the final installment of the environment and parks ministry's outdoor education program at Ruckle and Montague parks.

Pumps a concern

PCB scare prompts calls to government

Government officials in both Ganges and Nanaimo have received numerous telephone calls from Gulf Islanders concerned that some older-model submersible pumps may leak polychlorinated biphenyls (PCBs) into well water.

Bill Campbell, government agent in Ganges, said last week his office received a "surge of calls" soon after the provincial government announced in late June that some submersible pumps made between 1964 and 1980 may contain PCBs in their motors or capacitors.

"It (the possibility of PCB contamination) has been a major concern," said Campbell.

The ministry of environment's regional office in Nanaimo has also been deluged by calls from pump owners.

"We've had over, I'd say, 300 calls," noted John Finnie, head of the waste management branch's environmental safety program for Vancouver Island. "Yes, we have had quite a few (calls) from Salt Spring and the other Gulf Islands.

"The people who call often have suspect pumps," said Finnie. "I'd say maybe 35, 40 per cent actually have pumps that have been identified as possibly containing PCBs."

In an effort to identify water wells that may now be contaminated with PCBs from older submersible pumps, the ministry is offering pump owners free water testing.

To take advantage of this

service, property owners must turn their submersible pumps in to the ministry. To date, said Finnie, between 40 and 45 pumps suspected of containing PCBs have been brought to the ministry of environment's Vancouver Island regional office.

None of the wells previously serviced by those pumps has shown even a trace of PCBs, however.

"So far, they've all tested zero," said Finnie, "and we do not feel any will actually show contamination. This is not considered a serious health or environmental problem. The Ontario study actually revealed an almost insignificant level of PCB contamination. It was something like one well out of 200,000 tested."

Although the possibility of contamination no longer appears great, the provincial government is still encouraging island residents who suspect their submersible pumps may contain PCBs to contact ministry of environment officials.

According to B.C. government officials, a study conducted in Ontario revealed that some wells serviced by older submersible pumps did contain PCBs. The amount of PCBs found in these wells, however, was below the provincial safety standard of three parts per billion.

PCBs pose a potential threat because of their toxicity and potential to accumulate in organisms.

How about a hot air balloon?

Islanders seeking ways to discourage aircraft

Three and a half years ago Phoebe, the daughter of Tony Kingscote, with her husband Pierre and two children, set off from her father's Valley Road home for Zaire, the former Belgian Congo in central Africa, to fly planes for Air Service Freedom. Pierre Lajeunesse, who is also a qualified aeroplane mechanic, services the planes.

ASF's main goal is to make the aeroplane a vital tool for development in Third World countries. The two light planes are able to land on and take off from air-strips hacked out of the bush, providing rapid transportation of supplies and personnel to remote areas which otherwise would be reached only after days or weeks of travelling on primitive roads. The plans can also act as air ambulances in emergencies, bringing patients to mission hospitals.

The area serviced by this project is in the far east of the country, close to the Sudan. It was chosen because of its remoteness and poor communication facilities. Work has begun on a hanger for the two planes and this building includes the machine shop Pierre uses for maintenance. This pilot project is already making a major contribution to the development of this remote area.

In mid-August Phoebe and Pierre, with another member of the family—Heidi, born in Zaire—returned for a brief visit with Tony Kingscote on Galiano. The family will by now be on their way back to Zaire, where the first task is to set up a radio-communication system. Funds are badly needed for this and to purchase aeroplane replacement parts, which are expensive.

Because of the time needed to get new projects on the road, donations should be on their way within a month, by October.

Some idea of the difficulties faced by Pierre and Phoebe was obtained by an audience in St. Margaret's Church, which viewed a video of their work shown on Sunday by Pierre.

The terrain and climate are formidable. The remoteness makes the obtaining of supplies difficult and expensive. Native people must be trained to take over the project.

The congregation of St. Margaret's and the Galiano Thrift Shop, have already sent financial support to ASF. Donations may be made to St. Margaret's Church and designated for the use of ASF. Receipts will be issued for Income Tax deductions. Matching government grants will triple the value of contributions. Donations may be sent to, and further information obtained from, the Church treasurer, Les Woodbridge (9-5764), or from Cliff Coolidge (9-2756).

Low Flying Aircraft

Galiano is not the only place where residents complain about low flying aircraft and helicopters, and the dangers these flying machines pose to peace and quiet. It is, however, the only place where plans are afoot to alleviate the problem.

