Yesterday our mail consisted of a B.C. Tel bill, a postcard, three flyers from Victoria, and a glossy production from *Maclean's*, addressed to us (but on a bulk rate) with a picture of a free tote bag with a subscription at 68 per cent off, and a simplistic questionnaire about such national issues as the restoration of the death penalty, to be returned with our order.

The tally: legitimate mail, 5 per cent by weight, 95 per cent by cost; junk mail, 95 per cent by weight, 5 per cent by cost. Later in the day, at the post office lobby, boxholders were sorting their mail into about the above proportions, and the huge trash box was overflowing.

Yes, Virginia, there is a Post Office Santa Claus. He lives in Ottawa, and is a jolly old elf, especially when he is handing out cheap rates to deserving persons, while sticking the rest of us with most of the bill. He is at his very jolliest when he is closing post offices, cutting service, putting in those jolly super boxes, and so transferring this once vital service — except for its flyer-distribution function — to the private sector. Like ho ho ho. No wonder 20 per cent of Canadians are said to be illiterate — they can't afford to get any letter writing practice.

But I really don't want to talk about the Post Office; it's too depressing.

Let's consider other issues that would have taken excellence from his government (or, for that matter, from those that preceded it; but the Conservatives have been on the bridge for the last four years). If handled resolutely they would do far more for the intrinsic strength of our country than a whole wolf-pack of glamour nuclear submarines.

Dismal series of programs

Housing, for example. Surely it is obvious that there can be no more stabilizing influence for a country than the ownership of homes, however modest. But, over the decades, the problem has been met by a dismal series of tax-shelter rental building programs, in which most of the benefits went to developers. By 1991, the MURB program will have cost the government \$3 billion, with no discernible effect on rents. Consider the implications of this: over the last 20 years, home ownership by the poor has decreased by 30 per cent, while by the rich it has increased by 15 per cent. Or this: in many Canadian cities right now hundreds of thousands of steadily-employed people have no hope of every owning their own homes, and some must uproot themselves because not even a rental unit can be found.

One unresolved problem exacerbates another. The inability of a couple to buy or rent a home on one income has led (with other factors, it is true) to a need, studiously ignored until now, for a daycare program. The solution, according to the present election-pushed bill, is to subsidize it via tax breaks. The children of the working poor will continue to be deprived of the immense benefit of quality stable daycare, and many will start school with yet another strike against them.

The hoopla says that we now have tax reform, but we continue to be victimized by a theory that glorifies not incentive, but aggressive greed. According to the *Globe & Mail*, the bill helps the rich and throws a bone to the very poor. Further assaults, via sales taxes, will await the outcome of the election. Saddled with the borrowed Reagan-Thatcher doctrine, which insists, against all the evidence,

that the way to help Lazarus is to overfeed Dives, we continue to trail the western industrial nations in progressive taxation policies.

On these issues and others, such as the environment and abortion, our government does not lead. It looks fearfully around, gauges the political impact, calculates the loss of campaign contributions, estimates the howl from lobbyists, and gives us illusion, high-priced hype, and unrestrained money-throwing at election time.

Worst of all, it has diluted, with Meech Lake, its Canada-wide power. Nowhere is this more evident than in Quebec, where Bourassa and separatism now have a *modus vivendi* — give the first all he wants, and the other will be kept at bay. Which will do the better job of effectively dismembering Canada is anybody's guess. The day is not far distant when, if Free Trade comes, our provinces will have more in common with the USA than with each other. *E unum pluribus*.

Political differences in Canada are described as being between private and public control, or between free enterprise and socialism, or, less politely, between exploiters and humanists, patriots and subversives, or builders and drones. This is nonsense. Canada is and will remain a capitalist nation. The question, as Humpty Dumpty might have phrased it, is who is to be master, and for the benefit of all of us or just some of us.

On that the real strength of Canada will depend. If we continue to beat our ploughshares into nuclear swords, we can be too weak internally to carry such weapons.

