Equivalency tests may be offered

Sufficient interest by Gulf Islands residents could result in a General Educational Development (GED) test being scheduled for Ganges, rather than for off-island centres.

GED tests are commonly referred to as 'high school equivalency' exams. They are used by those aged 19 years or over, who have been out of school for a year or more, to move quickly into a community college or vocational school program.

Virginia Newman, speaking from the Salt Spring Island office of Continuing Education, said the provincial education ministry endorses the tests because it "recognizes that adults learn by life and work experiences, as well as by traditional schooling methods."

Newman said the Continuing Education department of the Gulf Islands school district offers a

GED preparation course once or twice a year. Instructor Debbie Nostdal uses old GED tests, as well as supplementary materials, to help prepare people to take the test.

"If enough people on the island are interested, the test can be

given here in Ganges, instead of the usual options of Victoria, Nanaimo or Vancouver locations," Newman said.

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
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Elementary students to turn off televisions

Students at Salt Spring Elementary School are being asked to tune out for 24 hours.

Effective today (Wednesday), the students have been asked to refrain from watching television for the next 24 hours.

The move is part of the school's month-long reading blitz, which began February 23 and will end March 12.

The aim of the reading blitz — and the shutting off of televisions — is to encourage students to develop the habit of home reading, says a newsletter sent by the school to parents.

In asking parents to co-operate with the 24-hour TV shutdown, the school noted that it conducted an extensive survey of student viewing habits last December. Among the survey results were:

- School students spent an average of 24 hours and 28 minutes a week watching television. Individual counts for the week of the survey ranged from zero to 57 hours.

- (By comparison, a U.S. study recently found that children between the ages of two and 12 years spend an average of 25 hours a week in front of television sets.)

- The time average Salt Spring Elementary School students spent watching television represented 14.59 per cent of the total hours in the week and about 25 per cent of their waking hours.

(By comparison, the same stu-

dents spent 14.88 per cent of the total hours of the week in school, which translated to 25.5 per cent of waking hours.)

The school newsletter says that a question raised by the survey — but not addressed — was how much time was spent by students in reading for pleasure.

"Our findings would seem to indicate that, for most students, it would have been far less than the amount of time spent watching television," the newsletter said in explaining that the reading blitz and shutting off of TVs for 24 hours is aimed at developing the habit of reading at home.

"The main aim is to develop a habit of home reading: perhaps this is done now, perhaps not, but the reading blitz will reinforce habitual home reading already taking place and introduce recreational reading into some homes. This is our goal — to have as many of our children reading at home as possible."

In noting that the focus is to form reading habits through frequency and not to add to homework assignments, the school asked local parents to co-operate in the program by reading with their children and offering assistance. "The goal," the newsletter said, "is on ensuring that reading at home is fun, rather than frustrating."

As part of the program, classroom teachers have distributed tally sheets to each child.

Helpers praised by library board

Volunteers received a strong dose of praise and recognition at the Salt Spring Public Library Association's annual general meeting, held in Ganges last week.

Chairman Merle Sheffield ended her term in office by thanking the legion of volunteer workers who staff the library and carry its services to the public.

"We can't say enough about all the volunteers," she noted. "Without them, there would be no library as we know and love it."

In her report to the meeting, Sheffield noted that the library presently has 57 active volunteers, including 11 who are newly-trained. In the past year, she said, the volunteers logged 309 substitute shifts.

Important work done by the volunteers last year included book-mending, choosing and purchasing new books, cataloguing the library inventory, keeping the shelves in order and ensuring the membership files are up to date.

Sheffield's report said the library currently has 1,230 regular memberships and 502 sustaining memberships, for a total of 1,732 adult members. Library patrons, she added, read 61,404 books in 1986, including 19,259 non-fiction books, 35,711 fiction books, 5,866 junior books, 28 classics and 540 large-print books on loan from the Library Services Branch.

The library's inventory reached 18,433 last year, including 5,462 fiction works, 8,648 non-fiction books, 266 large-print fictions, 32 large-print non-fiction in hard-back, 1,458 junior books, 2,304 fiction paperbacks and 533 non-fiction paperbacks available to members.

Sheffield noted that 143 requests were made locally for books from the Library Services Branch's inter-library loan department. Of those, all but 23 were available.

She also pointed out that the Salt Spring library was the best bargain in the province according to Library Services Branch statistics: cost of the service was \$3.27 per capita.

In reviewing events of the past year, Sheffield referred to a petition circulated on the island which requested establishment of a regional library. The library board, she said, met with a committee representing petition-

ers and while the meeting was "informative to a point, (it) was not conclusive and another meeting was to be arranged by us for the fall.

