

Company seeks higher helicopter flight path

The helicopter company annoying some Saturna Island residents has applied to Transport Canada for permission to fly at a higher altitude.

Several residents have sent written complaints about the flights to Helijet Airways and the department of transport in Vancouver. Helijet's helicopter taxis commuters between Vancouver and Victoria, but low-altitude flights in bad weather have

sparked complaints about noise.

Helijet's director of operations says the helicopter is licensed to fly at no lower than 3,000 feet using instrument navigation. In cold weather, the craft must fly below the freezing point to keep ice off the helicopter blades, according to Ken Glaze, who is also a pilot.

Once the copter descends below 3,000 feet, the pilot must use visual navigation and fly even

lower. "We have to go right down, even to the water if necessary," explained Glaze.

Helijet has applied to Transport Canada for permission to cruise as low as 2,000 feet with instrument navigation, Glaze said. "We're asking them to change the rules to keep us above being an annoyance but low enough to fly under the ice."

Transport Canada official Mike Matthews says the application

will be examined in Vancouver and then sent to Ottawa with a recommendation for attached. "We're hoping within two weeks we'll have our report complete."

Transport Canada will decide if an aircraft can navigate safely at that altitude and if radio communication can be maintained, Matthews said.

Glaze says the freezing level seldom falls below 3,000 feet so a 2,000-foot minimum would allow

the craft to fly with instruments most of the time. Glaze estimated the weather would force the helicopter down to visual navigation levels no more than a few times each month.

New kids at school are Noah and Alex Germain and Ray Hyder. I'm sure they help make school more interesting.

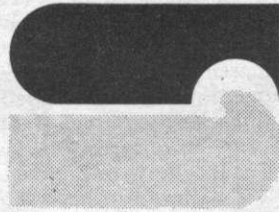
The two musicians are really good together, their music is entertaining and their rapport enhances their music. I enjoyed their program; live music is such a delight, and these two musicians were pure entertainment.

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Galiano Club to present proposals at meeting

President Donald Macdonald of the Galiano Club has just issued a "State of the Union" document which deserves the close attention of all Galiano residents. The name of this organization seems to suggest that this is just another group with recreational objectives. This is the truth but very far from the whole truth. The responsibilities of the club, which include the Community Hall, Bluff Park and the dump, are set out clearly in Macdonald's letter to householders, together with a description of the club's administrative structure of admirable clarity.

The club's AGM which will take place next month will ask members to approve two proposals: to have some selective clean-up of windfall trees in the rear section of Bluff Park, and to have these sawn into lumber for use in the renovation of the south Community Hall; and to take the lead in the formation of a registered non-profit society, hopefully in co-operation with the Chamber of Commerce and the North Galiano Community Association, to take over and supervise the operation of the SWDA (dump).

Accompanying this epistle is an explanation of the re-cycling system now in use at the dump with detailed instructions to users. This comes from the pen of Jim Scoones, who has done so much to bring the system into being, and whose supervision of the dump deserves commendation and thanks from all Galiano residents and businesses.

Local History on Tape

The Gulf Islands Branch of the B.C. Historical Federation was formed many years ago to include members from Galiano, Mayne, Pender and Saturna. During the sixties the Branch members wrote and published reminiscences of some pioneers of these islands under the title *Gulf Islands Patchwork*. Still selling well after 20 years, this book is still in print.

About the same time the Provincial Archives staff began recording on tape the memories of Outer Islanders, including, among others, Neptune Grimmer of Pender, the Maudes of Mayne, Dora Payne of Saturna, and the News and Georgesons of Galiano. These tapes are still in the Archives and in good playable condition. No tapes of comparable quality have been made since then with the exception of some made in connection with the archaeological dig on Pender.

It is interesting to note that there is a resurgence of interest on each Outer Island in keeping alive the record of recent history through making tapes, and setting up local museums. The *Sound and Moving Image* division of the Provincial Archives is willing to run a six-hour workshop for the branch in late spring. The Penders lost a long-time resident when Evelyn Lilly Pollard passed away in Victoria General Hospital on February 7. "Anybody could put up with something two or three times a month," Glaze says. He figures the Helijet flew low-level over Saturna about 40 times last month.

The Helijet service began in November.

"Right now I have to go through at 300 to 500 feet (in bad weather)."

