It's a special sign for a special place, individuals at the Salt Spring Island Community Centre agree.

The rainbow-coloured sign, created and donated to the Community Centre by Warren Langley, was erected on Ganges Hill last Thursday. It announces the Community Centre's locale and displays its new logo in brilliant red.

"We are definitely thrilled with the sign and the logo," said Community Centre director Barbara Jordan-Knox.

The logo shows three people linked with "hearts," indicating

the centre's care for the community, Jordan-Knox said. A roof over the characters' heads represents the umbrella position the Community Centre holds for services on the island.

Jordan-Knox said the Community Centre appreciates Langley's "generous contribution." She also noted that Langley acted as a consultant for the interior and exterior colour scheme at the centre's Community Clothing and Crafts store in the Ganges village.

Langley, who is also donating a sign to Centennial Park, said he appreciates what the community of Salt Spring has done for him.

Islanders earn recognition as 'Heart of Gold' citizens

Almost 30 local residents will be feted next week for their "hearts of gold."

The individuals, nominated by other islanders during the four-month-long Heart of Gold campaign, will be honoured at a wine and cheese reception at the Harbour House September 22. The nominees will be presented with certificates and pins at the reception, which is being staged by *Gulf Islands Driftwood*. A selection committee in Vancouver is in the process of creating a short list of nominees deserving of additional recognition. They will be invited to a regional presentation scheduled for this fall.

More than 5,600 nominations were received in the program, which was jointly run by Air Canada and the Canadian Community Newspapers Association (CCNA). The purpose of the campaign was to "recognize the contributions of many Canadians in helping others and improving the quality of life in their communities."

Nominations in the Gulf Islands included:

- **Bob Akerman:** Bob has been a participant, supporter and organizer of sporting events on Salt Spring for most of his life. He contributed much time helping with the reconstruction of the Fulford Community Hall; at the age of 17, he became a member of the Fulford Athletic Club, serving as the group's secretary until 1972. In 1962, Bob made the Fulford Ball Park available to the community. This piece of land is still used by Salt Spring ball players.

- **Bob Appleton:** Bob is actively involved in a number of activities which indicate his awareness of, and willingness to help the needs of others. Bob contributes much to the community by assuming responsibilities for activities such as Santa's Workshop at Christmas and the Community Centre's Sea Capers float.

- **Betty Ball:** Betty has "tremendous" organizational skills and offers her talents to many groups on the island. She is particularly talented at implementing short-term projects with specific goals, which assist numerous people throughout the community, both directly and indirectly.

- **Susan Bradford:** Susan generously gives time in her commitment to assist people in need. She has run an auction to raise money

for the Food Bank, operated a second-hand clothing store on a volunteer basis, been involved with planning on Salt Spring Island and has a strong commitment to community service.

- **Pat Desbottes:** Pat has been instrumental in the founding of a hospice group on Salt Spring Island. She not only organizes training courses for new volunteers, but also runs continuing support meetings for those involved and is intimately concerned in the well-being of both patients and workers.

- **Lee Evans:** Lee donates many

hours helping others in the community. She volunteers work with handicapped adults in special learning programs at the Community Centre. She is also a leader in her church, providing direction for, and an understanding of those in need at home and internationally.

- **Daniel Evanishen:** Daniel has shown many acts of kindness — public and private — to people of all ages on Salt Spring. With his "mischievous smile...dreadful jokes and his many acts of kindness and insanity" he has

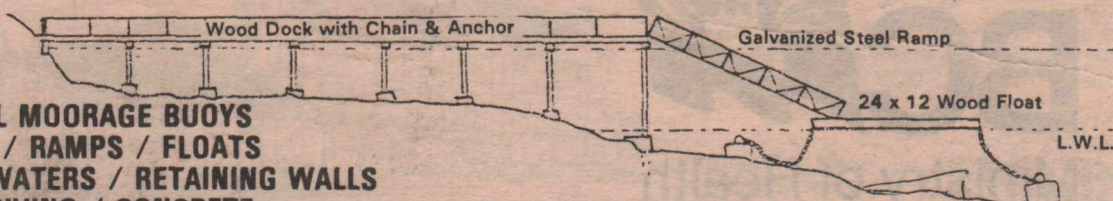

Forest firm rejects moratorium request

GALIANO ISLAND — MacMillan-Bloedel has rejected a Clear Cut Alternatives (CCA) request for an immediate moratorium on all logging on the island.

