

## Course teaches youngsters to say "No"

The Salt Spring Island Lions Club has helped to institute a local classroom program designed to help Grade Six students decide against becoming involved with alcohol and other drugs.

Club members bankrolled the acquisition of classroom materials and arranged a training session for local teachers using the course, after the school district agreed to include the program in its family life curriculum.

An overview of the program, which uses material supplied by B.C.'s Alcohol and Drug Education Service, an independent organization, was explained to Lions Club members at their meeting last week. Grade Six teacher Alison Jason, school district psychologist and special education co-ordinator Dr. Ralph Miller, and family life program member Debbie Magnusson were on hand to detail the scope of the course and its classroom progress to date.

Magnusson, who is on leave from classroom teaching and has applied to take over as the school district's family life program co-ordinator, said the material provided by the Lions Club fits neatly into recent program guidelines handed down by the provincial education ministry.

Those guidelines call for instruction in seven areas ranging from nutrition to sexual abuse. The program supplied by the Lions Club, called "Making Decisions," fits in the alcohol and drug abuse component of the overall curriculum.

However, Magnusson stressed that "Making Decisions" contains only one section dealing strictly with alcohol and other drugs — the remainder covers how to make decisions and imparts skills like coping with peer pressure.

"Decision-making should start young and build," she said. "Hopefully, these kids (those involved in the program) will come out ahead of the game."

Alison Jason agreed, saying the value of the program is not so much in the provision of facts about the ill effects of experimenting with alcohol and other drugs, but in providing children with a skill that will shape their lives.

"The vulnerability of adolescents to become addicted to substances is frightening," she said. "Kids who don't know how to assert themselves, who can't make decisions, who have a low self-esteem, are in danger. It is a crucial decision for teens to make."

Children in the Grade Six age

group tend to act and behave alike, she continued, to the point where they wear the same clothes and do the same things. The "Making Decisions" program can help those youngsters realize their individuality and act independently.

The program has eight components, ranging from outlining the differences between needs and wants to interpreting advertising content. Classroom activities include role-playing and interaction, "not just the teacher standing in front of the class," Magnusson said.

The program represents an evolution in the way parents attempt to educate children about the harmful effects of drugs, Magnusson continued. In the 1960s, she said, scare tactics were used and proved unsuccessful. In the 1970s, the emphasis shifted to providing as much information as possible in the hope that children would make a sensible choice based on facts, which again did not work. Now, in the 1980s, the thrust is to teach decision-making skills.

"It's a great approach — it will stay with them the rest of their lives."

Dr. Ralph Miller agreed, noting that the program echoes observations made in 1969 by the LeDain Royal Commission into the non-medical use of drugs, of which he was a part. The commission realized that the legal system was overemphasized in the fight

against drug use, and that more attention should be paid to social conditions and responses — i.e.,

## Two concerts by Galiano Singers feature formal and informal sounds

NORTH GALIANO — Most Galiano residents live two lives. They have their "into the city" life and a more casual lifestyle for home. At times gentlemen still wear shirt, tie and dark suit and the ladies are to be seen in long dresses rather than slacks. At the South Hall last Friday and Saturday evening these two aspects of island life came together. Ann Duncan and her Galiano Singers, in their first major concert, used the formal-informal aspects of island life to set the pattern for the evening.

First came the formal choir numbers: Wagner's dramatic *Pilgrims Chorus* from *Tanhauser*, Humperdink's gentle *When At Night I Go To Sleep* from *Hansel and Gretel* and Verdi's *Va Pensiero* from *Nabucc*, with its soaring melodies. In the modern vein there followed Jim Croce's *Time in a Bottle* and Gordon Lightfoot's *Early Morning Rain*.

Twelve-year-old Sarah Brooks then gave a lovely performance of Beethoven's *Fur Elise* on the piano, and nine-year-old Rowan Hartman manfully performed two short numbers by Bach and Suzuki on the violin. This ended the formal part of the program.

For the second half of the evening, the choir costumed themselves and an attempt was made to stage the numbers. In the space available backstage it is remarkable how many changes were attempted and how quickly they took place. Obviously make-up artists Vivien Brooke-Harte and her assistant Annie Scoones work well under pressure. The Gilbert and Sullivan section of the program began with numbers from *Pinafore* and with solos by Barbara Scoones as Buttercup, and Frank Greenhalgh, as "The Ruler of the Queen's Navy." Elizabeth Brinson, Barbara Scoones and Joan Paterson appeared next as "Three (not-so-young) Maids From School."

