

### Carnival has games, food for everyone

Visitors to Salt Spring Elementary School's annual carnival will have the opportunity to feast on barbecued food, travel through a haunted house and participate in a number of games and sales.

The carnival, organized by the school's Parents' Group, will be held throughout the Salt Spring Elementary building, beginning after school on Friday, May 27. Unlike previous years, greater family participation will be encouraged with the availability of dinner.

Two of the organizers, Anne McKerricher and Cherry Jensen, said the dinner — a choice of barbecued halibut, salad and roll (\$4), hamburgers (\$2) and hot dogs (\$1) — will prevent the typical 4:30 end to festivities.

Adults will also find lots to do before the meal. While many of the games (such as the sponge throw, cakewalks and floor hockey) will entertain the children, activities such as the silent auction will be geared towards older participants.

Face painting, guessing games and the Grade Seven French Immersion class's haunted house should keep everybody occupied.

The carnival will feature demonstrations by the RCMP, fire department, the ambulance team and karate club; clowns will circulate on the school premises, and a tea room will offer a Mardi Gras atmosphere with students providing decorations and music.

Stalls, located outside if the weather is good and inside should it rain, will offer a variety of wares, including plants, books, toys, baked goods, fresh fruit, and white elephant items.

A baby-sitting service will also be available.

The Salt Spring Elementary Parents' Group raised \$1,600 at last year's carnival. This year, they hope to double the amount raised. The group helps fund a variety of school-related activities such as the popular visiting artists program, where local artists provide classroom instruction in their area of specialty.

Last year the parents' group helped purchase school uniforms, and during the Easter break this year, it installed more than \$700 worth of full-spectrum lighting.

Jensen says there are a number of activities — plus equipment which needs upgrading — that the group would like to contribute towards.

Anyone interested in donating carnival sale items can drop the goods off at the school any time between today (Wednesday) and Friday. The games are a "nickel and dime affair," and most of the profit will be obtained from the stalls and food sales.

"We would like to invite everyone, not just the parents," McKerricher says.

### Coffee benefit will offset licensing cost

A coffeehouse benefit has been planned to help offset licensing costs of the *Under the Rainbow Nursery School*.

The May 27 event at St. George's Church Hall will be followed by an open house at the 124 Westcott Road pre-school on Sunday, May 29.

*Under the Rainbow* coordinator Lisa Sigurgeirson says the coffee benefit will help cover the expense of licensing the school — something she has been working towards since the establishment of a play group there two years ago.

The licensing process has involved a gradual build-up of toys and equipment, plus steps taken to meet Capital Regional District (CRD) health standards. The main expense, Sigurgeirson says, was the installation of running water to the nursery school building.

The building, distinguished by a multi-coloured rainbow painted across its front, is located beside

Sigurgeirson's residence.

The school caters to 10 children between the ages of three and five years. The children attend the program for two and a half hours twice weekly.

Unlike the Ganges pre-school, run from the Community Centre, *Under the Rainbow* is not a parent-participation program. Sigurgeirson feels some parents can't afford that amount of time. However, parents do take part in one or two fund-raisers every year — such as a trike-a-thon last year — plus a spring and fall work party.

Sunday's open house will allow parents and interested community members to view the facility. A cake-cutting ceremony is scheduled for 2 pm; there will be wet and dry refreshments, plus balloons and party hats for the children.

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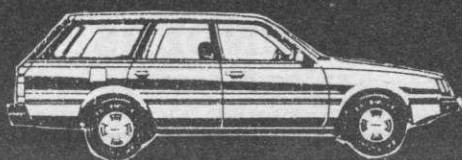
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# IODE rewards deserving students

## Local woman graduates in largest class

A Salt Spring Island woman was part of the largest graduating class in the history of Trinity Western University this year.

Wendy Ann Severn received her Bachelor of Art degree in Social Sciences. She was among 117 British Columbians in a graduating class of 201 this year at Canada's leading Christian university.

The university awarded 148 Bachelor of Arts and 22 Bachelor of Science degrees, and 34 two-year Associate of Arts diplomas this year.

Trinity Western, located on a 100-acre campus at Langley, is a private Christian university, chartered by the government of B.C. and granting internationally-recognized degrees with 23 majors in business and economics, physical education, fine arts, humanities, religious studies, education, natural sciences and social sciences.

