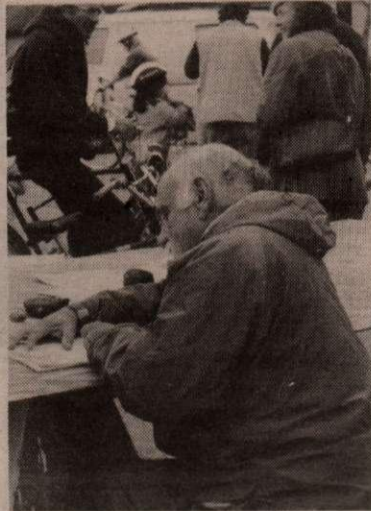

Bike-a-thon attracts over 70 participants

More than 70 people participated in a 10- and 20-kilometre bike-a-thon near Ganges last week to raise money for bike paths on Salt Spring Island.

Bob Andrew, one of the organizers of that meet, said he was pleased with the turn out. He noted that pledges should bring in close to \$2,000.

Andrew said the high turn out was indicative of the level of concern there is about the absence of safe places to ride on Salt Spring. He added that organizers hope to gather at least 1,000 signatures on a petition asking that the Department of Highways help build the paths.

Highways has agreed to take responsibility for maintenance and liability once the paths are built, but it will not cover the cost of building them because bicycles are not a recognized form of transportation.

The \$2,000 raised in the bike-a-thon will be used to build shoulders or "safety paths" on either side of the road between Central Hall and Baker Road.

Andrew could not say how much this would cost, but he noted the shoulders must be built to highway standards and be able to support the weight of a regular automobile.

The "safety path" committee on Salt Spring had considered building paths separate from the road which would be cheaper and easier to construct. However, standards set down by the highway department prohibit the building of those types of paths

on highway right-of-ways unless they are within 1.5 kilometres of a school.

Andrew said the committee hopes to start building the first leg of the paths this summer once the plans have been approved by the Department of Highways.

The committee decided to build on that particular stretch of road first because it is considered one of the more dangerous areas for cyclists on the island, he added.

On a larger scale, the committee also hopes to have bicycles recognized as a legitimate mode of transportation. If this occurred, Andrew noted, the highways department would have to be responsible for providing safe areas to cycle.

Environmental conference set

An environmental conference for youth in Vancouver this weekend is expected to attract 500 students, mostly from Vancouver but also a significant number from throughout the Lower Mainland and Gulf Islands.

The conference, sponsored by the Environmental Youth Alliance, will open with a keynote address by David Suzuki 10 a.m. Friday at the St. George's School.

One of the conference organizers, Joel Freedman says the conference will have two focuses — educating students and letting them know how they can be involved.

Altogether, 25 workshops have been scheduled for the three-day event (participants can attend six of these) as well as addresses by Dr. Wade Davis, an ethno-botanist from Harvard known for his work in the south American rainforest (Saturday), and Elizabeth May, a former advisor to the federal minister of the environment.

Workshop participants include John Reynolds, Minister of the Environment, Vancouver Alderman Gordon Price and Tom Perry, MLA for Point Grey.

Freedman says through the conference organizers hope to give students a better idea about what is taking place in the environmental movement and an opportunity to exchange ideas.

The conference is the first large-scale production put on by the Environmental Youth Alliance formed last October by students in Vancouver. Matt Brook, one of its founders, says EYA was set up to act

as a co-ordinating body for the growing number of student environmental groups. Its membership is estimated to stand at more than 17,000 students.

Says Brook, "There are a lot of environmental groups and all this energy, but people don't know what to do with it. The EYA helps us translate the energy into action so that we can do things like this."

Anyone interested in attending the weekend meet can register at the school, 4751 W-29th Ave. Friday morning. The cost of admission is \$25.

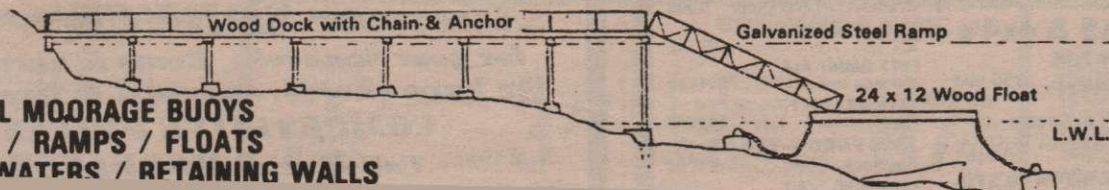

Famous Slug (and Mountie)

Styles leaves island after years of service

After a tour of duty covering six years and one month on the Gulf Islands, Constable Gary Styles is moving on.

The popular Mountie is being transferred to Maple Ridge for highway patrol duty and will be replaced at the Ganges detachment RCMP by Robert Doyle.

Since Styles arrived on Salt Spring in March, 1984, he has made his presence known, both as a policeman and as an athlete.

Styles was married in December, 1984 and wife, Cindy, gave birth to a boy, Nicholas, in 1986.

In 1989, Styles and fellow officer Constable Stephan Caron were awarded the Commanding Officer's Commendation as well as the Lieutenant-Governor's Award for bravery. The two policemen entered a burning house in a futile effort to save a man who was inside.

Sergeant Larry Wendel, head of the Ganges detachment, noted, "He always added a little humour to the office."

Fellow officer Constable Chris Bomford explained that because Styles will take a motorcycle training course for his duties with the Maple Ridge highway patrol, members of the Ganges detachment gave him a set of training wheels "so he won't fall off his bike."

As an athlete, Styles played hockey with the Salt Spring Slugs and was a feared fastball pitcher in the island fast-pitch league. He set a goal of jogging up Charlesworth Road. During the six years Styles lived on the island, the feat was not seen by anyone, reported an observer.

"He was known as a fitness freak," a fellow constable noted, "who was able to jog up to 10 feet without puffing."

Wendel praised Styles as "an excellent worker," and added: "We'll miss him."

Doyle comes to the Ganges detachment fresh from the RCMP Academy in Regina. He is 26 years of age and hails, as does Styles, from Newfoundland.

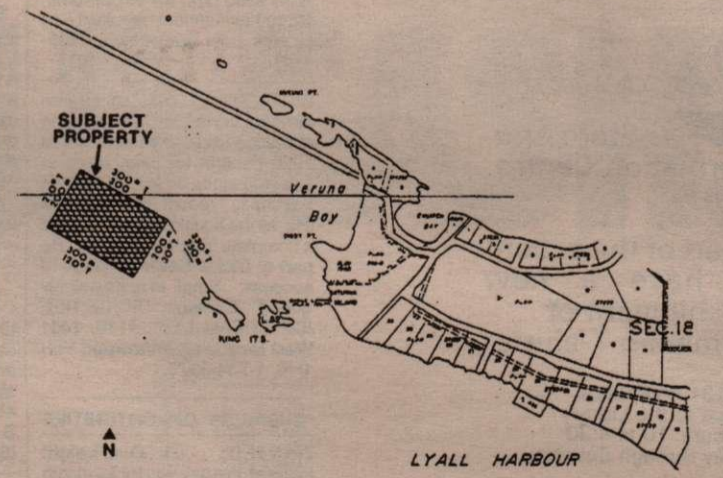
