

Chip truck denied park vending bid

A Salt Spring Island entrepreneur is furious at the "run-around" given him by the Parks and Recreation Commission, which has denied him permission to vend in Centennial Park in mid-week.

Myles Wilson, whose father Scotty ran the Fryin' Scotsman chip wagon until his death earlier this year, recently learned the commission has denied his request for space to vend in Centennial Park.

The commission wrote Wilson a letter, informing him it had "carefully considered (his) request" but "passed a motion to limit vending only to the Saturday Farmers' Market."

Wilson argues that there has been a fish and chip wagon in the park for at least 17 years (the Fryin' Scotsman has occupied space there for the past six or seven) and, more important, that the people of Salt Spring said

"yes" to mid-week vending in a vote held several years ago.

"It was voted in by the people and it should be voted out by the people," he says.

Both Wilson and his mother, Nora, have consulted lawyers on the issue, and both believe they have a right to vend in the park.

The denial puts an extra burden on Nora Wilson, who planned to work a few days a week for her son. Mrs. Wilson has health problems, making it difficult for her to work on a permanent basis: "I can work with Myles," she says, "because if I feel weak, I can go and sit down."

Wilson says that since his father died, his mother has been unable to get by on her pension. Working for him was to be her "ticket off welfare."

Nora Wilson says the "whole thing is just not fair." She says each summer they have carefully cleaned any mess in the park

created by their business. She says the chip wagon has become a tourist attraction and serves as an "information booth" as well as a take-out food service.

Wilson is looking to establish a year-round fish and chip business on Salt Spring; however, the building he plans to move into is six months behind its construction schedule.

Commission chairman Neville Smith says it was a "difficult" decision for the group to make. He says the motion to restrict vending to Saturdays was passed by a four to three vote.

The commission received a second request for mid-week use

of the park, he says, and the group expressed concern over potential expansion. "How could we determine who could be there and who couldn't?"

The commission was also aware that Wilson intends to move into a permanent location, Smith says: "It seemed timely . . . to make the decision."

country gourmet

**I ate with jaws that ached from famine
And my teeth felt thick with cobwebs**

Apuleius

One person who was never late with dinner was Anthimus, the cook who prepared meals eaten by the short-tempered Alaric the Goth. Alaric's appetite for plunder was only equalled by his lust for the scallops and wines that were offered to him in huge quantities by the cringing inhabitants of Italy.

The highlight of Alaric's career was the sack of Rome in 410. After winning the gold medal, so to speak, in rapine and pillage, Alaric, like so many since, grew bored and depressed. He'd besieged and wrecked everything available and even scaring vestal virgins with the Ultimate Disgrace had lost its appeal.

There remained only his faithful Anthimus who struggled to revive the conqueror with fresh victories from the kitchen.

I came across the cookbook of Anthimus by accident one hot and dusty day in the silent recesses of the University of Washington library. The Latin was ghastly and dissonant: a linguistic reflection of the social chaos of the Roman Empire stumbling into oblivion. There were, however, some golden recipes scattered through his book.

I wondered about him. He obviously loved cooking; but working for Alaric must have been no picnic. What impulse led him to write down the secrets of his kitchen at a time when his employer was doing everything possible to extinguish literacy? The future of cuisine was certainly dim after Alaric gave Rome the coup de grace. The spice trade had collapsed. It would be 11 centuries before the Portuguese could manage to claw their way around South Africa and then sail the monsoons to the fabulous spice markets of India.

Pride in his art

I lost track of time. The shadows crept along the shelves and the janitors had begun to work. They ignored me but I could tell they didn't want me to stay any longer in their library. They called to each other in bad English. One of them smoked. Their topics of conversation seemed remarkably similar to Alaric's: weapons, sex, warlike sports. It was extremely irritating.

I replaced the little book and came to a conclusion about Anthimus. He lived with barbarians who devoured the resources of the world for their temporary enrichment. He kept sane by taking pride in his art and he wrote it down to preserve it.

If it's my destiny to be hired as chef for the CEO of MacMillan Bloedel, you can bet I'll keep a copy of Anthimus over the stove!

Anthimus used the word *nivea*, or *snowballs*, to describe his scallops. No doubt he wrote his book in the Goths' winter quarters and the image came naturally.

The same snow has fallen on everyone this year, too. As I write this the white rain lies in drifts around my house and the realtors are having more difficulty than usual persuading emigres from Toronto that we really do live on Canada's Hawaiian Islands.

Delicious surprises

Anthimus got his scallops from the English Channel: "These scallops are in themselves excellent and abundant enough with us and from the clear flesh of these same scallops are made balls of snow." I get mine from the Captain's Cupboard in Fulford, a store that's always full of delicious surprises.

