Health council suggests joint-use for Lady Minto and Greenwoods

Representatives at a health council meeting last week suggested Lady Minto Hospital and Greenwoods may want to establish a joint-use agreement, enabling the two institutions to share equipment and staff.

Gulf Islands School District chairman Grace Byrne told representatives at the meeting the school board is in the process of establishing a joint-use agreement with the Parks and Recreation Commission.

She said the agreement has resulted from the school board's recent purchase of property on Rainbow Road, where it plans to build a new high school. There has been some suggestion a recreation complex could be added to that school.

Byrne noted that joint-use agreements can be set up between any tax-requesting agencies.

Greenwoods board chairman Ron Watson said that kind of agreement could allow Greenwoods and the hospital to share basic equipment plus the services of specialty staff such as dietitians.

In total, Thursday's meeting drew more than 20 representatives from a number of agencies providing a wide range of health services on the island.

Included at that meeting were four members from the Lady Minto Hospital Board which, according to vice-chairman Gordon English, were there to observe the proceedings.

Also there was a representative

from the hospital's medical staff.

English said the hospital board had earlier decided it would not participate in the council until the group had established its terms of reference.

He added that while the original decision had not been reversed, board members were there as observers and would report their findings to the board.

He also noted that CRD director Julia Atkins would be attending the

next meeting of the hospital board.

Atkins, in the meantime, told the group the formation of this body is important. A report done by John Noble, a consultant hired by the Victoria Health Project (VHP) to study the delivery of health care in communities throughout the CRD, noted a health council may be established to oversee the delivery of health care throughout the district.

She said this group could make an

B.C. Tel installs lines under Ganges roads

The streets of Ganges will be less cluttered when B.C. Tel finishes installing underground telephone lines.

The approximately \$400,000 project calls for the lines from Drake Road to Rainbow Road to be buried in conduits.

B.C. Hydro, however, will not be involved in the project, said Larry Davies at the Salt Spring hydro office. Such a project, from the corporation's point of view, would be too expensive, Davies indicated.

In addition to having to change the service for each customer along the route of the buried cables, transformers would have to be placed at ground level. With large transformers taking up ground-level space, he said, parking spaces, "so valuable in Ganges," would be lost.

B.C. Tel is conducting the project at this time in order to meet current and future demands on its service as the village grows and expands. The project should be completed by September of this year.

Trypewriter of

Salt Spring Island, again, sits centre stage as a place where disputes border on the absurd.

The world, at least that portion of it which pays attention to the shenanigans as reported and broadcast with the dateline "Saltspring Island," gains a rather distorted view of life on this rock.

Mayhaps, one day, they may even discover the correct spelling of the name.

Meanwhile, we see on television, a reasoned interview with concerned citizens. The clip ends with a unsavoury shot of the carnage of a massive clear-cut. Viewers gain the impression the talkers talk for all island residents and the massive clear-cut centres the fight for sanity in logging.

Unfortunately, the carnage sprawls across Mount Tuam but that shot was not identified as such. The talkers, while fronting for some residents of the rock, do not express, in any small measure, the feeling of the majority.

Public utterances on the issue have ranged from the ridiculous to the sublime.

Pushing more and more bureaucracy

When the Islands Trust voted to urge the province to impose a moratorium on logging across the Gulp Isles, the debate heated considerably. Property owners realized, rightly, that the call from the Islands Trust had no time limit. They also realized how speedily issues are settled on these rocks.

The issue became not one of logging but one of what can or cannot be done on private land. And that, dear friend is what Weldwood holds — private land.

Ken Byron noted in an interview with a daily news rag, "The Trust is just pushing more and more bureaucracy. We'll wind up having to get a permit to take out a tree only to find we have to wait for three weeks."

On the other side of the coin, Lynda Laushway stated clearly the private property issue was a reflection of outdated thinking.

Which may be the problem. Mayhaps those on the rocks, such as the trypewriter, who hold to the concept of private property being just that — private — should take lessons from enlightened thinkers.

Trypewriter holds to outdated thinking

The trypewriter figures his land, all one acre of it, is his sanctuary. The place he can hide from the world and not be concerned about interlopers who are not welcome.

If the police, those representatives of the Queen's law, cannot, willy nilly, come down the driveway without an invitation, ain't no one else going to invade that space regardless of how worthy they consider their cause.

And, dear friend, if the trypewriter holds that concept to himself, he will argue the same right for any other land owner as well.

But then again, the trypewriter holds to such outdated thinking as the Charter of Rights and freedom of the press — and private property.

Which brings us to another issue of enlightened thinking.

The Supreme Court of British Columbia decided, in its outdated thinking, that people should not wander through the forest on Mount Bruce lest they get in the way of falling trees.

Some people think that was a ridiculous ruling. Wandering through the forest, regardless of who owns the property, ranks as a prime pastime for islanders and the Supreme Court erred in its outdated thinking.

Difference between column and news article

And so dear friend, the lesson for this week is clear. Check the law books and decide which law should be obeyed and which law should be ignored. Pick your favourite, for or against, and let the world know.

If anyone calls you on it, cite chapter and verse, your rights as a resident and state, humbly but firmly, that they, those who call your bluff, lack responsibility.

And now for something completely similar.

Someone, once asked the trypewriter what journalism is all about. He replied that being a reporter involves gathering information.

A news item should be timely, informative, clear, concise and without bias in that it sets out both sides of the story.

A column, on the other hand, is somewhat different. A column offers the writer, whether 'tis the trypewriter or whomever, an opportunity to express an opinion. A column should never be taken at any other value than as an expression of opinion.

There is, and should be, a distinct difference between a news story and a column.

But then again, some people don't appreciate an opinion if it differs from theirs.

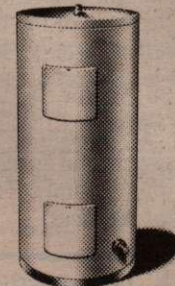

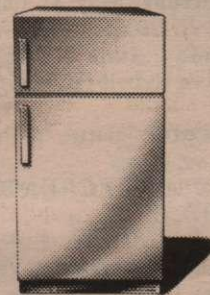
Fastball action underway
