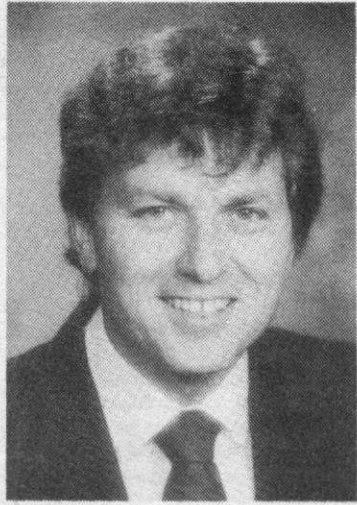


MLAs address free trade, health care



Terry Huberts

Free trade and medicare services were among the topics addressed by local MLAs Terry Huberts and Mel Couvelier at a town hall meeting held last Friday at the Masonic Hall on Salt Spring Island.

About 50 people attended the June 3 meeting to hear opening comments from both MLAs, plus a question-and-answer period.

Huberts opened the meeting by discussing the free trade issue, citing the trade deal as "very good for B.C." and "something Salt Spring should understand."

Huberts compared the deal with Salt Spring — formerly an isolated community — "tapping in on what's happening abroad."

Free trade will mean cheaper goods and greater selection for the consumer, plus more markets for manufacturers, Huberts said. As for Canadian culture and identity, he said, "yes we might lose some . . . but we can't stand still while the rest of the world

moves forward."

A question from the floor queried the effects of free trade on wages. Deitrich Luth asked what would prevent an "outflow" of manufacturing to Mexico where cheap labour could be obtained. He agreed there would be work, but "not at current rates."

Huberts suggested looking at the European Common Market to

determine what effects free trade had on European wages. Another individual said transportation costs would prevent an outflow of manufacturing.

Couvelier used his opening statement to comment on "initiatives" created by the Vander Zalm government. He said the first goal — labour management — has been taken care of with Bill 19. He said the vast majority of labour groups have their contracts up for renegotiation this year and he feels

School trustees agree: alcohol to be prohibited

Gulf Island school board trustees agreed last Wednesday to prohibit the serving of alcohol at school-sponsored activities.

The motion was passed at Wednesday's school board meeting after a number of citizens spoke to the issue.

Speaking on behalf of a group of parents present at the meeting, Eric Donnelly expressed opposition to the "broad blanket policy."

He mentioned an upcoming barbecue, scheduled for graduates and parents the evening before graduation ceremonies, as an "appropriate and not sinful" example of an event where those attending should be permitted a glass of wine.

Donnelly later clarified his statement to include only those of a legal drinking age. He said a blanket prohibition was regressive, and that the school needs to prepare students for what they will face after graduation.

School district psychologist Dr. Ralph Miller presented a number of alcohol-related statistics in asking that the board pass the motion prohibiting alcohol use. Miller's presentation said allowing the sale and use of alcohol is inconsistent with the education ministry's Family Life program, and "supports and enhances the acceptability of alcohol consumption and the pervasive perception of it as the essential component of celebration."

Furthermore, Dr. Miller noted, none of the 13 Vancouver Island area school districts allows alcohol at school functions, in the schools

or, with one exception, in facilities jointly funded by schools and communities.

The board received correspondence from Dr. Heaton and Reverend Al Skinner in support of the motion. Rev. Skinner said in his letter that he conducted six funerals in the past year for people whose deaths were due to alcohol use.

An informal poll taken of 20 members of the Gulf Islands Secondary School parents' advisory group, meanwhile, indicated a split. Five said the serving of alcohol should be left to the discretion of the organization, seven agreed it should be served only at adult functions, and the remaining eight said it should not be served under any circumstance.

A suggestion to hold off on a decision until more community input had been received was countered by trustee Ian Fraser, who noted trustees were elected to make decisions.

Trustee Grace Byrne said: "It is absurd it hasn't been dealt with before."

The new policy prohibits the sale of alcohol at functions such as *Salute the Century* — a musical event held at the high school earlier this year, in which alcohol was available. The policy also prevents teachers or adult volunteers from consuming alcohol on school-sponsored excursions, such as overnight ski trips.

Alcohol will still be permitted for those groups renting school facilities, should the correct licensing be obtained.

Fulford school combats lice

A medical health officer will travel to Salt Spring to help combat an uncommonly severe lice problem at Fulford Elementary School.

Some 40 students were sent home from the elementary school last week to undergo special shampoo treatments.

