

Sister newspaper launched to serve Outer Gulf Islands

Driftwood now has a sister publication.

Island Times, a new weekly community newspaper serving the Outer Gulf Islands, distributed its first issue on Tuesday, July 19.

Island Times is owned by Driftwood Publishing, which also produces *Second Impressions*, a graphic arts trade magazine serving Western Canada, and this newspaper.

Tony Richards, managing director of Driftwood Publishing, said the Outer Islands venture has been a long-time dream. "Timing is everything and now seems to be the right time," he said. "The islands are growing and have a character all their own. They deserve their own newspaper."

Driftwood will continue to be circulated to the Outer Gulf Islands of Galiano, Mayne, Saturna and North and South Pender.

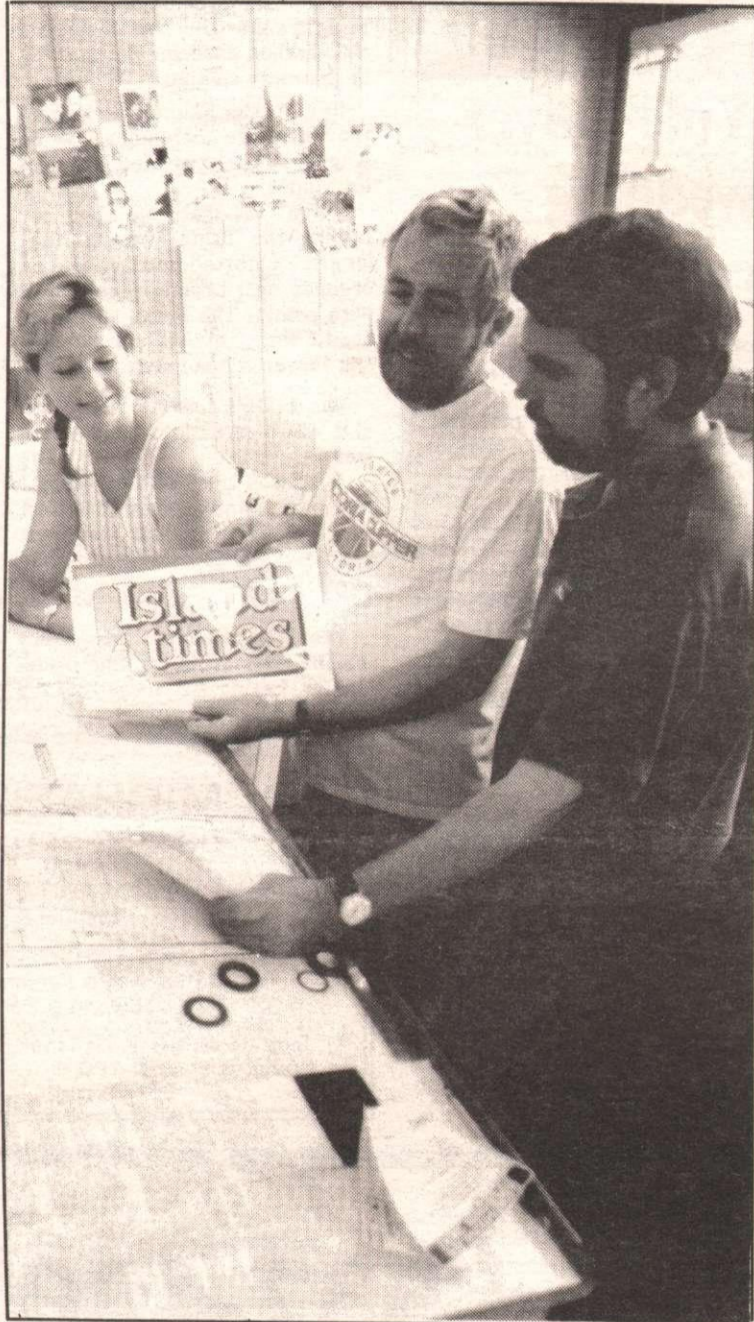
Island Times, based on the Penders, has an initial weekly press run of 2,500 copies — 2,000 of which will be delivered free to all mail boxes on the five Outer Islands. It will also be sold in island stores and on B.C. ferry runs throughout the Gulf Islands.