The North-enders have taken as their model a certain Herr

Blitzwurst of the town of Schickelburg in Bavaria, located near Lahr where a squadron of the RAF was stationed after the Second World War.

In taking off and landing, the planes flew low over the Schickelburg homes to the great annoyance of Blitzwurst. Eventually, exasperated beyond endurance, he devised a daring plan. In his yard he had a medieval brass cannon. Charging it with gunpowder, he loaded it with a Kartoffel Knoedel, a traditional Bavarian dish that might be described as potato dumpling. When next the Canadian planes approached he applied a match to the fuse, and, by good luck or good judgment, scored a hit on the squadron leader's plane.

Of course, the missile caused no damage, but when the incident was reported to Wing Commander Macdonald, he got the message. From that day forth the planes did not take off over the Blitzwurst residence.

The North-enders do not have kartoffel knoedel, but they do have haggis left over from their Burns' Night Supper. When they have ascertained that the haggis will not contravene any of the provisions of the treaties Canada has signed to limit chemical and bacteriological warfare, they will set up their stove pipe cannon, courtesy Russell and Wike, and Lt-Col Woody Coward

will stand by with a Bic in hand. Beware any low flying aircraft that invade North Galiano air space.

A different solution is proposed for South Galiano, where some older residents remember the barrage balloons which protected British cities during the aerial blitz of 1940 and until the end of the war. These hydrogen-filled balloons were anchored by steel cables, which were invisible to the pilots of attacking planes. This kept the planes at an altitude which reduced the danger to the inhabitants below.

There is a shortage of elemental hydrogen on Galiano, but the recent Atlantic crossing of a hot-air balloon has suggested an

alternative. A balloon is being constructed with a commodious gondola slung below it, in which a dozen people can comfortably sit. All Galiano clubs and societies will be asked to hold their monthly executive meetings in the gondola. It has been calculated that sufficient hot air will be generated at each meeting to keep the balloon afloat for several hours. The various women's bridge-clutches have also agreed to co-operate, and it is thought that these patriotic groups will, by playing bridge in the gondola, cover most of the daylight hours.

