Driftwood

\$11,000 needed for room

The room has come a long way from its dirt floor and windowless beginning, but much is needed before it becomes the area envisioned by a group of islanders.

And members of the library board, plus local archivists, hope the community will help raise the \$11,000 needed to turn this room into a meeting and study area.

A grant from the Windfall Fund has brought the 8.5 by 13.5 metre (28 by 44 feet) room, located in the lower part of the library on McPhillips Avenue, to its current state. The room now has a concrete floor, windows and insulation.

The library board requested a total of \$41,000 from the Windfall Fund and received \$30,000. This money has almost been spent and an additional \$11,000 is needed to furnish the room.

The library board and archivists envision a joint-use room, where islanders could gather to study, hold meetings, and research Salt Spring history.

The plans include a meeting area which would span the wall at the far right.

Institute organizes Helfrich fund-raiser

Organizers of an auction being held to raise money to send Brenda Helfrich to the Scripps Clinic and Research Foundation in California hope to gather between 50 and 60 items to sell Saturday night.

Helfrich was diagnosed with lung cancer last year and has been accepted into an experimental treatment program at the Scripps Clinic.

She was supposed to leave for California about three weeks ago but swelling in the upper part of her body has prevented her from participating in the program. She is currently receiving chemotherapy at the Royal Jubilee Hospital in Victoria and hopes she will be able to leave by mid-month.

So far, \$3,000 has been raised to cover the treatment which is expected to cost \$9,000 Canadian. The Medical Services Plan of B.C. will

Organization brings students to island

Salt Spring was home to 10 students from Japan recently when a small group of teachers from the Gulf Islands spent eight days showing the youngsters a culture and environment different from their own.

It was the third time David and Kay Kos along with Sheila and David Swanson from Gabriola have brought Japanese students to Salt Spring through the Gulf Islands International Institute, which they established two years ago.

This summer, they hope to bring an additional two groups to the island.

David Kos says the program gives students the opportunity to immerse themselves in the Canadian/English culture and, at the same time, see a new corner of the world.

Both Kos and the Swansons have

been in the teaching profession for several years. Kos holds a Masters degree in English and has been teaching for 19 years; Sheila and David both have their Master of Education degree with 35 years experience between them. The two couples have also spent several years teaching in locations throughout the world, including Japan, China and Nigeria.

The students brought here by the group are sent by a tutorial school in Japan's Gifu City, where one of the primary programs they study is English. They also learn about different cultures. Their trip to Salt Spring, Kos says, gives them the opportunity to experience Canadian culture first hand.

While there has been a blossoming of ESL (English as a second language) programs for Japanese in the last several years, this one differs from most in that it exposes students to a rural as well as an urban environment.

The desire to show them other

aspects of Canadian life has made marketing the program challenging.

As Kos explains, Japanese parents typically like to see their children study in a structured setting. This

does not necessarily meet the goals of the institute.

Says Kos: "Japanese educators

Trypewriter of

BILL WEBSTER



The trypewriter, as has been noted in past efforts at rectifying world problems, offers solutions humbly and contritely, with no malice intended.

Allow this lucid explanation of the history of commerce on Salt Spring to steep and ferment before using it as a basis for action.

Way back when, intrepid settlers arrived. They, of course, were imbued with environmental consciousness which affected every action necessary for the introduction of civilization.

Notice that the early enviro-folk didn't put their farms on the high slopes. No. They chose the valleys where nature, in her kindness, left large areas of clear spaces, bereft of trees. The road were cunningly strung out to follow deer paths and such.

And they did not introduce any, not one, plant, animal or bird which was not native to the area. Imagine the joy of the early enviro-folk when they discovered broom growing wild on the hills and in the dales of Salt Spring. Many of them, these early enviro-folk, had arrived fresh from the Highlands of Scotland and the broom welcomed them fondly.

They also experienced rapturous exaltation to discover groves of fruit trees, flocks of semi-tame sheep, not to mention herds of friendly cows and such. Salt Spring, or Chu-an, or Admiral Island - they had a choice of names for the rock in those days - was a heaven sent, peaceful, Pacific paradise.

