Tory accomplishments 'need to be emphasized'

The Progressive Conservatives must do a better job of pointing out the federal government's accomplishments, MP Pat Crofton (Esquimalt-Saanich) told a Salt Spring Island audience last Saturday.

Speaking at a breakfast meeting organized by local Progressive Conservatives and opened to the public, said a false impression of the government has been painted by over-emphasis of its failures and too little attention being paid to its accomplishments.

"The government gets blamed when nothing goes right, but there seems to be a reluctance to give the government credit when things do go right."

While acknowledging that the

Tories have made mistakes since coming to power in 1984, and that the government has done a poor public relations job, Crofton said the Tory accomplishments have not been emphasized. Part of the blame, he said, belongs to the national media.

"Anyone in elected office is frustrated when all of the facts don't get to the people," he said. "The media has a sense of survival; it prints what sells. It attempts perspective, but what you end up with is only part of the story — and the bits that are missed give a false impression."

As one example, Crofton noted that 2,000 people recently demonstrated in Ottawa in support of changes to the proposed Drug Patent Act, which would extend

the length of time pharmaceutical companies have exclusive right to manufacture new drugs. "There wasn't one peep about it on TV," Crofton said.

As another example, the MP cited the furor which greeted news that Mila Mulrone, wife of the Prime Minister, had intervened in the case of a teacher of the couple's children who was seeking an immigration permit at the same time as the Tories presented tough new immigration legislation. "We shot ourselves in the leg on that one," Crofton said, but he noted that the type of permit being requested is one that is issued about 5,000 times a year.

"It was blown out of proportion," he added.

At the same time as the government has been under criticism for those events, Crofton said, its record in managing the economy has been overlooked. He pointed out that Canada's economic performance in 1986 was better than that of any industrialized nation, and the growth of the economy in both the first and second quarters of 1987 was in the six per cent range. He also noted that national unemployment is at its lowest point in five years, and that the government is creating 25,500 new jobs a month, tops among industrialized nations.

Crofton said that one reason the Tories may not be succeeding in informing the public about its accomplishments is because the government "has been so intent

on presenting good legislation that we've overlooked the need to explain ourselves."

He added: "Communication is important. We must convey today's information, today's message to the public. There has not been enough playing up of our legislation — the onus is on us to stand up and play it up. If we Progressive Conservatives do not defend our policies, no one will."

Trade policy questions highlight MP's meeting

Trade inside Canada and with the United States was a main concern raised by Salt Spring residents attending a breakfast meeting held last Saturday with Progressive Conservative MP Pat Crofton (Esquimalt-Saanich).

After Crofton had discussed free trade negotiations currently underway between Canada and the U.S., one member of the audience indicated it would be ironic to reach such an agreement while trade barriers still exist between Canadian provinces.

Three examples of inequities were pointed out:

- dairy production rules which see B.C. import butter from Ontario and Quebec because the province has only three per cent of the allowable production quotas while holding 11 per cent of the Canadian population;
- freight rate policies which make it more expensive to ship goods from the west to the east than vice versa; and
- other freight rate policies which see westerners subsidize the cost of transporting to the east imported goods which are landed in Vancouver.

Crofton acknowledged the problems, saying the Progressive Conservative government is "working to resolve those inequities."

Dealing first with the question of dairy quotas, Crofton said the agricultural industry is heavily regulated and the government is having "a fight" with farmers who do not wish to see market regulations freed up but continues to look for solutions.

On the question of freight rates, he noted the government has introduced a bill to deregulate the rail industry.

He agreed with the audience

that one effect of current freight rates is a reluctance by Ontario to buy coal from B.C., even though it would reduce acid rain emissions in that province, because cheaper coal is available from the U.S.

The federal government, he continued, is looking at a subsidy for Ontario to make the purchase of B.C. coal more attractive.

Earlier, Crofton had outlined the status of free trade discussions between Canada and the U.S., saying the government's position was that "if we don't get a good deal, we won't have a deal."

A Canadian condition in the talks is inclusion of a "binding, foolproof" dispute mechanism, without which no agreement is possible, he said.

As those discussions continue, Crofton said, Canada is attempting to introduce trade benefits through the General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade (GATT), but said that route is a much slower process.

Crofton added that the term *free trade* is a misnomer. "We have been trying, from the outset, for secured trade, and enhanced where possible," he said, explaining that the danger to Canada is increased U.S. protectionism which might cut off markets in America.

