Year-round schooling format 'has few merits'

More than scheduling has to be taken into account before educators can determine if a year-round school schedule is appropriate for the Gulf Islands, board trustee Charles Hingston and school superintendent Mike Marshall agreed last week.

Hingston and Marshall were responding to provincial government comments made late last week which indicated the education ministry is considering a 12-month schedule for B.C. schools.

While it is not in use in Canada, the year-round format has been implemented in 70 U.S. school districts. Earlier this month, the Los Angeles school board voted to

introduce the scheduling system to its 618 schools by 1989.

U.S. educators favour the 12-month schedule because it eases crowding of existing classrooms and saves money on construction of additional facilities.

Hingston, who also serves as president of the B.C. School Trustees Association, said Friday, however, that the concept should not be introduced in B.C. just to answer concerns about crowded classrooms.

"You have to look at all the implications and considerations — transportation, contracts, staffing and operating costs, for instance," he said. "You just don't transfer something from Los

Angeles to cover the whole of B.C."

Marshall agreed, saying that an examination of all factors affecting school operations show the disadvantages of a year-round system "far outweigh any advantages — which is why a lot of systems haven't gone for it."

The National Association for Year-Round Education, based in San Diego, argues that the current nine-month schooling system is based on an outmoded, "19th century agricultural-economic schedule" that was never designed for education in the first place.

However, Marshall notes that the three-month summer break

now employed is still valid in many parts of B.C. where agriculture is a prime industry. He also points out that in a summer break is appropriate in the Gulf Islands, since it coincides with the peak of the tourism industry, giving students an opportunity for work.

More important, Marshall said, the summer shutdown is when all large renovation work, like the refurbishing of gymnasium floors, is carried out in schools.

The single advantage to year-round schooling, he continued, is more efficient use of classroom space, and if crowding became a major problem in Gulf Islands schools, the concept could be

examined by trustees. However, Marshall said alternative solutions, plus all possible advantages and disadvantages of a 12-month system, would have to be considered.

"And the biggest disadvantage is that there are detrimental educational aspects to the system," Marshall said.

Hingston, meanwhile, said he has seen preliminary results of a study assessing the educational standing of students in year-round systems. The study, he said, indicates those following 12-month formats "are doing worse, academically," than students in regular systems.

Advisory body needed'

The provincial government is "floating a trial balloon" with its announced consideration of a 12-month schooling format, says Charles Hingston.

Hingston, president of the B.C. School Trustees Association and a member of the Gulf Islands School District board of trustees, said he would prefer to see the province establish a permanent advisory committee to study such ideas.

"Rather than just toss out these ideas and have everyone over-react, I'd like to see an ongoing, two-way communication vehicle that could look at all sorts of things — scheduling, curriculum, whatever."

Such a "common sense" system is now in place in Quebec, he said, and should be instituted in B.C. The advisory board, Hingston explained, would be a permanent body made up of educators, trustees, parents and other groups interested in schooling. It would act as a sounding board to assess proposals, and give the ministry access to views other than those espoused by bureaucrats.

"The point of it is not to be reactive, but to be permanent," Hingston said, adding that the advisory board would help provide a two-way, communicative form of government.

North Galiano residents given fire prevention technique tips

Fire prevention is a family affair judging by the turnout for North Galiano's fire awareness day held Sunday, October 25.

About 65 householders and their families filled the fire hall for the event. After a light lunch of hot dogs and sandwiches, the program got underway with Norm Russell, chairman of the North Galiano New Horizons Fire Committee. Introducing visiting firemen — Captain Len Harman and training officer Don Holder of the Sidney Volunteer Fire Department.

The film *Fire Power* was shown. It graphically depicted the progress of a house fire from a cigarette in a waste basket to an inferno from which there would be no escape. In three and a half minutes the temperature in the room in which the fire started had risen to 1,400 degrees. It was four minutes before the first evidence of the fire was noted from outside the building. The importance of closed doors in containing a housefire was shown, as was the effectiveness of sprinkler systems and the importance of smoke alarms.

A slide presentation on smoke detectors came next on the program. Their placement is important, most fires occurring between 9 pm and 6 am. It is recommended that more than one detector be installed, perhaps one wired in electrically and the second operated by a battery.

