



## Community Society store slated to be moved to downtown Ganges

The Community Centre clothing store is moving from its relatively cramped and isolated quarters to a downtown Ganges storefront. The shift is designed to give the public improved access to the store and provide handicapped adults with work, Community Centre director Barbara Jordan-Knox said last week.

The clothing store, located for the past decade at the Community Centre on Fulford-Ganges Road (across from the RCMP station), is moving February 15 to 166 Fulford-Ganges Road (next to Luigi's Restaurant).

The new and larger location will permit Community Clothes and Crafts to expand its clothing selection and sell crafts made by the achievement centre's handicapped adults, Jordan-Knox explained.

The handicapped adults will also have the opportunity to assist a staff member with work at the store, for a small wage.

"It will be a neat experience for the handicapped people," Jordan-Knox said.

The working environment will train the adults in socialization and work skills, she continued. Through it, they will learn how to sell and maintain items, manage money and be punctual. At the same time, other members of the community will have a chance to interact with them.

The clothing store originally worked on the exchange system, where people brought in their old clothes and took what they wanted in exchange. From there it became a five-and-dime store, and eventually worked on a donation system.

In the new store, clothes will be

marked with prices. On Mondays, however, the donation format will be in place and individuals will pay either what they can afford, or what the item is worth to them.

A changeroom with a play area and toys is one addition the extra space at the new location will permit, Jordan-Knox said.

The move will also see an expansion in products offered for sale. Crafts produced for sale at the achievement centre include wooden swings, stuffed animals and marionettes. Used toys and household appliances (in working order only) will be available as

well. Donations can be made directly to the store, or dropped off at the Community Centre. The store will have no room for used furniture, however.

The store is a non-profit organization, and will still be staffed by the volunteers who have operated it for the past 10 years. Any profits made, after overhead costs have been met, will be turned back into Community Centre programs.

Community Clothes and Crafts will operate Monday through Saturday from 10 am to 5 pm. The opening — Monday, February 15 — will feature coffee and donuts.

### Financial aid

Lynda Jensen of Salt Spring Island Voice of Women recently presided over booth now open each Saturday in Mouat's Mall to sell arpilleras made by women in Chilean shantytowns. Funds from the sale of these and related items are used to assist the women: in 1987, the local group contributed \$1,500 a month to the Chileans. Arpilleras collected by the local group are also on display at the UBC Museum of Anthropology. The local Continuing Education office is offering a February 21 bus trip to the museum to view the works.

## Saltery Bay group takes new mandate

NORTH GALIANO — A meeting of the Saltery Bay Preservation Society was held in the North Galiano Hall on Saturday, January 30. At the meeting, members were brought up to date on the changes which have occurred at the bay since the last meeting.

As the society was formed for the express purpose of purchasing the Saltery Bay property from MacMillan-Bloedel for community use, and since this is no longer a possibility, all monies collected for this purpose have been returned. The society itself will remain extant only until the annual general meeting this July.

A new society with a wider mandate was formed at Saturday's meeting. The Phoenix Society, as this group will be known, will monitor ecological matters on the island (particularly in North Galiano) and work with other groups for the preservation of

island life. Its primary objective, however, will remain the opposition to commercialization of Saltery Bay and the maintenance of existing public access to the foreshore.

Officers of the new group are: Shirley Chambers, president; Phyllis Stafford, secretary; Norm Russell, treasurer; and Pat Hughes and Barbara MacKenzie, directors. Timmy Brooks is liaison officer to other groups.

They also promised that, from 1990 onwards, cutting plans will be submitted in sufficient time for islanders' concerns to be voiced and seriously considered within an integrated resource management plan.

# Museum society discusses options

**PENDER ISLANDS** — Edward W. Andrusiak, planner and project manager for Knata Heritage Research and Presentations of Edmonton, was guest speaker at the annual meeting of the Pender Island Museum Society on January 30.

Andrusiak presented an overview of Phase I of a feasibility study to determine the need for a multi-use cultural centre complex on Pender Island, while discussing the specifics of creating a Pender Island Museum.

