## HEALI Alert Line

### Full-time position reviewed

The Salt Spring HEALI Alert Line Society is considering hiring a co-ordinator to operate what has, until now, been run entirely by volunteers.

System co-ordinator Sue Ramsey says the operation has reached a point where a full-time co-ordinator may be needed to run the service. She says at this point, 61 clients are receiving service through the HEALI alert line.

Ramsey says that while she enjoys the work, the popularity of the program and its responsibilities have become such that volunteers are wondering whether it's time to hire a paid co-ordinator.

At this point, all of the work is being done by Ramsey and an assistant along with six people who check the home telephone machines and other equipment once a month. Installation of the home units is also done by volunteers who only charge for their materials.

The HEALI service was introduced to Salt Spring as a pilot project, patterned after a similar one in Alberta. A consultant working on the system was brought in to help organize the program on Salt Spring.

Clients who use the service wear a transmitting pendent which signals a central monitoring station at the Lady Minto Hospital through a "home unit" attached to their telephones. It costs users, most of whom are frail, elderly and living

He said there are close to 110 members on this island and added that the purpose of the Saturday meeting was to elect an executive to head a new branch which will work toward increasing local membership.

## Salt Spring Island takes step towards creating Abbeyfield Housing complex

A group working to establish an "Abbeyfield" housing complex on Salt Spring Island has found a site for the building and hopes to have leasing arrangements finished in the next few months.

When built, the home will accommodate between eight and 12 seniors who would not qualify for care in an institutional setting, but who do not want to live alone.

Sue Mouat, a member of a temporary Abbeyfield board currently applying for status as a charitable group, says the board would like to see construction started this year. She suggests, however, it could be several months before financing is in place.

The Abbeyfield concept itself originated in England in the early 1950s, but the first B.C. Abbeyfield home opened only three years ago in Sidney. A second house has since been built in Victoria.

Under the Abbeyfield plan, seniors who are mentally and physically well live together in an oversized home sharing the kitchen, living room and bathroom areas. Meals and housekeeping responsibilities are taken care of by a live-in housekeeper/cook.

Most of the seniors in these homes generally live on fixed incomes. Approximately two-thirds of their monthly income is used to cover their living costs.

Mouat says the organizing committee here has found a centrally-located site for the Abbeyfield it hopes to build here. She says, however, she would prefer not to discuss the

specifics until more details are finalized.

The cost of the building is expected to be paid for using funds provided by the British Columbia Housing Management Commission. Mouat says that while her committee would like to see that money come in time for construction to start this summer, it could be sometime next

year before funding comes through.

In the meantime, Mouat says she has no doubt the building would be well used. She says that a number of local interest groups have indicated there is a need for this type of facility in the Ganges area. She added the committee hopes to make an announcement about the project in the next few weeks.

Trypewriter of

**BILL WEBSTER**



The trypewriter moves in mysterious ways, stories to devise and quotes to invent.

When, in the course of human endeavour, the news of the week comes exceedingly slow, the trypewriter dons his trying gloves and sets to work with a vengeance.

Who shall bear the brunt of his evil imagination this week? What shall suffer the slings and outrageous arrows?

Readers of *Driftwood* have but to cast memory back down through the years to recall the vivid, lurid stories heralded on the front page.

When in doubt, invent. Such was the teachings taught to the trypewriter at the Rural Etobicoke College of Journalism and Acupuncture in Trawna. But of course, all and sundry know schooling in Eastern Canada ain't worth the paper upon which it is printed.

As an example: 'twas the first day of the year. The big story of the day involved strange people doing strange things at the beach at Vesuvius. The trypewriter, always ready to mangle a good story, hurried to the scene.

**Thesaurus used to spice the story**

Seems the Mayor of Vesuvius was conducting his annual experiment to see how many people would brave the icy water just for the possible chance of winning a slightly used tee-shirt.

The trypewriter approached the Mayor.

"Good day, eh?" said the Mayor. "I haven't time to talk now, I have to get this thing over with."

The news story, as it appeared, noted the Mayor refused to answer questions. He, the mayor, was then quoted as saying nasty things about the character, personal habits and family life of the participants.

The trypewriter indulged in the use of a thesaurus in order to spice the story. The Mayor was made to appear incompetent and unfit for office. He protested but his protests were ignored.

Don't bother the trypewriter with facts. He has his mind made up.

Invention in journalism stands as the mother of fame and awards. With fame and awards come money. And that dear folk is what the trypewriter seeks. Money. Fame and many, many awards.

**Suddenly there are four versions**

The trypewriter knows the results when four people read the same story. Guess what? Suddenly there are four versions: one person agrees with the story while the second person derives an interpretation which bears small resemblance to what was written and the other two people draw conclusions which spring from their own imagination. It is truly amazing how many people have been misquoted on such simple matters. To compound the amazement, add in the number of people who know the TRUTH about the matter, such TRUTH having been missed by the reporter.

