## Conference reveals

# Teens are high-risk for contacting AIDS

A spokesperson with AIDS Vancouver Island says teenagers are considered by health experts to be the next high-risk group prone to contracting the AIDS disease.

And Salt Spring Island doctor Jan McPhail says there is a good chance the AIDS virus is on the island.

McPhail spoke at a Conference on Youth staged by the Community Centre last Saturday. Her talk was part of a panel discussion on Youth and Sex, held in the latter part of the day-long event.

A number of people spent most of Saturday at the Community Centre, attending workshops on subjects ranging from youth and drugs to parent-teenager communication.

McPhail told the panel discussion she could not be certain an actual case of AIDS had come from Salt Spring Island, but she said it would be wrong to assume the virus is not here.

She said the statistics on health-related issues are identified as coming from a particular area (such as the Greater Vancouver Regional District), rather than a specific place.

Devorah Kahn, an RN working with AIDS Vancouver Island and one of a four-member panel to speak Saturday afternoon, said a total of 103 people under 20 years of age have been diagnosed as HIV positive

in British Columbia. Six of those are from the Capital Regional District which would include cases from the Gulf Islands.

McPhail said a main concern in the Gulf Islands now is the limited access teenagers have to condoms. She said they are only available at one drug store on Salt Spring and many people -- especially teenagers -- are embarrassed to buy them.

The result is that many are practising unsafe sex.

Kahn said teenagers are now considered by health experts to be the next group most at risk. And even though teenagers are concerned about the disease, they are not protecting themselves.

### Wrong to assume the virus is not here

She said teenagers are more concerned about getting pregnant than they are about contracting the AIDS virus.

Kahn noted that 3,500 Canadians have AIDS -- 20 per cent of which are 20 to 29 years of age. Thirteen per cent are between 15 and 19. The virus can, however, lie dormant for as long as 10 years before symptoms appear, meaning some of the people diag-

## All who knew him have stories to tell

Luke Harrison, 69, ranks as one of the well-liked characters of Salt Spring.

While cleaning his yard, Sunday, April 1, he suffered a heart attack and died.

Funeral service is scheduled for Thursday, April 5 at 2:30 p.m., Ganges United Church.

Harrison was born in Victoria and became an orphan when he was 12 years old. He came to Salt Spring at 15 to live with an uncle and has been on the island since. He was married in 1948 to Muriel Stewart of Fulford. Daughter Gloria was born in 1950 and Muriel Harrison died in April, 1951.

Almost everyone who came into contact with Harrison has a story to tell. He was a man who enjoyed life despite being handicapped since birth with a hip problem.

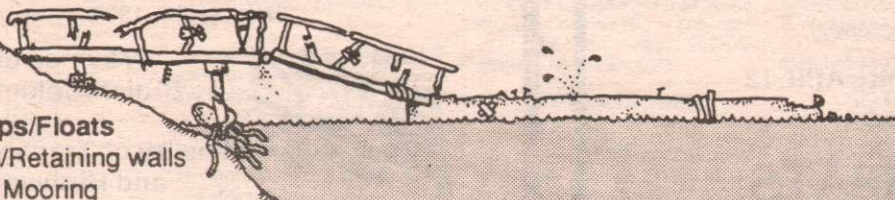

# Film gives parents advice on youth and drug addictions

About 35 parents crowded into an upstairs room at the Salt Spring Community Centre last Saturday to discuss youth and drugs.

The discussion, which centred around a video presentation, was led by Gulf Islands substance abuse counsellor Garry Hogan. The session was part of a day-long conference on youth, staged by the Community Society, March 31.

The video presentation involved one of four films created by the Canadian Chiefs of Police. Three of the films -- made for classroom presentation -- have been shown to school children throughout the Gulf Islands school district.

The film shown at the Saturday conference was designed specifically for parents. It focuses on opening the lines of communication between parents and teens.

The film indicates that children between the ages of nine and 13 are at a critical point in their development. This is the age when their bodies, feelings and lives are undergoing dramatic changes.

Studies show most youths will try tobacco for the first time at the age of 12, alcohol at 13-years-old, and inhalants (such as glue) between the ages of eight and 16. Pot is typically the first "street drug" a youngster will try.

