Greenwoods celebrates anniversary

"Open the door, please!" said Mrs. Florence Jones and Lieutenant-Governor Henry Bell-Irving cut the ribbon and formally opened the door to Greenwoods, the Gulf Islands facility for inter-late and personal care.

That was 10 years ago on June 4 and Greenwoods is having an open house and party on the same day this year to celebrate the anniversary.

Greenwoods administrator Margaret McKay said that along with the gala social garden party planned with live music, speeches and an art display for residents and guests to enjoy, Mr. Bell-Irving will be back to help celebrate. Alongside him, will be the flower girl in attendance at the first opening — Alwyn O'Brien — a little more grown up than she was 10 years back.

McKay stressed the event is open to everyone who wants to attend.

"We are hoping that a lot of people will come out and help us celebrate," she said. "The Salt Spring Yacht Club has lent us their carnival tent to put up on the grounds, we have about 250 balloons which we plan to release and there will be delicious strawberry short cake for everyone."

Artwork displayed at the gala event, McKay added, represents works created by residents of Greenwoods, in their art therapy program.

"We have some quite impressive artists living here," she said. "A lot of these people never tried their hand at this before they came here, so it is very pleasant to find out we have some budding artists living here."

Along with speeches from MP Lynn Hunter and several other dignitaries, the 18-piece Nadden military band will be on hand to perform for the residents and guests. The tenth anniversary celebration will take place this Sunday, starting at 1pm.

Speaker cancels:

Islanders feel backlash from events in China

The recent political turbulence in China has left its mark on Salt Spring Island.

Those events last week forced changes to the original agenda for a speaking engagement scheduled for tonight (Wednesday) in Ganges.

The evening was to have featured an address by Zhang Jin Li, a professor of solid state electronics at a university in Wuhan, Hubei province.

Jin Li, in North America to deliver a paper at a conference in Houston, Texas, cannot travel to Ganges because he had been unable to acquire a visitor's visa for Canada.

Rosalie Miles, the Salt Spring resident who arranged the local event, said the visa request was denied by Chinese officials, apparently because they are "unwilling to authorize private travel under the current conditions."

Miles, who met Jin Li while travelling in China several years ago, said she then arranged a visit to Ganges by an official at the Chinese Consulate in Vancouver. But the official later cancelled "due to the delicacy of current events."

Tonight's event — set for 7:30 pm at the library of Salt Spring Elementary School — will now feature Miles and discussion of current events in China. The Salt Spring resident said her recent conversations with Jin Li, with officials at the Chinese Consulate and with sources in the Chinese community in Vancouver have revealed a number of details that should be of interest to fellow islanders.

She also noted that two Chinese friends in Beijing have been involved in the demonstrations in Tianamen Square, and have since disappeared. Attempts to contact them via telex have failed, she said: "We were told that the communications system had been shut down."

An entry fee of \$2.50 was to have been charged tonight to help cover the cost of Jin Li's transportation to Ganges. Now, however, admission will be by donation; Miles said funds raised will be directed to the cost of Jin Li's stay in Houston.

The professor, Miles said, has been caught in the Texas city with little or no Western currency. Reimbursement of his expenses for attending the conference will not be made until after he returns to China.

Miles said she has cashed in the airline ticket arranged for Jin Li's visit to Ganges and wired the money to Houston, but believes her friend is still in need of financial help.

Limousine service offered

First a bus, now a limousine.

On the heels of the launch of Judy Kelly's scheduled passenger bus service on Salt Spring, another local firm is preparing to offer a new mode of transportation to islanders.

Libby and Paul Jones, operators of Goodman-Jones Funeral Home, recently purchased a six-door, eight-passenger limousine for the use of their company. Now they plan to also offer it to the public.

Libby Jones said the vehicle is appropriate for weddings, graduations and other special occasions. It will also be for hire for trips off-island, to pick up a large party of guests at the ferry terminals, or for

stylish transport between points on the island.

An application for a licence to operate the service is still being processed; at present, the limousine operates under temporary permits

issued for single occasions. Libby Jones stressed that the limousine will not operate in competition with other island services. For instance, it will not wait at ferry terminals for walk-up passengers; use of the vehicle must be booked at least three hours in advance.

Grant buys large vault for archives

An \$8,000 grant has been awarded to the Salt Spring Historical Society for establishment of a local archives dealing with the history of the island.

The project will involve several island organizations before it is completed—including the Historical Society, the Mary Hawkins Memorial Library and the local Museum Society.

The heart of the archival system is a fireproof, 600-pound filing cabinet already brought to the island and installed in the basement of the library.

(The Historical Society said special thanks are due to Salt Spring Freight, which transported the safe at nominal cost, and installed it in the library at no charge.)

Historical Society and Museum Society archival material has already been received and is in the process of being filed. All items must be cross-indexed, it said of the work which lies ahead.

Archivists for the project are Mary Davidson and Peggy Tolson. Tony Farr, Olive Clayton and Tony Luton are assistant archivists. Agnes Cunningham is the project's typist, and Tom Holtby is in charge of photography.

The archivists are not hoping to borrow for copying, or to receive for filing, any of the following items:

- family photographs and/or documents pertaining to the history of Salt Spring Island;

- original photographs and/or documents in need of a permanent, safe home; and

- historical materials pertaining to organizations, societies and groups on Salt Spring, including old minute books, photographs and membership lists.

Archivists say borrowed items will be quickly returned.

Once in place, the archives will be made available to qualified enquirers, the Historical Society says.

Funding for the project was made available as of April 30, 1989. It was financially assisted by the ministry of municipal affairs, recreation and culture, through the British Columbia Heritage Trust and B.C. Lotteries.
