Program in need of funds

In November, 1989, the Salt Spring Community Centre established a subsidized counselling service for people needing immediate therapy who could not see workers at the centre or afford other professional help.

This service may end because outside funding is not available and the centre has run out of funds. If this occurs, it could seriously jeopardize the emotional health of clients receiving help and others who need it.

In a last attempt to prevent the program from being cancelled, the centre decided at a special meeting two weeks ago to approach the community for help. Members hope to raise enough money to keep the program operating until additional funds are provided by another source.

Centre director Barbara Jordan-Knox says the board has applied to the Ministry of Mental Health Services for funding, but it could be

Parents oppose centralization

Gulf Island parents approve the concept of a middle school — but not if it means sending the children by water taxi.

Joy Ridley, school trustee for the Pender Islands told a meeting of the school board last week that parents were becoming upset at the "bulldozing going on to centralize the middle school in the Outer Islands."

The school district has tentatively suggested Outer Island children in

Grades Six, Seven and Eight would attend a middle school on Mayne Island.

The enrolment figures for Grades Five, Six and Seven as of May this year shows 70 children enrolled in the four Outer Islands schools.

There are 26 pupils on Galiano who would move into middle school while the Penders are home to an additional 26 children. Saturna, the island with the smallest population,

would produce nine mid-school pupils and a further 10 would come from Mayne Island.

Saturna Island trustee Lorraine Campbell urged the school district not to go ahead with the middle school concept centred at Mayne Island this year. She told the board that the parents should talk the situation through before a decision is made.

Ridley agreed. "Our kids spend

SSI emergency crews organize competition

Various members of Salt Spring emergency crews will be huffing and puffing approximately 28 kilometres around the island, Sunday, June 24.

The Emergency Services Biathlon pits teams of three from the Ambulance Service, RCMP, Coast Guard, Fire Department and Lady Minto Hospital to run and cycle the distance.


One organizer, Diana Hayes at Lady Minto Hospital, hopes the event will become an annual fixture for the emergency crews.

The idea is to have a runner start at the hospital and run four kilometres to Portlock Park, where a cyclist takes over to bike the 20 kilometre loop around the north end of the island. The cyclist returns to the park where the third athlete trots back to Lady Minto.

The RCMP will field two teams. On the "A" team, Constable Pat Wilkinson leads the charge while Constable Monique Jondarne will pedal the north end route to allow

several months before such money comes through.

Since the program started, the number of clients using it has grown from the eight last November to 20 in May — a number which cost the centre \$1,400 last month and approximately \$4,000 since the service began.

Under the program, the centre pays \$20 for a session provided by an outside therapist. The client contributes \$10, and counsellors donate the remaining \$10 to \$15 which would make up their normal fee.

At an emergency meeting two weeks ago, the centre's board of directors agreed to allocate \$1,000 to keep the service running for another month.

Jordan-Knox says the only alternative therapy for these clients would be provided through mental health services on Vancouver Island. She adds, however, it can take four to six weeks for people to receive treatment, and clients are often limited to four visits.

Seven local counsellors are involved in the program here, all of whom have their master's degrees in social work or psychology. Each sees between two and four clients a month through the program.

Altogether, 38 clients have received help since November, many of whom are teenagers, single mothers and senior citizens. All are on fixed incomes and were admitted to the program after being recommended by a crisis worker at the centre.

Jordan-Knox says some of the emotional disorders exhibited by

these clients include severe depression, acute anxiety and suicidal tendencies. Travelling to Vancouver Island for help may be financially prohibitive for these clients and the trip itself could be too much of an emotional strain, she says.

While funding for the service has in the past come from a variety of sources including miscellaneous donations and money taken from other programs, any "extra" revenue has been exhausted. The centre ap-

plied to the Victoria Health Project for funding but learned last week the VHP cannot help.

Knox says she would ultimately like to raise about \$13,000 which would keep the program operating until the end of the year. She adds, though, that any support will help.

Anyone interested in contributing to the program is invited to make a donation at the Island Savings Credit Union or the Community Centre.

