Eric McMabon

Principal aims for growth

The new Gulf Islands Secondary School principal will bring a variety of experience to the position, both inside and outside the education field.

Although Eric McMabon brings experience, he does not come with set impressions of GISS.

"I have no preconceived notions about the school," he said. "I'll just have to tune into the specific needs of the students here."

At the same time he has specific ideas of what the school should be.

"The primary goal of the school should be the intellectual growth of the students," he commented. "School should be a place where everyone grows."

He comes to Gulf Islands Secondary School from a vice-principal's position at a high school in Vernon, B.C. Prior to his year at Vernon, McMabon spent five years at Burns Lake.

He went to that school as the vice-principal and left as principal.

McMabon, born in St. Helen, near Liverpool, England, was raised in Wales and his family came to Canada in 1965. They lived in four provinces over a three year period, he recounted.

He completed his secondary education in Saskatchewan and attended Vancouver College before moving back to Winnipeg to work. McMabon returned to Swansea, Wales and took in two years at University College there.

He worked as a land surveyor in England followed by four years at the University of Manchester and a Bachelor of Education degree.

He taught in Devon, England, for five years. He came back to Canada in 1980 to teach at Brentwood College in Duncan for a year before moving in to the public system at Mount Prevost Junior Secondary. From that school, he moved on to Burns Lake.

By 1987, he had acquired a Masters in Education Administration from the University of Victoria. He applied for the position at GISS to replace John Wellingham because of the "positive challenges."

Wellingham moved from being principal to the school district staff to help initiate the new education system.

New rules may spell the end for RFM

Changes in charter boat regulations may spell the end for the familiar two-masted RFM in Gulf Islands waters.

Under the new regulations, RFM master Brian Holshoe must qualify for a 350 ton ticket, the Command Endorsement to a Watchkeeping Certificate.

His crew must also carry certified tickets to work the sailing vessel.

Owner considering sale of schooner

Holshoe has qualified for the required ticket in all aspects except the eye examination. He is partially colour blind and did not quite meet the necessary standard.

Holshoe could rewrite the examination and probably pass but he would have to re-qualify at least once or twice each year with the possibility of failing. This would leave the RFM without a skipper.

For the crew, the tickets require attendance at an off-island course and the effort would cost money.

Holshoe draws on a pool of 30 volunteers when he needs a crew for a charter cruise. The time and money involved for them to gain their tickets would not pay, he said, just for part-time work.

The new regulations come into effect as a means of bringing some

safety and control to the charter boat industry, Holshoe explained.

"I can't argue with safety," he commented. "But the new regs will kill 5,000 businesses like mine across Canada."

He noted the RFM could probably continue operations.

"The only thing left for me is private charters," he said. But it would be a moot point if booking such charters fell inside or outside the regulations.

The federal authorities may take

They wanted to get to Vancouver in the worst way. And that's how they went.

There were three trucks laden with chickens at Swartz Bay ferry terminal one evening last week. The three were parked alongside the Salt Spring Island lane. Birds were contained in cages in the sweltering heat and many appeared to be overcome by the heat.

Everybody who eats eggs or chicken must be aware of the conditions under which chickens are kept, but their appearance in broad daylight, under particularly trying conditions, attracted the attention of island travellers.

While the crews of the trucks, all hailing from Aldergrove, were busy covering the unfortunate birds with plywood sheets observers were introduced to a first-hand demonstration of modern farming methods.

The experience was a sad reflection on provincial standards of agriculture. An 11-year-old visitor from England asked why the birds could not be slaughtered on Vancouver island and transported to Vancouver as meat.

The minister of agriculture might do worse than examine the manner in which these creatures are moved about the province. He might, even, experience the same distaste for such treatment that was expressed by the watching travellers.

If no other ministry is concerned about the transportation of live birds, then the ministry of transportation and highways could introduce controls on the shipping of livestock on provincial ships.

In this instance one bird had the last word. As the trucks prepared to move off, one sad-looking, tailless chicken fell out of a cage on to the roadway. The three trucks disappeared behind the steel plates of the ferry vessel and the terrified chicken resisted efforts of onlookers to capture it.