A video on portable fire extinguishers followed. Types of fire extinguishers used for wood and paper fires, flammable liquids, electrical fires and chemical fires were discussed.

At the conclusion of the video, North Galiano's new fire truck, siren screaming, arrived at the hall and in 45 seconds, hoses were connected and 14 volunteer firemen were pumping water from the roof of the fire hall and all around it.

The afternoon closed with a hands-on demonstration of fire extinguishers, foam, carbon dioxide and dry chemical. Old and young, all were encouraged to put out the contained flames.

North Galiano's recently-retired Fire Chief, Thom Liddell, and his wife Peggy, were on hand to enjoy the successful demonstration. Also on hand was Chester Williams, South Galiano's fire chief, a staunch supporter of the North Galiano volunteer firemen.

The North Galiano Community Association and our volunteer firemen greatly appreciated the generous assistance in time, enthusiasm, and expertise of their two guests from Sidney. The community looks forward to their return.

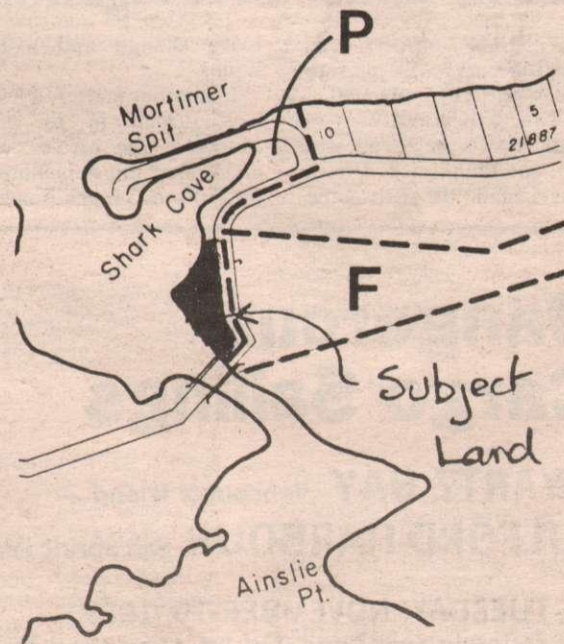

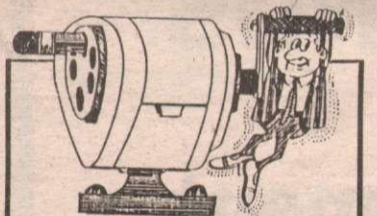

satisfied with a 1-0 win. After a break for refreshments supplied by team mothers, who also doubled as cheerleaders, play resumed with the Otters taking on the Lazars. One could not but admire the stamina of the 8- to 10-year-old Galiano players who, in the space of barely two hours, played four 25-minute halves of soccer on a by-no-means small pitch and a team of seven rather than the adult 11. This second game was more evenly contested and the result could have gone either way. The only goal was scored when the Lazars took advantage of some confusion in the Otter defense to scramble the ball across the goal line. Despite considerable pressure and good shots on goal the Otters were unable to penetrate the Lazars' defense, and finished up losing 1-0.

The actual goal, regulation size for this age, seems disproportionately small and makes frontal assault unproductive against any reasonably competent goalie. It might be profitable to study some of the tactics used in indoor soccer and practise oblique approaches and the back pass.

The Otters made a successful debut on their home ground, thanks to some excellent coaching from Bob Walker and Terry Hart, the young players' enthusiasm and vociferous support from parents and friends.

Hallowe'en

There has probably never been a better celebration of Hallowe'en on Galiano than this year's. It began three days early on October 28 when many children and parents converged on the North Galiano Hall to be confronted by snakes, spider-webs and a glowing skeleton. Over 45 pumpkins were carved, with or without help from adults, and everyone received prizes, food and drink and homemade chocolates, courtesy of the North Galiano Community Association.

In the meantime, excitement was gathering at the South End, fanned by the innovative Pumpkin Man setting of Burrill Brothers front window, while back of the shop mutterings of "double, double, toil and trouble" suggested that witches might be convening there in readiness for the Eve itself.