The study revolving around the multi-cultural centre is scheduled for completion in March, and was funded by a consortium of Pender Island groups: the hall committee, Museum Society, Pender Lender Library, Nu Tu Yu Shop and the Pender Play School.

While the Knata study is looking into creation of a multi-use cultural centre, the Museum Society has continued to explore options should it decide to fund a building of its own.

The group discussed the possible acquisition of the General Store building at Port Washington. The store, which has been a Pender landmark since 1910, was closed on January 15. Owner Russ Searle is asking \$170,000 for the property, which includes a second building on leased foreshore land footing the Port Washington Wharf. A motion to spend \$200 to order an immediate appraisal was tabled until the group's March meeting.

A key consideration in determining whether a museum

should be built, according to Andrusiak, is the need to store and protect historic documents. At present, Pender Island's historical artifacts are in the libraries and journals of families living on Pender, and in selected cases in various public archives in Victoria.

The Knata Phase I paper was presented in public session to the hall committee on Tuesday evening at the Pender Community Centre and focused on three possible sites for a multi-use facility: the present Pender Island school and Community Centre; the James Auchterlonie Centre, which presently includes the library and Nu Tu Yu Shop; and the vacant restaurant complex above and north of Prior Park.

The General Store property will be studied as a possible location as part of the Phase II report to the hall committee. The Museum Society is expected to await the final report from Knata Research before deciding on unilateral efforts toward a Pender Island Museum.

Society Directors Doreen York and Elizabeth Campbell say the group will continue their seasonal displays of island artifacts and memorabilia.

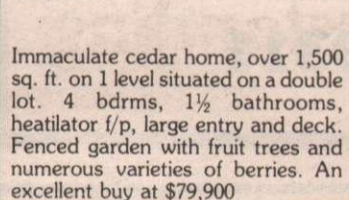

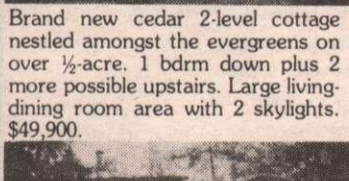

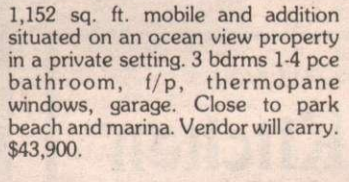

## The Justice Reform Committee wants to hear from you

The Justice Reform Committee was recently established by Attorney General Brian R.D. Smith, Q.C., "to improve the justice system in this province so that it is more relevant, more accessible, more efficient and less costly, with the result that it may be better understood and respected by all our citizens."

Chaired by the Deputy Attorney General, the Committee consists of seven other members who bring a diverse background in law, justice and civic administration.

The specific areas the Committee will focus on include:

- **Civil Law:** how can the trial process be shortened and simplified and the cost reduced?
- **Criminal Law:** how can criminal trial procedure be streamlined?
- **Court Structure:** how can overlaps be eliminated and a more integrated structure be achieved?
- **Alternate Dispute Resolution:** how can processes such as arbitration and mediation be effectively used?

The Committee wants to hear your concerns and suggestions about our justice system. You can provide your ideas by:

- submitting them in writing before May 15, 1988.
- presenting them orally or in writing at one of the public hearings which will be held between February 19 and May 15, 1988 in Nelson, Prince George, Terrace, Kelowna, Victoria, Campbell River, Vancouver and New Westminster (specific dates, location and appearance instructions will be published at a later date).

concession on the company's part, whereby they are recognizing the validity of the argument that their logging does have effects on the entire community. The possibility of smaller-sized clearcuts of between 25 and 40 acres is now a notion the company is also willing to entertain at future meetings.

In return, Clear Cut Alternatives was asked to prepare an inventory, in map form, of areas that islanders consider to be sensitive for a variety of reasons — i.e., recreationally, ecologically, or aesthetically. The MB representatives are hoping that the economic development plan currently being prepared for the Chamber of Commerce will be finished in time for the next meeting between these two groups, scheduled to take place at the end of May.

These two documents, along with MB's cutting plans, will form the basis of the ongoing negotiations, which promise to test the "reserved optimism" of the CCA and the "perceived shift in attitude towards greater flexibility" on the part of the MB negotiating team.