I'm no flag-waver when it comes to animals, but I didn't like what I saw.

Never go back!

Time was when a new tail light for any automobile could be purchased for a few dollars. I can recall one occasion when I was riding a motorcycle in Britain during the war and I lost the glass out of the tail light. I stuffed it with red rose petals and returned to my station without rousing any concern on the part of stray police patrols.

Those things are of the past.

I backed my car into a very tight situation and backed the tail light into a truck's bumper. Result: one small amber glass knocked out. So I got a new one.

The repair cost me rather better than \$150. I now have a new tail light assembly, complete with lamp holders, wiring and mountings. And I have the old one, complete. Complete, that is, except for one broken segment.

The new lamp is mounted. It is paid for. But I feel that I have been gypped by having to purchase more than I needed. I feel that I should have acquired a piece of amber plastic and the necessary adhesive to repair the original, which is still in otherwise perfect condition.

I had a car which had lost its sun-roof-winding-handle shortly after I bought it. No, I could not buy a new handle: I had to buy \$48 worth of mounting and equipment I didn't need. I backed out of that one and made a handle to do the job.

Signs of the times

Just riding the ferries brings to mind the little things of life that don't really matter. But they come to mind, all the same.

Like the coat of arms on the *Bowen Queen*. When the next painting comes up the arms will gleam in their original glory. In the meantime, the sea has taken its toll of the precise colours. Does it matter? Not a bit!

Another sign was on an oil tank truck, indicating its American ancestry. Back of the tanker carries the warning that it is restricted to a set speed limit. Odd thing is that the specified limit is in miles per hour, rather than the more familiar kilometres. Odder thing is that the vehicle is limited to 55 miles per hour, when the provincial limit on most roads is 50 mph, and the limit south of the line is 55 mph.

Of course, the oddest thing of all is that it doesn't really matter, anyway, and I don't think the sign has any standing in British Columbia.

Alternate school hires new teacher

A new teacher, hired to educate students at Salt Spring Centre's alternate school is qualified to teach in three provinces.

Margaret Leier will take up her duties teaching the intermediate students this September. She comes to the alternate school with a Bachelor of Education degree, certification as a teacher in Saskatchewan, Alberta as well as B.C.

She is currently putting the finishing touches to her Master of Education degree from the University of Saskatchewan.

Married with four children, Leier has also found time to write four books, plus a study guide for multiculturalism. On top of that she has written and published 15 articles for the *Junior Encyclopedia of Canada* on subjects ranging from psychology through marriage and divorce to sociology.

Leier, in a letter to the Centre School, wrote: "I visited Salt Spring since my childhood so I can't remember exactly when I decided this place is a paradise."

As for the school itself, she wrote: "I share the commitment to innovative teaching and learning within an academically challenging environment held by the members of the Ganges Education Society."

"I think their policy decisions are sound, for example, the small school population and small class size at Centre School enhances possibilities for teaching and learning in a supportive non-graded environment."

Harry Dhand, professor of Curriculum Studies at the University of Saskatchewan, offered praise for her, noting she was among the top five per cent of graduate students he had worked with.

"I have come to the conclusion that Margaret is a confident, competent individual and she has enormous potential. She is warm, relaxed, reflective and can be animated. I find her ideas creative, insightful and refreshing."

Sid Filkow, of the Salt Spring Centre, shares the praise and expressed enthusiasm, anticipating good things happening at the alternate school with Leier teaching there.

