## Beavers have new landscape

The only pair of dam-building beavers on Salt Spring Island will be able to stay in their home near Long Harbour Road if they don't tamper with renovations done by the local Salmon Enhancement Society (SES).

Kathy Reimer, who heads that group, says she and three other volunteers have been working to keep the culvert clear and the water flowing.

"(The beaver's) happy and the people on the property are happy, she says. "It looks like we can solve the problem without doing anything drastic."

Local highways members were forced to tear down the original dam near the intersection of the Long Harbour and Robinson Roads a few weeks ago when neighbours complained the dam was causing their basement to flood.

Highways foreman John Charlton said at the time his staff was forced to tear the dam down because highways is liable for any damage it might cause.

The beavers built a new dam within hours of the first one being torn down. Highways members suggested that wildlife officials may have to be brought in to move the pair.

Reimer was concerned about the tampering originally done at the site, fearing it could drive the animals away. They are the only dam-building beavers on Salt Spring Island and, while pond beavers may be common on the Gulf Islands, this variety is rare.

## Margaret Haddow trust fund set for nursing scholarships

A trust fund is being established in memory of the late Margaret Haddow to provide an annual scholarship for deserving local graduating students interested in pursuing a career in nursing.

Haddow, who died suddenly of a brain aneurysm on January 11, 1990 at age 34, was a practising registered nurse at Lady Minto Hospital in Ganeges. She is sadly missed by her friends and colleagues who wish to preserve her memory by establishment of a perpetual scholarship.

The trustees of the Scholarship Fund are Margaret's husband Trevor Haddow, and her friends Gail Mussell and Kitty Beasley.

The trustees are now soliciting donations to the fund, which will qualify as a registered charity for income tax purposes. It is hoped that sufficient donations will be received to allow interest earned upon the fund to pay an annual scholarship to a deserving local high school graduate interested in pursuing a career in any field related to nursing.

## Awareness month

# 10% suffer a speech, or hearing problem

May is speech, language and hearing awareness month.

For most people, being able to communicate is easy. However, as many as one in 10 children or adults experience a speech, language or hearing problem. This article will focus on information about children's development of communication skills. Next week will consider difficulties occurring in adults and what can be done to help.

Speech and language development begins at birth. Babies learn by listening to others around them. They experiment with many sounds. They try out first words around the first birthday. By their second birthday,

they are combining two words (on average).

At three years, more grammatical sentences are used, speech is fairly intelligible, and children understand many questions and directions. By four, comprehension is not only tied to concrete experiences, questions are asked, and speech should be almost completely intelligible. Common speech errors may be noticed with "s", "r", "l" and "th". The five year old child can use long, complex sentences, generate lots of novel ideas, and understand greater abstract information.

Speech should be completely intelligible, although there may still be those interesting word twists such as "ambience" "pasgetti" and "hosipal". My recent favourite is "tumulip" (tulip). By seven, the child has generally mastered sophisticated

Volunteers from the SES cleared and fenced off the culvert and moved the debris back about 20 feet. "Flood control" pipes were also installed through the dam so water could continue to flow if it climbed too high.

So far, the beavers have accepted the remodelling work and highways says they can stay if the water continues to flow.

In the meantime, volunteers are monitoring the site every day and clearing new build-up away.

Says Reimer: "I am amazed at the

amount of work a beaver can do in one day."

Reimer is also hopeful that an ecologically-sensitive person will buy the 18-acre site near the dam and set some of it aside for a park. She says in addition to providing a home for two rare animals, the dam also keeps water flowing in one of only 10 creeks on Salt Spring which supports a population of cut-throat trout.

## Sierra Club gives support

The Salt Spring Island Sierra Club offered support to actions being taken by local environmentalists at the Weldwood logging site on Mount Bruce.

Support was expressed at the club's May 3 meeting, which also reviewed the group's position in the next provincial meeting.

Sierra Club members expressed concern over Weldwood Canada's plans to carry out a clear-cut logging operation on Salt Spring. They supported efforts to obtain a moratorium on private land logging, until legislation can be introduced to regulate it.

The membership then considered which political party should receive its support in the next provincial election.

The group agreed both the Social Credit and New Democratic parties favour economic development, "leading to further environmental degradation."

The Green Party was considered as an alternative. Although members realized the party has little chance of electoral success at present, they agreed their support would at least

language and has sorted out all the sounds of speech. Cognitive skills continue to advance.