### Concern

We ask you to note that the previous report on Ambassador Sergio Lacayo's visit to Galiano was based on humanitarian principles, without political or any "group movement" implication. Our Canadian minister of external affairs has shown sincere empathy and concern, especially during his recent visit to Central America, and it is believed to be the case with many humanitarians toward all deeply suffering areas of the world.

We may well be reminded of two former Galiano couples, Dr. Hugh Maclure and wife Muriel have dedicated years of volunteer work in administering medical care in such areas as Haiti and Sierra Leone. At this time Hugh and Muriel, well beyond retirement age, are currently working hard under minimal conditions, at a hospital in a remote area of Sierra Leone. Also, Phoebe Kingscote and husband Pierre, who year after year commit their effort to flying patients and urgently needed supplies, among mundane chores too numerous to mention, in the dangerous and primitive conditions of northeast Zaire, which is situated in tropical Africa. This they do under the sponsorship of *Avions Sans Frontieres*.

We would hope that a more humanitarian outlook by those willing to help will encourage and strengthen the Central American people in their ongoing struggle. For them the alternative would seem to be hopelessness and despair.

### Montague Park Site

In a recent letter to Dr. Kingscote from the resource office of the South Coast Region that work will be done to protect the

archaeological site at Montague Harbour Provincial Park.

The Gulf Islands Branch of the B.C. Historical Federation has initiated this concern for conservation of prehistoric sites at Montague and other Gulf Island Parks. These Indian middens are irreplaceable natural resources for providing information dating back

4,000 years.

Protection must be provided against erosion caused by such forces as swells from water craft, access paths down the middens to the beaches, huge driftwood logs, and weathering. The fear is that unprotected middens and their treasures could disappear in a short time.





## Auxiliary sets 1988 executive

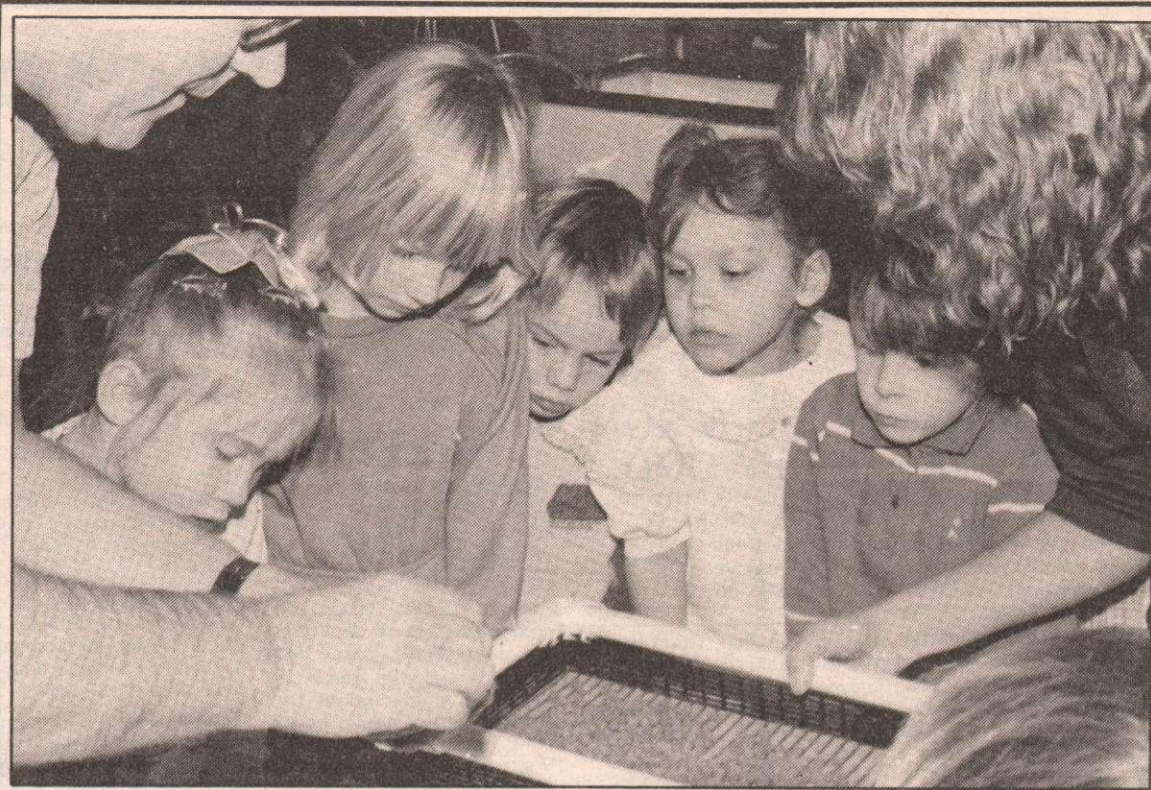
The annual general meeting of the auxiliary to Lady Minto Gulf Islands Hospital, held January 25, elected a new slate of officers for 1988.

