

## War on junk mail declared

A local man fed up with the increasing amount of junk mail coming to his door, says people should send it where it belongs — to the company that mailed it, the federal environment minister, the local MP or the Prime Minister himself.

Bob Stopford says that information from the two-month old "Mail Junky Rebellion" group out of Courtenay says that 100,000 acres of timber is harvested annually in this country to produce the one-and-a-half pounds of junk mail that every Canadian household receives each week.

And he noted according to the Mail Junky group, all of those figures are likely rise following a recent announcement by Canada Post that it plans to triple its delivery of third class mail.

(A spokesman for Canada Post was not available for comment as

## Fierce fighting faced allies in wake of D-Day landing

The only chance of defeating the Allied invaders was to launch a counter-attack as soon as possible after D-day, before the invaders could be established firmly in the bridgehead and be reinforced. Thus, on June 7 a German battle group commanded by Colonel Kurt Meyer began an attack against the Canadians near the village of Putot not far from Caen.

On June 8 both the Regina Rifles and the Winnipeg found themselves in danger of being surrounded and overrun. Lt. Col. Cabeldu was ordered to launch an immediate counter-attack to save them.

Within two hours of receiving this order, he had prepared his attack plan and directed his company commanders they *must* capture and hold Putot. It was essential this be done because there was no other infantry battalion between the enemy in Putot and the beaches.

Facing the Scottish were seasoned, fanatical SS troops, veterans of Russia, Africa and elsewhere. Of the Winnipeg they captured they murdered almost two dozen in cold blood.

Soon after the Scottish counter-attack began, "D" Company at-

tempted to cross a bridge over a railroad and encountered fierce opposition. The company commander, Major Tommy MacEwan, was severely wounded and put out of action, his second-in-command, Capt. Bryden, was killed, and the

# U.S. break-out aided by several tactical blunders

company headquarters was almost wiped out, as was most of the company itself.

Major Plows of "A" Company, when he heard this news, decided to amalgamate what was left of "D" Company with his own, thus stabilizing the situation.

Finally, on June 9, the Canadian Scottish recaptured Putot and threw back further enemy attempts to take it. But this had been done at a heavy

price. Forty-five officers and men were killed in this action and another 80 were wounded. All together, within the first three days after the landing, the battalion lost one-third of its strength.

The next major objective for the Scottish was Caen since it was the job of the British and Canadian armies to keep the enemy engaged around Caen and to draw more of them into the area. The purpose was to clear the way for the United

States forces to break out of the Cherbourg peninsula and drive to the south and east thus allowing all the Allied forces in France to pivot around Caen for their move towards Germany.

The American break-out was achieved by July 28 and thanks to several foolish tactical blunders that Hitler had made the opportunity came for the Allies to encircle and wipe out the greater part of the German Seventh Army and Fifth Panzer Army. On August 4 General Montgomery ordered the Canadian Army to launch a heavy attack from the Caen sector in the direction of Falaise to the south to cut off the line of retreat for the German divisions engaged with the British Second Army.

By August 19 the Allied attacks around Falaise brought about a collapse in German resistance and morale. German prisoners began to flow through Canadian lines first in a trickle, then in a stream and finally in a flood. About 12,000 of them were captured by the Canadian Army.

The battle for Normandy had been won.

the *Driftwood* went to press Monday.)

Stopford says actions advocated by the Junky Rebellion — a group formed by seven individuals in Courtenay two months ago and which has since spread to several other cities in British Columbia — are a way of telling the industry, the post office and the government that mail recipients have had enough and that too much timber is being used inappropriately.

He noted the garbage bin at the local post office was full when he was there one morning last week and suggested the waste there would pale in comparison to that found at larger centres in Vancouver or Toronto.

"Canada's forests are disappearing quickly and this is one thing we can do to keep on top of it," said Stopford noting that he puts his junk mail in an 8 x 10 envelope labelled return-to-sender.

"If it comes unsolicited, you are paying more for the product," he added. He also suggested that stores

who use direct mail to advertise should send it only to people on their mailing lists.

