

Galiano's Terry Fox Run raises over \$900

The run and walk to honour the memory of Terry Fox took place on Galiano a week late, on Sunday, September 20. This delayed start enabled participants to follow the usual route through Bluffs Park, which had been closed due to the extreme fire hazard. Starting and finishing at the South Community Hall, participants were encouraged on their way by a refreshment stand and check point in Bluffs Park, manned by Jim Scoones.

Over 20 islanders completed the circuit by running, jogging, walking or cycling with the youngest, two-year-old Sasha, in her own wheels pushed by her mother Penny Trueit. The first of the foot-sloggers to finish were John Coates and his nine-year-old daughter, Jeannie. Heading all the walkers was Elizabeth Steward in one hour and 20 minutes, slightly longer than her last year's record time. Second was Ragna Frederickson's granddaughter, Kate Jarvis. Youngest walker was Phoebe Trueit and oldest was Warren Foster. First to return were cyclists Don Anderson and his daughter, Megan.

The event was organized by the Galiano Club and secretary-treasurer Don Macdonald, assisted by Jim Ripley, sat at the receipt of pledges and collected over \$900 with more to come. Late donations may be made out to the Galiano Club and marked *Terry Fox Fund*. They can be mailed to the Galiano Club, Box 219, or given to Donald Macdonald.

There was no intention to challenge other communities, but Salt Springers might note that the per capita Galiano contribution will be approximately \$1.30. The *Driftwood* staff at Ganges should not preen themselves too much for their 80 per cent turnout, as ours on Galiano was 100 per cent and we both enjoyed the walk.

Although about half the participants were children, the general turnout was disappointing. Mrs. Brinson, who walked the course, had challenged her grades six and seven pupils to participate, especially as they might later expect the community to contribute to their fund-raising efforts to raise money for field trips. Only three of the class turned up for the event. You blew it, kids.

The public, regardless of political persuasion, is warmly invited to attend and question Mr. Manly.

Violin-Piano Duo

A full house at La Berengerie was treated to a lively and entertaining recital by Jean Knight, violin, and Angela Funk, piano. As *Western Living* remarked in a recent issue in which Gulf Island eating places were discussed, 'Madame' favours the Baroque, and so the performance began with a Telemann sonata for violin and piano. 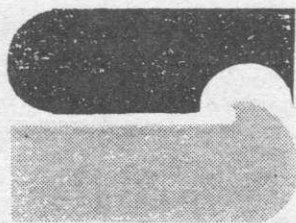

with and similar to J. S. Bach in style, this sonata made for pleasant and not too demanding listening. There was a happy partnership between the two players and between them and the audience.

This was no background music to eating, but a performance to which the audience listened intently and attentively. The sound of these two instruments just suits the size and acoustics of a dining room, except for a few occasions when, with the loud pedal down, the piano was a little too dominant.

Mozart's violin sonata in C major began with a simplicity of theme and in a key that can easily

become trite. However the last two movements provided the most exciting music of the evening. Two obscure composers, Fuocco and Lachner, made charming contributions to the program — more attractive than the over-popular Dvorak and an arrangement of the Londonderry Air. Not the least enjoyable part of a very pleasant evening was the commentary introducing each item given by Mrs. Knight.



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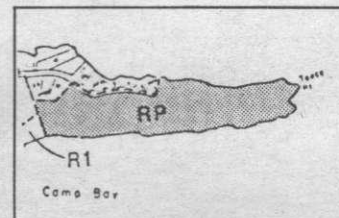
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East Point lighthouse has long, colourful history

were lack of access by road to other parts of Saturna Island, a serious shortage of water and an ongoing battle to preserve the lighthouse building from the elements.

Initially, mail was obtained from Mayne Island, until a post office was established at Saturna in the late 1890s. But it took all day to reach the post office by hiking over several mountains. And if someone at the lighthouse became ill during stormy weather, when a boat could not be launched, medicine and medical assistance could not be quickly secured.

A road to East Point, suitable for vehicles, was not completed until the 1950s. As late as the 1940s, Mrs. Kathleen Ritchie, wife of keeper Andrew Ritchie, made the 11-mile return trip to the post office by horseback, over

trail and road, twice a week.

The "driest of all stations" presented a serious fire hazard during the summer months, when water supplies were at their lowest. The family of keeper James Georgeson had a close call in June, 1889, when a brush fire threatened to spread to the buildings. Quick thinking by George Georgeson saved the station, and thereafter the keeper had orders to keep the grounds clear of underbrush.

