

### After cross-Canada journey

## 'Johnny Canuck' brings trade message home

Johnny Canuck has returned home to Salt Spring after completing a cross-country journey to help fight the proposed free trade deal between Canada and the United States.

John Wilcox, whose travels as Johnny Canuck earned him widespread media attention across the country, officially completed his trip last Thursday at Mile Zero near Victoria. He and his 1941 Chev pickup — painted like the Canadian flag — had left the same spot last April 1 for a 15,000-mile journey to Newfoundland and back.

Last Saturday, Wilcox and his truck made an appearance at the Farmers' Market in Ganges. As he had been doing on the road for the past four-and-a-half months, Wilcox used the occasion to distribute information about the proposed free trade deal and to discuss its implications with passers-by.

His opposition to the free trade deal, Wilcox says, stems from a belief that it amounts to an economic annexation of Canada by the U.S. He also feels the legislation being put into place to implement the agreement is a violation of democratic rights, and that the deal itself is a threat to the right of Canadians to determine their national destiny.

When he was welcomed at Mile Zero last week, Wilcox said Sunday, speakers like Victoria Mayor Gretchin Brewin hailed him as a national hero. "But I'm not a hero," he said. "The heroes were the people who made this country, not me."

Wilcox believes his cross-Canada trip was a success because recent national polls have shown support for the free trade deal ebbing in all parts of the country.

"Support is dwindling because when people find out what they deal is about, they become strong opponents," he said. "I like to think I had a part in that, by bringing a lot of attention to the issue. In that way, the trip was more than worthwhile."

When he first went on the road, Wilcox said, his message was getting through to individuals but not to the masses. He blamed that on the penchant of most media outlets to treat him as "an anti-free-trade stunt man," and not as a serious critic of the agreement.

"They (the media) didn't care what I had to say, they just wanted to see me perform," he

said. However, half-way through his trip, Wilcox said he deliberately began to focus only on a serious analysis of the deal itself, allowing him to make a greater impact on Canadians.

A sixth-generation Progressive Conservative Party member, Wilcox is the great-grandson of an MP who voted against an earlier version of the agreement when it was introduced by Laurier's Liberals in 1911. He was welcomed as such in the House of Commons on June 30, where he sat as local MP Jim Manly's guest to watch the enactment of closure on debate of second reading of the trade bill.

The visit to Ottawa was the highlight of his journey, Wilcox said, because it included an appearance at Canada Day celebrations in the national capital. Although his presence there drew opposition from Tory MPs, he said, opposition members and

security personnel went out of their way to make him feel welcome.

Wilcox also had a run-in with Simon Reisman, Canada's free-trade negotiator, in Ottawa during Canada Day celebrations. Wilcox said the accidental face-to-face meeting soon degenerated, after Reisman called him "a fear-monger."

However, Wilcox noted that Reisman did not dispute the truth of the arguments he raised against the free-trade deal.

Other highlights of the trip were his constant meetings with ordinary Canadians, Wilcox said,

while the only low points concerned mechanical problems with his truck.

"But people helped me out, often for nothing," he said, recalling several instances where he received free use of shop facilities or the donation of parts and materials. "It was awfully hard to get bummed out and have low points when everyone was so supportive."

In his discussions with people from coast to coast and through his research on the issue, Wilcox said he has gained a tremendous understanding of both Canadians and the free trade deal — to the

point where he has found himself advising opponents of the deal on its fine points. And with the issue still unresolved, Wilcox said he intends to continue his fight.

"I'll continue to function in this area, to get involved further to help the people who opposed the deal, the proponents of a free Canada," he said. "I'll continue to be involved with this thing until it's defeated."

