At Vesuvius

Residents form association

A residents' association has been formed in Vesuvius Bay.

Creation of the association follows a property owner's May application to the Islands Trust for rezoning of a residential parcel in Vesuvius to commercial status. The Trust turned down the bid after a public hearing heard strong opposition voiced by other area residents.

A letter announcing formation of the residents' association, read at the July 22 Islands Trust meeting in Ganges, asked that the group be kept informed on "all matters relating to Vesuvius," and that it be allowed to provide input into decisions made by the Trust's Advisory Planning Commission (APC).

The letter was signed by area residents Roger

Coster, John Lloyd and Ernie Weihing.

The association also asked the Trust to delete the word *Vesuvius* from a paragraph in the official community plan that says smaller service centres "such as Vesuvius, Fernwood and Fulford . . . be allowed to grow and prosper as public needs arise in those areas." The paragraph, the association said, "does not reflect the wishes of the community."

In discussing the letter, the Trust noted that it has already moved to address the latter point. At its May meeting, the Trust instructed staff to prepare a bylaw removing the word *Vesuvius* from the paragraph concerning commercial growth in smaller service centres. The bylaw is currently being studied by the APC.

Preservation of residential area one of group's nine objectives

The newly-formed Vesuvius Bay residents' association has listed nine items in its statement of aims. They are as follows:

- to preserve the Vesuvius Bay area in its present development as a residential area of single-family homes;
- to oppose any further commercial development or expansion of existing establishments;
- to work with the Islands Trust to change (that portion) of the community plan which now allows commercial development in Vesuvius;
- to oppose construction of a sewer system which would make such commercial development possible;
- to oppose the construction of multi-family buildings;
- to oppose any road construction of widening which would destroy the charm of the area;
- to liaise with Parks and Recreation on any proposals concerning Vesuvius Beach;

- to represent the householders of the area in dealings with local government; and
- to liaise with the department of

highways and RCMP on matters affecting traffic in the Vesuvius area.

Referendums 'ill-conceived idea'

Charles Hingston, the president of the B.C. School Trustees Association, has described recent government comments which support the use of referendums to raise money for schools, as "the most ill-conceived idea ever raised by government."

Hingston — a Fulford Harbour resident and member of the Gulf Islands board of school trustees — said students of this province would suffer should the government move towards referendums. Referendums may seem fair and equitable, he said, but they only

offer an illusion of democracy.

"In reality they would create tremendous educational inequality. Voters in richer districts would be able to afford additional expenditures, while people in less prosperous districts wouldn't."

Hingston said that with at least three ex-education ministers in the cabinet, the Vander Zalm government should have a better understanding of how education is funded in this province. Currently, school boards receive approximately 75 per cent of their budgets from the provincial gov-

ernment. The remaining 25 per cent — which is most commonly used to provide services and programs for specific and unusual needs — is raised by school boards through residential taxes.

"At worst it's a deliberate distortion of facts," Hingston said. "Mr. Vander Zalm keeps talking about education costs being too high. Education costs are not too high: B.C. has the second lowest per-pupil costs in Canada. School district spending has risen 11 per cent since 1982,

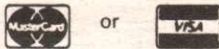

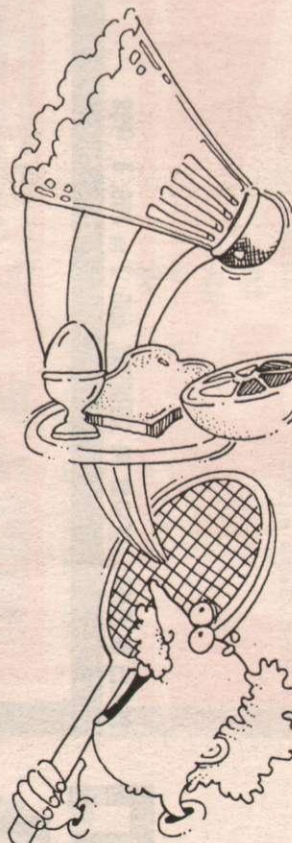

Canada Safety Council program

Farm safety improvement is theme

Statistics recently released by the Canada Safety Council indicate 104 people died in farm-related accidents in 1986. This compares with 190 fatalities in 1976 and represents a 45 per cent decrease.