The dry winter of 1894-95 created a serious water shortage by April, 1895, when water had to be carried from two miles away. Various cisterns and catchment systems were tried over the years but most proved inadequate and suffered from inundation by salt water spray during winter storms, or by the demise of inquisitive rats. Currently, drinking water is obtained by purifying rain water.

Although the East Point station was spared the terrible storms endured by other West Coast stations, it did not fare well over the years. In 1896, the kitchen floor had to be replaced, and by 1904 the shingles — nailed on with ungalvanized nails — were

blowing off. Carpenter ants invaded the wooden structure, making terrible inroads by the 1920s.

Ideally, the building should have been replaced in the late 1930s, but the Second World War

created a scarcity of building materials. When a 35-mile-per-hour gale reduced the light to rotating at half-speed in 1945, it could only be wired down. Stations at Kains Island, Portlock Point and Porlier Pass had seniority for replacement.

Finally, in 1948, a new steel tower was erected at East Point and one of the first airport beacon lights used for marine purposes on the West Coast was installed. The DCB-36 rotating beacon (later changed to a DCB-10) stood 38 feet above the ground and was visible for 17 miles.

When a new residence for the keeper was built in 1967, it was not a difficult task to reduce the old building to rubble.

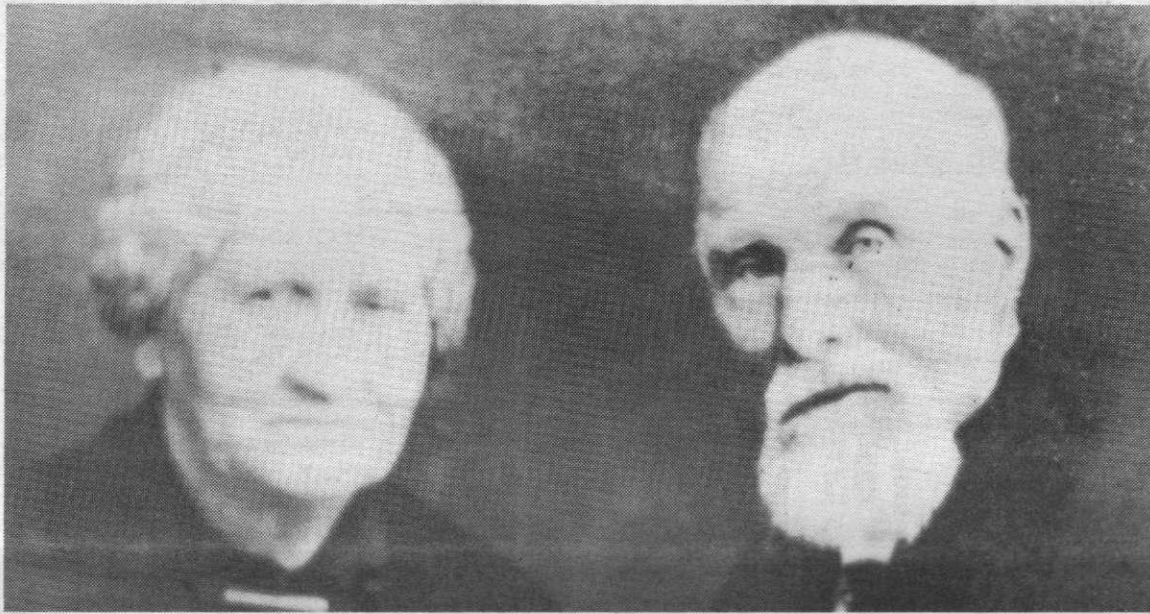
Other improvements were made to the East Point light over the years. In 1918, a diamond vapour light, burning coal oil vapourized under pressure, was

installed with two 90-inch reflectors.

Fog is a terrible menace to navigation in the islands, but various marine agencies and pilots did not demand a fog alarm for East Point until 1935. A fog gun was first installed, but it proved unsatisfactory and was replaced by an alarm installed in a new building in 1938. In 1977, the diaphone fog alarm was disconnected and replaced with a simulated diaphone.

Hydro service arrived in 1970, after Transport Canada provided \$6,000 to ensure that the line reached East Point. Telephone service arrived the same year, although the keeper had the use of a radio telephone beginning in the 1940s.

Today, via satellite, weather information is automatically transferred to Toronto through line-of-sight transmission.