By 6 pm on October 31 the South Hall was filled with so many

colourfully-clad islanders that it was impossible to stage or judge the traditional costume parade — but there were prizes of assorted goodies, and refreshments for everyone and to spare. Promptly at opening time, strands of stringed donuts and large dishes of floating apples were there for revellers to sample.

The unique thing about Party '87 which everyone will remember is the entertainment put on by the newly formed Galiano Soul Company. The opening item of adult dancers — four females plus Pub-George launched on a second (writhing) career — in black tights with gold and orange streamers evoked an atmosphere of spine-tingling mystery. Thus the scene was set for the Macbeth-like witches to alight en route to Mount Galiano to prepare their spells in a cauldron that bubbled most audibly and emitted sauna-level steam. Next followed a very hirsute white-clad Rene Mahlow who told of a people-less ferry gliding with full lights through Active Pass escorted by a silent pod of killer whales — of white 'ghost deer' and finally of a white ghost tramping the roads of Galiano. The chilling climax came when Rene leapt into the audience, snatched up a child and disappeared behind the curtain. He is to be complimented for both his script and his acting.

Last was a junior chorus line, elegantly clad in top-hats and tails tapping their way from Galiano to New York in front of a Keith Holmes designed sign-post.

We look forward to seeing the young trio of Erin Howell, Erin Jarvis and Anami Finnie and other members of the 'Soul Company' in future island productions.

Deserving thanks were John Thomas Allen for supplying the music, Brent Alvarez for the exciting strobe lighting and especially Christa Weiss on whose shoulders fell the responsibility for arranging the evening on behalf of the Galiano Club.