If these projects succeed in eliminating, or at least reducing

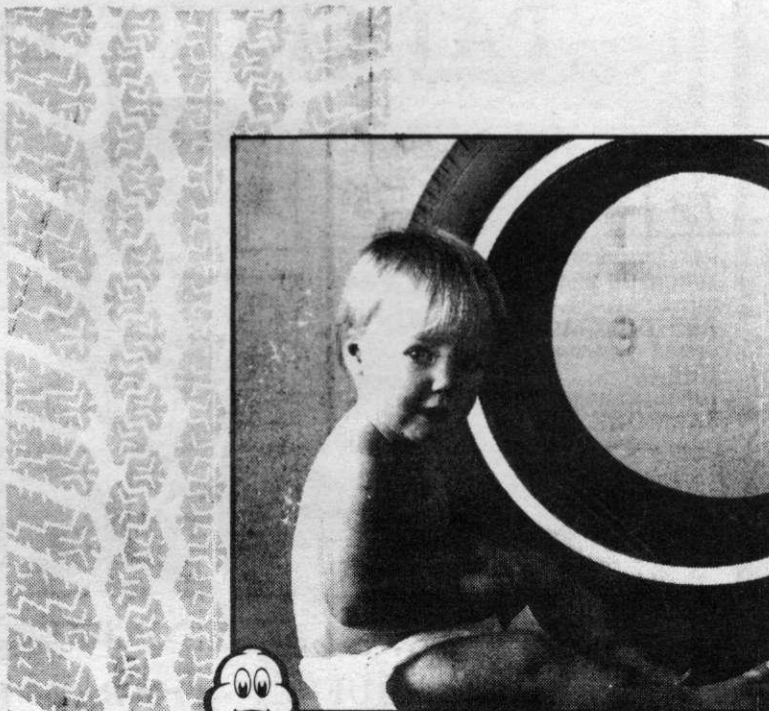

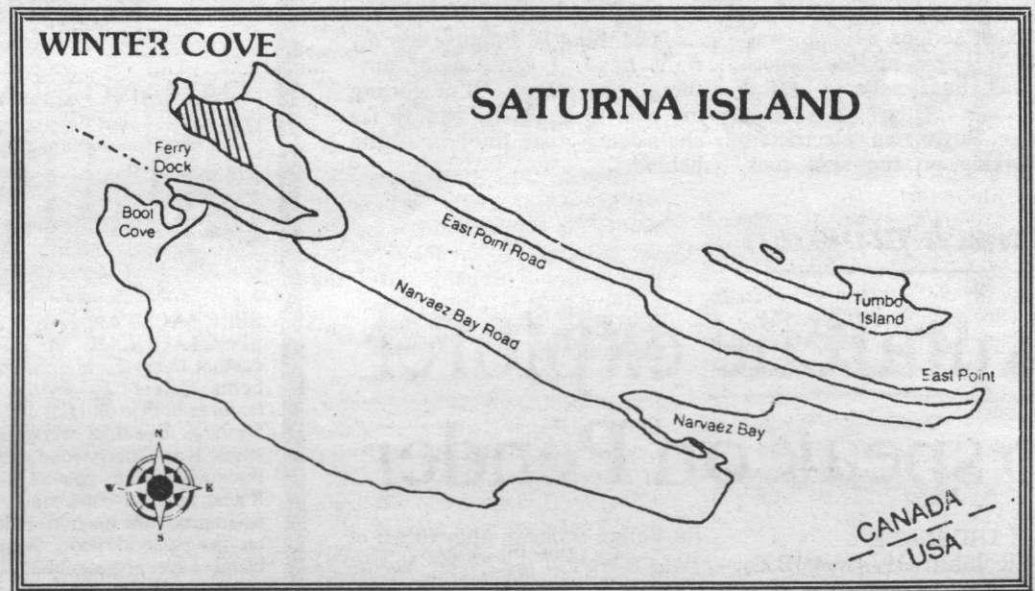
The schoolyard was enlivened with the huge theatre tent, 12 huge Clydesdale horses and four outrider horses of the Caravan Stage Company.

Tablesaw accident sidelines trustee

PENDER ISLANDS — Outer Islands Trust representative Steve Wright is recuperating at home after severely injuring his right hand in an industrial accident.

Wright, a carpenter by trade, was working at a Pender Island construction site on August 19 when he caught the hand in a table saw.

"It was right at 4:30 pm, and I was cutting the last board of the day," he said last Thursday. "I was just thinking about what the kids could load onto the truck."

"I don't really know what happened. The wood jammed, and I caught my hand in the saw."

The most serious damage was done to Wright's middle finger, which was almost severed by the saw.

Charlie Boyte, an electrician also working on the site, took

Wright to the Pender Medical Centre, where he was treated and given painkillers. He was then taken by ferry to Royal Jubilee Hospital in Victoria for further treatment.

At Royal Jubilee, a plastic surgeon applied a skin graft to his hand. He was released at approximately 12:30 am August 20.

"The skin graft took," Wright noted.

Wright will not be able to work for several weeks. Furthermore, because it is his right hand that sustained the injury, he is unable to do any paperwork in his capacity as Outer Islands Trustee and vice-chairman of the Islands Trust.

"The thing is, because it's my right hand, I can't write anything," he stated. "I'm getting my wife to help out, and so far she's doing great. But I am a little behind."

Outreach program

Antarctic explorer to speak on Pender

PENDER ISLANDS — A B.C. resident who with two companions completed the first unsupported trek to the South Pole, in 1986, is set to step out of the pages of the April issue of *National Geographic* and onto Pender Island.

Gareth Wood, Canada's 'Man of the Antarctic,' will be the first speaker in the fall Outreach lecture program sponsored by the Pender Island library. His address, scheduled for September 9 in the community school, will be fully illustrated.

Wood — a resident of Sidney — and his two companions walked a total of 883 miles in the footsteps of Shackleton and Scott. They marched without dogs, mechanized transport or radios, each pulling a heavily-laden sled, and endured constant hardship and danger. Wood himself was attacked by a savage leopard seal.

The men arrived at the South Pole only to learn that their support ship had been crushed in sea-ice, necessitating an additional year's living within 100 yards of Scott's 1910 hut.

Admission to the Wood lecture is free; however, the library depends heavily upon donations at the door to continue the program.

Wood will be followed on October 14 by well-known B.C. author and naturalist J.E. 'Ted' Underhill, speaking on the topic of Gulf Islands mushrooms. He is

the author (among other titles) of *Wild Berries of the Pacific Northwest* and *Guide to Western Mushrooms*.

Underhill takes over the mushroom assignment from Dr. A. Funk of the Pacific Forest Research Centre.