Scallops can be deep-fried, sauteed, bisqued (is that *really* a word?), baked, broiled and creamed. Like brasseries they often have to play a supporting role. Most seafood restaurants have a "captain's plate" which is ordered by people who have enormous difficulty making decisions. Among the heap of cod, salmon, oysters and prawns you will always find a scallop or two. It's the same with chowders.

The best places know that scallops deserve their own plate. A Chinese restaurant I visit in Victoria serves a fantastic dish: swimming scallops in an agrodolce black bean sauce that falls upon the tongue like Alaric upon Rome: with ravishment and evil intentions.

After my first encounter with this marvellous creation I tried to express my delight to the waiter. Unfortunately, he spoke little useful English and kept backing away from me, having received totally the wrong message. Since then I eat my scallops in a glacial Anglo-Saxon silence which seems to please the waiters at this gifted, but eccentric, restaurant.

Snowballs

| 8 oz scallops, dry weight | ¼ t cumin |
| ¼ t ground pepper | 1 T white wine |
| ½ celery seed | ¼ C melted butter |
| 1 T fresh parsley | breadcrumbs |
| ½ fresh mint | |

In a mortar grind pepper, celery seed, parsley, mint and cumin. Add the seasonings to the melted butter. Dip the scallops in the sauce then roll them in breadcrumbs. Saute in olive oil for five minutes.

Alternatively, use parsley (chopped very fine), dill, corinader and chives.

Scallop snowballs make a splendid hors-d'oeuvre with, of course, a glass of white wine or, if you can invent the excuse, some iced champagne.

Gulf Islanders ready to launch water project

Residents of several of the Gulf Islands are now en route to Nicaragua to help install a \$75,000 drinking water system for a heavily-populated village on an island in the Central American country.

The project, set to begin sometime this month and be concluded a few months later, was made possible by \$12,000 raised in the Gulf Islands.

The community contribution — which included a \$10,000 donation from one Salt Spring resident — was matched by the B.C. Save the Children Fund. The Canadian International Development Agency (CIDA) provided the remainder.

The money will be used to purchase and install pumps and pipes to replace the ones now in use on Ometepe, an island in Lake Nicaragua. The condition of the current system is blamed for water-related health problems.

The seeds of the water system installation project were sown last year, when residents of the Southern Gulf Islands initiated a twinning with the residents of the Central American island. One of the intentions of the twinning was

to upgrade the quality of life on Ometepe by the provision of technical help to its residents.

Among those active in promoting the project were Ron Pither, who leaves his Mayne Island home later this month to oversee installation of the water system,

and George Harris of Galiano, who has left for Ometepe by motorhome and who also expects to be in Ometepe later this month.

Joining the two Outer Islands residents in Nicaragua will be Salt Spring's Andrew and Betty Gib-

son, who flew to Costa Rica last week to meet with a water consultant working for CARE International, an agency that has offered its assistance in purchasing materials, getting the islanders to Ometepe, and providing technical help.

Another Salt Spring resident, John Norget, visited Ometepe in November to see the present water system and meet with area residents. He says the villagers are eagerly awaiting the gift of water from their sister islands in Canada.

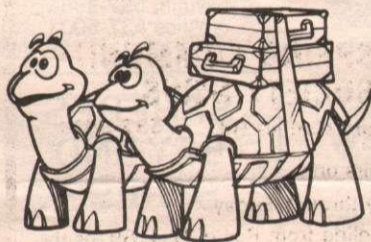

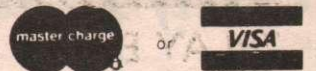

Twenty-five years ago

A salute to Vernon Case Morris, who has completed 50 years of service with the Ganges water system, was made by chairman C.R. Horel on behalf of the North Salt Spring Water District trustees at the annual meeting, held last week.

Morris saw installation of the first water line from Maxwell Lake to Ganges in 1914. At that time he was employed by the old Ganges Water Company and is still associated with its successor, the publicly-owned water system.

Students at Ganges school competed in an oratorical contest. There were 23 entrants in four divisions. Cindy Reynolds was the primary winner and Sharon McManus took the junior division. Intermediate winner was Bruce Hildred while Gail Slingsby topped the seniors.

A proposed subdivision on Old Scott Road brought protests at a meeting of the Salt Spring Chamber of Commerce. Residents objected to the 12-lot subdivision on a waterfront farm in the area. The lots would be 75 feet wide at the water line and be located on a steep slope. The subdivision met the required minimum size, the meeting was told.

Twenty years ago

An overloaded electrical circuit was blamed for the death of an elderly Ganges man.

Clyde Brewsaugh was overcome by smoke when his Mouat's Point home was destroyed. The alarm was sounded by Jim Napper, who saw the smoke and flames. When firemen arrived to bring the fire under control, the body of Brewsaugh was discovered laying near a window, suggesting that he was seeking to get out of the house.

