## One of best deals going

# Sabot program teaches kids boating, sailing

SALT SPRING — The sabot program of the Salt Spring Island Sailing Club is one of the best deals for youngsters on the island.

A \$5 membership fee gives sailors from nine years to the mid-teens a chance to learn sailing fundamentals in eight-foot dinghies called sabots. A \$15 rental charge for the year covers wear and tear on the sabots — cat boats with only one sail on a mast situated near the bow of the boat.

Some of you saw sabots in action at Sea Capers weekend. Even though the wind was a little brisk at times — one sabot suffered a broken boom — and the beginners had little sailing theory, they were proficient at getting around the course.

Taking part in the Sea Capers sabot races were Jeremy Miller, Neil Somerset, Chris Huntley, Jeremy Huntley, Darren Nordine, Juno Ruddell, Aileen Neish and David Troesch.

"The idea is to enrich the sailing club and teach kids how to sail so when they step into larger boats they are well-grounded in sailing technique," says Simon Henson who, with wife Louise, is an instructor of the 12 sabot sailors.

The program gets under way in March or April with the first of five evening sessions of instruction. As well, there are two field trips, which may include a tour of the local Coast Guard vessel and its equipment.

Through the summer they have sailing picnics where they swim and pursue other water activities. The season winds up with a club regatta, a series of races with trophies awarded at the end.

Sabot sailors take the "Let's be boatwise" course for juniors offered by the Salt Spring Power and Sail Squadron. The course teaches the basics of navigation and safety.

By the end of the summer the kids can independently skipper the dinghies, having grasped the basics of sailing and racing, says Henson. A small power boat accompanies the youngsters at all times.

The sabot program was launched in 1969 when Lawrie Neish, an industrial arts teacher at Gulf Islands Secondary School, built the first of many sabots in his school shop. Around this time Neish and Barbara Toynbee helped launch the Salt Spring Island Sailing Club of which Neish is currently commodore.

Neish says the sabot caught the attention of the model yacht builders who quickly worked out that they could have a real boat for the cost of a model.

"Since then sabots have come off the line like liberty ships, the total reaching 80 at the last count," notes Neish in the sailing club's newsletter, *Telltails*.

Having helped his woodwork-

## Youth Environment Corps

# Youngsters help with salmon work

SALT SPRING — A local man is finding it a rewarding experience being involved in a series of stream and salmon enhancement programs.

Jim Russell, who has been involved in commercial fishing off and on for 10 years, is the supervisor of a seven-member Environment Youth Corps currently undertaking several projects on Salt Spring.

Members of this group, who are working under the leadership of Kathy Reimer and the Salt Spring Stream and Salmon Enhancement Society, are among 1,000 youths working in the Environment Youth Corps program throughout the province.

The 76 eight-week projects currently on the go are funded by the provincial government through several non-profit organizations, including the Outdoor Recreation

Council.

Reimer, who has expressed great enthusiasm over the program, says it is the "best funding we've ever had." Each of the youths earns \$7 per hour for a 40-hour work week. The group is fully insured, receives first aid and chainsaw training, and has access to a brand new crewcab truck.

Reimer says island high school students responded enthusiastically to the program — the island could easily have fielded three crews. Participants were interviewed and selected by Reimer and Russell. Several of those involved in the program have previously worked for the Stream and Salmon Enhancement Society on a volunteer basis.

To date, the Salt Spring group has spent much of its time rescuing salmon and cutthroat trout fry from streams drying up in the sun. The

task has involved travelling to pools in Mansell, Cusheon and Stowe creeks, scooping out the fry in nets and transferring them to safe bodies of water, via buckets.

Other projects on the agenda for this summer include the construction of a fish ladder on Cusheon Creek, and a stream clearing project — the removal of harmful debris choking the channel — in Fulford.

The crew will also improve accessibility to trails on Duck and Cusheon creeks, and upgrade maps documenting the watershed areas in Cusheon Lake and Mansell Creek.

The group is also spending one day each week in the linear park in Ganges, undertaking basic maintenance.