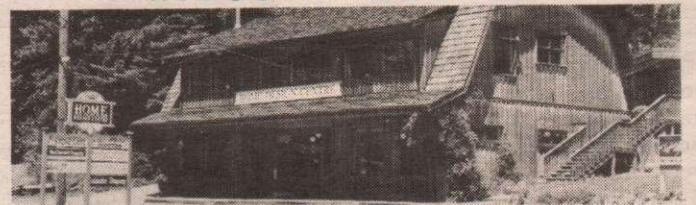

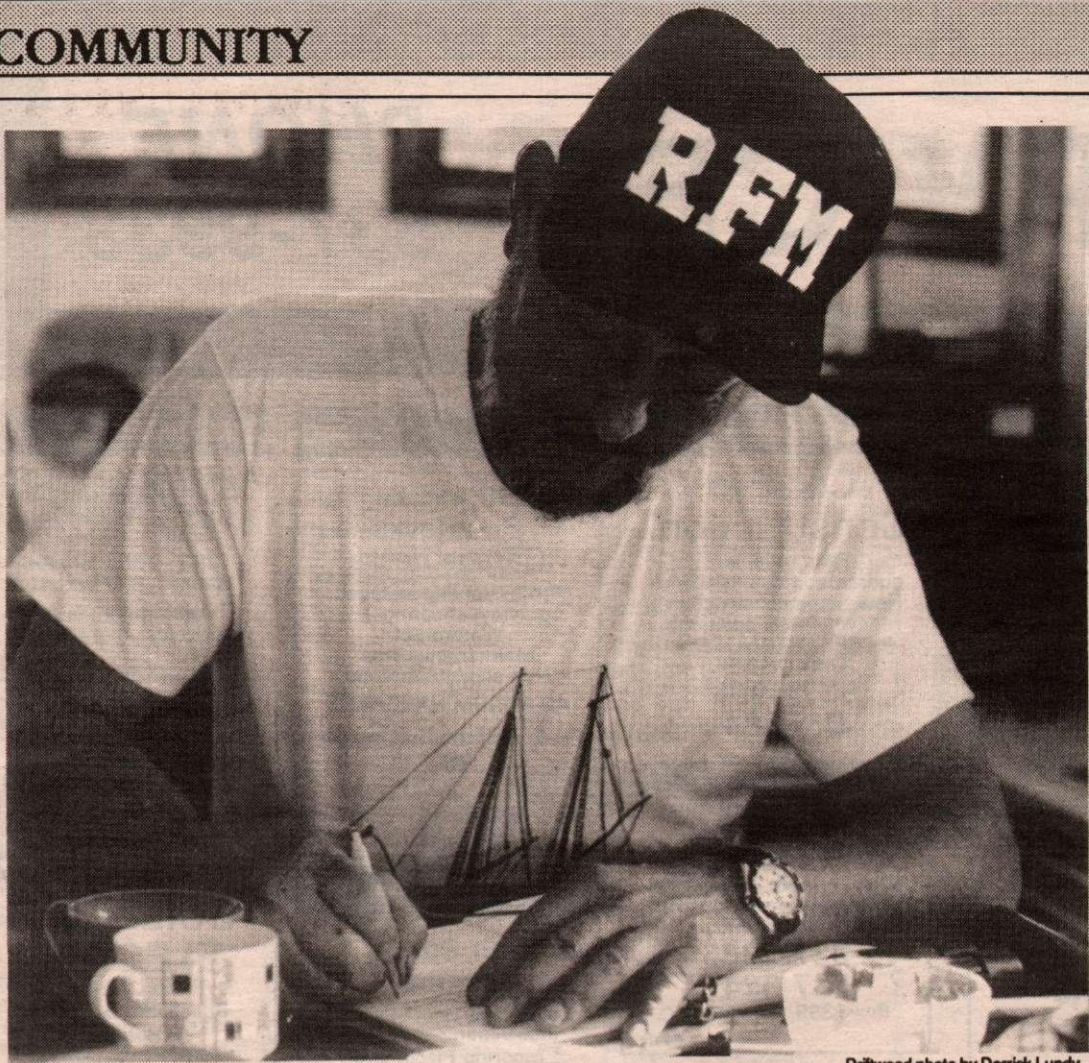
Voters should ensure names on voters' list

RFM pays as a charter vessel, but makes for a costly hobby

such operators to court to set out the limit of their jurisdiction in the matter.

"I don't want to be the guy who's

the test case," he stated.