The film offers several tips on helping children choose not to get involved with drugs:

**Catch problems early:** A dramatization shows a mother finding a tobacco cigarette in the pocket of her son's jeans. She chooses to discuss the matter with her son, rather than lecture him.

The film advises parents to stay calm and question a youth rather than accuse him. Offer help if he/she wants it and point out the immediate effects of the drug.

According to the film, the earlier a child starts

drinking alcohol, the more likely he/she will have problems with it later. Inhalants can cause seizures and death and the use of pot can decrease the production of sexual hormones important in the maturing process, the film states.

There are several reasons why youngsters will take that first step towards the use of drugs: peer pressure; curiosity; lack of self esteem, boredom and adult influence.

## Keep communicating

The most important thing a parent can do, the film says, is keep communicating.

**Be honest:** The film advises parents to be honest with their children on why they do not want them to get involved with drugs. It also suggests parents should respect their children's honesty.

Many youths have their first drug experience at home, the film says. They copy their parents use of drugs such as alcohol without understanding the intensified effects on their smaller bodies. Parents often give their children mixed messages on drug use and it is important they set a good example.

Parents must be able to explain why they can drink alcohol while their children cannot.

**Help children refuse drugs** Those films created for older children in the Canadian Chiefs of Police series offer ways for teenagers to refuse drugs.

The film suggests parents initiate discussion about drug abuse with their children and ask them to verbalize ways in which they can say "no" to drugs.

# Street kids moving to Victoria

A street worker from Victoria says the number of kids on the street is rising because of tougher enforcement measures being taken by police in Toronto and Vancouver.

Speaking at a conference on youth at the Community Centre last Saturday, David Miller, a street worker with the Greater Victoria Community Council, said Victoria has now become a prime destination for pimps. The city is also becoming well known for street violence.

Miller told a panel discussion on "youth and sex" that the use of hard drugs among juveniles in cities has

become almost "epidemic." Some cities, he added, are opening treatment centres specifically designed to treat children.

Miller said the increase in the number of street "children" is largely a result of harsher enforcement measures initiated by police in larger centres such as Toronto and Vancouver in the last six to eight months.

Furthermore, he said, juveniles are coming to Victoria because of the mild weather which makes it easier for them to live on the streets.

Many of the street kids support themselves by selling drugs or their

bodies, he said. The majority of kids on the street have suffered physical, sexual or emotional abuse at home, he said: the streets offer an "illusion" of control.

Miller also noted that the high number of kids on the street is largely a "male issue:" it is generally men who put girls on the street and buy them. He added that solving the problem will require a concerted community effort.

"The community has to take a lot of responsibility for why there are so many kids on the street.

"We have to be a part of it."

nosed with the disease in their 20s could have contracted it in their teens.

She added that education is the key to prevention. Parents, she said, need to spend more time discussing AIDS with their teenagers while they are young. She said it is crucial that teenagers have easy access to condoms and that schools are equipped with condom vending machines. She also said parents should consider making condoms available to their teenagers at home.

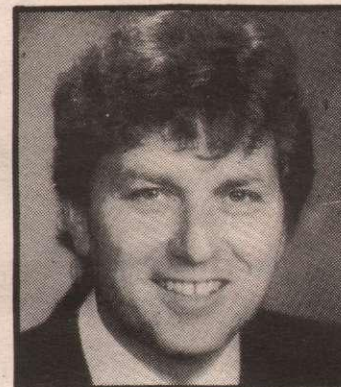
Kahn said there are a number of terms used to describe different stages of the AIDS disease -- HIV meaning human immune deficiency,

HIV positive meaning the virus is in the blood stream, and HIV disease which means a person is showing symptoms of having the disease.

(People diagnosed as HIV positive might not have any symptoms of having the AIDS virus.) AIDS occurs when the virus is in its advanced stage.

While people who have AIDS will show various symptoms of the disease, those who are HIV positive can carry the virus in their blood and spread it to others for several years before it turns into AIDS and before symptoms appear.

Kahn said people generally live for two years once they have AIDS although they can live for four.

