

Locals benefit from United Way campaign

Two significant developments were completed in the Salt Spring Island community during the past year and, while they are not high profile projects, they are a manifestation of the compassion and generosity of the people who live on the island, for without their continued support they could not have evolved.

The projects — the purchase and staffing of a home for mentally handicapped adults, with an attached woodworking shop, and the opening of the Community Clothing and Craft Store in the Ganges core area — are just a part of the continued contribution the Salt Spring Community Society makes to the enriching and rounding out of the community.

This month, the Community Society is into its second year of association with the United Way of

Greater Victoria. Last year the society received a grant of \$23,000 from the UW which enabled it to add two much-needed members to its permanent staff. "We will need at least that much again this year so that we will be able to sustain the two new staff positions," said Executive Director Barbara Jordan-Knox.

"Hopefully the grant will be increased so that the extra funds can be directed into one or more of our ongoing programs," she added. "It all depends on the results of the annual campaign for funds which was launched last Thursday in Victoria."

Local campaign chairman Arvid Chalmers, who attended the opening of the campaign in Victoria, said the overall objective is \$2.7 million, "which is an increase of about 35 per cent over last year's final results."

Locally, in addition to placing a solicitation insert in the October 12 issue of *Driftwood* and the mailing of personal appeal letters to 1,100 residents of the island, Chalmers has organized a program whereby representatives of many local businesses and institutions will be asked to canvass fellow staff members within their businesses.

Chalmers pointed out that all

funds solicited on the island go directly to the Victoria campaign office and it is not possible to segregate that amount contributed from any one area such as Salt Spring. "However," he said, "we would like to try to attain an amount that would be a significant portion of the ultimate grant the Community Society will receive, if not the full amount."

A third new project of the Community Society will be getting underway in the high school next month after being more than a year in the development stage. It is a peer counselling program for teenagers, involving extra-

curricular classes held once a week under the guidance of Anne Marshall, a trained counsellor. The program is a result of the students' successful effort to form a 10-member youth council. It subsequently asked for and received an adult advisory team consisting of representatives of a variety of relevant organizations on the island.

The home for mentally retarded adults, referred to earlier, is located on McGoldrich Place. Currently, it provides a home and personal care for four persons on a 24-hour basis. The residence has a staff of nine trained personnel headed by Ed Hoover, as well as four part-time workers. They also work with other handicapped people on the island.

The island nations of Papua New Guinea and Vanuatu are developing their deepwater fishing industries for local consumption. CUSO, the Canadian non-governmental development agency, is assisting by supplying: FISHERIES OFFICERS AND BOATBUILDERS

The objectives are to train people in the operation of a small-scale self-sufficient business. Islanders to meet with corporation

A meeting between Salt Spring Islanders and B.C. Ferry Corporation officials is in the works.

Transportation Committee chairman Dan Evanishen said last week the corporation has agreed to a meeting on Salt Spring to discuss problems with local delivery of ferry service and what plans the corporation has for improvements.

The meeting will be held October 19 in the Activity Centre at Salt Spring Elementary School. It is timed to follow a corporation board of directors meeting set for mid-October.

The Transportation Committee has been seeking to arrange a

public meeting with local residents and corporation officials since late last year, when a meeting called to discuss the rumoured construction of a new terminal at Isabella Point drew islanders but no representatives from the corporation.

"We've been wanting them to come over and tell us what they're doing, and they've decided to come," Evanishen said. "It's taken them this long, but they're coming."

Although the agenda for the meeting has yet to be settled, Evanishen indicated it was a minor point. "I'm sure people will have a million questions, no matter what's on the agenda."

Trust reserve concept will be put to province

The provincial government will be approached to discuss the setting aside of Crown land on the Trust islands as reserves for future community use.

"Some form of reserve is needed to protect Crown lands for future use, until they are needed," Trust vice-chairman Carol Martin told the September 9-10 Trust Council meeting on Gambier.

The suggestion was prompted by a provincial government decision to review the status of Crown lands in the region, most notably on Denman and Salt Spring islands. Lands now set aside for future recreational or other community uses may be opened to other activities such as resource extraction, council was told.

On Denman, a piece of Crown land marked in the community plan for future recreations use was removed by the province; on Salt Spring, a similar move has been hinted for Block 42 on the south end of the island.

Martin said a mechanism is needed to let communities identify those Crown lands it expects will be most needed for future recreational use, and to have those parcels set aside until the community can apply community can apply for their use.

Chairman Nick Gilbert said the Trust should approach the provincial government to see if it would allow the Trust to identify reserves for future use.

"It would be like putting a flag on a map, giving the Trust the right of first refusal," Martin said.

Council endorsed the suggestion, giving the general trustees leave to discuss the concept of Trust reserves with the provincial government.

Man remains in custody for pre-sentence report

A Ganges man is being held in custody until a pre-sentence report has been completed.

