

### Commission explains budget increase bid

Unless it receives a larger budget, the Salt Spring Island Parks and Recreation Commission will have difficulty meeting its responsibilities.

That message was delivered by commission chairman Phil Hume last Thursday night at an all-candidates' meeting for local

school board and Islands Trust seats.

Speaking during an intermission, Hume urged the audience in the Activity Centre of Salt Spring Elementary School to support this Saturday's referendum on a proposed mil rate increase for the parks and recreation commission.

If approved by voters, it would give the commission an additional \$48,000 a year. The cost to taxpayers would be \$15 per \$100,000 of assessed property value.

Hume said Thursday that the parks and recreation commission has been operating with "limited

capabilities" for the past five or six years. In that time, he continued, it has been hard-pressed to marshal its budget to operate local parks and fields and maintain a staff.

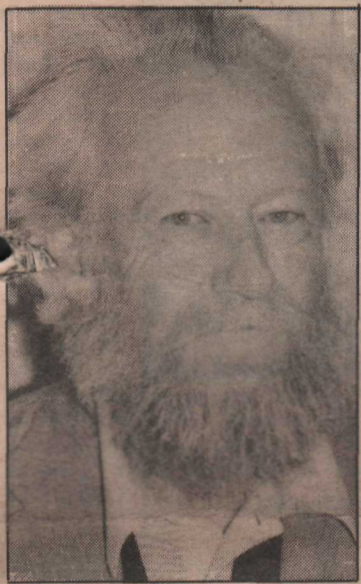
Any local projects of consequence done over the same span have been done with the aid of

Lottery Fund grants, volunteer efforts and grants-in-aid from the Capital Regional District, Hume added, citing Centennial Park improvements as an example.

A \$48,000 injection to the commission's budget would help

### School board hopefuls address public meeting

A Salt Spring audience last week heard from the four candidates for two local seats on the Gulf Islands board of school district trustees.

Incumbents David Eyles and Bert Beitel and challengers Murray Shoolbraid and Charles Bazard spoke to about 75 people gathered at an all-candidates' meeting held last Thursday night at the Activity Centre of Salt Spring Elementary School.

The meeting, arranged by the Salt Spring Community Planning Association, also heard from candidates for Islands Trust seats.

The school board candidates spoke in an order determined by the drawing of lots. Shoolbraid, the first to speak, said he believed he could bring "new thinking" to the deliberations of the board at a time when new problems are