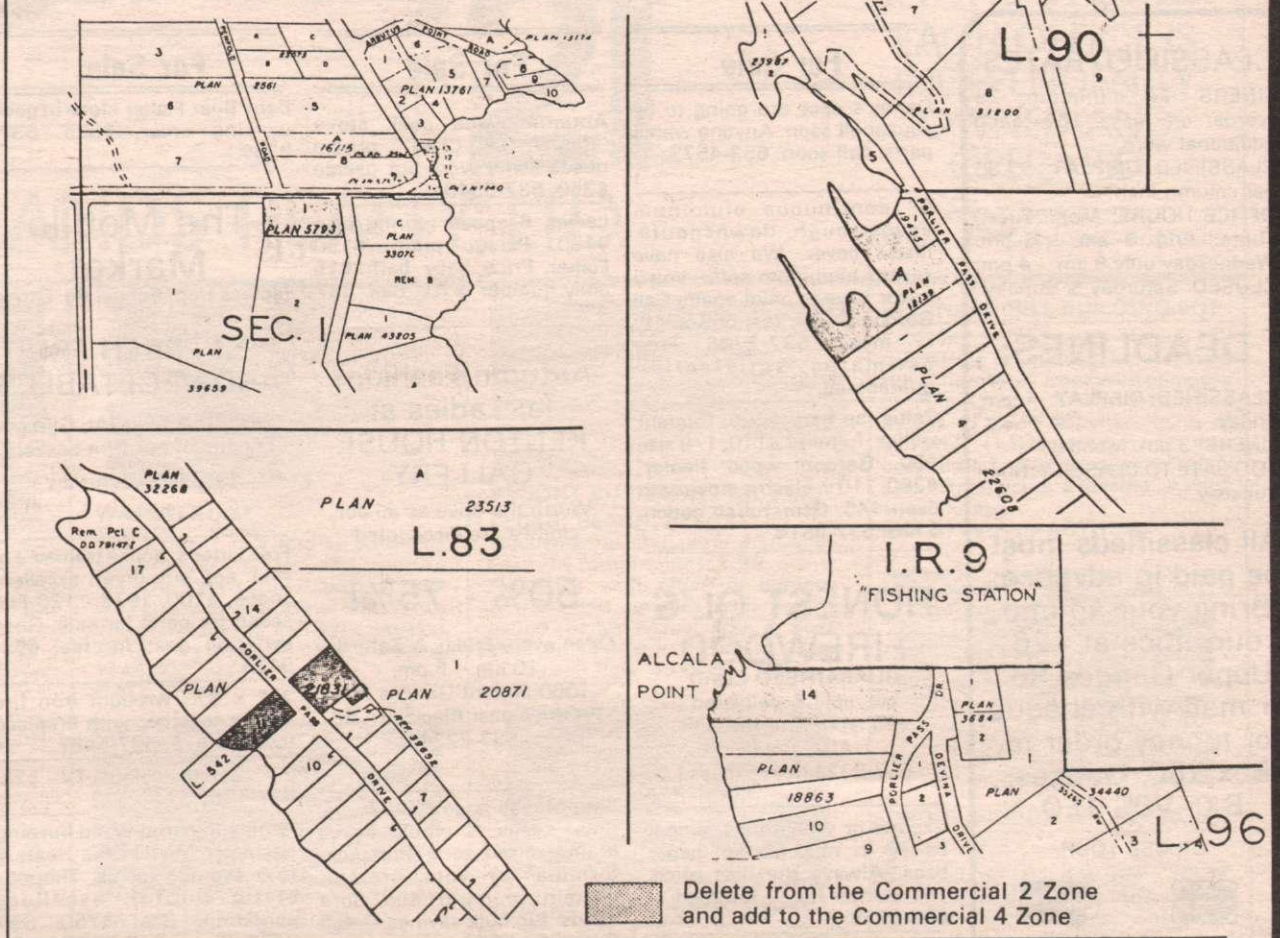

- a) adding a new zoning classification entitled, "C4-Commercial 4" in which the principal uses permitted are tourist accommodation facilities such as hotels, motels, resorts, lodges, cottages and cabins providing temporary accommodation for the travelling public in individual tourist accommodation units. Secondary uses permitted, only in conjunction with principal uses, are restaurants and cafes, licensed liquor establishments, boat ramps and boat rental facilities, retail uses accessory to principal or secondary uses, and a one-family or a self-contained dwelling unit for the owner. 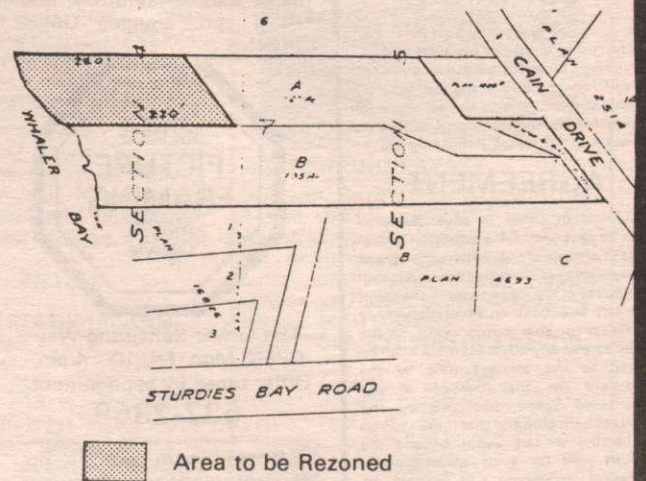

Mother seeking safer school bus

A Salt Spring Island mother is asking School District 64 to investigate the possibility of re-equipping one local school bus with rear-facing seats and seat belts.

Anna Hawthorne, a Salt Spring Island resident, noted recently that the federal government is currently testing one 22-passenger school bus with rear-facing seats in Surrey. She added that Transport Canada officials feel buses with high-backed, rear-facing seats — and seat belts —

would better protect children's safety.

Hawthorne would like to see the new, safer bus operating next September on the route taken each day by her child. She invites parents who share her concern for children's safety to attend the next District 64 board meeting November 12.

According to Transport Canada, there were approximately 2,000 motor vehicle accidents involving school buses between

1982 and 1984. In those accidents, six students were killed and 47 injured.

The federal department of transport's version of a safer school bus has seats facing backward. Each seat would also be equipped with lap belts.