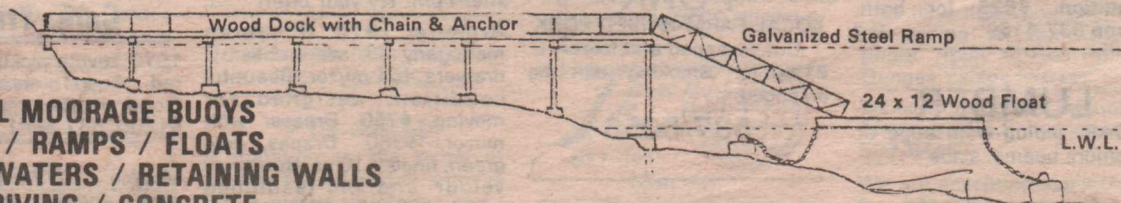
His trip across Canada was financed by the sale of *No Deal* tee-shirts and caps, with a contribution by the Council of Canadians, and by donations from individuals and groups.

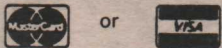

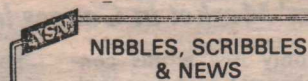

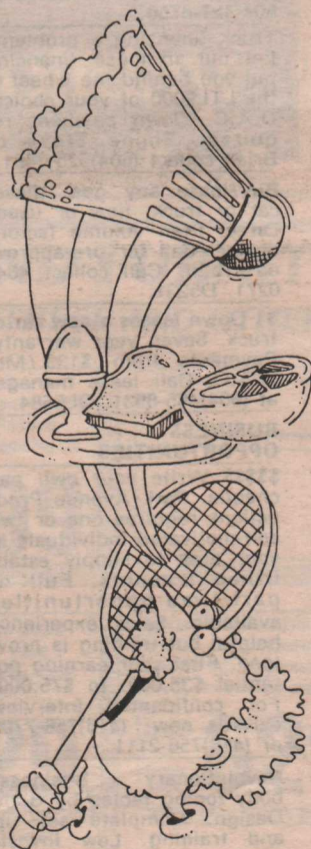

# Canal bridge closed

Construction of a new bridge over Booth Canal began earlier this week.

The highways ministry project, announced last Thursday, will see new timber pilings driven, steel stringers installed and a new bridge deck constructed.

"It will be a new bridge," Kevin Cutting, the highways ministry's district operations co-

ordinator, said last Thursday from Saanich.

Work on the new bridge should be completed by September 2. In the interim, the ministry said, it apologizes for any inconvenience suffered by motorists unable to cross the canal.

"It will be inconvenient for a couple of weeks, but the work has to be done," Cutting said. He

explained that the old bridge has deteriorated since its construction in 1977 because no preservatives were applied to the timbers used.

"None of the timbers were creosoted — they never last that way," he said. "If the wood is treated, it lasts for years and years."

Instead of waiting for the old

bridge to "fall apart," Cutting said, the highways ministry decided to install a new structure as soon as possible.

"We're moving rather quickly on it," he said, adding that the one unfortunate aspect of a fast start is that islanders received scant warning of the project and the inconvenience it might mean for motorists.

# Fish farm boundary to grow?

An application for a licence of occupation in Sansum Narrows, made by Mae West Ltd., will bring the company's Salt Spring Island fish farm permit into line with expansion at the plant.

"We're taking care of details," said David Munday at Mae West's Maple Bay branch.

The original application for the fish farm, which is located near Burgoyne Bay on Sansum Nar-

rows, allowed for two hectares of surface structure. Munday said the original design for the farm did not incorporate sufficient anchorage area. A further seven hectares was needed to obtain anchorage holding power.

The permit application is being handled by the forests and lands ministry, and Munday indicated its processing is a formality. If regulations now in place had been in effect when the company first

applied for the Sansum Narrows fish farm site, he explained, the additional area now being sought would have been included with the permit.

The fish farm, which began operations in 1986, produced 40 tons of chinook salmon in the last year. For the upcoming year, it estimates a total production of 140 tons and expects to reach full-scale production in 1990,

selling between 200 and 220 tons. Relative to others in the industry, Munday said the Salt Spring Island farm is fairly successful, with a good survival rate and good production of larger fish. He said Sansum Narrows, which is home to two other fish farms, is an "excellent" area for fish production.

Expansion of the anchorage area has already taken place.

## Budget concerns prompt commission to decline Weston Lake work project

The Salt Spring Island Parks and Recreation Commission declined last Monday (August 6) to become involved in maintenance of Weston Lake.