Ceremony set to mark lighthouse's first century of service to sailors

A September 27 ceremony marking the 100th anniversary of Saturna Island's East Point lighthouse will also salute the keepers who manned the station over the past century.

For many of its years of service, the station was staffed by successive members of the Georgeson family, whose tenure began in 1889 under Shetland Islander James Georgeson, brother of Henry Georgeson who was then keeper of the Active Pass light at Georgina Point on Mayne Island.

James Georgeson arrived at the Saturna Island station to replace its first keeper, John Wick, who had assumed his duties on January 1, 1888, and left in 1889 to take over the Sand Heads Lightship.

With James Georgeson came his wife, Joan, and their large family, which would grow by two more children on Saturna. James established a farm on Saturna and, with brother-in-law Peter Garrick, built boats for himself and other islanders.

The farm helped James supplement his annual salary of \$500, which increased to \$510 in 1901. Several times a year, he would sail across the Strait of Georgia to New Westminster for staples.

When the Georgeson children were ready to attend school, James purchased a small farm on Mayne Island, where his children and those of the George Taylor family of Saturna care for one another.

In total, eight members of

several branches of the Georgeson family have been involved with lighthouse keeping on the West Coast. James cared for the East Point light from 1889 until 1921, and was awarded a Long Service medal. His son Peter, who had assisted since 1909, took over as keeper in 1921, on an annual salary of \$750.

Peter married Nellie Aitken of Mayne Island in 1923 and they had two sons, Kenneth and James. Kenneth later became involved in lighthouse keeping while Nellie's nephew, Donald De Rouise, is currently a senior keeper on the coast, stationed at the Active Pass light.

Peter and Nellie transferred to the Albert Head lighthouse in 1939 and were replaced at East Point by Peter's brother, Henry, until Andrew and Kathleen Ritchie transferred from Race Rocks in 1940.

Subsequent keepers at East Point were Bob and Iris Quinney, Art and Mary Waldren, Art and Vivian Britton, and Ian and Joan McNeil. Junior keepers were Pete Fletcher, I. McNeil, R. Kerpan, D. McNeil, Babe Chapman, R. Wells, John Davidson, Frank Lake and Dennis Johnson.

Artists display works at Pender's art show

PENDER ISLANDS — Numerous residents and their guests attended an excellent Labour Day weekend show featuring works by Pender Island artists.

About 30 artists exhibited at the two-day event and were pleased with public reaction and the sales made. All artists who participated live either full-time or part-time on the island.

The art show offered some interesting items, like the *Talking Stick* carved by Dr. J. McKeague of South Pender and shown courtesy of Dr. and Mrs. D. Blanchard of Pender Island.

An ancient parliamentary tool, the stick was extremely heavy — more in the class of a club. It was required of the speaker in a parliamentary session to hold this heavy article upright while making a speech; as its weight was such to tire the arm, it limited the length of a speech. Such "talking sticks" are also part of Indian customs.

Also shown was a 15-minute video, *Off The Wall*, prepared and shown by Peter Adamson and accompanied by well-known classical music by Bach and Chopin. The video opened and closed with *Memories*, from *Cats*, and in between featured the works of 10 Pender Island artists.

The show also featured the works of some new island artists not seen previously. Joyce Jones, for example, displayed a number of attractive paintings.

Of the old-time artists, John Kwak was represented by an outstanding representation of the Port Washington store painted from a boat and showing a larger panorama than is usual.

The artworks were well-arranged and classified, with plenty of space being left for the viewers to move about. The show was held in the school gymnasium.

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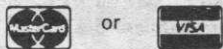

Link with United Way means single agency for fund-raising

As Landon pointed out, all direct fund-raising for the community society — such as the door-to-door solicitation of donations — will now become the United Way's responsibility.

"We'll handle all open appeals for donations," said Landon. "The agencies affiliated with us are not permitted to do that, although we do expect them to conduct other forms of fund-raising. Our rules are that the people they appeal to directly must receive something of value for their money. For example, United Way agencies can hold craft sales, bake sales, raffles, etc. — but not door-to-door campaigns. We'll be working with local groups to help them develop some creative ways of fund-raising."

Community society officials don't mind relinquishing their right to ask the public for donations. In fact, as Jordan-Knox and Swing pointed out, they are pleased the United Way will conduct these campaigns in the future.

This one-agency approach to fund-raising, they noted, will reduce the financial costs associated with conducting such campaigns, and thus ensure a larger proportion of every dollar donated goes directly to the organizations that need it. (The United Way boasts that 95.5 cents of every dollar donated in 1986 went directly to member agencies.)