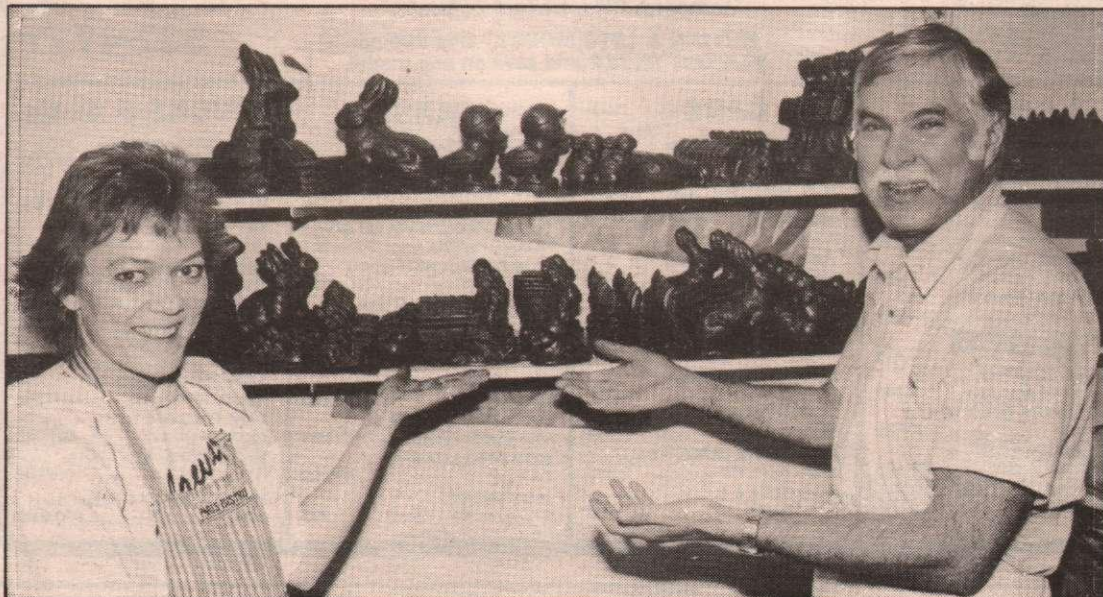

# As a trustee, Harrison took the side of the underdog

He never complained about the problem, indeed, he preferred not to discuss it. But friends who knew him well also realized he lived with pain every day of his life.

Phyllis Fetherston remembers Harrison as generous and filled with a love of nature, children and animals.

And that was another side of him which he kept to himself. Many times he heard of someone needing firewood. He'd load up his pickup, deliver the wood and expect nothing in return.

In 1984, Harrison ran for, and was elected to, the Islands Trust. He topped two of the three polls on the

island. But after a year, the pain in his hip forced him to resign.

His term on the Trust exemplified his outlook on life. Harrison took the side of the underdog.

Some of the tales of his antics have assumed the proportions of legend. Jack Reynolds knew Harrison as a friend of the family. Reynolds said he enjoyed watching Harrison, just to see when he was cooking up.

One of his stunts proved to be too good. About 11 years ago, when Greenwoods was in the planning stages, the Capital Regional District

offered a contract to Harrison to demolish the house which sat on the Blain Road property.

Harrison carefully planned the demolition. He asked close friends for old coins with the requirement that no coin be minted since 1930 which was when the house was built. He casually showed the coins around, just as casually mentioning the demolition of the old house.

People paid him \$20 for the privilege of helping to demolish the structure. Reporters from off island heard of the treasure of old coins and rushed to interview him. The matter

reached the CRD board which demanded possession of the coins. The board reasoned that the house belonged to the CRD and therefore the coins did as well.

Harrison had the last laugh. The house was demolished and he didn't have to work very hard.

But that was the side which the public saw. The true Harrison was a concerned individual.

Jeff Outerbridge has been a tenant of Harrison's for several years.

"He hated to see anyone down and out," Outerbridge said, "and when he did, he did something about it."

