

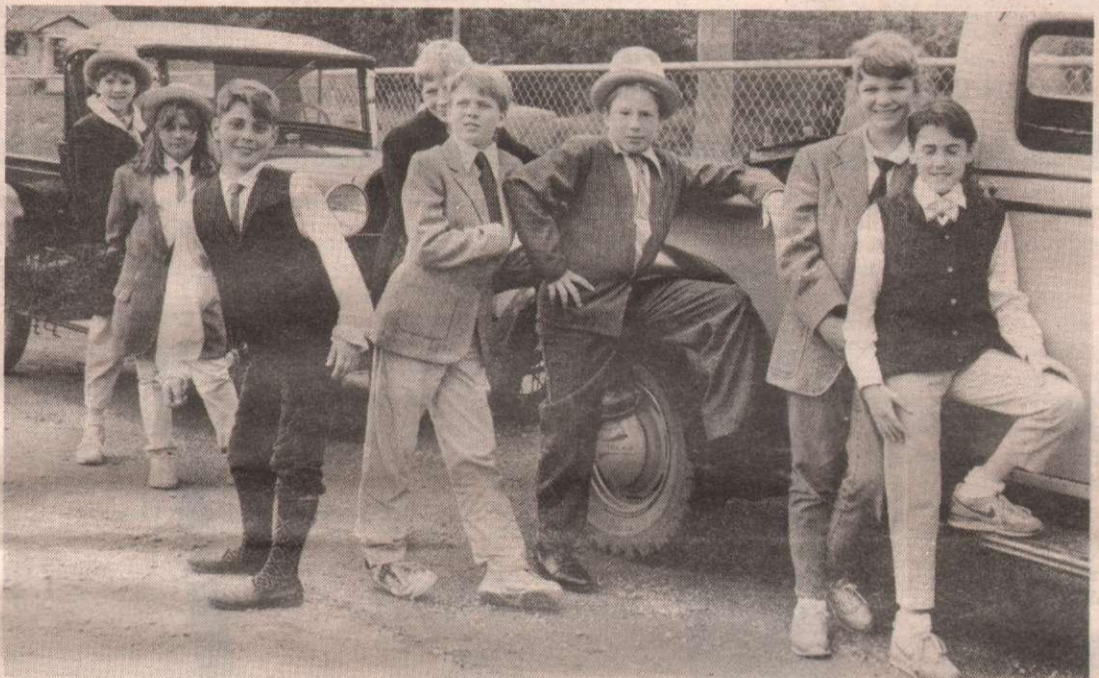

## Local high school merits praise accreditation survey indicates

A team of educators who carried out an accreditation survey at Gulf Islands Secondary School says the community should be proud of the school and its students.

In a letter to *Driftwood*, External Accreditation Team chairman and Superintendent of Schools Owen Corcoran said the team was "most impressed with the general student body."

"The school and the community may be justly proud of its Student Council, peer counsellors, its *Wish Upon a Star* troupers and workers, and the hundred and one other daily student roles that were filled so ably."

The team travelled to Salt Spring Island earlier this year. As part of its review, members made phone contact with a random selection of parents and spoke informally to busi-

ness people in Ganges. The group — consisting of two superintendents of schools and two principals — also spent a great deal of time in the school.

Corcoran said "your students were courteous and co-operative, they interacted with us respectfully and with a sense of equality as people, and they gave us many pleas-

## Local firefighters to raise MD funds

Salt Spring volunteer firefighters will be at shopping malls and other public locations this Saturday working to raise money for the Muscular Dystrophy Association of Canada.

Association regional director for B.C. and the Yukon Norma Saltzberg says the money will be used to buy equipment for people who have the disease.

A child who suffers from Duchenne Muscular Dystrophy — one of 10 forms of MD — could require \$40,000 worth of equipment during his short lifespan — none of which is covered by B.C.'s medical services plan.

Each type of muscular dystrophy is progressive and fatal. The most severe forms are Duchenne Disease,

which affects children, and Lou Gehrig Disease which attacks older people. People usually die within five to six years after the symptoms of Lou Gehrig appear.

The symptoms of all types of MD are the same — general weakness and laboured movement. However, the severity of the symptoms will vary with the type of MD.

Approximately 550 people in B.C. have MD. There is no cure or treatment.

Saltzberg says, however, there are currently five major research projects looking into the disease: one is in Toronto and the other four in the United States. Other research projects are underway at the Univer-

sity of British Columbia and Simon Fraser University.