Other Mikado numbers followed, with a very young John New as Nanki-Poo, the wandering minstrel, and *Driftwood* correspondent Basil Bengel, as the ex-Lord High Executioner, Ko Ko, singing *Tit Willow*. The Wit Mr. Bengel displays in his writings was most evident on stage. His approach to his song changed completely from performance to performance. The thunderstorm which accompanied his suicidal song at dress rehearsal on Thursday evening was replaced on opening night by thunder of another kind, from his audience this time.

From *Pirates of Penzance* there followed solos by Bill Calloway, as a pirate king with a very long sword, and Bill Eaton as a most effective police chief in *A Policeman's Lot Is Not A Happy One*. Lord Stanley's many daughters then cavorted with baskets of posies on the sea shore while singing *Climbing Over*

Rocky Mountain.

Following the intermission the scene opened in the mythical Scottish village of Brigadoon, where the villagers in colourful tartans gathered for a wedding. Bill Calloway's rich voice lead off with *The Heather On The Hill*, followed by two dances by Galiano's Scottish Country dance group. Joan Paterson delighted the audience with *My Mother's Wedding Day*. The chorus' singing of *Brigadoon* opened and closed the scene.

Three solos by concert pianist Barbara Landmark followed. Sensitive performances of pieces by Mendelssohn, Landmark and Chopin.

The evening closed in Tsarist Russia. Cam Trowsdale and his violin led us to the stage for *Fiddler On The Roof*. The singing of *Tradition* by the chorus was particularly effective and Bill Calloway was excellent as usual in *If I Were A Rich Man*. *Sunrise*, *Sunset* and *To Life* brought the evening to a close.

## Growing Herbs

Speaker at the May meeting of the Galiano Garden Club was Brian Crumblehume of Mayne Island. Brian and his wife Mary have lived on our sister island for 10 years and operate a herb farm. The Crumblehumes find our temperate climate and sandy soils ideal for the growing of these useful plants. On the whole, herbs don't need much water, they don't need much care, and they don't need much fertilizer.

On the whole, deer don't like herbs and tend to leave them alone. This has got to be a recommendation in itself to island gardenary.

Herbs are best picked in June, just as they are about to flower.

The word herb comes from the latin *erba* and can be pronounced correctly with or without the *h*. The Germans use the word *wort* for herb, hence the herb we know as lungwort, and others such as woundwort and St. John's Wort.

Herbs have many uses proven and unproven. Mint is used as a breath freshener, the drug digitalis is derived from Foxglove but not our common garden or roadside variety. Herb teas are popular and a fairly recent phenomenon. Flax has long been used for its fibres in the manufacture of linen. Yellow dye can be made from yarrow. Roses and lavender have long been used in the manufacture of perfumes and marestail can be employed to polish pewter. Culinary uses are many and go back to the earliest times. The Egyptians are known to have used mint, ginger, basil and cumin; the Romans favoured lovage and parsley; and Medieval recipes called for thyme, saffron, sorrel and purple lane.

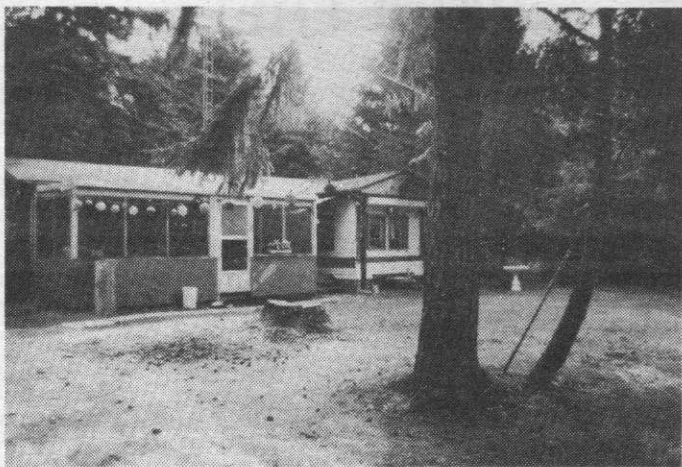
For drying they should be hung in loose bunches in 90 degree temperature and covered from sunlight. They can also be dried in a microwave or a dehydrator. Some herbs are best frozen in water, others pickled in vinegar or sherry.