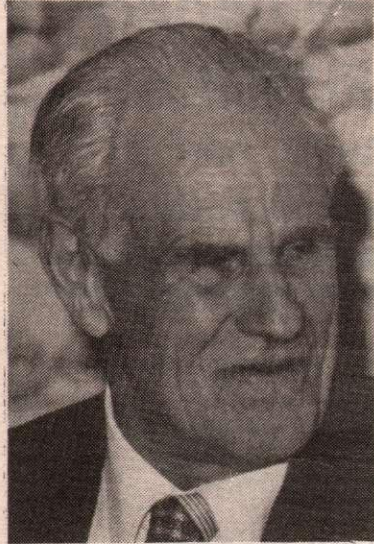
Bill Webster got to know the hidden side of Harrison. During one of the many talks with Harrison, Webster asked about his hip problem.

Harrison replied, "Some mornings when I wake up, my leg is really aching and I have a hard time putting on my sock."

"Then I tell myself that at least I have a leg to put a sock on and think of someone who doesn't have a leg. When I tell myself that, I can force myself to put on the sock despite the pain."

Luke Harrison was a very private person and as Fetherston noted "He was an exceedingly kind person."

Those were the days! The beautiful convertible stood outside a Sidney store and the driver was busy shopping. It was the heyday of the wood-trim motor car and this convertible was rich in wood and heavy with chrome, including massive, shiny bumpers.

Alas! The owner was more concerned with groceries than bumpers and she neglected to apply the parking brake. The convertible started, very gently to move with the grade. By the time it reached the power pole it was doing all of five miles per hour.

Damage was minimal. In fact, the pole was unscratched. But that beautiful, massive, shiny steel bumper was finished for life. The decorative protection against damage had wrapped itself around the power pole so lovingly that force was needed to unwrap it. Not a lot of force, naturally!

That was nearly half a century ago and it destroyed my faith in collision safety.

Taking a token gift

Last year I was in Paris and I expect to be there again this year. Free-loading, of course! From the end of 1939 until the summer of 1940 I was stationed in northern France with the Royal Air Force and I was reminded last year by a return to the Marne of the first time I went back.

During the war I met a family in Epernay and when the war was over I kept in touch until, in 1947 I returned. It was a chaotic France in 1947. So much damage sustained during the invasion was still evident. Many coastal roads were temporary and ruined buildings were everywhere to be seen. We wanted to take them a gift and finally we decided to take coffee in token of the fact that France was, like most of Europe, desperately short of coffee.

My good friend Andre looked at the coffee in amazement. "Do you know how much that is worth?" he asked. Of course I did; I bought it!

That coffee would buy new tires for his car, Andre told me. He listed other items for which he could exchange so much coffee on the black market. But he drank it.

Coffee, which was rivalled in Britain, in those days, by tea, was quite plentiful in the United Kingdom. Elsewhere it was the real currency.

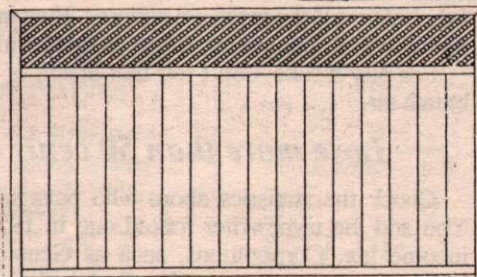

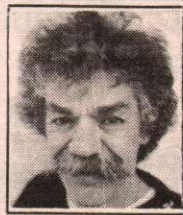

The venter of politicians crumbles to reveal: greed. Here in Canader, eh?, we face a money grab by the feds of an extra seven per cent beginning at the beginning of next year. The General Sales Tax replaces a tax which business should have been paying.

Over 'Ome folks take to the streets in protest against a poll tax levelled by the Iron Lady - Maggie Thatcher. Where does it end?

And as if the GST added to everything and more isn't enough, the wonder boy of fed deficit financing, Mike Wilson adds more tax to beer. That's right, common folk, enjoying a cool one will mean adding more to government coffers.

Think of it for a moment. Cigarettes, loose tobacco and beer are favoured targets of Wilson and his provincial counterpart, Mel Couvelier. Items which the common folk enjoy and use.

