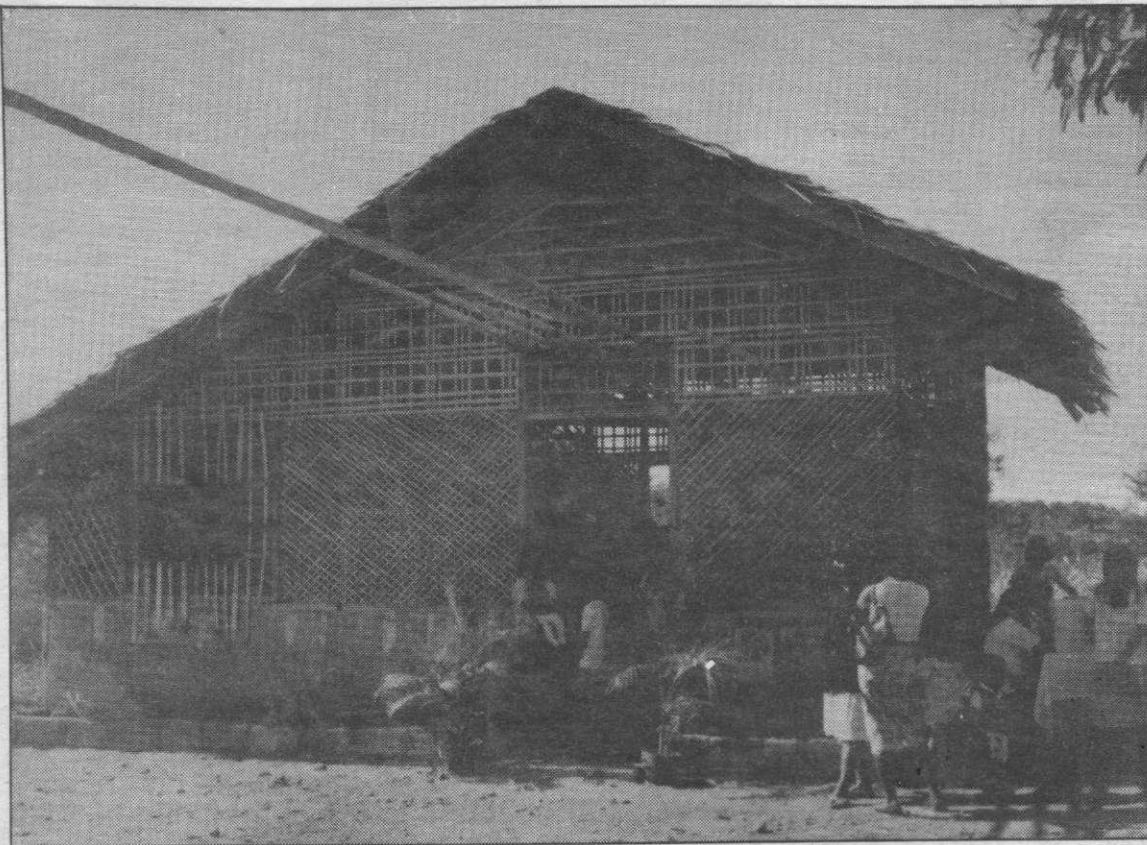

World Development Tea supports projects overseas

"Thank you very much for your letter and the enclosed cheque of \$3,000 for the TB control project in Altamirano, Mexico. Dr. Stephen Gray, who is the co-ordinator for that project and plans to be in Mexico in September and October, also extends his very best wishes and gratitude for your encouragement and assistance."

"While we are happy that CIDA is matching the project funds on a three-to-one basis, we are especially grateful to your group for starting the funding for this project."

"Thank you very much for your cheque of \$500 recently received toward water development in Zimbabwe."

"After hearing Joyce Chikaro discuss the water and sanitation programs in Zimbabwe, I am sure you have heard how very well those projects are being operated and what it has done to lower the incidences of disease in areas."

"At this time I wish to share a little bit with you about the program towards which your money will be used . . . I walked with a group up a stream until we came to a spring that they will be able to access. Springs are then properly channelled into a holding tank, pips put up towards the village and a separate holding tank to which the villagers come for water."

The above quotes are excerpts from letters received from 1985 to 1987 from the Save the Children Fund and the Y-International. Salt Spring Island money is passed to them because they know how to assess needs and to work with CIDA to obtain grants.

The World Development group on Salt Spring Island is ecumenical, being composed of members of the Anglican, Community Gospel, Roman Catholic and United churches.

