From all over the world

Students arriving

Nineteen students from all over the world will be on Salt Spring this weekend, experiencing some sights for the first time.

A number of the students are still grappling with the intricacies of the English language which they couldn't speak at all before coming to Canada last summer. And their visit to Salt Spring will provide some with their first viewing of an ocean beach.

The students coming to Salt Spring for Easter have been billeted in homes throughout British Columbia for 11 months, as part of an exchange program offered by American Field Services out of Montreal. They were invited here by Trudy and Randall Sloan whose daughter will be participating in the program later this year.

Trudy said she thought it would be a friendly gesture to invite them here for the weekend.

"I feel that anything that has to do with exchange students widens their views about other countries and helps to promote world peace."

The Sloans learned about the program from an advertisement in this paper early last year. After applying to the head office in Montreal and being interviewed by program personnel from Victoria, the Sloans were notified in February their 16-

year-old daughter Tammy would be sent to study in Venezuela for about one year.

She leaves August 15.

Through this particular program, students 16 to 18 years of age are billeted with host families while they participate in regular classroom study. Their own families, in return, provide housing for a visiting student for an 11-month term.

The Sloans have had a student from France with them for the past eight months.

Tammy, in the meantime, has been busy studying Spanish and will attend a weekend conference in Surrey next month to prepare for her trip.

Trudy says her family was able to meet some of the students currently visiting at a weekend meeting in Crescent Beach (near White Rock) last September. Last February, she decided to invite the 34 students participating in the program in B.C. to spend a weekend here.

Nineteen were able to accept the invitation.

"It's quite an opportunity for them and for us," she says adding the four-day itinerary includes a trip to Victoria, Ganges and Ruckle Park.

"It's quite a lot of work, but we've learned to expect that. It's worth it when you see how much fun they have."

Salt Spring cub pack attends G.V.R. camp

Luckily, a first aid truck was there for the duration of the camp and the cubs were quickly taken care of.

Island cancer victim leaves for California

Brenda Helfrich leaves for California this Friday, almost five weeks after the first samples from her biopsy were sent to the Scripps Clinic and Research Foundation.

The first slides sent to the research institute from the cancer clinic in Victoria were the wrong ones, causing a delay in the trip. It took another 17 days for the correct set to get there after the mistake was discovered.

In the meantime, the cancer which she hopes will be cured at the institute, has spread to cover a larger part of her lungs. Where five weeks ago x-rays showed she had two spots on one of her lungs, tests done last week indicates the cancer has grown

and now joins the two spots.

Helfrich cannot fly to California because the cancer has produced a condition which limits the flow of blood to her brain. Instead the 38-year-old mother of two, will drive down with her sister and arrive at the institute the early part of the following week.

Helfrich was diagnosed as having cancer last April and after receiving 20 radiation treatments the following month, she was told there was nothing more doctors here could do.

A few months ago, however, she learned about an experimental project being done at the Scripps

Some corners of these Gulp Isles hide pristine beauty. Nature, mostly untouched by human meddling, offers wonders to behold in awe and reverence.

On Salt Spring, Musgrave stands as one such area. The road, winding across the flanks of Mounts Tuam and Bruce, isn't the best thoroughfare on the island. For part of the way, a 'dozer apparently tried, half-heartedly, to make a smooth surface out of rough gravel. Baked mud marks the last portion of the road as it winds down to Musgrave Landing.

Several years ago, a ferocious fight erupted, tea-pot storm style, over plans to develop the Landing. Dire predictions of dire consequences rent the otherwise tranquil air of the rock.

Now, these years later, one house squats on Musgrave Point. The government wharf decays in disuse while but two fingers of the planned marina spread across the bay. The landing can't be visited very often. There is no discarded garbage visible.

On the rocks above the bay, one sits, chilled by a spring breeze off the chuck while warmed by the sun, watching sailboats dare the rip in Satellite Channel as a Coast Guard hovercraft skims past.

Sleek ducks ply the water

A powerboat and a sailboat raft together at the float in the bay. The drone of conversation from the boaters, the occasional discordant clang of metal against metal as they clean and prepare for yet another cruise impinges only slightly on the hum of nature.

Sleek ducks ply the water. Part of the flock detours behind a boom anchored near shore. Finding themselves trapped on the land side, they take the easy way and dive under the large logs to join the remainder of the sassy armada.

Vancouver Island sits in peace, near and yet apart. Marine traffic in and out of Cowichan Bay testifies to the presence of the world.

Back on the road on the return journey, the breeze, tempered by the trees, wafts through the open windows of the car.

A clearing beckons and upon investigation, a sheep pen is to be found sheltered among the trees. Discarded wool offers mute evidence of activities past. The split rail fence appears to be in good repair prompting unanswerable questions centred on who operates that mountain pasture.

Winds its way through unknown passages

Again travelling the rocky road, the sounds of bird conversations blends with the gurgle of water. And there below the drop-off beside the road, a mountain stream babbles on its way to the sea.

The water originates somewhere higher up the mountain and winds its way through unknown passages further down. But here, near the road, it tumbles and falls many metres into a ravine cut into the hillside.