"If we start fixing it, then we're married to it," commission members agreed, noting the lake is not the commission's responsibility and never has been.

The decision came after a plan to fix a deteriorating float at the lake was proposed by a Weston Lake resident. The resident offered to form a work party to make repairs to the float if the commission would provide the necessary materials.

The present condition of the float is described as dangerous, with nails protruding through the boards.

Commission members noted that they have not taken responsibility for Weston Lake in the past, and decided they should not take it now, especially while their finances are particularly tight.

The Parks and Recreation Commission decided August 6 that they do not have the finances to meet another request for assistance.

A letter sent to the commission directed its attention to the lack of

facilities at *Bader's Beach*, located at the end of *Collins Road*. The letter described the area as a "mess," and commented on the lack of washroom facilities.

Commission members agreed the area needs a toilet; however, they said they are financially unable to take on any further responsibilities.

If the public should agree through referendum (presently planned for November) to provide the commission with further tax revenues, members said, the commission would then have the opportunity to take on added expenses.

An agreement reached by the Parks and Recreation Commission could result in a future bicycle rest area on *Beaver Point Road*.

Commission members discussed potential uses for a piece of land tentatively offered to them

from a *Beaver Point Road* subdivision. The area, which borders the main road, measures approximately 150 by 70 feet.

Members agreed in principle they they should accept the donation, and discussed the long-term possibility of providing a bicycle rest area on the parcel.

## July visits higher

Visitor traffic to Salt Spring Island bulged in July, according to statistics kept at the Travel InfoCentre office in Ganges.

The office reported last week that 4,903 visitors dropped by the centre in July — an increase of approximately 45 per cent over

the 3,924 noted for July, 1987.

In addition, the newly-opened satellite information office in *Fulford Harbour* recorded 1,329 visitors in July.

Chamber of Commerce president said the totals for July are thought to be a record.

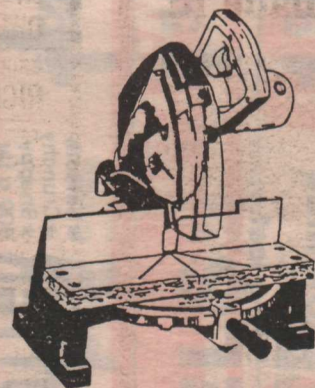

# Recycling efforts to increase on Salt Spring

In anticipation of an apparent solid waste disposal dilemma on Salt Spring Island, greater recycling efforts will be undertaken here.

With the help and support of the Community Society, recycling efforts are to be doubled, according to Dr. Hugh Borsman, Salt Spring's representative to the Capital Regional District (CRD).

Borsman noted the Community Society has an active committee working on recycling, and that the community has been "most fortunate to have them continue to carry on this essential service."

The disposal of solid waste is problematic on Salt Spring, because the present Blackburn dump site is in the Cusheon Lake watershed, which is the source of

drinking water for many households.

One possible solution to the concern involves changing the present dump site into a transfer station and hauling island garbage to the Hartland dump on Vancouver Island. The estimated cost of this alternative is an average of \$160 to \$175 per household per year. It would cost

a further \$72 each per year if garbage were collected at the door.

Continuing the dump as it is poses two problems: one is the potential hazard of leachate getting into Blackburn and Cusheon Lakes. The second is that when the CRD waste management plan (recently submitted for approval)

is adopted by the government, it will replace existing waste management permits. When this occurs, Salt Spring will no longer have an approved dump site.

Dr. Borsman, along with the local Solid Waste Committee chaired by Tom Gosset, intends to call a public meeting to discuss the problem.

## down the years

### Twenty-five years ago

- Close to 600 people watched sky-divers Leif Moe and Glen Brundage put on a "thrilling" display of their sport as the opening performance for Pirate Days.

Following the dance, four 52-foot canoes, each propelled by an 11-man crew, took part in a race around the crescent-shaped lake.

