

Mining and environment top discussions

The Falconbridge mining proposal and environmental concerns dominated questioning at Saturday's Town Hall meeting with Salt Spring's MLAs.

Close to 50 people gathered at the Salt Spring Elementary School Activity Centre to question Terry Huberts and Mel Couvelier. Concerns, which ranged from clam digging at Cranberry Outlet to logging in Caramanah Valley, were expressed most strongly in the areas of opposition to mining on Salt Spring Island and preser-

vation of the environment here and in the rest of the province.

Marc Holmes was the first of many people to address the MLAs on the issue of Falconbridge Mining Company's proposal to establish a mine on Salt Spring. He asked the MLAs to express their opinions on the issue and tell the gathering exactly what they are doing, and what steps they are willing to take, to protect the island.

Both Huberts and Couvelier expressed a reluctance to outline

any game plan at a public meeting. The options will change as the "cards are played," Couvelier said, describing the issue as one rooted in legalities.

"There is no question we understand the view of islanders," he said. "We now have a responsibility to oblige the interest of the constituency."

Ron Puhky, who noted that many off-islanders have also expressed opposition to the proposal, said he hoped the MLAs were not just bowing to the desires of

the constituents, but that opposition to mining on Salt Spring is part of their personal convictions.

Commercial clam digging and dioxins from the Crofton mill formed the basis for a discussion of local environmental concerns.

In the area of commercial clam digging — which has increased in frequency on Salt Spring beaches, bringing with it a multitude of related problems — one individual suggested the MLAs address the issue before the situation erupts into violence.

In response, the MLAs noted clams and oysters are a federal concern. They said, however, that they have received letters on the issue and are "following it up."

Huberts and Couvelier also said they are involved in discussions with the federal government, in an attempt to resolve the problem of dioxins emissions across the country. Couvelier said the installation of the natural gas pipeline on Vancouver Island will assist mills, such as the one in

MLAs address island issues at local town hall meeting

Crofton, in meeting stiffer environmental regulations.

Ian Fraser noted that the environment is one of two potentially opposing forces in this province. Economic development is the second force and there is concern, he said, that the second will overpower the first.

Fraser asked what commitments the MLAs have made towards the protection and enhancement of the environment in this province.

Huberts told the meeting he feels the two forces should be addressed in a way that will maintain and safeguard both. Couvelier suggested that perhaps a ceiling could be placed on the budget stabilization fund and surplus dollars be directed towards environmental protection.

The environment also found its way into a discussion on foreign ownership in the province. Couvelier told the group the nationality of money becomes irrelevant once on the market. "As long as

we get the jobs and technology, in the long run, it will do us more good," he said.

But one member of the audience pointed out that this philosophy neglects the environment, which could be exploited by a company that does not have a vested interest in preserving the land. Couvelier responded by saying it is the government's job to ensure this does not happen.

The meeting also touched on several non-environmental issues:

- One person questioned the provincial government's proposal to change farm status tax regulations. The proposal — which would see the minimum income necessary to obtain farm status increased from \$1,600 to \$5,000 — has previously come under fire from local farmers. At Saturday's meeting it was suggested \$5,000 is far too high and that the government should consider applying the cutoff point at a lower level, such as \$2,000 or \$3,000.

Couvelier agreed the government would probably take that

route.

- On the issue of the provincial debt, the MLAs told the group the government should be working on a balanced budget within the next two years. They said the areas of health and education will not suffer cuts in the wake of achieving this goal.

- The MLAs came under attack for the government's move to eliminate \$50 from welfare payments to single mothers, once the child becomes six months old. Isadora Godchild said the step discourages mothers from staying at home and bringing up their own children, forcing them to place these children in a day care environment.

Couvelier responded by saying the \$50 reduction occurred concurrently with a \$150 increase towards day care payments. He said the step was taken to initiate "behavioural change," and that society should not expect government to provide "for all of those people who might be able to work."

Local society spearheads thrust in United Way fund-raising effort

This year marked the first time ever that the United Way canvass was conducted on Salt Spring Island by a local organization.

The campaign, which began in October, was handled by the Salt Spring Community Society and headed by Arvid Chalmers.

Joe Landon, executive director for the Greater Victoria United Way, said the decision to let a local organization handle the canvass came about after several discussions were held with island representatives.

"We discussed the matter and decided that it would be a good idea to have island people involved," he said. "We thought it would give the campaign a more personalized touch."