Last year, the 225 fire departments who participated in the one-day campaign raised close to \$500,000. The department on Salt Spring brought in \$3,000.

Saltzberg says people who have the disease can require between \$25,000 and \$40,000 worth of equipment during their illness. A child with Duchenne, for example, will need a manual wheel chair by the time he is eight or nine, a power wheel chair within the next three years and a hospital bed when he is 14, plus other equipment which will enable him to stay at home.

The association also pays for medications and other prescription needs that are not paid for by B.C.'s medical services plan.

Les Wagg, chief of the local department, says 28 volunteers are expected to participate in this year's campaign through which the department hopes to match or beat the \$3,000 raised last year.

Firefighters will be at a variety of locations on the island between 10 a.m. and 6 p.m. this Saturday.

## Regulations changed for West Coast's trek

Hiking the West Coast Trail in Pacific Rim Park exists as an enjoyable diversion for many islanders.

Changes to regulations for use of the trail recently came into place. Backpackers are required to register and obtain a free permit before starting out on their hikes. Permits must be picked up in person at the trailhead information centres at either Port Renfrew or Pachena Bay near Bamfield.

The West Coast Trail began about 1900 as a lifesaving trail to aid the rescue of shipwrecked sailors. At 77 kilometres in length, the trail demands stamina, self-sufficiency and expertise not only in hiking but in camping.

The requirement for registration enables the park service to ensure the hikers know how to do it and also what to expect.

A second regulation change increase the group size to 10 people from the previous eight. The added

two hikers allow for more economical trips while keeping the impact of group activities to a minimum.

Groups organizing for a trip along the trail are encouraged to contact one of the information centres before hand to give the park service people a chance to schedule hikers and thus avoid congestion at campsites.

Telephone numbers for the Pacific Rim National Park are: Port Renfrew — 647-5434, Pachena Bay — 728-3234, Long Beach — 726-4212.

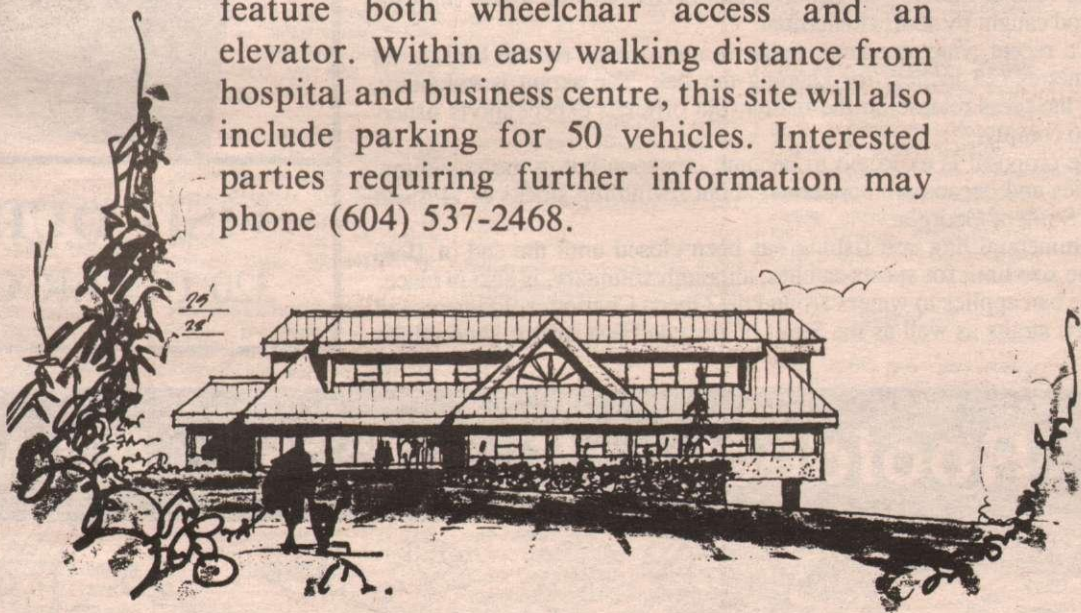
Information centres are open 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. each day with the Long Beach facility remaining open until October 10 and the other two centres staying open until September 30.

Campground fees are \$8.50 until the end of this month and rise to \$10.50 from June 1 to September 30. At that time the fees drop back to \$8.50 until the end of October when a self-registration fee of \$5 comes into effect until mid-March, 1991.

