

Chamber launches new lamb barbecue

Islanders will have the opportunity to munch on barbecued Salt Spring lamb and tap their toes to live entertainment at the Chamber of Commerce's Lamb Barbecue this Saturday.

If the event is a success, says Chamber of Commerce president Jack Cherry, it will become an annual event.

After lighting the fire on the Harbour House grounds at about 9 pm Friday, Mike Byron and associate cooks will place the first lamb on the grill at 5 am Saturday. A second will be started at 6 am, and after six hours of barbecuing, the lamb will be ready for public taste buds.

For \$7 a plate, those attending the barbecue will receive six ounces of lamb, salad and a bun or potato. Food will be served throughout the event, which is scheduled for an 11 am start. It will wind down around 7 pm.

Also scheduled for the entire day is a selection of live entertainment, including the Salty Wheels, Second Wind, Pat Byron and a karate demonstration, Gene Groomes and April Curtis, Dwayne Prosk, and John Akerhurst.

Judy Kelly is providing bus service between ferries and the Harbour House Hotel grounds as follows: a bus will meet Mainland foot passengers on the 1:20 pm sailing from Tsawwassen. The bus will depart from the Lamb Barbecue at 4:30 pm and 7:40 pm, to meet the Swartz Bay/Tsawwassen connec-

tions.

For Vancouver Island participants, the bus will arrive at Fulford Harbour in time to meet ferries leaving Swartz Bay at 8:45 am, 10:15 am and 11:45 am. The bus will leave several times throughout the afternoon to return passengers to the Fulford/Swartz Bay ferry.

Also featured on Saturday in conjunction with the barbecue will be harbour tours by boat, organized by Geoff Swift, and a 2:30 pm appearance by local MLAs Terry Huberts and Mel Couvelier.

The event is being staged as a fund-raiser for the Chamber of Commerce. In addition to collecting proceeds from food sales, the chamber has also been offered earnings from Al Hall's car wash, which will run, as usual, in the Harbour House Hotel parking lot.

If the weather is poor on Saturday, the Chamber has arranged to move the entertainment inside the Harbour House Hotel.

Salt Spring to host 30 Japanese students

Thirty Japanese students will visit Salt Spring for three weeks this summer. They are youngsters of high school age, and have joined the Cultural Homestays Institute in order to live with a host family in Canada.

Their primary aim, and the aim of CHI, is to learn about other customs and cultures and to foster international friendships and understanding. They also want to improve their English, and hope that three weeks with a Canadian family will transform their skill with written English into the spoken variety.

CHI is a non-profit organization and is a highly regarded exchange program in Japan. It has been approved by the Japanese Ministry of Education, and many students who participate in the program are given credits by their schools for their three week language training.

Cultural Homestays Institute was founded 10 years ago in California by Tom Areton, a man who grew up amongst the destructive nationalist rivalries of post-war Czechoslovakia and became convinced there had to be a better way.

So far, the focus has been primarily on establishing ties with Japan, but the eventual aim has always been to extend the program to as many countries as possible.

This year, 10,000 students will be part of a CHI exchange. Of those, 2,500 will come to British Columbia and Alberta, double the number who participated in the Canadian program last year.

Areton says that the Canadian part of CHI is the fastest growing, and reflects the particular interest of Japanese people in our country.

This year is especially important for the organization: CHI will bring a group of Taiwanese students to Victoria and another group from the

Soviet Union to the Los Angeles area of California. The success of those two exchanges will have a great influence on the future development of the Cultural Homestays Institute.

The Japanese students coming to stay on Salt Spring from July 24 until August 15 will live with local host families, spending time with them in the evenings and on weekends.

On weekdays they will work on their conversational English, formally during the mornings at their study centre at Ganges United Church, and informally during afternoon outings to beaches and parks, artists' studios and other points of interest.

One day a week they will go to Vancouver Island, to see the Provincial Museum, Sealand, Butchart Gardens and the Forestry Museum in Duncan.

The host families are a central part of the CHI program. They are not paid to be hosts, although their

expenses can be claimed as charitable donations on their income tax forms.

They are a group of people with a special interest in international friendships, who welcome any opportunity to learn more about

another culture, and enjoy the challenge of helping a student struggle with the complications of our language and customs.

They will often maintain their contact with their student guests by letter, and many have been invited

to stay with their "families" during a trip to Japan.

It is the interest, the hospitality, and the open-hearted generosity of host families that make such programs as Cultural Homestays Institute successful.

