## Classes encourage theatre involvement

Teachers of the mentally-handicapped, and their Salt Spring Island charges, attended a series of Saturday workshops aimed at encouraging their involvement in theatrical productions.

Held at the Activity Centre in Ganges, the workshops were led by Ann McQueen, actor-director and long-standing teacher with Theatre Terrific of Vancouver, a group formed in 1985 to involve people with mental and physical disabilities in creative drama and stage productions.

Funded by the Community Arts Council with assistance from the Community Society, the workshops were initiated by Laurie Clarke of the society's Achievement Centre. Separate sessions were held for teachers and for handicapped adults.

Along with introducing islanders to the concept of involving the handicapped in theatre, McQueen said the Salt Spring sessions were designed to assess the possibility of initiating a local group. She added that the prospects for a Salt Spring Island group are good, given the sense of community apparent on the island and the acceptance of the handicapped as a part of that community.

"It's different in Vancouver, where you get on a bus and you're a stranger," she said.

The aim of Theatre Terrific is to dissolve attitudinal barriers towards the mentally handicapped. Central to its thrust is the staging

of productions drafted and performed by individuals who have a disability.

McQueen said that thrust means audiences attending a Theatre Terrific performance are introduced to the perspectives held by the handicapped, not to non-handicapped script-writers or directors attempting to interpret those views.

A newsletter by Theatre Terrific notes: "Disability is a part of life. Theatre and the performing arts are a reflection of life. If you believe in the idea of putting people ahead of labels and if you see drama not as a fantastic art

form but as a powerful tool for communication, then you believe in what we're doing."

The workshops held in Ganges last Saturday concentrated on communication skills, including both verbal and non-verbal abilities. Some of the exercises introduced were from Theatre Terrific's repertoire, while others were developed by Nicola Perrin of the Dancing Dog Theatre Company of Vancouver.

Participants at the workshop had high praise for the day's events. One, Lynda Jensen of Vesuvius Bay, attended because of her interest in theatre. She said she was impressed by the theatrical instruction offered and by the way the group accepted all participants.

Theatre Terrific, meanwhile, will take one of its productions to Vancouver Island in May, during National Awareness Week for the Disabled. *Such Stuff As Dreams Are Made Of*, a collaborative work by six physically-disabled students which grew out of a script development workshop, will be staged in Courtenay and Comox.

Theatre Terrific performs year-round to conferences and community groups in an attempt to dissolve attitudes towards the disabled. Its repertoire includes *Oh Fooy*, and *Dancing on the head of a pin with a mouse in my pocket*. Last year, it performed at the Vancouver Fringe Festival.