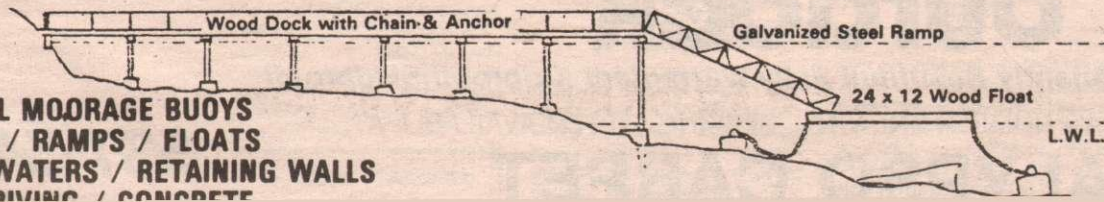

# Soccer teams battle for Springford Cup

Some of you may be familiar with the ABC television serial "Twin Peaks". Starting this week the Driftwood will publish, in two parts, the Eric Springford Challenge Cup serial. Part one covers the time period Saturday to Sunday, before Monday's deadline. Part two, next week, will tie up the loose ends, namely Monday's results, trophy winners, and the Cup winner.

Now, how shall I paint the picture? How shall I be your eyes and describe what has occurred? Remember Twin Peaks? Evocative visual imagery sets the tone of the series. The opening credits roll over the symbolic images of Yin and Yang — a bird and a smokestack of industry. Proceeding from there to offer the Tibetan Buddhist symbolism for the elements, the five passive forces of nature.

Contrast that with Eric Springford imagery: Yin and Yang — men wearing short pants and t-shirts in the freezing rain. Then there's the symbolism of certain players' profiles and Roman Emperors. Last week the Emperor Claudius proclaimed the games and promised to visit — he didn't arrive, or at least no one I talked to mentioned a lame, stuttering gentleman speaking Latin, Greek or Etruscan — although, interestingly enough, three actual players resembled important figures in Roman history.

Malcolm Legg of Salt Spring resembles the Emperor Tiberous somewhat, and Mike Anderson of Sidetrack, looks something like Caligula, and Bob Toma, of Sidetrack, looks a lot like Brutus of Edward de Vere's (the 17th Earl of Oxford, a.k.a. William Shakespeare) Julius Caesar — if you hold to the theory, as I do, that Brutus of "Popeye" fame is a direct descendant of the Roman Brutus.

OK, the Yin and Yang don't work, but the Roman history bit fits in nicely with soccer and Italy hosting the 1990 World Cup, doesn't it?

So much for symbolism, on to the plot. Saturday's play was distin-

guished by a distinguished visitor. Victoria Steelers arrived with Nick Gilbert in tow which caused quite a buzz in the spectator galleries.

"See that guy in the white shirt and blue shorts?"

"Yeah".

"That's Nick Gilbert."

"Who's Nick Gilbert?"

"Canadian International Striker."

Last week he was playing for Canada against Mexico, this week he's on Salt Spring playing for the Eric Springford Cup."

"Isn't he on the Island's Trust?"

Anyway, Steelers finished the first two days undefeated, winning 4-1, 4-2, and 2-0 and also tying Powell River.

Salt Spring F.C. opened against Andy Capp on Saturday and drew 1-1. Kerry Walker supplied the goal, converting a fine cross from Darren Strong. William Todd Tamboline, 21, of Ganges, had a touch on the ball at one point, too, he tells me.

Two time winner Powell River, won their first game Saturday, 4-1, and followed up with a 3-2 win over Salt Spring. F.C. led 2-1 at half time and completely dominated up to that point but for some reason the victory eluded them. Dave McColl and David Toynbee scored for F.C. — these are the Daves I know.

On Sunday, F.C. dominated again but drew, again, 1-1 against Vic West. Darren Strong scored F.C.'s goal after getting on the end of some good work by William Todd Tamboline, 21, of Walker Hook.

Sunday's last game was an exciting, brutal contest between Delta Sidetrack and Salt Spring F.C. Sidetrack's vicious tackling threatened to turn the friendly atmosphere into gang warfare but exceptional refereeing by Matt Flanagan preserved the game and fittingly, David McColl blasted home the winning goal on a free kick late in the game.