The library lecture series saw several speakers in its spring program, including: marine biologist Gordon Green, curator at the provincial museum; Dr. Garry Rogers, seismologist at the Pacific Geoscience Centre; Dr. Helen Schwantje, B.C.'s only woman wildlife veterinarian; and Dr. James Hesser, director of the Pacific Astrophysical Observatory. Dr. Hesser spoke to a near-capacity audience on the search for extraterrestrial life in the universe and beyond.

Among speakers due to appear in the current session are Canadian author-journalist Peter C. Newman, and Wayne Campbell, curator of ornithology at the provincial museum. Confirmation of other program speakers is pending.



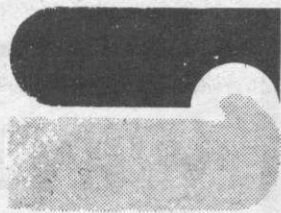

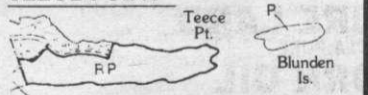

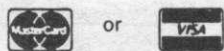

Recreation commission okays referendum on pool question

It's a go. The Salt Spring Island Parks and Recreation Commission voted at its regular meeting August 31 to go to referendum on the question of building an indoor pool here.

5-0 in favour of asking the Capital Region to conduct a referendum on the island in conduction with this fall's November municipal elections. A number of recreation commission members abstained from voting on the issue.

Woodley said Tuesday the referendum request will likely be dealt with at the CRD's next board meeting.

Woodley added that a majority of recreation commission members feel construction and operation of an indoor swimming pool here is feasible, based on a proposal made by Vic Davies Architect Ltd.

Although the commission has elected to put its pool proposal to a public vote, Woodley noted that a decision is yet to be made on a final pool site.

"It appears it (the pool proposal) is feasible," stated Woodley. "We still have some loose ends to tie up. But the majority feel it is feasible."

"We have to firm up plans for a site," he continued. "The Mouat Park site isn't out, but we now have another site to look at."

According to Woodley, recreation commission members and pool society officials have pegged the pool's total cost at \$1.3 million. The cost of this facility to island taxpayers, Woodley said, will be 73 cents per \$1,000 of taxable value.

It is estimated the pool will have an annual operating deficit of approximately \$127,000.

Monday night's debate on the pool proposal was a lengthy one, according to Woodley. He added that although no one voted against the proposal, some felt they needed more time to consider it — and thus abstained from voting.

Horticulturist to demonstrate

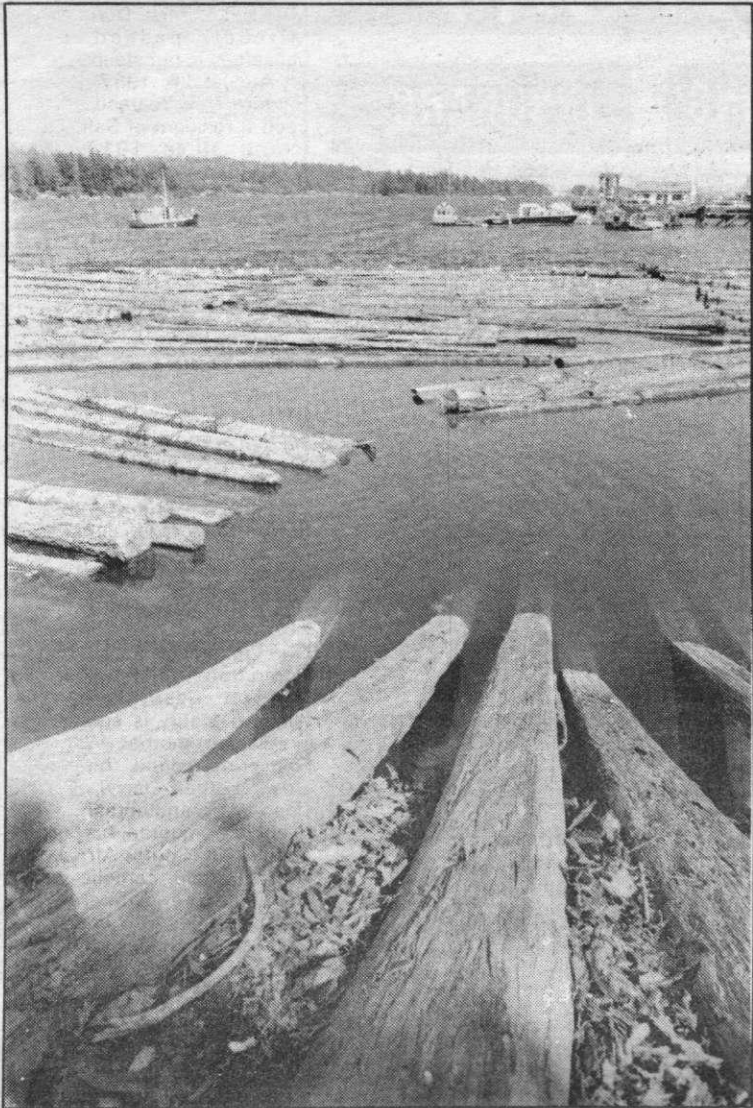
Local horticulturist William Hoopfer is offering a free demonstration this Sunday on the art of preparing flowers for show.