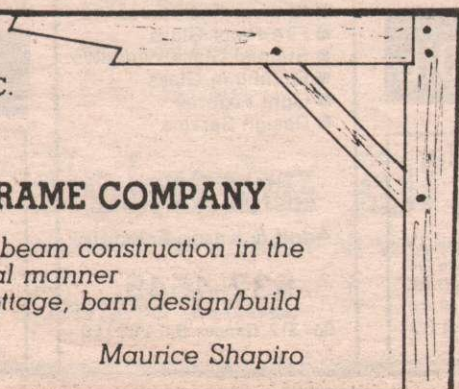
The heavily padded seats in the department's test buses are 25 centimetres higher than those currently installed in school buses, and thus protect children from whiplash.

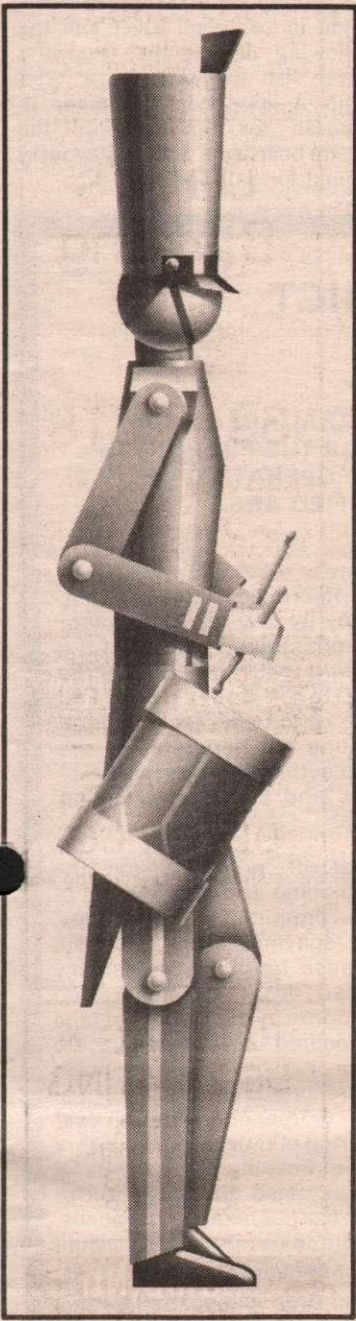

War toys to be discussed at meeting on November 10



The prevalence and implications of war toys will be discussed next week in Ganges at a session co-sponsored by the Salt Spring Island chapter of Voice of Women and the Gulf Islands Teacher-Librarians Association.

The discussion will be led by Susan Yates, reference librarian for the regional library in Nanaimo. It will take place at 7:30 pm on Tuesday, November 10, at the Salt Spring Elementary School library. Admission is free.

Yates will screen a short film and provide an assortment of written material containing extensive information on war toys and their alternatives, plus names and addresses of manufacturers of specific "objectionable" toys.

War toys, the event sponsors note, are defined by the Swedish Toy Council as "playthings used to solve conflict, gain power or win through violence, and which aim to wound or kill."

Yates, whose special interest is war toys and their alternatives, says items fitting that definition are readily available to island consumers.

Maggie Hayes, a Voice of Women member, notes by way of example that a catalogue distributed by one department store chain offers toys ranging from assault boats "armed with cannons" to a \$17.99 'defence force combat kit' — with "AK47 machine gun, two hand grenades, handgun, holster, binoculars, dog tag and ID card" — recommended for children aged three years and up.

"The implications of these chilling 'toys' for our children are profound," says Hayes.

Voice of Women has joined with a number of peace and parent groups to urge people to avoid buying their children toys

that are "in any way related to war," she added.

Hayes points out that psychologists advise against buying war toys for children, and that teachers express concern about the aggression they promote in children.

"Ideally, the toys our children use should encourage their creativity, imagination, and sense of co-operation and understanding of the world around them," she explained.

Yates, meanwhile, notes that war toys now register sales worth \$842 million a year in North America, making them the leading type of all toys offered. Those sales figures, she adds, represent a 350 per cent increase since 1982.

Along with the toys themselves, Yates and Hayes are concerned about the advertising methods used to promote their sale. "Parents taking time to watch the TV cartoons their children love note the acts of violence, the glorification of militarism, sexism, even racism, that the seemingly harmless animation depicts," Hayes says. "And the children have these negative images reinforced by advertising, where they are subjected to a hard-sell approach to the 'heroes' and war paraphernalia they have just seen depicted so graphically in their shows."