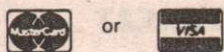

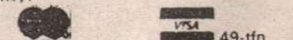

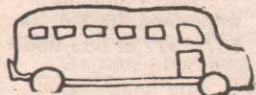

# Long Harbour residents defeat bike park plan

A proposal to make a Long Harbour area property eligible for a temporary commercial or industrial use permit was rejected last Friday by the local Trust Committee, after a public hearing voiced strong objections to the scheme.

The property designation was sought by David Clegg, who hoped to turn his five-acre property into a bicycle campground. If the Trust had proceeded with the proposed bylaw declaring the property eligible for a permit, Clegg would then have had to apply to the Trust for the permit itself.

But the Trust, in regular session following the public hearing,

voted to proceed no further with the proposed bylaw, noting that it had "no support in the neighbourhood."

Property owners living near Clegg had objected that declaring the area eligible for temporary commercial or industrial use permits would be "the thin edge of a wedge" that could change Long Harbour Road from a scenic, residential area to one with a strip of commercial outlets.

As one neighbour noted: "No commercial area like the Pat Bay highway should start on Long Harbour Road — that is the worst kind of advertising."

The bicycle campground idea

itself came under fire from neighbours, who said it would subject them to nuisance problems, impair the aesthetic appeal of the area, and reduce property values.

Resort owner Rick Rockliffe, who stressed he was neither supporting nor opposing the proposal, offered the opinion that cyclists are the best tenants a campground operator can find, since they are normally tired after pedalling all day to reach a campsite.

"They go to bed early," he said.

Clegg, who told the public hearing that he was willing to tailor the operation to meet any

concerns raised, said the campground proposal was motivated by a recognition that the needs of visiting cyclists must be addressed on Salt Spring. The temporary use permit, he added, was the only mechanism available to allow him to determine if the campground would be financially feasible and appropriate for the area.

Temporary use permits are effective for one year and renewable for a second year, after which time the owner must either halt the operation or seek rezoning to

an appropriate land status.

Those qualifications did not appeal to residents at the public hearing, who worried that since declaring an area eligible for temporary use permits is a permanent step, it opens the door to later applications for ventures that would be even more inappropriate than a bicycle campground.

Amplifying that point, Pat James suggested from the audience that the Trust should make permit area designations temporary, just like the permits themselves.

## Poet to seek NDP backing in new riding

Poet Elizabeth Woods last week declared her candidacy for the NDP nomination in the soon-to-be-created federal riding of Sannich-Gulf Islands.

The Gulf Islands are currently included in the Cowichan-Malahat-the-Islands riding served by MP Jim Manly (NDP). However, federal redistribution is scheduled to carve up the riding later this year, with the Gulf Islands portion added to the Saanich region to create a new constituency.

Manly said late last year he would not seek the Saanich-Gulf Islands seat if the next federal election is called after redistribution takes effect.

MP Pat Crofton (Equimalt-Saanich), meanwhile, has already declared his intention to seek the Progressive Conservative nomination for the new federal riding.

Woods, a 48-year-old resident of the Victoria area, has published two books of poetry (*Gone*, 1972; and *Men*, 1979), two novels (*The Yellow Volkswagen*, 1971; and *The Amateur*, 1980), and written several works broadcast on CBC-Radio.