Back in the early days of the past decade, *Driftwood* was cast in the mould of the bad guy for daring to print stories about the dread sewer. The editor was vilified and snubbed. The trypewriter endured verbal abuse and on at least two occasions was threatened with physical violence.

Did he care? Not a bit. The story must out. The trypewriter lives by the motto: "He may not always be right, but he is never wrong."

**Fill in spaces around the ads**

Back then, as now, the trypewriter hid himself in a dark corner and tryped away at producing the definitive version of the controversy. Did he talk to both sides? What for? After all, there are only so many pages in a notebook and why bother to fill the pages with drivel when the TRUTH can be found somewhere within the word processor.

Roy Thompson, of newspaper fame, once noted that editorial content was just something to be used to fill in the spaces around the ads.

That's another credo by which the trypewriter stands. Editor Susan says how much space, in metric, is to be filled and the trypewriter utilizes words to that end. Each week, he consults the pages of a nationally known and exemplary model of hard-hitting journalism (which can be purchased at the checkout counter of most supermarkets) for ideas.

He then moulds the examples to include local content and writes sufficient copy to fill the space appointed by the editor.

It's easy. Who needs accuracy? Who needs fairness? What is needed are sufficient words of sufficient length, creatively reported, to fill that white space beside the advertisements.

P.S. It should be pointed out the example of the interview with the Mayor of Vesuvius is pure fiction. The trypewriter, for

alone, approximately \$100 to have the equipment installed and \$15 a month in rent.

Since August, 1987, the number of people using the system has grown from 38 to 61 and the number of home units from 19 to 42. (One of the units is located at Croftonbrook and provides service to 20 people there.)

Ramsey says that the numbers do not adequately reflect the workload of the volunteers and notes that the units are moved on a regular basis. It is hoped the money to pay for the services of a paid co-ordinator might be available through the Victoria Gerontology Association.

The service itself is considered an important tool for helping seniors remain in their own homes. The need for it is becoming increasingly important, says Ramsey, as the number

of spaces available in long-term care institutions continues to decline.

One of the main problems the

volunteer service has had since it was implemented is finding enough money to keep it running. Ramsey says the program is relies largely on donations from individuals in the community to keep it running.

It was seriously short of money two months ago, when a grant from the CRD helped the organization meet its expenses at that time.

She added that one of the reasons for the high overhead is that this HEALI alert system prefers to buy equipment, which is then leased to clients. This means the alert line must have the money available to buy the equipment before any rent actually comes in from the rental of the machines.

In the meantime, she says the organization remains heavily dependent on donations from the community.

The Reform Party of Canada is a Western-based federal organization formed three years ago and committed to senate reform, reducing the federal deficit, entrenched property rights and "free and fair" trade. It is headed by Preston Manning out of Alberta.

Altogether, the party claims to have 28,000 members in Western Canada. In the 1988 federal election, it ran 72 candidates from the West. Its first electoral success came in March last year when Deborah Grey was sent to Ottawa from the federal riding of Beaver River, Alta.

Regular meetings and workshops are held for the Executive Committee, Publicity Team, Office Volunteers, File Workers, Visiting Buddies, Volunteer Drivers and Greenwood Buddies.

The monthly speakers program has featured many topics including legal matters, tax, the Alert Line and addictions. A talk by renowned gerontologist Gerald Hodge from Simon Fraser University on the special needs of seniors in rural areas was well attended and received. It's not all serious though, presentations are often fun and pure entertainment.

Volunteer members have opportunities to attend special courses and programs like the Peer Counselling Trainers sessions at the University of Victoria. People wishing to invest in themselves and their community are invited to call Kamhoot at 537-4604 and get involved.

### Thirty-five people attend first meeting

Bergson suggested the membership in the local area is such that there is a possibility the Saanich, Gulf Islands and Victoria constituency may open an office of its own.

He did not say when or where that would be done and added he is not completely in favour of the idea because of its prohibitive cost. He noted that the over-riding goal is to gear up for the next federal election.

Central to the Reform party's platform is its call for constitutional change, namely an elected senate and

modified Meech Lake agreement; "representative democracy" in which, MPs represent the views of the constituents instead of Ottawa implementing changes on its own, and "financial responsibility" which includes a simplified income tax system, federal debt reduction and a balanced budget.

Some of the party's other platforms include "free and fair" trade within Canada as well as with the United States, and a system of "economic justice" which would

mean more economic decisions that favour the West instead of Eastern Canada.