Both Swing and Jordan-Knox feel local residents will appreciate the change in fund-raising, too. They pointed out that in future, local residents will no longer receive dozens of mail requests for donations from local groups. Instead, islanders will be asked to make a single contribution to the United Way, which in turn will divide it among affiliated organizations serving Salt Spring.

"It certainly won't be the end of the community centre's fund-raising," Jordan-Knox indicated. "Programs like the Christmas Hamper drive, the Christmas Craft Faire and the food bank auction will continue."

The community society's members are pleased to be a part of United Way, which has a record of service in North America dating back to 1887. They are hoping Salt Spring Islanders will continue to support the community centre and its work by giving generously when the United Way's 'mailer' arrives in early October.

"We're ecstatic to be part of United Way," said Jordan-Knox. "It's such a nice association. It has existed for a long time, and is universally recognized as a reputable group. The United Way means something to people, and we think Salt Spring will be excited to know that we're part of it, too."

"I think it will knit people together who came to the island from other communities where the United Way was part of their lives," continued Swing. "It's an international organization with an excellent reputation. Being accepted into it is a real feather in our cap."

Landon is equally pleased to welcome the Salt Spring Island Community Society into the United Way of Greater Victoria. He noted that while many groups apply to the United Way for membership, only a select few with a long and spotless record of community service are accepted. This year, the Salt Spring society was one of only three chosen for admission.

"I feel it will increase the credibility of this group, and increase the United Way's credibility on the island by giving it direct representation here," he said. "The association will be a positive one for all involved."

Reading room established for local cancer patients

The Canadian Cancer Society's Salt Spring unit is establishing a reading room in the community centre to help cancer patients and others cope with disease.

Susan Blagborne, a CanSurmount program volunteer, said last week that under the proposal, a room in the community centre will be open to people from noon to 3 pm every Friday. In it will be books and magazines designed to help people learn to cope with the disease and perhaps heal themselves.

A CanSurmount volunteer will also be on hand to talk with visitors and perhaps refer them to support groups.

"It will be open not just to people with cancer, but to people with any disease," added Blagborne. "It will be there to help them learn about their disease — a quiet place for meditation and thought."

The proposal to establish a reading room for people suffering from serious diseases is the first of its kind on Salt Spring. Blagborne said no official opening date has been set for the room yet, because organizers are still in the process of gathering the necessary books and magazines.

"What we need now are books and magazines for the room," Blagborne said. "We're asking

people if they would like to donate to the room. They should pertain to self-healing, meditation — anything that relates to disease and helping a person heal themselves."

Anyone wanting to donate materials for the room can drop them off at the community centre.