Bill and Heather Gardam are the co-ordinator/teachers for the CHI exchange program on Salt Spring and would be pleased to hear from anyone interested in being a host family or contributing in any other way to this summer's exchange.

Early these green and warm mornings in May, the happy humming honey bees of David Harris arise to the sweet trumpet music of lilacs. They rush forth into the dew drop fields and gather nectar and pollen from the green clusters of maple flowers, the gold of the dandelions, and broom, from blossoms snow white of cherries, plums and pears, and from the white and rose bloom of the legions of apple, hawthorne and arbutus.

By mid-day the apiaries are fragrant with the exquisite perfume of new spring honey. The whitened combs, heavy with liquid gold, when held to the sun, sparkle and glitter, making the jewels of the sultan dull by comparison.

In evening, beneath skies starry, these hard working creatures fan a current of air through the hive to evaporate excess moisture and to concentrate the honey into a concentration which will keep in crystalline form for 4000 years.

For those weary of the bland taste of watery, over-heated clover from cold and foreign provinces, the bees have left for their friends plenty of their exquisite mix of Sooke Mountain, and Cowichan and Salt Spring Green Valley Honey.

You will find HIGH MOUNTAIN HONEY at the happy honey house of Jeff and Joan Erickson, 2401 Fulford-Ganges Road, near the Red Barn in the Fulford Valley, at Harlan's, S.S. Nature Works, Alisi's Catering, and the Captain's Cupboard, home of fine produce and fish, overlooking the sea in Fulford.

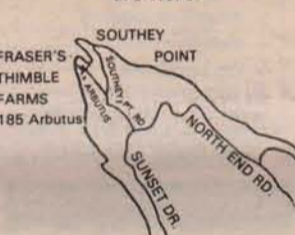

Summer recreation registrations accepted

Registration for a variety of summer recreational programs will begin May 31 at Portlock Park.

This year a new recreation director will be heading the activities. Sandra Henry has been hired for the position by Parks and Recreation Commission; she will co-ordinate programs such as the summer day camps for children, tennis, swimming and a one-week volleyball camp.

Henry said the recreation program is in dire need of private pool facilities for the months of July and August.

"We have a huge demand of kids who want to take swimming courses," she said. "There are twice as many kids that can't take the swimming programs as do, because we don't have enough facilities, so anyone who could help us out here would be greatly appreciated."

This year's swimming program once again includes the Red Cross water safety instruction and Bronze Cross courses. To take water safety instruction, individuals must have achieved the green level in swimming, and be at least 16 years old.

Those interested in the Bronze Cross course must first complete the prerequisite program — Bronze Medallion. The Bronze Medallion course is scheduled for July, while the Bronze Cross follows in August, making it possible to obtain both levels in one summer.

There will also be the parent and tot swims, family swims, CPR, and an integrated adult and handicapped adult swimming program.

The children's day camp is under the direction of Leah Kitchen for the second year. She is hoping to expand the camp to take day trips off-island, developing

theme days where the children are taken to various places such as the provincial museum in Victoria.

The day camps will run from 9:00 am to 4 pm, Monday through Friday, and offer a variety of events — such as hiking, swimming, nature awareness programs and beachcombing — to children between the ages of six and 11 years. Cost will be \$50 per week, or \$11 day on a drop-in basis.

For those who want to learn to play tennis, instructions will begin towards the end of May at Portlock Park. Individual or group lessons are available for persons of all ages.

Although Sandra Henry, 20 of Victoria, is making her first step as a recreational program director, she has a great deal of experience to draw from. A second-year student in the University of

Victoria leisure studies co-op program, she also has five years experience as a counsellor at the Crofton Bible Camp, where she was involved in counselling, bike camp touring, overnight camping and water sports.

Henry's office will be open at Portlock Park between 8:30 am and 4:30 pm on Monday, Wednesday and Friday, and from noon to 8 pm on Tuesday and Thursday. She can be reached during those hours at 537-4448.

Program registration must be done in person only. There will be a nominal cancellation fee charged to cover administration costs.



Fines handed down following break-and-enter on Galiano

A Galiano man and his New Westminster friend will pay a total of \$750 in fines, after pleading guilty in Ganges provincial court last week to their involvement in a break-and-enter offence on Galiano Island.

Galiano resident Lars Lilholt and Louis Gagnon of New Westminster pleaded guilty to breaking and entering the home of Jim Ford on January 14. Lilholt further pleaded guilty to simple assault.