Publisher and editor of the new newspaper is Casey O'Connor, who has established editorial and advertising offices in the Driftwood Centre on North Pender Island. He will be aided by Barbara Pender, who will serve as assistant editor and office manager.

"It is our aim to provide a first-rate news service to the five islands, which have been prospering of late due to increased publicity in Eastern Canada and in the U.S.," O'Connor said. "Everyone senses the pressures of potential growth and the accompanying problems. Our aim will be to provide a forum to Gulf Islanders — a meeting place in print where people and ideas can come together."

O'Connor holds a master's degree in broadcast journalism and has written extensively for international sailing publications. Most recently, he has written a one-man show for folk singer Glenn Yarbrough and is in the process of completing a book focusing on Pender Island's past (*Cathedrals — A Gulf Islands Story*) and an adventure novel (*Knight of Aries*).

Barbara Pender is a daughter of South Pender Island, tracing

her ancestry back to Cornwall along with distant cousin Daniel Pender, for whom the Pender Islands are named. She is an artist and writer and is collaborating with O'Connor on *Cathedrals*. *Island Times* will work with a

staff of correspondents based on the individual islands: Basil and Kathy Benger and Alistair Ross cover South and North Galiano Island, Diana Lodge reports from Mayne Island, and Priscilla Jansen handles Saturna Island.

Court orders probation for convictions of theft

A Salt Spring Island youth pleaded guilty last week to an offence described by Judge R.E. Hudson as "troubling" and "perplexing."

Judge Hudson said it was only the letters of reference filed on behalf of the accused that convinced him a period of incarceration would not be necessary.

The 17-year-old youth, who cannot be identified under the terms of the Young Offenders Act, pleaded guilty to one count of break, enter and theft, and four counts of theft.

A co-accused in the incidents, which took place within a four-week span last November and December, appeared in court two months ago. Both youths were handed similar sentences.

The youth, who appeared before Judge Hudson this month, pleaded guilty to breaking-and-entering at a residence on Long Harbour Road. Crown Counsel Derek Lister told the court some 20 bottles of liquor were stolen, as well as beer and several other items. The youth also pleaded guilty to three counts of car stereo theft, and one count of car theft.

A \$14,500 car was also stolen from the carport of a residence, Lister said. The keys had been left on the floor. It was found three days later in a field off Stark Road. Damage to the right rear panel of the car was estimated at \$1,300.

The total value of the stolen stereo equipment was \$465.

Defense Counsel Ian Clement noted that all the incidents occurred within a four-week period. He said they coincided with a renewal in friendship with the co-accused, and were accompanied by excessive consumption of alcohol. He described the individual as "quiet" and "withdrawn," suggesting the co-accused has the dominant personality of the two.

Clement provided letters of recommendation, which he said confirm a transformation has occurred in the youth's relationship with his family and the community since last December.

He noted the youth's family, which has put him through a period of "probation," provides a steadying influence.

Concerning the offences, Clement said the car was taken in a "moment of thoughtlessness." The individuals panicked, disposing of the car almost immediately. The damage was incurred at this time, he said. He also noted that some restitution had already been made, and that some of the stolen equipment was recovered.

Judge Hudson placed the youth on two years' probation, subject to keeping the peace, abstaining from alcohol and attending school regularly. He ordered restitution of \$440, 50 hours of community work, attendance of the Coastal Challenges Outward Bound program, and a tour of the Vancouver Island Regional Correctional Centre.