Reimer says the island may

## Seal-coating contract completed

Twelve kilometres of Salt Spring Island gravel roads recently got a face-lift by a Victoria seal-coating crew.

Shades Trucking won the Victoria Highways Maintenance Corporation contract earlier this month to seal-coat gravel roads in various parts of Salt Spring Island. Ten crewmembers spent the last week doing the \$250,000 seal-coating job, which is done yearly.


The process involves applying crushed rock or graded aggregate on top of a coating of oil. In some cases a blinding sand is added to help draw emulsion over the rock. The roads are then compacted.

It takes 24 hours for the asphalt to cure, after which local highways crews sweep off excess gravel. The


result is a coated surface which is similar to pavement, which reduces the need for grading and practically eliminates dust, says Kevin Cutting, general highways superintendent for the South Island Highways District.

Cutting says there will be a minor amount of seal-coating done on other southern Gulf Islands by Victoria Highways. This is because traffic flow is much less there and because there are fewer gravel roads. For instance, all of Mayne Island is paved, save for five kilometres of gravel.

He says there will be up to two kilometres of seal coating done on Pender, Saturna and Galiano Islands.

ing students build 15 sabots, Neish was faced with the problem of teaching the builders to sail. The problem was eased somewhat by one or two of the students having been members of the Sea Scouts.

"The teaching of sailing to 15 or so raw beginners was accomplished by giving all the budding sailors an hour or two of sailing time in a small keel boat," Neish explains.

"We had a great time. Marks were laid to give direction to the sailing and before we realized it, we were racing. At this point Warren Hastings and Harold Dibnah of the

(Ganges) Boat Yard offered a trophy to the school district for sailing."

Neish decided to go big time and joined the Canadian Yachting Association, recording the name Salt Spring Island Sailing Club for the school club. The name eventually became identified with the adult club, then located at Scott Point Marina. In 1987 the sabot program was amalgamated back into the adult club.

For its burgee Neish hit upon the idea of loosely adapting the crest of the *H.M.S. Ganges*, changing the colour of the elephant from gold to

white. "White elephants and starting and underwriting the running of a sailing club seemed, in my mind and wallet, to produce the same result — poverty," says Neish.

"Jeanette Larson sewed a prototype for us and for a number of years made them for club members. The originals were also painted on the sabot's quarters. Most of the sabots, at that time, sported major works of art on their transoms. These paintings helped relieve the boredom of sabots and El Toros belonging to other clubs while following our sabots around racing courses."

Salt Spring sabots, indeed, became the boats to beat in practically every race they entered. The club developed "a long and happy relationship" with the Royal Victoria Yacht Club and the girls of Strathcona School.

"In the balmy days of the early 70s sabots carried the name and burgee of our small club off-island to some 14 or more regattas a year hosted by clubs all over B.C. The sailing standard became incredibly high."

This September the club will once again hold the Terry Fox

Sailathon. Last year the club raised \$300 through pledges. Although the day was cold and miserable, says Henson, they raced from the club base off Beddis Road to Harbours End with two circuits of the harbour and back again.

Henson says working with the sabot youths is "really rewarding. They're a neat group of kids."

The club's philosophy, he adds, is that kids living on the island should learn how to have recreational activities on the water, learn the fundamentals of racing, and do it safely.

## Labour of love for Meg Coombes

# International circuit is her goal

SALT SPRING ISLAND — Fifteen-year-old Meg Coombes admits she's a workaholic.

But her single-minded determination to reach the international equestrian circuit is a labour of love.

So is caring for her 10-year-old running quarterhorse, Karmen. "She's got a sweet personality. She's really willing and honest."

Coombes, who trains under Lynne Denton of Denton Farms on Salt Spring Island, is well on her way to achieving international stature.

Recently, at the Milner Downs Hunter Jumper Show in Langley, Coombes won first place in the Canadian Equestrian Federation (CEF) and American Horse Shows Association (AHSA) medal classes.

These wins qualify Coombes for the CEF equitation finals in Toronto and the ASHA equitation finals in Harrisburg, Pennsylvania. Both categories are judged on the rider's ability to readily negotiate a course of jumps three feet, six inches in height.

