Islanders honour retiring fire chief

Firemen and trustees of the Salt Spring Island Volunteer Fire Department paid tribute on Saturday evening to Fire Chief Bob Leask, who has retired after 10 years in the position. Amid the accolades and presentations, no tribute was warmer than that paid by a former chairman of the fire district, Fred Donaghy, who was serving in that capacity when the fire chief was appointed.

There have been four fire chiefs in the history of the island department, recalled Donaghy, who was one of that number. As chairman of the board and, later, after he left the fire district, the speaker heard numerous complaints in respect of the other three, he told the gathering.

"I never heard a complaint or a criticism of Fire Chief Bob Leask," he recalled.

Firemen who had been out all night on Friday in response to two fire calls and a fruitless rescue operation, were eager participants in the gala night.

The lower hall at the Masonic Hall in Ganges was crowded with serving firemen and trustees as well as those who had since completed their association with department and board.

Trustee Hans Hazenboom, a former fireman, extended the evening's expressions of appreciation to include firemen's wives, who carry a large part of the burden of emergency calls and procedures.

Ben Martens welcomed the guests and introduced various participants.

Leask came to the island in 1978. He was previously with the federal government's department of national defence at Esquimalt. On

Saturday, he recalled after the evening's program was ended that the national defence duties left him far removed from the public, except when his equipment was called out to assist the municipal fire department.

His experiences on Salt Spring had been very different. Apart from actual fire-fighting, he had been a regular traveller to residences and business as well as institutions, to check fire safety provisions. He had been called to pump out flooded basements and to take cats out of trees, he told *Driftwood*. He had thoroughly enjoyed the opportunity of taking part in such community concerns.

The president of the Firemen's Association, Bob Tranter, spoke of the warm regard of his association for the retiring chief and presented him with a camera. Marlene Leask was given a set of canisters for her new home in Nanaimo.

Trustee Hazenboom presented Leask with a video recorder from the trustees and the community. Two former board chairmen, Donaghy and Frank Richards, spoke for the trustees of past years, expressing their regard for the retiring chief and their regret at his departure.

Newly appointed Fire Chief Les Wagg presented his former chief with his hard hat. He explained that he had not intended to offer any remarks. In view of the events of Friday night, however, he wanted to express his appreciation of the work undertaken by firemen who had spent most of the night answering alarms.

Following the dinner, a dance was held in the main hall.

Bob and Marlene Leask have already left the island to take up residence in Nanaimo.

For Gulf Islands

Another dry summer predicted

Salt Spring may be in for another dry summer, according to rainfall statistics compiled by islander Don Storr.

Storr, a retired meteorologist and trustee of the North Salt Spring Waterworks District, said last week in a letter to *Driftwood* that between September 1987 and the end of March 1988 the island received 23.8 inches of precipitation — 29 per cent less than the amount recorded during 'normal' years.

It appears that the drought which hit Salt Spring last year is continuing. According to Storr, the island received only .32 inches of rain in September. Although this amount doubled in October to .64 inches, it still represented only 17 per cent of the amount of precipitation the island receives in that month during a 'normal' year.

The rains finally came in November, when 4.79 inches fell — 83 per cent of the amount

expected. December proved even wetter, when 7.78 inches fell. Precipitation in that final month of 1987 actually exceeded the expected amount by approximately 10 per cent.

In 1988, January and February were again abnormally dry months. A total of 5.92 inches of rain fell during the two-month period, considerably less than the 11.4 inches of precipitation expected.

An above-normal amount of rainfall fell on the island in March, according to Storr. A total of 4.35 inches of precipitation was measured, 121 per cent of the 3.6 inches that generally fall during a normal March.

"Although December and March were slightly above normal," Storr concluded, "for the whole season precipitation has been over 9.5 inches below normal. Lake Maxwell has not begun to overflow into Maxwell Creek and I suspect that much of the

groundwater reservoir may be similarly low."

Storr added Wednesday that a storm which hit Salt Spring early last week dumped about 1.25 inches of rain on the island. He noted, however, that while "it was a good help," April is generally a relatively precipitation-free month. It seems unlikely the island will receive enough rainfall in the next few months to make up the precipitation deficit already recorded, he added.

"In a normal April, we generally only get about 2.25 inches of rain," he said.

"What concerns me is that the level of Maxwell Lake is still six inches below the runoff point ... There is a little water in Duck Creek (a outlet creek on St. Mary Lake), but we aren't sure if it's actually coming from the lake or an area of marsh."

Last year, drought conditions in the Gulf Islands caused many wells to go dry in the region.