In addition to being concerned about the vast amount of lumber needed to make the flyers, Stopford is also worried about the junk mail that can not be recycled.

"A lot of it comes wrapped in plastic and people just (throw it away) in the plastic. It won't decompose."

Stopford added he is especially opposed to flyers printed on glossy paper, which most recycling companies do not use.

In the meantime, Stopford says, he is not sure what action he will take outside of encouraging others to follow his lead. He added, though, that change will only come about through increased public awareness.

"The post office is paid to handle it once, but not to rehandle it.

If (returning) it happens on a large scale, it will slow things down."

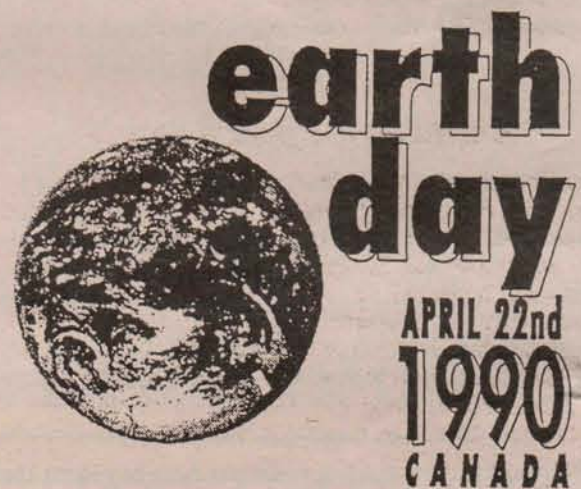

**to be frank**

If you're going to eat cheap it ain't in London. Nor, indeed, in any other capital city over here.

How's this for a breakfast? Bacon, eggs, sausage, tomato and fried bread, served with a cup of tea for the handsome price of five pounds; or, roughly, \$10. Not a top-of-the-line eating scale because I haven't been patronizing those places lately.

Another mill-run on meals saw a diminutive steak, a large roast potato (black in parts) and cauliflower. That, complete with a Scotch, a small one, and tea ran me 14 pounds, or near 30 bucks. That's eating in London!

I have been to a wine bar in this Yorkshire town quite a few times because I'm in with the staff. Prices are easier, by a long way, than in London and the meals are excellent. I scrounged a menu from Hedley's wine Bar, in Harrogate to give me an idea of prices in a house where I could enjoy the meals. The prices are shown in dollars for convenience of readers. If such there be!

**Entres on a different scale**

Starters: broccoli and apple soup, \$2. Chilled melon pearls with port, \$5. Avocado with prawns, \$5.25. Chicken liver pate with toast, \$4. Smoked mackerel pate and toast, \$4. Smoked salmon and prawn roll \$6. Prawn in garlic butter, \$6. Mushroom in garlic butter, \$5.50.

Entres: Ham and mushroom quiche, \$6.50. Chicken Kiev, \$8. Steak and kidney pie (my favourite!) \$8. Cold roast ham, \$8. Chicken Marsala (chicken breast, pan-friend with cream and marsala) \$8. Seafood pie, \$8. Homemade Lasagna, \$8. Omelettes \$6.50. Scampi, deep fried, \$8. All served with leeks, cauliflower Mornay and new potatoes; or new potatoes and salad. Smoked salmon salad, \$10. Prawn salad \$9.50. Ploughman's Lunch \$8.

For dinner, the meal started the same way, with the entres on a different scale:

Roast rack of lamb \$14. Chicken Kiev \$12. Escallop of pork, Stilton sauce, \$12. Panpiette of veal, rolled and filled with bacon, mushrooms and onions, \$14. Steak and kidney pie \$10.50. 8 oz filet steak with beer and pepper sauce \$18. Vegetable lasagna \$10.50. Half roast duckling with plum sauce \$14. Chicken Montpelier, boned breast, poached in wine and baked in pastry with cheese and cream \$12. Grilled sirloin steak \$13. Vegetables or salad are \$2 each.