Fire Chief Fred Donaghy attributed the death to a failure in the electrical circuit. He explained that 30-amp fuses had been used and the circuit was not designed to take such a load.

Helicopters were called into service on a construction job on Salt Spring this week. It is the first operation of its kind in local history.

The aircraft were flying cement for the foundations of the hydro transmission towers on the top of Mt. Erskine. Access to the rough terrain by normal means proved impossible so the helicopters were put into use.

Lady Minto Hospital received approval to expand its facilities. The health care facility would be adding 15 beds in a new extended care wing. The approval came from the ministry of health and

would be subject to approval by the Capital Regional Hospital Board.

Fifteen years ago

Four young Salt Spring residents drowned on Friday when they attempted to cross Stewart Channel in a canoe during a wild storm. The first clue of the tragedy came to light when the body of Nancy Jane Morrill was found floating in the water near the overturned canoe. The dead woman was wearing a life jacket.

RCMP reported the 21 year-old woman was one of a party of four that left Musgrave Landing early Friday to make a regular trip to Duncan for supplies. They were headed for Maple Bay. Also believed drowned are Douglas Hosford, 21, Michael Walls, 21, and Richard Hunt, 25.

All were living at Musgrave Landing in a commune. The loss represents the sixth canoe fatality in island waters this winter. Last fall two youths were drowned when their canoe capsized during a trip from Ganges to Prevost Island.

As meat prices rise, rustlers are busy on Salt Spring Island. Beaver Point farmer Mike Byron reported two animals stolen last week. A Suffolk ewe and a purebred Suffolk lamb are gone from the farm and a neighbouring farmer suffered a similar theft when a goat was stolen. There has been no sign of either of the livestock or the thieves.

Ten years ago

While the *Bowen Queen* and the *Mayne Queen* were in dry-dock being stretched, service on the Swartz Bay-Fulford run to and from Salt Spring was being handled by the *Motor Princess* and the highways department ferry *Tachek*. The two vessels maintained a schedule of hourly service between the two ferry terminals.

Local MLA and provincial secretary Hugh Curtis came to Salt Spring to present a cheque for \$30,000 to the Farmers' Institute. The money was from the provincial lottery fund and was intended to help the institute purchase land on Rainbow Road for a permanent home for the organization.

The Islands Trust threatened court action if Pinchin Holdings took action on its foreshore lease at Bennet Bay on its foreshore lease. The lease for extensive moorage facilities in the bay had been granted by the provincial government despite opposition to the plans by the Trust.

Trust chairman John Rich said a compromise could be arranged to

allow docking facilities but under control of the Trust.

Five years ago

Regular seaplane service between Ganges and Vancouver harbours began Monday.

Harbour Air Ltd. is offering service four days a week, with daily service beginning in May. There will be two flights each way during the week.

Redevelopment of Centennial Park at Ganges has become an objective for the Salt Spring Sea Capers committee, with \$3,000 already allocated towards construction of a bandshell.

Allocation of the money, which was decided at a recent meeting of the committee, makes Sea Capers the first organization to commit funds to a facelift of the park. The \$3,000 represents a surplus from last year, and any future surplus will be used for the same purpose.

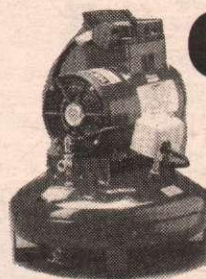

Jeff Brown of the Stingers played a great defensive game against the Galiano Otters, but his team's overall effort fell short. Galiano recorded a 4-1 win.

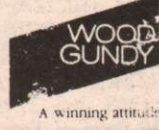

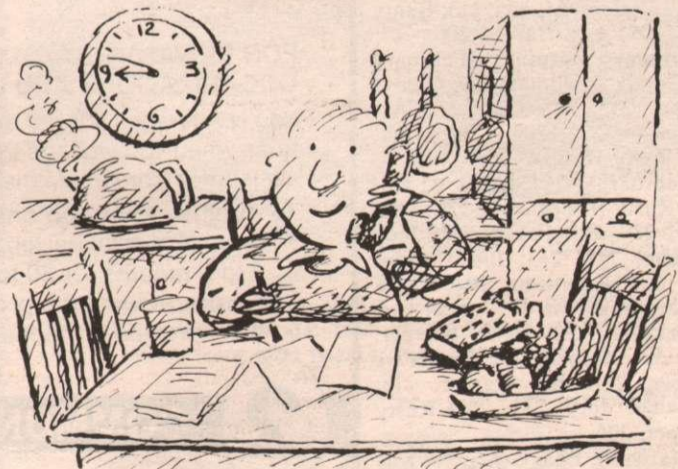