Continuing his talk and with the aid of photographer and projectionist George Griffith, Crumblehume showed slides of herbs in his garden. Particularly attractive is the Medieval physic garden with its path of camomile and the Elizabethan knot garden designed to look like a patterned carpet.

With his obvious knowledge and enthusiasm for his subject and his touches of humour, Crumblehume informed and entertained the 50 or so garden club members present. His invitation to have Galianoites visit his herb farm when they are on Mayne Island next will doubtless be acted upon.

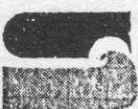

# Musical combines varied talent and sound

**SOUTH GALIANO** — The Musical "Pops" *Pourri* performed by the Galiano Singers last Friday and Saturday was an unusual event for several reasons. It is many years since a Galiano audience has enjoyed such a varied bill of musical fare. There have been musicals combining the talents of the school children and community adults, such as the recent production of *Oliver*, and instrumental concerts have been performed in the community halls and at La Berengerie. But not within recent memory has a four-part choir consisting solely of local residents sung on Galiano.

The repertoire ranged widely from grand opera choruses to modern folk songs, from the century-old comic opera selections from Gilbert and Sullivan to modern musicals such as *Fiddler on the Roof* and *Brigadoon*. The latter was enhanced by the dancing of a strathspey and a jig by the Scottish Country Dancers of North Galiano.

The age range of the choristers was also remarkable, from the 14-year-old Sara Stang to the 78-year-old Frank Greenhalgh, who first sang the *Ruler of the Queen's Navy* solo he performed so admirably over 50 years ago. Talent also ranged widely, from the very limited amateur to the highly trained exceptional ability of the professional musician.

The successful welding of this diversity was due to the enthusiasm and dedication of Ann Duncan, professional singer but amateur conductor, who survived her first year of choir training and direction with her ego intact and her infectious cheerfulness undiminished.

Also contributing greatly to two successful performances was the accompaniment provided by Sue Gilson. The art of accompaniment is one of the least appreciated and yet the most important in the musical world.

Guest artist Barbara Landmark demonstrated her exceptional musicianship with a Mendelssohn *Capricciosos*, a Chopin *Polaise*, and her own composition *Steam Roller Blues*. She also demonstrated the need for a new community piano, for which the concert was designed to raise money.

The fiddler on the roof was Cam Trowsdale, who is always willing to practice his philosophy that community involvement is essential, both for the individual musician as well as larger professional groups such as choirs and orchestras. Cam's improvised accompaniment to the *Fiddler on the Roof* selection was an inspiration to the performers and to young guest violinist Rowan Hartman. Sarah Brookes was the other talented guest artist who made her contribution with a piano solo.

The behind-the-scenes crew members, although invisible, are essential but too numerous to mention, except for the ubiquitous Joe Fleming who was stage director, curtain-puller, and "up front man" providing commentary as master of ceremonies.

The *Singers* are at present in a state of euphoria from the enthusiastic reception their performances received from two full houses. They even are masochistically threatening to do it again in the fall. The generosity of the audience also extended to \$450 of additional donations over and above the ticket money, including \$100 from the Ladies Service Club.

## Open Shelf Library

The final report of the *New Approaches Ministerial Task Force* on public libraries has just been issued by Bill Reid, the minister of tourism, recreation and culture. Of the 200-odd submissions made to the task force, five were from Galiano and one can be confident that all five were supportive of the Open Shelf postal library service provided by the library commission. Nevertheless, the report contains the recommendation that the open shelf service "be transitional in nature, to be provided until alternative services or resources become available".

Is this to be interpreted that the Open Shelf is on the danger list? It is true that the Open Shelf has been regarded as a substitute for a real library but most users of the service have a fierce loyalty to the Open Shelf, from which they have received excellent service for many, many years. The several attempts to start up a borrowing library on Galiano have never met with much success. The Open Shelf provides access to a great range of

titles, such as could never be provided by a branch of the Regional Library or a Book-mobile.



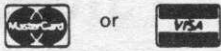

## Fewer tent caterpillars on scene— but keep an eye out for new pests

For almost every gardening situation, there is a good news/bad news story and this week is no exception. All of us bug-watchers have been eagerly awaiting the hatching out of the tent caterpillar egg clusters, and the good news is that there doesn't appear to be much of a showing. Now for the bad news: this year the leaves of trees and shrubs are playing host to some new pests, namely leaf tiers, leaf rollers, sawfly larvae, and, last but not least, powdery mildew. It's the same old war; just the enemies are different.