### Twenty years ago

- A Nanaimo dog trainer placed first and Salt Spring Island's Bill Evans, with King, came in second at the first official sheep dog trials to be staged on the island for more than 30 years.

Wild mountain sheep were provided for the trials by Ted Akerman.

- Trustees of the Gulf Islands school district expressed regret that the Salt Spring Island library had rejected any plans for the merger of the public library and the school library.

The proposal would take nothing from the community library, said one trustee, but would offer better facilities.

The library is a way of life for many on Salt Spring Island, another trustee remarked: any change would be over "their dead bodies."

- It would collectively cost Outer Gulf Islands students \$4,000 more to live on Salt Spring Island to attend school. Renovations to the dormitories will cost close to that amount.

Decorations, plumbing and floor coverings had all been changed along with new lighting fixtures and new kitchen arrangements.

### Fifteen years ago

- The world premiere of Gardner

McKay's play *Sea Marks* was to be presented at Fulford Hall and tested on Salt Spring Island audiences before its presentation in Los Angeles.

- A photograph showed Jack Lamb standing beside a parsnip plant. When he left the parsnip in the ground to go to seed, the St. Mary Lake resident expected a fair sized plant and some seed. He did not expect the parsnip to grow to a height of 11 feet.

- Three Salt Spring Island youths returned from an exciting week in Portland, Oregon.

David Woodley, Mike Rozanno and Wayne Reynolds were chosen earlier in the baseball season as part of the Babe Ruth 13-year-old All Star team of Ladysmith and District. The boys travelled to Oregon, where they played three exhibition games, winning all three.

### Ten years ago

- The Stowell Lake watershed received attention from the Islands Trust with an amendment to the bylaws restricting the area to one residence per five-acre lot.

There would be no provision for an additional cottage per parcel.

- Although the beer strike continued, the liquid could be obtained at the Ganges liquor store. Price was \$26 for 48 bottles per customer. The high price reflected shipping costs from the United States.

- Local weavers were commissioned to create a wall-hanging for the Royal Bank in Victoria.

- A beach fire on Saturna Island cost two men \$20 each in court. They were accused of starting a fire within 20 feet of beached logs. By the time the fire had been put out, it had burned more than 1,200 square feet of logs.

### Five years ago

- The grand aggregate winner at the weekend's Salt Spring Island Garden Club summer flower festival went to Mrs. Freda Carter. Prize for the best exhibit went to I.C. Shank of Churchill Road.

- A re-definition of watershed areas would be investigated by the Salt Spring Island Trust Committee to ensure they were appropriately identified.

The re-definition came as a result of the Islands Trust modification of minimum lot sizes for property lying in watershed areas. The minimum lot size had recently been changed from seven to 12 hectares.

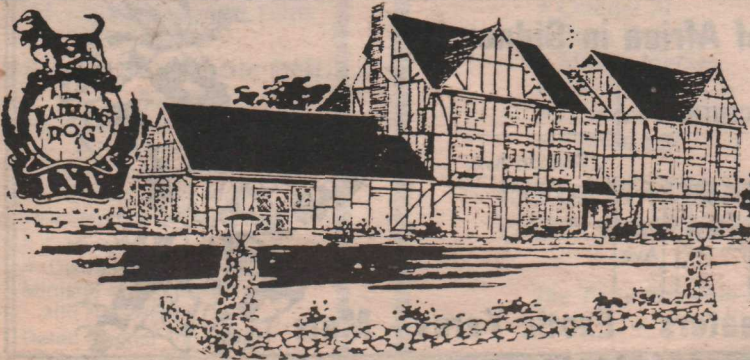

# Interpretative programs continue at Ruckle Park

The Red Cross equipment loan service at Lady Minto Hospital may have to be closed unless volunteers come forward to help with the distribution of equipment.

Volunteer Red Cross representative Carol Simpson said last week that the service is presently being operated by hospital staff, but because it is not part of their job description, the service may cease if volunteers cannot be found.

The service loans medical equipment such as wheelchairs, walkers and commodes, free of charge, to people recovering from surgery or injury.