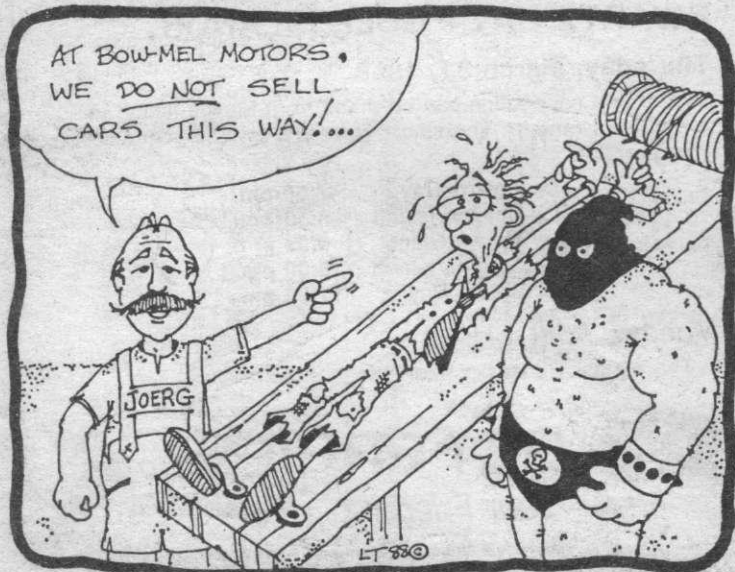

## Amnesty to mobilize for signatures

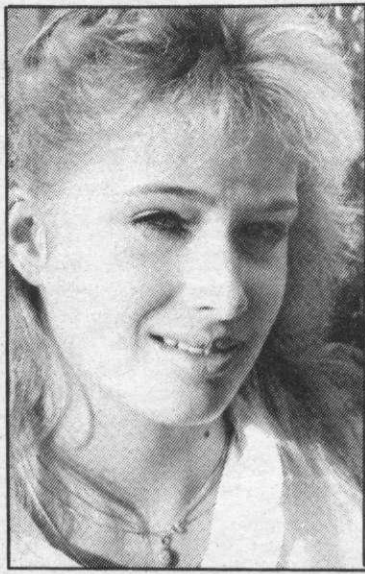
The Salt Spring Island chapter of Amnesty International (AI) is participating in a world-wide drive to mobilize the organization's 700,000 members in 100 countries.

In Canada, the *Human Rights Now* campaign is seeking 250,000 signatures on a petition to be presented to the United Nations on the 40th anniversary of the adoption of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights.

Salt Spring's AI chapter says the campaign's launch comes at a time when the organization's work is needed most: "Nearly half of the countries in the world have prisoners of conscience, 60 of them use physical torture, many employ paramilitary death squads, and in 120 of them there are judicial executions — often in flagrant violation of elementary justice (a current example is the Sharpeville case in South Africa)."

The release points out that the threat of death or torture or inhumane imprisonment has a paralyzing effect on even the mildest dissent — and its use is increasing among regimes which find terror to be a useful political tool.

"That there are brave people in such countries who know the risks yet speak out is a tribute to the human spirit," AI says. "It is incumbent upon us, safe here in Canada, to support them — to have the wrongs inflicted on them investigated and publicized. In the last analysis, they are suffering for us."

The Salt Spring Island council of the Catholic Women's League held its March meeting on Wednesday, the 9th. The ladies assembled in Our Lady of Grace Church for Mass at 1 pm, at which league pins were presented to member Nellie Gilman, and to new members Joan Calderhead, Mary Anne Leber and Mary Whelan. Maple leaf service pins were presented to Jean McCaffery and Ursula McEwen for their long service with the league.

The business meeting was held in the parish hall. Members were advised of the provincial convention being hosted by St. Mary's Council in Chilliwack from June 20 to 23. There was also some discussion of the Victoria Diocesan convention slated for May 10 and 11. It is being hosted by St. Joseph's council in Victoria.

Joan Calderhead volunteered to attend the meeting on March 10 with representatives from the Anglican, Community Gospel and United Churches to plan this year's World Relief Tea.

The members unanimously supported a motion to have the secretary write on behalf of the SSI Council to Premier Vander Zalm, commending his stance on the abortion issue and assuring him of their support.

Alicia Anderson, convener of the nominations committee, distributed nomination forms to the members in preparation for the election of officers to be held in April. Jeanne Anderson was appointed election secretary.

## File will hold resource information for seniors living in the Gulf Islands

Salt Spring's *Seniors for Seniors* group is compiling a comprehensive resource file of services available to island seniors — and is seeking volunteers willing to help with the project.

The group says the work involves "ferreting out information of all sorts, and compiling it into a usable file" that will contain names and telephone numbers, brochures, application forms and any other data of use to seniors.

Volunteers will be asked to take responsibility for an area of special interest, "scouting out" all the available information on that topic.

"As the file takes shape, there will also be a need for volunteers to dispense the information," the seniors group adds.

The recently-formed seniors group has establishment of the resource files as its main focus, but expects to widen operations in the near future. It hopes the group will act as a vehicle for Salt Spring retirees to identify their needs and co-ordinate and carry out services required to meet those needs.

The group meets on the fourth Thursday of each month. Its next meeting is at 10 am on March 24 in the board room of the provincial government building near the Upper Ganges Centre.