The rapid spread of venereal disease such as AIDS proves the need for a condom machine accessible to high school students, Salt Spring trustee Charles Hingston said.

But, he suggested, the school board should wait for health officials to decide the best location.

If a condom machine were installed in the high school, it would not be available in the evenings. CRD health officials are considering the entrance to Lady Minto Hospital as a possible location, trustees learned.

The trustees ended debate on the subject by agreeing a condom machine should be available to students, somewhere.

INFECTION CONTROL IN DENTISTRY

For many decades dental offices have carried out procedures to prevent the passing of bacteria or viruses from one patient to another. Disposable one-use items such as needles, suction tips, mixing spatulas, tray papers and bibs are discarded after each appointment. Metal instruments are scrubbed after use and sterilized. Dental chairs, counters, tray tables and light handles are wiped down with disinfectant after each patient's visit. As a result, you are less likely to be exposed to someone else's mouth bacteria in a dental office than in a good restaurant.

Dentists started the routine wearing of disposable surgical gloves in recent years when it was recognized that even vigorous scrubbing would not leave hands totally free of bacteria. Gloves provide mutual protection from infection and disease and for this reason, you should ask that your dental team wear them when you are being examined and treated.

But the dental team must also be aware of the potential danger of infection to themselves. Splashing water containing blood or saliva can cause infection of the skin, eyes, or respiratory system. Accidental needle punctures of the hands may transmit diseases such as hepatitis that are very serious and potentially fatal. For these reasons, special precautions are taken, and most staff members wear surgical masks and eye glasses or face shields in addition to gloves to examine or treat patients. With the advances being made in protective equipment design, it may well be that dentists in the future will bear a strong resemblance to deep sea divers!

The AIDS epidemic has created serious concern about the disposal of infected wastes, highlighted when contaminated medical syringes washed up on east coast beaches in the U.S. The dental profession has acknowledged its responsibilities in the safe disposal of hazardous products. This has led to new guidelines which includes separating and incinerating used needles and other used material, and sterilizing and identifying these wastes for disposal when incineration is not available.

Increased infectious control measures is making a good system even better because the dental profession believes its patients - and its staff - have a right to expect no less than the safest care possible.

Handicapped Association help to disabled residents

The Gulf Island Handicapped Association offers a helping hand every day of the week and every hour of the day.

Bill Best, who describes himself as the volunteer co-ordinator, recently explained the services available to handicapped residents of the Gulf Islands to the *Driftwood*.

Best noted the group offers advice on a range of services such as the Red Cross wheelchair loan services, the availability of public housing for the disabled as well as financial advice on rebates on taxes and other costs for the disabled.

He offered as an example the association's efforts with B.C. Ferries to have elevator access on larger vessel clearly marked in English instead of the international symbols. He said the Queens of Nanaimo and Sidney are now marked in English and other ferries with elevators will be changed as well.

"We're anything but a social club," Best said. "There's a lot of hard work."

The group talks with businesses on the islands to ensure easier access for the handicapped. It has also marked 21 parking spaces in Ganges for use by wheelchair users. Best indicated the department of highways would be repainting the parking spaces with a plastic paint to ensure the marking lasts longer.

In addition to advice, the group acts as an advocate for the handicapped. Best explained the advocacy aspect deals with various governmental departments for those individuals having problems getting their messages across.

For instance, Best will aid individuals in completing the forms necessary to obtain Guaranteed Annual Income (GAIN) for the handicapped. He will guide people through the process of application and the hearing.

The situation demands explicit details of each case, Best said.

The government sticks to a legal definition of "handicapped," Best noted. His efforts are aimed at ensuring the definition acceptable to the government is clearly followed.

A physician's report is the basis for the application. The person must be apparently permanently disabled. There must be "no remedial therapy might significantly lessen the disability."

In addition, the person must be receiving assistance, either in permanent home care, supervision in normal functioning or in meeting continued costs as a direct result of the condition.

Best said many people who would otherwise qualify are turned down because forms are not filled in properly. In such cases, he helps the individuals prepare an appeal.

The handicapped are also eligible for various refunds and discounts. They can qualify for a gas tax refund,

federal sales tax rebate, a disability tax credit or be eligible for grants for the disabled.