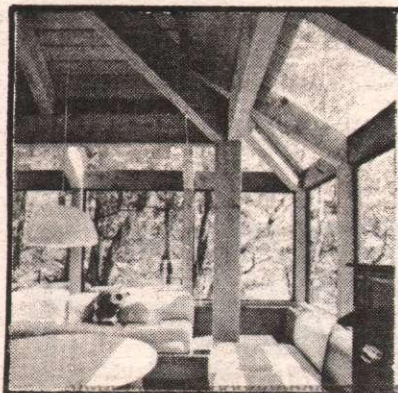

Symphony to appear on Pender

PENDER ISLANDS — History is made of events like this—the first full symphony concert to be given in the Outer Gulf Islands.

The island is North Pender. Time and date are the afternoon of Sunday, November 15, and the place is the gym in Pender Community School.

And the orchestra? Why, the full Victoria Symphony Orchestra, of course.

The unprecedented event is the latest organizational triumph of the Outreach Program sponsored by the enterprising Pender (Lender) Library, an all-volunteer, non-profit society which heretofore has brought in outstanding speakers.

The program was initiated in March, its purpose to show that a library can be a vital, lively force in a small community, by reaching beyond its traditional role as a valued but essentially static community resource.

"And that's the way it's working out," says library president June Hall. "The new perception of what a library can be through the Outreach Program, the outstanding speakers we have brought to the island—and now the Victoria Symphony—are the talk of this island. It has stimulated renewed interest that is beginning to show up at the library itself."

Popularity of the program was made clear again September 9 when just over 300 islanders swept into the gym to hear Antarctic explorer-adventurer Gareth Wood, of Sidney, tell of and illustrate his trek to the South Pole and his two years in Antarctica. Wood was given a standing ovation.

(A summary of Outreach speakers to date and pending appeared in the September 2 issue of *Driftwood*).

Pender Library has over 10,000 volumes on its shelves—and is rapidly running out of space. It has one of the highest per capita member-population ratios among rural libraries in the province. Island population is about 1,300 persons. Library membership is reaching for the 400 mark.

Concert tickets will go on sale at the library and through members at \$12 per adult, \$6 for children 12 years and under. The number of tickets (seats available) will be about 325. Proceeds over and above the \$3,000 basic fee to bring the orchestra to Pender, plus incidental expenses, will go back into the Outreach program, said Mrs. Hall. Early indications are the concert will be a sellout, she added.

Pender Island artist offers retrospective

PENDER ISLANDS — Joseph Hecel, a noted goldsmith and jeweller, held a three-day reception and showing of his works at Pender Lodge during the Labour Day weekend.

The lodge was entirely taken over by Hecel's guests, who attended the event from Ontario, California and other regions in B.C. Over 100 guests attended a private reception on Saturday afternoon, and on Sunday and Monday the show was opened to the public.

The Polish-born Hecel studied at the Munich Academy, graduating with a gold medal. Just prior to the German invasion of his homeland in 1939, Hecel completed a personal chalice for a young Polish priest. He is now Pope John Paul II, who uses the chalice in private Vatican services.

Other Hecel chalices and objects d'art reside in cathedrals

and private collections throughout Europe and North America.

After spending the Second World War in a concentration camp in Europe, Hecel emigrated to Vancouver in 1953 and opened a business on South Granville Street that soon attracted clients seeking fine wrought jewellery articles.

Hecel's works have been shown in Toronto, Vancouver, Calgary and Seattle, and he has been the subject of television programs and magazine articles.

Although he has long since retired, Hecel continues to work for customers all across Canada.

For the past 10 years, Hecel has lived on Pender Island, in a house on the beach. Logs arrive on his doorstep from the ocean, waiting to be carved into thought-provoking statuary by his clever hands and imaginative brain.

GALIANO ISLAND—A celebration was held in North Galiano on Thursday, September 10, in honour of the arrival on the island of the community's newly-acquired Mercury Thibault fire vehicle.

Hecel says the shape of the logs is more important than the type of wood. Whenever he sees an interesting log, his imagination goes to work to produce ideas which his hands transfer to the wood.

One of Hecel's recent carvings is titled *Flame of Chernobyl*. It was made from a cottonwood log which arrived on his beach one day. The carving is tall, and the wood hollow and burned out. A face looking out from the front is sad and weeping.