Glaze has heard complaints from three Saturna and two South Pender homeowners. He says he has since told Helijet pilots to fly south of the Penders but says it would add five minutes to each flight to go south of Saturna.

"That translates into an exorbitant increase in our costs."

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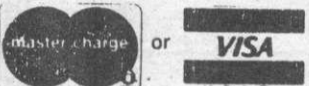

Shrine club members continue the tradition of community service

Though its profile here may not be as high as those of other service groups, the Gulf Islands Shrine Club continues to raise funds for worthy causes.

Jim Napper, newly-installed president of the Salt Spring Island organization, noted last week that 'Shriners' raised \$167 million across North America in 1986. The money, used to help burn victims and crippled children, included \$500,000 raised by Shrine Club members in B.C. and the Yukon — all of whom are members of Vancouver's Gizeh Temple.

"One hundred cents of every dollar, every penny we raise, goes to these causes," Napper stressed. "If we want to have a parade or something, the money for that comes out of our own pockets."

Physicians will often recommend that burn victims and crippled children seek help from the Shrine Club, which owns and operates 19 orthopedic hospitals and three burn institutes.

Napper noted that doctors in England recently asked the Shriners for help in treating a young crippled child.

"The doctors said they could do nothing more for the boy, but we said we could," Napper recalled. The organization has since agreed to raise \$10 million to pay the costs of more than 40 operations for the boy.

"We've turned out some pretty fine people by the age of 21," he continued, pointing out that the Daughters of the Nile organization — whose membership consists primarily of the wives and daughters of Shrine Club members — raises funding for all prosthesis required by those helped.

"Money is no object. We just want to help people, no matter what it takes."

Napper noted that several burn victims from this area have received help through the organization. "We certainly don't want more, but we'll help any that come along," he stressed.

Although Shriners keep the details of their ceremonies confidential, Napper said there is really nothing mystical about the group.

The organization — formally known as the Ancient Arabic Order of Nobles of the Mystic Shrine — was established in 1872 by members of the Masonic Order in Manhattan.

It was formed after a Mason named Billy Florence attended a party in Marseilles, France, thrown by an Arabian diplomat. The host's entertainment consisted of a musical comedy which concluded with all the guests joining a secret society.

Florence and his fellow Masons had been considering the establishment of a new order, and

decided to base it loosely on the model used by the Arabian diplomat.

Each of the 185 Shrine temples in North America is run by a slate of officers that changes annually. The leader (or president) is referred to as the potentate. Other officers are the chief rabban, assistant rabban, high priest and prophet, and the Oriental guide.

All Shriners start as first-degree members of the worldwide Masonic Order and, after learning certain "knowledge" (which is not divulged by club members), they obtain additional degrees. Upon becoming 32nd degree Masons, they are eligible through local Shrine Clubs for membership in the Ancient Arabic Order of Nobles of the Mystic Shrine.

"Only individuals of the highest character are accepted," Napper said.

The Gulf Islands Shrine Club is now in its seventh year of operation. It has approximately 25 members.

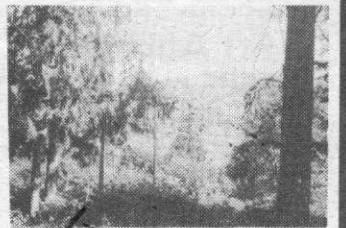

The money, representing proceeds from the Rotary Club's Grey Cup luncheon, will be used to complete a sitting room for residents of the care home.

Mattiesing, the administrator of Greenwoods, said the room will provide the more mobile residents with a place they can go to "get away from it all."

Furnishings will be placed in the room, along with "some commodities," Mattiesing added.

"Say if, in the middle of the night, they (Greenwoods residents) can't sleep," she said. "Here, they'll be able to get up, make themselves a hot drink or something. It will allow them to get out of their rooms for a while."

It is hoped that the sitting room, located in the southern

wing of the home, will be opened just before Easter.

In addition to helping complete the sitting room, Rotary Club members are planning a work bee to "put in a rose garden" between Greenwoods and the Lady Minto Gulf Islands Hospital parking lot, Arnold said.

"We'll be putting in several

plots at Croftonbrook as well," he added.

Mattiesing said she and Greenwoods residents greatly appreciate the club's donation and all the other assistance provided by island service clubs.