The goal the United Way set for this year was \$2.7 million. Organizers are already 95 per cent of the way there, having raised \$2.567 million. "It looks very promising," said Landon.

"We still have some pledges coming in and we urge anyone who hasn't gotten around to it yet to please send in their donation so that we can reach our goal."

All together, Landon said the Gulf Islands raised a total of \$10,720, with almost \$9,000 of that coming from Salt Spring. The main thrust of this year's campaign was a fund-raising insert in *Driftwood* and the *Island Times*. The committee in charge also sent out personal letters of appeal to 1,100 island residents.

Along with that, the B.C. Ferry Corporation's Gulf Islands fleet employees have raised \$14,638 through payroll deduction commitments. Equal parts will be donated to the B.C. Cancer Association, B.C. Heart Association, Salvation Army and the United Way. B.C. Hydro's local employees also added \$700 to the cause.

The acceptance of the Salt Spring Community Society as a United Way agency came about as a result of the continuous efforts of the previous chairman, Shirley Vida and her successor, Walter Swing, along with execu-

tive director Barbara Jordan-Knox and the many board members. "It came about a year after we had made our final overture to the Victoria body," Swing said.

This year, Swing, who is continuing as chairman of the society, will also be vice-chairman of the annual appeal for funds. Other members of that committee are: John Crofton, Tony Richards, Paul Sadler, Mike Hayes, David Williams, Tom Toynbee, Bob Ackerman and Maggie Hayes.

"In the first year that we have been a member of the United Way, the Salt Spring Community Society has benefited greatly," said Barbara Jordan-Knox. "Following last year's campaign and our application for a grant, we received \$23,000. This is flexible money," she explained. "It can be directed to any one of the 15 groups within the society, if and when it required, whereas the government grant money is usually locked into a specific program. This year it enabled us

to hire much-needed additional staff members and equalize salaries where there had been an imbalance due to restricted funding."

The two new staff members include office manager-secretary, Kathleen McCurdy, who has taken on the task of handling much of the society's correspondence in addition to numerous other routine office jobs. The other new staffer is assistant bookkeeper Nel Meyer.

"The campaign is basically in the wrap-up stage on Salt Spring," said Chalmers. "We had a great response from everyone. I would like to personally thank Frank Leigh-Spencer and all the canvassers — they did a great job. "We felt confident from the beginning that we could count on the continued generosity of Salt Spring's residents, which has always been so evident in past community campaigns to support local non-profit organizations."

country gourmet

The language one has to use when describing the saffron trade is positively narcotic. Because a daunting half-million stigmas of the crocus sativus are required to make a single kilogram of this spice, adulteration has been common since Phoenician times.

Some authorities give the figure of 13,000 crocus stigmas to the ounce. But what's in a number? I've never met anyone who could look me in the eye without squinting and say he crawled all over the fields in Saffron Walden trying to count them.

I have, however, frequently thought that this plant would make an ideal prohibited substance and I am surprised that saffron has hitherto escaped the avarice of governments. Its production is labour-intensive, its colour is expensive, and it is addictive (but only to cooks). Best of all, opportunities abound for the unscrupulous to cut it with lowly turmeric and pass their brand off as Mexican or Columbian saffron.

You can imagine the conversation between two crazed chefs: "Hey, Sappho, I just got a shipment of Indian saffron through from the west coast. What a caper! The new RCMP spice squad, the Sparks, was watching the wrong pot this time, eh? This stuff is almost pure. No more than 10 per cent turmeric, by Larousse! It's incredible if you do it with rice."

"That's nothing, Zafferano. Stir some of this Italian Abruzzi saffron into that bouillabaisse you've been cooking for the next meeting of the School Board. You'll blow their taste buds into the next edition of Bon Appetit!"

This costly and fabled spice, with the delicate pale yellow colour of fine gold and an exotic, slightly bitter taste, has enjoyed a reputation throughout history as the most snobbish of condiments, whose price often exceeded even that of cinnamon.

In the huge mediaeval kitchens of the Plantagenets, perspiring cooks loved to use saffron to colour the dishes of their aristocratic masters. A feast at the castle given for the barons by Henry or Richard would inevitably end with an illusion dish like Cockatrice (in which fowls and suckling pigs were artfully combined to represent a mythical beast) or a food sculpture made of Marzipan (marzipan). For all recipes of this ilk saffron was absolutely *sine qua non*.