Steven Konig, 18 and of no fixed address, will be sentenced in Ganges provincial court on September 26. Last week, Konig pleaded guilty to an August 10 break, enter and theft at Luigi's Restaurant in Ganges. The incident occurred while Konig was on probation.

Konig was eligible to be released from custody on a \$1,000 surety; however, no one was willing to provide it.

Crown Counsel Derek Lister told the court the offence occurred when Konig and a co-accused stole alcohol and food from the restaurant. The accused attempted to enter Luigi's through a bathroom window, only to find the door to the restaurant was barricaded. The individuals then broke in through a rear door.

The offence occurred at approximately 11 pm, and the accused had been drinking since 5 pm.

Among the items stolen was a quantity of beer and wine. As Lister noted, one of the terms of Konig's probation was a period of abstinence from alcohol.

The pair then spent most of the night in Mouat's Park, where a

bottle was found. Konig's fingerprints were lifted from the point of entry, Lister told the court.

Defence Counsel Mayland McKimm told the court Konig has lived on Salt Spring for seven years and has had employment with his father splitting and delivering firewood. McKimm said Konig feels his father did not pay the surety, because he felt it was time Konig had "a lesson" in jail. McKimm also said Konig is aware he has an alcohol problem.

McKimm asked the court to consider Konig's time spent in jail — just over one month — as "dead time," or time towards his sentence. McKimm suggested the court release Konig and place him on probation for the offence.

Lister argued that probation obviously had not worked, and suggested the court receive a pre-sentence report before sentencing takes place.

Judge R.E. Hudson said breaking and entering into commercial places on Salt Spring Island cannot be treated lightly, nor excused as the result of an alcohol problem.

"There has to be some penalty," he said.

Judge Hudson requested a pre-sentence report and will hand down a decision September 26.

There are MPs of all parties who are opposed to this outrage, but they are silenced by their political leaders, because none of the parties will risk offending Quebec, since Quebec support is necessary to form a government.

Since leaving things unsaid is just as dishonest as an outright lie, could you be happy supporting any one of the parties — Conservative, Liberal or NDP —

who all stand accused of perpetrating this deception?

The Reform Party of Canada is the only party that takes a clear stand on both of these important issues; strongly supporting the free trade agreement and definitely opposed to the Meech Lake accord.

The disaster for Canada of adoption of the Meech Lake accord would arise for two reasons: it would give Canada the most rigid Constitution of any country in the free world, in that it requires unanimity of all 10 provinces for any constitutional amendment, rendering change almost impossible; and it would become hopeless to effect any meaningful change in that virtually useless body, the Senate.

Plans for the development of a park at Long Harbour were well underway. An artist's conception of the new park site showed a terraced picnic site above the ferry parking area, a lookout and a beach site.

The site was planned to take advantage of the natural setting with the tables, buildings and retaining walls created to blend in with the natural scene.

Following an investigation of dormitory arrangements in Prince George and Quesnel, the Gulf Islands School Board decided the old hospital building on Ganges Hill would meet the requirements for a dormitory on Salt Spring Island.

The board decided on dormitories to ensure provision was made for supervised study periods for pupils living away from home.

Front-page praise was extended to Salt Spring Island's rural postman, W. Hele, who for several weeks had gone beyond the call of duty to deliver mail to residents on Scott Road.

New road construction made the mailboxes inaccessible by car: so Hele walked. Often, the job had to be completed after hours, due to the hazards of the road construction and equipment.

Twenty years ago

Several courses of action were offered to Salt Spring Islanders to exert control over the pollution of local waters.

Islanders were encouraged to send 500 telegrams to the premier of the province, to write the minister of health and to join the Salt Spring Island Anti-Pollution Society.

The trouble started the previous week when the hunting season opened and at least two homeowners in the southern area of Salt Spring Island were up in arms.

One resident was watching several deer which regularly fed on his property, when two hunters jumped from a car and opened fire on the deer.

Another resident was in his house when he heard eager gunmen firing in all directions. He stepped outside the door with his own gun and fired rapidly into the air. This resulted in the desired sound of footsteps running in the opposite direction.

Fifteen years ago

Fire ripped through a modern two-story home on Park Drive. The house, gutted in the blaze, suffered extensive damage which

was partially covered by insurance. There were no injuries.

A local hotel proprietor was shot to death in his suite at the Harbour House Hotel. A 23-year-old Ganges man was charged in connection with the killing, and Ganges RCMP were still investigating the matter.

Ten years ago

Visitors thronged to the school grounds in Ganges for the Salt Spring Island Fall Fair. The event was officially opened by Mike Byron and special guest was MLA Hugh Curtis.

Curtis brought with him good news: the Farmers' Institute could receive up to \$25,000 in order to create a permanent home for the association and the Fall Fair.

The majority of renovation work on Central Hall had been completed and opening ceremonies were scheduled for the weekend.

The hall now boasted a kitchen, rooms in the basement, a new roof and a ramp for wheelchair access.