At day camp

Popular activities attract children

The first two weeks of the Summer Discovery Day Camp have proven successful in a number of ways, says camp director Leah Kitchen.

country gourmet

"Take care not to overcook the fish by even 10 seconds." — Escoffier

For people like me, fishing is an excuse to go with my son down to the dock at Fulford Harbour and cast over the waters for pile perch we don't expect to catch. It's enough to stand beside him and watch the last of the sunlight falling on Mount Tuam and Mt. Bruce.

Others are more scientific. They memorize tide tables at dawn. They sit, freezing, in open boats and weight their lines with particular care to intercept the migrations of coho and pink salmon as if their livelihoods, not their dinners, were at stake.

Very rarely will you meet a person for whom fishing has acquired religious status. My friend John has devoted himself for years to the habits shy bass and cutthroat trout who live in St. Mary Lake on Salt Spring Island. I take my cooking as seriously as he does his fishing and we get together often to enjoy his catch.

The bass are best in late spring and summer, when the surface water of the lake warms up. He says the fish live nearer the surface at this time of year and feed hungrily on the morning and evening hatches of insects. He ties his own lures to imitate the insects that attract them.

A good-sized bass will run two to three pounds and can provide the centrepiece of a meal for four. The flesh is white and receives seasonings agreeably but, as with all fish, care must be taken not to overcook. Bass may be a trifle less delicate than the flesh of our cutthroat trout but it's a delight nonetheless. Prepare yours as soon as you're within range of the kitchen.

For many, even this delay is too much. Their ultimate experience is to eat them right on the shore, out of a hot frying pan, with a bottle of Reisling or Chablis cooling in the water that slaps at their feet.

How to enjoy bass? This fish is great cooked on a bed of shallots with a touch of garlic, or dredged with flour and fried in hot olive oil with a sprinkle of lemon. You can gently poach bass in a white wine sauce seasoned with thyme, oregano and coriander. Or try them Portugese style. Cut the fish along down the back and season carefully with a tablespoon or two of reduced wine. Cook them, covered, then glaze in a coating of butter and breadcrumbs. My absolute favourite, however, is to poach bass fillets, then serve each with a portion of raisin and damson wine sauce.

| 1 t celery seed | 2 T white wine |
| 1/4 t cumin, freshly ground | 1 C fish stock |
| 2 whole lovage leaves, torn in half | A little honey to taste |

In a mortar grind pepper, celeryseed and cumin. To these seasonings add lovage leaves, raisins and sliced damsons. Moisten with white wine, vinegar, olive oil and stock. Bring to a boil, then simmer for 30 minutes to reduce. If you like, sweeten with a little honey. Pour a little of this sauce over each fillet of poached bass. Serves four.

For two years I had to eat a succession of dreary dinners at an Oxford College. There was no escape from them since my scholarship paid only for the overcooked culinary objects that emerged from the grimy kitchens and, being poor, I had no money to dine properly at the many fine restaurants in the town. It was forbidden to cook in your room.

How I longed for the salmon steaks, freshly buttered corn, sweet miner's lettuce and plump oysters of my native Vancouver Island. Once the college made a mistake. They served us each a grilled trout, not freshly caught of course, and cooked a little too long. I resolved then and there to return to the west coast when my time was up and learn how to cook.

Cutthroats are best in spring and fall. In the cold months of the year they swim to the bottom of the lakes where the water, paradoxically, remains warmer, and then they are hard to interest in a lure. You can mooch (jig) or troll for them with worms. For many anglers the fight put up by these beautiful fish is a great thrill. The flesh is white or pink and I think it's among the finest tasting of all the fresh or saltwater fish.

Recipes for trout run from the simplest to the most elaborate. In the outdoors I simply fry them in olive oil over a fire of alder sticks. A sprinkle of lemon juice and a glass or two of dry white wine makes a feast that old Omar Khayyam would have loved.