Displays of conspicuous consumption are, in this democratic age, distasteful. But if I had to choose between Mrs. Marcos' shoe collection, my neighbour's Rolls Royce, or a serving of saffron spiced zuppa di pesce in a good Italian restaurant... well, what shall we order for the second course?

Other famous saffronica are the risottos of Milan and the famous bouillabaisse of Marseilles which depend upon a good pinch of the crocus for their authenticity. Spanish cookery is redolent of saffron, a reflection of this country's past as a Phoenician, and later a Moorish, possession. A paella from the south of Spain may require half a teaspoon of saffron to make the famous rice dish which combines the flavours of seafood, vegetables and meats in a typically classical manner.

The Phoenician theme appears once again with the less august but nonetheless tasty Cornish saffron buns. When the indefatigable traders from the distant Mediterranean arrived in Southern England in quest of tin mines centuries before Julius Caesar turned up, they left shivering Britons with an affection for this spice.

Shakespeare added saffron to the warden pies he cooked with the large, Elizabethan pears he grew in his garden at Stratford. Pliny added a pinch to colour his mulled wines on winter evenings and the legendary gourmet Apicius invented a tremendous saffron wine sauce for poached fish. Even before him Solomon listed saffron among his "chief spices," as did the ancient kings of Persia when they surveyed their palace gardens.

With the holiday season near, you may be tempted to experiment a little at dinner parties with game birds, Cornish hens, or even the common, but always useful, chicken. Try my Saffron Nut Sauce For Game Birds, while it's still legal.

SAFFRON NUT SAUCE FOR GAME BIRDS AND FOWL

- | | |

| 1/3 C hazelnuts or almonds, roasted and grated | |
| 1 t honey | 1/4 t ground pepper |
| 1 t wine vinegar | 1/2 t parsley seed |
| 1 C chicken stock | 1 t celery seed or lovage |
| 1 T olive oil or butter | 1/2 t mint |
| 1 celery stalk | saffron, a pinch |
| 1 sprig of mint | 1/2 C white wine |

In a mortar grind pepper, celery seed, mint and a little saffron. Add the nuts, honey, wine, vinegar and stock. Put olive oil or butter into a saucepan. Heat and add the sauce. Bring up to the boil then simmer for half an hour to reduce. Stir from time to time with a bouquet of celery and mint.

Score the skin of the roasted bird and pour the sauce over the clefts. Cook together for a few moments then serve with saffron wild rice and a conchicla (cooked peas and beans in-the-pod) with coriander sauce.

For the stuffing I first pre-cook half a cup of brown rice. Mix this with 10 or 12 small quartered mushrooms, a stick of chopped, sauteed celery and a fistful of pecans. Season with a sprinkle of salt, a sprig of sweet cicely, and a pinch of saffron. Bind with egg, well beaten. Before roasting, rub the skin of the bird with olive oil and coriander.

For the wine, I suggest you serve a bottle of iced, very dry champagne for your guests or family. After all, most people come into the world with nothing and we all shall certainly leave it the same way. Doesn't it make good sense, then, to enjoy ourselves a little en route?

Parking problem cited

Salt Spring Island has at least one parking problem *outside* the commercial centre of Ganges.

Mary Williamson, manager of Central Hall, recently told *Driftwood* that an ongoing parking problem at the Central Hall facility has resulted in a number of difficulties.

A sign posted at the hall advises drivers that the parking

lot there is limited to use by those attending Central Hall or the neighbouring cemetery.

Unfortunately, Williamson said, space in the parking lot is being taken up by individuals using facilities at Portlock Park.

Williamson recalls one incident where vehicles in a funeral procession were unable to find parking spaces at the hall.

Just last week, she said, a car appeared in the parking lot one night and was still there the next day. Problems arose when contractors arrived to blacktop the area and the owner of the vehicle could not be found.

Members and users of Central Hall are asking the public to obey parking regulations and refrain from using the parking lot illegally.

Donation benefits foundation

A large donation has helped the Salt Spring Island Foundation become better established as a charitable organization for the benefit of the island and its residents.

An anonymous donor last week doubled the size of the foundation's assets by contributing an undisclosed sum of money to the organization.

Born during the last year as the result of action taken by the late John Lees to promote Salt Spring and its way of life, the foundation is devoted to a number of charitable purposes.

Included among the foundation's purposes are the relief of hardship, the advancement of education and the support of recreational, cultural, artistic, intellectual, religious and health care programs and facilities.