Another carving, *The Creation of Man*, was carved from a yellow cedar log brought to Pender Island by a neighbour, who picked it up while at sea and donated it to Hecel. At the top of the tall, straight carving are three beautiful faces representing a woman, a man and God. Below, in series around the carving, are six faces — each progressively less attractive, down to the bottom one, which is ugly.

In all, the show presented 28 carvings depicting a range of human characteristics, from the terror of the concentration camps to holiness.

From the time of his youth, Hecel aspired to produce a jeweled egg in the style of Faberge, the French artist who was commissioned by the Czars of Russia

to produce beautiful art objects. Hecel realized his ambition and produced not one but two eggs, one of which was on display at the Pender event.

Other artists were also represented. Robyn Leake, a Pender Island resident and rising artist, displayed large-sized paintings done with chalk pastels, and Hecel's niece — Plug Craudel, an

artist visiting Pender from Germany — showed six oil paintings, primarily of Vancouver Island beach scenes.

Premek Kruta, a friend of Hecel's from Toronto and a professional singer and classical guitarist, entertained the guests with sons. A Czechoslovakian by birth, he speaks and sings in 14 languages.

Galiano Island school prepared for 1987-88 term

Galiano School opened its doors on Tuesday, September 8, to reveal a number of changes which have taken place during the summer. One classroom has been converted into a spacious library and another classroom added. New toilets in the Activity Centre portion of the building will serve both the higher grades and the adult public using the Centre. The parking area in front of the school has been paved and the playing field turfed. The survival of the new grass can be credited to the efforts of Rosemary Walker and Ed Andrusiak, who spent countless hours during the past hot, dry weeks watering.

Volunteer librarian Phyllis Stafford and her assistants have also spent much time at the school moving and re-organizing the school library, which incidentally is available to the public. There is now space for additional books and donations of books and other suitable material are welcome. The school plans to use the Memorial Fund to purchase more books. To give the public an opportunity to view the additions and changes, a ceremonial 'opening' will be organized in about a month's time.

The 91 pupils who registered (a record high number for Galiano) are organized in five classes. Kindergarten meets in the morning and the 16 pupils are taught by Louise Miller. The regular classes, Grades One and Two, are taught by Lynne Scott, Grades Two and Three by new teacher Barry Bartlett, Grades Four and Five are taught by Catherine Maneker, with Elizabeth Brinson as principal and teacher of Grades Six and Seven. Robin Bracht will teach French and P.E., and relieve the principal for administrative duties. Steve Nemtin is the part time special education and learning-assistance teacher. Auxiliary staff are Marion Williams, secretary; Doug Smith, janitor; and Kelly Blackwood, bus driver.

Playschool

The Galiano playschool for pre-school children has a qualified teacher, provincial certification and a dozen pupils but no premises. The Harris' cottage, which was used last year, is no longer available owing to the imminent departure of the Harrises. The parents who organize the school would appreciate any offers of accommodation and can afford to pay a modest rent.

The building or space should have electricity, toilet, running water and be 300 to 500 square feet in area. Offers of help will be gratefully received by Martha Miller, (telephone 2740), or Joceline Bourque (2157).

Perhaps the Garden Club members should consider changes to the time, format and location of the show if they hope to encourage more entries.

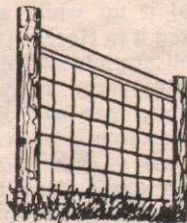

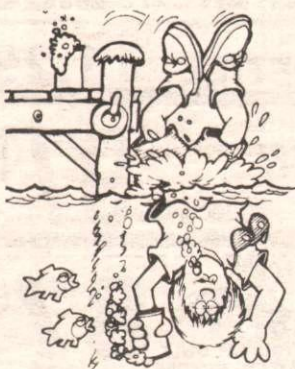
Many of the ferry crew members working on the *Vesuvius Queen* over the summer have been replaced by staff with more seniority when applications for the next three-month stint were received.

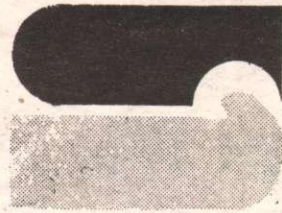
The upper store, Saturna General, is changing its hours for the winter — 9:30 am to 6 pm, closed Sundays.

Stamps support research

Anyone interested in supporting cancer research beyond a once-a-year event like the Terry Fox Run held last weekend on Salt Spring should consider clipping stamps.