Coombes, who lives on her parents' 23-acre farm near Beaver Point Hall, desperately wants to go to the finals. But it won't be cheap. She estimates costs will be between \$8,000 and \$12,000.

"Just being there will really be a neat experience," says Coombes, who has been training with Denton since she was nine. She has been a working student most of that time, paying off her instruction by grooming horses, mucking stables, keeping the tack in good shape and other duties.

Even for a self-proclaimed workaholic it takes a lot of dedication for Coombes to work with the horses six to seven days a week for up to 12 hours a day.

"I enjoy every minute of it. You've got to keep a balance, though. I don't let my schoolwork suffer."

Coombes follows the English equestrian discipline. Her main interest is Hunter Seat equitation, a form mostly for junior riders. She says the sport appeals to her technical mind.

Riders are judged for their ability or horsemanship over a series of tests on the flat and over fences to demonstrate their seemingly effortless control and their ability to produce what many call the "invisible ride."

The Hunter Seat equitation, developed in 1937, has evolved as one of the most demanding forms of horsemanship for riders and is highly goal-oriented. The ultimate

finals in Toronto and Harrisburg, Pennsylvania, where riders are judged on their ability to readily negotiate a course of jumps three feet, six inches high.

fulfilment for these young riders are the equitation medal classes.

The medal finals are an exacting test of the rider's style, form and precision, a training ground for future Olympians.

Equitation is a very nerve-racking sport, Coombes says. "You have to make a plan and ride everything according to the plan." Horses are judged a lot on appearance, style and form, says Coombes.

Some competitors put as many as 50 braids in the horse's mane. Coombes herself spends up to 30 minutes daily brushing her horse.

Coombes says she likes the challenge of her sport and the partnership with her horse. She has competed in local shows in B.C. and as far away as Monroe, Washington.

She says were it not for the expense she would like to go to more distant events.