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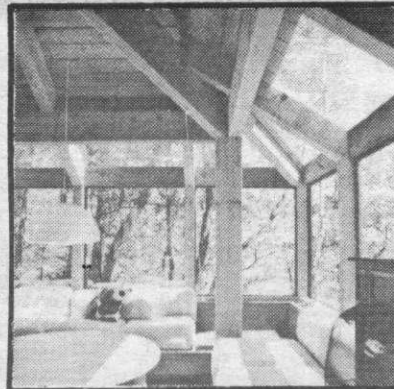
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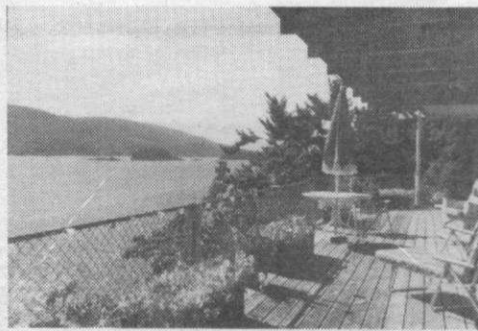
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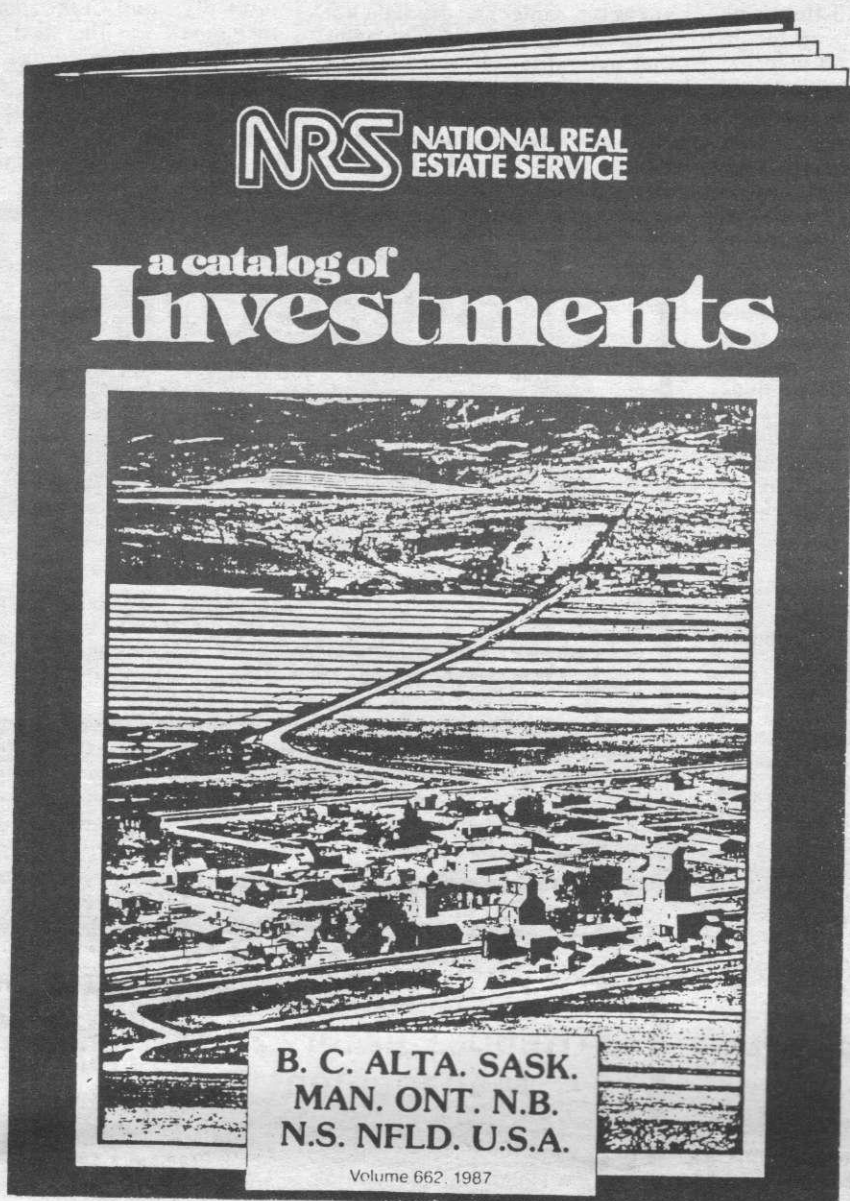


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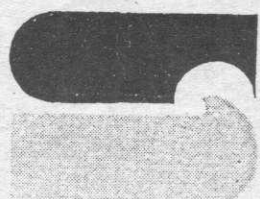
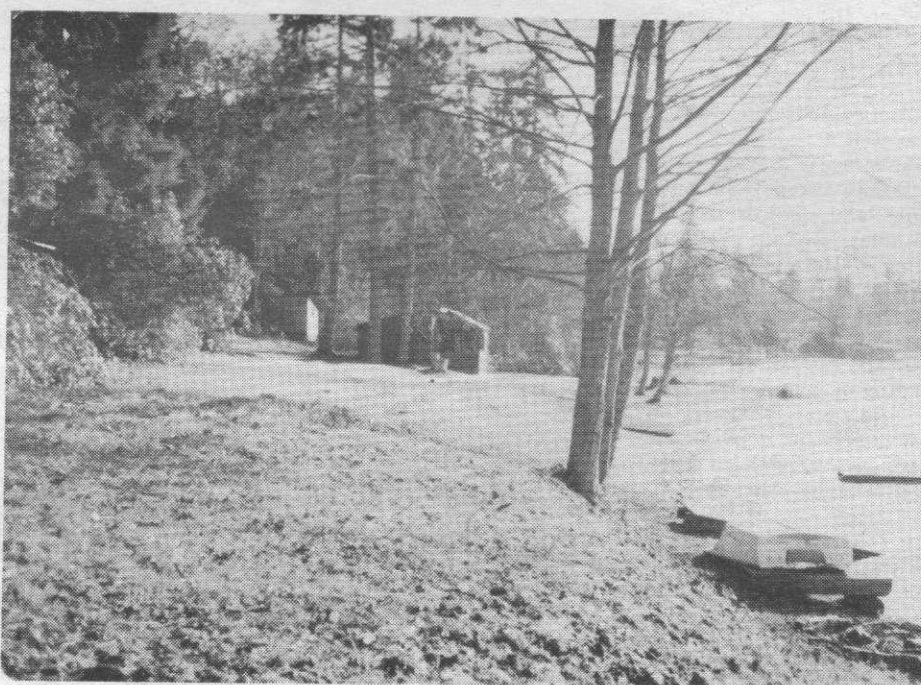