What can impair normal speech and language development? — varying degrees of brain damage before, during or after birth, hearing loss, illness or long hospitalization, abuse. Often, especially in milder cases, the reason is unknown, but is presumably neurologically-based.

Hearing problems can be more common than you expect. One in ten children develops hearing problems at some time. Persistent ear infections or fluid can cause speech and language delay. What are the symptoms? Ear infections can be hard to spot, but they generally appear after a cold and are most common in winter. Irritability or crankiness may be the only signs. Watch out for: high temperature, ear

pain, runny nose or ear discharge, not paying attention as usual, speaking less clearly or poor behaviour. See your doctor whenever you are concerned and be alert to recurrence. Help your child to keep good listening skills.

Parents have a very valid question: when should we worry about our child's speech? Here are some "Red Flags":

1. The child is not attending to sounds or words, vocalizing in response to being talked to or making any speech attempts by 12 months of age.

2. Meaningless jargon or a sparse repertoire of sounds persists after 18 months.

3. The child is still not talking by age two.

4. Limited or poor response to directions or questions by age two.

5. Speech is difficult to understand after age three.

6. The child omits many beginning sounds after age three.

7. The child is still not using two to three word sentences by age three.

8. Word endings are often dropped after age five.

9. Words are left out, mixed up, or ungrammatical in sentences at five ("him going there", "me not go in car").

10. The five year old still substitutes easier sounds ("tar" for "car", "pour" for "four").

11. Voice quality is monotone, too loud or too soft, the pitch is too high or low, too little or too much sound going through the nose.

12. The child displays "stuttering" behaviour, may be accompanied by struggling, avoidance, anxiety or facial grimaces, especially after age five. (A certain amount of non-fluency between two and five is considered normal).

13. The child is embarrassed or disturbed by his speech at any age. For school age children, we look out for weak vocabulary knowledge, difficulties with grammar, frequent "searching" for words, difficulty following directions, difficulty remembering information or dealing with new concepts, and persistent articulation problems.

I recommend that if any parent has a concern about a child's development, it is better to check it out rather than keep on wondering. Children do not always "grow out of" speech or language problems. ## The date is set for 1990 Terry Fox run

The date is Sunday, September 16 and the event will be the Tenth Annual Terry Fox Run.

Last year, the event gathered more than \$7 million, a 22 per cent increase above the total from 1988. And organizers expect bigger things this year.

In B.C., the 1989 run generated donations totalling \$710,000 which translates into a 46 per cent increase above the \$484,000 donated in 1988.

The run on Salt Spring attracted 118 participants and pledges, donations and sale of items related to the event brought in close to \$12,000.

All money gathered through the runs goes to the National Cancer Institute of Canada and is used to fund cancer research projects and programs.

In 1977, Terry Fox lost his right leg to cancer. Three years later, on April 12, 1980, he began his Marathon of Hope. He intended to run across Canada to raise awareness of the need for cancer research, and money to help fund it.

His efforts ended at Thunder Bay,

Ontario and he died on June 29, 1981. But his dream did not end and the Marathon of Hope brought in more than \$25 million. In September of each year, Canadians perpetuate the Marathon of Hope with the Terry Fox Run.

"Somewhere the hurting must stop," Terry Fox said of his efforts to raise money for cancer research.

Betty Fox, his mother, said of the event this year, "It's so exciting that people have never forgotten Terry's dream to find a cure for cancer and I don't think they ever will."

"Even little children who weren't born when Terry ran his marathon know about Terry and want to be a part of the run. I'm really looking forward to this year."

Organizers of the Terry Fox Run in B.C. set the tone of why the dream will not die: "When the Marathon of Hope began, Terry Fox opened the door to finding a cure for that horrible thing called cancer."

"The Marathon of Hope showed us that maybe, if we all work together, cancer can be beaten."

# Limpets and barnacles: salubrious seafood

I will have none on't: we shall lose our time,

And all be turn'd to barnacles, or apes

With foreheads villanous low.

Shakespeare, *The Tempest*

It is with reluctance that I undertake to write about barnacles and limpets — not, as you might think, from any concern for the delicacy of my readers; but rather because I do not wish to be responsible for an assault upon our beaches by a famished army of gastronomes in search of culinary novelty. As with nettles, the best thing for the future of the plants and animals of this coast is to remain, except to the cognoscenti, uninteresting.

