country gourmet

"Gooseberries are not everybody's dish, but if you like them, you like them."

— A. R. Willis

A food writer who is not omnivorous soon reduces himself to silence in the presence of all those foods he can't eat, but with the singular exception of cucumber I like every food in its proper season.

As summer wanes and the nights have a delicious coolness redolent of drooping bramble thickets and apple trees bowed under their burdens of rosy fruit, I look forward to that division of the country calendar when all the gooseberries have ripened and, made into preserves, sit in cool dark cupboards waiting for winter.

Not everyone feels this way. My father, who, appropriately, once owned a chocolate factory, disliked everything that was at all tart or sour, and loved to sprinkle sugar over his slice of gooseberry pie after a riotous pantomime of grimaces and scowls directed at the offending fruit.

Others are more fastidious about what they eat. To the surprise and relief of everyone, cousin Jane grew into a beautiful and healthy woman on a diet which consisted only of tea, bread and honey, and chips "without too much potato in them." I do not believe a berry of any kind ever passed her lips.

With these two exceptions, however, I have never met anyone who did not love blueberries and raspberries and blackberries. But think, when did you last listen to a speech in praise of the lowly gooseberry?

Is it the unlikely name? Then what about the soapberries we use for Indian ice-cream? This treat enjoyed by Indian children for centuries is made by mixing the fruit with an equal volume of water, and whipping it into a froth. A little sugar is often added nowadays.

Or consider bog cranberries, salmonberries and thimbleberries. None of these foods is particularly blessed by the dictionary. "What's in a name anyway?" said the white blackbird when he sat on a wooden milestone eating a red blackberry.

Well, it's the same with gooseberries.

As my tutor, Lord David Cecil, once happily remarked on bumping into two ladies of diaphanous appearance at the door of an Oxford restaurant: "You may regale yourself with a plate of oysters, young man, but I'm having a brace of gooseberry tarts."

In my garden there are two kinds.

The indigenous gooseberry has colonized the ruin of an old fir and its hardy, prickly branches survive drought and neglect — even the hammer and nails of my son who decided last year to transform the stump it grows beside into a castle for his toy soldiers.

This is the sticky gooseberry, characterized by trailing red sepals in spring and a cluster of three very sharp spines at each stem node. The berries are large and turn a deep crimson before they fall. The fruit is covered with sticky hairs and was eaten only sparingly on the Gulf Islands and Vancouver Island by the Salish peoples, and with good reason. It is scarcely palatable.

As for the domestic gooseberries whose fruit is best in July and early August, to borrow a delightfully vague expression of Culpeper, "It is so well known that it needeth no description."

This reminds me of a friend at university who was asked to identify a passage from John Milton's *Paradise Regained*, a poem noted only for obscurity. He had never read it and the only John Milton he knew played defence on our soccer team. He closed his eyes and prayed for inspiration.

"A minor epic by a blind man about his loss of virginity," he declared in front of the astonished examiners.

He should have quoted Culpeper instead!

What can you do with gooseberries besides pies, tarts, fools, crumbles, preserves and bit parts in fruit salads?

The rich tradition of French cuisine gives us *groseille a maquereau*, in which the gooseberries in the sauce "procure" a special taste for the fish. Mixed with strawberries, gooseberries make a marvellous jelly. A chilled sauce of gooseberries spiced with cinnamon, nutmeg and cloves will wake up a slice of roast pork or a chop. My favourite use for them, however, is in a gooseberry charlotte, a specialty not only of Normandy, but also of Northern England's Lakeland, and one of the many interesting culinary connections that exist between Britain and France.

GOOSEBERRY CHARLOTTE

- sponge cake
- 2 cups custard
- 1/2 oz. gelatine
- sugar
- 1 lb. gooseberries
- 1 t lemon juice

Prepare a sponge cake, tear into fingers. Line a plain mould with these and then set aside. Now take the fresh domestic gooseberries, add a cup of water, as much sugar as you like and then stew. Strain and chill. Add custard fortified with gelatine and seasoned with lemon juice. Stir carefully and pour over the sponge cake.

Voice of Women

October meeting will discuss pension changes, proposals

The Salt Spring Island chapter of Voice of Women is sponsoring an October 3 meeting to discuss the Canada Pension Plan as it affects women.

Scheduled speaker is Sheila O'Connor of the Canada Pension office in Victoria, who will discuss changes implemented in the plan and proposed legislation to improve benefits paid to survivors.