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Planting flower bulbs has become a fall tradition

It has probably been said a few thousand times before, but the quote bears repeating: "to everything there is a season"—and the garden is no exception.

As each year passes in the garden, the attending gardener becomes more keenly aware of the changes and cycles that are at work. "This is the right time for planting wallflowers," or "the corn seemed to mature and finish earlier this year with all that extra heat," are small examples of how we learn to work with the almost predictable regularity of nature, relying on the ever-turning but essentially unchanging cycles of life on the island.

One of the traditions associated with gardening and the fall harvest is the rural, small-town fall fair, which gives us an opportunity to celebrate and appreciate the abundance and the richness of life in the Gulf Islands. Most of us come away from the displays and horticultural exhibits with renewed energy and interest in how much better our gardening efforts might be next year. I saw people making notes about which variety of tomato looked best and might be worth a try, and which dahlia looked so special. All were doing their homework, researching for an improved crop in 1988.

With the fall fair behind us (and a fine fall fair it was) we can turn our attention toward fall preparations for the winter ahead and the spring to come. We start planning that new cold frame, a new raised bed, a major renovation of the shrub border, or most often, we commence with the ritual of planting the fall bulbs for next spring's show.

Fall bulbs are as big a tradition as the fall fair and it's hard to resist the desire to indulge a bit. In selecting bulbs, there are traditional favourites, such as King Alfred daffodils, and rich red tulips (favourite deer food), but each year some new bulbs are introduced to the local market, and each year, some older varieties enjoy renewed popularity.

A new one on the scene is a delightful, delicate little tulip named Batalini (Bright Gem), growing to four inches in height and blooming in early spring with a rich golden yellow show. The dwarf rockery Iris reticulata and *I. danfordiae* are enjoying a comeback along with other named varieties, and the species and snow crocus varieties are finding revived interest as well.

Over the course of the fall season I am often asked for bulb suggestions and choices to suit problem areas, difficult sites and challenging schemes or situations. In choosing a bulb for a particular situation one has to take into consideration the soil, drainage, sun aspect and exposure, the scale of the setting or layout, and floral colour and leaf texture to complement or fit in with the garden design. Well, let's get down to some lists of suggested bulbs to

your garden

try in certain problem spots or design-garden types.

The first group that comes to mind pertains to bulbs suitable for rockeries or stony, rocky flat areas with naturalized plantings. These are the bulbs that look good with stone, and can tolerate the drier, hotter aspects and fast-draining

soils: Snowdrops (*Galanthus*; usually the first to show), winter aconites (*Eranthis*; early, bright golden), glory of the snow (*Chionodoxa*; delicate but very effective), crocus (species, snow crocus and named varieties), Wood lily, trout lily (*Erythronium*, good for shady combinations with ferns and moss), Anemones blanda (good in partial shade around trees with their fine foliage and warm colours),

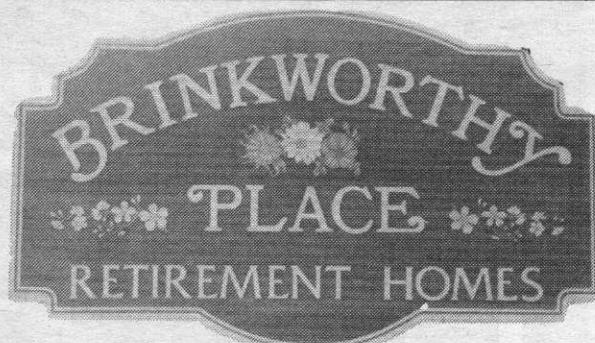
Fritillaria (meleagris, for the small rockery and imperialis for the big-scale situations), fall-flowering crocus and colchicums (in bloom now), Brodiaea laxa (soft blue and later to show), hyacinths (tolerant of partial shade), summer snowflake (*Leucojum*, late season showing, similar to snowdrops in form, but 12 to 16 inches in height), the dwarf rock Iris (all varieties, and the blues are fragrant), the shorter Allium species especially *A. ostrowskianum*, *A. moly luteum*, and *A. sphaerocephalum* (all look far better than their names sound), Cyclamen species (spring, summer and fall blooming varieties), bluebells (*Scilla* species), grape hyacinths (*Muscari* sp.) species and botanical tulips, bunch-flowering tulips, Oxalis (naturalize well, especially suited for partial shade areas), and of course, all of the shorter Narcissi. Some of the best ones are Thalia, Peeping Tom, Tete-a-Tete, Jack Snipe, February gobs, Sundial, Angel tears, Silver shimes, Poetaz types, jonquils, mini Narcissi and, of course, the species Narcissi. All of the bulbs mentioned above make effective shows in rockeries and complement the form and proportions of rock garden designs.