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Experts discuss forestry issue

One hundred attend symposium on clear-cutting

SOUTH GALIANO — A symposium to explore the effects of clear-cutting on the ecology and economy of Galiano, and to suggest viable alternatives and encourage community participation in the preparation of a *Map of Sensitive Areas* for presentation to MacMillan-Bloedel on May 31, was held in the Activity Centre Saturday afternoon on April 9.

About 100 people turned out to hear a panel of well-qualified speakers, watch a slide presentation and examine a comprehensive visual display of maps and statistics. The symposium was exceptionally well-organized by Clear Cut Alternatives (CCA) who jointly sponsored the meeting with the Islands Trust.

Chairman Ed Andrusiak first introduced Gary Moore, who gave a brief review of the genesis of CCA last fall and subsequent developments as the group negotiated with MB. He was followed by Nick Gilbert, chairman of Islands Trust, who gave credit to CCA for organizing the symposium.

While the Trust could show its support for the objectives of CCA by co-sponsoring the meeting, it has neither the funds nor the staff to provide more assistance, and has little power to intervene in such situations as were occurring on several of the Trust islands, Gilbert said.

The Trust's mandate to 'preserve and protect' the Gulf Islands has been difficult to fulfill, he added, as the Trust has limited powers and these have been eroded by the parsimony of successive governments.

The Trust Committee has asked the minister of municipal affairs to undertake a study of the effect of current logging practices with a view to preparing a set of guidelines for the use of the Trust and forest companies, and for the education of the public.

Dr. Bert Brink, director of the Nature Trust, revealed that his group was created by the federal government to assist in ecological matters relating to B.C. As well as three 'conservationists,' the board includes several businessmen whose advice has enabled the Trust to augment its initial \$4 million grant by judicious investment and use only the interest to make a number of purchases of key ecological areas such as estuaries on the east coast of Vancouver Island.

Dr. Brink suggested that

perhaps there was a case to be made for obtaining one or two Gulf Island sites of particular ecological value, but that great discretion would be required in approaching the Trust chairman. He also spoke of the possibility of obtaining money from the B.C. Habitat Conservation Fund or from the Habitat Enhancement Fund administered by the federal government.

Dr. Phillip Haddock, former professor of forestry at UBC, illustrated that "points of view" can change, and that as an amateur naturalist his opinions about silviculture and forestry practices were not identical with those he espoused during his career. However, he said he could understand the position of MB, and warned that if environmental concerns made logging unprofitable or too damaging to the corporation's image, management may find itself forced into selling the Galiano holdings.

Dr. Haddock also pointed out that the best silviculture areas on Galiano were down the length of the north-east half of the island, where the land slopes gently and there is sufficient depth of soil. The tops of the ridges have no depth of soil and the bluffs on the west side make logging difficult so that, if there is no possibility of these areas becoming a park, they might be better employed as home sites. He felt the earth should be regarded as a great entail which belongs not only to those who now occupy its surface, but equally to those who come after. Although the issue is a moral one, the solutions may have to be political.

Ben Miltner, president of GIVA, spoke of the impact of present logging practices on the ecology and economy of Galiano, particularly on tourism and related businesses — which employ more islanders and contribute far more to the island economy than logging. He warned of the danger of the obliteration not only of lifestyle but also of livelihood, while noting that a solution was possible through compromise and cooperation.

As a change of pace, Cameron Young, author of the *Forests of B.C.*, showed a stunningly beautiful collection of slides of B.C. forests and spoke of the origin and nature of the Douglas fir coastal forest such as still exists on parts of Galiano.

The most inspirational yet, paradoxically, the most pessimistic speaker, was Dr. Bill Rees of UBC's planning department. He gave a socio-economic-philosophic analysis of

the present dilemma.

Fifty years ago, exploitation of natural resources was 'vertical,' meaning industry and business operated in the same relatively small area, so that benefits and cost to a community could be compared, and there was a considerable measure of local control.

Now exploitation is horizontal. Logging on Galiano is done by an off-island crew, management is done from Vancouver Island and Vancouver, and financial control is exerted from Toronto. The social, environmental and economic 'costs' are borne by the people of Galiano but the 'benefits' accrue elsewhere.

From the point of view of society as a whole, benefits and costs should be compared, and, if the latter outweigh the former, government should require a corporation to modify its practices. Ideally this should be considered as a moral issue, so that a company would strive to be a good corporate citizen. Failing this, society should demand that its government protect it. This would require planning and in the present political climate, plan is a four letter word.