# Double meaning in headline about chamber

Chamber Splits: The headline may be read in two ways. Using Chamber as an adjective and *splits* as a plural noun meaning those who depart, it indicates that several members of the Chamber of Commerce executive have declared their intention not to run again. These include the hard-working and able acting president Bill Callaway and next in succession Fran Whipple. Also not continuing as directors are Ann Hennessy and Akasha Forest. Connie Kennedy, who was nominated to contest a place on the board, withdrew when she learned that there was opposition to her candidacy on the grounds that she was not 'in business'. It must be a matter of concern when a committee loses three intelligent young women at the same time as two experienced executives.

These events lead to the other interpretation of the title, that the executive of the chamber is divided over the matter of philosophy. The Galiano chamber has always been schizophrenic over its role, unable to decide whether it is a development and business-oriented group or a rate-payers association representing the people of Galiano in negotiations with government agencies such as BC Ferries, Hydro or the department of highways. The chamber can, of course, change its position on this matter, but whether this should be done by a rump of the executive or by the membership at large can be argued. However, with the membership fee now set at \$12, it is not likely that many Galiano residents will feel inclined to pay dues to contest with the business faction. Even the business community is somewhat divided as many in the hospitality industry, which employs more people than any other, have a rather lukewarm relationship with the chamber.

There have been times when the majority of citizens have thought the Chamber to be irrelevant except to its own very limited membership. If this again becomes the situation the question arises as to whether the chamber is the appropriate organization to represent the views of the residents of Galiano.

### Celebration of the Tree

The series of events organized by the Galiano School of the Arts to raise consciousness about dangers to the environment began on Sunday, March 13, in the Community Hall. In a gracious opening speech Akasha Forest made presentations of specially designed Galiano tree-posters to recipients in recognition of their contribution to the aims of the celebration.

Professor Emeritus of Guelph University, Dr. A. A. Kingscote,

needs no introduction to Galiano readers, but his chronicle of achievements puts us all to shame. Margaret Griffiths was deservedly cited for her study of eagles and her campaign to protect their habitat on Galiano. A group award was made to Mrs. C. Maneker and her class from Galiano School for their record in raising \$250 for Greenpeace — the highest school total for Canada. Even *Driftwood* received mention for the nature-oriented articles in the Galiano column.

The main item on the agenda was an inspiring account by Montague Park naturalist, Dave Fraser, of the rehabilitation of the site of the open-pit coal mine in southeast B.C. The mining company, to comply with government regulations, hired a group of naturalists to restore the

devastated landscape. The result was an ecological triumph of learning and improvisation, with the re-introduction of not only vegetation but also wildlife from the native ungulates to wild and game birds, insects and even appropriate bacteria.

Equally instructive were the principles of environmental care that can be applied to private properties and public areas such as parks. The value of snags, nurse-logs, stumps and native vegetation to provide a habitat for 'creatures great and small' was explained.

We shall miss Dave this coming summer although there will be a naturalist in Montague Park, which last season notched the highest visitor response to nature programs per dollar of cost of all BC provincial parks. Dave has been promoted to naturalist at the prestigious Freeman King Interpretive Centre in Goldstream Park.

The *Celebration of the Tree* concluded on Saturday, March 19, in the Activity Centre with one of the most innovative programs ever

seen on Galiano. Designed primarily for children, with the emphasis on participation, the colourful decor, imaginative sound and light assembly and the choreography by Francine Renaud provided entertainment for adults and subjects for photographers with still and video cameras.

On arrival, participants were invited by novelist Audrey Thomas to record a wish for

Galiano on a 'leaf' and have their faces painted. They then listened to Coast Salish story-teller Ellen White recount the tale of *The Deer and the Cedar Tree*. This was followed by the main entertainment, a masquerade, *The Well*, with a cast of about 70 children accompanying four adult dancers. Francine and her group are to be congratulated for this very creative

# Harry Baines contributed greatly to Galiano Island

**NORTH GALIANO** — The *Sea Wave* has been a familiar sight in North Galiano for many years. Now wharfed in safety, it formerly was anchored in Baines Bay, a convenient spot a quarter mile from the home of its owner, Harry Baines. Harry died on Monday, March 9, in Ladysmith Hospital. Many of his family were at his bedside for his final moments. He was 83.