Also at issue in advertising approaches is the "blatant and deliberate" sexual stereotyping used to sell toys, Hayes says. She points out that war toys are promoted for young boys — "with lots of appeal to direct action, fighting and the exercise of power" — while young girls are "nudged toward passive, domesticated pursuits."

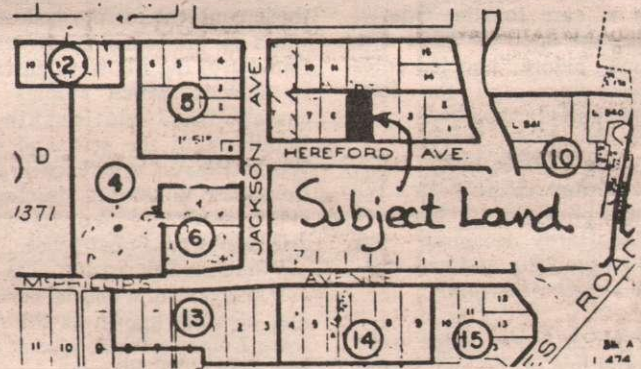

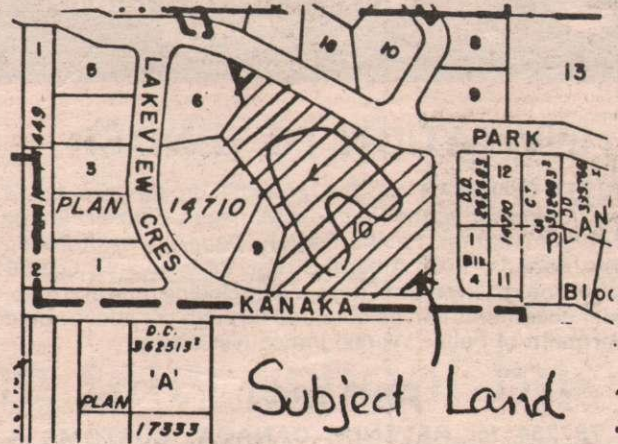

Delegates from Salt Spring Island attended the B.C. Association of Hospital Auxiliaries (BCAHA) area conference held October 8 in Port Hardy.

Ten members of the Lady Minto Gulf Island Hospital Auxiliary left Salt Spring on October 7, taking the 7 am water taxi to Crofton and transferring there to a Lions bus which carried them north.

Driven by Daisy Gear, the bus stopped in Parksville for coffee and muffins, and in Campbell River for lunch, before arriving in Port Hardy at 4 pm.

The conference, hosted by the 35 members of the Port Hardy Hospital Auxiliary, opened that evening with a wine and cheese reception.

Following a buffet breakfast the next morning, the conference was called to order by the area representative, Elsie MacGillivray. BY-LAW NO. 1567

A BYLAW TO ESTABLISH SALT SPRING ISLAND ELECTORAL AREA AS A SPECIFIED AREA OF THE CAPITAL REGIONAL DISTRICT FOR THE PURPOSE OF PROVIDING FOR THE ESTABLISHING, EQUIPPING AND OPERATING OF SWIMMING POOL FACILITIES IN THE SAID SPECIFIED AREA

WHEREAS the Regional Board of the Capital Regional District has been requested to establish a specified area for the purpose of acquiring land, constructing, equipping, operating and maintaining swimming pool facilities in the Salt Spring Island Electoral Area;

AND WHEREAS the Regional Board is empowered with respect to that part of the regional district not within a city, district, town or village to undertake any work or service under the provisions of Part XVI of the "Municipal Act";

AND WHEREAS for the purpose of acquiring land, equipping, operating and maintaining swimming pool facilities it is estimated that an amount of \$800,000.00 will be required, which is the amount of debt intended to be created by this by-law;

AND WHEREAS the amount of the authorized debenture debt of the Regional District incurred pursuant to Section 797 of the "Municipal Act" is \$64,283,792.42 as at July 31, 1987, of which \$55,871,792.42 is existing outstanding debenture debt and \$8,412,000.00 is authorized and unissued debenture debt, and none of the principal or interest of the debenture debt of the Regional District is in arrears;