The rejection was made September 2 when representatives of both parties met on Galiano. A second meeting was set for Monday, September 12.

For the September 2 session, CCA presented a position paper based on a 1987 report of the National Task Force on the Environment and Economy, to which MB and Noranda president Adam Zimmerman is a signatory. Co-

pies of the paper had earlier been sent to MB and Noranda.

CCA said the findings of the report were directly applicable to the situation on Galiano, and suggested government, industry and the community develop an integrated approach to solving the economic problems posed by the impact of industry on the environment.

CCA also said it felt it made some progress in achieving an agreement in principle for a committee to be struck to explore a variety of options for the use of MB's 3,000-hectare Galiano holdings.

MB's Bruce Francis agreed to take the proposal to higher management. MLA Terry Huberts, minister of state for the coastal

region, previously agreed to investigate the provincial government's reaction to such a proposal. A representative from Huberts' office attended the September 2 meeting.

In proposing a moratorium, CCA said it felt its proposal should be considered by all three parties before cutting resumed.

MB executives took the posi-

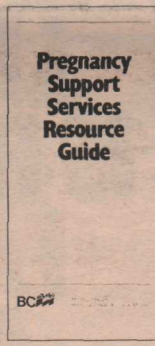
tion that the company's 1988-89 logging plan had already attempted to take into account the community's concerns, as expressed at earlier public meetings and in questionnaires circulated in the community. They added that commitments had been made and logging contracts signed, making changes unacceptable at this point.

MB's 1988-89 plan call for cutting of five 20-acre blocks on the west side of Galiano, and four 30-acre blocks on the island's east side.

CRD report projects growth in AIDS cases

A report to the Capital Regional District (CRD) community health committee estimates as many as 500 people in the regional district could develop AIDS (Acquired Immune Deficiency Syndrome) within the next decade.

Although only 21 cases of AIDS have occurred in the CRD to date, the report estimates between 210 and 500 people are currently infected with HIV (Human Immunodeficiency Virus) — the virus which causes AIDS. One-third of these individuals can be expected to develop AIDS within

the next five years, and possibly all of them after a longer period. The average incubation period from HIV infection to clinical AIDS is now thought to be eight years.)

In Canada, British Columbia has the highest rates of infection and disease per capita: 20.3 per cent of AIDS cases have occurred here. While 80 per cent of the 368 cases have occurred in Vancouver, there have been 21 cases in the CRD.

As the report states, all CRD cases have occurred in adult

males, with the following risk factor distribution: homosexual/bisexual, 17; homosexual and I.V. drug user, 2; blood transfusion recipient, 1; heterosexual high risk contact, 1. Eleven of the cases occurred in the 30 to 39 age group, eight in the 40 to 49 group, and one in each of the 50 to 59 and over 60 age groups.

The CRD operates an AIDS testing and evaluation clinic on Cook Street in Victoria. Between July 1987 and May 1988, it saw 439 clients, seven of whom tested antibody-positive.

Dealing with AIDS has federal, provincial and municipal planning components. On the municipal level, the CRD has created the clinic and developed a close liaison with local school boards and physicians. CRD physicians and nurses present educational sessions on AIDS and HIV to a variety of audiences, the report says.

The CRD has also provided funding for creation of a comic book for use by local street kids and other high risk populations.

Following are several recom-

mendations made by the report concerning future AIDS and HIV care within the CRD:

- That the medical health officer work with the health care community and the provincial government to ensure an adequate number of health care professionals are available for increasing numbers of HIV patients.
- That the CRD share the report with the hospital planning group and assist it with organizing services and providing medical care for individuals with HIV infection in Victoria.

Adopting a Special-Needs or Older Child:

There are many people in British Columbia who have been waiting a long time to adopt a baby. At the same time, there are many special-needs and older children waiting for adoption.

In order to help unite more of these children and parents, your Government is providing new information and support services because we recognize that successful adoption is not an easy task.

Adopting an older or a special-needs child is a major decision for a family to make. It requires an informed decision based upon the strength of the family and the particular needs of each child.

Special-needs children include some with physical or mental handicaps, learning disabilities, developmental delays, or who may have been abused. In addition to providing a stable home, families may need to obtain therapy, counselling, rehabilitation services or special equipment to help children deal with medical problems.

In Vancouver and Prince George there are adoption projects in place supported by staff specially trained in assisting potential parents in making the best decision, and to help them meet the challenges of older and special-needs children.