The etymology of barnacles is suitably hidden in various celtic and mediaeval fogs, although a connection has long existed between barnacles and a European wild goose, anser bernicla. The Elizabethan poet Drayton believed barnacles grew on trees, and then dropped into the sea, where they were oddly transmogrified into geese.

Others swore that the birds emerged from the "goose-neck" barnacles which flourish on exposed, rocky shores where changing tides and shifting currents require great flexibility of the neck for the species to survive.

Perhaps they really had in mind those devious birds of prey, the politicians and their flocks of gaily plumaged servants, who cling to office in spite of the assaults of common sense and of the appeals to reason by everyone around them, simply by bending their long, slippery necks and presenting yet another face to weather the storms of protest in which they are continuously immersed.

Another technique the cunning gooseneck barnacles favour is that of living in groups and clusters whose solidarity is so dense as to leave the inmates indifferent to the clamour. Only their armed crowns are allowed to extend above the seething, communal masses.

The word limpet, meanwhile, is derived from the Latin for lamprey, an eel whose eating habits are unsavoury in the extreme. This creature attaches itself to other fish and eats its way through them by sucking and grinding. Then it rests, like a limpet, upon the nearest rock in gluttonous stupefaction. A hideous sight. The metaphorical, not to say metamorphic, connection with Ministers of Finance is obvious.

There is, however, a difference. Mr. Wilson and Mr. Couvelier do not, quite, devour all of the body politic; but on the other hand they take no rest from their labours and seem content to munch on endlessly in the belief that whatever goods, and services, and reasonableness, and intelligence, we may regenerate between budgets they effortlessly will be able to consume.

In addition to the goosenecks, acorn barnacles and giant acorn barnacles flourish on the west coast. The acorns are intertidal and familiar to everyone. The goosenecks may require a little courage to gather, since they flourish in rocky, waveswept

places. The giant barnacles, which can achieve a shell 12 cm high and 8 cm in diameter, will have to be obtained by a diver; but these are the most delicious, an unusual and salubrious seafood that reminds you of scallops and crabs and yet has its own special place in the hearts, and

on the palates, of good cooks.

## Sauteed Giant Acorn Barnacles

2T unsalted butter / pinch minced garlic / pince minced shallot / 1t dry white wine / 4 giant acorn barnacles,

cleaned carefully / 1/2t chopped parsley

Melt the butter and add the garlic, shallot and wine. Cook for a few moments. Now add the barnacle meats and saute for five seconds only on each side. Garnish with parsley and serve.

This recipe, which is how Sinclair Philip prepares barnacles at the Sooke Harbour House north of Victoria, makes a splendid hors-d'oeuvre.

## Pasta with Limpets in Black Butter

1 lb limpet meats (or as much as you have patience to gather) / salt and

pepper / 1/4 t summer savory / 1/8 t cumin / 1 T good olive oil / 1/2 C butter / 1 t lemon juice / 1 lb. cooked pasta

Season the limpet meats with salt and pepper, summer savory and cumin. Saute for only a minute on each side in olive oil. Set aside, reserving the olive oil.

Now add the butter to the olive oil, and cook slowly until it browns. Add the lemon juice. Add the cooked limpets. Toss. Pour over the pasta.

I got the idea of combining limpets and pasta from my colleague John Doerper, whose recent book *Shellfish Cookery* has a definite west coast flavour.

To the Editor, Controversy rolls on regarding industrial or large-scale clear-cut logging of private tracts of land on this island. On Tuesday, May 1, over 100 residents collected at the local Islands Trust office telling trustees that there must be rules and regulations governing logging on the Gulf Islands. On Thursday, May 3, over 200 islanders held a meeting at Drummond Park, spoke their heart-felt concerns, and many hiked up to Mt. Bruce to camp, ready to meet directly with those carrying out the Weldwood logging operation. Weldwood is currently in the limelight, but Texada is waiting in the wings and local land developers are continuing their removal of trees in large cuts.

At an Island Watch Society directors' meeting Tuesday night, we discussed many concerns about what was going on with industrial logging on private land, especially on Salt Spring. How do we feel? We want "Forests Forever", but don't see that possible with present log-and-leave practices.

Currently, logging operators on private land can get away without cleaning up and without replanting. We also find it strange that the B.C. government and logging companies continue to pay no heed to what has been learned in other logging countries, namely, that long-term planning and use of alternative logging methods must be chosen if one really wants Forests Forever. We understand that individuals or groups who are now involved in direct protest action with logging companies or the government do so out of utter frustration with the lack of response to other methods, e.g. lobbying, made by many communities.