Spot checks at Fernwood and Salt Spring elementary schools, and at the high school, indicate the problem has not spread. Superintendent of Schools Mike Marshall said, however, that there are bound to be some isolated cases of overlapping, due

to siblings attending different schools.

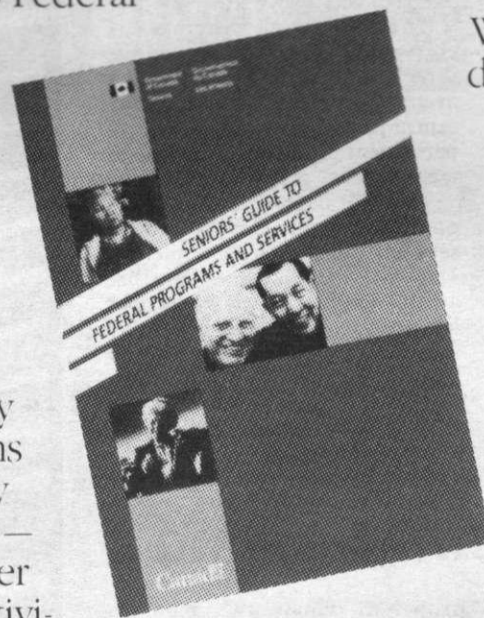
Marshall said the school district undergoes a lice problem most years, but that this year's problem is uncommonly severe.

"It's very frustrating," he said, noting that the treatment for lice, which is quite extensive, does not assure the child will not contract lice again, once back at school.

Marshall said the problem will be dealt with jointly between the education and health systems. "It's really a health problem . . . that's why we're relying on the health officer's expertise."

Annual meeting resumes

Tribute paid to hard working Club members

SOUTH GALIANO — The adjourned annual meeting of the Galiano Club resumed at 1:40 pm on Saturday. Only a semi-quorum was present, but nobody had the heart to insist on niceties. President Bill Scoones paid tribute to the hard work of retiring secretary-treasurer Don Macdonald, and to Connie Kennedy for her work as chairman of the Bluffs committee. Bob Riddle and his renovation committee were praised for their achievement in putting the hall on a sound foundation and planning a new kitchen.

Elected by acclamation to the executive were Jim Scoones, Ella Johnson, Ron Way, David New, Sue Minette and Pat Connelly. With the three continuing members of the board of directors is still three short of its quota.

Mike Frayling gave notice of motion that the club take under its umbrella a ratepayers and renters

association — not as another society, for the island already has over 30 organizations of one kind or another, but as an apolitical group to provide a platform for residents who want to complain about the adverse effects of the actions of governments and bureaucrats on their lives.

Burned Offerings

In Biblical times it was customary to sacrifice animals and offer them as a "burned offering" to the Lord to celebrate some special event. It is possible that the "burning" was a kind of barbecue, and that the priests and temple officials were able to supplement the protein-component of their diet on these occasions.

At Retreat Cove on Saturday, May 28, a similar event took place when a local dignitary was elevated to the rank of patriarch. Four hoggets were offered as a rather rare burned offering. A large tribe

or clan gathered at Hunterstone Farm. Descendants of Ralph and Marney were present in Biblical proportions and, with on- and off-island friends and neighbours, amounted to over 100 people.

Flowers of Roadside and Hedgerow

The flowers of spring bloom first on the bluffs. The wildflowers of May and June thrive by the roadside, in the ditches and on the hedgerows, of which we have quite a few on Galiano. The record rainfall of May has produced a profuse blooming of a large number of species. A good proportion of these are 'exotics,'

mostly imports from Europe brought accidentally, or sometimes deliberately, by the early settlers.

Some, such as the little *twinnflower* are circumpolar in the boreal forest zone. Most of the clovers have escaped from pastures, but the mauve and white *lance clover* is a native. There are two so-called *miners' lettuce* one of which is *Montia* now blooming on mossy banks. This has a rosette of fleshy basal leaves and pretty pink bells carried on slender stems. There are two lovely *alum roots*; the *small flowered alum root* has

General store to reopen as temporary museum

PENDER ISLANDS — The Pender Island Museum Society will re-open the doors of the General Store at Port Washington on Saturday, June 11, as the 78-year-old building becomes the new temporary home of the Pender Island Museum.

The Museum Society will be sharing the North Pender landmark with the Pender Island Chamber of Commerce in an effort to share a bit on the island's history with locals and tourists alike.

The General Store ceased operations as a grocery on Friday, January 15, when current owner Russ Searle consolidated

operations at his Driftwood Centre location across from Browning Harbour (*Driftwood*, January 20, 1988).