Harry built the *Sea Wave* on his property at North Galiano and he fished these waters constantly during his later years. It was his third boat. Earlier he had rebuilt a purchased vessel and before that had used a rowboat for his fishing. Boats were in his blood.

Harry's father, George Harry Baines, an Englishman, moved from Ladysmith, Harry's birthplace, to Valdes Island and established a boat repair shop on a scow there about 1917. A couple of years later the scow was towed across Porlier Pass to Galiano and beached at what is now Baines Bay. Later the scow was raised and set on pilings and a motor repair shop added. Harry and his brother helped their father in the business. The boys had six sisters.

In 1927, the Baines men took part in the work parties which were formed to construct the new school, now the North Galiano Community Hall. The following year Harry married Devina Allison, older daughter of lighthouse keeper Sticks Allison of Porlier Pass. Harry and Devina had 56 years of happy life together in North Galiano. It was a fruitful marriage; they had seven children; Joy, Jeannie, Harry Jr., Thelma, Lawrence (Buddy), Tillie and Lloyd. Three of the seven still live on Galiano with their families. There are now 27 grandchildren, 29 great-grandchildren and one great-great-grandchild. Harry saw the little one in hospital before he died.

During the early years of his marriage, Harry found work as an engineer at the Tabata herring saltery, located below the bluffs in the middle of Saltery Bay. When the Japanese left during the Second World War he worked for a short period for Francis Millard, who took over the saltery. With the closure of all the salteries, Harry acted as caretaker for a time.

In March, 1950, the Baines house burned to the ground. Harry and daughter Jeanne were out fishing at the time. Jeanne remembers seeing the smoke as they returned home down the west side of Valdes Island. The boathouse became their living quarters after that devastating fire. It was later converted into their house and Harry lived there until he went to hospital in Ladysmith three weeks ago.

Harry will be remembered by the community for his long years of service as fire warden for this area. He will also be remembered as a quiet man and a loving husband and father. The *Sea Wave* will be missed, too. A year or so ago, this writer took a photo of Harry on the *Sea Wave* just 50 feet or so from the shore. The successful fisherman, Harry, is to be seen pulling in a cod. Memories are made from scenes like this.

The funeral for Harry Baines was held in St. John's Anglican Church in Ladysmith on Friday, March 14, 1988, with Rev. Fred Hartel officiating. It was standing room only. A number of North Galiano residents present and past

were on hand to pay their respects to the Baines family and to remember their friend and former neighbour. Harry's granddaughter Dianne Scheppe composed a tribute to her grandpa and this was read during the service by her Aunt Tillie, Harry's youngest daughter.

After the service and interment at Ladysmith Municipal Cemetery, a gathering was held with the family, in First United Church Hall. Harry's sister Isabella Seikert of Duncan, and his sister-in-law Frances Brown of Colwood, were among the family members present.



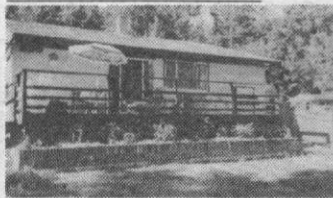

## Phil King leads Pender committee

**PENDER ISLAND** — The Port Advisory Committee held its first formal session this past week and elected Phil King as chairman and Bob George as secretary-treasurer.

King represents the Pender Island Yacht Club. Bob George owns the Corbett Store at Hope Bay and is employed by Fisheries and Oceans as wharfinger for the government docks at Hope Bay and at Browning Harbour.

Following the election of officers the committee voted to send a letter to Fisheries and Oceans requesting that action be taken to repair a sunken float at Browning Harbour.

"It wasn't common knowledge until a few days ago," says Gordon Wallace, "that Bob George has been making repairs and constructing floats as the need arose ... and doing it with his own money. I recommended that the committee find a way to sell the floats to the government so that they can take responsibility."



Support Your Lung Association

Wallace, the father of the Pender Island Port Authority concept, says he is now ready to take a back seat. "I've seen my role as that of a facilitator and the job is now complete and the committee functioning. I'll be available to help in any way but there are eight strong individuals in place who can make this thing work."