They also can gain discounts from ICBC and B.C. Ferries, among other agencies.

The GIHA was recently granted \$1,000 from Capital Regional Director Julia Atkins for operating expenses. That money goes along with a \$500 grant from the Salt Spring Foundation. Best noted it also seeks other sources of income to meet the monthly expenses of \$235.

enough time on the water," she asserted.

If a middle school was established on Mayne Island as suggested, a pupil from one of the other Outer Islands would spend seven years commuting by water taxi to gain an education. Besides the three years of water taxi to attend middle school, the pupil would spend a further four years commuting to Salt Spring for secondary school.

By high school, Ridley noted, "the kids are tired and frustrated" by all those hours spent on a water taxi.

School superintendent Mike Marshall told the trustees he was seeking information from other school districts as to how they handle middle school for small, isolated schools.

"We'll get there, but in our Gulf

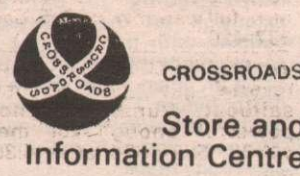

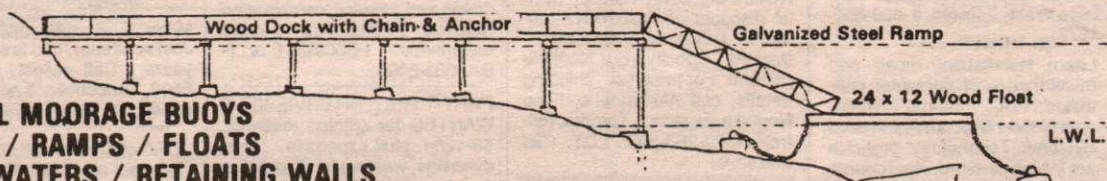

Down through the years

Thirty Years Ago

• Mount Maxwell at Salt Spring claimed the life of James Grosart of Fulford. Searchers combed the top of the cliff of the mountain for three days before they found the body. Gavin and Don Reynolds lowered themselves 400 feet down the cliff where they discovered Grosart. RCMP Constable Bonner had organized the search when Grosart was reported missing after not showing up for his normal taxi ride to his job as postmaster at Fulford.

Twenty-five Years Ago

• The tragedy began with a three-vehicle accident at Salt Spring and ended in a Victoria court. Frank Jones was convicted of criminal negligence and sentenced to 90 days in jail. He had been driving a vehicle which struck another driven by Victor Sholes who was killed in the accident.

• The dugout skiff collapsed and sank in Active Pass near Mayne Island but the lone occupant was quickly pulled from the water. Felix Jack had been alone in his boat when it sank. Slim Thorburn and Mac Moutat of Salt Spring were fishing close by and pulled him to safety.

Twenty Years Ago

• A meeting of Salt Spring residents began as a shouting match but ended with a call for incorporation. Residents were upset at a proposed zoning bylaw which would have made some businesses nonconforming. Marc Holmes, director at the Capital Region, told the meeting he had asked to have the bylaw set aside so that residents could come up with a compromise.

At the end of the meeting, participants approved allowing the steering committee to look at incorporating the entire island.

Fifteen Years Ago

• The subdivision bylaw for Salt Spring came under attack at a meeting of the planning association. Ray Hill said it did not control the destiny of subdivisions and did not deal with ribbon development. Capital Region director George Heinekey assured the meeting the bylaw would not go to third reading until islanders were satisfied.

Ten Years Ago

• The Urban Transit Authority would accept the exclusion of Salt Spring from the transit levy scheme said Saanich Mayor Mel Couvelier, who was also a member of the UTA. The authority was seeking legal advice on whether to accept the ruling of Capital Region chairman Jim Campbell of Saturna that Salt Spring be excluded even though the CRD board had voted against the proposal in an earlier vote. Local MLA Hugh Curtis supported Salt Spring residents in calling for exclusion because the island was not served by buses.