And they prospered. Their environmental consciousness expanded as their eco-system awareness increased. They knew, did those early folk, that once a tree was cut down, nothing would replace it. So they never, never cut down a tree. Well, mind you, the odd tree was chopped inadvertently. Maybe two or three - but no more.

Fire wood was obtained by scouring the forest primeval for dead-falls. Fence rails were scavenged the same way. Larger pieces of dead-fall were utilized as beams and studs for houses and barns. Walls of those early buildings were constructed of rock and sod. The eco-awareness of the early folk explains why no building on Salt Spring pre-dates 1953. Homes were constructed with the knowledge that as time passed, the building materials would recycle back to nature.

Sorting through the memorabilia of those early days, the trypewriter comes across many instances of fallacy and out-right lies casting aspersions on the character of the early enviro-folk.

Five log dumps, side by side

Vicious rumour holds that Salt Spring Island has been clear cut, all of it, at least three times in the past 130 years. Innuendo holds that at one time, a mere 40 years ago, there were 55 log dumps marring the shores of the island. Imagine the twisted imagination which invented the tale of five -FIVE- log dumps in place, side by each, along the shore of Ganges Harbour where the PetroCan storage barrels now add beauty to the scene.

And we all know, don't we, that no log dump was ever placed on Grace Point.

The trypewriter shares this information with you because he heard from those who KNOW.

Clear cutting a ridge such as the one along the southerly side of Cusheon Creek Valley will utterly destroy the area. Nothing with ever grow there again. The rumour that the ridge had been clear cut from Cusheon Lake south to Ruckle farm, from the tide line to past the top of the ridge, has been circulated by grubbing, greedy folk who care less about nature and more about hoarding Loonies.

Walk that line of forest -what's left of it- and see the size of those fir trees. Some of them are a metre wide. Such fir trees take centuries to grow. We know that because the death of several beautiful firs in Ganges proved the point. A few years ago, hungry speculators hacked down a line of firs which stood majestically where the credit union now stands.

Angled shot to hide firs

In the early years of the century, the site was location of the Ganges Inn. Disregard the old photos of the Inn which don't show firs there. We all know the cameraman angled the shot so the firs were hidden.

We know because when the chainsaws murdered those firs, the rings on the stumps were counted. One stump bore evidence of 150 rings. Nature adds one ring to each tree each year. We all know that. And we know the magnificent fir is not a weed tree which puts several rings in place each year.

We have to return to the environmentally conscious, eco-system awareness held by our fore-fathers, and mothers, to ensure the forests of Salt Spring continue to thrive.

Listen to those of us chosen few who KNOW. Have you hugged a tree lately?

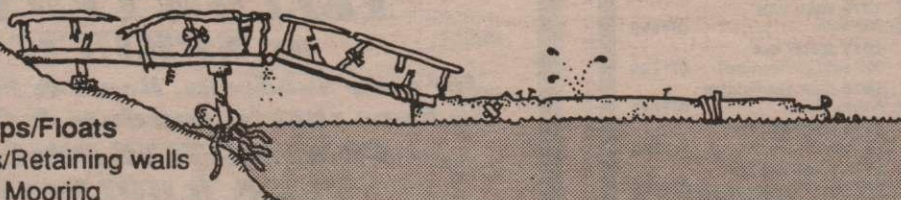

don't see outdoor activities as important, but we do."

The students coming here are between eight and 17 years of age and most speak a beginner's level of English. The language barrier makes it challenging to work with them, and Kos hopes some of the learning can be achieved through first-hand experience.

Ten students came to Salt Spring with the last group in April, spending four days here, three in Victoria and one in Vancouver. Part of their time involved classroom study, while the rest was activity-oriented.

On Salt Spring, for example, they hiked through Ruckle Park, visited the schools, rode horses and went canoeing. It was the first time most of them had been riding or out in a boat.

In Victoria, they visited the provincial museum and the Royal London Wax Museum. They went ice-skating and spent a day shopping in Vancouver.