Born in Prince George and raised in Kamloops and Vernon, Woods graduated from the University of B.C. in 1961 with a Bachelor of Arts in psychology. She later took post-graduate studies in psychology at Queen's University in Ontario, and at UBC.

"What I bring to politics," she said last week in a prepared statement, "is the conviction of the central importance of the arts in transforming our society; central because, for the artist, the bottom line is not simply the dollar — the bottom line is being able to earn one's livelihood doing work one loves."

That goal should not be limited to artists, she continued.

"We all need to become more like artists, not necessarily by becoming dancers or painters or writers but by considering ourselves as producers rather than as consumers, and by receiving intrinsic satisfaction from what we do to earn our living."

The nomination committee for Woods is organizing an arts benefit for the candidate, called *A Poet for Parliament*.

Woods described herself as "a blue socialist," saying she advocates small-scale private enterprise while recognizing the NDP as a party which "understands best, and cares most about, the hard realities of most people's lives."

## Youth advisory group seeks help from adults

Gulf Islands youth need constructive and stimulating activities as preventive measures to problems, says Youth Extension Program (YEP) co-ordinator Judith Knight.

And to make these programs work, she says, adult involvement and community support is imperative.

Knight feels problems like juvenile crime and drug and alcohol abuse could be prevented if young people are provided with — and help create — alternative activities.

YEP's purpose is to work with teens, helping them plan and organize their activities, and then watching things happen. But Knight stresses that adult participation is necessary and rewarding.

"People on the island would get a sense of self-worth if they volunteered time for something as positive as this," she says.

Teens on the island have responded enthusiastically to the program, Knight notes. At a recent meeting, 14 youths representing a variety of ages volunteered their energies for the teen council.

Adult volunteers are needed in a number of areas, including two individuals for the teen council,

and several others for the advisory committee. The adult volunteers for the teen council will work with the youths to organize YEP activities.

The teen council will take its plans and ideas to the all-adult advisory committee. Members of this committee, Knight hopes, will be chosen from the community by the teen council.

Others who volunteer will either be placed in a central group and called upon to supervise dances, for example, or assigned to specific areas of talent. Knight hopes the activities will range from sports to creative workshops for dancing, acting and writing. Both areas will need specialized volunteers.

Those willing to volunteer in any area should contact Knight at the community centre.

The latest in a series of YEP-sponsored workshops — entitled *The law and you* — will deal with youth rights.

Victoria lawyer Colin Robinson will speak on the subject February 9 in the high school band room. The workshop will begin at 3:10 pm.

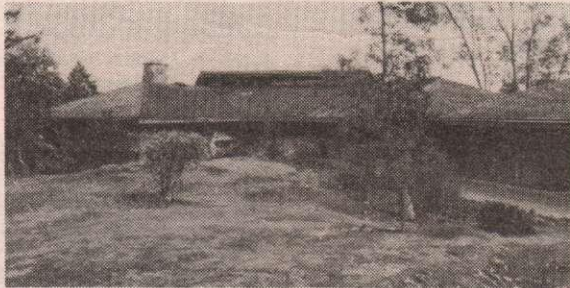

# Toughest phase of season no match for FC guns

Salt Spring F.C. 2, Victoria Royal Elks 0.

Salt Spring F.C. has completed its most difficult month of the season in fine style; a victory, first place, and a celebratory dinner at Vesuvius Inn.

In December the prospects for January looked bleak. At the Christmas break, F.C. found itself in second place, in a close race for first with three other teams, all of which the local side was scheduled to play on successive Sundays.

I must admit that at that juncture, T.S. Eliot's belief that "April is the cruellest month ..." looked pretty idiotic. He obviously hadn't seen our schedule.

In any case, February is here, F.C. is in first place (and facing the easiest portion of its schedule), and the universe is unfolding as it should.

Sunday's match was a potentially explosive affair as the

two teams took advantage of some extremely lenient officiating. By ignoring some early violent challenges, the referee encouraged the two teams to provide a match that was played with all the gentlemanly conduct of a wildebeest mating ritual (yes, head-butts were allowed!)