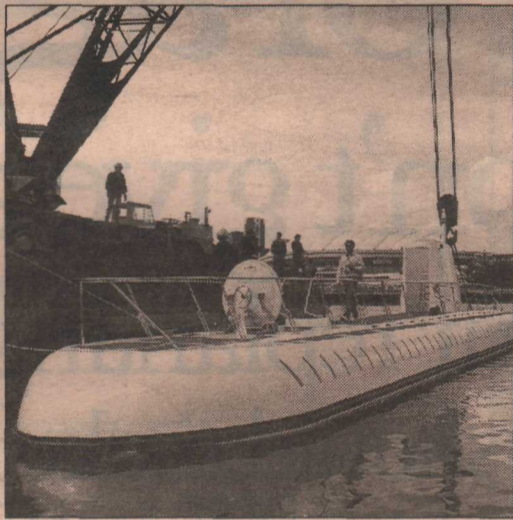

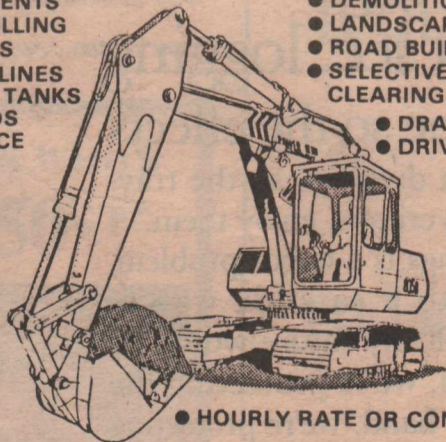

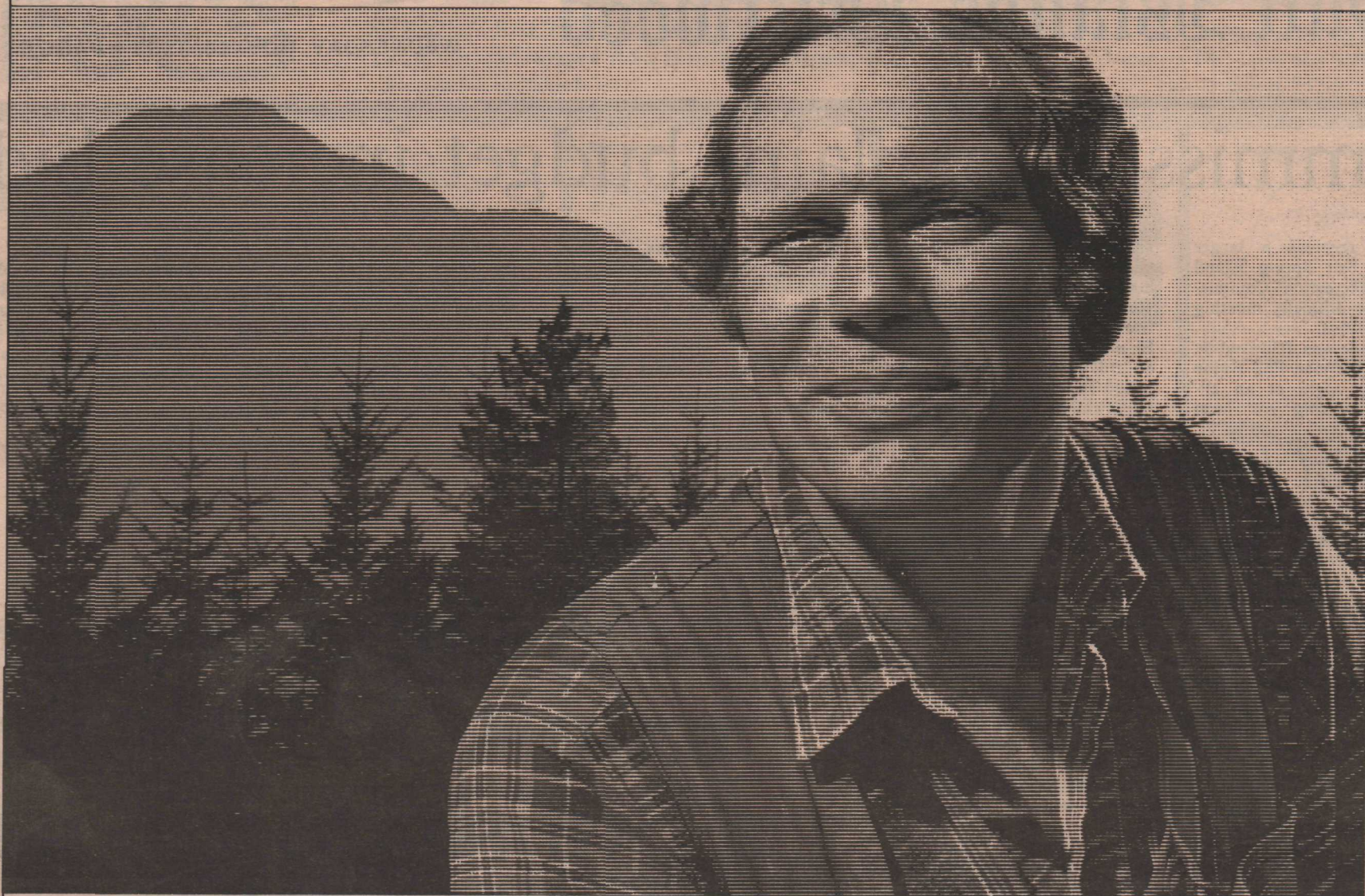

“Foraging deer don’t give a damn about your replanting program.” ¶ “I think we should make people aware that we’re genuinely trying to do a good job.” ¶ “You see, logging isn’t necessarily detrimental to wildlife. It can be done so the effects

are minimal, even a benefit. That’s my job...to promote ways that logging and wildlife can co-exist.” ¶ “With development of second growth, you’ve got so many more options. You can have winter ranges or forage production areas and get some timber at the same time.” ¶ “We try and maintain a patchwork of regenerating cut in different stages of regrowth to create the diverse habitats that wildlife populations need.” ¶ “I’d like to make an inventory of wildlife viewing areas – such as eagle or swan nesting sites – with maps

and guidebooks for each division, so the travelling public can see these critters, enjoy them.” ¶ “Deer browsing on seedlings is a major problem. If I could come up with a sure-fire way to keep foraging animals off, my future would be secure.” ¶ “On one hand, we’re protecting the wildlife, and on the other hand, we’re protecting the new forest.”

# Four school trustee candidates outline philosophies, positions taken on issues

arising and new perspectives are needed. He added that he would bring "common sense and a sense of fiscal responsibility" to the board.

Shoolbraid identified class sizes as a problem to be dealt with, noting he favoured classes that are as small as possible. Other points to be dealt with, he said, include computer programs, French Immersion, library facilities and bus shelters.

The candidate said he would also encourage students in the district to provide the board with feedback, and work towards making schools an integral part of the community.

Looking outside the district, Shoolbraid said that to make changes in schools will require the assistance of the provincial government. "To get change, we need lobbying and spadework," he said. "We can't change the government, but maybe we can change its thinking."

