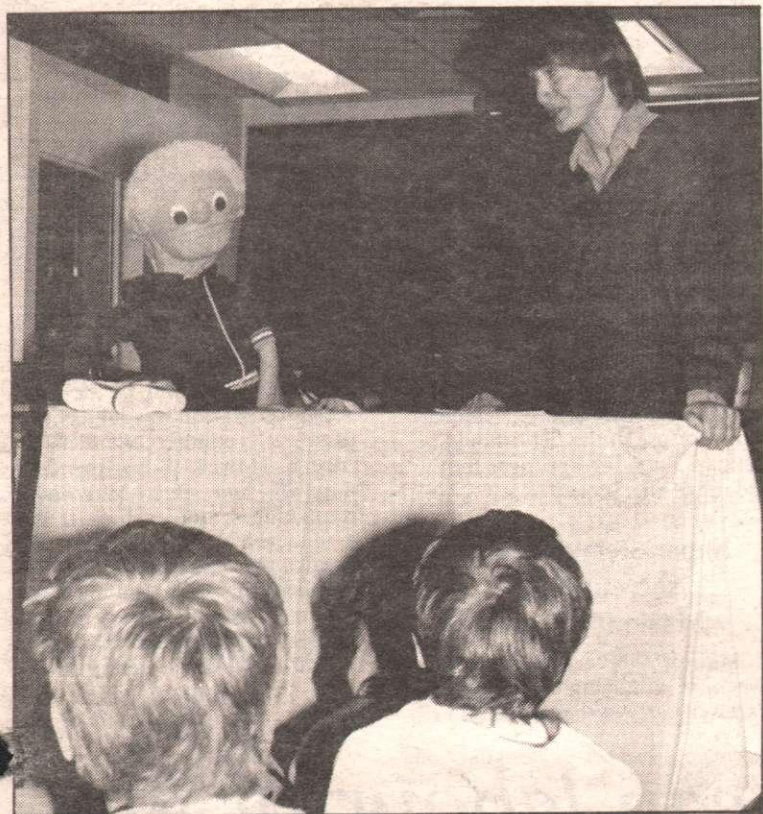


Puppets show children position of handicapped



"Brian" explains epilepsy to elementary students

The two life-size puppets are discussing television, when one smells something unusual and falls to the ground in an epileptic seizure.

His non-disabled friend reacts to the incident and, through discussion after the seizure, learns how to deal compassionately and effectively with an epileptic friend.

Elementary school children in Ganges, Fulford and Fernwood witnessed the above last week in the *Kids on the Block* program, a puppet show from Victoria brought to Salt Spring through the sponsorship of the Royal Canadian Legion branch and the Achievement Centre.

The program aims to increase the level of understanding and awareness children have of their handicapped peers, and to point out to them the similarities and differences between all children.

Children in the Grades Three-to-Five audience are encouraged

to ask the puppets questions: "Can you die from epilepsy? Does it hurt? Why do they (epileptics) shake?"

Students at Salt Spring Elementary learned about epilepsy and learning disabilities, while students at Fernwood and Fulford Elementary Schools met blind and mentally-disabled puppets.

Kids on the Block is performed by Junior Service League of Victoria puppeteers, and involves life-sized, muppet-like puppets: "Mark" has cerebral palsy; "Mandy" is deaf; "Renaldo" is blind; "Ellen Jane" is mentally disabled; "Brian" has epilepsy; and three others are their non-disabled friends.

The Fernwood and Fulford sessions were unique in that students had the opportunity to actively participate and discover how it feels to be handicapped.

First the students were given directions — sit down, stand up, turn around, clap your hands — at a pace they were unable to keep up with. The students learned how it feels to be given directions they could not follow.

In the second activity, students were given a story written in Spanish. They could not understand it until a second story in

Spanish, accompanied by pictures, was presented to them. Through this exercise they learned how handicapped children can learn through alternative teaching methods.

"There was a positive, immediate impact on the kids, who were comfortable asking the puppets questions," said the Achievement Centre's Laurie Clarke. "The efficiency of the puppets and the receptiveness of the audience ensures a lasting impression."