AND WHEREAS the amount of the authorized debenture debt of the Regional District incurred pursuant to Section 798 of the "Municipal Act" is \$40,988,146.79 as at July 31, 1987, of which \$40,947,940.79 is existing outstanding debt and \$40,206.00 is authorized and unissued debenture debt, and none of the principal or interest of the debenture debt of the Regional District is in arrears;

AND WHEREAS the maximum term for which debentures may be issued to secure the debt created by this by-law is Fifteen (15) years;

NOW THEREFORE the Board of the Capital Regional District in open meeting assembled enacts as follows:

1. The Regional Board is hereby empowered and authorized:

(a) To establish the Salt Spring Island Electoral Area of the Capital Regional District as a specified area to be known as the "Salt Spring Island Swimming Pool Facilities Specified Area".

(b) To undertake and carry out, or cause to be carried out, the acquisition of a swimming pool facilities site, the construction of a swimming pool and related facilities and the purchase of equipment generally in accordance with the plans filed with the Regional Board, and to do all things necessary in connection therewith including the operation and maintenance, and without limiting the generality of the foregoing:

(i) to borrow upon the credit of the Regional District a sum not exceeding \$800,000.00;

(ii) to acquire all such real property, easements, rights-of-way, licences, rights or authorities as may be requisite or desirable for or in connection with the acquisition of a swimming pool site, construction of a swimming pool and related facilities, acquisition of equipment and the operation and maintenance of the said building and equipment;

(iii) to delegate to the Salt Spring Island Parks and Recreation Commission, established by By-law No. 327, any or all of the administrative powers of the Regional Board with respect to the administration, operation and maintenance of the said facilities and without limiting the generality of the foregoing the setting of rates for use of the facilities, and policies respecting the operation.

- The entire cost of providing for the establishing, equipping and carrying out of the aforesaid swimming pool facilities, including the repayment of the debt authorized by clause 1(b)(i) above, less any revenues derived from the operation thereof, shall be borne by the owners of land in the said specified area and a sum sufficient therefor shall be levied and raised in the manner prescribed in the Municipal Act in each year commencing with the year 1988 for such period of time as is necessary on all lands and improvements on the basis of assessment as fixed for taxation for regional hospital district taxation purposes. The annual amount to be raised by levy shall not exceed \$261,000.00.
- The said specified area established by this by-law may be merged with any other specified area or areas for the same purpose whether contiguous or not in the manner prescribed in Section 677(3) of the "Municipal Act".
- This By-law may be cited as the "Salt Spring Island Swimming Pool Facilities Specified Area Establishment and Loan Authorization By-law No. 1, 1987".

Save the Children Fund seeks support

The aims of the *Save The Children Fund* were explained recently to students of Gulf Islands Secondary School and Salt Spring Elementary School.

Speaking to students at both schools two weeks ago was Vernon Reimer, an executive director of the fund. His appearance at GISS coincided with that school's participation in the United Nations' World Food Day.

The *Save The Children Fund* has been in operation since 1919, when it was founded by Eglantyne Jebb. Its charter, *The Rights*

of the Child, was officially adopted by the UN in 1959.

The fund supports work in developing countries like Nigeria, Zimbabwe, Bangladesh, India and the Philippines. Projects range from training local residents as health care workers to help in providing adequate clean water to villages.

Jean Knight, Salt Spring representative for the *Save The Children Fund*, noted that local residents last year donated \$10,000 in support of its work. Funds were raised through a

garage sale, the annual *Children Helping Children* concert, Christmas card sales, donations and collections.

This year, Knight said, local organizers are planning Halloween collections, a Christmas card competition for all GISS art students and a Christmas tag competition for elementary school students.

All contributions to the *Save The Children Fund* are tax-deductible, she added, and eligible for matching funds from the Canadian International Develop-

ment Agency (CIDA). Depending on the projects for which they are used, donated funds are matched on a 3-1, 6-1 or 9-1 basis.

Grand prize in each of the poster, prose and poetry contests


is a trip for two to Ottawa, plus \$275, and an invitation to take part in the national Remembrance Day ceremony as a representative of the youth of Canada.