Speaking second was Charles Bazzard, who gave the audience details of his background. Noting that he was educated at an all-boys boarding school in England, he said the experience gives him a different, useful perspective on the local school system. He also pointed out that his position as general manager of the Maracaibo development, and his extensive background in banking, would be useful at the board level.

Bazzard said he was particularly interested in the planning, development and construction aspects of the local school system. Growth on the island, he said, has been faster than expected and has already forced several expansions of schools and made others too small to meet demands.

In a general sense, he said, "there are a lot of grey areas and concerns, and no one quite knows what they are. I'd like to find out."

He concluded by saying he would encourage co-operation among parents, teachers and the school board, and that he hoped to have a hand in introducing new programs that would "provide everyone with new challenges."

David Eyles, the current board chairman, said he "felt good" about what the board has accomplished in the past several years. He cited three areas in particular — the district's 'day of dialogue' that promoted communication among those involved in the education system; community involvement like the artists in the schools program; and steps taken to focus attention on the high school following similar emphasis placed on elementary schools that resolved many of their problems.

Fellow incumbent Bert Beitel said he saw his role as a trustee as that of a custodian or guardian whose responsibility is to see children get the best education possible while ensuring taxpayers

get the best possible value for the dollars spent.

Beitel also said that if re-elected, he would work to create an educational environment "where everyone is a winner."

In the question period that followed, Eyles was asked to explain the board's position regarding the Yardley report on future facilities needs. Michael Hayes said no copies of the report had been made public and no opportunity was given to speak to its contents.

Responding to a related question from Dietrich Luth, Eyles said an overall plan is needed for the site now housing the elementary and secondary schools, and that it would be the elementary school that would move if that became necessary. The site may be too small to accommodate both facilities, he said, and the high school must remain where it is to allow ease of transport for students using water taxis.

In response to a general question about local funding for a program dealing with environmental issues, all four candidates said they would support such a program. Asked whether they would endorse school board support for a public swimming pool, all four again replied in the affirmative.

All four candidates were also questioned about possible use of school facilities by the community, particularly if and when the population declines and extra facilities are in place. Except for Beitel, the candidates indicated they supported increased community involvement in the school system. Beitel replied that he did not believe the question of surplus facility space would be an issue for several years to come, given the district's growth rate.

The candidates also said they would support creation of a common room at the secondary school, be it a lunch room or a covered courtyard.

Eyles said the report cannot be circulated in its original form because it contains details specific to possible property purchases. He noted that a synopsis of main points was published in *Driftwood* and a call made for feedback. Having none, no meeting was called to discuss the report.

Eyles also pointed out that the process is continuing, and that the next stage of determining future facilities requirements will be a more in-depth, engineering assessment of buildings. It is also up to the board to come up with a draft plan to share with the public, he said.

put that organization into place, Hume said. The money would be used as follows:

- \$18,000 for a full-time program director (the sum includes the cost of support services, and allows for the director to create programs that would bring in revenues equal to about half the salary paid);
- \$11,000 for operation and maintenance of properties and equipment;
- \$6,000 for equipment replacement and acquisition;
- \$3,000 for development of new programs; and
- \$10,000 for acquisition of new parks and fields.

## Neighbourhoods challenged to emulate North End tree

A love for the old-fashioned Christmas, where everyone from the neighbourhood got together and enjoyed the spirit of the season, was the reason Pat and Marguerite Lee and a dozen of their neighbours started decorating a balsam fir tree at the junction of Sunset Drive, North End Road and Southey Point Road. Now they are challenging other neighbourhoods on the island to do the same.

"When we started this seven years ago we had 14 people come out and help with the decorating," said Marguerite. "Last year there were 80 people on hand to help out, supervise or just stand around the bonfire and enjoy themselves and meet their neighbours."

The number of people who come out to enjoy the event isn't the only thing that has grown over the past seven years — so has the tree. "When we started this the tree was only about 10 feet tall," she said. "Now the tree is around 25 feet high and we have to use extension ladders to get to the top."

The neighbours all gather together on the first Sunday of December to put up all the

decorations, most of which are handmade from recycled goods.

"It really is a wonderful thing to see," said Marguerite. "We have hand-painted oyster shells from one family, decorated wood-scrap from a local carpenter and one family have made a 60-foot-long garland out of the plastic rings which go around the six-packs of pop cans."

The decorations are then left up for all to enjoy until the first Sunday in January, when everyone gets together again to dismantle their work of art.

The neighbours are not the only folks who get to enjoy the tree. Lee said that over 100 people stopped by in their cars between Christmas and Boxing Day last year to have a look or take pictures of the tree.

"It is really nice to see all those folks stop and admire our handiwork, but the nicest part of all is that it brings everyone together at a special time of year. It is a great way to get all the neighbours together and meet each other. We have all age groups involved, and everyone has a really good time, so I thought if it works here, why not try to get the other neighbourhoods to do the same?" she said.