Wendel is the third police sergeant to take up the position this summer. Sgt. Jim Kirk arrived a few months ago to hold the fort until Wendel arrived. Kirk went on holidays and was replaced for two weeks by yet another sergeant.

Wendel, who has moved with his family from Falkland, B.C. says he is looking forward to working on Salt Spring. Prior to spending some 26 months in Falkland, Wendel undertook 10 years of police work in Chilliwack. He also brings experience from Fort Saskatchewan, Alberta, and North Vancouver.

Wendel says he and his family feel fortunate to come to Salt Spring. He plans to provide the community with "a very good and professional police service."

Arson suspected as cause of blaze

Local RCMP say the cause of a September 9 house fire on Park Drive has not been determined, but circumstances surrounding the blaze are suspicious and an investigation has been launched.

The fire, which gutted two rooms and damaged the remainder of a house belonging to Margaret Cates, occurred at approximately 7:20 pm on September 9.

The Salt Spring Island Volunteer Fire Department attended the scene with a pumper truck and two tankers. Fire Chief Les Wagg said fire-fighters had the blaze under control within 10 minutes.

The house was unoccupied at the time, and the fire was reported by a neighbour.

Wagg said the amount of damage to the home has not yet been determined, but he indicated the house was insured.

In the meantime, police are seeking the driver of a pickup truck who was forced to brake for a pedestrian on Park Drive at approximately 7:20 the same evening.

Collision sends two to hospital

Charges are pending following a motor vehicle accident which sent two people to hospital with minor injuries and caused \$2,500 in damages.

The accident occurred at 11:50 pm on September 9, at the corner of Rainbow and Lower Ganges roads.

The driver of one vehicle, Troy Michael Logan, 18, of Salt Spring was halted at a stop sign when driver of the second vehicle — a 17-year-old from Brentwood Bay — reportedly crashed into the back-end of the first car.

Police are continuing their investigation into the matter and say charges are being considered.

In other police matters, a local man is offering a reward for the recovery of his poodle, which was stolen from his vehicle Sunday.

William Buckler is offering \$50 for the recovery of his apricot-coloured "toy" poodle. The seven-month-old puppy, which was wearing a pink collar, was apparently taken from the front of a pick-up truck in the Ganges Village Market parking lot.

Buckler is offering \$50 for the return of the dog.

A "fairly large" diesel spill on Fulford-Ganges Road closed down the throughfare last week.

Local police attended the scene to aid the Salt Spring Island Volunteer Fire Department in a mop-up. Police are unsure of the origin of the spill, which took place September 7 at approximately 9 pm.

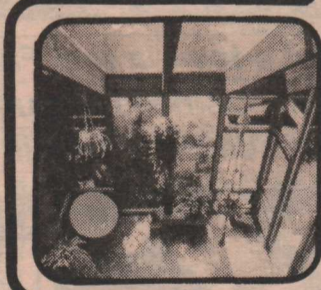

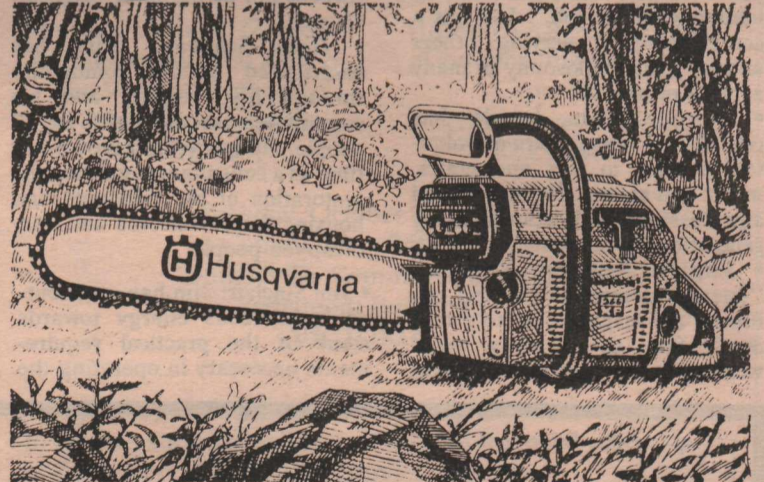

Twenty-five years ago

• All four political parties had nominated candidates in the Nanaimo and the Islands riding to run in the provincial election September 30.

The Honorable Earle Westwood was nominated by acclamation for the Social Credit party; the Liberals elected Robert C. Weir to run; the New Democrats chose David Stupich; and the Conservatives elected Mrs. Cornelius Wildman.