O'Connor has been a Canada Pension counsellor since 1968, helping people apply for benefits and staging workshops on the

plan for any interested bodies.

Also present at the Salt Spring meeting will be local resident Larry Scarf, who has retired from Canada Pension.

Voice of Women notes it is studying the history of attempts to have the work of women in the home covered by Canada Pension.

"In the hope of strengthening our families and allowing women the choice of remaining at home without fear of poverty in old age," the chapter says, "Voice of Women will work toward inclu-

sion of women's household labour under the Canada Pension Plan system."

At present, the group adds, 50 per cent of all women over the age of 65 years and living alone are poverty-stricken — an issue to be addressed by Sheila O'Connor.

All local women's groups have been invited to attend the October 3 meeting, which will take place in the library of Salt Spring Elementary School, beginning at 7:30 pm. The meeting is open to the public.

Pension payments increased

Increases in the cost of living will automatically increase federal Old Age Security (OAS), Guaranteed Income Supplement (GIS) and Spouse's Allowance (SA) payments in October.

Increases include:

- Universal OAS payments, paid to people 65 years and over, rise to \$320.08 a month from \$315.97.

- The maximum GIS for a single person and for a married person whose spouse does *not* receive OAS or SA benefits, rises to \$380.39 a month from \$375.51.

- The maximum GIS for each married person whose spouse also receives an OAS pension, and for a married person whose spouse receives an SA, increases to \$247.75 from \$244.57.

- The maximum SA — paid to low-income people between 60 and 64 years who are married to GIS recipients — will increase to \$567.83 from \$560.54.

- The maximum Widowed Spouse's Allowance, paid only to low-incomed widowed persons aged 60 to 64 years, increases to \$626.90 from \$618.85.

Benefits are adjusted every three months based on changes in the Consumer Price Index, Statistics Canada's measure of inflation. Current increases are effective for October, November and December.

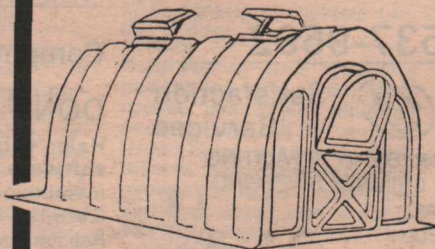

Island Trustees must consider budgetary needs

December's Trust Council meeting is expected to decide if the Trust will seek additional local funding for its operations.

Council debated the question briefly at its September 9-10 meeting on Gambier Island, but elected to turn the matter over to the general trustees and staff for research and recommendations.

The question of local funding was raised because the Trust must soon decide whether to submit a request for more money to cover growing expenses and staff shortfalls, or to wait and see if the province allows it an increase in the local mill rate to make up expected budgetary shortfalls.

Earlier this year, the province granted the Trust authority to raise an additional \$71,000 in

local taxes in the current fiscal year, of which \$42,000 was tentatively allocated in March to cover leasing a computer system, increasing Trust honorariums and funding two part-time staff resource positions.

Chairman Nick Gilbert told the Gambier meeting the difficulty facing the Trust is that it does not know if the province will allow it to decide the dollar size of its budget, whether local residents would approve an increased tax levy, and how it will be expected to overcome staffing problems.

"We're not clear on our relationship with the province,

whether we're going to be able to raise and spend the money ourselves," he said. "Should we put in a request for increases in local taxes next year to make up budget shortfalls? We have no idea how much we'll need, but if we do request the ministry (of municipal affairs) to allow more local dollars to be raised, we should start examining the question now."

Trust manager Cynthia Hawksworth told the meeting the extra \$71,000 generated this year could prove to be a larger sum next year, since it is based on a mill rate that is tied to rising property

values on the islands.

Jim Campbell of Saturna Island doubted the need to raise additional funds, pointing out that trustees had yet to allocate the full \$71,000 injected into the current budget and suggesting the Trust might find itself spending money "just because it was raised." Spending should not increase just because property values rise, he added.

Russ Bates of Galiano agreed: "We have \$28,000 (unallocated from the \$71,000) that we see no need to spend," he said. "I don't think we'll need more next year. If a need is seen for more

revenue, we should detail that need and work out what the (mill) rate should be."

Donald Macdonald of Galiano also questioned the propriety of the current Trust council passing any motion to increase taxes when a new council will be formed following the November elections. The question of taxes should be pondered by the council that will have to live with the decision, he suggested.

In the end, council agreed to leave the question with the chairman, vice-chairmen and staff, who are expected to present suggestions to the December council meeting.