The result pleased everyone, the fans, the referees, the other four teams, and especially F.C. As I write this we are preparing to play Vic West for third place but beating "Track makes up for missing out on the final.

Next week Part Two will chronicle the results from the tournament's final day.

## Ling cod size limit set

The federal ministry of fisheries and oceans has set a size limit for ling cod caught by sports fishermen.

In a recent announcement, fisheries and oceans set the limit at 58 centimetres (23 inches) for keeping the fish. The action is voluntary, noted the press release on the matter, but officials expect sports fishermen to comply.

The proposal is expected to become law soon but in the meantime, fisheries and oceans are concerned about dwindling stocks of ling cod in the Strait of Georgia.

Commercial ling cod fishing has been closed until the end of 1990 and the size limit for sports catches, although voluntary, is also in place.

The ban applies to waters around the Queen Charlottes, Johnston and Georgia straits as well as the Strait of Juan de Fuca east of Sheringham Point.

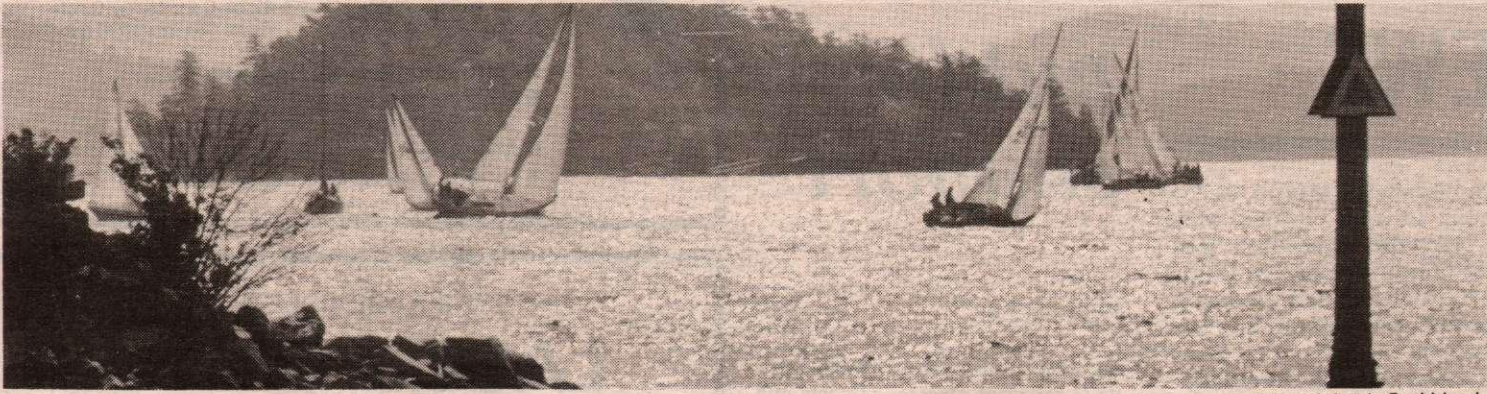

## An open letter to the residents of Salt Spring.....

Until the recent advent of environmentalist groups intent on saving every tree, logging has been a traditional and honourable occupation in the Gulf Islands, responsible in large measure for the physical and economic environment its residents enjoy today.

Island residents have been extremely tolerant of the various cultural, religious, environmental and political beliefs of fellow Islanders. This is what makes our Island special.

The Islands Trust, at the urging of and with the full support of "special interest" groups, introduced and passed a resolution calling for a moratorium on all commercial logging in the Gulf Islands. This resolution, as sent to the Lieutenant Governor in Council, reads:

The Trust Council's Policy Statement May 5th 1990 - "The Islands Trust Council recommends to the Lieutenant Governor in Council that an immediate moratorium be placed on commercial harvesting of timber in the Islands Trust area. The Council further recommends to the Lieutenant Governor in Council that the moratorium remain in place for each island community until such time as regulations and policies regarding the commercial harvesting of timber are determined by each island community in consultation with appropriate Government ministries and Islands Trust."

The resolution was passed at a special meeting called minutes after the adjournment of a Budget Meeting. Only 15 minutes were allowed to introduce, discuss and vote on the resolution.

Nick Gilbert, Chairman of the Islands Trust, permitted a violation of Trust policy, and of the rights and privileges of elected representatives, by not informing all Trustees of the second meeting.

The moratorium could be permanent - the resolution has no time limit!