Members at the Saturday meeting suggested a priority in Canada now should be reforming the senate instead of implementing the Meech Lake Accord. Some argued entrenching a Triple-E senate (triple E meaning "effective, equal and elected") would be impossible if the Meech Lake constitutional accord is enacted as it is.

It was also suggested that other


provinces should have some say in deciding whether Quebec should remain within Canada since some of the economic benefits it has enjoyed were made possible by federal money and initiatives.

In the meantime, Roger McKellar became president of the new Salt Spring wing by acclamation on Saturday. McKellar moved here from Alberta a few months ago and works with B.C. Ferries part time.

A date for the next meeting has not been set although Bergson suggested it will probably be within the next month.

NOTICE is hereby given that all persons who deem their interest in property affected by the following proposed bylaws will be afforded an opportunity to be heard on the matters contained therein at a Public Hearing to be held in the **SOUTH PENDER ISLAND FIREHALL, SOUTH PENDER ISLAND, B.C.** on **SATURDAY, APRIL 28, 1990**, commencing at 1:00 PM.

In general terms the intent of the following proposed bylaws is as follows:

1. Proposed South Pender Island Trust Committee Bylaw No. 28, cited as "Official Community Plan Bylaw, 1989", is a bylaw to adopt the Official Community Plan for South Pender Island, Blundon and Skull Islets and the surface of the sea within 1,000 metres of the shoreline of South Pender Island and mid-channel between North Pender Island and South Pender Island. The Official Community Plan provides goals, objectives and policies to guide development and maintain the rural character and environment of South Pender Island. The proposed bylaw would replace the Official Community Plan (South Pender Island) Bylaw, 1973.
2. Proposed South Pender Island Trust Committee Bylaw No. 34, cited as "Zoning Bylaw, South Pender Island, 1980, Amendment Bylaw No. 1, 1990", is a bylaw that defines hotel, hotel cottage, lobby, sleeping unit, temporary and useable site area. None of these terms are defined in the present zoning regulations, and the definition of the same will affect permitted uses and site area regulations and standards.
3. Proposed South Pender Island Trust Committee Bylaw No. 35, cited as "Zoning Bylaw, South Pender Island, 1980, Amendment Bylaw No. 2, 1990", is a bylaw that deletes Section 4.15 "Development Permits" from the bylaw. In addition the bylaw provides new Schedule 'A'; zoning map, on the metric base.
4. Proposed South Pender Island Trust Committee Bylaw No. 36, cited as "Zoning Bylaw, South Pender Island, 1980, Amendment No. 3, 1990", is a bylaw that establishes floor area requirements for hotel cottages and site density requirements for hotel cottages and hotel sleeping units. In addition the bylaw establishes parking requirements for hotels and motels and new site coverage provisions. With the exception of site coverage provisions, these proposed changes add new size and density requirements and restrictions to the existing zoning bylaw. Present site coverage provisions are being amended to reduce allowable site coverage.
5. Proposed bylaws numbers 34, 35 and 36 contain textual changes to the existing zoning bylaw giving effect to new regulations that will be generally applicable to all lands on South Pender Island and Blundon and Skull Islets. The effect of such changes is not necessarily limited to specific lands and all persons are advised to inspect the proposed bylaws to determine their effect in relation to any particular lands.

A copy of the proposed bylaws may be inspected at the Islands Trust Office, 1106 Cook Street, Victoria, B.C. between the hours of 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., Monday to Friday, inclusive, excluding statutory holidays, commencing April 9, 1990, and up to and including April 27, 1990.

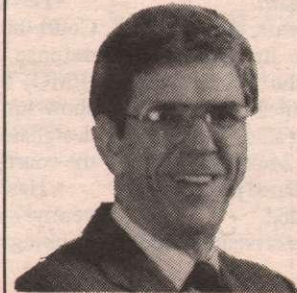

Responsibility

To the Editor,  
The March 21 issue of the *Driftwood* contained a large ad entitled, "Water, Our Most Precious Resource," which heralded the provincial government's assistance toward preserving all British Columbia's supply of pure, fresh water.

The provincial government does have the constitutional responsibility to protect our water supplies. It does have the expertise, and it does have the financial ability, should it choose, to make water quality a priority.

So how well has it done over the years? Not very well in our opinion.

Let's look at Salt Spring Island, for an example. The first mistake was made many years ago, when the government of the day did not retain any Crown Land in the island's watersheds, thereby severely limiting control over the land that produces most of the community's water supply.

This mistake was compounded when later provincial governments allowed excessive subdivision development near the lakes, despite the fact that the effects of nutrient enrichment on lakes were well known in Europe.

Since the inception of the Community plan and the Islands Trust Act, some steps have been taken, al-

though belatedly, to protect our water sources. However, it is interesting to note that these initiatives have all come from local people, groups such as the Water Preservation Society and Water Districts, or from the Islands Trust.