In the ravine, with the waterfall glistening in the sunlight, moss clings to everything which hasn't moved for a time. Scrambling down the rocks, taking care on the slick moss, one reaches the ravine floor to look up at the water splashing happily in and out of its appointed channel until, near the bottom of the drop, it plays tag around the roots of an ancient deadfall.

On a ridge above the waterfall, an old orchard enjoys the spring sunshine. Moss shrouds the limbs of old apple trees and grapevines thrust aggressive arms skyward, held in place by a wire enclosure, partly one assumes to keep the deer at bay and partly to aid the grapes.

Some show a girth of at least one metre

Although no one is about, efforts to revitalize the old orchard are apparent. Water in the stream flows to the sea but someone has taken the effort to erect a reservoir to feed the thirsty roots of the fruit trees.

Along the road, tall, majestic firs stand sentinel to time. These trees are big. Some show a girth of at least a metre. The firs stud the mountain side, blending to a muted blur of browns and greens.

As stark contrast to the living forest, a valley lies denuded of trees. Smaller logs, unsuited for commerce, splay like giant pick-up sticks across the sides of the valley and on the ridge beyond. Marketable logs, of similar size to the giants on the hillside, lie at roadside awaiting timber trucks to begin the journey to a fate of uses other than to inspire awe.

Thought brings one to a conclusion which offers scant solace over the view of the naked valley and ridge. If the trees hadn't grown to magnificent proportions and hadn't acquired monetary worth, the road would never have been repaired to ease the transit across the mountains to Musgrave.

Clinic. Here, people with lung cancer are being injected with an antibody/drug conjugate researchers hope will destroy a certain cell type found in lung cancer.

To be included in the study, the type of cancer Helfrich has, had to match that being studied in this particular project.

Helfrich sent copies of her x-rays and samples of her biopsy to the Scripps Clinic early last month.

Helfrich finally received a call from the institute last Friday saying the type of cancer cell she had was the same as that being studied at Scripps.

She says she will stay at the clinic for between six and eight weeks, a period in which she expects the injections will make her condition worse before she gets better. She says she understands the treatment offers no guarantees, but it is one of the few remaining hopes she has.

One of the difficulties in participating in the program is that the Medical Services Plan of B.C. will not finance the trip because the work is only experimental. She estimates the cost of the treatment will be approximately \$7,000.

So far, local service clubs have contributed about \$3,000 toward her trip, an amount which includes other private donations deposited in an account set up for her at the Island Savings Credit Union. She is hoping to raise the rest of the money she needs from other local sources.

In the meantime, Helfrich says she is somewhat bitter about the delay caused by sending the wrong biopsy samples to the clinic in the first place. She says if the correct slides had gone, she might not be as sick as she is now.

Sale will raise funds for Tibet

Salt Spring Islander Judith Bradley visited the Tibetan Children's Village in Dharamsala, India in June, 1989, and started collecting clothing for the village when she returned.

Bradley says approximately 1500 children live at the village. Many are orphans, being raised in the Tibetan culture, now being eliminated in China.

Bradley says the children are well cared for but need both winter clothing and shoes. An appeal to Salt Spring Islanders for help brought an overwhelming response, she says. Approximately 30 bags of clothes were collected and several people donated money.

Other people expressed an interest in "adopting" a child through monthly payments.

Grades Five and Six students at the Fulford Elementary School collected clothes for the children and two bags were sent by teacher Jim Lightfoot.

Altogether, Bradley was able to send six large sacks of clothing to Tibet which cost \$300, partially paid out of her own pocket and through other donations.

Bradley says because of the high cost of sending clothes to India, she will sell the summer clothing at the market this Saturday, April 14. All of the money raised through that sale will be sent to the Children's Village.

Information about the village and other Tibetan support programs will be available from her booth.

At still another station they tried their hands at making recycled paper, taking home a sample for their parents to see.

One of the favourite stations was the outdoor cooking. The cubs learned how to make bannock and eggs in a bag over an open fire, but the best part was eating what they made. The bannock was burned black and the eggs were rubbery, but each cub swore it was the best

food he had ever eaten.

After participating in the various activities at all the stations, the boys earned their Conservation badges.

On Saturday night at sunset, the camp quietly gathered down by the river for a "Cubs Own," which is a non-denominational service. It was a serene moment in a busy schedule and was somewhat like "taking time to smell the flowers."

The final event of the evening was a campfire held at the amphitheatre. Many an old song was sung such as "Ging Gang Goolie" and "The Quarter Master's Stores." The boys also learned some new songs to sing at future meetings.

Sunday morning was spent attending the last five stations, packing up, cleaning the camps and attending the closing ceremonies. Each cub received a souvenir badge of the Wolf Howl 1990 camp to be sewn on their camp fire blankets.

What else did the cubs have to take home with them? A few mementos, new friends, memories of good times and fellowship to last them a lifetime.

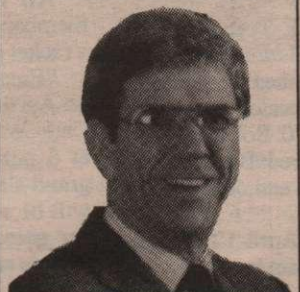

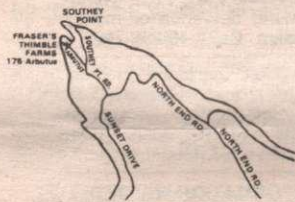