We squarely lay the blame on the government, which is continuing to

allow unregulated industrial logging on private land in communities sorely torn by its effects.

Events on the rocks follow an unsettling trend these days. Mob rule rules, or tries to.

And the implications are frightening.

Weldwood harvests trees, the better to make money. Individuals find tree cutting and making money alien to their concept of the real world and try to stop the practice.

They, the group who adore trees more than common sense, gathered at the Islands Trust office in Ganges recently, the better to accomplish something or other.

"Do something," they chanted. "We are Salt Spring. Do something."

Nick Gilbert, head honcho of the Islands Trust agreed something should be done.

Several days later, these self-appointed guardians of all that's-good-in-life marched to the top of the Mount Bruce to stop the chain saws. Gilbert, exhibiting his stalwart leadership, supported them. No one cared about the fine point of trespassing on private property.

Weldwood, uncaring corporate citizen that it is, gave the loggers a holiday. The enforced holiday came about because Weldwood wanted to avoid a confrontation particularly when the tree-folk brought children along. At one point, the tree folk told the world 20 people manned the barricades on the mountain top. Certainly: eight adults and 12 children.

**Think making money is grubby**

Events heated. The Islands Trust, to disprove the theory they exist to "oppose and obstruct," met in Nanaimo to consider a resolution calling for a permanent rest for chain saws in the Gulp Isles. The motion passed with one lone vote against.

Now comes the part which shows-to-go what kind of intellect inhibits the folk who think making money is grubby. At least one of the members of Green Islands called for the resignation of the Islands Trustee who dared vote against the logging ban. Others in that organization, seeing the stupidity of such a move, quickly quieted that the individual.

They scurry about these folks, telling all and sundry they ARE the Salt Spring community. They insist their concept of the world be accepted. Gulp Islanders have elected officials to represent them although sometimes the elected get things mixed up and seem to spout their pet theories which miss the ideas and beliefs of many, many rock sitters.

**Democracy means nothing**

What worries most about the situation is the audacity of these folks. Democracy means nothing to them, it seems. Their concept must prevail. Opposition is derided, chastised, smeared and rejected. Don't, by all means, don't hold to your personal view. Agree with them.

Green Islands issued a press release concerning the situation, as seen through green eyes, on Mount Bruce.

"Community representatives want the company to come back to the bargaining table to negotiate a sustainable logging plan as well as preservation of sensitive areas of old growth and wetlands."

Green Islands, the trypewriter did not name you as his representative. Don't take it upon yourself, without at least checking, to call yourselves "community representatives." Such a title infers being elected by a majority of residents. The trypewriter doesn't recall such an election recently.

As to "back to the bargaining table," Weldwood has not bargained with anyone about logging land the company owns.

**Another voice of Salt Spring spoke up**

This group, Green Islands, wants a halt to "commercial logging." Taken to the extreme, commercial logging can be defined as cutting trees to clear land to build a house. Commercial logging would encompass cutting trees to be sold for firewood.

As further example of the tactics of Green Islands, one looks at another hand-out from the group. That tract accuses Weldwood "of a planned 740 acre clearcut, which will destroy the Fulford Valley over an as yet ambiguous period of time."

Ask Weldwood. The company plans to cut 125 acres of 750 acres it owns on the mountain. The remaining trees, immature at best, will be logged in about 20 years time.

The trypewriter thanks Green Islands for letting the public know the area below the mountain is the Fulford Valley. Lo, these many years, islanders have been mistaken in calling it Burgoyne Valley.

The objective of bringing intelligence to logging practices in B.C. rates commendation. Methods used to achieve that end to date: lies, distortions of facts and trampling of the rights of others, bring condemnation to the group. More's the pity.

Last week, another voice of Salt Spring spoke up.

The question remains: will it actually be heard? Will it ac-

**Couvelier speaks to Rotarians**

British Columbia's Minister of Finance said B.C. would not suffer financially if Canada separated over the Meech Lake Accord.

Speaking at a Rotary Club meeting on Salt Spring Island last week, Mel Couvelier said most of B.C.'s trade is done with Pacific Rim countries and not with the United States or other parts of Canada. Therefore, he said, B.C. would probably not suffer financially if Canada were to divide over the accord.