That's right — stamps. The Salt Spring Island chapter of the Order of the Eastern Star collects and sells cancelled stamps to raise funds which are, in turn, directed towards cancer research and the provision of free cancer dressings to all patients who require them.

Stamps gathered by the Order of the Eastern Star are either sold as collector's items or for dyes. It advises that all stamps clipped should leave a good border around the perforations — preferably one-half inch, if possible.

At the annual session of the Eastern Star's Grand Chapter of B.C., held last May, a cheque for \$11,517.45 was presented to Worthy Grand Matron Roberta Millin. The total represented the amount raised during the previous year from the sale of cancelled stamps.

Accountant given fine

A Salt Spring Island chartered accountant pleaded guilty in Ganges provincial court Tuesday to eight counts of failing to file tax returns for himself and two of his client corporations.

Judge Hudson levied fines totalling \$1,600 against Ross R. McKinnon.

Crown Counsel Jennifer Power-Dixon asked the court to impose the minimum fine of \$200 on each count as McKinnon and the two corporations had since filed all but one return.

As well as being fined for not filing his own tax return, McKinnon was fined as director of the two corporations also charged — Michael Management Ltd. and Mac Data Ltd.

The court has issued a compliance order against McKinnon as director of Michael Management Ltd. for the outstanding 1986 T2 return.

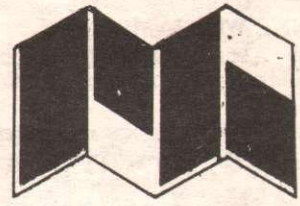
Of the eight counts, three were for McKinnon's missing T1 returns for the years 1983, 1984 and 1985. Two counts were for missing returns for Mac Data for the years 1984 and 1985, and the remaining three counts stemmed from Michael Management Ltd.'s missing returns for 1984, 1985, and 1986.

"In our continuing effort to identify taxpayers who should be filing returns, Revenue Canada has over 30 cases before the courts, on Vancouver Island alone, in which taxpayers face charges for failing to file returns," said spokesman Dan McGrath after the court case.

McGrath is the public affairs manager for the district office of Revenue Canada in Victoria.

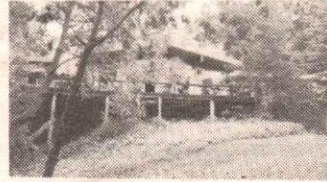

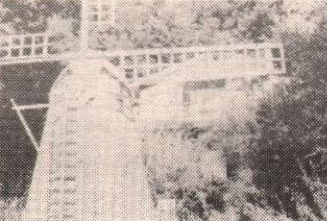

Turf expert says

Fall better time than summer to attempt new lawn growth

Before we launch ourselves back into the seemingly countless chores and jobs to do out in the yard, I would like to take the opportunity to express my appreciation for what we all will be able to enjoy this coming weekend at the Salt Spring Island Fall Fair. The folks at the Farmer's Institute and those who work so hard to bring us the fair deserve a lot of credit for all of that behind-the-scenes effort to make the displays, shows and events so beautiful, and so much fun.

While entries are no longer being accepted (Saturday was the last chance), we still have an opportunity to show our support for all of the top-quality farming and gardening that goes on here, as well as the baking, preserves, traditional crafts, photography, art, livestock and equestrian shows. It is all so great and so much a part of our cultural fabric; the kids love it and so does the kid in every one of us. Let's give it our full backing, and who knows—maybe next year we can all enter a few of our prize productions. I guess I'd better get started on my zucchini patch right away.

An interesting effect of this hot summer's dry, sunny, weather has been that the gardens have tended to mature and finish off earlier than in past seasons. For many, a successful harvest was taken, albeit too early to have been prime for the fall fair, and then for those unfortunate masses who exhausted their water supplies, there was failure and garden abandonment to deal with.

Even for those with water, a few plants slipped into desiccation and demise, overlooked just once, and then lost.

In any event, when any of your plants' leaves brown and wither prematurely, don't jump on it and rip it up; just wait. Prune off any dead leaves and stems which show no signs of any green coloration in their bark or cambium, and water the plant carefully. While it is a good idea to give dried-out plants a good deep soaking to saturate the pore spaces in the soil and to revitalize the root tissues, you don't want to push out all of the air in the soil, as root rots will then invade and attack the weakened roots. After the initial soaking, water moderately, allowing the soil to dry off a bit each time.