It is the only university in Canada with a recognized aviation program, and one of the few that operates without government grants.

## Mermaids and fishermen to staff Sea Capers float

The Fulford and Ganges branches of the Old Age Pensioners Organization (OAPO) recently held a combined meeting to discuss their participation in Sea Capers.

The May 9 meeting decided that a float would be entered in the grand parade in an attempt to match the group's 1987 win in the "best overall" category — something that has apparently never been done before.

This year's OAPO float, titled *A Senior's Sea Fantasy*, will have a nautical theme. Further details will be kept secret until the day of the parade, but it is known that in addition to fishermen, it will feature at least four 70-year-old mermaids.

In previous years, OAPO floats have been built on trucks which, owing to the nature of their construction, were inclined to impede visibility. This year, a low-sided farm wagon will be used, which should benefit spectators. It will be towed by Lloyd Kinney's restored 1946 Jeep.

The Ganges OAPO branch held its May social meeting at Central Hall on May 10. It took the form of a "court" whist drive, with the object of raising funds to cover the cost of sending delegates to the OAPO convention in Nanaimo from June 20 to 24.

## Publishing regional history

The most recent monthly meeting of the Salt Spring Island Historical Society was held at Central Hall on May 7, with 27 members in attendance and president Mary Davidson in the chair.

Guest speaker was Maralyn Horsdal, a partner in Horsdal and Schubart, a B.C. book publishing firm headquartered in Ganges, who discussed publishing of regional history.

Horsdal and Schubart has had a string of successes. In the past three years, its *Samuel Maclure, Architect, On The Shady Side*, *Sappers* (by former islander Beth Hill) and *Seven Shillings A Year* have all been well received.

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# Entomologist explains Galiano research project

GALIANO — Risa Smith, entomologist, spoke at the last Galiano Garden Club meeting about a research project she is pursuing in her field on the old Kolossoff property at Spotlight Cove. The subject of the research is the Apple Ermine moth.

Not native to North America, the moth was first noticed seven years ago and is thought to have come to B.C. on root stock from France. It has no natural enemies, although spiders, earwigs and birds do attack them.

The moth is small and is usually identified in the caterpillar stage occupying small tents on the tips of apple branches and under the leaves. The latter turn brown along the edges and become misshapen. The caterpillar itself is white with black dots along its sides.

To carry out her experiments Risa has had built six seven-by-seven walk-in cages with fibreglass roofs and double-screened walls. Nine three-year old Spartan saplings are planted in each shed and are watered by a drip system.

Funded by Agriculture Canada, the department of supplies and services and some nursery growers of the Fraser Valley, the experiment involves tiny insects (natural enemies of the Apple Ermine moth) which are to be brought here from Europe. Risa has, over the past week or so, collected Ermine Moth tents from trees all over the island to use in her research.

Associated experiments are also being carried out on Salt Spring Island, Saanich and the Fraser Valley.

David Tarrant, "The Western Gardener" and frequent Garden Club speaker, is now "The Canadian Gardener," and his Saturday morning CBC television show is going national. His new production schedule does not permit his appearance here at the June 8 meeting as expected. Program convener Margaret Griffith will arrange his replacement shortly.

Shirley Chambers has arranged a garden tour with the Pender Island Garden Club. The tour will be on Tuesday, June 7, and will include six gardens plus a look at deer-proof and drought-proof garden experiments on the island. Galiano Garden Club members will board the 11:50 am ferry at Sturdies Bay for the trip to Pender, arriving back on Galiano at 5:45 pm.

Another garden tour is planned for July 27 and will take in several

## Manning outlines mandate

# Party hopes to gain solid voice in parliament

PENDER ISLAND — Reform Party leader Preston Manning visited Pender Island this past Saturday as part of a brief campaign swing through B.C. following the past week's western premiers' conference.

"We here in the west have a fundamentally different view of priorities," said Manning to a Pender Island audience of 50. "We are not out to set up a

national party, but we do want to gain a solid voice in (parliament).

He continued: "The current government has the Canadian economy skewed to the advantage of Quebec and Ontario. They look at the west as a market for eastern goods, and as a supplier of resources. And we want to change that."

The Reform Party platform takes issue with French as Canada's second language and takes a

stand for tighter immigration controls.