Back home you can coat the fillets with breadcrumbs and fry them in butter, steam the fish on a bed of freshly picked mint (it's growing now!) with some green coriander seeds and a pinch of aniseed, or simply cover your cutthroat with tomato slices and bake in foil. Trout does very well served in an almond or pecan sauce on a bed of saffron rice, or poached in a shallot-flavoured white wine sauce and served with halved walnuts, dill and wedges of lemon.

Try brushing the fish with a thickened clam sauce and serve with just-steamed julienned zucchini and celery. If you have time, bake your trout Provencale style, stuffed with breadcrumbs, mushrooms and butter-fried shallots and parsley.

| 1 t mint | 1 t olive oil |
| 1/2 t coriander | 3 T white wine |

In a mortar grind rosemary, mint, coriander, fennelseed, pepper and celeryseed. Combine with honey, fish stock, olive oil and white wine. Bring up to the boil then simmer for 25 minutes to reduce.

This sauce is understated so as not to overcome the trout's natural flavour, but everyone's taste is different. You may wish to accent the rosemary. I once had a girlfriend named Rosemary and every time I use this fragrant herb I think of her! Serve your baked trout with honey mint sauce beside peas cooked with thyme and sweetened with a spoonful of honey. Ambrosia!

Addition requested for up-island park

MP Jim Manly (NDP, Cowichan-Malahat-The-Islands) has asked the federal government to add Carmanah Valley to Pacific Rim National Park.

Speaking in the House of Commons, Manly said every effort must be made to preserve the giant spruce trees found in the valley, which lies on the southwest coast of Vancouver Island near the West Coast Trail.

Included in the valley is a spruce tree referred to as the Carmanah Giant, which foresters believe is the tallest spruce left standing in the world.

MacMillan-Bloedel, which is preparing to harvest timber in the area, has asked the provincial government to help protect the spruce trees by setting aside 90 hectares in the valley as two separate recreation sites (see story, below). Manly, however, said in Ottawa that the entire valley, and not just a section, should be set aside and included within Pacific Rim National Park.

"If the area is not large enough," he said, "it cannot continue as a miniature ecosystem that will go on living." An exposed grove of trees, he added, would soon succumb to changes in the water table and be claimed by blow-down.

Manly said Tom McMillan, the federal environment minister, responded favourably to his suggestion that every effort be made to protect the giant spruce trees in the valley. But he said the minister stopped short of taking legal steps — such as expropriation — to safeguard the trees.

McMillan, according to Manly, said it would be "a matter of moral suasion in trying to exercise benevolent influence."

Enthusiastic support for a Carmanah Valley park has spread throughout lower Vancouver Island, Manly said. He pointed out that the valley lies within a short drive of Victoria and other centres and could develop into an attractive tourist attraction.

Sites are considered

MacMillan-Bloedel is seeking government approval to establish two recreational sites in Carmanah Valley on the southwest coast of Vancouver Island.

One site, along a creek bed halfway up the valley, covers about 90 hectares and surrounds large spruce trees. The second site is a nine-hectare property around a record spruce tree beside Pacific Rim National Park and near the mouth of Carmanah Creek.

At 95 metres tall, the record spruce — dubbed the Carmanah Giant — is believed to be the tallest in the world.

MacMillan-Bloedel said the proposed recreation sites also contain a unique trio of large spruce and some other large-diameter trees. The area itself is generally flat, making for easy strolls.

Soil scientists employed by the company are designing the site for maximum wind protection for the large trees, MB added. The Carmanah Giant is protected in a small canyon that is part of the proposed nine-hectare recreation site.

MB's application for establishment of the two recreation sites has been made under the Forest Act. The designations, if approved, would be made by B.C.'s chief forester.

Guest of honour named: NDP leader will attend

Provincial NDP leader Mike Harcourt will be the guest of honour of local New Democrats at a lamb and salmon barbecue scheduled for this weekend.