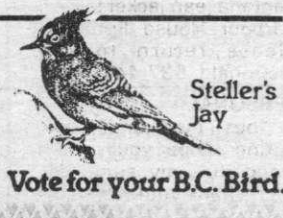

British inventors discover new way to eliminate slugs

Well, we've already made it to the Labour Day weekend, and in a few short weeks, summer will be over, the harvest will be safely tucked away in our tummies, the larder or the root cellar, and the 1987 gardening season will taper off into the winter.

The days are getting noticeably shorter and many of us have started to compare this year's crop with the 1986 yields. In the nursery and plant business, researchers are collating their data, and the industry readies itself for the fall and winter shows and trade fairs, where new products and services will be introduced.

In reading the trade magazines and journals, I've gleaned a couple of items of interest and also have a couple of 1987 experiences to relate.

It seems that the problems with slugs are almost universal to all temperate garden regions, and for our benefit, the British have done it again; they've come up with a better way to kill slugs. There are only two chemicals which can effectively destroy snails and slugs; namely Mesuroil and Metaldehyde, and several forms of delivery have been tried. The bran baits, pellets, Deadline gel and the concentrate spray all have one or more drawbacks relating to usage, toxicity to other animals and term of effectiveness. Well, worry no more, as we shall soon see the introduction of Slug Tape.

The Slug Tape is a one-inch-wide tape made up of seven or more layers of paper that have been impregnated with a good dose of Metaldehyde. An attractant or bait has been sprayed on to entice them to dine on the strip and, as they ingest it, the end is close at hand. The tape can be cut to any length and then tied to stakes, stapled to boards or fence posts, or merely set out amongst the plants to be protected.

The tape breaks down slowly, will withstand watering and moisture (unlike baits and pellets) and it can also be moved about the garden as needed to control outbreaks of the dreaded slime. Birds and pets do not find it attractive and thus many of us will have overcome our greatest misgivings about using slug poison. This tape can even be used in the vegetable garden, set in the pathways, or stapled to the outer face of the raised boxes or planters, as it keeps the pesticide centralized in the tape, not all over the yard.

This product won't be available in Canada for a while, as testing, approval and distribution will take

some time, but when it does arrive in our area, Slug Tape will change the way we do battle with slugs and snails.

Another product that will improve our attitudes toward gardening is an aid for the training and tying of vines, shrubs, tall perennials, and even espaliered trees.

"T" Lock staking and tying straps are reusable, durable, black coloured, heavy plastic bands that are very strong. There are two sizes available: a smaller half-inch width for tying up roses, vines, shrubs and perennials, and the heavier one-inch band for staking and supporting large shrubs and trees.

The lighter band will hold against over 50 pounds of pull and goodness knows how much the big one will handle, but the real beauty of this stuff is the ease of use and the refastenable, reusable nature of the product. It resembles a flattened chain, and the cut end is merely looped around the stem or stems to be held, then given a quarter turn and fed through one of the holes in the band. Then all you have to do is turn it back to the normal alignment, and the connection is complete.

It comes in 50-foot rolls, or can be bought by the foot. It can be cut to any length, and it has a seemingly unlimited life expectancy. It can be nailed through one or both ends, and since it can be unfastened, you can let down vines for cleaning up or painting, and then remount them with ease. Its ease of fastening makes it great for roses and other thorny plants, as well as hard-to-reach spots.

Over the course of this summer, we acquired a bit of cedar lumber and, in order to hasten its drying, it was laid up in the greenhouse where the sun and heat were the greatest. Well, the lumber has dried, but as a side benefit I've noticed that not one of the plants

in my greenhouse has any insects on it. Outside, about 50 feet away, I have had a summer-long problem with aphids on my waterlilies, and with fish in the pool there isn't a single pesticide, not even Safer's soap, that can be safely used.