"The Rotary has always provided us with wood for the fireplace, too," she noted.

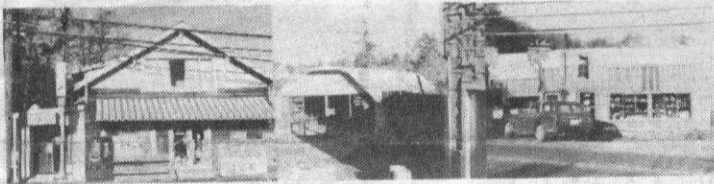
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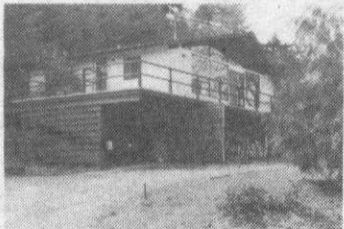

Mild winter will bring them out soon

Book tells how to rid garden of pests

Even though the calendar tells us that spring is not officially here, the bulbs are pushing their noses up out of the ground and bursting into bloom. The mini-narcissi and even some daffodils are flashing their colours, as are the crocuses and Iris reticulatas. A few sheltered Japanese ornamental flowering plums (*Prunus X bliereana* and *P. pissardi nigra*) are in full bloom, showing all of their glory, as if spring were already here. You can't fool a plant (ha-ha); spring must be here.

As the hectic spring season approaches, I find a flood of gardening catalogues, handbooks, guides, periodicals and magazines piling up on the desk. Many are helpful and informative, but one in particular fills a gap in gardening literature that many home gardeners are interested in.

Pest or Guest, a guide to alternative pest control in the home garden was produced by a

that are worthy of consideration.

There is a bit of pest control philosophy (to each his/her own) and a minor amount of politicking, but overall it is a most useful, straight-forward booklet for home use.

One section emphasizes the value of good management and the growing of healthy plants which are less susceptible to attack by insects and diseases. As we've all said before, a rich healthy soil coupled with good sanitation and proper care can go a long way toward avoiding garden pest problems before they actually happen.

For instance, where clover in lawns is a problem and you wish to eradicate the clover, "use a squirt bottle to apply equal amounts of liquid fertilizer and vinegar to the clover patch; this mixture turns clover and grass brown but the fertilizer brings the grass back."

For aphid control, suggestions include the use of natural parasites, growing deterrents such as garlic, chives, coriander, anise, and petunias amongst aphid-frequented plants, and a novel one including the use of aluminum foil as a film mulch around plants that are to be protected. Apparently, the aphids tend to avoid foil-shielded plants, perhaps being confused by the high intensity light levels on the leaf undersides, where they often seek refuge.

For several insect pest problems there are specific controls recommended, and for slugs they have a few additional approaches to try. As I have been recently informed that disposing of slugs into plain water doesn't suffice (they can swim, or at least tread water), this section says to use soapy water or buckets with just plain salt (how gruesome).

We have all heard of the beer in the shallow dish trick for trapping and drowning them, but did you

know that by adding a teaspoonful of sugar to the beer that you will trap codling moths and yellow underwing moths as well as the usual host of slugs?

The guide also covers dealing with wasps, carpenter ants, termites, fleas, lice and cockroaches, and all of the rest of indoor pest problems. No doubt many of us have problems with some of these guys and the information in this guide is very helpful.

One area of the guide that is useful deals with the specific formulations and mixes for hot pepper sprays, garlic sprays, pulped-up-bugs sprays, soap and tobacco sprays and others which no-one has stepped forward to put numbers and ratios to. They do recommend, however, that such sprays should be applied on a trial basis to assess the resulting control/damage effected, before you commence wholesale spraying.

While this guide doesn't cover all of the products, (for instance it makes no mention of Reemay or similar competitive products) or

alternative control methods, it does provide a fairly comprehensive framework for the average home gardener.

For those more interested in the field, the bibliography, sources, suppliers and specific resource people listed at the end of the book provide plenty of contacts and research possibilities.

The guide is available from SPEC at their office (2510 Maple St., Vancouver, B.C. V6J 3T3), and for the next couple of weeks you're welcome to peruse this copy at the counter at Foxglove.

As the spring gardening season approaches, so does the pest season.