• Highlights from a recent school board meeting indicated the Salt Spring Island kindergarten classes would be moved to Mahon Hall. This move would take advantage of nearby playgrounds, and lessen the traffic hazard.

The school board also announced that further action on a referendum for improved school facilities would be delayed until January 1964.

• A meeting of the Pirate Days Central Committee unanimously endorsed a recommendation to the Salt Spring Island Chamber of Commerce to continue with Pirate Days for 1964. The event, held August 9 to 11, had succeeded in bringing people to the island, but in spite of the crowds, no trouble occurred.

Twenty years ago

• The New Democrats named their candidate for a by-election in the federal Nanaimo-Cowichan-The Islands seat.

The by-election, which resulted from the death of incumbent Colin Cameron, would see NDP National Leader Tommy Douglas fighting for the seat.

Group of Salt Spring Island residents had called for a public meeting to discuss the issue of future sewage disposal on the island.

The provincial government's pollution control board had recently accepted two proposals to discharge sewage into the sea around the Gulf Islands. Rumour had it that there were 20 more developments coming up for similar applications.

Fifteen years ago

• A \$105,400 extension to the firehall in Ganges had been approved by the trustees of the Salt Spring Island Fire Protection District.

The need for adding to the hall at Ganges resulted from the

greatly increased number of homes on the island. The fire district had also purchased a second pumper.

• The school bus driver at Galiano was busy trying to fit a quart into a pint pot.

The school bus at Galiano had a capacity of 18 students, but the number of students requiring transportation had jumped to 23. Until a bus of sufficient capacity was obtained, the present bus would have to make double runs.

• Canada's newspapers had been rationed on newsprint, and the ration was already less than past needs.

Suppliers of newsprint had stated that production was unable to meet demand, and that all newspapers must cut back on consumption. The ultimate effect on *Driftwood* and other small newspapers had not yet been assessed.

Ten years ago

• An oil slick in Ganges Harbour had not been traced. The slick, which spread over a fair area of the harbour, could not be attributed to leakage from known oil storage units. Authorities decided it must have come from the bilges of some boat.

• Progress was holding steady at Fernwood School.

Trustees of the Gulf Islands School District were informed that the roof was on the new school, and the drywall crews had begun work.

• Food specials offered at the Gulf Islands Trading Company looked like this: 48 oz. tin of tomato juice, 69 cents; 24 oz. bottle of Crisco Oil, \$1.19; 19 oz. tin of pineapple, 2/\$1.00; 12 oz. tin of

corned beef, 99 cents; mushroom soup, 3/89 cents; bar soap, two packages of two for 69 cents; pork loins, \$1.79 lb; smoked picnic hams, 89 cents lb.; Devon side bacon, \$1.89 lb.

• The Gulf Islands School District was looking at school sites in the southern area of Salt Spring Island.

Trustees agreed that classroom size on Salt Spring Island was going to be at a premium, even with the completion of the new Fernwood School.

Five years ago

• Plans were proceeding for the Fulford school although the Gulf Islands School Board had yet to purchase another site for the facility.

The school trustees held an option to purchase a five-acre site on Southridge Road, but were exercising caution in the move, and awaiting ministry of education approval.

• Two Salt Spring Island fishermen were rescued after their boat sank in Queen Charlotte Sound. Bruce Hildred, owner and operator of the packer *Stromross*, and brother Rolf were picked up by a tug at 6:30 am, about an hour after their boat sank.

• Gulf Islands school enrolment was now ahead of ministry of education forecasts for September of the following year.

Preliminary figures indicated that enrolment for the entire region was up 2.4 per cent. Registrations in the Outer Gulf Islands were down, but all Salt Spring Island schools had more students. Fernwood School had increased by 12 per cent.

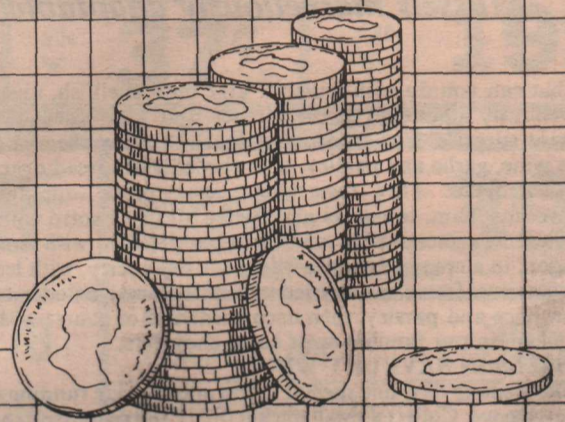

*While you gorged on oysters
I cut my lips on a mussel shell.*

Martial

The ancient Romans gave them a bad press, as if it was somehow their fault for not being born oysters, and Shakespeare made it worse by calling his character Simple a "muscle-shell" because he stood with his mouth open and looked like this cooked mollusc. Perhaps mussels suffer from comparison because their shells are not creamy white like those of many oysters, clams, cockles and scallops. They also wear beards (actually, the brownish threads by which they attach themselves to things) and this makes some people suspicious of their motives.