Says Kos, "The thrust is to get an ESL program which merges the environment and culture. The more Japanese students that can do it, the greater the consciousness will be about the environment."

While on Salt Spring, the students stayed with host families who showed them some of the regular activities associated with Canadian life.

The relationship between parents and children, for example, is much more rigid and structured in Japan than it is here. Seeing how Canadian families relate was an eye-opener for the students.

Kos says, "One of the things that impressed them about Canadians is the relaxed informal style between adults and children."

As the students learned from their Canadian hosts, the Canadians learned from the Japanese. Kos notes the students are co-operative and work well together as a group.

"The students are easy to be with — they are supportive, co-operative and have (a high energy level). They have a group consensus which is what Japanese success is based on. One member feels responsible to the whole, so one will not go off on his own and jeopardize the activities of the group as a whole."

Two groups are tentatively scheduled to come to Salt Spring this summer—an indication there might be more acceptance of the local program.

Says Kos: "It's been slow because Japanese parents and educators understandably want to establish a trusting relationship with their Canadian counterparts before sending their children over."

"We think it is on it's way, that our program is getting some recognition

on a small scale."

By the time the students leave, Kos hopes they have a little better grasp of the English language and a better insight into Canadian life and the natural environment.

"We want them to feel good about the beauty of B.C. and Salt Spring and the importance of utilizing nature in a sensitive way. When they go, we hope they are high and happy about the program."

Joint-use room envisioned

As library board chairman Patricia Morgan notes, Salt Spring Island has few places where small groups can hold informal meetings.

Plans also call for a study area and allotment of storage space for the library's rare books. At the far left, local archivists hope to finally have a home for their collection of historic Salt Spring material.

"Finally," says archivist Mary Davidson, "we'd have a place on Salt Spring, where someone could come and do research (on the island's history) instead of going to Victoria."

At present, Salt Spring's archival material is stored in several locations, including filing cabinets and the homes of Davidson and fellow archivist Peggy Tolson. Now, individuals wishing to study the history of Salt Spring usually travel to the archives in Victoria.

Local archivists have access to a number of records vital to Salt Spring's history. They have the full set of minutes from the beginning of the Farmers' Institute. They have the minutes of all Central Hall meetings, early family photos, land registries, rare books and newspaper clippings from the 1900s.

Creamery records and electoral polling divisions right back to the 1800s are also available.

Special storage facilities are needed for the archival material, Tolson and Davidson note. The area must be well-ventilated and secure.

The group of volunteers working on the room also hope a series of glass cases, located along one wall, will allow storage space for local artifacts.

Museum-type material discovered in archaeological digs previously conducted on Salt Spring are

currently being stored at Simon Fraser University. The university will not give Salt Spring the artifacts until the island has an adequate place to store them.

The room will also provide a location for the library computer, a microfiche centre and photocopier.

Morgan says the group will be going to the public in an effort to raise

the \$11,000 needed to complete this room. While details of specific fundraising programs are not being released at this time, Morgan hopes the community will realize the benefits of this room and help make it a reality.

Some of those donations include bobcat and backhoe time, landscaping, a day's work in the garden and jobs by hard-to-get-hold-of tradesmen.