According to the provincial government turf expert, the second half of September is the best time of the year to establish a lawn in the coastal region of British Columbia. While we have been able to create excellent-quality lawns during all of the spring and summer months as well, the key factors in the game are soil workability and lots of water on tap. While a summer-planted lawn would grow and establish so well in two weeks that cutting would be required, it would also take vast amounts of water and careful attention to keep it moistened down—something that fall-planted lawns aren't as demanding about.

Whenever you choose to do it, lawn preparation begins by creating proper sloping and grading to ensure positive surface drainage of excess water (winter floods), and then you must loosen and improve the soil to a depth of six inches. Remove stones and roots, and do a thorough raking. If you need some better quality

topsoil, mix it in with the existing soil and, to improve the organic matter content, add one to two inches of sawdust and incorporate it well also.

(Fresh cedar sawdust can affect the germination of seeds, but if aged or mixed in with fir, alder, etc., it is just fine).

After mixing it all and raking well, roll the area to compress the

ratio for the best results. To compensate for the microbial robbers that will be working on the sawdust breakdown, apply some nitrogen, either sulphate of ammonia at 10 pounds per 1,000 sq. ft. or, for a longer feeding, use 34-0-0 (at seven to eight pounds per 1,000 sq. ft.).

Rake the amendments in lightly and then sow down the grass seed at one pound for every 150 to 200 square feet, depending on the seed mix. For a more drought-tolerant and wear-resistant lawn, ensure that the lawn seed mix contains some dwarf perennial ryegrass. Next, pass a leaf rake over the area, just flipping the seed under a quarter inch or so, and then roll again and water in well. Over the next couple of weeks, the surface should not be allowed to dry out, and if the temperatures are high enough, the lawn will show some growth by month-end.

In the vegetable garden, you will no doubt be harvesting almost all of the remaining veggies. Leave the parsnips, jerusalem artichokes, rutabagas, and leeks in the ground until needed for the table, as they keep best and taste best if left out in the soil. Leave your tomatoes on the vine until ripe or until just before the first frosts, and dig your main crop potatoes as the tops turn brown and start to die down. You can still do sowings of turnips, swiss chard, radishes, spinach and cress for a fall-winter crop, and started lettuce and brassica plants may be planted out now. Keep up with cleanup, feeding the vegetation to your compost, and sow down a green manure-cover crop such as winter wheat, fall rye or mustard to compete with the weeds, and improve the organic matter content of your garden soil.