F.C.'s first goal resulted from a free kick awarded when David Toynbee was pulled down from behind on a breakaway. Trevor Tamboline, from 20 yards, rocketed the ball into the top right corner of the goal.

Leading 1-0, Salt Spring concentrated on what the team does best — defend. To my knowledge, there is not a team in any league in Victoria that can match F.C.'s back-four and goalkeeper. Lance Lomax, Arnie Hengstler, Lyle Brown, Trevor Tamboline, and Ken Marr make up this formidable combination.

On Sunday these five withstood

a continuous seven-man attack for virtually the entire game. If one must look for comparisons for Elks, look no further than Wimbledon of the English First Division. Their two teams play a similar brand of soccer in that they employ three physical defenders, and for all intents and purposes, seven front runners. Basically by by-passing the midfielders through long balls up front, Elks can harass and intimidate opposing defences for 90 minutes.

For Salt Spring's midfielders — Michael Brown, Jack Braak, and Tony Legg — this style can pose some problems. In F.C.'s attack the midfield represents the key element. Most offensive thrusts are the result of methodical buildups from the back-four through the three linkmen. When these two diametrically opposed systems clash, it can lead to the unhappy spectacle of the three halves acting like a sort of pig-in-the-middle;

first chasing the ball forward, then back. It is a difficult chore to break that cycle, although happily F.C. wrested control over the game from Elks in the final 25 minutes.

F.C.'s frontrunners ran miles on Sunday (who was it who said *Every mile is two in winter?*) David Toynbee, Jonathan Oldroyd, Ken Duke, Gordon Hitchcock and Miles Wilson created much havoc for the Elks defenders. Ken and

Jonathan in particular pursued the defense from the kick-off to the final whistle.

Finally, Salt Spring iced the game on a beautifully taken free-kick by Lyle Brown. Spotting Tony loose in the centre of the Elks defence, he threaded a low ball which Tony flicked on for Ken Duke, who calmly deposited the ball into the corner of the net.

A perfect shot. A perfect result.

Another factor was the steady play of full-back Tony Marshall, who quietly and efficiently went about doing his job expecting no more than to contribute to another Selects victory.

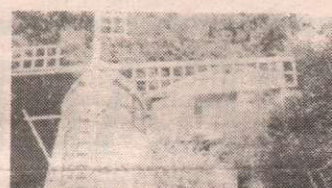
Getting back on the winning track was important as the boys have a key Sun Cup match coming soon, and the solid win should see them well prepared.

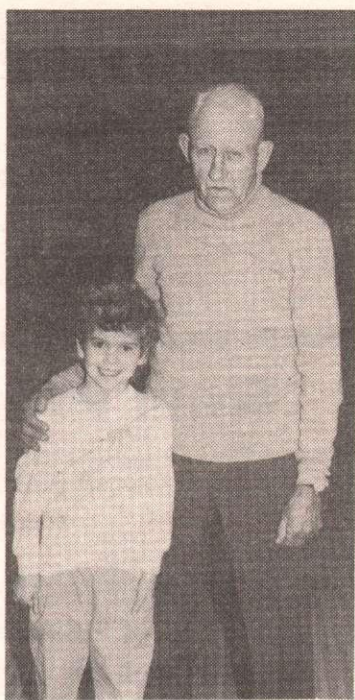

**Twenty-five years ago**

- Due to inadequate screening and lack of care for outlets, trout escaping from Weston Lake were dying in the shallow pools of "slash-choked" creeks. Many of the creeks had been used by trout and salmon for spawning purposes. Once outside the lake, however, the fish were unable to travel through the shallow waters and were left to die of suffocation or starvation.
- Pender Islander Terry Martinich won a nation-wide CBC contest by naming a baby gorilla. The prize winning name was *Mumba*.
- The Salt Spring Island School was slowly being transformed from a "little red schoolhouse" to one with the atmosphere of a city school. Plans for the first school annual, to be published in June, were being finalized by the graduating class.