The Port Advisory Committee will act under a mandate from the Coast Guard and Fisheries and Oceans for a one-year trial period, during which they will keep the two government agencies informed as to the need for maintenance and repair to the various government wharves at Port Washington, Hope Bay, Browning Harbour and Bedwell Harbour.

The committee will also recommend the appointment of wharfingers to oversee the various dock facilities. The Coast Guard and Fisheries will pay the wharfingers and continue to cover all day-to-day operating expenses.

At the end of a year the committee will meet again with the government agencies to determine whether it is in the best interest of all concerned for the committee to take over all day-to-day operations of Pender's ports.

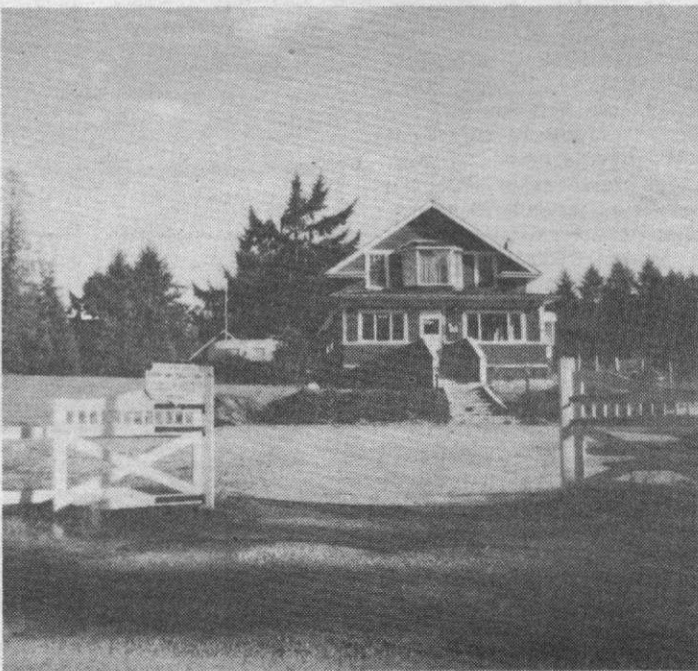

celebration of the last day of winter.

The performance ended with a procession along a corridor of gaily-decorated trees through green streamers outside to plant a plum tree in commemoration of the festival.

Finally, a cluster of balloons with all the wishes attached was released to sail high into the clouded sky.

## Sensitive areas

Clear Cut Alternatives and Galiano Island Trust jointly sponsored a public meeting last Sunday in the Activity Centre to identify areas of Galiano considered of special ecological, recreational, historical or archaeological interest to be included in proposals to be made to MacMillan-Bloedel regarding the company's logging plan for

Galiano. A very satisfactory turnout of concerned residents almost filled the gymnasium.

The meeting was ably chaired by Mike Hoebel, who introduced a number of recent, relevant studies including a *Natural Resources Inventory* (1975) which identified Georgia Stait as one of the most significant recreational areas in the world, a *Resource Analysis Study* done for the Trust which produced a series of 12 comprehensive and detailed maps of Galiano covering such topics as geology, soils, vegetation and visual classification, and a 1980 study done by the Pacific Forest Research Centre for Environment Canada.

The assembly then broke into seven study groups of up to a dozen persons who discussed sensitive areas, marked them with comments on a map and reported back to the meeting through a spokesperson. These will be summarized in next week's

*Driftwood* and in about two weeks distributed to all Galiano households by a general mailing.

To provide residents with an opportunity to view some of these sensitive areas several people volunteered to lead field trips or boat outings. The first two of these will take place next Sunday, March 27, at 1:30 pm. Geoff Gaylor will lead an exploration of what remains of the east coast trail (meet on Georgia Heights Road by the MB sign), and at 3 pm Dawn Christian will guide a Bodega Ridge walk (meet at the top of Cottage Way). The next meeting to consider the sensitive area suggestions will be held on April 9 when additional excursions will be announced.

## Fire Hazard

Last summer we on Galiano suffered, as did many other places in BC, from drought — but

fortunately no serious fires. With below average rain this winter, the water table is very low and the bush, with much dead salal extremely dry. Fire Chief Williams asks that all burning of rubbish be done as soon as possible and with great care.