Each year, the women of the churches take a turn to make the arrangements. This year, members of the Roman Catholic Church are in charge. They plan to hold the tea in the United Church because there will be a little more room.

The tea is set for this Saturday, April 29, beginning at 1 pm.

Home baking will be in the upper hall, while the tea room will be downstairs. The ladies of the Roman Catholic Church are in charge of the tea, with junior volunteers and Pathfinders helping to serve.

Ladies from the Community Gospel Chapel will sell white elephant items; the Anglicans will sell home baking, and the United Church people will sell plants.

Last year's proceeds from the tea and sale were just over \$3,000. Of that, \$2,000 went, through Y-International, to assist in practical training for nurses to work in impoverished areas in the Philippines. Another \$750 was given to Ten Days for World Development to help bring potable water to Ometepe in Nicaragua. And \$750 was given to the Inter-Church Fund for International Development in Malawi, Africa.

Each project is small in itself. The hope is that many groups, funding many such undertakings, will eventually lead to this being a fairer and more peaceful world.

To guide course in coming year

CWL selects new slate of officers

The Salt Spring Island Council of the Catholic Women's League (CWL) held its regular meeting on April 12, commencing with Mass and a short homily by spiritual director Fr. P.A. Bergin, at Our Lady of Grace Church.

Father Bergin's homily, which addressed the importance of League women working to foster vocations to the religious life, was followed by the business meeting in the parish hall. President Val Gyves took the chair.

Christian Family Life Convenor Ruth Liston spoke on the Victoria Pro-Life Society's proposed Crisis Pregnancy Group Home, plus the fifth annual Walk-for-Life being held in Victoria on Saturday, May 27. Members voted to send a donation to help establish the crisis home.

Members were reminded of the Diocesan Annual Meeting being hosted by St. Patrick's Council in Victoria on May 16, and the B.C. and Yukon Provincial Convention being held in Port Alberni from June 20 to 23.

Plans were finalized for the World Development Tea being hosted by the Catholic parish of

Salt Spring Island this year, with Elsa Drummond as general convenor. The event is scheduled to take place Saturday, April 29, in the United Church hall from 1 pm to 3 pm.

This is an ecumenical project, presented annually by the four main churches on Salt Spring — Anglican, Catholic, Full Gospel and United. Proceeds are directed to Third World countries, providing aid in areas such as the provision of equipment and pure water for schools, hospitals and clinics.

The Catholic hall is not large enough for a project of this size,

and members have accepted a generous invitation to use the United Church Hall this year.

Islanders present at session in Nanaimo

More than 250 New Democratic Party (NDP) delegates from Vancouver Island, Mackenzie and the Gulf Islands gathered in Nanaimo three weekends ago for a first-ever regional workshop.

Salt Spring was represented by six delegates — Irene Wright, Sue Bradford, Peter Pentz, Joan and Gordon Calderhead, and Virginia Newman.

Ten main issues were discussed at the convention and of those, three resolutions were considered to be in urgent need of being acted upon. They included the eradication of poverty, protection and reclamation of watersheds and, under a resolution tabled by Salt Spring resident Susan Bradford, the phasing out of all pesticides with long-term damaging effects to the environment.

Bradford's resolution also called for all food sold in B.C. to be labelled with notice of all pesticides and processes applied to them, so that consumers can make choices.

Another resolution which received lively attention at the meeting was the relocation of the Fulford ferry terminal. NDP transportation critic Dale Lovick said he plans on speaking forcefully with the government to find out why there was a lack of democratic input into the decision-making process.

Salt Spring tops rest of B.C. in per-capita donation tally

Salt Spring Islanders contributed more per person to last year's Terry Fox Run campaign than the residents of any other community in B.C.

Compilation of results from the September, 1988, event were completed recently by the Terry Fox Run's Vancouver office. They show islanders who participated in the local run and related events raised an average of \$117 per person.

That total was ahead of the \$116 per person raised in Houston, B.C., and the \$109 per person collected in Burns Lake.

The highest total of all, meanwhile, was recorded by Dawson City, Yukon, participants. They contributed \$237 each.

In terms of dollars alone, Vancouver led the way with a total of \$45,000. Next was Port Coquitlam

and, in third spot, Victoria and Salt Spring Island at \$18,000 each. Salt Spring's dollar total was a 200 per cent increase over the amount collected in 1987.

Across B.C., last year's run raised \$500,000 for cancer research funding. It drew 100,000 participants to 470 sites in B.C. and the Yukon. Nationally, \$5.8 million was raised by 350,000 participants at 2,400 run sites.