"Last year 157 people on Salt

Spring were loaned 180 articles of medical equipment by the Red Cross," Simpson said. "This was an increase of 60 per cent in the number of people using the service over the previous year."

Simpson hopes to gather a group of volunteers interested in giving out equipment at the hospital.

"If we can get a group of people, we can organize so that each volunteer only has to put in a couple of hours a week," she said, noting that increased numbers of volunteers will mean more flexibility of service.

Simpson said that with the large population of seniors on Salt Spring Island, the loan service is

a "vital community benefit." Most of the people helped by the service are on a pension and cannot afford rental fees, she continued.

Simpson also pointed out that donations made to the service are specifically used to purchase equipment for the outlet in Ganges.

"Working in the loans service is very much a people job," Simpson said. "You get to meet a lot of people and help them when they need help most."

All programs are free and open to everyone, not just campers at Ruckle Park. Unless otherwise noted, all events begin at the Meeting Place in the park.

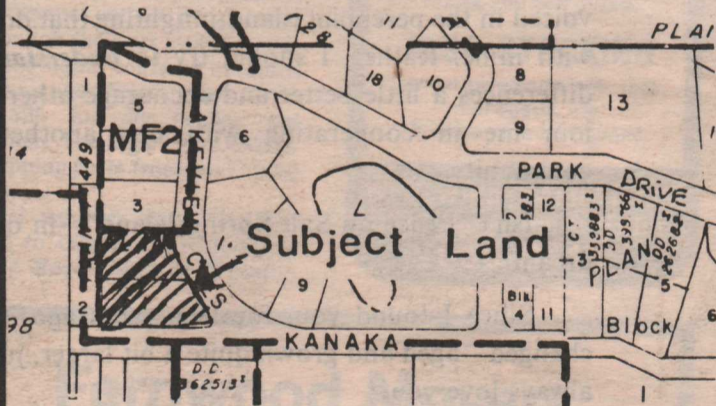

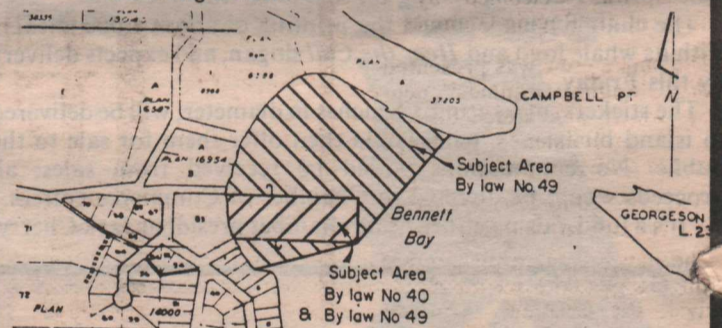

1. Proposed Mayne Island Trust Committee Bylaw No. 40, being "Mayne Island Planning Area Zoning Bylaw, 1980, Amendment Bylaw No. 2, 1987", is a bylaw to amend "Mayne Island Planning Area Zoning Bylaw, 1980". In general terms the intent of the proposed bylaw is:

a) to add a new zoning classification "W-3L (Water Commercial Limited) Zone which allows for wharfage and moorage for patron access to abutting upland commercial development. The Bylaw also contains regulations relating to such matters as the height and length of floats, the use of a breakwater, and a prohibition of buildings or shelters on a float.

b) to change the zoning classification of Lot 560 covered by water in Bennett Bay, Mayne Island, from the W-2 Water Moorage Zone to the W-3L (Water Commercial Limited) Zone as shown on Plan No. 1 attached to the Bylaw.

2. Proposed Mayne Island Trust Committee Bylaw No. 49, being "Official Community Plan (Mayne Island) Bylaw, 1978, Amendment Bylaw No. 1, 1988", is a Bylaw to amend "Official Community Plan (Mayne Island) Bylaw, 1978" by:

a) designating a portion of Bennett Bay, Mayne Island, to be a Development Permit Area pursuant to Section 945 4(e) of the *Municipal Act* as shown on Plan No. 1 attached to the Bylaw.

The general location of the subject area is shown on the sketch on above.