If your apple leaves have curled up and are coated with a fine dusting of what appears to be white flour, then powdery mildew has infected the leaves during some of that wet weather we had over the past few weeks. To control the problem, spray at label-recommended rates and timings with ferbam or benomyl (favoured because it is a systemic fungicide).

Where insects are the culprits, you will have to try to identify the pest before you take remedial action. If the caterpillar has a soft body and head, with no legs along the middle portion of its body, it is probable that you're dealing with a moth or butterfly larva, and spraying with the organic insecticide, Bt (*Bacillus thuringiensis*) will be effective. For the sawfly and leaf rollers with their hard heads and maggot-like appearance, you will have to resort to tougher chemicals such as malathion (not on my list of recommended weapons), so when in doubt as to what you've been afflicted with, get some help.

The good news aspect of the wetter weather has the garden growing like mad. The columbines are three feet high and lush, but the bad news is, so are the weeds (not really). This brings us around to the heart of this week's issue — more things to do in the garden during the month of May.

Weed, weed, cultivate and water, then weed some more. Actually one of the most important jobs this month is the care and feeding of trees and shrubs that have just finished blooming. Now that the forsythia, red flowering currant, flowering quince (japonica bush) and white, spring-blooming spiraea are done, you should cut out the oldest third of the stems, mostly wood that has flowered, prune out the weakest third of the 1987 growth, and prune back the remaining stems by at least a third, to encourage the growth of new bloom-producing wood.

Once the ornamental brooms have finished blooming, use shears to shape them, or better still, cut the individual stems back hard, leaving only three or four buds on the wood produced in 1987. This will help to maintain a bushy, full growth of bloom-producing stems. Evergreen hedges and broad-leaved evergreens such as boxwood and laurel should be sheared or clipped back to tighten their form and remove straggly growth.

If you haven't fed any shrubs yet, there is still time this month. For a long term feeding use a time-

release fertilizer such as nutricote, and aim for a nearly balanced formulation such as 14-14-14.

May is prime time for feeding and mulching your azaleas, camellias, rhododendrons, pieris and kalmias, after you have undertaken the almost pleasurable task of picking off the dead blossoms, and deadheading the flower trusses and seedheads. Use up to an inch of coarse peat or fine bark mulch for top dressing and water well right after it is spread. Any corrective pruning required should be carried out as soon as possible, and endeavour to do any major work spread out over two or more seasons.

For your rose plants, remove any suckers that arise from below the bud union, and start with your fertilizing program as soon as colour starts to show. Feed your new plantings with bonemeal, a half cupful per hole, and water in well.

Remove spent bloom heads from your lilacs once they fade, but don't do severe pruning unless needed, as you will be cutting off the plant's flowering potential.

Train your grapes as they develop, and pinch out any unwanted growth. Usually the cut stems will bleed, but a dusting of

fine charcoal powder will help to stop the flow of sap. Mulch your strawberry beds late this month and if it dries out, provide additional water. Also keep up with the watering of your peonies as they come into bloom.

For those of you who want to remove any spring-blooming bulbs from beds that you want to plant with annuals or perennials, try to lift as much soil and root as you can, then relocate the plants to a location where they can go on growing and storing energy for next year's showing. Don't try to cut off the tops until they start to yellow as they are still needed by the plant for growing purposes. Feed the bulbs after relocating them, with a quick fix such as 20-20-20 (it will help a lot).

# Commission long-term planning will consider island facilities, needs

The Salt Spring Island Parks and Recreation Commission has initiated a five-year, long-term planning program.

Under the direction of the planning committee, chaired by Neville Smith, the plan will consider items such as projected population and demographic statistics, and available and potential recreational facilities.

Salt Spring has limitless recreational possibilities, notes commission member Ian Fraser: "Recreation has year-round potential with the moderate weather we have here."

As island population grows, he

adds, more facilities will be needed.

With this in mind, the planning committee has taken steps to determine long-range needs for the island. The first step towards this end, says Smith, is assessing the Parks and Recreation Commission's inventory. After determining what facilities the commission presently operates, a condition audit listing what must be upgraded will be completed.

The long-term planning study will also look into Parks and Recreation Commission management and authority, plus the recreational programs it presently runs. From there, population and

demographic statistics will be considered, as well as recommended new facilities and programs.

The study will also look into total funding needs from a potential and practical standpoint.

According to some predictions, Fraser says, the population of British Columbia could double within the next 20 years. "We have to look ahead and pin down all our recreational possibilities."