The figures are contained in the Terry Fox Run office's newsletter for the region. It also includes a half-page profile on Damaris Rumsby, the Salt Spring Island resident who organized the local run, and praises islanders for their contributions.

Rumsby is an employee of Gulf Islands Driftwood, which has sponsored the Terry Fox Run on Salt Spring since 1987.

By unions, governments

Dead, injured workers remembered

Seventy-five years ago, on April 28, the Workers' Compensation Act received its third and final reading and became law — and yet three-quarters of a century later, working people say they are still struggling to have these laws enforced.

Four years ago, the Canadian Union of Public Employees (CUPE) led the way in calling for a national day of recognition for workers killed or injured on the job. In 1986, the Canadian Labour Congress (CLC) declared April 28 the Day of Mourning for each year in perpetuity.

Several provincial governments — including Ontario, Manitoba, Nova Scotia, New Brunswick and, for the first time, B.C. — as well as the federal government have also recognized the day. Still, more than 1,000 Canadian workers are killed on the job every year and another one-half million are injured or permanently disabled. Many die from cancer, lung disease and other ailments caused by exposure to toxic substances.

Even with these statistics, the death toll is continuing to rise every year and the CLC expects the health and safety regulations to be weakened because of the free trade deal, in an effort to conform Canadian laws with the U.S. legislation.

In Ontario, the CLC says, Bill 162 threatens to drastically reduce

the rights of injured workers to receive adequate compensation and rehabilitation from on the job accidents. Manitoba's Conservative government is now reviewing the workplace health hazard regulation in an attempt to change the current laws which establish occupational exposure levels for carcinogenic and other controlled products, saying it is to great a burden on business. The New Brunswick government has also been accused of not prosecuting employers whose health and

safety violations have led to fatalities or serious injuries of workers.

Because of this, the CLC has stepped up its campaign to make the public in general more aware of the issues at hand and is asking members and the public to contact their local MPs and let them know how they feel.

A press release received from the Victoria Labour Council says: "It is important for working people to understand that safety on the job is a right."

Firm headquartered on island purchases tree farm in Duncan

A company whose managing director operates from an office on Salt Spring has purchased the Koksilah Nursery from the provincial government.

Neal Beaumont, who works from the Ganges Centre, said Odin Industries Ltd. is pleased with the acquisition of the nursery. He said it "will add one more dimension to (the firm's) commitment to the forest industry."

The purchase of Koksilah Nursery — announced recently by Forests Minister Dave Parker and Cowichan-Malahat MLA Graham Bruce — adds to the list of companies controlled by Odin that service the forest industry.

Odin now employs 65 full-time workers.

The Koksilah Nursery has been in operation since 1964 and specializes in the container production of large western red cedar crops. It is also reputed for its production of quality lodgepole pine, Douglas fir and spruce stock.

The purchase price of \$625,000 includes 50 acres of land, equipment, improvements and inventory —

including 22 greenhouses, cold storage facilities and various other nursery structures.

The purchase also includes a contract to grow 23 million seedlings for the province over the next four years.

The transaction was completed through cash on hand and a \$340,000 bank loan.

Professional agrologist Glenn Matthews has resigned his position as a senior member of extension services of the B.C. Ministry of Forest's silviculture branch to join Odin as overseer of operations at the Koksilah Nursery. Matthews brings to the newly-purchased company over 25 years of experience in forest research and development. He is considered an expert in the field of container nursery technology and forest nursery management.

In a prepared statement, Beaumont said: "We presently supply micro-electric equipment to every major forest company in British Columbia, through our subsidiary company Forest Technology Systems, and we are pleased to be able to offer yet another high quality product to the industry."

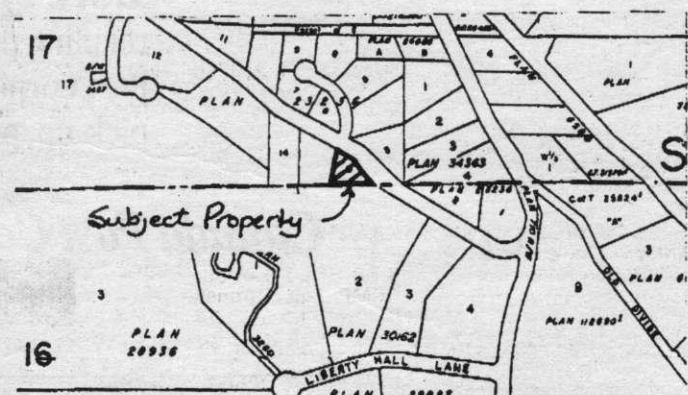