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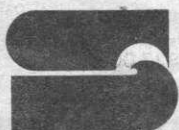

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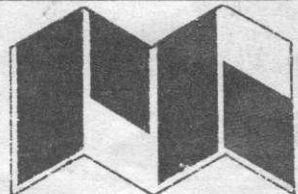


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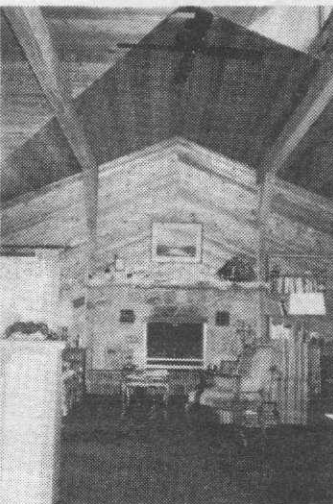

Twenty-five years ago

• Funeral services for Elizabeth Ellis, a 10-year resident of Ganges, were held at St. George's Anglican Church. Mrs. Ellis died at King's Daughter's Hospital in Duncan after a lengthy illness.

Mrs. Ellis was born in St. Paul, Minnesota, in 1899 and grew up in the same neighbourhood and society as writer F. Scott Fitzgerald. After the death of her son in the Second World War, she travelled the world seeking a release from her sadness — and finally found a certain amount of peace on Salt Spring Island.

• B.C. Hydro is carrying out construction work on Salt Spring Island to boost the voltage available to Holdfast Natural Resources, a plant on Welbury Bay.

Increasing the power to 25,000 volts from 12,000 on the Scott Road line caused some interruption of service to the Outer Islands and parts of Salt Spring, however. Construction work included installation of new conductors, transformers and poles.

• The birthday of Lord Baden-Powell was marked at 11 am by a parade of Salt Spring Island Sea Scouts, Wolf Cubs and Brownies at Ganges United Church.

Local scoutmaster was P.D. Williams, while Fred Perry served as cubmaster. Flagbearers were H. Sprecker and G. Mouat for the Sea Scouts, and E. Booth for the Cubs.

Twenty years ago

• Inflation has forced up costs and prices and is hitting the freight industry as hard as any other. Norman Jackson of Salt Spring Freight Service told the Chamber of Commerce last week.

Following a discussion at the chamber meeting, Jackson explained his reasons for seeking an increase in hauling rates. He also pointed out that a Vancouver light service would be extended to the island if there was an increase in the amount of freight to be hauled.

• The board of trustees for School District 64 (Gulf Islands) will honour the memory of Salt Spring Island's first teacher and other Gulf Islands pioneer teachers by paying for the planting of a tree in Centennial Park.

Salt Spring's first teacher, John

C. Jones, taught at four island locations for a full decade before the provincial Public Schools Act was proclaimed.

• New teachers needed on Salt Spring for the 1966-67 school year will be brought here from the United Kingdom.

On the advice of district superintendent F.A. McLellan and principal D.L. Hartwig, local school trustees decided to apply to the United Kingdom district teachers' recruitment plan for teaching replacements.

• Gavin Reynolds, well-known on Salt Spring for his work with the local Rod and Gun Club, became a member of the Salt Spring Island Chamber of Commerce.

Reynolds has been attending chamber meetings since 1952, but held off joining the group until this year.

Fifteen years ago

• The benefit fund for the Laszlo Bedocs family of Salt Spring reached \$1,100.

The fund was established by Rev. Frank Sutherland after fire caused extensive damage to the Bedocs' home early in the new year.

• The fishboat *Sea Master* hit a rock as it ploughed past Chocolate Island in Ganges Harbour.

Throughout the day, other fishboats stood by and kept lines on the *Sea Master* to prevent it from capsizing at low tide. When the tide again rose, the vessel was pulled off the rock.

• Lyn Hedger set a single-game record at the Leisure Lanes bowling alley.

Hedger rolled a 375 single, one point more than the old mark set by Walter Carlson.

• The department of transport is investigating an oil slick in Stuart Channel.

The slick was spotted by Dr. R.P. McCaffrey from his home along Dogwood Lane. It is thought that the oil, which showed signs of containing detergent, was illegally discharged by a freighter.

Ten years ago

• The *Queen of Tsawwassen* was delayed when the islands-bound vessel was searched by police and crew looking for a bomb.