The resolution was made to the Lieutenant Governor in Council, not the Legislative Assembly.

The resolution does not allow for exemptions (i.e. firewood, clearing for building sites, farm land clearing, Christmas tree cutting, licensed tree farms, etc.).

A MINIMUM of 35 families will immediately be stripped of their livelihood the day a moratorium is declared. In the days that follow, many more families in the community will suffer the consequences as the effects ripple through the local economy.

A spokesperson for Green Islands has been quoted in "The Vancouver Sun" as saying... "the private property issue was a reflection of an outdated way of thinking."

This moratorium could be used to prevent you from cutting a single tree.

ing pictures of them as students in a wide range of classes, subjects and co-curricular activities."

He went on to indicate that each day "hosts of good things happen in and around GISS."

The school, he noted, does an "admirable" job of trying to draw these things to the community's attention. Often, however, the communication effort is thwarted by a human tendency to dwell on the negative, he added.

"A school does not stand alone. Nor can the school do it all. The school and the community are partners in readying our youth for future citizenship."

He urged the community to consider what it can do to help the school.

"Good schools become great schools, even excellent schools, when all their audiences understand and serve the major purposes of each school with strong social commitment."

I found a 'Warm Deal'

Time again to comment upon activities abounding on the rocks. To meet the criticisms of critics of the typewriter, no comments on controversial issues will be offered. Instead, glances are cast at such endeavours as slo-pitch, Jellyfish, and other sundry and interesting items of rock life.

He, the typewriter, won't indulge in lies and innuendo about cutting trees, placing planks along the low-water line of Ganges Harbour, or indeed, about any such nonsense.

He, the typewriter, is, after all, a humble, modest and unassuming individual who seeks only to be loved and appreciated.

For the past number of years, Sea Capers, the Terry Fox Run, the Fall Fair, and slo-pitch, among other rock endeavours, have each benefitted from the presence of Jellyfish. They, of course, will deny any hint of altruism and reject any commendation for what, to Jellyfish, is merely enjoyment of the various facets of island life.

But that's what being a Jellyfish is about. One does not expect praise for doing what comes naturally.

There are ever increasing questions about the wisdom of the forestry practice known as clear-cutting. Where has U.B.C.'s School of Forestry been in this and other public debates?

Last fall, a five-person committee chaired by U.B.C. vice-president of research Robert Miller, released a 20 page review which examined U.B.C.'s School of Forestry. When it came to the school's role in facilitating public information gathering, the committee concluded:

"It is seen as not meeting expectations, nor rising to challenges nor exploiting opportunities. It is believed to be insular and uncommunicative. There is good reason to agree that these perceptions and beliefs are solidly grounded in facts." (Executive Summary, P.1)

In an angry, 10-page memo dated December 7, 1989, School of Forestry Dean Robert Kennedy made this biased reply:

"To be completely realistic, the faculty must be circumspect about their involvement in controversial or emotional issues. The large integrated companies are increasingly sponsoring or supporting our Faculty's research. They can easily be alienated by the perception that the Faculty is promoting a subject which they deem not to be in their best interest." (P.8)

Considering that the main forestry building on the U.B.C. campus is called the MacMillan Building, such comments are not surprising.

# Communication problems can impair adults

Second of Two Parts

Last week, communication skill development in children was discussed. This week, as speech, language and hearing awareness month continues, the focus will be on communication impairments which occur with adults.

"Communication" — the word itself is one of the big buzzwords these days, used to mean T.V., radio, newspapers, fax machines, public relations, etc. What it boils down to is "getting your message across."

The majority of people have adequate speech, language and hearing abilities which allow them to get and receive the myriad number of messages we exchange in daily living.

Others do not. A communication impairment can range from mild to severe in its impact. Some impairments are also more obvious than others. Stuttering can be immediately apparent, a hearing loss may not.

What are the communication disorders affecting adults? The most common one is hearing loss, which occurs in about 10 per cent of the general population, 20 per cent of those over 65, and about 40 per cent of those over 75.

Hearing impairment is usually characterized by distortion of sound, particularly speech sounds, as well as diminished loudness. Hearing aids can help, but do not restore normal hearing, and so the task of understanding others' conversation can still be a great strain.

Some suggestions to help you communicate with a hearing impaired person are: try to keep the light on your face; do not cover your mouth; try to keep facing the listener; start a conversation with a key phrase so that the hearing impaired is clear about the topic e.g. "let's go to Victoria." If you are not understood the first time, don't repeat the same sentence over and over, reword your sentence.