The commission's long-term planning study is presently underway, with each committee preparing a report for use of the planning committee.



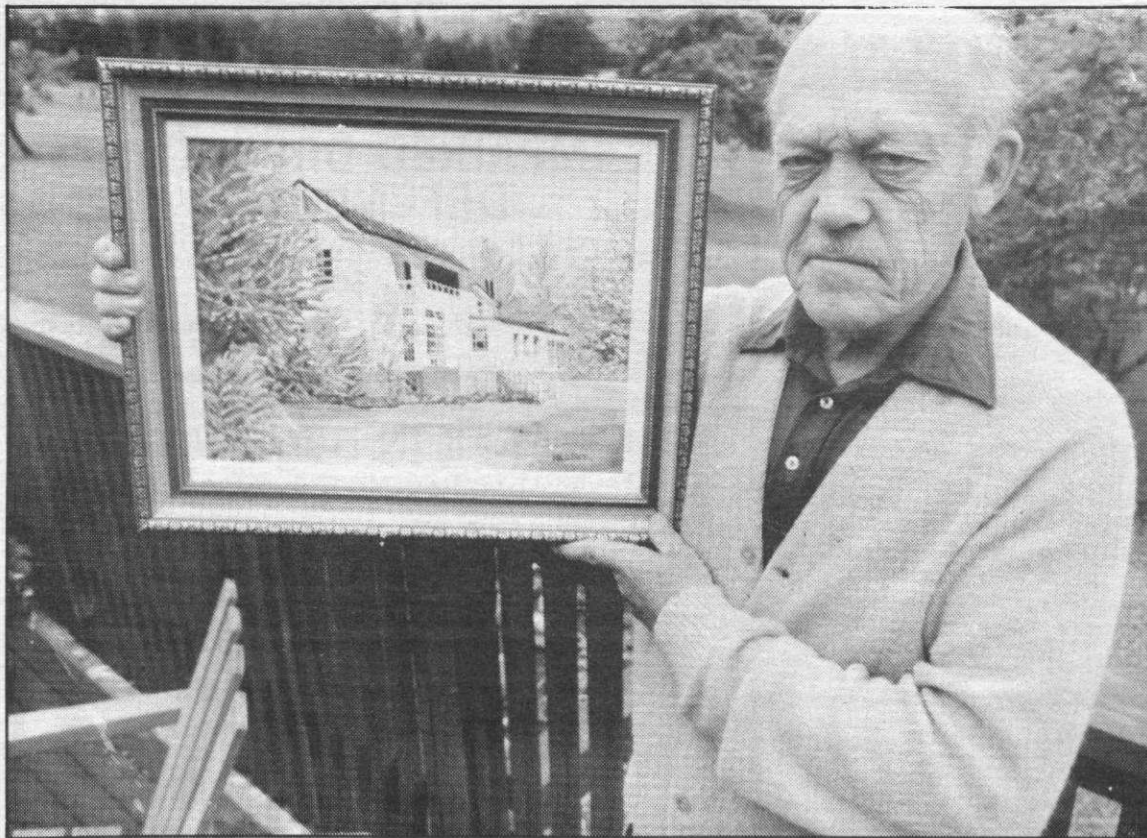

## SSI Golf Club to celebrate its 60th birthday

The Salt Spring Island Golf and Country Club celebrates its 60th birthday this weekend, on May 21 and 22.

To mark the event, the club will host two nine-hole tournaments — one on Saturday, the other on Sunday — plus a Saturday night dance and a Sunday afternoon barbecue.

Also planned is a display of memorabilia from past and present, and the presentation to the club of an oil painting of the original clubhouse and farm building.

The club was formed in 1928 by 44 "devotees of St. Andrew's folly," according to Hal Stone, who has researched and compiled a history of the organization.

An agreement reached with Norman Wilson, then-owner of Barnsbury Farm, gave the club property on land located eastwards of the intersection of what is now Upper and Lower Ganges roads. From a sheep farm, the land progressed to part golf course and part farm, "through lean times, depression and war to better times in the 1950s," Stone reports.

In 1959, tragedy struck the club when the original farmhouse and part clubhouse, called Barnsbury, burned to the ground.

"By dint of great endeavour and courage, the members bought the course and rebuilt the clubhouse," Stone said. "This was added to until it has reached the present form. Great improvements have taken place due to the efforts of members, directors and particularly the several greenskeepers employed."