The Museum Society is currently seeking a year-round site for a Pender Island Museum and is awaiting studies on a community centre project that would house a permanent collection of island memorabilia.

"We will have numerous items on display at the General Store," says group museum spokesperson Doreen York, "but are asking that anyone with treasures they would like to donate or lend us for the summer contact a member of the Society."

Emergency co-ordinators named for Pender Island

PENDER ISLANDS — Peter Hunter and Peter Hemphill of Pender Island have been appointed area co-ordinators for the Provincial Emergency Program (PEP) following completion of a government-sponsored course and the recent formation of a Pender Island Emergency Committee.


"The first order of business for the committee," says Hunter, "is to produce a written emergency plan for the island covering any and all foreseeable hazards to life and

property. When the plan is completed it goes to the Emergency Program's zone manager in Victoria for approval. Once the plan is approved, we will make copies available to island residents."

"Once the plan is adopted and approved," continued Hunter, "we will begin recruiting and training able-bodied resident volunteers in search and rescue techniques, fire-fighting and other disciplines. All persons completing the training will be registered with the Provincial Emergency Program and will be covered by the Workers' Compensation Board."

Influx of visitors heralds summer

NORTH GALIANO — Despite the weather, the summer influx of day and weekend visitors to our island has begun. Our roads fill with cyclists as the morning ferries arrive from the mainland. Many of these people enjoy their few hours on Galiano travelling to North Galiano. The exercise, the natural beauty of our forests and scenery, the challenge of a hilly, twisted road with who knows what around the corner — these things appeal to city dwellers and draw them to Galiano.

Local people involved in the tourist business do well for the tourist. We provide bed and breakfast for them, we run grocery stores where they can buy supplies, we sell them gas for their vehicles, drinks to satisfy their thirst, paintings to hang on their walls, we provide boats to row in our waters and even houses for them to buy if they wish to stay.

What we don't provide everywhere are sanitary conveniences. At North Galiano this is becoming a problem. The only provision for the island's many visitors in North Galiano are two privies at the community hall and one at the fire hall. They are frequently used — much too frequently for the peace-of-mind of the volunteers who service them.

There are those visitors, however, who don't or can't afford the time and effort to get themselves to one of these places and more than one North Galiano resident has been forced to fence off their property to keep unwanted relief seekers from their shrubbery.

This is not good enough. It is time the Chamber of Commerce discussed this problem again. We wonder — is it fair to expect volunteers and non-commercial residents to shoulder the responsibility for this necessary service?

Jamboree No. 8

Preparations are well advanced for this year's North Galiano July 1 Jamboree. The theme for the celebration is children's literature, giving lots of scope for costumes and parade floats.

A storybook dragon is featured on the posters and uncoloured drawings of the dragon have been made available. Children are encouraged to name their dragon, colour the copy and bring it to the jamboree for display. They can, of course, create their own dragon or dinosaur and bring it along for the display. Prizes will be awarded.

Molly Colson is in charge of the giant raffle. The prizes are roast beef this year, rather than lamb. Tickets are now available.

Collectibles Tea

The tea held at the home of Wendy Roberts one sunny afternoon in mid-May realized a

treasure trove of collectibles which were sold at the giant sale at Christ Church Cathedral in Victoria later in the month. Sales people, Roberts and Edgare took in about \$800 as their contribution to the Cathedral's completion fund on behalf of St. Margaret's, Galiano.

Blue Moon

Strange things are supposed to happen when the moon is full. Some school teachers say they can tell when the moon is full by the way the children get along together on the school grounds and by their interaction with one another in the classroom, and they do it without looking at the calendar. "It must be a full moon," they say as they arrive home from school after a day of minor crises.

We had a full moon last week, the second in the month — a rare blue moon. Who knows what small problems our educators faced on that day?

Even though we couldn't see the moon here on Galiano due to heavy cloud cover, it did have its effect on more than just the tides. For example, it must have been the blue moon which prompted one of our volunteer firemen to offer the suggestion that since in the recent test of the fire siren the sound was not reaching very far, and that it was Galiano's hills and tree which were muffling the sound, then perhaps we should ask MacMillan-Blodell to clear-cut the area south of the hall. That suggestion, fellows, would indeed sound a few alarms.