It may be helpful to write down a key word sometimes, ask the person if this is useful; speak distinctly, but

don't shout (shouting distorts your words and facial expression); if the person has a "good ear," stand on that side when speaking; be aware of background noises, which can seriously interfere with comprehension.

Hearing loss can result from aging, noise exposure, some drugs, infection or disease. If you have any concern about your hearing, ask your physician for referral for a hearing assessment.

Other types of communication disorders experienced by adults include stuttering, voice problems, residual articulation difficulties, and language comprehension and/or language expression difficulties resulting from (cerebrovascular) strokes, accidents, and degenerative diseases, such as Parkinson's Disease.

Depending on the severity of the problem, impairment of one's ability to communicate is not only extremely frustrating but can also lead to feelings of isolation.

Adults living in this area can receive speech-language therapy services from the Gorge Road Hospital,

Speech Department, tel. 386-2464, or CRD Speech and Hearing Clinic, tel. 388-2250, both in Victoria.

There are support groups for various communication impairments, for example, Speak Easy of Victoria for stutterers. Information

on support groups should be available from the public health nurse or from physicians. If individuals on Salt Spring are interested in more information on particular problems, or want suggestions, they may also contact me, at 537-2616.

## Focus needed

To the Editor,

The May 10 meeting at Mahon Hall, called to gather broad community input on the Islands Trust motion calling for an immediate moratorium on industrial-commercial clear-cut logging on privately-held land, may well be the fore-runner of future meetings to be held by the other Island Trust communities.

It is to be hoped, however, that the other communities will be able to more precisely focus their discussions of the pros and cons and more successfully keep in mind just who it is that the Trust motion targets.

Unfortunately, many of the views expressed were clearly misdirected and some fell into what might be charitably characterized as a discordant abyss of polarized half-thought.

Perhaps one could be generous and lay the blame for much of what was said on the doorstep of misinformation or a simple lack of understanding. But, regrettably, it goes much deeper than that into the murky waters of self-interest.

I think most islanders have, by now, seen and heard the unmistakable evidence of the environmental and social changes taking place around the world. It would be regrettable if those with vested and deeply-rooted interests, no matter how legal or chronologically-based, fail to see beyond the walls of their absolute rights and recognize that other beings also have rights that must be protected. Have they not noticed that the walls of absolute rights are crumbling wherever there is social, political, ecological and environmental injustice?

I think all Salt Spring Islanders, including those with a clear conflict of interest, must try harder to focus, objectively, on the purpose of the Island Trust moratorium motion and try to make a positive contribution to a community solution. The sooner, the better!

## Down through the years

### Thirty Years Ago

• May Day celebrations on Salt Spring were sponsored by the Fulford Hall Association and held in Ganges for the first time. Kathleen Butt was crowned May Queen by retiring Queen Joan Warburton. Kathie Morrison and Elizabeth Beech were the princesses. Constable H. Bonner of Ganges RCMP led the parade.

• The Hospital Improvement District met for an annual meeting and the chairman's report, read by H.C. Giegerich, noted an operating deficit of \$1,195.78 for Lady Minto Hospital. The non-operating revenue came close to cancelling the shortfall. The mill rate for the year for running the hospital would drop to one mill from the 1.5 mills charged the previous year.

• The inter-house track meet at the Salt Spring high school was won by House III with 289 points. House I followed with 257 while House II had 227 points. The senior boys' cup was taken by Malcolm Bond and Kathleen Butt won the senior girls'. The junior cup winners were not decided because of the close finishes.

• The Guild of Sunshine met in Mahon Hall in Ganges with president Mrs. G. Lowe in the chair. The group agreed to have a candy stall at the fall fair and two new members, Mrs. W. Ashbury and Mrs. R.M. Lumley, were added to the rolls.

### Twenty Five Years Ago

• May Day celebrations at Salt Spring were sponsored by the Fulford Athletic Club. Queen Darlene was attended by Princesses Gillian Smith and Linda Inglin. The Athletic Club won the award for best original float in the parade which was watched by more than 500 people.

• The Pioneer Village fund-raising campaign by the Lions Club had raised a total of \$10,585.65. Campaign chairman W.H. Bradley reported that \$222 had been donated that week by 11 islanders. The Lions Club was hoping to raise \$12,000 for the Pioneer Village in Ganges.