The barbecue, to be held this Sunday (July 24) at the Farmers' Institute grounds in Ganges, represents the windup of a year of activities by the Gulf Islands NDP Club. The barbecue begins at about 1 pm; those wishing to attend are advised to speak to a member of the executive before Sunday.

Besides Harcourt, the barbecue is expected to attract Lynn Hunter, who recently earned the NDP nomination for the new federal riding of Saanich-The-Islands. Jim Manly, the island's current representative in Ottawa, has also been invited to attend but organizers say the fact the House of Commons is still in session will likely keep Manly in Ottawa.

(If Manly does not attend, the club says it will honour the MP and his record of service at a future time and place.)

Entertainment at the barbecue will be provided by the Raging Grannies of Salt Spring, and by the Newman Family. Also set to appear are the Vegetable Puppets — John Turnip, Brian Baloney and Ed Broadbean (with his little Endy Peas).

Prior to the barbecue, there will be a meeting in Ganges on Saturday (July 23) for representa-

tives from all Lower Island NDP constituency organizations to draw up plans for the first of many regional conferences to be held every other year. The first in the series is set for spring, 1989.

Organizers say the barbecue will mark the close of a significant and successful year for the club. Along with regular fund-raising, internal education programs, sponsorship of an essay contest at Gulf Islands Secondary School and participation in regional affairs, the past year has seen the club make "significant contributions beyond the normal."

During the winter, for instance, NDP members on Salt Spring put together several resolutions for the annual provincial convention in Vancouver, and saw many of those resolutions given high priority and become part of provincial policy.

The resolutions included a call to require an NDP government to provide public kindergartens and pre-schools operating with flexible hours and providing food services and sleeping areas. The resolution was passed unanimously.

Also carried unanimously was a locally-introduced resolution reaffirming the right of every handicapped person in the province to vocational training and rehabilitation within the limits of their abilities to benefit from such training.

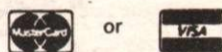

Need vision

Sir,
In my recent trip to Alaska and the Yukon, the two things all travellers seemed to share was a love of the country and concern that the weather had become so unpredictable, no matter where you were from. In Alaska, the snowfall was down from five to three feet annually; when I got to Inuvik it was the hottest day of the trip — around 80 degrees, which then promptly changed the next day to fog and cool weather. Unpredictable!

Ironically, I was travelling the same route as the naturalist John Muir, founder of the Sierra Club, took by water, past spectacular glaciers and sea life. On travelling up-island, we kept passing clearcut areas which Mac-Blo had replanted with signs *Forests Forever*; the trees were just seedlings or very thin after 16 to 20 years of growth.

On returning, a friend mentioned (and CBC reported) that the elusive hole in the ozone was actually bigger in size than the USA and extended as far as New Zealand. Connecting this with the maps of drought areas in the States and Canada, you could see what is happening. The weather changes, erratic and unpredictable as they are, must be a result of the combined CO² (greenhouse effect), the global logging (trees absorb CO²) and the decrease in the protective insulation of the ozone. This is alarming not only because of the effects on all of us, but because the industries and government have known about and not dealt with the facts sooner. They have known about, denied and explained away the CO² and ozone problem for at least 15

Rational voice

Sir,
Recently I had opportunity to attend my second public meeting in some six years, at the founding of the Island Watch Society.

My motives for joining were purely selfish. I simply wish to

protect my home on Salt Spring Island, and here was a vehicle in which to do so.

The leadership was sincere as to which direction the group was to take: it would encompass all phases of flushing out whatever is being planned for the way our home is to operate. Quite naturally it would overlap other groups.

In effect it would be an extension of the Islands Trust, which seems to be mostly put in the position of having to say 'no.' Why would that be?

Some say growth is inevitable. Here is a segment of a report put out by the United Nations population fund, which points out that while leaders are looking for arms reduction, the potential power of a runaway population explosion on our larger home and its resources, threatens another kind of mutually assured destruction. Here are some quotes from the article:

"It used to take 1,000 years for the world's population to increase by two per cent, but it now takes only ONE year. There are approximately five billion people on the Earth today, and by the end of the century — only 12 years away — the population will reach 6 billion.