Clarke felt the students left the presentation very much enlightened, and with a new warmth and understanding towards handicapped persons — one which would last them a lifetime.



Salt Spring views, profile sought by consultant for mineral company

A consultant acting on behalf of Falconbridge Minerals wants to know how Salt Spring residents would react to possible "mineral extraction" work on the island.

Gary Reith, a sociologist with Victoria-based Connor Development Services Ltd., visited Salt Spring last week for three days of interviews with a wide cross-section of islanders.

Reith, who told *Driftwood* his company "specializes in resolving public controversies," said the

purpose of his visit was to find out for Falconbridge what type of public response it could expect if it proceeded to develop its mineral claims on Salt Spring.

The company has claims in the Mt. Tuam and Mt. Bruce areas at the south end of the island. Reith stressed that the company has done little or no work assessing the potential of those claims, and has yet to decide if it would even proceed as far as a small, exploratory drilling program.

However, if the company does proceed with anything, he continued, it wants to be prepared for response from the public.

"The company wants to be oriented better to the community," Reith said. "It wants to know local attitudes towards resource extraction and growth, and take steps to deal with those public concerns before misinformation and entrenched attitudes start alarm bells ringing."

The consultant added that speculation about Falconbridge's intentions would be preliminary at this point, because the company itself has made no decision on the fate of its mineral claims here.

"All I'm trying to do is identify the local interest groups and get their advice on what the company should do, how it should proceed if it does proceed," he said. "I'm also here to help orient them (the company) to key social factors on Salt Spring Island."

Specifically, Reith is studying the island's demographics and attempting to identify specific island organizations which might support or oppose resource extraction. He also wants to know what Falconbridge might be able to do to ease public concern.

Should the company decide to act on its mineral claims, the role of the consultant would be to help Falconbridge "stickhandle" through any applicable public process, Reith said.

Terra Tepper, another campaign organizer, said that if all islanders would simply clean up refuse from along their lot lines, "there would be little need for the campaign."

Toynbee noted that the clean-up effort has attracted more and more support in the past few years, and now includes a good number of participants. As evidence of the community effort backing the campaign, he said this year's drive will be assisted by two highways department trucks and crew members, and by

Boat-launching will cap labour of love

NORTH GALIANO — Ken and Mo Fraser of North Galiano normally live quietly in their small home on Alder Way, but these are exciting days for them, and things are about to change. The *Cheeky Hobson* is ready for launching.

For four years now, Mo and Ken have lived for the *Cheeky Hobson*. They have planned her, cut and cured her wood, built her, made her sails and loved every minute of it. The love and care is there for all to see; she is beautiful.

She is patterned on the design of an old English pilot cutter and is a sailing vessel of 29 feet with two head sails and a triangular mainsail. Lyle

B.C. woods used in construction

Hess of California designed the ship and so far two vessels have been built to his design, one in California and one on the East Coast. The *Cheeky Hobson* will accommodate two people.

Ken has taken pride in using as many local woods in his vessel as he could. Arbutus was cut on an Alaska mill, air-dried for five or six years and used for the floor and some furniture. Pear wood trims the doors. The breadboard is of apple wood. The mast and booms are of Sitka Spruce from the Queen Charlotte Islands, local red cedar is used for the

planking and the deck, and fir for the backbone frames, some sawn for strength and the others steam bent. White oak is the only non-B.C. wood used in the vessel's construction.

The keel is of lead and two and half tons in weight. It was cast on the site by Ken and Mo, using a wood pattern, a concrete mold and the Stevens brothers and their heavy equipment to open the mold and lift the keel into position.

The Frasers have also made many cast-mold patterns for fittings not available commercially, among these are such items as chain plates, gam-

mon irons and coomkins. Ken has adapted a 7.5 hp. Volvo engine to serve as auxiliary power to the sails. The latter are made of Dacron and were fabricated in the North Galiano Hall a little over one year ago. The sailing speed of the *Cheeky Hobson* will be about seven and a half to eight knots.