"It might make sense to have French language laws in Quebec but not here in the west," says Manning. "And with respect to immigration, we in the west want a say into who comes into our provinces. We want to make

choices that can take us in a positive direction."

The Reform Party was inaugurated at a Manitoba conference in November, 1987. In January, 1988, it was officially recognized as a political party in Canada.

Manning is the son of former Alberta Premier Ernest Manning.



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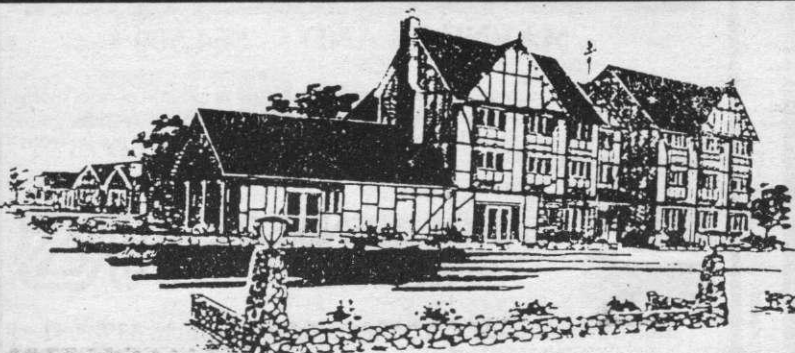
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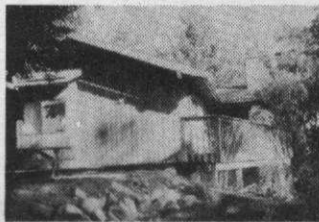
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# Islanders ready for visit by MB

**GALIANO ISLAND** - Writing in his book, *The Unknown Island*, Ian Smith said: "A tree falls in today's wind, but trees always fall. A deer browses peacefully in tomorrow's sunshine, but the sun always shines. An earthworm moves an inch of the forest soil, but time moves it back. They have little consequence in the long-term life of the forest ... much more important to men are the cataclysmic changes induced by fire or logging ..."

"I'm optimistic that things can work out," said Bill Paterson two weeks ago. Noranda's head man, Adam Zimmerman, is flying to Galiano in June and will be meeting with four members of our Galiano Clear Cut Alternatives committee. Ray Smith of MacMillan-Bloedel was instrumental in getting him out here and from all we have heard he's open to discussing alternatives to what will otherwise be the destruction of over 50 per cent of our island's forest."

MacMillan-Bloedel currently controls 7,000 acres of Galiano forest land. "The original plan for cutting," says Paterson, "stretched over 60 years with one-third of the land being cut and replanted each 20 years. But an upswing in the lumber market caused MB executives to reassess the program and three years ago the cutting accelerated, beginning with their property on the east side of the island. When they began cutting the western slopes near Coon Bay and near an area being considered for a provincial park, we began to take notice and formed Clear Cut Alternatives to explore ways of getting the company to reconsider."

"We on Galiano," continued Paterson, "see the clear-cutting of the MacMillan-Bloedel lands as having a serious impact on tourism, construction, arts and crafts and property values - ultimately resulting in a loss of jobs and destroying the ecology and affecting the peace of mind of all who were attracted to the island's natural beauty."

Cam Trowsdale is a concert violinist - a concert master with the Vancouver CBC Orchestra. He

has served on the music faculty at UBC and moved to Galiano 12 years ago. "I grew up back east," says Trowsdale, "and was drawn here by the land ... its natural beauty and wildlife. And that is where the Canadian identity we are all searching for lies. You can see it in the stars on a clear night and feel it when you look out your window and see a couple of bald eagles swirling in the play on the air currents."

"I recognized it for the first time, I think," continued Trowsdale, "when I paddled a canoe in the early morning light and had a sea lion surface just a few feet away. We're all in this together."

"I'm optimistic about Adam Zimmerman's coming out here to meet with us on Galiano," says Bill Paterson, "because we discovered that he was part of a Canadian Task Force on The Environment and Economy and was signatory to a report that made some rather sweeping statements in support of what Zimmerman called a new type of business-level decision-making."