Since 1973, the Canada Safety Council has sponsored, in conjunction with Agriculture Canada and provincial safety councils, public awareness campaigns to promote safer work practices on the farm. This year's theme focuses on how farmers and their families can improve the safety of their farm operation.

According to Safety Council statistics, more than 60 per cent of farm fatalities resulted from industrial type accidents, usually involving the use of agricultural machinery.

Less frequent causes of farm deaths were from firearms (7.7 per cent), poisoning or drowning (both at 6.8 per cent), suffocation or falls (both at 3.8 per cent), and other non-transport accidents (6.7 per cent).

The 1986 fatality statistics were highest in Ontario — accounting for 30 per cent of all farm deaths — followed by Saskatchewan (21 per cent), Alberta (20 per cent) and Quebec (11 per cent).

Statistics also show that more than 5,000 time-loss injuries are sustained by Canadian agricultural workers each year.

To lessen the chances of farm death or injury, the Council advises farm families take a "summer safety hike" to determine if any hazards exist on their farm. The following is a list of items to consider:

- Can any farm operations be made less hazardous by replacing a toxic chemical with a less toxic one, or by reducing noise levels, guarding machinery, improving layout, limiting exposure time to dust, vapours and excessive noise, or through the use of personal

protective equipment?

- Have all workers been adequately trained to operate each piece of equipment they use? Can they recognize operating and maintenance hazards?

- Have workers been taught everything they need to know to complete the job safely, including: hand signals; correct lifting practices; the selection, use and care of protective equipment; where smoking is permitted; the location of first aid boxes, fire extinguishers, alarms, emergency lighting and telephones?

- Are agricultural chemicals stored separately from feed, seed or other supplies where contaminated material could present a hazard? All chemicals and medicines should be stored in their original containers with a legible label and out of the reach of children, animals and visitors.

- Have all tripping and falling hazards — such as tools and equipment — been removed from work areas? Is there an accumulation of rubbish or debris which could feed a fire or block an exit?

- Do you follow maintenance recommendations made by machine manufacturers? Are all shield and guards in place and in good condition? Failure to replace shielding after it is removed for maintenance is a common source of amputation, the council indicates.

- Do you conduct regular safety checks, considering fields, animal facilities, grain and silage storage areas, workshops, equipment and equipment, fuel and chemical storage areas? Take note of any areas which could lead to accident or injury: repair those areas, post caution or instruction signs, or use personal protective equipment where necessary.

The Canada Safety Council recommends a number of areas which need personal protective equipment, noting that agricul-

tural injuries involve all parts of the body. It suggests head equipment should be worn at all times; and eye equipment when handling and applying pesticides and

ammonia, hand and power tool work, harvesting, spray painting, welding, applying fertilizer, haying or any job involving dust.

Three accidents reported

Local RCMP attended three major accidents last week.

A single-vehicle accident July 24 sent a Nanaimo driver and passenger to Lady Minto Hospital, where they were treated for minor injuries.

The accident took place at 8:30 pm as Terry Loyd Pridge drove southbound on Fulford-Ganges Road. The driver lost control and spun off the side of the road, striking a power pole. Pridge's 1977 Ford pick-up sustained some \$3,000 in damages.

A second single-vehicle accident took place on Galiano Island when the engine of a rented car stopped, causing loss of the vehicle's power steering.

Trail resident David Vannucci was proceeding south on Sturdies Bay Road when the engine quit. The vehicle crossed the road and

struck a rail guard, causing \$1,000 damage.

A Ganges woman was taken to Lady Minto Hospital following a motor vehicle accident on Fulford-Ganges Road July 28.

The accident occurred when the driver of one vehicle, Frank Alex Sutherland, 58, struck the rear end of a vehicle driven by Charel Tara, 29. Total damage sustained by the two vehicles amounted to \$4,500.

Sutherland has been charged with driving without due care and attention.