Another list which is often requested is for bulbs that naturalize well, and it is, essentially, the entire rockery list, with a few important additions. Hardy lilies (*Lilium* species and hybrids) are the most significant bulbs for mass planting on a large scale, as they endure for years without any attention, as will star

of Bethlehem (*ornithogalum*) and *Camassia cusickii* (for soils that are wet in winter and dry right out in summer). The group of bulbs that naturalize well suit both the large-scale garden in masses and drifts that move in the wind and give colour to the landscape, and for the small scale, by adding a greater sense of space and wildness

to small restricted areas. These are the bulbs that should, over time, multiply and take care of themselves for the next several years, before needing lifting, dividing and fertilizing. They don't ask for a lot.

Well, the space is gone but the lists aren't all issued, so until next week, happy gardening.

Tofino man given fine

A Tofino man who pleaded guilty last week in Ganges provincial court to break and enter and theft from the Ganges liquor store will pay a \$200 fine and serve a one-year term of probation.

Nineteen-year-old Melvin Sport was also ordered to make restitution to the amount of \$131.69.

The incident took place in November, 1986, when a window at the liquor store was smashed and bags of beer bottles taken. Traces of blood were found on the window.

Crown counsel Derek Lister said Ganges RCMP followed a trail leading from the liquor store to Mouat's provincial park. At the bottom of the trail they found two paper bags, one marked 6 Kokanee and the other 6 Columbia. Blood stains were evident on the bags.

In a statement to police, Sport said he and a young offender had been drinking when the other initiated and carried out the window-breaking plan. Sport said each took one bag of beer bottles.

(The young offender has already appeared to answer charges relating to the incident; he is serving a one-year term of probation.)

Sport, who was living on Salt Spring Island at the time, has since moved to Tofino where he has obtained work at a fish plant.

In reaching a sentence, Judge R.E. Hudson noted that Sport has generally remained "out of trouble" in the last few years. He also stressed that the incident was initiated by the other youth. Sport has until January 15 to pay the \$200 fine and until December 1 to make restitution.

A Ganges man was fined \$450 and had his driver's licence suspended after pleading guilty to impaired driving.

William Luker, 43, will lose his licence for six months.

The incident occurred last June 24 when Luker was stopped by the RCMP on Vesuvius Bay Road. Crown counsel Derek Lister noted that Luker has no prior record and was co-operative with police.

Judge Hudson awarded a suspended sentence Tuesday for an act he described as "inexcusable".

Sooke resident John Lucas pleaded guilty to the assault of his wife last September 26. Kathleen Lucas suffered a black eye, bruises and cuts to her head after she was pinned to the ground and hit three times by her husband's head. She was treated at Lady Minto Hospital and released.

Lucas, described by the defense as a "soft-spoken and gentle man," depicted his eight-month marriage as stormy, and subject to numerous verbal fights. He said he found himself constantly frustrated by his wife's jealousy. He told the court he was remorseful of his actions — he immediately left Salt Spring after the incident and wrote a lengthy letter of apology to her.

Lucas is a spiritual elder with his tribe and carries spiritual pipes. He is also a counsellor for those with alcohol and drug problems.

While Judge Hudson said "wife-beating" was inexcusable, he handed down a suspended sentence and 18 months probation. Lucas is also required to perform 60 hours of community service and must seek counseling. He is not permitted any contact with his wife and her child during the period of his probation.

Golf course reservoir enlarged on Salt Spring

Excavation work currently underway at the Salt Spring Island Golf and Country Club is expected to significantly increase capacity of the facility's water reservoir.