The plants in close proximity to the vapourizing cedar oils or extractives appear to have been shielded from detection, or else the presence of the fumes has actually been an insecticide. Even with an open door and heaps of infectious aphids outside, the drying cedar has given me pest-free water plants in the greenhouse.

Some of you may already have experience with this effect, and if so I'd like to hear from you. I've known for some time that the cedar pet pillows are effective in reducing pet troubles with fleas, but the plant-aphid-cedar oil triangle is news. In preparation for next season, I'm going to round up some fresh cedar shavings and store them in sealed bags, and then next spring hang them up in mesh bags wherever a pest problem develops in the greenhouse. We may even give them a try in the tropicals greenhouse this fall and over the course of the next year, find out if the cedar chips are curative, preventative or only coincidental in the never-ending battle with insects.

Brazier felt the turnout was disappointing, "considering the number of hunters on the island, but (it is) something I hope we can improve on."

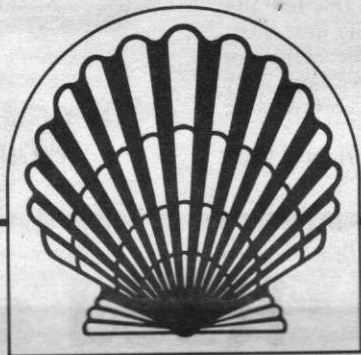
Louie Lorentsen was the shoot's big winner, taking home three prizes. John Bennett finished a close second, and won two prizes.

Library given grant instalment

The Salt Spring Island Public Library Association has been awarded the first installment of its \$40,000 Expo Legacy Fund grant.

A cheque for \$13,333 — representing one-third of the grant total — was forwarded to the library association last week. The grant is being used to fund construction of an addition to the

library.

The remaining two-thirds of the grant is to be sent to the library association as work on the building addition progresses.

The Expo Legacy grant of \$40,000 will cover approximately 40 per cent of the addition's total cost. The remaining \$60,000 needed to finish the building has been donated to the library by

Salt Spring residents.

Sunquest Enterprises of Salt Spring has been awarded the contract to build the addition. Sunquest has agreed to complete the "basic shell" of the facility for a fee of \$75,945. The remaining funding will be used to provide the addition with carpeting, desks, shelves and other items.

Mysterious noise irks islanders

A Vesuvius Bay resident complained last week of a "heavy turbine" noise coming from the B.C. Forest Products pulp and paper mill in Crofton.

Teri Cooper of Chu-an Drive said she noticed an annoying "low-level" noise last week that she thinks was coming from the Crofton mill. She said the sound could be heard intermittently during the week, and in one instance was audible "all night long."

Cooper, who telephoned the Crofton mill on the matter Wednesday, said she found the noise aggravating. She added that studies have shown that low-level noise "does affect health."

The Chu-an Drive resident, who recently moved to the island with her family, realizes the mill employs Salt Spring residents. Nevertheless, she said that if the noise continued, she would consider "moving from the island."

Although Cooper is convinced the noise emanated from the Crofton mill, officials there say they can't understand what could be causing the sounds.

"We had a call from one island resident who asked about the noise," confirmed David Haywood, the Crofton mill's industrial relations officer. "We did an audit to try and found out what it was, but we were not able to identify it. We couldn't find anything in the mill that went on and off at the times she claimed to hear the noise."

Haywood said he even "checked locally" to see if anyone in the Crofton area had heard the noise. No one, he said, had heard anything of the type described by Cooper.

"It's really weird," he said. "If the noise was that distinct on Salt Spring, it would have to be something fairly loud. The only thing that loud would be our emergency safety whistle . . . which is blown once a day at noon, primarily as a test."

Haywood added that the loudest noise created on a constant basis at the mill came from "the compressor located at the back of our newsprint mill." He said, however, that it usually can't be heard from great distance.

Haywood is at a loss to explain the noise Cooper and others in selected Vesuvius Bay areas heard last week. He suggested that perhaps atmospheric conditions somehow enabled Salt Spring residents to hear the mill.

"We don't understand it," he said. "But we try to be responsive to people's concerns. Anyone with any concerns about our operation is free to call. There's someone here 24 hours a day who can take the call, and if there's a noise, we'll do what we can to alleviate the problem."