"Due to unforeseen circumstances, this was not done and as no further contact was made by the committee, it was dropped."

Other highlights noted by Sheffield included: the work done by Carol Langston to order, reorganize and catalogue the junior books section; connection of the library to the Ganges sewer; and an experiment with a copying machine that was sent back after repeated failures caused frustration among volunteers and patrons.

Residents protest changes to Strathcona Park

Between 20 and 25 Salt Spring Islanders have already indicated they are concerned about the provincial government's plan to delete 22,000 hectares from Strathcona Provincial Park.

Donald Kreye, a Salt Spring Island resident and Friends of Strathcona Park member, said last week he is urging local residents who oppose the boundary changes to call the premier's office or the ministry of parks and environment and request a moratorium.

Sections of the 231,000-hectare provincial park on Vancouver

Island are being deleted or redesignated to permit mining and logging within wilderness areas. Several environmental and recreation groups — including Friends of Strathcona Park — are opposing the plan, which was announced last month by Environment and Parks Minister Stephen Rogers.

In a letter to *Driftwood* last week, Kreye noted that "some of Vancouver Island's most environmentally-sensitive areas have been taken out of the park, or downgraded to recreational status, to permit mining interests . . .

to develop gold and silver claims. Beside the impact of road construction, there will be lakes and streams dammed for hydro and the inevitable heavy metal and tailing pollution."

Kreye said Thursday he is trying to raise public awareness of the impact these changes will have on the park and organize local opposition to the proposal.

Kreye feels Salt Spring Islanders should be concerned about the changes, and not only because they threaten the integrity

of the park system. He pointed out that Strathcona is the closest large provincial park to the island.

According to Kreye, groups opposed to the Strathcona Park changes have only a limited time to convince the B.C. government that public hearings should be held on this matter. He noted the provincial government need only sign an order in council to make the changes law.

"And, of course, once they become law, it will be very difficult to reverse them," he pointed out.

Kreye is asking anyone who opposes the Strathcona Provincial Park changes to contact the premier's office and the ministry of environment and parks and request a moratorium. Additional information on the issue can be obtained by calling him at 537-2833.

Kreye said that he hopes to give a slide show here in the near future on Strathcona Park, and added that if enough interest is shown on Salt Spring, a Friends of Strathcona organization could be organized here.

Governing parties lack willpower—Harcourt

The federal and provincial governments' "lack of political willpower" is preventing B.C. from moving out of the economic doldrums, New Democratic Party leadership hopeful Mike Harcourt told those attending the Gulf Islands NDP Club's annual general meeting held last Monday night in Ganges.

Harcourt told the largely partisan crowd that thousands of jobs could be created in this province if both levels of government had the willpower to establish new programs and policies.

In giving examples of programs an NDP government would establish, Harcourt said 5,000 jobs could be created in the B.C. construction industry each year if the federal, provincial and municipal governments embarked on a program designed to upgrade service infrastructures in this province.

The MLA for Vancouver Centre said a national study conducted among municipal governments has determined that during the past 15 years, basic sewer and water services have been neglected in Canadian municipalities. He noted that in many instances, services are badly in need of major repairs and upgrading.

"In Vancouver, for example, some of the pipe under the streets is 70 years old," he said. "In Yellowknife, it will take \$8 million in a community of only 12,000 citizens to make repairs to the sewers. There, they found that the pipes underneath the town were fine on top, but on the bottom they had disappeared.

"Our basic services have been neglected in Canada, but they're nowhere near as bad as they are in the United States. In New York City, 35 per cent of the water that leaves the reservoir never gets to the tap because of leaks. In some places there, they're afraid to start digging for fear of what they'll find. They still have wooden sewers under some parts of New York."

Harcourt said it will take \$15 billion to upgrade Canada's municipal infrastructure. It has been recommended, he pointed out, that \$3 billion be spent annually during the next five years to correct these problems. The cost of this program, he added, would be shared between the federal, provincial and municipal governments.

"We could employ 60,000 across Canada, create 5,000 jobs in B.C.'s construction industry annually, plus all the spinoff jobs," he said.

Harcourt added that B.C. need not build the Site C dam in the Peace River country simply to meet energy needs or put construction crews to work. He pointed out that through energy

conservation and the creation of many small-scale hydro-electric and other power generation facilities, the province could produce the same amount of electricity as the proposed Site C dam — but at half the cost.

"We could, for example, take those six big burners in Williams Lake, and put in a system to use the wood waste, burn it in an environmentally sound system to generate electricity," he said. "It would make Williams Lake energy self-sufficient and even put some power back into the B.C. Hydro grid system — if they'd let us."