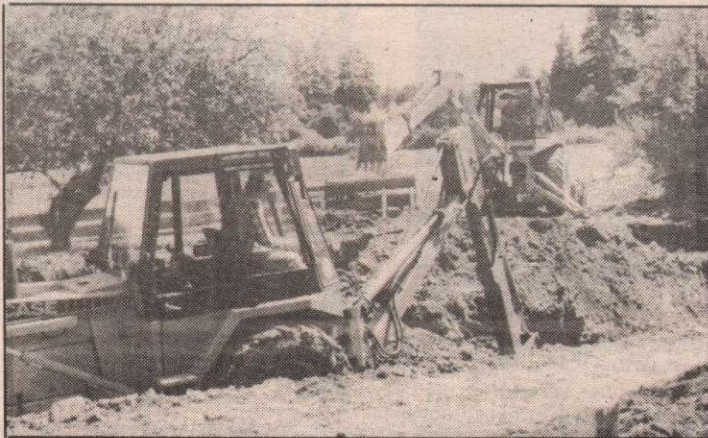

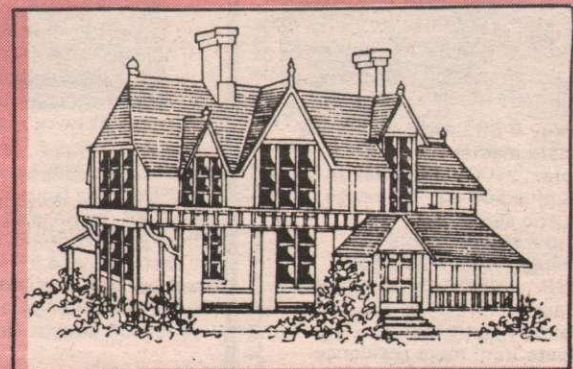

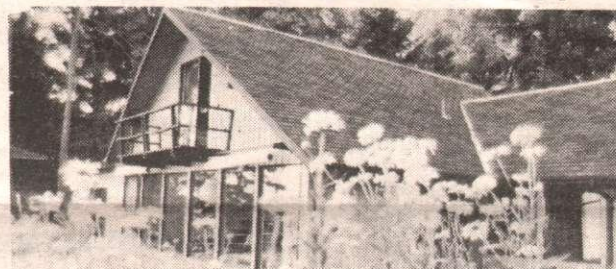

Twenty-five years ago

- *Driftwood* editor Woody Fisher was made a Lifetime Member of MOIS (Mystic Order of the Itching Stitch). The honorary degree conferred upon Fisher invests him with the right to talk about his operation on all occasions.
- Salt Spring residents were urged by J.M. Evans to vote *yes* on the forthcoming gym referendum.
- Temporary grass greens were put in the golf course — an improvement over the original sand 'greens.' Sidney Quinton urged islanders to support the construction of a club house for the course. Without a club house, the whole project falls into the category of "unfinished business" — and Salt Spring Islanders don't like unfinished business, he said.
- A rather unique accident sent Ganges' new Public Health nurse to the hospital emergency ward soon after her arrival. Mrs. Doris Coombes was chased by a bulldozer and fell into a hole on her new property on Sunset Drive.
- O.M. Olson of McGill Road on Salt Spring held a lucky number at the Pacific National Exhibition and was the happy winner of a deluxe model Dodge car.

Twenty years ago

- Movies returned to Salt Spring. Former motion picture man and sports and entertainment promoter Gordon A. Simmons brought motion pictures to Fulford Hall every alternate Wednesday and Saturday.
- An adequate supply of water was maintained on Salt Spring during the summer only by the use of two gas-powered pumps at Maxwell Lake. Constant demand for more water would soon exhaust the capabilities of the present service, ratepayers were told.
- First cup finals at the Galiano Golf Club for the 1967 season were played September 17 for the Jack Trophy mixed handicap. Mrs. Irine Lee was the winner with Betty Stewart the runner up.
- The 1966 census showed the following populations: Galiano 292, Mayne 167, North Pender 278, South Pender 49 and Saturna 105.

Fifteen years ago

- Former Attorney-General Robert Bonner officially opened Camp Yawaca on behalf of Mac-Millan-Blodel.
- Bonner headed the large lumber company, which leased land to the Young Women's Christian Association in order to establish their annual summer camp at Beaver Point.
- Salt Spring Island became the first electoral area and the second island in the Capital Regional District to make public a community plan proposal to control land use.
- The newly-published community plan provided for the replacement of the 10-acre freeze on land development on Salt Spring with controls that would provide a basic five-acre lot development, but also permit development of one-acre lots.
- Bill Arnold made 32 miles on Day One of his cross-Canada Run. He set out from Ganges and spent the next two hours on the ferry. It was a last-minute panic to get away and "I had to run pretty hard to make the ferry," he said.

• Colin King of Old Scott Road reported seeing a bright object in the sky shortly after 8 pm Thursday. The light moved rapidly from south to west.

Ten years ago

- A break-in at Embe bakery in Ganges was thwarted by a member of the staff. When a man broke into the rear of the building, an employee went back to see what was causing the noise. She found a stranger in the room. The burglar made no attempt to explain himself; he took off.
- A number of Ganges residents demanded that the sewer petition be rescinded. At two meetings held on Salt Spring the week before, opinion was almost unanimous that the petition be stopped. Meeting-goers charged that the canvassers who took the petitions around had been misleading and that, in some cases, pressure had been applied in order to obtain signatures.
- Bob Akerman and Deanna Marleau were the top scorers at bowling for the week, with scores of 722 and 794, respectively.

• Philip Wade of Pender Island came second in the ewe lamb class and second in the market lamb class at the Salt Spring Island Fall Fair.

• The Islands Trust took a firm stand on the oil ports issue and

the resultant hazard to coastal waters. At the initial hearing of the West Coast Oil Ports Inquiry in Vancouver in July, the Islands Trust presented a brief on the area it represents and the potential hazards of an oil spill there.