Politicians fire up a large cigar while enjoying their Scotch on the rocks. Cigars don't bear a horrendous tax. Liquor escapes the humungous tax increase. Could it be that the politicians won't tax themselves as they tax others?

**Absolutely forced to raise taxes**

We pay taxes on income and when we buy something, we pay the province a sales tax for the privilege. Next January, we'll also be paying the feds. The price of gasoline carries hidden taxes. Go to a movie and the price of the ticket is boosted by taxes. Anything, everything and then some carry that extra bit for governments of various levels.

Watch when Couvelier brings in his budget for the province. Bets abound he will eliminate property taxes for use in funding schools. If property taxes for school use goes the way of the dodo bird, guess what'll happen.

Couvelier will state that greed by municipal politicians and insatiable demands of residents force him, absolutely force him to raise the provincial version of income tax. Such a raise in taxes won't harm the little guy, he'll say. The impact will be felt most among large money earners.

Although money earners in the upper brackets really haven't been hit all that hard by the steady stream of rising taxes. It the people in the middle.

The poverty line hovers somewhere in the vicinity of \$14,000 per year now, having suffered the outrage of inflation just as everything else has. Figure a wage earner pulling in the incredible amount of \$6.50 per hour. For a day's work, the slave can expect \$52; for a week, \$260 and for the year, \$13,520. Then check to see on which side of the line that amount sits.

**Take home amount shrinks**

But the amount which gets taken home somehow shrinks. Income tax, unemployment insurance and Canada pension are sliced off the top. It doesn't stop there, because health insurance is mandatory and more bucks follow the leaders into the pocket of governments.

Own a home? Property taxes. If you're part of a water district, water taxes. If you're part of a sewer district, sewer taxes.

The school district, for now, tax us. The Capital Regional District tax us. This year, the Islands Trust will tax us. The provincial and federal governments also tax us.

When all the taxes, blatant and hidden under whatever name, are added together, the common man loses more than 50 cents on each dollar earned. We have to work each year until well into July before all the taxes are covered. Five months of working and five months of wages are left to us to do with as we please.

For pity's sake, don't tell that bunch of money grubbers we breath air.

**Lose more than 50 cents on dollar**

Check the statistics about who pays what in Canader, eh? You and the typewriter forked out, in 1978, \$68 BILLION in income tax. Corporations, such as General Motors and other biggies, somehow managed to find the huge amount of \$14 Billion to cover the taxes on their meagre incomes.

Tax revolt? It's coming. When the sum earned doesn't cover such things as peanut butter for the cut-rate day old bread, people will scream loudly.

Income tax began back in the innocent days of World War One as a temporary measure to pay for the guns and bullets. Years later, Parliament acted. Not to eliminate the temporary measure but to change its name to the Income Tax Act. NO longer temporary, the tax grew, and grew, and grew.

What started out as payment of five per cent on \$1,000 income has grown to visible taxes of 25 per cent of every dollar made - not by corporations, but by us.

Mike Wilson expects us to, meekly, submit to the newest money grab. Mayhops we will.

Then again, mayhops Canajuns might, just might, stand up and say "Enough's enough."