Five years ago

The ferry dock at Vesuvius would be repaired at an estimated cost of \$500,000. The B.C. Ferry Corporation decided to repair the dock to the condition it was in

with driftwood

before the *Vesuvius Queen* rammed the facility in August.

Once a tender for the job had been let, the estimated time until completion of repairs was six to eight weeks.

Enrolment at Gulf Islands schools stood at 1,029 — an increase of three from the previous September. On Salt Spring Island the number of students at Fernwood Elementary was 120. However, because the school was not yet completed, both elementary schools were using the Ganges building.

A preliminary hearing into the embezzlement of \$39,000 from Greenwood on Salt Spring Island had been set for February, 1988.

More programs planned

Community Centre projects touch all parts of island life

One of their projects is a large vegetable garden on the grounds of the home. A large double garage attached to the house has been converted to a well-equipped wood-working shop which replaces the former rather cramped quarters in the Activity Centre building. With Don McEacher as director and counsellor, the wood-working shop provides training and meaningful activity for a number of handicapped island residents.

The new Community Craft and Clothing store, in addition to selling used clothing, provides a retail outlet for items produced in the workshop, the vegetable garden, and handicrafts. The store also gives useful employment to handicapped people and, in some instances, has provided them with their first day-to-day contact with the community.

"It (the store) is still being bridged to a degree," Jordan said, "but we are hopeful it will eventually become self-sustaining."

In addition to the three recently

developed programs, the Community Society has numerous ongoing projects providing a variety of services to the community. These include the Community Counselling and Consultation Services program, which is staffed by professionals and provides a wide range of services to island residents on a fee-for-service basis.

The Gulf Island Program Serving Youth (GIPSY) provides an alternative to the regular high school for students between the ages of 15 to 19. The students work on individualized programs at their own speed and receive one-to-one counselling.

One service widely used by the community is the recycling depot located on the parking lot of Ganges Auto Marine on Park Drive. The depot is manned primarily by mentally handicapped people, as well as volunteers.

There are very few aspects of community life on Salt Spring that are not directly or indirectly touched by the work of the

Community Centre. The centre itself is a scene of constant and varied activities from craft classes to meetings of senior citizens, to counselling sessions to the busy administrative offices. And while there is a core of full-time professional employees, a great deal of the activity is guided by a large group of willing volunteers who are essential to the successful operation of the centre.

"Now that we have availability to the resources of the United Way," Jordan-Knox stated, "we have direct contact with all the other agencies supported by the UW. We now can make direct referrals to the Victoria agencies and they in turn can make use of our resources. It is a two-way referral program which greatly enhances our opportunities to assist the members of the community who need our assistance."

"We urge all residents of Salt Spring to give generously to the United Way, because in doing so they are contributing directly to the well-being of the community."

Trustees endorse recommendation aimed at reducing dropout numbers

The Gulf Islands School Board wants to highlight a Royal Commission recommendation it feels might keep potential dropouts in school.

School trustees passed a motion at last Wednesday's board meeting to highlight a recommendation to implement lifespan education as part of the curriculum.

As the report from the Royal Commission indicates, the dropout rate of high school students averages between 30 and 40 per cent in B.C. While the Gulf Islands School District's rate is substantially lower than the provincial average, school trustees believe the issue should be addressed.

"Even if one student drops out, we have a problem," said school board chairman David Eyles.

Many of those leaving school, the report indicates, are doing so because the school fails to offer programs which interest them. Those students who stay in school, but who do not plan on attending a post-secondary institution, also cite the apparent failure of schools to offer a non-university preparation program that is valuable in its own right, and not simply a second-best alternative.

Therefore, one solution to the drop-out problem, the report concludes, is to offer relevant alternative programs of good quality, to attract non-academic students.

Local school trustees agreed a Lifespan Education program — described in the Royal Commission report — may fill this need. The Lifespan Education program would "relate to students' experiences and everyday activities" as a primary objective. From the outset, the report suggests, the program would include studies in nutrition, personal health, family life, career awareness, citizenship, plus safety and the use of

leisure time.

As children grow, the topics could be expanded into more in-depth studies of fitness, mental health, community and environmental health, consumer awareness, prevention of sexual abu-

se, substance abuse and AIDS.

The motion passed by school trustees will suggest the ministry look at implementing such a program as a means of curbing the rate of dropouts in the province.

Washroom hours to be 'reduced'

The washrooms in Centennial Park will not remain open to the public 24 hours a day during the winter months.

The Salt Spring Island Parks and Recreation Commission decided the washrooms will be locked up at 4:30 — as employee Terry Stringer's final duty.

The commission agreed to open the washrooms at times of public gatherings, such as the bonfire event at Halloween. It also said it would re-examine the motion for closure, and possibly leave it until the end of daylight saving time before locking the washrooms overnight.

The commission also announced that a bid had been accepted to install hand-dryers and lights in the washrooms.