Nick Birks, grounds superintendent at the golf and country club, said Thursday that island

resident Norman Twa has been hired to enlarge the reservoir.

"Norman has his excavator and his truck out here," noted Birks on Thursday. "He's digging it (the reservoir) out, and when he's done, we're looking at holding another two million gallons there."

At present, the reservoir holds

approximately four million gallons of water. Although the golf and country club has one well with a capacity of 10 gallons per minute — which Birks says "runs all year round" — groundskeepers rely on run-off retained in the reservoir to keep the course green during long, dry summers.

Though four million gallons may seem like a lot of water, it wasn't enough this year. Birks said groundskeepers were forced to stop watering the fairways more than three weeks ago.

"When the (excavation) work is done, we should have six million gallons plus, though," said Birks.

"But we plan on putting in more sprinkler heads, increasing irrigation by about 20 per cent."

The excavating work is expected to be completed in another week or two — in time for the fall rains.

"Usually, the reservoir is full again by the end of November."

NDP group forming new organization

A new constituency association is being formed by the New Democratic Party (NDP), following a shift of Gulf Islands voters from one riding to another.

The Gulf Islands are currently contained within the Cowichan-Malahat-the-Islands riding, which also stretches from the Cowichan Valley to Ladysmith on Vancouver Island. By next July, however, federal redistribution will see the islands contained within the new riding of Saanich-Gulf Islands, along with portions of the current Esquimalt-Saanich riding.

The NDP will meet September 26 at the Cordova Bay United Church Hall — at 5166 Cordova Bay Road — to form a new constituency association. Officers will be elected following a presentation by guest speaker Svend Robinson, an MP from the Lower Mainland.

The meeting is scheduled to get underway at 2 pm. Also on the agenda are the delivery of reports from executives of the NDP's Cowichan-Malahat-The Islands and Esquimalt-Saanich constituency associations.

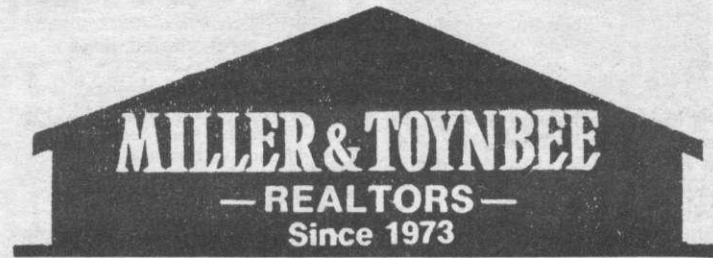
Membership in the Salt Spring LETS organization can be obtained for a fee of \$15, which is payable in either federal currency or green dollars.

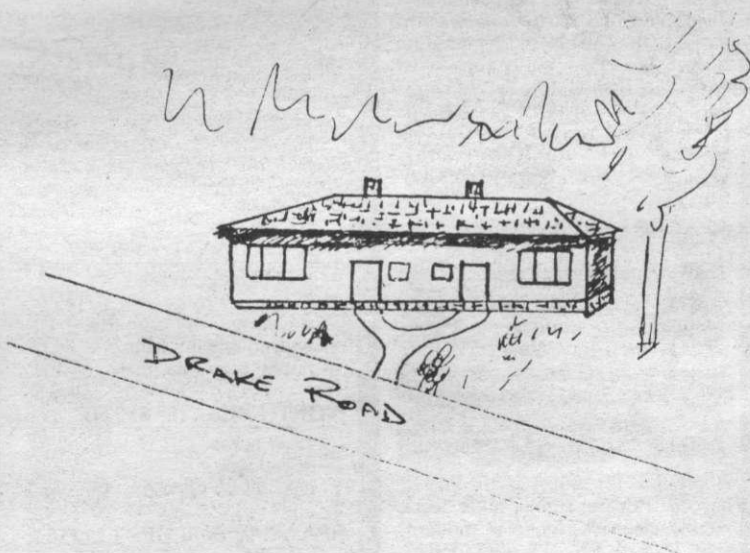

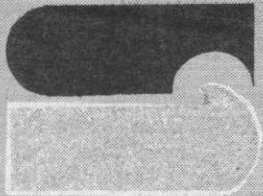

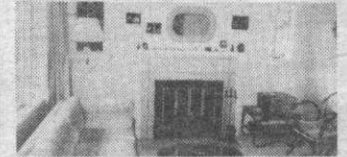