The second blue-moon-inspired proposal was to be a joint venture of the Garden Club and the solid waste committee of the Galiano Club. The proposal was for the clubs to purchase from a well-known garden supply firm on the Lower Mainland a large number of privet bushes. These would be planted around our solid waste area as a hedge and would have the effect of screening off the logged area below the dump, and at the same time retain our newly-discovered view of the Straits and Lower Mainland. No doubt government aid might be obtained for the project as it could be applied for as the "privatization of an unnatural resource." Blue moon, indeed!

New Horizons Report

Members of the North Galiano Community Association recently formed a New Horizons kitchen improvement group and have applied to the federal government for help in purchasing, amongst other items, a commercial dishwasher.

Harold Wike heads the group and Walter Roots is secretary. Their proposal has been approved in Vancouver and is now in Ottawa, where the department of health and welfare makes the award. A decision is expected within the next few weeks.

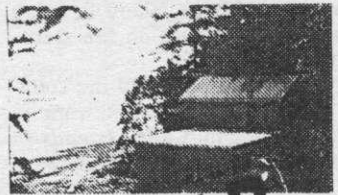

Gulf Islands book project now ready for publication

A book about the Gulf Islands, prepared as a New Horizons project, will soon be on the market.

Art Sweet, who co-ordinated the writing project for seniors, addressed last weekend's Trust Council on Thetis Island to bring trustees up to date on the status of the work.

Sweet last addressed the council three years ago, when work on the book began. Called *Islands In Trust*, the publication is now in

the hands of a Victoria book-printing company and will soon be available for sale at about \$10 a copy.

The first half of the book, written by Sweet, contains chapters covering historical and geographical background on the islands within the Trust area, and an account of the events which led to the formation of the Trust.

Subsequent chapters are devoted to full accounts from each island, covering topics like the

construction of a community hall on Lasqueti Island. In the southern Gulf Islands area, chapters were written by Basil Benger (Galiano), Norrine Hooper (Pender), Rev. George Morrison (Mayne), Taimi Hindmarch (Saturna) and Dr. Dave Lott (Salt Spring).

"The whole idea of this book is to support the aims and objectives of the Islands Trust," Sweet said, adding that the first printing will be for 2,000 volumes.

tiny white flowers on a slim stem and looks like a very delicate lace. The larger flowered is more robust with bell-shaped flowers, pink inside and green outside.

Many of the hedges are adorned with a splendid display of the bold-pink *Nootka roses*, so reminiscent of the "sweet eglantine" of Shakespeare's England. There are also the much more diminutive *dwarf roses* like miniatures of their larger relative. Shakespeare's woodbine was probably the honeysuckle, but the name was also applied to other climbing vines. On Galiano the orange *honeysuckle* is a brilliant alternative to the pale English honeysuckle, although it has no perfume. The white rose-like blooms of *thimbleberries* are blooming on the canes at the same time as the *salmonberry* fruits in red and pale orange are ripening and providing a dessert for the robins.

Preferring shade and relatively rare are the orange flowers of the *Western columbine*. *Aquilegia formosa* sounds as if it is a visitor from China, as *Formosa* was the former name of Taiwan but, in fact, *formosa* is Latin for beauty — a tribute well deserved. It is native to this part of Canada. *Vetches*, *buttercups*, *vanilla leaf*, *False Solomon's seal*, *creeping blackberry*, *pyrola*, *sanicle* and many, many more 'roadside attractions' delight the eyes of the observant walker on Galiano roads.

Firemen's Golf

Once or twice a year the volunteer firemen from both North and South Galiano play a tournament in the form of a two-ball foursome. On Sunday, June 5, they were blessed with a fine day for their day out on the course. Playing nine holes, low score was

achieved by Ralph Brine and Fred King with 43. Some of the inexperienced players needed a calculator to keep track of the score and a fair number of lost balls were contributed to the rough. There is an annual "Forestry Trophy" for the player striking most trees. Although he was unable to play as he had to work, it was decided that the holder, Bill Stevens, should retain the trophy as no one could come near his record of previous years.

- On Saturday next, June 11, there will be a grand benefit concert to raise money for the work of CCA. Scintillating local talent will be headed by violinist Cam Trowsdale. Curtain time is 7:30 pm in the South Community Hall. Tickets, which must be pre-sold,

Special hearing to decide Bowen zoning application

A rare case of local Islands Trust representatives being outvoted by general trustees could occur later this month on Bowen Island.

In late May, following a public hearing into a rezoning application that would clear the way for a marina development in Snug Cove, the Trust's two vice-chairmen — Carol Martin of Hornby Island and Steve Wright of Pender Island — voted against the application, while the two Bowen Island trustees voted in favour.