According to Harcourt, NDP members believe the creation of regionally-based economic strategies would help identify new economic opportunities in the province. These plans, prepared at the local level, would identify local resources and ways in which they could be used to create jobs and promote environmentally-safe economic development.

In keeping with this strategy, an NDP government would look to small and medium-sized businesses for job creation. Studies have shown that it is the small and medium size businesses that create most of the new jobs in B.C. and Canada as a whole.

Harcourt noted that B.C. is a world leader in the fields of high technology, communications and medicine. He added that British Columbians are also "tree farmers" and the NDP believes the province's "crop" should be properly tended, and its growing areas maintained if not enhanced.

"What we lack in B.C. is political willpower," he concluded. "We're not broke. But the people will get another chance to do something about it. In another 1,100 days (until the next B.C. election), they will be able to elect a government with willpower."

Manly speaks at meeting

NDP popularity on the rise

The New Democratic Party is for the first time a truly national political party, Cowichan-Malahat-the Islands MP Jim Manly told the Gulf Islands NDP Club's annual general meeting February 23 meeting in Ganges.

Manly told the crowd of more than 100 that, according to public opinion polls, the NDP is experiencing a new wave of national popularity.

"We are happy with our position in the polls, partly because of good management on our part, and some not so good management on the part of others," he said. "But we'll take what we can get."

The MP added that in the next federal election, the NDP will represent a serious threat to the two

established parties in all 10 provinces, rather than only four, as has been the case in the past.

Manly added that party leader Ed Broadbent must also take some of the credit for the party's resurgence at the polls.

"It's a tribute to Ed, because three years ago people were counting us out," he continued. "We went down in the polls from 26 per cent to 22, to 13, to 11, and at one point, to nine per cent. *Maclean's* magazine ran a story announcing the end of the NDP. They had us in the grave and were ready to shovel the dirt over us. But here we are, we're still fighting and we're still strong."

Manly said scandals in Ottawa such as the

Oerlikon affair have helped discredit the Progressive Conservative government. However, he added they have also prevented the NDP from focusing attention on many other — and perhaps more important — issues facing the country.

"All attention has been focused on the scandals, and because of this, we have not been able to raise other concerns like changes to Unemployment Insurance, daycare, land claims and the environment," he said. "Too much emphasis has been placed on this one issue of integrity in government, which has become the single, over-riding issue."

Manly said the Progressive Conservatives were now on a continual, downward spiral in the polls. Finance Minister Michael Wilson's recent federal budget, he added, will do nothing to help unemployed Canadians or solve the other pressing issues facing this country.

"It's a 'steady as she goes' budget, but as we in Western Canada and in the Maritimes and other areas know; things have not been going very good lately," he continued. "It (the budget) isn't bad in terms of taxes, but it does nothing for the unemployed, or the four million Canadians living below the poverty line in this country."

Manly said the NDP's rise in popularity was indicative of the problems facing many Canadians.

"The unfortunate thing is, if the NDP is doing very well, it's probably because a lot of Canadians are doing very badly."

Manly predicted that the New Democratic Party will eventually form the government in Canada.

"We will become the government," he said. "I don't know if it will be this election or the next one, but we will become the government. And we are determined that if we are the government, we will not be in it for us, but for the people in Canada, to ensure the young people have a decent country to grow up in."



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Pender meeting called to discuss health

has returned to Edmonton. There was unanimous agreement to seek another doctor, Hillhouse said.

"We're going to advertise for another."

If a doctor cannot be encour-

aged to move to the island, the community will seek a nurse practitioner.

Dr. Ellen Anderson has served the island for the past five years. "She was given a big vote of confidence at the meeting," Hill-

house said. "If we have just one doctor, she has to be on call 24 hours a day. Nobody can do that."

The shared hours will appeal to a semi-retired doctor who is not looking for a full-time workload, Hillhouse said. "A young fellow wouldn't come. There's not enough work."

The meeting lasted an hour and a half. The history of the society was outlined and the finances, which are good, were examined.

MILT's 'A Potpourri of Fantasy' an evening of cabaret-style fun

"God created this whole bizarre circus just to have someone to order around."

That line is one from an assortment of original skits produced by Mayne Island Little Theatre (MILT) for local audiences. The production, *A Potpourri of Fantasy*, was an evening of cabaret-style entertainment, composed of playlets.

"The members of the cast, crew and production staff were aware that they were putting themselves on the line when they presented *A Potpourri of Fantasy*, our latest production," MILT president Bill Bender said last week.