"By the year 2,000, half the world's people will be living in cities — one-fifth in megacities of more than four million.

"In Latin America, 75 per cent of the population will be urbanized by the year 2000.

"In the space of just 12 years, the developing world will have to increase by 65 per cent its capacity to produce and manage its urban infra-structures, services and shelter — merely to maintain present conditions.

"With less than 25 per cent of the world's population, the developed countries are consuming 75 per cent of the world's energy, 79 per cent of its commercial fuels, 72 per cent of its steel and 85 per cent of its wood.

"In the United States and the Soviet Union there is a growing awareness that the arms race has sapped economic strength and eroded rather than reinforced political influence.

"If both superpowers can change their penchant for making mischief abroad, there is much they could do in concert to defuse the impending crisis before all the world becomes an impoverished prisoner to its own population growth."

I wonder if such an article as this is trying to tell us something right here on Salt Spring Island. Perhaps it's telling us that we must begin to get beyond the boundaries which we have imposed upon ourselves. That we cannot stop 'progress.'

I sense the opportunity for this new group to invite those who can

get beyond their personal boundaries to not go "shirt-tailing" with others who have a tendency toward leading a charge.

I noticed in the meeting the tendency toward reaction rather than response. Big difference — one produces destruction, the other assists clarification.

I would invite all islanders to take advantage of this vehicle to collectively have a rational voice in the way this island and her people change it. No one has a license to reduce the level of its natural integrity.

Fundamental

Sir,
What is the Triple E Senate? It is a fundamental change in our system of government. It is not a tinkering adjustment to an ineffective body — it is the elimination of this feeble, costly and unproductive institution, and the creation of a meaningful arm of government designed to protect regional interests.

The reformed senate would be:

- Directly elected by the people of each province in order to give it political credibility and legitimacy.
- Established on the basis of equal representation from each province, with additional provision for generous representation of the Yukon and NWT.
- Equipped with powers and procedures which would make it effective in safeguarding and enhancing regional and provincial interests.

The "fathers of Confederation" in Canada and the "Fathers of the Constitution" in the American colonies both recognized the need to create an arm of the government which would protect the regional interests of smaller states and prevent them from oppression by the larger states, and likewise assure the fair treatment of underdeveloped provinces and inhibit their exploitation by the larger provinces.

The American drafters of the

Constitution were successful. In the American Senate the two senators from Rhode Island are just as effective in looking out for the regional interests of their tiny state as are the two senators from either New York or California.

The "Canadian Fathers of Confederation" failed in their objective of creating a protection for regional interests. They failed because right from the start they compromised the principle of equal representation. Ontario and Quebec were each given 24 senators, whereas B.C., Alberta, Saskatchewan and Manitoba only have six each. Ontario and Quebec have the advantage of representation by population in the House, and they have it to some degree as well in the Senate.

The American Senate, by virtue of performing its role of protecting regional interests and by the fact that senators are elected for six years, is a highly respected institution in the U.S.

The Canadian Senate is blundering and ineffective in protecting the interests of the smaller provinces. Further, the practice of patronage appointments leaves most Canadians with the impression that the Senate is a costly institution of little relevance or value.

Liberals, Conservatives and the NDP have all given lip service to the need for Senate reform. But none of the national parties will ever make any meaningful changes in the Senate because the status quo favours Ontario and Quebec.

A Senate that truly represents regional interests will come about when the Reform Party of Canada elects enough members from the north and the west to hold the balance of power in the minority government that is sure to come.

The Reform Party presented a draft for constitutional amendment to reform the Senate of Canada to the premiers of the four Western provinces at their recent conference. It was well received because all the Premiers agree that the West wants more fairness and balance in national decision making, and the West wants more effective representation of regional and provincial interests in Parliament.