Trust chairman Nick Gilbert of Salt Spring reserved casting of his vote, but will do so at a special public hearing set for Bowen on the June 17-18 weekend. Should Gilbert vote against the applica-

tion, it would be only the second time in Trust history that a local committee has been outvoted by the general trustees.

Gilbert had been prepared to give the rezoning bylaw second reading provided certain conditions were met by the developer. However, at last weekend's Trust Council meeting on Thetis Island, the Trust chairman was presented with a legal opinion from the Attorney-General's ministry which said that to do so would constitute bargaining in bad faith.

At the special public hearing later this month on Bowen, Gilbert will put three questions to the developer concerning his willingness to scale down the marina project and remove provi-

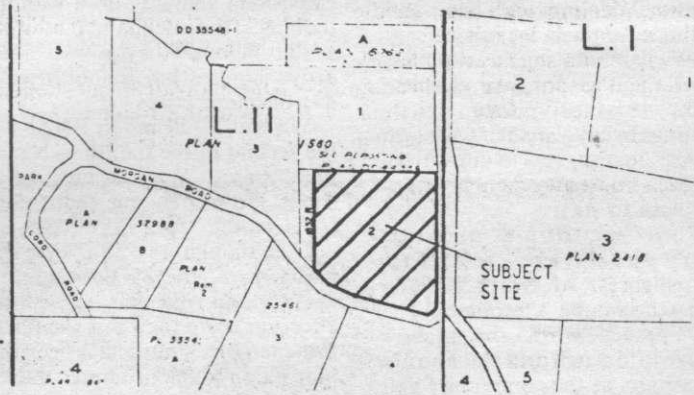

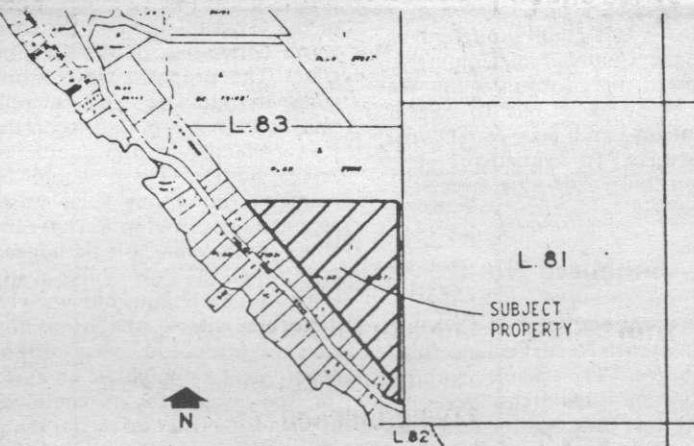

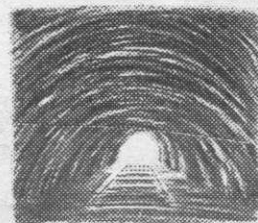

settlements will be reached "without government interference."

The initiative aimed at diversification of industry, he said, is being achieved by regionalization, which will result in grass-roots business development.

Couvelier said a further initiative is the Pacific Rim project, which will see B.C. as a "link" between the rest of Canada and the Pacific Rim. The major thrust of the program is in the schools, where language and cultural programs dealing with the Pacific Rim are now being offered.

Couvelier also discussed health care in the province, indicating the province needs to think "creatively" about how to cut

down on costs. This year's increase in health care funding surpassed the total amount given to the three universities, he said. "We've got to give education more priority."

Luth suggested from the floor that the number of ill people in the province increases with the number of doctors. He suggested limiting the number of billing numbers available for doctors and upgrading the status of nurses. He indicated nurses could perform certain procedures for about one-tenth the cost of a doctor.

Several other issues were introduced by islanders and addressed by the MLAs:

- One individual questioned the status of the Islands Trust, indicating it is islanders who suffer

when the Trust is under-funded because several months will pass while rezoning applications are considered. Huberts said the mandate of the Trust is still under examination; however, the body did receive an increase in funding this year.

- Responding to a question regarding the "Maliview International Airport," Huberts said he had asked the Agricultural Land Commission to keep him up-to-date on the situation.

- Another individual suggested those workers losing their jobs due to privatization should receive "better than fair settlements." The MLAs agreed, indicating the government has approached the issue "responsibly" with a generous early retirement program.

sion for a marine pub. The answers to those questions must be either a yes or a no and are not subject to negotiation. The answers will determine how Gilbert casts his vote.