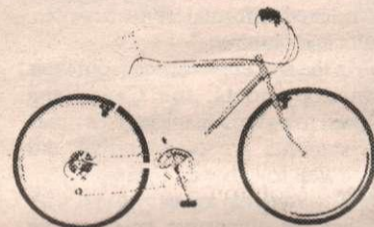

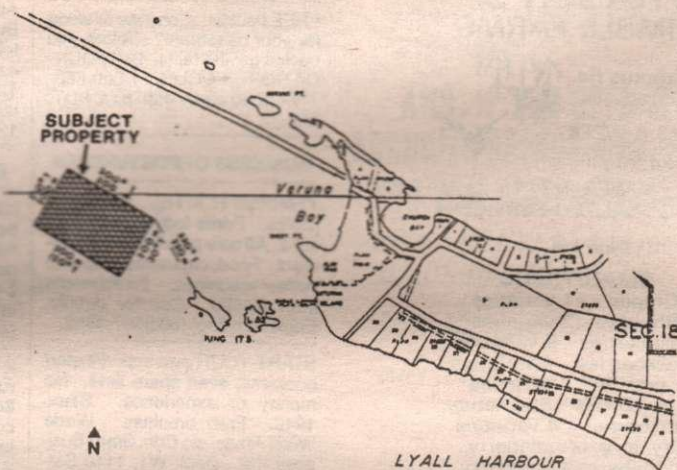

Provincial Liberal Party is preparing for B.C. election

The Liberal Party of B.C. is set to move into action when the election is called and intends to offer voters of the province a viable alternative.

The message comes from Gordon Wilson, Liberal Party leader, as he tours B.C. drumming up support. Wilson spoke to the *Driftwood* last week to outline Liberal plans and expectations.

The party intends to target ridings across the province in order to determine where the effort would best pay off. The new local riding of North Saanich-the Islands is being seriously considered as a potential battleground for the Liberals.

Wilson pointed to the split in Social Credit ranks when both the sitting members decided to seek the nomination for the northern riding. Mel Couvelier had been mayor of the Saanich municipality south of the line, Wilson noted and with the apparent ouster of Terry Huberts, the party appears split.

The Liberals will be holding a nomination meeting for the riding with Sidney businessman Clive Tanner the favourite to win.

Wilson sees the Liberals' "greatest opportunity, now." The people view politics with a jaundiced eye, he added. People are sceptical of politics in general and are "sceptical to give any political party a majority."

Wilson points to the example of Manitoba which, he said, functions well under a minority government with the Liberals holding the balance of power.

"That government," he said, "is far more observant about what people want."

Wilson indicated the actions of the B.C. government pointed to a spring election. "But if they hold off

until October, we'd be in a much stronger position."

The provincial Liberals will begin a publicity campaign geared to bring their message to the voters. The advertisements will stress the party platform as well as gain the leader, Wilson, more public exposure.

Wilson explained that if a number of Liberals were elected, they would push for a legislative committee structure in the provincial assembly.

Commenting on the way the Legislature works, Wilson said, "It's a farce. We have no democracy in B.C. at present."

The government, with a majority and without an all-party committee structure to look at bills, can ram legislation through the house.

"That's not representative government," he said.

"If you point your finger at the moon, study the moon, not your finger."

Outlining the Liberal position on various issues facing the province, Wilson claimed the New Democratic Party is not stating a clear position on the controversy in the Carmanah Valley.

The Liberals, he said, would set up a Land Use Secretariat. It would be established independently of the political process in order to establish a long range plan for land use in the province to cover up to 75 to 100 years. Part of the mandate of the group would be to encourage better planning in the forest industry.

If, Wilson said, the forest companies did not go along with the long-range plans, the government would force the issue. For instance, he

noted, if a company threatened to close a mill because timber activity was cut back, the government officials would ensure the company lost its tree farm licence.

On the forestry issues closer to home, Wilson stated, "I don't support logging in the Gulf Islands."

The islands are unique, he said, and "need to be preserved and need to be protected."

The Liberals have a plan for an Environmental Protection Insurance Fund.

If, for instance, the Crofton Mill had to be closed to protect the environment, money from the insurance fund would be used to help workers financially while the mill was closed or to find employment elsewhere.

Dumping toxic waste material into the ocean must also end, Wilson stated. If various products cannot be safely disposed of, the products should not be available for use, he said.

Wilson outlined what he sees as the issues in the coming provincial election. The leadership of Bill Vander Zalm would be an issue, he noted. The environment, affordable housing and tax reform would be stressed by the Liberals.

"Meech Lake will be an issue," he maintained.

Wilson said the constitutional crisis had not been created by Canadians but by the prime minister and the 10 premiers. The ordinary citizen did not "have it in" for Quebec, he stated. He would like to hear a strong B.C. voice on national issues, he said.