Bender has long- and short-term plans for MILT. "I would like to see 50 per cent of MILT's productions (be) original and indigenous to Mayne Island," he says. Bender justifies that long-term view by pointing to the overwhelming success of *A Potpourri of Fantasy*, and notes that the short-term proposal is production of "tried and true" plays.

Bender said he feels MILT has grown more sophisticated in appreciating the varying aspects of theatre from having put together

their own production. "This process," he says, "tends to make people aware that they are responsible for a specific aspect of the whole production."

MILT president since the beginning of the 1985 fall season, Bender acknowledges the efforts of Ian Cocker, who instructs the drama class at Mayne Island School. "It really helps," he said, "when a play calls for younger

characters, to have available young people who are versed in the rudiments of acting and are able to accept and respond to direction."

In the long term, it is within MILT's grasp to act as a medium for Mayne Islanders to express themselves, entertain themselves and communicate — theatrically and culturally — with other islands, Bender concluded.

Police locate stolen items

Three juveniles proved to be adept art collectors, but not quite so skilled as thieves.

Pender RCMP will charge two Pender youths and one Victoria juvenile — all male — with break and enter, and possession of stolen property.

Const. Brian Brown recovered several thousand dollars worth of stolen items after the parents of one of the boys caught their son with some of the loot.

The articles included artwork, antiques, tools and candy. The artwork included oriental sculptures worth several thousand dollars, Brown said. "They had no idea what they had."

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Saturna firemen want to do efficiency study

Saturna Island's fire department hopes the "province will finance a study to determine how to make the service more efficient.

At the fire department's request, the Saturna Community Club has written to the Island's MLAs to arrange a meeting, according to Alfred Reynolds, one of the department's captains.

The community representative will seek provincial money to hire

a local resident who could perform a study to determine the island's needs and how to meet them, Reynolds said.

The department is supported by revenue from two annual barbecues and occasional donations, Reynolds said. This pays for the heat and taxes on the hall and other operating expenses.

A lack of money for other areas, including training and equipment, has blunted the depart-

ment's effectiveness, he added. "It's been apparent for the last two or three years."

Reynolds has noticed fewer volunteers who want to take an active role in the department, and says the number who turn out for weekly practices is diminishing.

"Everybody's interested in fighting a fire but when you get there, not very many know what to do."

Reynolds thinks more volunteers would surface if expenses associated with the week-long training session in Vancouver were paid for by the department. "Nobody wants to pay out-of-pocket expenses to take training."

Partial remuneration for the fire chief would help the department as well. "We've burned out about half a dozen fire chiefs in the last 11 years."

The study would compile information related to the benefits and costs of possible improvements. The information would be useful if the department sought a referendum to begin tax levies to support the fire department.

"We'll have to have all the answers. How much will the (public's) insurance cost if we don't have a fire department at all? If we get updated, how much will they save?"

The house of Lily Island, at the mouth of Boot Cove, was totally destroyed; the roof had collapsed before the fire department arrived. Tom Coulton, current owner of the house and a frequent visitor to Saturna since 1969, was greatly saddened by the loss.

According to Lorraine Campbell, the house was built by McArthur from Victoria in the early 1940s. Lorraine said she found it funny that Jerry Payne's kids, who lived at Breezy Bay, were shocked to find Lily Island didn't belong to their family, as they had so often rowed over and explored the island at the time of the sale.

Dr. Hallowes owned the island for years before the Coultons bought it. We all sympathize with the Coultons.

On February 21, at a fire extinguisher jamboree sponsored by the Women's Club and the Fire Department, about 16 people turned out to the fire hall to listen to Vancouver fireman Donald Newell.

The frequent visitor to Saturna explained various types of fire extinguishers, the best way to use them and basic emergency fire skills. Participants then gained confidence and experience using their own extinguishers to put out small fires set at the hall. The community service was much appreciated.

Alfred Reynolds reminds the community that fire extinguishers need to be serviced every two years.

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Galiano APC elections prove lively contest

The public meeting to elect three members to the APC was held on Saturday, February 21. The relatively good turn-out was attributed by some to a rabble-raising criticism of the commission in *Driftwood*, and by others to a case of meeting-packing by a group hoping to liberalize the home occupation definition in the zoning bylaw.

During 'question period,' the chairman and the two Island Trustees who sit on the commission revealed that work on revising the Community Plan bylaw had been suspended pending revision of the Municipal Act, that a questionnaire regarding *home occupations* had been prepared, but not distributed as it was to be reviewed, and that a draft proposal to amend the section of the zoning bylaw dealing with commercial accommodation had not been favourably received by resort owners, who would be making counter-proposals.