With chisel in hand, Ken was cutting the vessel's name on her handsome white and brown stern when your reporter arrived. Mo was off to the foundry with the propeller shaft — something was not quite as it should be. But it will be right, just everything else is. Long may the

Pender flower show 'enjoyable success'

PENDER ISLAND — The Pender Islands Cancer Society sponsored its annual spring flower show on Saturday, April 16, in conjunction with the Flower Grower's Group and the Nu-to-Yu Shop.

Over 200 people attended at a cost of \$3 each. Funds realized will be donated to the Cancer Society.

Mrs. Anita Blanshard, president of the Pender Islands Cancer Society and the district educational chairman for Vancouver Island and the Gulf Islands, opened the show at 1 pm.

Blanshard said: "Many years ago an anonymous donor gave a group of cancer volunteers 5,000 daffodils, which World War II veterans separated, packaged and distributed to cancer volunteer groups across Canada."

Thus was born what evolved into the daffodil as the official emblem of the Cancer Society, and the month of April each year as Cancer Campaign month. "The early spring daffodil flower expresses hope and renewed life," said Blanshard. "It is an expression of what the Cancer Society does for those needing help in coping with often frightening illness."

On the Penders, all the daffodils sold had been donated by the Pender Islands Pennock Nursery.

The Canadian Cancer Society was officially instituted 50 years ago and a special guest from off-island for the afternoon was Marilyn Clarke, president of the Cancer Society for the Vancouver and Lower Mainland district.

Judge for the extensive display of flowers for the show was Mrs. Beatrice Kempster of Saanich, a member of the Horticultural Centre of the Pacific and the Victoria Flower Arrangement Guild, who does the Ikebana containers for Japanese flower arranging and is senior judge for the Dahlia conference.

Marjorie Bailey is president of the Flower Growers Group, one of the more popular groups on the island.

The flower display this year was ranged along the three walls of the gymnasium. The flowers were more numerous and beautiful, indicating Pender Islanders take great pride in their gardens.

The overall winner in the Flower Show was Olive Pennock, who won the rhododendron bush donated by Grace Hastings. Second prize, to Dr. M. Neilson, was a special container for flower arrangements donated by Mrs. B. Kempster.

Margaret Tallman, as commentator for the Nu-to-Yu fashion show, kept it moving at a fast pace with her witty dialogue and charming good humour. All clothes worn by the models, who are members of Nu-to-Yu, were from the shop.

Garden Club

Scottish Country dancing is a regular feature at the North Hall on Tuesday evenings. On Wednesday last some of the dancers, plus a lot of other people as well, were at the hall for the Garden Club meeting to learn all about heathers for their gardens. The speaker was Ellen Norris of Shawnigan Lake, the current president of the North American Heather Society.

Heathers and Heaths are, of course, not exclusive to Scotland but grow literally all over the world, and a suitable variety can be grown to give the garden colour at pretty well any season of the year. Scottish heather, *Calluna Vulgaris*, with its rosy pink flowers, blooms generally from June to December, whereas rosy-red *Erica Carnia* from the European Alps blooms in winter and spring. *County Wicklow* has a showy double pink flower and generally blooms in August and September. *Daboecia Cantabrica* (Irish heath) has glossy dark green leaves and pinkish-purple urn-shaped bell-like flowers and blooms from June to October.

Heathers have a lot of colour variation in their foliage as well, and range from yellows to light and dark green, silvery grey, and bronzy red. *Calluna Vulgaris Aurea* has golden foliage in summer and russet in winter. Its blooms are purple but sparse.

Size variation is a feature of heather as well. Whereas most heathers average from nine to 15 inches in height, *Foxii Nana* grows

to only six inches while *Erica Arboorea* can grow from 10 to 20 feet in height. The latter is from Southern Europe and North Africa. Its burls are the briars used for making tobacco pipes.

Heather plants should be planted in full sun. Most varieties should get at least six hours of sun a day. They like an acid, well-drained soil but must be mulched with peat or with the trimmings from last year's growth. Some varieties have a rangy habit and need trimming yearly to keep them compact and blooming.