The provincial government has not provided much direction or leadership in this regard.

In more recent years, the provincial government, to its credit, has funded studies on the island lakes, and with the assistance of the then MLA Hugh Curtis, it also agreed to a land exchange at Maxwell Lake which would have helped protect that lake if it has succeeded.

However on the less positive side,

the provincial government:

- Refused to approve a proposed 20 acre minimum lot size in our potable water producing watersheds, despite community and Islands Trust support;

- Did not come up with alternative protection plans, as promised by the Minister of Municipal Affairs;

- Did not support in B.C. Supreme Court the Federal Government in its defense of Electric Motors Only (EMO) for St. Mary Lake or even show up on court in spite of being designated as an interested party in the court proceedings;

- Has not provided any (not one penny!) of Lottery Grants toward drinking water protection while at the

same time contributing large amounts of money toward recreation projects. The latest example of this questionable attitude was the 1989 rejection of the Water Preservation Society's application for B.C. Lottery Funds to purchase 50 acres of critical Maxwell Lake watershed lands for the protection of that water source;

- Continues to insist on a multiple use philosophy for the island lakes which in itself leads toward water quality deterioration;

- Refuses to contribute Revenue Sharing Funds to Water Districts to help them treat the deteriorating quality of our drinking water.

• The men of St. George's Parish put on a bean supper and 150 people attended. Proceeds from the supper would go to the repair fund for the church. Dr. L.C. Lambert of Vesuvius offered a slide show of his trip to Mexico.

• The Guild of Sunshine held its annual Daffodil Tea and Sale. Guild president Mrs. W. Norton opened the event held in the lower hall of the

United Church in Ganges. The ladies raised \$98.46.

### Twenty Five Years Ago

• Dr. Francis' private hospital in Ganges would be closed by mid-month. Dr. Francis said the closing had been forced by government policy towards such private institutions. The 17 patients would be transferred to a nursing home in Saanich.

• The Inter-Island Trap Shoot was taken by the team from Pender. The Galiano team came second while the Salt Spring team of Ken Stevens, W. Cogwell, G. Scarff, H. Bradley and A. Kaye came third. Ellen Bennett and Mrs. L. Anderson organized the food.

• The weather for March offered more sunshine for the month than in any year since 1913. The high for the month was 68 degrees, the low, 25. There had only been 1.32 inches of precipitation.

### Twenty Years Ago

• Drummond Park at Fulford Harbour was being prepared as a centennial project for Salt Spring Island. Ray Simard was in charge of the work crew. The area was being levelled and a sea wall installed.

• The blood clinic at the Legion Hall in Ganges attracted 230 people. The line-up continued past the scheduled closing of 9 p.m. and donors were just finished by 10:30 p.m. The Red Cross accepted 176 pints of blood from the donors.

### Fifteen Years Ago

• The subdivision bylaw for Salt Spring was ready for public comment. The Capital Region had given the document first and second reading and it would be available for anyone to read and comment on. The bylaw was based on the community plan and had been put together by a group of island residents.

• Papajohn reported from Saturna that 180 people had gathered at the community hall to enjoy a pig-roast. Jim Campbell and Jim Mooney had cooked the 166-pound pig and when everyone had his fill, there was no pork left. Art Walton conducted the music for the dance after the Saturnalia had ended.

### Ten Years Ago

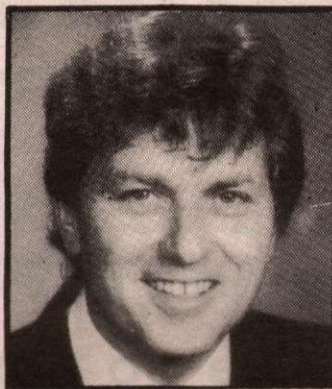

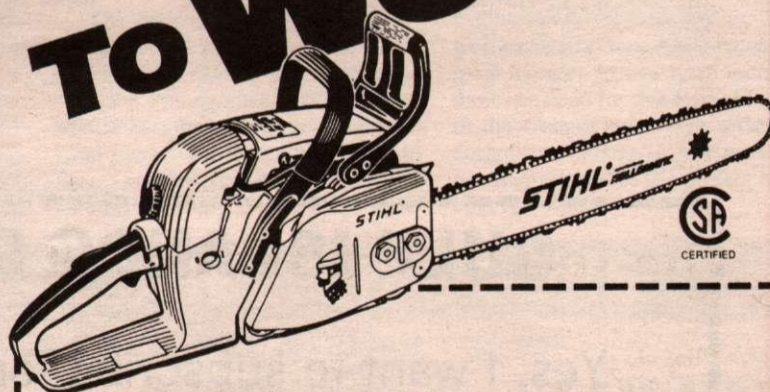