Twenty-five years ago

• Earle C. Westwood, provincial minister of parks and conservation, spoke to some 75 islanders and suggested the Gulf Islands needed a body with some authority to "prevent inadequate planning and subsequent downgrading of property."

Westwood expressed disappointment in a subdivision development on one of the Gulf Islands, noting the situation there was "not as it should be."

• Architects' plans for development of a park and picnic area at the Long Harbour ferry terminal were on display. Work was to commence immediately.

In the meantime, an Isabella Road resident presented an appeal to set aside land for future park development at Fulford before it was "too late."

• Mrs. Dorothy Fanning carried off the Scott and Peden trophy for the best bloom at the Salt Spring Island Chrysanthemum Society annual show held in Mahon Hall.

• Mrs. J.W. Catto won the Freeborn trophy for best entry in the club members' special class. The Society trophy for best flower arrangement went to Mrs. Scot Clarke.

Twenty years ago

• The department of transport and the B.C. aviation council agreed there was a need for landing strips on the Gulf Islands.

The governmental bodies made the statement in response to a question raised by the Gulf Islands Joint Council, which felt there was a positive need for emergency landing strips for small aircraft.

• Curling was increasing in popularity on Salt Spring Island, and at least two separate clubs were planning curling rinks.

When the Salt Spring Island Lions Club discussed its recreation centre project, it learned the

Salt Spring Island Golf and Country Club was also investigating the provision of curling ice.

• Two keen sailors at Ganges had launched a sailing club.

Dave Rainsford and Ron Knight hoped to find a sufficient number of sailors to form a club on Salt Spring Island. The two men also planned to institute sailing contests, preferably using a standard style of light vessel.

Fifteen years ago

• A new freeze was pending on the Gulf Islands.

Restrictions on subdivisions among the Gulf Islands was one of the main recommendations made by the Select Standing Committee on Municipal Matters. Another top proposal made by the committee was the establishment of an Islands Trust to exert a tight control over the "hoarding and development" of island land.

• The Capital Regional District (CRD) was planning a series of informational meetings in connection with the designation of farmland in the islands.

• No charges were laid when a small car rolled across McPhillips Avenue and came to rest against the building of the Shape-Up Shop. The car was parked on the side of the road when the brake apparently slipped. No one was hurt.

• Sale prices at the K & R looked like this: 20 lb. of flour, \$1.99; one-gallon tub of ice cream, \$2.19; ground beef, 99 cents per pound; whole fryers, 69 cents per pound; bacon, \$1.39 per pound.

Ten years ago

• The local director to the Capital Regional District (CRD), Jim Bryce, died in hospital.

Bryce came to Salt Spring Island to retire and took the position with the CRD when George Heinekey stepped down.

• The Black Sheep of Pender

with driftwood

Island brought home the prize from the Salt Spring Island Fall Fair. The ewe took three firsts, two seconds and the Champion Animal trophy in the commercial division.

• Residents of Saturna Island would have an opportunity to vote on a proposed water system for their island.

The minister of municipal affairs had approved the referendum calling for the expenditure of \$580,000 to take over and rebuild two private systems on the island. Annual cost to Saturna Island taxpayers would be \$16,000.

Five years ago

• The Salt Spring Island Parks and Recreation Commission received a letter from the provincial ministry of lands, parks and housing which indicated the commercial use of Centennial Park must cease.

The letter referred to use of the park by the Ganges Farmers' Market and mobile food vendors, whose future there was questionable.

• The local Islands Trust Committee re-asserted support for more restrictive zoning after a majority of interested Salt Spring Island residents favoured a reduction of population density in watershed areas.

The committee also approved tighter controls on the Stowe Lake watershed.

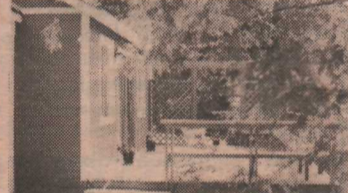

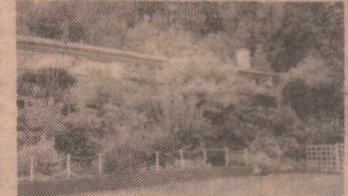

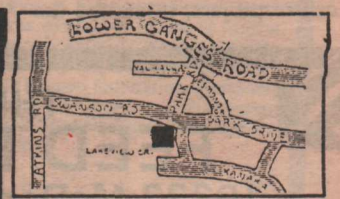