In closing her talk, Mrs. Norris informed her audience that the North America Heather Society was formed in 1984, developing from the Pacific Northwest Heather Society (1977) to better reflect the growing membership of what was originally a purely B.C. and Washington group.

The Society sponsors projects at Vancouver's Van Dusen Gardens and at the Victoria Horticultural Centre of the Pacific. The group is particularly interested in saving the old varieties of heathers as the popularity of the showier hybrid varieties flood the market.

Club members eagerly approached the sales table at the conclusion of the meeting to purchase pots of named varieties for their gardens.

During the business meeting, President Emily Switzer asked for volunteers to act as convenors for the upcoming plant and bake sale (May 14). Club members are asked to prepare annuals, perennials, house plants, shrubs, vegetables and herbs for the sale well ahead of time. They may be delivered to the hall on Friday, May 13. Edith Wishart is in charge of the bake sale.

Several club members hoped to journey to Victoria to attend the Alpine Plant Society show there on April 15 and 16. The possibility of a tour to the "Glades Rhododendron and Azalea Garden" in Surrey is being looked into. A private garden, it is open to the public only from May 1 to May 20.

Showbench judge Aini Haksi, in her garden hints, told members to look out for tulip fire blight. It can be identified on the plant by tiny spots on the leaves. Affected plants and bulbs should be dug up and burned to check the spread of the blight to other healthy plants.

Program Chairman Margaret Griffith announced the topic for the May meeting will be herbs, and the speakers will be the Crumblehulmes from Mayne Island — the owners of one of B.C.'s best herb farms.

Incidentally, more than 25 people were involved in putting on the ball. Some had high-visibility jobs, like master of ceremonies Woody

Coward, auctioneer Norm Russell, and Terry Wishart and Arne Haksi in the bar — but there were others like all those pie-makers, preparers of salads, and washers of dishes.

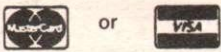

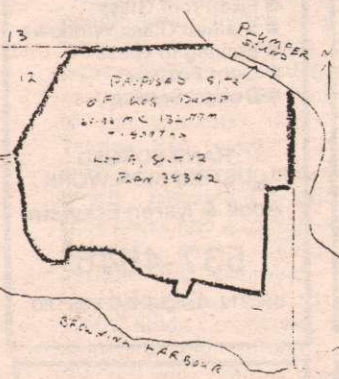

she had filled out in 1973. Under the entry "Education and Training" was written N/A - not applicable. In response to the request "Why are you applying for this job?" she had written three words. *Might be interesting.* Well, she was certainly right in that assumption.

Newton's Laws enforced on Galiano

Newton's Third Law, when applied to a Gulf Island population, states that: "To every faction there is an equally obdurate reaction." CCA's success in rapidly building its membership to over 100, and its well-organized P.R., have some Galiano residents worried.

The anti-CCA is a very loose coalition so that it is hard to estimate its numbers and influence. It includes those who do not welcome the growth of the hospitality industry: "Better large areas of clearcut than a massive influx of tourists." The coalition also includes a 'fear and favour group,' who believe in "better the devil you know than open Pandora's box."

What if MB should sell their holdings on Galiano? The rumoured asking price is anywhere between \$20 and \$30 million which works out to around \$4,000 an acre or \$80,000 for a 20-acre parcel, which is the minimum lot size in Forest Zoned land. Who would have that kind of money and what would their intentions be? Should we fear oriental money? Hong Kong has about the same area as Galiano and a population of five million that needs relocating before 1997. Or is it Middle East oil money seeking a safe haven, or should we worry about that small island nation in the eastern Mediterranean?

The lesser known Fourth Law as

enunciated by Sir Isaac postulates that the most powerful force in human affairs is *inertia*. Probably a majority of islanders have never walked in a forest or seen a clearcut. They can't see the forest for the trees that still grow on their property. These are possibly more of a menace to the forest than those who have thought through the problem and chosen what they perceive to be the lesser of two evils.