• The IODE listened to special guest Phyllis Cook from Vancouver discuss plans for a fur fashion show which was to be put on by the group to raise \$125 for a scholarship to be awarded to a local high school graduate.

### Twenty Years Ago

• Roller hockey players and their guests gathered for a banquet at Fulford Hall. The purpose of the event, led by Terry Slingsby, was to present more than 30 awards to individuals and teams for their efforts during the hockey season. Fulford Barons won the senior boys' league while the Ganges team took the Bob Akerman Trophy in the girls' league.

• Wreckage of a missing Piper Comanche was found in the dense bush on Mount Tuam. The pilot and a passenger were killed when the aircraft, flying from Vancouver to Victoria, crashed into the Salt Spring mountain. The aircraft had been missing about a week before it was sighted by a passing plane.

• Vern Roddick of South Pender would be chairman of the Gulf Islands Joint Council for another year. Mary Backlund of Galiano was chosen secretary for another year.

• Golden anniversary greetings from Prime Minister Pierre Trudeau, Lt.-Gov Nicholson and Premier Bennett were received by Bill and Marguerite Morson of Mayne Island.

• Thirteen volunteers mixed and poured cement for a boat launching ramp in Ganges. There were 13 people. The group, mostly teachers, was headed by Mike Byron, Bob McWhirter and Glenn Woodley.

### Fifteen Years Ago

• Two men were rescued from the waters between Mayne and Pender Islands by the MV *Thunderball*. The hydro boat had been taking crews between islands when lineman Alan Holt spotted the wrecked boat. *Thunderball* operator Dave Stacey changed course to rescue the two men who were taken to Lady Minto Hospital. Their boat had hit a wave put out by a passing ferry and a plywood patch was jarred loose.

• Papajohn reported from Saturna that the arbutus trees as well as the weeds in his garden were in full bloom. The Community Club needed storage space and the used books of the Saturna library were to be donated to any group which wanted them.

• The Capital Region intended to appeal the cancellation of the permit for the Ganges sewer by the Pollution Control Board. CRD director for Salt Spring, George Heinekey, said the board had made five errors when the permit was cancelled and those errors would be the focus of the appeal.

• The May Day committee on Salt Spring announced winners of the various raffles held during the recent celebrations. Adam Hendrickson, 7, of Ganges won the steer while Vicki Holmes won the pig. Wilf Bangert won the lamb and Barbara Litz of Courtenay won a two-day holiday at Harbour House Hotel.

### Ten Years Ago

• The sailors sailed around Salt Spring Island in record time. The annual round-the-island race was taken by Mike Howard of Tsawwassen on the *Sandalwood* in a corrected time of nine hours, 45 minutes. Winner of the Marshall Sharp trophy was Dick Moore in the *Marimba*. He came third in the race but was the first islander across the finish line.

• Nominations to fill a vacancy on the Gulf Islands School Board,

created by the resignation of David Stacey, closed with only one person in the running. Vivian Pinteau had been named by acclamation as a Salt Spring school trustee.

• The Aage Villadsen Golf Classic was the event of the day at the Salt Spring Golf Club. Winners were Allan Trelford, Jack Goodwin, Bill Kernaghan, Terry Smollett, Gil Humphreys, Marvin Russell and Mac Mout.

• The public hearing to discuss a proposed zoning bylaw at Mayne Island had been adjourned after four hours of talk. The bylaw would regulate land use, buildings, structures as well as the height and siting of buildings on the island. Trustee Joan Sprague said that summer residents had not had an opportunity to comment on the proposal.

### Five Years Ago

• Work continued on the sewer system in Ganges as did an argument in the B.C. Supreme Court intended to stop work on the project. The two petitioners who had ordered the suit claimed they had been denied the right to vote on the project.

• Bill 30, the Islands Trust Amendment Act, was passed in the provincial legislature but with a fight from Victoria MLA Robin Blencoe. He said, "there is going to be a tremendous battle on those islands... this government won't get its way. They want to do a Waikiki mondo-condo on the islands."

• A program designed to train British Columbians for the hospitality industry and attract trade to participating businesses was set for Salt Spring Island. The government had announced earlier a multi-year program for communities throughout B.C. to improve the quality of service and hospitality offered to visitors.

As part of an effort to make tourism a prime industry here, 50,000 to 75,000 people were to be trained as "superhosts."