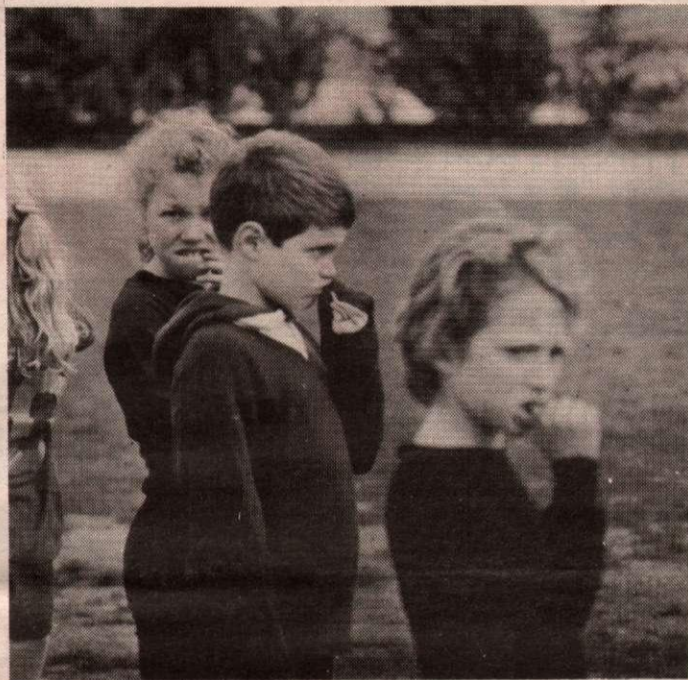

## Organizers hope to create two rowing clubs on island

If you're a sports enthusiast with extra time and energy on your hands, you may be interested in a rowing club just getting off the ground on Salt Spring.

There are actually two clubs forming — one for students at the senior high school and a second for adults.

Doug Pearson, a teacher at the high school and one of the organizers starting the groups, says 30 students from the school have already signed up for that club. However, he and Jerry Alkoff, who will also be leading the group, are hoping to find between 30 and 50 adults interested in forming an adult club.

The pair have collected most of

the equipment they'll need for the groups. At this point, they've located six practice single rowing boats (or sculls), a racing single, a practice quad and a 14-foot aluminum power boat. They're currently in the process of raising some \$900 needed to repair the quad, and hope to buy an eight-seat racing boat which could be used by both groups.

That boat is expected to cost between \$10,000 and \$12,000.

Pearson says rowing clubs have become popular in many urban centres and with practice, both the student and adult teams could be ready to compete this fall.

Most of the training will be done

on the Alkoff property on St. Mary Lake where a dock is equipped with two dry-land rowing machines. Pearson said there will be no charge for students on the high school team and only a nominal fee for those wanting to participate in the adult club.

He added that both groups will hold their first meetings early next month. An instructor from the University of Victoria will be brought in to lead at least two of the training seminars.

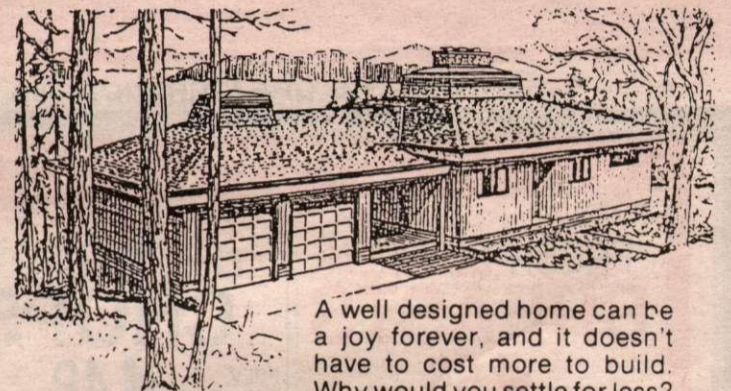
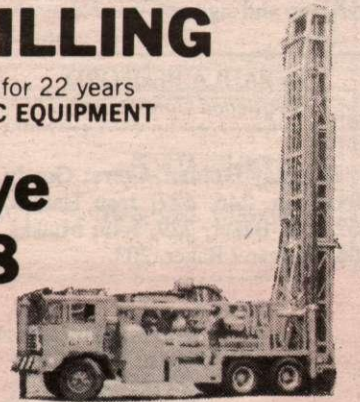

## Radio course offered

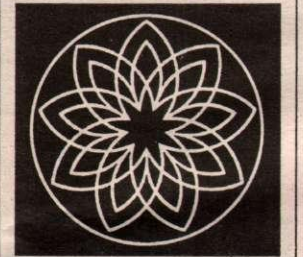

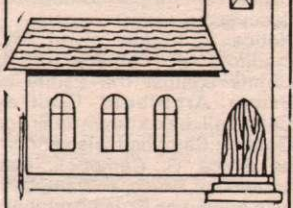

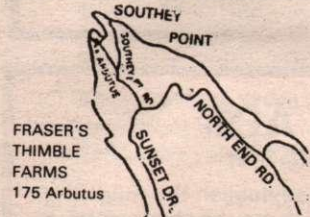