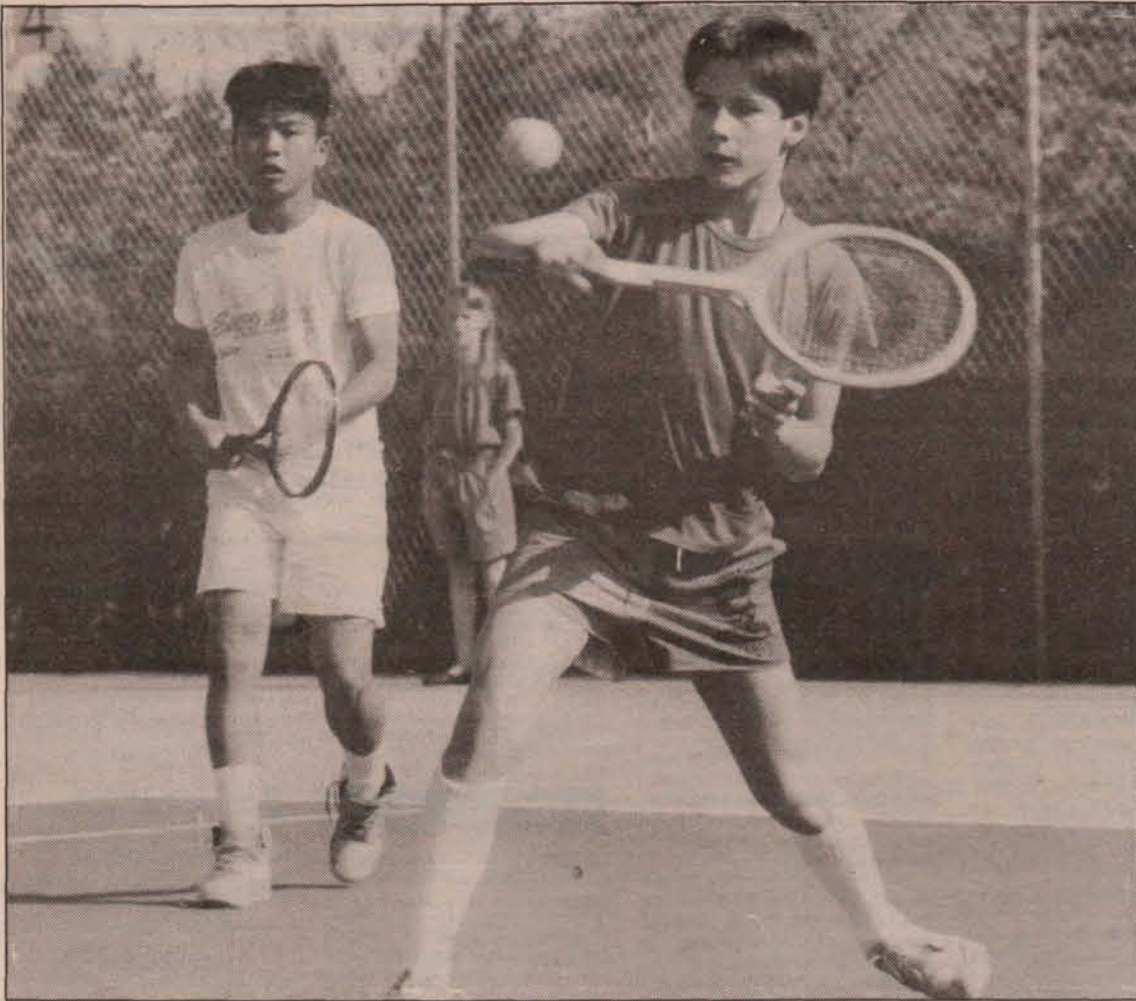

## Don't forget fish limits--ministry

While recreational fishing in British Columbia offers a "variety of species and diversity of encounters," the ministry of fisheries and oceans is reminding sports fishermen that limits are in effect.

According to ministry statistics, the number of people who sport fish in this province has increased steadily over the past few years. The sport fishery generates more than \$90 million each year, while

more than \$190 million is spent on related goods and services.

B.C. is home to one of the largest salmon sport fisheries in the world. Fishing for other finfish — such as halibut, rockfish and lingcod — accounts for almost 40 per cent of the total sport catch by anglers.

The ministry of fisheries and oceans says it has worked alongside groups from all sectors of the fishing community to develop new strategies for meeting its resource conservation goals.

A general guide to daily limits, according to species, follows:

Abalone (north of Cape Caution), 12, (south of Cape Caution) 4 or 6; clams, 75; crabs, 4 or 6; eulachons, 20 kilograms; flounder and sole, 8; greenling and lingcod (combined), 3; halibut, 2; herring, 20 kilograms; mussels (depending on species and area), 12, 25 or 75; octopus, 1; oysters, 15; perch, 8; pink or spiny scallops, 75; prawns and shrimp (in the shells), 12 kilograms; rockfish and sculpins, 8; salmon, 2 or 4; rock scallops (north of Cape Caution), 12, (south of Cape Caution) 6; sea urchins, 12; sturgeon, 1; cutthroat trout, (north of Cape Caution) 4, (south of Cape Caution), 2.

## Vandals subdivision opponents?

Terry Klokeid says repeated vandalism to a sign advertising Amblerwood Estates subdivision is not justified.

Klokeid, who owns one of nine lots in the 42-acre subdivision, said Tuesday morning that a sign and two supporting posts were ripped out of the ground, probably by a rope or chain attached to a motor vehicle, at the subdivision's entrance at Amblerwood Drive near McLennan and Beaver Point.

He links the incidents to opposition to the subdivision, which was approved last November. Klokeid says subdivision owner Gordon Swan, who reported the incident to the police, is "very upset" about the mischief.

Klokeid, who lives in Regina but says he is committed to live on Salt Spring and to preserving the McLennan valley, says the properties are not suitable for agriculture because they are hilly, rocky and heavily forested. He says only minimal logging has taken place in the subdivision, which is designed to maintain privacy and to not damage the aesthetics of the valley.