• An article in this week's *Driftwood* said the idea of incorporating Salt Spring as a municipality was not new. Its beginnings could be traced back to 1873 when the island was granted municipal status as the Township of Salt Spring Island. Disagreements arose, however, and the province terminated the incorporation in 1883. In early 1960, incorporation was again suggested but a referendum held on the matter in 1967 was defeated by a narrow margin. Another study currently underway was started in October, 1984.

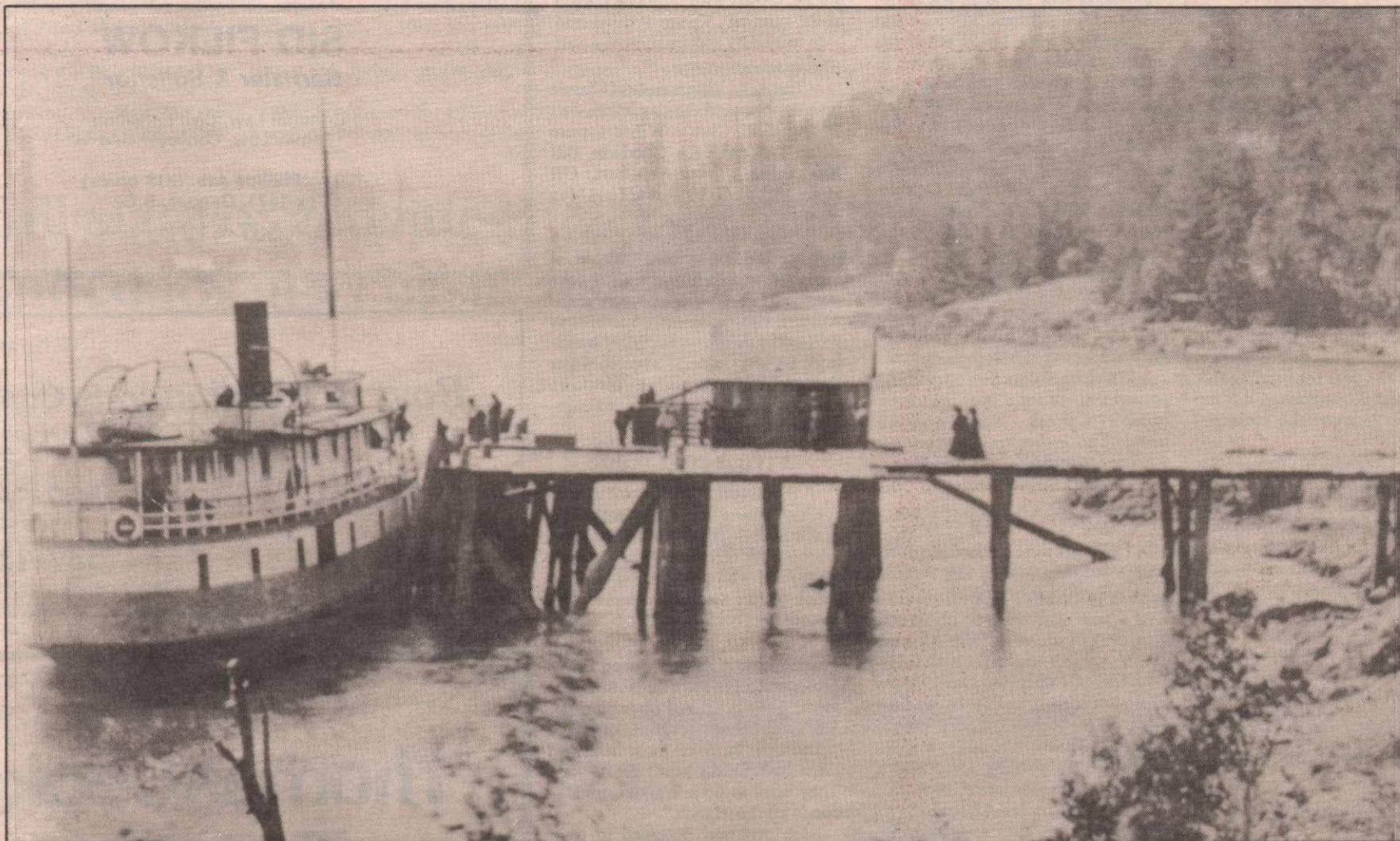