Crown Counsel Derek Lister told the court that at approximately 10:40 pm on January 14, a woman at Jim Ford's residence — a garage/loft area detached from the property's main house — heard two males banging on the door. The men demanded to see Ford, who was not on the island at that time. When he did not come to the door, they kicked it in and entered.

Lister said the men then proceeded to smash lights and windows. They overturned a motorcycle, which leaked gasoline, and smashed a car battery.

In the meantime, the woman upstairs phoned the police. Jim Ford's 76-year-old mother, who lives in the main house, picked up the phone and heard the commotion on the party line. She grabbed an old shotgun — which did not have a firing pin — and hurried outside.

According to Crown evidence, she saw two individuals inside the garage area. She demanded they leave, but they refused.

Lister said Mrs. Ford pointed the gun at Lilholt, who grabbed it and attempted to twist it from her. In the process, she was forced to her knees.

As Lilholt tore the gun from the woman's hands, the skin between her thumb and fore-finger was ripped, requiring nine stitches.

Lister said the assault was not a case of Lilholt approaching Mrs. Ford with the intention of harming her.

The men then fled the scene. Police attended the following day.

Both of the men's lawyers blamed the co-accused for the damage done inside Ford's residence.

Counsel for Gagnon's defence — Vohun — said his client was sorry for the incident, in which he felt he had shown a lack of maturity. He said the event was short-lived and involved the consumption of a great deal of alcohol.

Both Vohun and Lilholt's lawyer, F. Easton, referred to an incident of "provocation" which occurred the previous summer at Coon Bay and involved an associate of Ford's.

Easton said Lilholt understands

he was trespassing and had a duty to leave when requested. He continued, however, that his response was altered by having a gun pointed at him. Lilholt did not mean to hurt Mrs. Ford, he added.

In sentencing Gagnon, the Judge noted the circumstances did not amount to a normal break and enter offence. He said alcohol was obviously at the root of the matter, and that Gagnon's behaviour could not be condoned. Taking into account the accused's low income, he fined him \$250.

The Judge fined Lilholt \$250 for the break-and-enter offence, and a further \$250 for the simple assault.

Leaving scene nets fine

A \$300 fine has been handed down to an Abbotsford man who neglected to remain at the scene of an accident in Ganges.

Nicholas Birks pleaded guilty to the offence, which occurred close to a year ago in the Harbour House Hotel parking lot. The incident took place at approximately 10:55 pm, when Birks collided with another vehicle. A passenger in the second vehicle was taken to Lady Minto Hospital.

Police traced Birks' vehicle to a residence. Red paint found on the vehicle, matched paint belonging to the second vehicle. There was no response when police knocked at the door of the residence.

The following day, Birks attended the local

RCMP detachment. He told police he was driving in the centre of the parking lot to avoid vehicles parked on either side. He said he panicked when the collision occurred because he was driving without his drivers' licence.

Defence counsel Jim Pasuta told the court that cause of the accident remains in dispute, with both parties blaming the other for the collision. Pasuta said Birks drives up to 300 miles a day in his capacity as a golf course superintendent in Abbotsford, and therefore requested the judge not suspend his drivers' licence.

Judge Filmer noted the seriousness of the offence, but agreed the circumstances could cause the accused to panic. He fined Birks \$300.

Accused caught before new penalties in place

A Ganges man who pleaded guilty to impaired driving in Ganges provincial court last week missed the new, automatic 12-month drivers' licence suspension by 1.5 hours.

Thomas James Little, 34, of Woodland Drive, pleaded guilty to the offence which took place at 10:25 pm on March 31. At 12:01 on April 1 am, the provincial government's minimum 12-month driving prohibition for impaired driving convictions came into effect.

The Crown's evidence indicated Little was stopped by Ganges RCMP as he travelled west on Upper Ganges Road. Police said Little's vehicle wandered from the road's centre line to the shoulder and back again on more than one occasion. The Crown told the court Little showed signs of impairment during a sobriety test; there was al-

cohol on his breath and his speech was slurred.

The accused was taken to the RCMP detachment where breath samples were provided.

The Crown noted the accused had a previous impaired driving conviction, in 1980.

Little agreed he was driving near the centre of the road, but attributed that to its narrow, winding pattern. He also told the court he was on medication at the time the offence occurred.

Judge Filmer noted Little's prior conviction was close to 10 years ago and said he would not take it into account. He told the accused he was lucky his breath sample was on the low end of the scale, and that he was stopped at 10:25 pm, rather than at 12:01 am.