The foundation is also designed to provide "seed money" to help non-profit societies to initiate programs, projects or research which those groups would be able to sustain on a continuing basis.

Two funds are administered: an open fund, which will accept any size of donation or bequest; and a closed fund for amounts of \$5,000 or more, to be dispersed in accordance with the donor's wishes.

All requests for financial support are screened by the foundation's board of advisors, who are prominent locally in professional, business and other fields.

Approved requests go to the three trustees for their action. The trustees are Dick Toynbee, John Crofton and Vancouver businessman Al Pierce.

Improvements to main deck signage requested for Long Harbour vessel

The Salt Spring Handicapped Association has asked the B.C. Ferry Corporation to resolve a "potentially dangerous situation" on board the M.V. *Queen of Nanaimo*.

Association spokesman Bill Best said the association has for some time been attempting to have improvements made to signs identifying the location of the elevator used by disabled passengers.

In a letter to Salt Spring transportation committee chairman Dan Evanishen, Best outlines several problems associated with the promenade deck signage.

"Unlike the international symbol of accessibility for persons with disabled abilities, which identifies the elevator location sign on the car deck," Best said, "the elevator location sign on the

promenade deck consists only of a small, three-symbol sign, mounted above eye level."

Best said the sign cannot be easily noticed by passengers.

Best further noted that the elevator door itself carries an international symbol that he understands to mean: *No children without parents are permitted*. The door does not carry the word *elevator*, and is frequently mistaken for the ladies' washroom, he added.

Best estimates the disabled population of Salt Spring to be in the area of 200 people, many of whom are elderly and easily disoriented in unfamiliar surroundings, such as a ship. In conversations with ferry crew members, Best said, he has been told that mobility-impaired passengers frequently ask crew members the

whereabouts of the elevator.

"We are therefore seriously concerned as to the safety of these passengers in the event of a fire or other emergency," Best notes in his letter.

The Salt Spring Handicapped Association is asking the ferry corporation to take several steps towards improving the situation. For instance, it says overhead signs should be mounted or suspended above the passenger aisles parallel to the elevator on the promenade deck.

The signs should also display the international white-on-blue wheelchair logo, indicating handicapped access, Best says. The association feels the beige-on-green combination now in use is not uniformly recognized.

The association further believes the elevator door itself should be painted in a colour

which contrasts the surrounding area. The door should carry the word *elevator* for further clarification, and all signs should be affixed at a level easily seen by those in wheelchairs, Best says.

According to Best, the ferry corporation was informally asked to review the matter in August, 1987; however, the request was "dismissed out of hand as being inconsequential." The recommendations were again made early last summer through the Salt Spring transportation committee. Best said no response was forthcoming.

He hopes this time the corporation will recognize its moral obligation to provide directional guides "which are visible, readily identifiable and fully adequate to the needs of . . . disabled passengers."

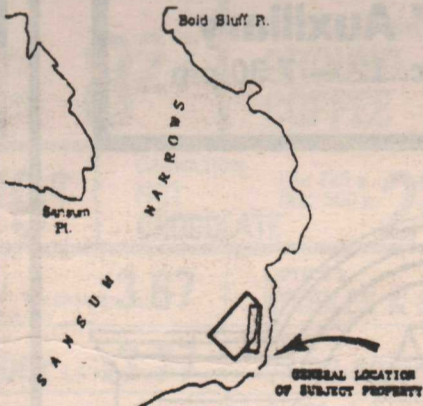

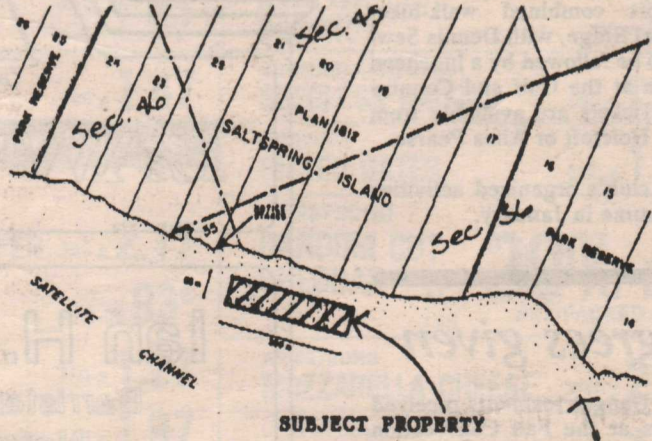