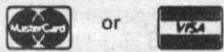

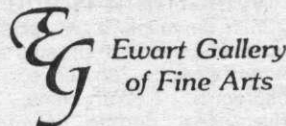

**Disappointed**

Sir,  
Those of us who have been involved over the past week in the controversy surrounding the ecological reserve on Mt. Tuam offer our sincere disappointment that Paul Kynaston has tendered his resignation as warden of this reserve. This position is strictly voluntary and involves the overseeing and protection of the reserve, as well as acting as liaison between the ecological reserve unit and the public.

For the past year, Mr. Kynaston has taken on the responsibility with a deep conviction as to the worth of the program. He has offered his resignation because he feels the staff of the ecological reserve unit has failed to keep him informed, even though an application was received as far back as mid-February, by Pepperbrook Retreat Ltd., for the purpose of moving logs through the reserve from the adjacent property.

Mr. Kynaston was not informed until he made urgent enquiries about survey tape, placed through the reserve in several locations, indicating a planned route.

Mr. Kynaston feels, as we do, that to not inform the acting warden of such intent makes his job meaningless. He wishes only to protect the reserve. Without Mr. Kynaston's posting of signs in the rain last week, the public would most likely still be unaware that the co-ordinator was entertaining such an application.

Mr. Kynaston does not feel that the position of warden has any meaning if the ministry has chosen to disregard the rules and intent of the Ecological Reserve Act.

In conclusion, we wish the public to know that Mr. Kynaston has performed his duties as warden to the highest degree of competency, and deserves better recognition from the co-ordinator of the Ecological Reserve Unit than the way he has been treated.

**A glimpse**

Sir,  
On Sunday, March 27, at 1 pm, two visitors from Nicaragua — Isaura Chavarria Salgado and Angela Calvo — will speak on their country's revolutionary approach to education. Their talk will take place in the lower hall of

Ganges United Church. The two women are, respectively, secretary-general of the Nicaraguan Teachers' Union (Matagalpa high district) and the director for Adult Popular Education (Leon region).

There are probably more computers in Salt Spring's three elementary schools than there are in all of Nicaragua. There are probably more pencils here than in all of Nicaragua's schools. But what they do have in abundance that we sorely lack is a clear sense of direction — a shared, societal vision of what education is for.

It comes out of a long tradition of revolutionary struggle and popular education, which are seen to go hand in hand. During the six years that Sandino led the struggle against the U.S. Marine occupation of his country, he also fought for literacy classes for his officers, and a popular education based on common problems and aimed at improving living conditions. Under Carlos Fonseca, four decades later, Sandinista militants taught literacy skills alongside instruction in weapons.

The struggle continues: rural teachers, along with health workers, have been among the contra terrorists' favourite targets. Many educational collectives have been forced to shut down because of direct sabotage or the danger to students attending classes in areas of intense counter-revolutionary actions. It is hard to imagine what it must be like to teach under such conditions.

Still, advances also continue: since 1979, transformations have centred on fostering more collective, participatory, inquiry-oriented, and work-related approaches. Major steps have also been taken to involve schools more directly in community development.

At the higher education level, social science students record nutritional deficiencies in school children, law students help establish and run legal aid clinics for low-income people, and engineering students work in sugar mills. Under Somoza, youth were often considered enemies of the state. Now, in a profound cultural change, students and youth assume major responsibilities for the success of education in their country.

All this offers but a glimpse of a radically different situation to our own. To learn more from Nicaragua's revolutionary experience, please come out on Sunday to meet, hear and question Isaura Chavarria Salgado and Angela Calvo.

# Gardeners host visions of vegetables

With the arrival of spring, gardeners are already starting to get an appetite for the good things to come from both the vegetable garden and the berry patch. The rhubarb is showing its pink buds, and the asparagus is about to burst forth, but for many of the other delectable goodies, we have to turn to our southern imports for flavour and inspiration.