**Twenty years ago**

- B.C. Telephone Company's 1968 expansion program included \$48,000 for additional cables and for central office facilities on Salt Spring Island.
- The work would permit customers to dial station-to-station long distance calls directly to any of more than 90 million telephones.
- A new lumber mill had been established on Salt Spring Island. Operated by Gavin Reynolds, the mill was the first of its kind on the island for several decades.
- A Beaver Point farmer reported the loss of over 200 sheep in the past year. Of a herd of 400 roaming the slopes above Fulford Harbour, Gavin Reynolds could find only 200.
- Total value of the lost sheep was estimated at \$5,000. Robert Akerman, who also ran sheep at the south end of the island, echoed Reynolds' concern. Losses were blamed on hunters and thefts carried out by boat or scow.

**down through the years**

- The cartoon by Simons has a radio announcer giving the scoop on Gulf Island weather: '1/8 inch of snow has blanketed the Gulf Islands as temperatures drop sharply to a bone-chilling 34 degrees — schools will be closed until further notice and motorists are advised ...'

**Fifteen years ago**

- A shortage of classroom space at the Mayne Island school meant some students would attend in the mornings only, while others would attend classes in the afternoons.
- Trustees of the Gulf Islands School Board hoped to have new classrooms available by mid-February. The classrooms would be portables.
- The Thrift Shop, operated by the Women's Auxiliary to Lady Minto Gulf Islands Hospital, grossed more than \$12,000 in six months of business. The group had donated over \$7,000 to the hospital for medical expenses, as

well as for supplies for the extended care wing.

- A Salt Spring Island businessman reported a lady had purchased a bottle of banana oil from his store 45 years ago. She wrote to request a second bottle: the first had recently run out. She said she needed it to continue baking her favourite cake.

**Ten years ago**

- A second meeting of the Fernwood Parents' Group met to discuss the proposed Fernwood School with members of the school board. Close to 60 parents attended.
- The major question of the evening was *why build a school at all?* Many parents doubted the necessity of a new school, feeling improvements to the present elementary school would be adequate. Salt Spring Elementary School reported an overflow of 130 students.
- A group of curlers was pressing for a rink on Salt Spring Island.

crashed into Mount Erskine in heavy fog while the group was on a flight from Nanaimo to Seattle.

**Five years ago**

- The Farmers' Market in Ganges returned to haunt the Parks and Recreation Commission at the organization's recent meeting.
- At least 30 people gathered to voice opinions on efforts to control the market. Without exception, each speaker wanted the market left as is, with only minor changes.
- A decision to drop boarding allowances received protests from Outer Islands parents, causing school board trustees to reconsider the move.
- The school board had been subsidizing boarding allowances for Outer Islands students attending school on Salt Spring. The trustees had decided to drop the allowances because daily water taxi service is available between the Outer Islands and Salt Spring.

**with driftwood**

Six curlers decided to go ahead with plans for an ice rink and to invite other island curlers to support the project.

Gordon Hutton, the spokesman for the group, said the rink could be located in one of two places and costs would involve building the structure and providing equipment.

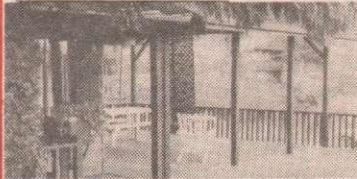

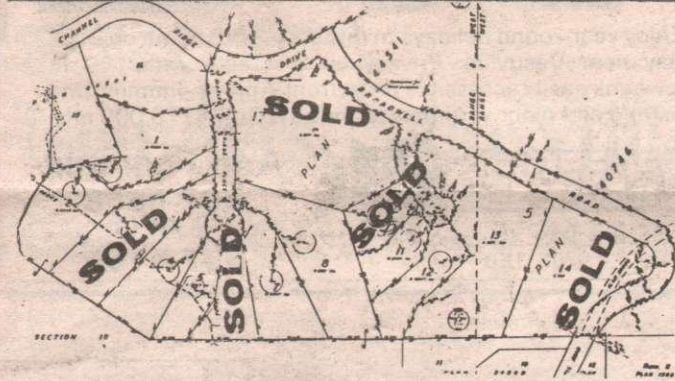