Dr. Rees saw the present situation on Galiano as a wonderful opportunity for the company to institute an environmental impact study of the kind that should be mandatory before any large-scale resource development process is allowed to get underway.

Dr. Rees encouraged an emotional response to situations which endanger the environment and affect our existence. We are

emotional beings. It is the ability to enjoy our environment that makes living worthwhile. He concluded by noting that planning is a political process and that a community plan for Galiano should not be separate and unrelated to a forest plan.

Mike Hoebel of CCA appealed to the residents of Galiano to complete and return the *Sensitive Areas Questionnaire* recently mailed to every island household and to all off-island property owners. The questionnaire contains much detail; answering will require map-reading skills and careful study. The decisions to be made are not easy, but surely the people of Galiano can rise to the challenge.

Music Appreciation

Barbara Moore of North Galiano conducted a successful pilot project for visiting seniors on Galiano in conjunction with the recent *Celebration of the Tree*. Now Barbara has arranged a second event to include islanders as well as visitors.

Brian Tate, a Vancouver musician and composer will conduct a three-day workshop entitled *Enjoying Classical Music* from Wednesday afternoon, April 27, until Friday evening at La Berengerie. There will be 16 hours of instruction with a dinner and concert on the last evening.

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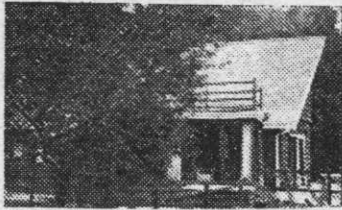

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Islanders hunt for missing neighbour

NORTH GALIANO — They searched for a friend and neighbour.

Jackie Besler had worked at the lodge as a waitress, filled gas tanks at the garage, entertained with her dramatic characterizations at the Community Hall and at the North Galiano Jamboree, aided her father, the late Harold Dyer, to construct many chimneys and fireplaces on Galiano, lived on the island for many years and raised her family here, and now she had disappeared.

The call was made to North Galiano Fire Chief Ted Waterman about 9:30 am. on Easter Monday. He relayed the call to the RCMP in Ganges, who then notified the Coast Guard.

Organizing a land search, Ted Waterman then proceeded to the search area at Shaw's Landing. Within minutes a Coast Guard vessel was at the cove searching nearby waters. With the North Galiano Volunteer Firemen as the nucleus of the search party, plus many volunteers and as many as five firemen from South Galiano, two land searches were organized in co-operation with the RCMP. As many as 30 people participated.

The morning search concentrated on the immediate properties at Shaw's Landing, while the four-hour afternoon search covered the area further north, south and inland along logging roads towards Coon Bay.

The following day RCMP divers combed the waters nearby, and on Wednesday RCMP dogs scouted for the unusual. They turned up nothing, as did another land search with family members and local residents.

The island is left with only hope and sympathy — hope that Jackie may still be found, and sympathy for a family torn with the apparent loss of a loved one.

Fire Siren

The North Galiano Volunteer Fire Department recently purchased a powerful air-raid type siren from the Langford Fire Department. When a suitable site is found, the siren will be installed and put to the test. It is hoped the purchase price, as well as the installation costs, will be completely covered by the \$1,000 donation made to North Galiano by the ladies auxiliary to the South Galiano Volunteer Fire Department. A very generous gift.

With all the concern expressed recently about low water tables and the lack of rainfall, it was timely to have the skies open up and send our volunteer firemen and their helpers scurrying to put up tarpaulins in an attempt to cover the outdoor auction area.

All was over by 3:30 pm. and the fire department realized enough to cover the costs of gas, oil, licenses and insurance for their three vehicles for the next few months.

Winners of the Easter raffle were 10-year-old Wendy Fukushima and nurse Elsie Mussell, both of North Galiano.

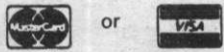

down through the years

Twenty-five years ago

• Close to 2,000 Gulf Islanders cast votes in the federal election, defying both the nation's and the riding's trend.

While the country voted Liberal, the local riding went to NDP candidate Colin Cameron. In the Gulf Islands portion of the riding, however, first place went to PC hopeful Matthews. Liberal Doug Greer finished a poor third, ahead of Doug Dane for the Socreds.

• Over 250 Salt Spring Islanders ate 68 pounds of beans (plus salad, rolls and pie) at the Beaver Point Community Hall's annual bean feast.

• The local school board passed a motion to limit use of school buses to the transportation of children. The motion followed discussion on requests from several organizations to use the buses.