Couvelier said Premier Bill Vander Zalm supports the accord because it carries his name. He said that while the premier feels the original intent of Meech Lake has "been breached," he feels obliged to support a document which bears his name.

On other matters, Couvelier said the province's economic future looks "dicey" in the short-term, but good in both the medium- and long-term. He said the concern now is that private sector employees will ask for wage settlements equal to those of the public sector.

Couvelier said public employees are receiving 7.5 per cent wage increases — 3.5 per cent higher than private sector employees.

The larger settlements are intended to compensate for the period of time when public employees did not receive wage increases due to government restraint.

Couvelier said private sector employees could use the 7.5 per cent increase as a bench mark for their own wage demands, triggering a further downward spiral in the economy.

Couvelier suggested one of the government's more significant accomplishments in the past four years has been regional diversification which created jobs throughout the province.

He said half of all the new jobs in Canada last year were in B.C.

Couvelier hopes further diversification will include a move away from logging and into other types of industry.

**Auxiliary decorates hospital**

Ten new flower boxes and six hanging baskets decorate the Lady Minto Hospital this week, installed by the hospital auxiliary to mark Hospital Health Week, May 7 through 12.

Mary Walker, a member of the auxiliary, says funding for the boxes was provided by a couple who recently celebrated their 50th wedding anniversary on Salt Spring. Walker said the wife had been a patient at Lady Minto and wanted to make a contribution that would leave a lasting benefit.

Hospital Health Week is designed to increase public awareness about the hospital, said auxiliary president Bea Carr, adding it was only the second time Hospital Health Week was officially celebrated in B.C.

Last year, the auxiliary sponsored an open house at the hospital which attracted more than 250 people.

Altogether, the auxiliary has more than 140 active members on Salt Spring who raise close to \$50,000 annually to buy equipment for the hospital and another \$10,000 for Greenwoods. Most of that comes

# Driftwood

## Down through the years

### Thirty Years Ago

• Mrs. L.G. Mouat, Mrs. M.T. Mouat and Mrs. I.B. Devine entertained at a tea at the latter's home in honour of Mrs. J. McGill and Mrs. C. F. Mouat prior to their moving to Seattle. Mrs. F. L. Jackson and Mrs. B.A. Wilson presided at the tea.

• Excerpt from the journal of Anthony Tripp, said to have been found with letters in rubbish removed from a derelict farm on Maxwell Mountain:

27 January, 1867. The sea being quiet, I floated our boat and rowed me to Borgoyne Bay, there to seek Beef. Saw Mr. John Maxwell, Mr. Frederick Foord and Mr. Thomas Williams who were in discussion about the pressing need for a Loading Wharf, the better to serve the interests of the Settlers of Borgoyne Valley.

I had subsequently some discourse with Mr. Maxwell, who was worried by a repeated loss of Beefs from Thieves. Being a dour, strong character, he usually thinks deeply and says little. On this occasion, however, he complained bitterly he no longer held faith in the capacity of the Authorities to afford a right and proper protection to the Queen's Subjects.

He opined Salvation lay in Federation with Canada, for so long as we remain isolated, we also remain weak. He could not stomach annexation to the United States, a course favoured by some disgruntled Merchants in Fort Victoria. Asked if he blamed the Indians for his losses, he replied some of the tracks showed the persons abetting them well shod, therefore White.

Moreover, the thefts were planned so ingeniously, they betrayed direction by a Person of no mean intelligence. He sought my opinion of the Australian, Mr. Walch, who was hither and worked long at no place. I said he struck me as a might civil Gentleman.

### Twenty Five Years Ago

• A report on the local school district budget was presented to the board by Dr. T. L. Jansch, finance committee chairman. The report revealed the provincial government would assume only slightly more than six per cent of the net operating budget for the year 1965.

The government would thus contribute only \$6,816 net operating expenditure plus \$8,962 to debt and capital costs on a total budget expenditure of \$349,688. The local school district was to assume 95.32 per cent of these costs.

The budget for next year was up \$52,036 from the year before necessitating a rise in the mill rate from 21.38 to 23.92. This was still below the provincial average of 25.48.

• W. P. "Bill" Evans, resident of Salt Spring for 53 years, celebrated his 74th birthday on May 15.

• The announcement of plans to build a chronic care unit in conjunction with the present hospital building was the highlight of the annual report given by Mr. M. Atkins, chairman of the Lady Minto Hospital board. Administrator Harold Hofman reported that out of a total operating budget of some \$90,000,

the year ended with a \$30.74 surplus. 378 adults and children were patients during the year and 30 new babies were born. The hospital had been in operation for 51 years — the last seven at its current site.