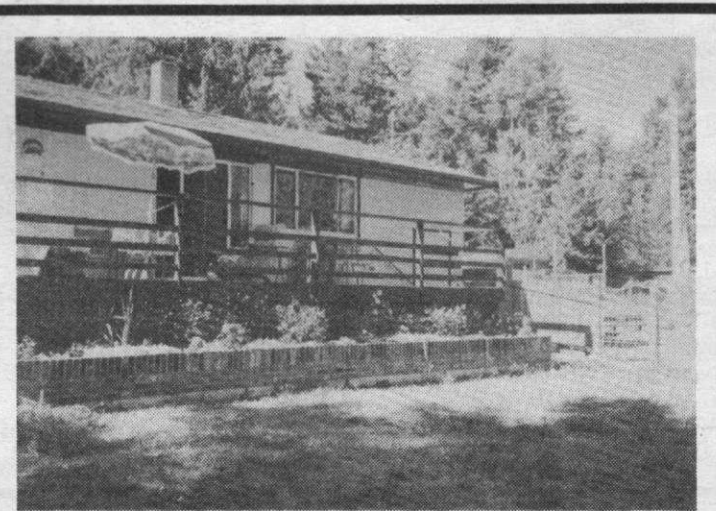
"David Buzzelli, who heads up Dow of Canada, was also on the task force and stated that he felt economic and environmental concerns should go hand-in-hand. Tom MacMillan was also part of the committee and as minister of environment said he did not think it possible to have a sound economy without a healthy environment."

There are those who take a jaded view of such public statements seeing them as only part of industry's campaign to present their efforts in a more positive light. But when all is said and done the final decisions are made by men seated next to and across from each other.

And we ask - who are the men that will ultimately make the decisions that affect Galiano and in the long term set precedents for logging throughout British Columbia?

MacMillan-Bloedel is a subsidiary of Noranda, which in turn is owned by Brascan, which is owned by Peter and Ed Bronfman of Toronto. Peter Bronfman is the driving force behind Brascan and

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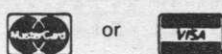

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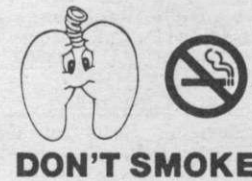

attended Upper Canada College in Toronto.

Historian Peter C. Newman is also an alumni of Upper Canada College and interviewed Peter Bronfman for one of the profiles in his book *The Canadian Establishment*.

"The great irony," said Bronfman to Newman, "is that my brother Edward and I figured that once we sold the Canadiens Hockey Club, we would kind of disappear from the scene. What we didn't count on was the upset with Brascan."

"In my twenties," Bronfman recalled, "while other guys were busting their asses — when I wasn't with my kids — I was doing community work because I guess that was something in our family blood. And my kids, well, they were definitely going to have a father ... a relationship with their father which I never had. So at that point business was kind of a hobby. After we get Brascan settled and things cool down, I can get back to a more normal schedule."

It was 1979 when Newman talked with Peter Bronfman on the football field at Upper Canada College. Nine years have passed and another alumni has entered the picture in the personage of Adam Zimmerman, who began work with Noranda as an assistant comptroller in 1958. Zimmerman was not included in Peter C. Newman's book on the Canadian establishment but Newman spoke of him via telephone this past Sunday.

"Zimmerman is on the boards of more than a dozen companies across Canada, among them Canada Packers, Royal Insurance, McLaren Power and Paper and BC Forest Products," says Newman. "I knew Adam as a person and not as a businessman. He is what I would call an enlightened business executive who looks beyond the bottom line."

"We are hoping that Mr. Zimmerman will sit and listen to our position," says Bill Paterson. "Ideally we would like to see a moratorium called on the cutting until a study can be done to determine the long-term effects on Galiano Island. A recent survey of islanders came back with 193 yes votes and 32 no votes on the moratorium concept."

"We want some time to explore other avenues that could work for both MB and the island," continued Paterson. One idea involves Wildlife Habitat Canada. It is possible they could purchase the property and develop it as a wilderness reserve. There is also talk of a testing area for the replanting of the coastal Douglas firs. At one time they comprised the majority of all timber pulled off the lands in B.C. growing on the east coast of Vancouver Island, along the Sunshine Coast and on Galiano. The coastal firs now comprise only five per cent of the timber cut."


I sat listening this past Saturday evening as Cam Trowsdale mused about Galiano and the other Gulf Islands. "Civilizations past inhabit all lands," said Trowsdale. "If we are perceptive enough we can find our roots — in the rocks and sea and in the trees."