"Vander Zalm is a complete joke on matters of national consequence," he said.

Part of the problem in B.C. reminded Wilson of a Buddhist saying: "If you point your finger at the moon, study the moon—not your finger."

"And that's what B.C. has been doing," he said. "Looking at its finger."

Lou Yellowlees remembered for active SES participation

Long-time Beddis Beach resident Lou Yellowlees died at the Lady Minto Hospital recently at the age of 76.

He will be well-remembered on Salt Spring for his work on the Cusheon Creek Salmon Enhancement project.

Yellowlees moved to Salt Spring in 1969 after retiring from the Royal Canadian Air Force as Wing Commander. He served on the board of the Lady Minto Hospital and was one of the original founders of the Cusheon Creek Salmon Enhancement project.

In 1980, Yellowlees obtained permission from the federal department of fisheries to restock Cusheon Creek with coho salmon, a project which involved monitoring the flow of the creek for a year before the fish could be introduced.

After the project was taken over by the Salmon Enhancement Society, in 1984, Yellowlees visited all of the sites worked on by the society to offer encouragement and advice.

Kathy Reimer, who heads the society now, says Yellowlees was "absolutely" delighted to see the first returns of coho to the creek last

winter.

As well as being interested in fish, Yellowlees also painted and wrote plays and poetry (mostly about life in the air force). He loved animals and nature and will be greatly remembered by his many friends on Salt Spring.

"He was a kindred spirit and a one-in-a-million guy," says Reimer.

Yellowlees is survived by his wife Mary and his children Robert, Heather and Georgina as well as his grandchild Leandra, all of Victoria.

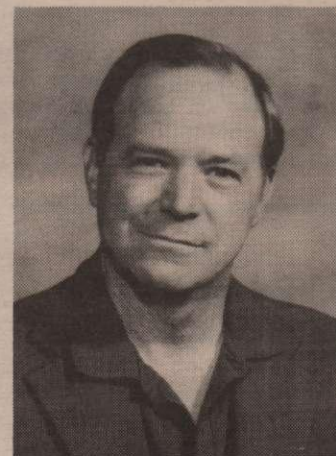

Down through the years

Thirty Years Ago

• The Gulf Islands School District received its budget for the school year from the department of education. The budget was up approximately \$17,000, 57 per cent of which would be covered by local tax dollars. The remaining 43 per cent would be paid for by the department of education.

• Victoria Day celebrations, organized by the Fulford Community Hall Association, would be held in Ganges for the first time. The organizers wanted the event to become an all-island affair. The May Queen would be crowned and sports events held during the day.

• The monthly cribbage sessions at Beaver Point ended for the season. High score during the season had been made by Mrs. A. Stevens, while John Klasson won the most games.

• The Sea Scouts of Salt Spring held regular meetings in the loft of Doug Parson's barn. There were 16 boys involved and the group was sponsored by the Legion. Leaders were J.A. Green, Jack McColl, Dennis Fleming and Jack Smith.

A search was on to find a whaler to allow the group to become water-borne.

• Drivers on Salt Spring were asked by RCMP not to make left turns across traffic in order to gain a parking space in the Ganges business district. They were also asked to observe the white lines designating parking space.

Twenty-Five Years Ago

• The Fulford Athletic Club gave \$161 to the Gulf Islands Pioneer Village fund-raising effort by the Lions Club. Along with other donations, the fund stood at \$3,103.65. The goal was to raise \$12,000.

• Fire Chief Fred Donaghy reported that the 22 volunteer firefighters of the Salt Spring Fire

Protection District answered 35 calls the previous year and spent 290 hours responding to those calls.

Only \$62,000 in damages was caused by those fires. C.W. Harrison and Alex McManus were elected as trustees for three-years terms.

• The cougar was more than six feet long. Bernie Reynolds of Salt Spring had been at Lake Cowichan with a friend and as the pair walked in the bush, the big cat appeared.

Reynolds chased it and brought it down with two shots.