Traffic laws enforced

In an effort to combat a "dramatic" increase in local traffic accidents, Ganges RCMP are cracking down on islanders who violate driving regulations.

By the middle of this month, local police had already issued over 70 tickets. This compares to a total of 68 issued in September and even fewer in August.

RCMP Sgt. Larry Wendel said the crackdown will aim to prevent accidents and subsequent loss of dollars, "but more importantly, prevent injury and all the heartache that goes with it."

Wendel said the crackdown has also resulted from numerous complaints local RCMP have been fielding about traffic infractions. As part of their new emphasis on traffic law enforcement, local police are actively pursuing incidents reported to them.

"We feel it is imperative that we take a more aggressive attitude (towards combating infractions)," he said.

To meet this aim, Ganges RCMP have adjusted their shifts

Tools for Peace committee stages annual donation drive

The annual collection of domestic goods for Nicaragua is now being conducted by Salt Spring Island's *Tools for Peace* committee.

Priorities of this year's drive for contributions are school supplies of any kind, safety equipment (goggles, hearing protection, masks, gloves, etc.), rubber boots (for agricultural workers; maximum is size eight), simple tools and roofing materials.

The committee is accepting donations of either the items listed above, or funds to help purchase the goods.

Contributions can be made through boxes stationed at Gulfstream, KIS, *et cetera*, the United Church and Foxglove Farm and Garden Supply. Donations of money can be made through cheques made payable to *Inter Pares, Tools for Peace* and deposited at the table in the Saturday Farmers' Market or mailed to *Tools for Peace* at Box 1500, Ganges.

Founded several years ago in Victoria by church representatives, *Tools for Peace* has become one of the most effective non-governmental agencies assisting Nicaragua in the wake of its revolution and



subsequent eight-year conflict with contra forces.

Local *Tools for Peace* organizers note that 50,000 lives have been lost in fighting in Nicaragua since the revolution, and that economic turmoil is continuing in the country. Its people, they say, need medical supplies, pumps to supply potable water, transport and food.

Salt Spring Island has traditionally been one of the largest per-capita contributors to the *Tools for Peace* effort — a fact organizers hope remains true this year.

Islander takes supplies, souvenirs on expedition to Nicaraguan island

John Norget will be the first Salt Spring Islander to visit the Nicaraguan island of Ometepe since a Gulf Islands Friendship Association was established to link with the community.

Norget, who is meeting his daughter in Mexico later this month, will spend the first week of November in Nicaragua.

"I want to see for myself what the situation is there," he said.

The Gulf Islands Ometepe Friendship Association was formed earlier this year following a visit to the Gulf Islands by the Nicaraguan ambassador to Canada. Since its formation, members have worked to develop the association's structure, create programs and outline goals. Objectives include the promotion of cultural awareness and appreciation.

Because Ometepe is in need of all-around aid, Norget said, whatever is done will provide some good. The association decided, however, to focus on the provision of a clean water system to parts of the island. While details have not been worked out, local contributions to the fund have so far reached \$11,500.

Furthermore, the B.C. Save the Children Fund, has matched the local level of donations with a further contribution of \$11,500.

Norget has gathered a collec-

tion of Gulf Islands paraphernalia, which he plans to take with him to Ometepe. Included are a book on the Gulf Islands, maps of B.C. and Salt Spring Island, carefully dried maple leaves, a Canadian flag, pamphlets and crafts.

"I want to give them a feeling of what it is all about here," Norget said.

He will also be taking a letter of introduction from the Nicaraguan ambassador, as well as medical supplies on behalf of Bainbridge

Islanders — Americans who have also formed a "friendship" link with Ometepe.

Norget spent most of his childhood in Spain and speaks Spanish fluently. He stressed that neither his visit nor the Gulf Islands Ometepe Friendship Association has connections with any governmental body. They are entirely non-partisan, he said.

It is a case, he said, of a "have" country helping out a "have-not" country.