Jungle-type cacti provide colourful show

When the clouds finally arrived this past week, it was like seeing the return of an old friend, and when it eventually rained, you could almost hear the land sigh and start to live again.

While the ground is still bone dry just a few inches below the surface, the majority of plants are no longer on the brink of dying off due to the water shortage. If the precipitation can only get a bit more regular and abundant (perish the thought), we will soon be able to consider turning off the irrigation systems. Plants that are located under roof overhangs or broad spreading cedars or firs will still be parched and needing supplementary watering.

An amusing topic these days is the long-term weather prognosis, some anticipating a hard, cold, long winter, others forecasting up to three months more of dry, clear weather to come, and some folks are just saying that it's going to be a mild one. I can see where the law of averages favours a spot (or two, or three) of rain before too long. Regardless of how the winter turns out, the spring, summer and fall of 1987 were well worth any environmental punishment we might have to withstand in the months ahead.

The weather is a great subject for discussion because nothing you can say will influence it, but I'd like to digress if I may, to discuss an indoor plant that starts to set buds and develop blooms at this time of year — the Christmas cactus. The so-called Christmas cactus that is for sale in bloom right now is technically a range of varieties of the species *Schlumbergera truncata*, named Thanksgiving cactus in the U.S. where Thanksgiving lands in November. *Schlumbergera truncata* can be identified by its curved-toothed margins that somewhat resemble crab claws. The two-inch-long leaves also have a tendency to produce two new leaves at the end of each advancing leaf, thus bushing out automatically. These plants can reach sizes of three feet or more across and are available with blooms of red, white, orange, salmon, pink and several shades in between.

The other species with which several crosses have been made is *S. bridgesii*, the Christmas cactus, which has leaves that are more flattened, less than two inches long, and have leaf margins that

are scalloped or wavy edged without spines or tooting. The drooping habit makes these plants ideal for hanging baskets and the rich rosy red blooms have a slight purplish tinge to them, which makes for a most impressive show against almost any backdrop.

The other jointed-stem cactus with a similar habit is the spring-blooming Easter cactus (*Rhipsalidopsis gaertneri*) which has a more triangular cross-section and some small soft bristles or spines (barely) on the scalloped, wavy edges. This plant produces rich red, pink or rose blooms in April and May in profusion.

All of the plants we are talking about here are jungle-type cacti, not of desert origin, and they grow on trees or shrubs in the manner of epiphytes. They root in the leaves and debris that bark, branches and horizontal surfaces trap or catch over the years, and they are well

adapted to surviving and thriving with considerable neglect and abuse, provided we can match a couple of nature's conditions that they are used to having.

They don't like an alkaline soil, being used to a life of leached organic matter for rooting medium (ph of 5.5 to 6.5, ideally) and they don't like temperatures below 40 degrees F. They like a rich, well-drained mix of potting soil, peat moss or leaf mold and some sand. The potting mix should not be allowed to dry out except during their rest period, which is usually a month or two after flowering for *S.*

bridgesii and *S. truncata*, and for *R. gaertneri* it is resting time in October-November.

When they are growing, they should be fed with a soluble balanced fertilizer every two weeks and watered regularly enough to allow the mix to dry off, not dry out, and the plant shouldn't show any signs of leaves wrinkling. If you grow them out of doors during the spring-summer period, see that they aren't in full sun, as they are used to some shade, and full sun will discolour and burn their leaves, leaving them with blotches of brown and purplish yellow coloration. A half-sun situation is ideal.

If your plants have had cool nights and a good rest during the past couple of months, there should be a showing of tiny nubs or buds developing at the tips and junctions of the leaves. Try to keep temperatures in the 45 to 55 degree

F. range and don't let the plant dry out. Don't let the plants stay wet or water-logged and avoid any draughts (cold or dry) as these are the two major causes of bud drop. Often a new plant will drop some of its flower buds in response to having been moved or relocated and even older plants will often drop some buds after being repositioned or moved about the house. Touchy little fellows sometimes, but when the show begins, it's well worth the effort and the wait. During flowering, stop feedings, water regularly and pick off any faded or spent blooms, and you will enjoy a couple of months of floral show from these unusual, beautiful epiphytic cacti, the *holiday* cacti. Until next week, happy gardening.