• The ladies had challenged the Lions Club to a game of roller hockey. For two periods the ladies clobbered the opposition, but in the third, the Lions roared back and the final score of the games could not be determined. The three stars were Michele Byron, Laurie Cruickshank and Cpl. Fred Rhodes.

Twenty Years Ago

• The mill rate for school taxes went down 1.72 mills to 25.53 mills. It was the second year in a row that the mill rate for the Gulf Islands had dropped. One of the reasons was a \$4 million increase in assessment values in the islands. School board chairman George Heinekey noted that the provincial average was 31.81 mills and the Gulf Island rate was the lowest of the school districts in the Vancouver Island area.

• The cost of installing toilets in Centennial Park in Ganges would go up about \$800. The Centennial Park Committee, headed by Adrian Wolfe-Milner, was seeking donations to help cover the increase in costs.

• Papajohn reported from Saturna that the cement blocks for the fire hall had been put in place. A work bee, with Papajohn and Uncle Art as sidewalk superintendents, was organized to pour the concrete floor and put a roof on the structure.

• Plans for the walk-a-thon on Mayne Island were underway. Chairman of the committee would be Gordon Ducklow, while the co-ordinator would be Niel Imrie. The committee decided to change the route but the length of the walk, 10 miles, would stay the same.

Fifteen Years Ago

• A public hearing was held in Ganges to discuss changes to the Agricultural Land Reserve. Some property owners asked to be excluded from the reserve while others wanted in.

The morning session was attended by about 10 people, but the afternoon hearing attracted more than 50. Comments made at the meeting would be passed on to the Agricultural Land Commission for consideration.

• Papajohn reported from Saturna that the members of the Lions Club would have trouble making a living by singing. They were not sure of the right words to the national anthem, he noted, because few could remember the old words.

• Pender Island was not considering a wholesale jump to the Saanich School District, said Pender school trustee Don Fairweather. Parents on Pender wanted a middle school on that island and would send their children to Saanich rather than Mayne Island.

• The Galiano Golf Club was the scene of a two-ball foursome event. Jack Bickerton and Betty Stewart took top spot with Hall Tingley and Peg Bickerton as the runner-up team.

Ten Years Ago

• The Capital Regional board of directors voted to exclude the Gulf Islands from the transit levy area. The vote was tied and lost. They then voted to exclude Salt Spring and the vote passed. But they rescinded the motion and Salt Spring was back in the transit levy area.

Appeals to finance minister High Curtis would be made to have the islands excluded because no buses served them directly.

• The budget for the Gulf Islands School District was set at \$3,280,778 and the mill rate would be 48.411 mills. The figures showed an increase over the budget of the previous year of \$432,314. The mill rate for that year had been 46.938 mills.

Five Years Ago

• Residents near the Blackburn Road Dump were angry about the amount of smoke coming from that site for the last week. Operator Norman Twa said he had started a fire to burn stumps and a second fire to burn garbage. While the stumps burned well, the rain dampened the garbage fire which smouldered most of the week.

• A story in this week's *Driftwood* warns that at least three fewer teachers will be in Gulf Islands classrooms in September unless the school district can find more money. Superintendent of schools Mike Marshall told trustees that ministry funding for 1985-86 budget allowed for only 71.5 full time equivalent teachers in September. There were currently 74 on staff.

• He also released school district estimates for enrolment showing that 50 more children could be attending school at that time.

• St. Mary's Church in Fulford was broken into and several valuable items were taken. The break-in occurred sometime between April 21 and 26. Taken were two brass vases, a brass altar cross, silver wafer dish, a silver paten and a silver dish.

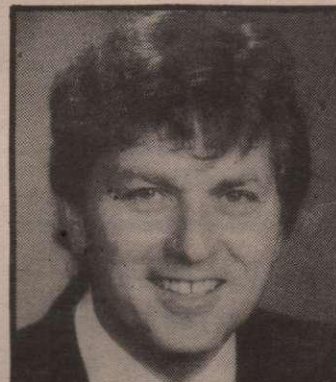