Trowsdale will be performing in a benefit concert set for June 11 on Galiano. Proceeds will go to fund the efforts of the Clear Cut Alternatives Committee.

Yes Murray, some of us are aware that divinity is manifest in Nature, and experience pain when we see the insensitive manner in which all of us, including you, contribute to abuse of the Earth. The oceans are dying, the forests are withering away or being wiped out at an astronomical rate. A recent poll indicates that over 90% of Canadians are most afraid of being poisoned to death, even as we turn our planet into a desert. The rampant increase in auto-immune diseases shows that this fear is well founded.

Anyone who uses toilet paper (whose non-decomposable fibres are now choking life in the ocean in clouds hundreds of miles wide along much of the eastern seaboard), or gasoline, is part of

## Resolutions

Sir,

The following resolutions were presented at a recent meeting in Vancouver of the B.C. Environment Network for Action. They follow the guidelines for "sustainable development" contained in the report by the UN's world commission on environment and development.

- Reduce the annual allowable cut in B.C. by 10 per cent per year to approximately one-half the present rate, the exact percentage to be determined from a study to be commenced immediately. We must also practise better silviculture.
- Reduce energy consumption in B.C. and Canada by 40 per cent before the year 2000. This process to be commenced immediately at the rate of five per cent per year. No further energy exports to the U.S. should be permitted.
- Complete the national and provincial parks in B.C. with a target doubling the protected area to 10 per cent before the year 1993.
- Implement the task force on environment and economy recommendations by integrating the WCED report into all Canadian school and university curriculums by 1990.
- Create funding to finance the necessary environmental protection work in the amount of one per cent of the GNP (\$1.2 billion a year, nationally). This environmental work must include inter-venor funding and the immediate establishment of a sustainable environmental management and economic development centre. This centre would be staffed by at least two persons per province as a start.

High priority should be given to economic conversion of the military-industrial complex to socially beneficial production, beginning with the centre called for above. Initial funding could come from the \$9 billion submarine program. Support these recommendations by writing to MP Jim Manly, provincial environment minister Bruce Strachan, and federal environment minister Tom MacMillan.

Sir,

The recent letter to *Driftwood* (April 6) from Uri Cogan was an illogical display of ignorance and presumptuousness.

Zionists and their allies are quick to respond with spiteful condemnation when anyone "advocates the total destruction" of the racist, terrorist Zionist

entity, yet presumably these people are supportive of the destruction of Palestine as a nation in order for Zionist Israel to exist instead.

The over three million Zionists, who currently live in the part of Palestine which they renamed Israel, are occupying land which rightfully belongs to over four million Palestinians. For Palestinians and their sympathizers to wish for the destruction of Zionist Israel as a political and military entity is no more "despicable" or "demented" than for the Chinese to have hoped for the destruction of Imperial Japan during the Second World War.

Mr. Cogan's allegation that I distorted facts in a previous letter is lame. Every reference to events and statistics in my brief summary of the Zionists' violent seizure of Palestine is truthful to the best of my knowledge. For that letter, I was careful to restrict my historical claims to those which can be verified by a commonly respected and fairly neutral source — the *Encyclopaedia Britannica*.

His contention that my letter was "a call to mass murder" is laughable. The fact is that the Zionists and Palestinians are in a state of war, and the Zionists began this war when they migrated to Palestine and proceeded to forcibly create their own country on Palestinian land. For over 40 years, Zionists have killed (or "murdered") and maimed Arabs to enforce Zionist occupation of Arab land.

There is a vast difference between the violence used by conquerors and oppressors and the reactive violence of their victims.

The Zionist entity owes its existence to Yankee military and economic aid. If the Arabs ever acquire military assistance of comparable quality, they would have a realistic chance to reclaim the lands to which they are entitled. Of course, it is the

Zionists who possess atomic bombs. Are the Zionists prepared to "nuke" Arabs in order to perpetuate the occupation?

Zionist leaders and settlers have choices. At present, they obviously choose to engage in a brutal occupation of another people's homeland. The Zionists do indeed possess the power "to deal harshly with those who seek Israel's destruction". The Arabs have paid a high price in terms of death and suffering for their opposition to Zionist aggression. However, history shows that situations change, and there may come a time when the Arabs have the power to deal harshly with those who seek to perpetuate the destruction of Palestine.