The commission consists of five members elected for two-year terms. Chairman Elizabeth Ocsko and Christine Finnis have one more year to serve. Six candidates stood for the three positions, and in a close contest Bob Knowles was re-elected and newcomers Judi Pattison and Carmen Braund beat out George Tully, Bob Alsbury and Bruce Landmark. The three newly-elected members of the commission must wait until the Galiano Island Trust Committee meeting of March 28 to have their appointments confirmed.

Notice Board Bylaw

The Galiano Commission has received a number of complaints about the misuse of public notice boards on the island. Some organizations hog space with huge and gaudy posters depriving discreet users — whose information is of just as much value to the reading public — of a place to put their notices; pornographic material can be posted without any let or hindrance from moral regulation; misleading information abounds and out-of-date material clutters every board.

The commission has therefore drawn up a bylaw regulating the use of every public notice board on the island. Watch for details on your neighbourhood board. Although the commission cannot regulate boards in private premises it is to be hoped that the lodge and the pub and any other establishments displaying inside information will see the bylaw as a guideline for policing their own notice boards.

As well as regulating the content of postings, the bylaw limits the size of any display to 50 square inches or 325 square centimeters. To enforce the bylaw a commissioner will be appointed. To be frank, this person should be a speed-reader as it is only a part-time job, with hours from midnight until 4 am on two nights a week.

The person appointed must have a car and supply his or her own tools which include a flashlight, nail puller, tape measure and garbage bag. Applicants must be of good moral character, know community standards and be able to distinguish between pornography and art. A more detailed job description, with rates of pay, may be obtained from the commission secretary.

The commission has no connection with the APC, nor does it have its bylaws approved by the Trust or the Lieutenant-Governor in Council. It rates the

intelligence of Galiano citizens more highly than these other bodies and does not require the bylaw to be read four times before the public gets the message. This bylaw will come into effect on the Ides of March.

North Galiano News

The North Galiano Community Association recently held its annual general meeting. Bill Stafford is serving his second term as present and Elizabeth Ocsko is the new vice-president. In appreciation of the valuable contribution to the association made by Edith Wishart as secretary-treasurer, she was made an honorary life member. Continuing to serve on the committee are Audrey Cook, Arne Haksi and Alistair Ross, while Joan Waterman and Woodrow Coward were newly elected.

Business over, the North-enders enjoyed coffee, cookies and scrutinizing a collection of 160 pictures showing reconstruction of and events staged in the renovated North Galiano Community Hall.

Bylaw to be redrafted

A bylaw to rezone Mayne Island waters to deal with existing mariculture operations will be redrafted.

A February 19 public hearing indicated that some Mayne residents were given the impression the rezoning would permit new mariculture operations. South Pender trustee and Trust Council vice-chairman Steve Wright blamed the bylaw's wording.

Trustees wanted to remove mariculture as a permitted use in water also used for public moorage (W2) and marinas (W3), and create two new classifications specifically for bivalves (W3a) and algae (W3b). An oyster lease and a seaweed operation to make nori nets already exist.

"You're turning a recreational area into a commercial area," accused John Coates, one of 30 people who attended.


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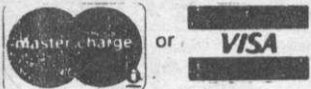

Professor asked to let name stand

A Vancouver professor is being considered as the chairman of a commission which would hold an independent review into lighthouse automation.

University of B.C. oceanography professor Paul LeBlonde said west coast Coast Guard officials last month asked him if they could submit his name to Ottawa as a possible commission chairman.

"I told them I would do it if they chose me." The Coast Guard officials, LeBlonde said, also told him the names of other people who will be considered.

LeBlonde is awaiting news and does not know when the review would be held. Transport Canada's west coast officials were unable to confirm earlier media reports that a review was definite, though LeBlonde's report indicates planning is underway.

"It's probably true that it will go ahead," LeBlonde said. "It's a matter of what time."

LeBlonde said the Coast Guard will determine most of the terms of reference for a review, though the commission would have some voice. "There would be as much of an effort as possible to contact the

users (of lighthouses)."

Transport Canada, through the Coast Guard, announced last year it intended to unman some west coast lighthouses, as has been done on the east coast. Opposition from commercial fishermen, recreational boaters, other marine groups and the union representing lighthouse keepers has led to consideration of a review.

LeBlonde served as a commission chairman for the federal environment department during the investigation of an October, 1984, storm which sank several west coast fishing boats.

• According to Ganges weather observer H. Carlin, the island received 21 inches of snow during the week.

Many people were walking, and there were a lot of cars in the ditch. Wreckers and taxi drivers were doing a booming business. Sheep farmers were feeding their animals and gardeners were wondering about the early-blooming daffodils hidden under the snow.

Twenty years ago