## Wondering

Five years ago our regional director appointed a representative on our behalf to a Solid Waste Subcommittee. It was reported that they were concerned with our present landfill site (garbage dump) being on watershed. Through those five years, we have heard very little from this committee or our director on how their work was proceeding. Apparently they felt they had nothing to report.

It appears, however, they had a consultant and an engineering report done, and came to the conclusion that not only should we transfer our garbage off-island but their choice of a new site for holding and transferring our garbage should be on watershed!

Fortunately, before we need to vote on this expensive notion, our Island Trustee found us a new, cheaper site which for all you picnic lovers has a fine view of Fulford. Tenders are out for operation, application for disposal of land, and yet our CRD director and his committee still do not seem to feel they have anything to report.

Anyone with any objection to this costly new proposal that has taken the help of consultants and engineers five years to put together, has now been told to come prepared with an acceptable and realistic alternative that can be processed and put into operation within months. If we are going to

have this matter concluded "one way or another this year" this leaves us wondering:

1) As the CRD has been concerned with groundwater contamination at the existing site for over five years, why is there no groundwater monitoring program in effect?

2) Why was the site, rejected by the consultant as it was on watershed, re-introduced at the insistence of the committee and then chosen as the prime candidate site?

3) If this is to be settled "one way or another this year" what other options are being considered? What if the referendum is defeated?

4) Why the apparent secrecy? If our tax dollars are being spent on our behalf, couldn't we be kept well informed and up to date on the progress of the sub-committee?

5) When will all the owners of property adjacent to this "chosen site" be notified? Is the Subcommittee and CRD unaware of the consequences of moving industry into residential areas?

6) If Saanich is to gracefully accept our garbage for now — what happens when their site is full — do we then in our turn accept their garbage here?

I'm sure these questions are relevant not only to South Salt Spring Island, but to all the islanders.

The real heartbreak is that not all of the kids causing the problems are bad. They're your kid and my kid and they want something to do on evenings and weekends. If they had an alternative, I know most of them would respond favourably.

**Ferry traffic continues to increase**

Figures released for June show further increases in both vehicles and passengers travelling on B.C. Ferries.

Transportation and Highways Minister Neil Vant confirmed last week that June figures have followed the upward trend seen in May.

"The operational figures for May 1989 showed substantial increases over May 1988, and the June figures show even greater increases over the previous year," Vant said in a prepared statement.

On the Tsawwassen-Swartz Bay route, June's figures show an 11 per cent increase in passenger traffic and a 10 per cent increase in vehicle traffic over the same month last year.

The figures are representative of increases in all routes serviced by the corporation.

Vant said his ministry is encouraged to note that the early summer trend had continued into the first of the peak summer months.

receive funding for two other crews later in the year. Following the conclusion of the summer youth corps program, a 22 to 23-week program for individuals on income assistance may get under way. This group would undertake similar projects in the area of stream and salmon enhancement.

Also in the making is a community-wide project for tourism. The five-member crew, which may not be formed until next spring, will undertake any work relevant to improving the tourism industry on the island. More information on this project will be available at a later date.

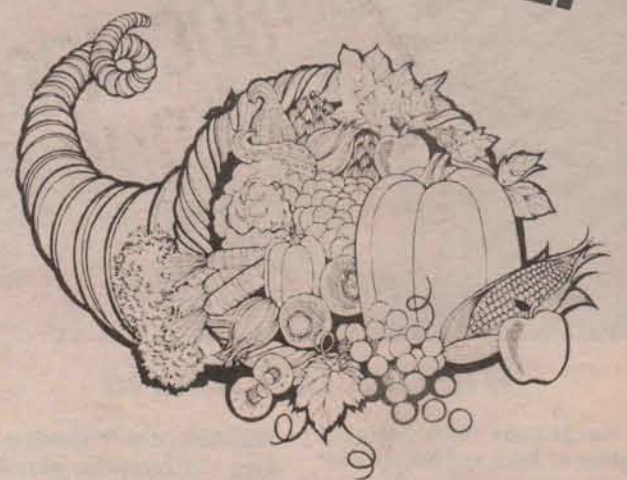