The board also agreed that the fee of rental fees, as laid down some time ago for Mahon Hall and the board room, must be paid by all parties, with no special rates or free use permitted by any parties.

Twenty years ago

• A proposal to establish a log booming ground in Burgoyne Bay met with vigorous opposition from nearby residents.

Ladysmith Log Sorting Company applied to bring logs from the West Coast of Vancouver Island to be separated and sorted in the bay beneath Mount Maxwell. Burgoyne Bay property owners protested on the grounds such activity would pollute the water and be detrimental to the area's peaceful, residential atmosphere.

• The provincial government intended to clamp down on sheep stealing, after hearing complaints from a Salt Spring Island delegation.

Delegates Robert and Maurice Akerman, Jack Todd and Don Fraser described constant sheep loss to the minister of agriculture, F.X. Richter. The minister agreed sheep rustling had to stop.

• The Salt Spring Island Chamber of Commerce roads committee

outlined features of the highways program. Topping the list of priorities was the paving of Beaver Point Road.

Fifteen years ago

• Fire claimed the life of a Salt Spring Island woman whose North End Road home was completely destroyed by flames.

Despite frantic efforts by passers-by to enter the blazing house and save the 75-year-old woman, her body was taken from the ruins by firemen.

• The Salt Spring Island Rod and Gun Club was to press the provincial government for the elimination of outboard boat motors from all island lakes except St. Mary Lake.

Gavin Reynolds, club president, said outboard vessels are undesirable on the smaller lakes, where the main interest of users is the fishing.

• Provincial Liberal leader David Anderson added his voice to pleas for government acceptance of island planning.

The government had held up all island planning until its own committee could take a look at the islands and evaluate islanders' competence to plan for themselves.

Ten years ago

• The Salt Spring Island Fire Protection District had selected a new fire chief from 30 applications received for the position.

Robert Leask, employed for 23 years in Victoria with the Canadian Forces Fire Service, received the job. Leask took the position formerly held by Kelly Hanke, who left the island at the beginning of the year.

• Three projects had been approved for the Gulf Islands by the job creation branch of Canada Manpower.

The Salt Spring Island Parks and Recreation Commission would receive a grant of \$7,600 to hire four students to work at improving recreational facilities over the summer months, and the Salt Spring Island Parents Co-operative Pre-school Association

received a grant to hire three students for the construction of play equipment.

The final grant went to the Pender Island Chamber of Commerce. Five students would be employed to maintain and improve recreational facilities on that island.

Five years ago

• The cost of water went up. Parcel tax on properties within the North Salt Spring Waterworks District doubled, and several consumers expressed curiosity as to where the money was going.

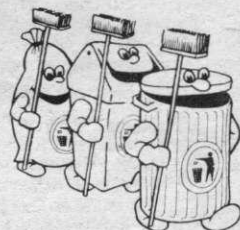
The increased levy was needed to pay for six miles and more of water mains, replacement tanks and a new pumping station. Most pipes are geared to a 25-year life, and it is customary to replace them with larger line after that period.

• Total cost of repairs to the government wharf in Ganges would amount to \$45,000. "Minor repairs" to the wharf had already cost approximately \$20,000.

• The proposed summer ferry schedule would improve service to the Outer Gulf Islands, but would be much less desirable for Salt Spring, the Salt Spring Island transportation committee said.

The summer schedule between Long Harbour and Tsawwassen appeared to be co-ordinated with Outer Island service to Swartz Bay. Jan MacPherson said lack of morning connections would discourage day-trippers from travelling to Salt Spring Island.

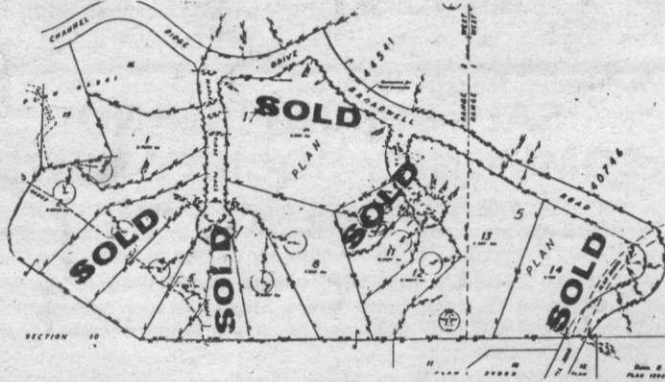

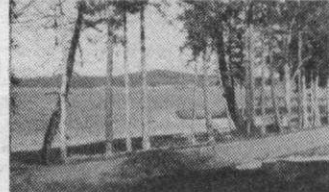