One of the current treats coming up from California and Mexico is strawberries, and while they may not taste quite as good as our home-grown ones, they do manage to fuel the inner drive to get out into the berry patch and get our own plants into top-producing condition.

By carefully selecting the proper site, and choosing the right plants, Coastal gardeners can enjoy strawberries from the garden from June right on through to the first fall frost. In a sunny spot the green berries may even manage to ripen after the passage of a light frost, and by using cloches or plant tents, some delectable berries may be produced by late May.

When dealing with strawberries, the first and most important thing is to choose the right site, as they love a sunny, somewhat sheltered spot that has good drainage and a light-textured soil. A sandy loam soil with a pH of 5.0 to 6.0, and a fairly high organic matter content, is ideal.

While fresh, "hot" manure puts out too much nitrogen, composted or aged manure or seaweed will work wonders in improving the soil's moisture-retaining ability, and at the same time add in balanced nutrients. For optimal production, ample water must be provided throughout the dry season, especially for the everbearing (correctly named day-neutral) varieties, as they are trying to produce full, juicy berries during summer's driest months.

If excess surface moisture may be a problem during the wetter months, then you should consider making raised or boxed beds. Run your rows across the slope, and try to start with soil as clean and weed-free as you can produce.

When laying out the beds, set the plants 18 inches apart, two rows per bed. If the bed is two feet wide, you will be able to peg down one or two runners next year to fill in the rows, and if the final cropping plants end up spaced a foot or so apart within the rows, with plenty of room to grow out between the rows, you will find weeding easier (only having to weed between rows) and your crop will consist of a larger quantity of larger berries.

Should you choose not to use the modified hill or row system, and opt for the matted row system

where you have a solid bed of smaller, less productive plants, you will harvest more berries but smaller-sized ones, and the total crop will be pretty much the same. You will find that by using the two-row system and mulching the space between the rows with black plastic or a moisture-permeable filter cloth (great stuff), weeding will be minimal and production will be the best possible.

We'll talk about variety choices later on, but for all plants, choose ones that are dormant or just starting to grow, have just been freshly dug and have had their roots trimmed back to five inches or so in length. Trim back your own transplants too, so that roots won't end up being balled up or bunched together, in order to fit into the planting hole. Use some bonemeal for each plant, and top dress the bed with a quarter pound of superphosphate and an eighth of a pound (two ounces) of ammonium sulphate for each square yard of bed area.

For an easier product use berry food, and time the application so that the plants get fed just as they've made eight to 10 full leaves.

When planting, be certain to set the plants with their crowns one quarter of an inch above the soil line, as deep planting ensures problems with root rot. Keep down the weeds as the season progresses, and don't allow any blooms to develop into berries; for the first season with the regular June-bearing varieties, and for the day-neutrals, keep picking off the buds until the end of June, and then let them go into production. Berries will be ready for picking by late July.

If you resist the urge to hasten your plants into production, they will become sturdier and bear better in the long run. Likewise, with the production of runners for the purpose of expanding or filling in your beds, don't let new plantings spend valuable energy on

making runners. Pick off any that form in the first year, and the next year allow only two runners to develop for each plant.

Let the runner grow out a few inches past the first plantlet, and pinch out the runner tip, so that it doesn't travel on and make more babies, and then use the cut stub as a hold-down, using a bent wire to pin the plantlet to the ground. By autumn the plantlet will be well enough rooted to be relocated into its new home.

Just before fruiting commences, put down a straw mulch around the plants to keep the berries clean, preserve valuable moisture, and perhaps most importantly, to keep the roots cool. For the everbearing types, fruit production slows or even ceases when the soil temperature rises above 25 degrees Celsius, and the shallow roots are sensitive to heating.

In late August or early September, seed in barley between the rows as a green manure. The fall frosts will kill it, and you can turn it under when cultivating in the fall or early spring.

In subsequent years, you should time a feeding for when the new growth starts in the spring.

applying two ounces of a balanced fertilizer for each plant. Repeat this process right after harvesting is finished for the June bearers, and for the everbearing types, feed in late June and again in early August. Once again, always remember to irrigate and mulch.

## Twenty-five years ago