Identification? That's simple, too. The wild *mytilus edulis*, which is only Latin for "edible mussel," is intertidal, has a mostly smooth blue-black or brown-black shell, and rarely exceeds six cm. in length. You can find it mostly in sheltered waters and bays along the eastern coasts of Vancouver Island and on the Gulf Islands. Or you can cheat and buy them, tinned, at the store.

Mussels marvellously adaptable

What can you do with mussels? Like most shellfish, mussels are marvellously adaptable in the kitchen and their sweet taste is a pleasant surprise. For an exciting snack, I enjoy them cooked in white wine, garlic and parsley, then shelled and spread over a piece of fried bread. They taste great as a pizza topping beside mushrooms, ham, tomatoes and cheese, or in a risotto with butter and grated Parmesan. Try mussels in potato salad with lemon and tarragon, in a creamed soup with a little dry sherry, with leeks and tomatoes over fettuccine, curried with onions, marinated in olive oil, lemon juice and parsley, then deep fried, and of course with clams and bacon in our familiar west coast chowders.

MUSSELS IN SAVOURY WINE

Take a sunny day, one special friend and the tide running down a sheltered cove. Collect a small bucket full of edible mussels then rush back to the kitchen and assemble:

- About 4 cups mussels in the shell
- 1 C mussel stock, strained, or fish stock
- 2 T chives
- 1/4 t cumin
- 1/2 t summer savory
- 1/4 C dry white wine, reserving the bottle for later

Clean the mussels and trim the beards. Cook them until the shells open. Drain and set aside. Now take fish stock, or mussel stock drained through a fine sieve, and add chopped chives, ground cumin, summer savory and the wine. Pour the sauce over the mussels and simmer together for 15 minutes. Shell the mussels and dip them in the sauce as you enjoy them with your companion. Drink the rest of the wine.

Versatility of local shellfish

One of the qualities I especially admire in our local shellfish is versatility. The definite, meaty yet not particularly marine, flavour of freshly gathered mussels lends itself to dishes that are right across the strait from our cream soups, chowders and seafood salads. Consider, for example, making sausages from mussel forcemeats. What an inventive and creative change from the usual pork links! And you cook them in exactly the same way: sauteed in olive oil in a covered pan. Or shape the seasoned, minced shellfish into patties with a little chopped onion and grill into musselburgers.

For something really special but a little more difficult to make, prepare the sausages with grated almonds or pine nuts. Brown in a little olive oil then slice into a double crust apple pie seasoned with cinnamon and ginger. Bake and serve, when cooled, in small slices as an appetizing first course to a formal dinner beside a glass of your favourite, chilled dry white wine. It's a culinary knockout!

MUSSEL FORCEMEAT SAUSAGE FOR TWO

- 1/4 lb. minced mussels
- 1/2 t ground pepper
- 1 t celeryseed
- 1/2 t cumin
- a pinch of fennel
- 1 raw egg
- 1 C bread crumbs
- casings
- 2 T olive oil

In a mortar grind together pepper, celeryseed, cumin and fennel. Mix with the mussel forcemeats and bind with well-beaten egg and bread crumbs. Stuff into sausage casings and saute, covered, over a low heat for 20 minutes in olive oil.

Student number higher

Fulltime student enrolment in the Gulf Island School District has increased by close to five per cent this year, but is slightly less than the "optimistic" ministry of education predictions.

A total of 1,376 children are enrolled from kindergarten to Grade 12 in Gulf Island Schools. Calculating kindergarten students at half-time, the total is 1,317.5 fulltime students, compared to 1,256 last year.

On Salt Spring Island, all three elementary schools have experienced increases in students at the Grades One to Seven level. Salt Spring Elementary's total for 1988 is less than the 1987 total, due to a drop in kindergarten students.

A total 204 students at Fulford Elementary breaks down into 23 kindergarten students and 181 elementary students. This compares to a total of 183 children in 1987, including 21 attending kindergarten and 162 in other classes.