Reports of an explosive device on board were investigated but nothing was found in the ship. It eventually made its scheduled Gulf Islands trip.

• The proposed site for a northern Salt Spring Island school is being considered by the B.C. Land Commission.

The land proposed as the new school site is contained in the Agricultural Land Reserve. School District 64 trustees have applied for its exclusion to permit school construction.

• Directors of the Capital Regional District (CRD) board were treated to a sample of island ditch water and reports on the deteriorating state of Ganges buildings.

Les Ramsey and Tom Toynbee attended the board meeting and outlined the problems facing merchants and property owners in the community. Ramsey told the board that Ganges was sick and on its way to its demise, and produced photographs to prove his point.

• Stone walls do not a prison make, nor steel fences a guard.

Ian Kyle of Ganges lost two lambs to dogs, even though the lambs were in a fenced yard along Beddis Road. Ian, the son of Mr. and Mrs. Lindsay Kyle, was breeding the sheep to help meet the costs of attending university in the fall.

Five years ago

• Emotional rhetoric reached a peak last week when the Capital Regional District (CRD) voted 4-3 in favour of proceeding with the Ganges sewer.

The solid waste management committee indicated it would present the recommendation for action by the full board. Committee chairman Peter Pollen, mayor of Victoria, attempted to have a motion introduced that would tie the construction of the sewer to a change in the Salt Spring community plan by the Islands Trust.

• Salt Spring volunteer firefighters took to the sea three times last year, and handled 95 other calls.

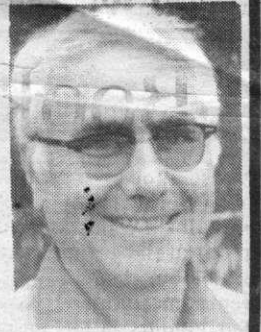

Location of new court changed at Portlock

Parks and recreation commission members last week approved a change in construction plans for a fourth tennis court at Portlock Park.

The new court, originally to be built at the east end of the existing tennis courts, will now be constructed at the west end. The change will require moving planted trees and some playground equipment.

Recreation commission member Jocelyn Holmes told officials March 30 that representatives of the Salt Spring Island Soccer Association have volunteered to move some playground equipment and trees from their current location to one further west of the tennis courts. She explained that the soccer association would like to retain the existing playing field east of the court facility for a second soccer pitch.

Holmes said soccer association officials have measured the area and claim a second soccer pitch — which she noted is desperately

needed here — could be constructed east of the tennis courts.

Recreation commission members agreed to build the new tennis court at the west end of the facility, provided playground equipment and trees were moved "at no cost to the commission."

The fourth tennis court at Portlock Park is scheduled for construction this summer at a cost of up to \$33,000. Funding for the facility will come from four sources: an \$11,000 donation from Dr. Jack Fisher; an \$11,000 grant from the B.C. Lotteries Branch (already approved); \$5,500 from the Salt Spring Tennis Association; and \$5,500 from the parks and recreation commission.

The tennis association's fundraising campaign has already met with considerable success. Organizer Pat Tiernan said Thursday that 34 donations representing approximately 48 individuals and totalling \$3,200 have been received to date. Three donations from resorts and another from a business have been received.

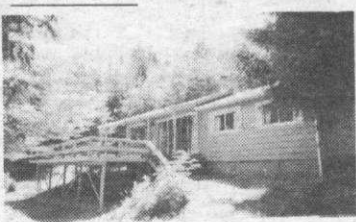

• Damage amounting to several hundred dollars was done to Galiano's Montague Park during Easter week. Approximately 300 students filled the scenic park and left installations and structures wrecked.

Residents complained of drinking and shrieking during the weekend. Damages were also reported at Mout Park on Salt Spring Island.

• New golf club and recreational facilities are planned for the Blackburn Lake area.

The Salt Spring Island Planning Association heard a summary of the plan from Kevin Luton and his family, who plan to establish a new club and other facilities at their lake property.

• W.E. Ted Delmonico is seeking to open the first private public-use park in British Columbia.

Delmonico told the Salt Spring Island Planning Association that he holds 4.5 acres on the east side of North End Road at St. Mary Lake, and an acre on the west side. The acre on the west side, he explained, would become a park. There are plans for a boat launching area, a bathing area, and a facility for renting boats and canoes.