He fined Little \$450 and suspended his drivers' licence for six months.

Prank fails to amuse provincial court judge

What started out as a prank ended in a Criminal Code conviction for a Ganges man who wanted to put Gulf Islands Secondary School "up for sale."

William Todd Tamboline, 20, of North End Road, pleaded guilty to theft not exceeding \$1,000, after police found a Century 21 real estate for sale sign in the trunk of his vehicle.

The incident occurred at approximately 12:02 am, September 28, when a high school employee noted a "suspicious person" on the high school grounds. Local police were notified and Tamboline was pulled over some 10 minutes later.

Judge Filmer told the accused there were criminal ramifications to what was obviously intended as a prank. He said: "You are not a child any more, so don't act like one."

He fined the accused \$100.

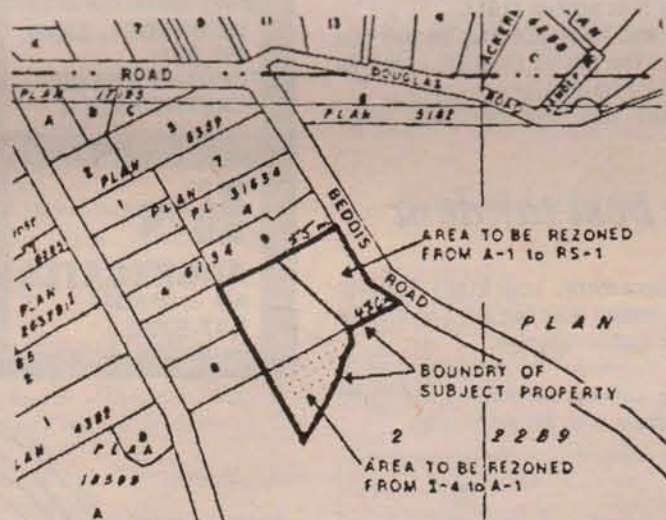

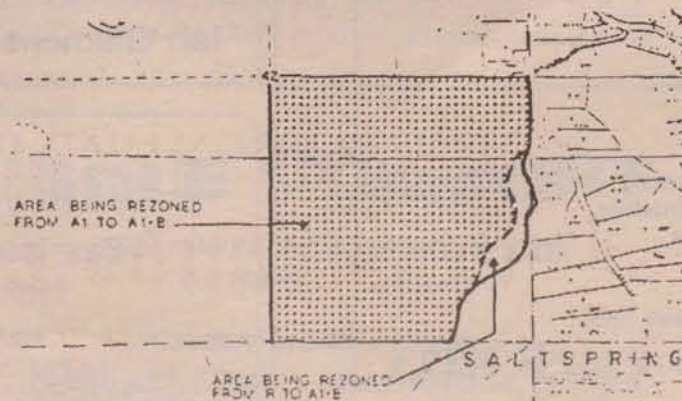

In general terms:

Bylaw No. 235, cited as "Zoning Bylaw, Salt Spring Island, 1985, Amendment Bylaw No. 3, 1989" establishes a Rural Service 1 (RS-1) Zone for the purposes of permitting motor vehicle repairs and part sales, small machinery repairs and accessory storage use. The proposed bylaw limits the number and size of buildings and structures, establishes site coverage, setback and screening requirements for the permitted uses. The zone applies to Lot 1, Section 18, Range 4 East, Plan 2289, North Salt Spring Island, Cowichan District as shown on the following sketch. In addition, a portion of the subject property as shown on the following sketch is being rezoned from Industrial 4 (I-4) Zone to Agriculture 1 (A-1) Zone.



Bylaw No. 236 cited as "Zoning Bylaw, Salt Spring Island, 1985, Amendment Bylaw No. 4, 1989", establishes an agriculture 1-B (A1-B) Zone which permits one dwelling for each residential parcel, accessory buildings and structures, home occupation and resource uses including farm, managed forest use and accessory buildings and structures. In addition, the proposed bylaw establishes site coverage, height, setback and off street parking provision for the proposed zone. The zone applies to the South East 1/4 of Section 42, South Salt Spring Island, Cowichan District as shown on the following sketch:

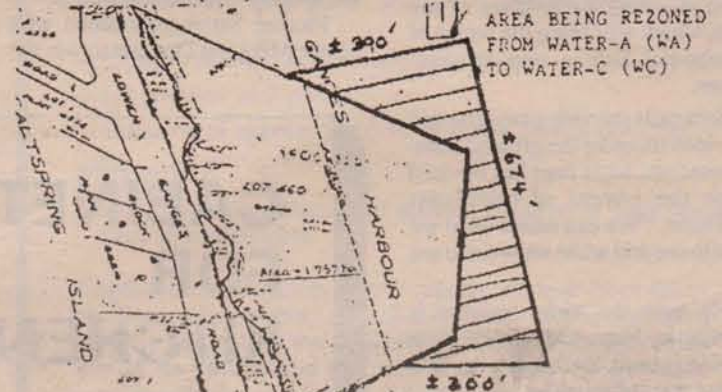


Bylaw No 237 cited as "Salt Spring Island Subdivision Bylaw No. 1, 1975, Amendment Bylaw No. 2, 1989", proposes the minimum parcel area for an Agriculture 1-B (A1-B) Zone to be 8.0 hectares (19.76 acres). In addition, for parcels greater than 48 hectares (118 acres) or larger, the bylaw proposes to allow residential clustering of lots having a minimum area requirement of one hectare (2.47 acres). Additional residential lots are allowed if a large remainder is left in resource use.

Bylaw No. 238 cited as "Zoning Bylaw, Salt Spring Island, 1985, Amendment Bylaw No. 5, 1989", proposes to establish a Guest House (GH) Zone which permits guest house use of not more than 9 rooms for transient accommodation in addition to a self-contained dwelling unit for the accommodation of the owner and family or the operator of the guest house use. In addition, the proposed bylaw establishes site coverage, minimum site area for a guest house, height, setback, off street parking, minimum service level, and minimum parcel areas for the proposed zone. The zone applies to Lot 7, Section 3, Plan 13007 and Lot 15, Section 3, Plan 18728, Salt Spring Island as shown on the following sketch.



Bylaw No. 239 cited as "Zoning Bylaw, Salt Spring Island, 1985, Amendment Bylaw No. 6, 1989", would permit marina facility use including washrooms and showers, and marina administrative facility use as accessory uses to marina use in those locations that are zoned Comprehensive Development 2 (CD(2)). In addition, Schedule "A" of the zoning classification of the water areas as shown on the following sketch is being rezoned from Water-A (WA) Zone to Water-C (WC) Zone.

Islands backdrop for fishing video

MAYNE ISLAND - Active Pass and Porlier Pass are featured in a fishing video which is increasing the reputation of the Gulf Islands as a mecca for anglers.

Gulf Islands video-maker Peter Sara has produced two videos that are popular with the salmon fishing fraternity. *Salmon Fishing Techniques of the Pros* teaches viewers how to be more productive with mooching techniques. It was filmed mainly in Active Pass and Porlier Pass.

Besides conducting salmon fishing charters, Sara and his wife Anneli are in the process of opening a bed and breakfast establishment, catering to families and fishermen, at Miners Bay on Mayne Island.

Sara started the first independent, professional video post-production company in Western Canada. After selling Gastown Productions, Sara started Gastown Enterprises Inc.

Another popular fishing video is *Giant Salmon of B.C.*, which features a 71-pound salmon caught at Rivers Inlet during the biggest run of large salmon in 25 years.

Sara's colleague John Massey, who has worked with Fisheries and Oceans, gathered extensive records on when the big fish would arrive in Rivers Inlet. "We were in the right window of time for that big run," Sara says.

A Japanese language version of *Giant Salmon* has also been made, the first Canadian video made specifically for the Japanese market. Sara started marketing the video last month at Yokohama Exotic Showcase '89, a fair rivaling Vancouver's Expo '86 in size.

To give you an idea of the importance Yokohama gives to its sister city, Vancouver, there are no pavilions for Canada or its provinces — but there is a Vancouver pavilion.

Sara says his videos are helping to market the sport fishing industry in Japan. There are 12 million members in the Sports Fishing Association of Japan.

Sara, who also has a home in Ladner, says he just finished another short video shot in the Gulf Islands. It explains the policies of the Budweiser sportfishing team. "The team is dedicated to fishing education and conservation, so that our children will also have the enjoyment of this great pastime."

He is also preparing to make the video, *Trolling Techniques of the Pros*, which will bring the world of commercial fishing into viewers' homes.

Sara calls the video-cassette and the video recorder the greatest communications tools man has devised since the advent of broadcast television. "We can select what we want to see and when we want to see it."