**Housing costs are out of sight**

Carnes, or meat dishes were English-style in the main. Solomillo de ternera con salse de pimienta took top place in the price index at \$15.50. Despite the Spanish it is a simple filet, or tenderloin, with black pepper sauce. Sirloin steak with the same sauce was \$13, while pork filet was \$9. Steak and kidney pie (a l'anglais, no doubt) was \$7. Chips, or French fries, are termed "patatas fritas," or fried potatoes. A side-plate was \$1.75. Toasted sandwich was \$2 and a hamburger was also \$2.

There must be something about European meals because I've been eating like a pig for months and I'm not a pound heavier than when I started out.

As far as eating at home is concerned, the cost of food is very close to the cost in the islands. Incomes are lower, but not notably. Gasoline prices are almost double those at home and the price of a car is astronomical. A new car costs at least half as much again as it would in British Columbia.

Housing is out of sight. If you can find a house for less than \$50,000, grab it! By comparison the island's houses might as well be in a depressed area.

All these things have a direct bearing on the cost of eating and eating out. In general, the story is that eating over here is not about to bankrupt you!

**Scientists search for tide indicator**

Two University of British Columbia food scientists are working on a quick, reliable method to detect a deadly form of food poisoning — paralytic shellfish poisoning — in coastal waters.

PSP, also known as red tide, can turn clams, mussels, oysters and scallops into deadly fare for people who eat shellfish contaminated with the nerve toxin. It may bring on numbness, nausea and paralysis of the neuromuscular system within a short period of time and is sometimes fatal.

There is no antidote for PSP. "It's a serious problem from a public health point of view and it's an equally serious problem from an economic point of view," said David Kitts, who teaches food toxicology in the Food Science Department.

"We have a problem on the West Coast with sporadic, unpredictable outbreaks of red tide and this has resulted in approximately 70 per cent of our coastal areas being permanently closed to shellfish harvesting."

Kitts and colleague Phil Townsley, who teaches industrial microbiology, are working in collaboration with Helix Biotech Corp., a UBC spin-off company, to develop a kit that would enable producers to detect PSP in shellfish on the spot.

Red tide, which takes its name from the organism that sometimes gives the water a reddish tinge, isn't always visible in coastal waters. Contaminated shellfish do not exhibit any toxic signs and cannot be distinguished from non-toxic

shellfish.

Much of B.C.'s coastline is permanently closed because there is no rapid and efficient method of constantly monitoring the water, Townsley said, adding that although signs are posted warning of red tide, people do not always see them.

"We are trying to develop a test kit that is reliable, economical and easy to use in the field," he added.

The kit would mean that producers, and even tourists who dig up shellfish, could promptly assess whether it posed a danger to them.

# Demands on ferry service outgrow vessel capacities

Spiralling ferry service demands on the Mayne Island Swartz Bay route have outgrown the capacity of the 75-car *Bowen Queen* and *Mayne Queen*, according to Barry Wilks, chairman of the Community Chamber of Commerce's Transportation committee.

Wilks says he was returning to Mayne from Swartz Bay last Monday when he learned this would be the last run of the 130-car *Queen of*

*Tsawwassen* until spring. Wilks noted the ferry was already two-thirds full, despite the fact it was early November, and claims it is impossible for the smaller ferries to transport all commuters between Mayne and Swartz Bay.

Wilks foresees Mayne Islanders clamouring for space aboard the small ferries in order to get back to Mayne for the night. He expects some will be left behind.

Wilks says the current influx of new residents from the Greater

Vancouver area will cause vehicular traffic aboard the ferries to spiral. And with each new arrival, there are necessary support services; he expects we will see more cement and gravel trucks coming to the island, all of which require additional ferry space.

Wilks fears Pender Island residents will be even worse off, as they will have to put up with the remaining space, if any, after residents of both Galiano and Mayne have been accommodated.

"I can see what is looming ahead for us," Wilks said. "Families will be worrying about getting on in case they are left behind due to overcrowding."