### Twenty Years Ago

• The Salt Spring Island bowling team, headed by Phil Valcourt, took the zone championship in Victoria. The island bowlers played three games to get to the top of the Festival of Sports bowling contest for Vancouver Island. Top island ball rollers were Phil and Yvette Valcourt, Leo Toutant, Frank Schwagly and Rowena Dixon.

• The Galiano Rod and Gun Club sponsored a dance in Galiano Hall Saturday to the music of Peter Darling and Maury Lupton on the piano with Mark Darling on the drums. Mrs. Peter Denroche reportedly played the castanets with considerable flair and zest.

• Papajohn reported from Saturna that 16 people on that island were supposed to go over to Mayne to give blood. But when "old faithful Dave Jack" went to the wharf to take people over, only person was there.

### Fifteen Years Ago

• The fall fair in spring was May Day on Salt Spring Island. Part of the day was devoted to a parade of floats and entertainment in the school grounds, as well as a livestock show, pancake breakfast and the crowning of the new May Queen Jane Toynbee.

• On Mayne, the Lions Club enjoyed another successful auction, president Ron Mitchell said. Auctioneering by Bill Hortie brought in more than \$600. Participants strolled around the grounds of the Mayne Inn bidding on an item then enjoying a dance and a "wee drop or two" inside the Inn.

• Water bus or high-speed boat would not be acceptable among the Outer Islands the Gulf Island School Board was warned. Clare McAllister, chairman of the Outer Islands co-ordinating committee, reported that all parent groups had strong, unmoving opinions toward daily transportation by water bus.

### Ten Years Ago

• The Mayne Inn's 200-foot wharf at Bennet Bay, Mayne Island, was ruled legal by the B.C. Supreme Court. Mr. Justice F.C. Munroe overturned an injunction against the dock and dismissed action by the Islands Trust against the hotel.

The Trust's argument that the dock was not private but designed for commercial activity was rejected by Munroe. He decided it was a private dock which would provide access to property immediately abutting the foreshore.

• MLA Hugh Curtis, minister of finance, and his executive assistant visited Galiano. Because the ferry was an hour late, he had to fly in to keep his first appointment with the executive committee of the Chamber of Commerce.

• A local minor told Judge D.D. McAdam that he went to the Harbour House pub only to use the telephone. However, the police presented evidence that the minor had been sitting at a table with a beer glass in front of him. The minor told the

court that the beer glass was empty and that it belonged to another person who had been sitting there. He said he had only sat down only to wait for a taxi. The youth was fined \$100.

### Five Years Ago

• Salt Spring Island residents were told they would have to pay an additional 42 per cent in property taxes if the island was incorporated as a municipal district.

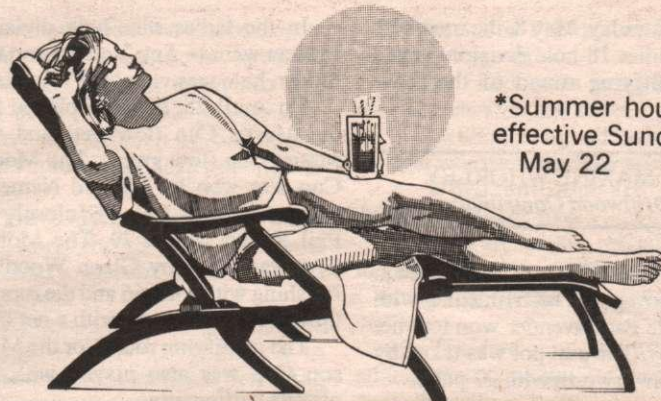
A report prepared by the Salt Spring Community Planning Association said \$1,350,556. would have to be raised through property taxes to cover municipal costs of \$2,174,556.

• Islands Trust bylaws allowing development on Channel Ridge were approved. The bylaws amended the community plan and zoning and subdivision bylaws to meet the cluster type of development outlined in the project. Project spokesman Louie Lindholm said he hoped to create a pattern for future developments on the island.

• A four-month study of Salt Spring ravens verifies what local farmers have long maintained — there are too many ravens on the island. The study's solution is to either cull the number of ravens, reduce the availability of food to them, "or make them go away somehow by scare tactics." The garbage dump is an obvious attraction to ravens and is a major food source.