Bowen Island trustees Don Leigh and Peggy Rose briefly attended the Thetis Island Trust Council meeting. They left after conferring with the general trustees and Trust staff on the next steps to be taken.

Leigh indicated to *Driftwood* that the developer is unlikely to make significant alterations to his proposal.

According to general trustee Steve Wright, the public hearing into the Snug Cove proposal lasted eight hours and received numerous letters in support of the proposal, and the voicing of strong objections to the plan.

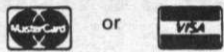

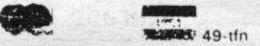

Newspaper traces changes in society

There's nothing like reading when you land in trouble. Like today, I brought a china cabinet downstairs. It's been stored in a closet until now I need the space. So, alone and unaided I manhandled the brute to the stairs landing. It's still there. I had to do something, so I started reading the collection of old newspapers that had lain atop the cabinet until I ruthlessly disturbed them.

In 1935 the British parent of the now wider-spread Schweppes company was advertising in verse and this was a sample:

A soaking wet day with the Bicester

Nearly killed Annabella, my sister:

But her wheezins pneumonic
Were dispelled with Schweppes Tonic

Now the "stags" at hunt balls can't resicester.

The Bicester, pronounced, if you haven't caught on, "Bister," is a famous hunt with horses and hounds and regalia.

Still in the drinking business: Cartoon depicts two men walking an endless road; and the caption reads, "I feel like a Guinness!" "I wish you were!"

Nearer home, Seagram's Whiskey, spelt with the "E", was the best 1897, according to the agents, R.P. Rithet and Company in Victoria.

The same *Province* carried a statement familiar to many islanders at that time. The Victoria and Sidney Railway would leave the city daily at 7 am and 4 pm, returning to Victoria at 8:15 and 5:15 pm. The V&S Railway was the route to Victoria for island residents crossing the waters in their own boats.

For those planning to travel further on larger trains the Canadian Pacific Railway was more boastful. The only trans-continental line running through trains between the Atlantic and the Pacific "passes through 600 miles of the Grandest Scenery in the World, Embracing the Wildest Canyons (spelt in the Spanish style), the highest Mountain Peaks and the greatest Glacier." The *Empress of India, Japan and China* sailed every four weeks for Japan and China, while the *Warrimoo* and the *Miowera* left monthly for Honolulu, Suva and Sidney.

Of course, the traveller heading for the interior of the province was left to make his way in the old western style, by stage coach. The British Columbia Express Company's stages left bi-weekly for Cariboo and Lillooet, "leaving Ashcroft every Monday morning at five o'clock, travelling by daylight only, and making about 70 miles each way, per day, lying over one day at Barkerville. Returning, arrive at Ashcroft Tuesdays and Saturdays.

The Barber and Ellis Company of Bay St., Toronto, produced envelopes, papetries, writing tablets, flat and ruled papers and cardboards. There was a Barber Ellis salesman still making monthly calls to Salt Spring Island

until a dozen years ago.

Books offered by William Briggs, of Toronto, were of lesser-known authors. S.R. Crockett has not survived as a classic and Florence Kingsley and Clifford Smith are not to be found on every bookshelf. One title offered had an interesting claim to distinction which would appeal to many buyers today. The book was offered at 50 cents in paper cover and \$1 in cloth-covered hardcovers.

There was another interesting feature of the 1897 postal style in Victoria. The reader was invited to write to Thomas Dunn and Co. for information on the purchase of miners' and prospectors' supplies. The address given was "Vancouver, BC." No street address, no code, nothing beyond the name of the city.

The shortest route to the goldfields of Kootenay or Kettle Valley was by way of the Northern Pacific Railway, the reader learned in April of that year of grace, 1897. "Travellers from the east, or from the west will find this the quickest and most comfortable route to the gold and silver districts of British Columbia." Timetable showed that the journey from Victoria to Spokane took 22 hours. Rossland was a 30-hour trip and Nelson, 33 hours. Kaslo and Grand Forks lay within 36 hours of Victoria.

W.J. Pendray's British Columbia Soap Works had been awarded two gold and 13 silver medals for their soaps and vinegars.

Bicycles Free from troubles were available from J.H. Duncan, of Victoria.

Having yet to consider the various charters and laws, British Columbians could advertise as they wished. There was no hindrance to the Ensign Corset Company's advertisement seeking "Lady Agents to take orders for hygienic corsets." What about men's rights?

Advertisements are certainly not news. Yet a glance through the ads of the past reveals many aspects of the changes in society over the past near-century.