Addressing the Community Chamber of Commerce Wednesday night, Wilks pointed out there will be no additional ferries constructed for at least two years, so the condition will only worsen.

Ed Williams, a ferry ticket handler, reported there were only 14 reservations accepted on one Friday night for vehicles going to Saturna from Tsawwassen. When people on Saturna attempted to return on the *Nicola*, via Mayne, en route back to Tsawwassen, the overload was left behind.

## Growth questions posed

The question of how to handle future commercial growth on Mayne was of major concern at the monthly meeting of the Advisory Planning Commission, according to Mayne Island member, architect Robert Irving.

Facing APC members is the question, "should such development be concentrated in one general area of the island or should several smaller, lower density areas be encouraged?"

Irving reports this matter, as well as numerous other questions, will be discussed at public meetings planned for the future.

Paddy Lambert, APC chairman, reports members plan to meet with Island Trust members to discuss Mayne Island's community plan before hosting a meeting to allow the public to air their views.

**Alert line**

To the Editor,  
The HEALI Alert Line Service is now four years old. I would like to inform the community of the effectiveness of this service.

The bottom line is, how many emergency situations have been peeked up.

In the period from Sept 30, 1987 to Sept 30, 1988, eight emergencies were handled by the Alert Line Service — five serious falls and three acute illnesses.

The home unit has a 24-hour timer which sends a signal if the client is unable to push his pendant.

In the period of Sept 30 1988 to Sept 1989 three emergencies

alarms were received — all falls — resulting in fractures and hospitalization.

At the present time, we have 35 units in operation servicing 55 clients. Five of these units are on Pender Island.

I would like to thank our installers Ed Allan, Ken McKenzie and Ron Watson, our volunteers who check out every unit once a month, Barbara French, Elizabeth Hengstler, Toni Gainor, Ruth Gronau, Ruth Hopping and Mary Ann Hume; the staff of extended care; Irene Ferguson of Pender Island; the HEALI Alert Line board; a special thanks to our retiring treasurer Marion McKenzie who spent many hours keeping our records straight; and all the service clubs and groups who have supported us so generously.

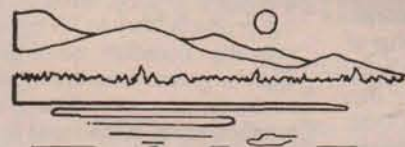

**Dirty habits**

To the Editor,  
This letter is written to SSI readers who love or drive cars. There are many advantages to cars. They keep us dry; they transport quantities of goods and people; and they allow us to send a message to onlookers — messages like: "I'm rich," "I'm practical" and "I recycle."

Because burning a gallon of gasoline puts out five pounds of carbon (*New Yorker*, Sept 11/89), which joins with oxygen to form carbon dioxide, which traps sunlight, which warms the oceans and dries up wells — because this complex chain of events occurs with every gallon of gasoline burned, driving a vehicle now has a new meaning.

Driving cars unnecessarily means, to me, the driver has not fully awakened to his/her contribution to ecological breakdown.

There's nothing quite like a converted smoker ... well, I am a converted driver, sort of. I've driven 1000s of kilometres every year for 20 years. And then, like smoking, I became aware of the awful smell.

With no intention of quitting driving for good (and I haven't), I took the insurance off my car for the month of February. I live 2 km out of town in Ontario's snowbelt. I walked, called a cab two times for major shopping. In general, the quality of my life increased in ways I'd never have predicted. "Slowing down" was necessary in my life — not driving a car helped.

Now I have a limit of 150 km per week and will reduce that to 100 km next February. At 150 km/wk, I can drive to the market on Saturday and visit some land I bought (20 km away) twice. There is a bus from town to the city and I am a regular traveller on it.

According to *Blueprint for a Green Planet*, one person in a car averages 21 person miles/gallon. Thirty people on a bus get 80 per-

son miles/gallon.  
So SSI drivers — don't continue your dirty habits in paradise — take the bus. It's warm, cheap,

has great schedules and is the new way to travel.