School funding referendums described as 'dangerous step'

but the tax shell game being played by the provincial government has forced residential taxes to rise 77 per cent. It's not a spending problem: it's a tax problem and the problem has been caused by government, not by school boards."

Hingston described the use of referendums to fund services as a dangerous step.

"Realistically, how many people are likely to vote yes to tax increases? Experience elsewhere shows that by the time people really see the need to voluntarily pay taxes, health services are in such a state of decline that people are dying, students are ignorant, and the roads are broken."

Hingston went on to describe a precedent which "proves" the folly of referendums. Proposition 13, which was passed 10 years ago in California, effectively cut property taxes in half. The law was an example of a grassroots procedure which let voters bypass elected legislatures and draft populist laws, force referendums and even impeach elected officials.

Proposition 13 enjoyed popular support from overtaxed voters and ignited a national anti-tax crusade. Since then, taxpayers have saved \$228 billion in reduced property taxes. The state, however, has been saddled with a \$2 billion U.S. revenue deficit. In addition, hospitals and libraries have shut down, prisoners are being released early from prison and the freeway system is quickly deteriorating.

One Californian university professor says schools have deteriorated to such a point "that no parent who can afford to send his or her children to a private school, even considers the public schools."

Spending limits imposed by ballot initiatives can only be

overridden by another initiative which at the very earliest, cannot be placed on the ballot until 1990.

"You simply can't run government by referendums," Hingston said. "Long-term planning becomes impossible because you'd never know what budget level would be approved from year to year."

Referendums are also expensive, he noted: U.S. boards spend millions of dollars to explain why funding increases are necessary. It would be difficult to adequately inform residents of this province about needs such as those in special education:

"Most people have no contact with learning-disabled children and lack an appreciation of the types of assistance that are required to help these students become productive citizens. Referendums would result in dramatic cuts to programs for special

needs students and minorities."

Hingston said approximately \$150 million is raised by school boards to pay for educational services beyond what is provided by government. "We estimate that going to referendum would effectively remove that amount of money from school budgets because history demonstrates that people don't approve tax increases if they can't see that they will receive direct benefits.

"This is the most ill-conceived idea ever raised by this government. We can only hope people can see it for what it is — the antithesis of democracy. Parents in B.C. are a minority and children are unable to vote. People who care about the future of B.C.'s young people and who recognize the social and economic contributions that flow from education, should tell the government the education referendum is totally unacceptable."

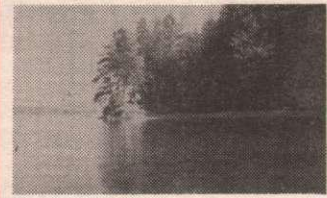

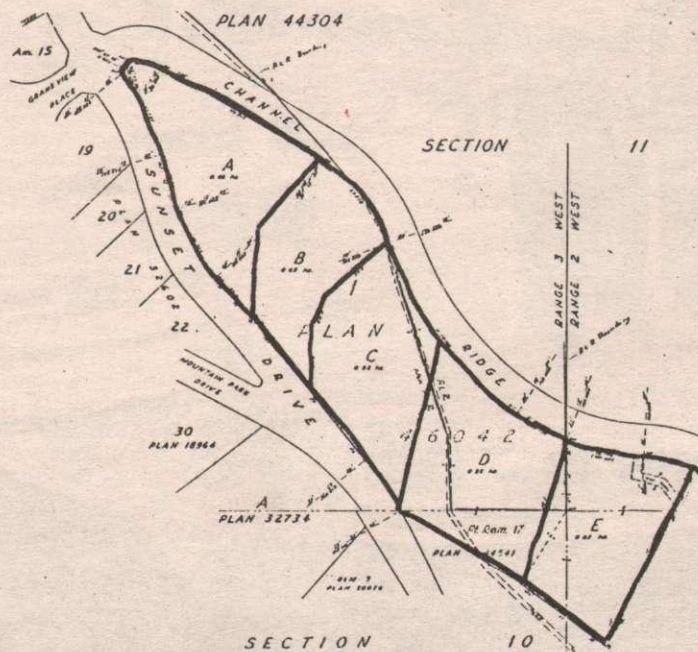