Five years ago

- The budget for Gulf Islands schools was cut by \$110,006 to meet the restraint program of the provincial government. The school board was forced to cut the budget because the ministry of education had reduced the grant for school district expenses and told the board to find ways of meeting the reduction.
- A Vancouver man was saved from death by drowning by quick action of people at Montague Park on Galiano Saturday. Louie Conneley was pulled from the water after it was observed that he was having difficulties. His companions used a breathing tube from a boat's first aid kit to help him start breathing again.
- One hundred and three runners participated in the Terry Fox Run on Salt Spring Island, raising a total of \$390 for the Cancer Research Fund. Some walked, some ran — one entrant even roller-skated — and many bicycled on the three different routes of one, three and five kilometres.
- Preliminary enrolment figures for Gulf Islands schools showed an increase of five-and-a-half per cent.

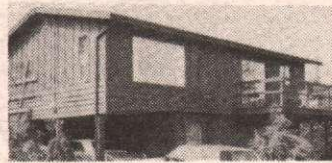

Malcolm Robertson, the manager of the Salt Spring Golf and Country Club for the past nine years, is retiring (again) and will be replaced by a golf pro born and raised in Robertson's home town — Paisley, Scotland.

"I'm not retirement age according to the definition of the government, but I've always been a retired person at heart," says Robertson.

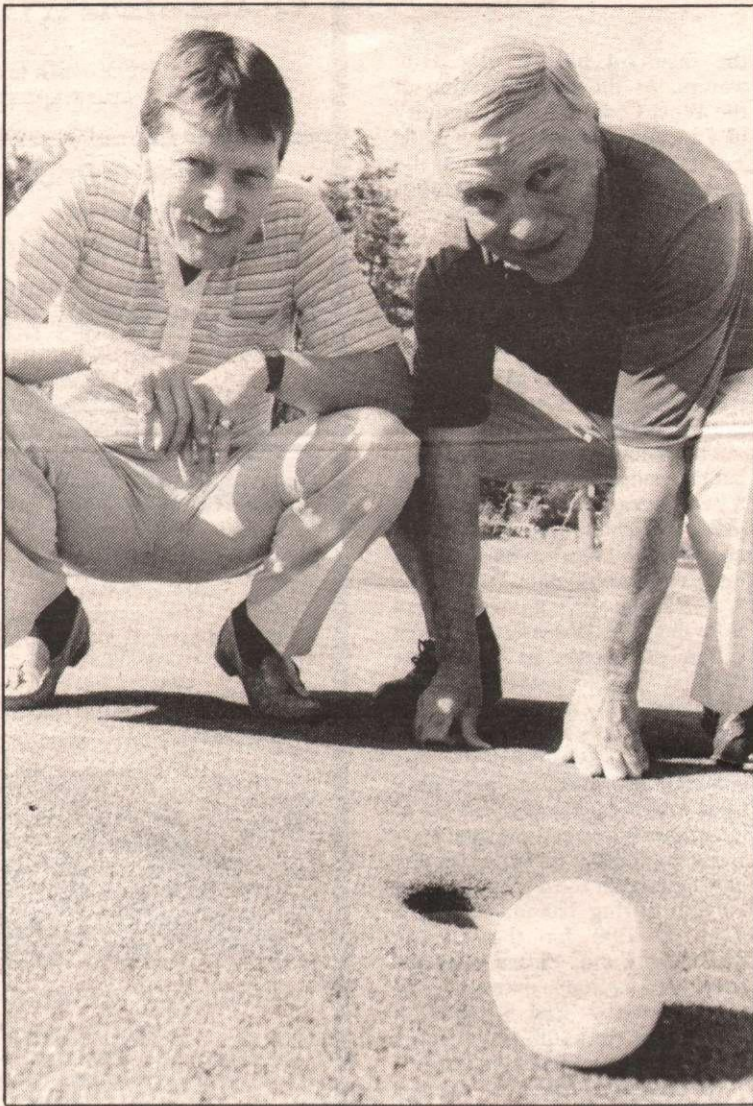
The former owner of Booth Bay Resort said the golf course has improved physically in the last decade, grown in terms of members and visitors and become a more financially viable operation.

"Certain holes are not particularly long but they're very tricky so you've got to use your head and proper club selection — and I didn't do that. I took out the driver and landed in the bushes and Malcolm wouldn't even let

The club's new golf pro said that he has a good teaching track record and hopes that members will not be loathe to approach him for help. The job transition will take place about the middle of September.

Fergusson has been involved for years in the relatively rare art of club-making and club repairs and hopes eventually to have the workshop space at the club to continue that work.