Five Years Ago

• Even though residents at a public meeting voted against having a study done on the feasibility of incorporating the island, a project team made up of members from the planning association decided the study would go

ahead. Before the vote was taken, team member Ray Hill said that because the 65 people in attendance represented only about one per cent of the population, any consensus reached at the meeting would not be binding on the project team.

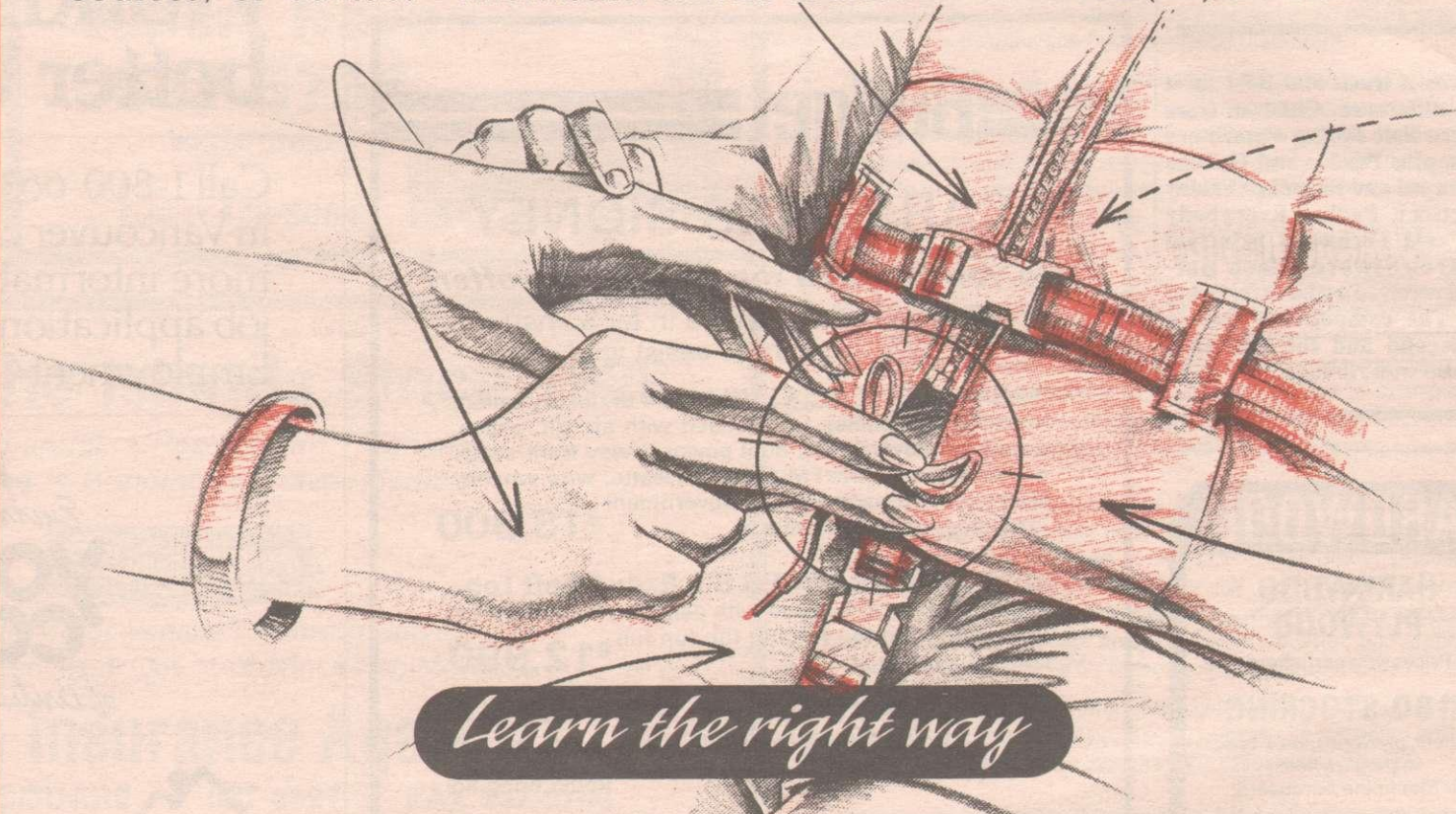