At Fernwood Elementary the total number of students has jumped from 195 to 220. This year's figure includes 23 kindergarten students (28 in 1987) and 197 elementary students (167 last year).

A total of 320 children are attending Salt Spring Elementary (40 and 280), compared to 195 (48 and 279) in 1987.

Early figures for the high school indicated enrolment at Gulf Islands Secondary was down substantially. Since the first day of school, however, the numbers have come back up, and predictions are the school will cater to approximately the same number as last year (370).

Ministry of education predictions, described as "optimistic" by local Schools Superintendent Mike Marshall, anticipated a total of 877 elementary students, compared to the actual 862, and 405 high school students, compared to 399.

Trust sees zoning as clamming problem cure

Local authority over land-use should be recognized by the federal government as a means to control commercial clam digging on island beaches, the Islands Trust says.

Meeting as a council last weekend on Gambier, trustees from the 13 major islands within the Trust adopted a three-point proposal on clamming policy put forward by Barry Kurland of Lasqueti, chairman of the Trust's coastal resource management committee.

The proposal asks that the federal government recognize, in matters of commercial clam digging, that the practice is a matter of commercial land use within the jurisdiction of local zoning by-laws; that it assist the Trust in identifying suitable sites for commercial clam digging; and that the Trust requests closure of all commercial harvesting in areas not zoned for commercial use.

"The underlying principle is sound," noted Jim Campbell of Saturna, "but to get the federal government and the province to accept this will not be easy. But it's a first step, to see if we can get them to co-operate."

A joint committee made up of federal and provincial government representatives has been holding meetings in the region to hear public concerns about the recent increase in commercial clam digging activity, and to hear suggestions for regulatory controls.

Among the proposals put forward by the committee are provisions for a system to licence commercial diggers, and a call to restrict some beaches to recreational harvesting only.

Kurland disagreed with the latter point, saying he would prefer to see beaches designated for commercial harvest, not the other way around. He also pointed out that since the Trust has the authority to zone land for commercial purposes, and has the power to zone offshore areas, it should be able to zone beaches for harvest.

Recommendations put forward by Kurland were:

- that the federal-provincial committee investigating commercial digging work as quickly as possible to rectify the problems created;
- that a new licence be issued to replace the existing licence, which does not distinguish between clams and fish;
- that commercial diggers be licensed in the same manner as commercial fishermen;
- that harvest limits be set for some areas to control the amount of clams that can be taken, not just the size of the clams that can be harvested;
- that enough fisheries enforcement officers be provided to match the increase in diggers;
- that commercial-only digging areas be established according to local zoning regulations;
- that beaches designated for commercial use be rotated periodically to ensure the clam resource is not threatened; and
- that a toll-free number for reporting of violations be better advertised.

Chairman Nick Gilbert of Salt Spring said that by adopting Kurland's recommendations and the accompanying three-point proposal, the Trust would be "steering" the federal government towards identifying beaches suitable for commercial and recreational use.

"We would like the federal

government to recognize our right to zone the beaches, to get us around the heavy harvesting and the accompanying impact on up-land owners and tourists," he said. "The federal government's authority supersedes ours, but we

would like them to recognize our role."

Kurland added: "The whole idea is to gain some local control. Let the federal government apply for the zoning and come up with the criteria to justify it."

Kurland was to meet earlier this week with a representative of the federal-provincial committee, which may agree to open its membership to an Islands Trust representative.

Two wall maps of the Trust

area were posted at the Gambier meeting. Trustees were asked to mark one according to beaches they felt were suitable for recreational clamming, and the other for beaches best left for commercial digging.

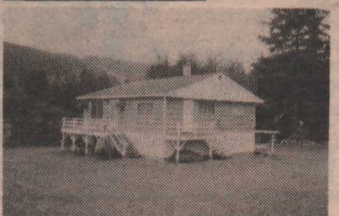

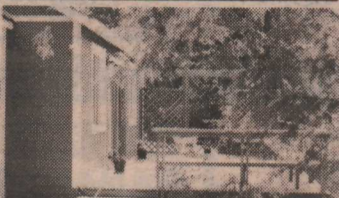

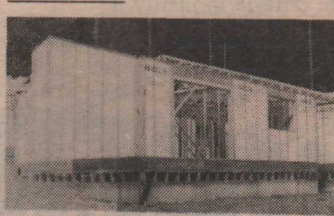