He says the video market is growing by leaps and bounds, both in information and ability to distribute that information.

Sara says his videos are different from typical fishing programs on television which usually lack story lines and are often shot in one day. His videos cost up to 50 times more to produce, partly because all the action and dialogue are scripted.

Each video has a conservation message which, because of their strong visual impact, can help make

fishermen aware that it's not necessary to kill every fish that is hooked.

Sara also has a commitment to the highest technical quality. The music and sound effects are far superior to the usual Saturday television fishing show. The recording engineer for *Giant Salmon* was Roger Monk of Little Mountain Sound Studios of Vancouver, who recorded the music for the soundtrack of the movie *Platoon*, which was played by the Vancouver Symphony Orchestra.

Monk is also a partner with Sara in Canada's first digital recording facility, Un-reel, located at Little Mountain Sound.

Sara says his dream is to conduct salmon charters, and make fishing videos in the summer and edit them in the winter.

The Salt Spring team suffers from the absence of proper practice facilities on the island, is forced to play all of its games in the home team's park, and must play a gruelling schedule of double-headers each Sunday.

"Those are the disadvantages," Topping said. "On the other hand, we've got a keen bunch of kids, and they're all good athletes."

Next games for Salt Spring will be Sunday, May 28, in Chemainus. The first game starts at 10 am, with the second set to begin at about 12:30 pm.

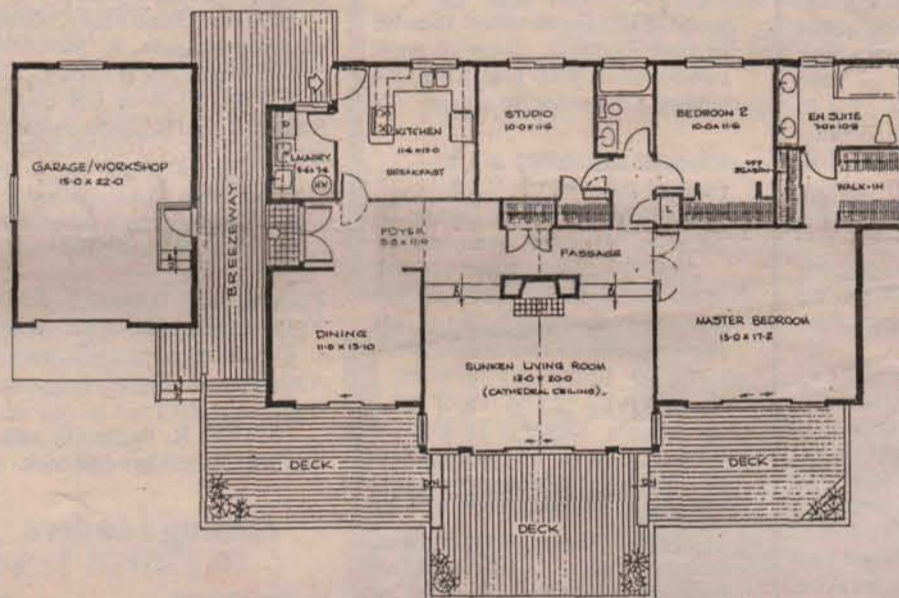
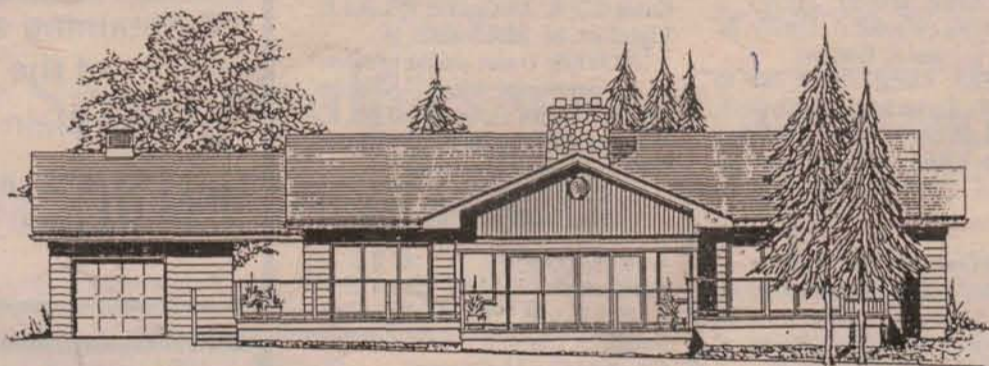