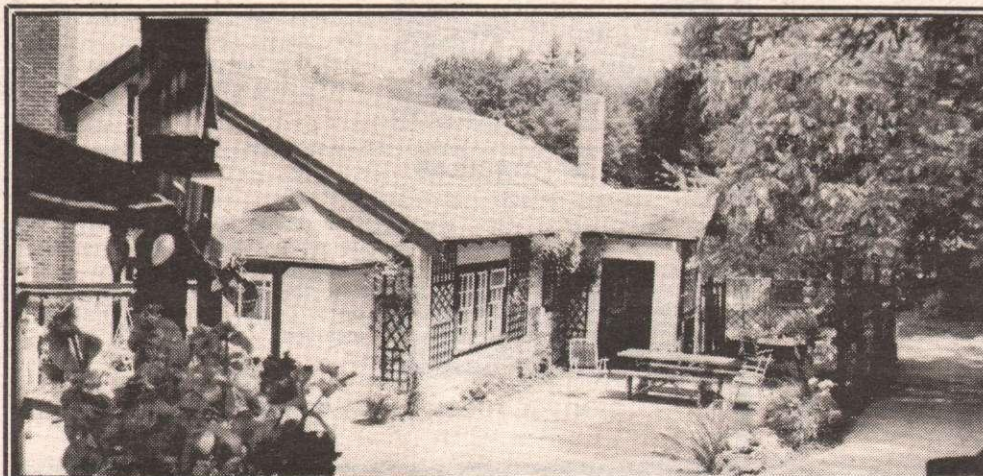

Building statistics show hike

The value of building work underway on the Gulf Islands in 1987 is \$2 million ahead of the level reached at the same point last year.

From January to the end of July, 1986, work worth \$5.735 million was underway or completed on the islands. In the same period of 1987, the building activity is worth \$7.961 million.

The increases, outlined in statistics released last week by the Capital Regional District (CRD) building permits office, are evident on both Salt Spring and all of the Outer Islands.

Year-to-date figures to the end of July show building work on Salt Spring to be worth \$4.954 million in 1987, compared to \$3.126 million for the same period in 1986. On the Outer Island, the current year-to-date total is \$3,007 million, while the 1986 figure was \$2.627 million.

Building activity in July helped to keep the 1987 totals ahead of those for 1986. On Salt Spring, July saw 39 permits taken out for work worth \$551,752. A year earlier, the figures were 422 permits for work valued at \$469,963. On the Outer Islands, there were 34 building permits issued this July, for work worth \$511,080. In July, 1986, there were 24 permits taken out for work valued at \$408,889.

The July, 1987, totals for Salt Spring included seven permits for single-family dwellings, two for commercial or industrial buildings, 13 for plumbing work, eight for chimneys and nine for 'other' projects. That brought the year-to-date figures to 47 permits for single-family dwellings, six for mobile homes, one for a moved dwellings, 12 for commercial or industrial buildings, 107 for plumbing work, 51 for chimneys and 57 for 'other' projects.

From January to July, 1986, Salt Spring Islanders took out 31 permits for single-family dwellings, seven for mobile homes, six for moved dwellings, 12 for commercial or industrial buildings, 129 for plumbing work, 41 for chimneys and 51 for 'other' projects.

On the Outer Islands, all but Galiano boast a building pace ahead of 1986 figures. Current year-to-date statistics, with numbers for 1986 in parentheses, are as follows:

- PENDER: single-family dwellings, 18 (7); commercial or industrial buildings, 2 (3); plumbing, 48 (27); chimney, 23 (14); other, 28 (15). Value of work, \$1.27 million (\$1.02 million).
- SATURNA: single-family dwellings, 1 (2); commercial or industrial buildings, 2 (0); plumbing, 4 (4); chimney, 3 (4); other, 4 (3). Value of work, \$147,896 (\$119,250).
- MAYNE: single-family dwellings, 12 (7); commercial or industrial buildings, 2 (0); plumbing, 16 (14); chimney, 9 (7); other, 5 (9). Value of work, \$670,043 (\$404,000).
- GALIANO: single-family dwellings, 9 (15); mobile homes, 1 (0); commercial or industrial buildings, 5 (2); plumbing, 18 (20); chimney, 12 (12); other, 8 (12). Value of work, \$920,472 (\$1.08 million).

Mayne led the way in July, 1987, with 14 permits for work worth \$359,455.