Stone added the club members and directors regard the course as "a jewel in the crown which is Salt Spring."

The 60th birthday celebration will hopefully attract anyone who has been associated with the club. All those interested in attending the events should contact Marjorie Cade or Glenn Hewitson, or drop by the clubhouse and sign up on a sheet provided.

# down through the years

## with driftwood

### Twenty-five years ago

- The *MV Queen of the Islands* was officially launched into Burrard Inlet by Mrs. Earle C. Westwood, wife of the minister of recreation and conservation.
- The \$2.5 million vessel, 236 feet long and weighing 1,600 gross tons, was promised for the Tsawwassen-Gulf Islands run at the end of June.
- At least 355 people attended the open house celebrations commemorating the 50th anniversary of the Salt Spring Island Trading Company.
- The school board set a date for a second referendum concerning the building of a gymnasium and science room for Salt Spring Island school. The first vote, held the previous October, was defeated by a small margin.
- In other school board matters, trustees remained firm in their decision not to allow use of school buses for any other purpose than school-related activities.
- The third annual Firemen's Ball held at Mahon Hall was the most successful to date, with between 175 and 200 people attending.

### Twenty years ago

- The 54th annual report of Lady Minto Gulf Islands Hospital, presented by Douglas Cavaye, showed the largest-ever increase in activity.
- The number of out-patients treated was up 56 per cent, while the total number of in- and out-patients increased 54 per cent. Births were up 60 per cent, and the number of X-rays taken jumped 92 per cent.
- Tenders were called for construction of five new classrooms at Gulf Islands Secondary School in Ganges. The additional classrooms were approved in a school building referendum accepted by ratepayers the previous December.
- A run on fire extinguishers saw seven of the devices stolen from Ganges that week.

Three extinguishers were removed from school buses parked in the school garage. One bus had been sprayed with foam, and the windshield wipers of all three buses were left running. Other extinguishers were taken from local businesses and vehicles.

### Fifteen years ago

- Sale of Walker Hook Place lots was stopped again. The sale was stopped the previous summer by the provincial Superintendent of

Insurance, E.T. Cantell, who ruled the lots could not be sold because permits to build on them could not be obtained.

The Victoria Medical Health Office has refused permits to construct septic tanks or to drill wells on the quarter-acre lots. Lots in the subdivision were too small to meet present requirements.

Developers protested the denial, but the decision was upheld by the Court of Appeal.

- A probe into every aspect of education was scheduled in a meeting forum for Salt Spring.

The day-long debate would enquire into the philosophy of education, as well as its practical aspects in terms of discipline, curriculum and the use of school facilities for other purposes.

- A car stopped at Ganges Crest on Monday morning, but not for coffee. The car, owned by Grant Marcotte, rolled over the edge of the road at breakfast time and came to rest among the tulips. No charges were laid.

### Ten years ago

- Bob Anderson was the first entrant to complete the annual walkathon, which was dampened by torrents of rain.

In second place was Eric Donnelly, followed by Ed Davis in the number three position. Despite the rain and subsequent small turnout for the event, the walkathon raised close to \$3,500 for the Lions Club.

- Lack of work available on Salt Spring Island is blamed for a substantial drop in the enrolment at Gulf Islands Secondary School since February 1.

District superintendent Bob

Huestis felt people were leaving the island due to work shortages. Enrolment at the school had dropped by 30 students.

- The provincial government would pay the major portion of the Islands Trust budget that year. This would result in lower taxes for the majority of property owners in the Gulf Islands so far as planning and related services were concerned.

Estimates tabled in the B.C. Legislature indicated property owners in the Trust area would be taxed at three-quarters of a mill for planning in 1978.

### Five years ago

- Reservations for the mainland-Gulf Islands summer ferries opened Tuesday and by the close of business on Wednesday, 15,000 spaces had been reserved.

Phone lines to the reservations desk were tied up and people were dropping into the office to make reservations. Many of the reservations were for multiple bookings, said a ferry official, describing the number of bookings as "incredible."

- The federal fisheries department was investigating the appearance of thousands of dead and dying fish in Active Pass.

The district supervisor said fast currents caused by extreme tides were believed to be responsible for the death of more than 5,000 hake.

- Thirty-six small ships sailed around Salt Spring Island in the annual race held by the sailing club.

Kerry Butler in *Wayward Wind* took top spot, followed by Roger Kibble in *Gretha*. Third place went to Tom Butler-Cole in the *Akane*.