The RFM was built in False Creek in 1922. Designed along the lines of a schooner, the vessel originally worked as a tug. The boat gained its name from Richard Frederick Mar-

pole, the grandson of the owner of the company which originally operated the boat, Marpole Towing.

The previous owner began to convert the boat to a schooner but died in a log salvage operation before the job was finished. Holshoe bought the boat and with help from a number of people, completed the conversion from tug to a two-masted schooner.

The changes in regulations affect vessels larger than 50 tons. Concerns about the cost involved for small charter companies might bring about a shift in requirements.

The weight limit may be raised to 60 tons. But, noted Holshoe, the RFM comes in at 64 tons.

(Tons with regard to vessels does not involve weight but the measurement inside the hull. The term comes down through history from when cargoes were shipped in barrels. The term refers to the number of barrels which would fit into a ship.)

Holshoe said the RFM pays for itself as a charter boat but if he had to switch to run the vessel as a hobby, it would become too expensive.

One option available to him is to sell the boat.

"But I'm not going to sell to the first guy with a lot of bucks."

Holshoe is considering one offer to purchase the RFM as a training vessel.

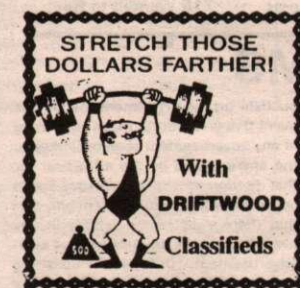

COMMUNITY

As this time of year is so busy with swimming, sun-tanning, entertaining company and simply enjoying oneself, gardening activities are relegated to a back burner until the problems arise to stare you in the face. For this reason I'm driven to answer three of the most pressing and timely questions of the season.

First, the most frequently asked question: "How do I change the colour of my hydrangea?"

Depending on the soil treatment, the tones can be changed and the colour altered. If you want a blue, bluish or bluer (or is that more blue) colour, then use aluminum sulphate or alum at one tablespoon per gallon of water every two weeks. If you want a pink or more red colour then sprinkle on some lime or super-phosphate and water in well. The colour change won't be immediate but with regular applications the desired effect will be forthcoming.

An alkaline well will also yield a more pinkish hue as it tends to increase the pH. A rich, porous, well drained loamy soil with regular deep waterings will provide the best growing conditions. Hydrangeas like to drink a lot so to increase the water-holding capacity of the soil, add in as much as 25 to 30 per cent humus and peat moss or sawdust, and mix it in well.

The second battery of problems relate to browned, curling, burnt leaves or dried, crispy green leaves.

In most cases no insects or diseases can be identified and the problem almost always relates to water supplies, both in quantity and quality. When moisture stresses develop within a plant, there are two or more symptoms evident. For evergreens, the needles or leaves that are two or more years old, will turn yellow and then brown before dropping off.

The plant budgets its water supply to keep the youngest, most efficient needles alive, and sacrifices the rest. For rhododendrons, the older inner leaves turn spotted and yellow, then drop off. The other most prevalent symptom is the reduced development of the shoot extension. The leaders and lateral shoots only lengthen as long as adequate water is provided.

Your Garden

To keep the plant bushy, full of foliage, and growing well proper watering is needed. In deciduous plants, the shoots fail to develop fully, and the succulent growth wilts during the hot, sunny part of the day, most often recovering during the night. But the most common sight is the total collapse of the plant. If the wilted plant doesn't get water right away, the tissue dies and turns the classic scorched brown, with only the inner, shaded leaves staying green a bit longer.

Often the flower buds and open blooms are sacrificed and dropped immediately. Drought stresses will usually significantly shorten the duration of the blooming period and, perhaps more importantly, drought stresses during July, August, and September will reduce or even prevent the development and setting of flower buds for next year's show. This is especially true for rhododendrons, fruit trees, and for some curious reason, magnolias.

In some situations where your well water has a higher soluble salts content, often undetectable by tasting, but determined by laboratory testing, constant, conservative watering will build up the mineral or salt content of the soil in the root zone. Salt damage will show itself as browning leaf margins, cast off older leaves, and bud drop, as the roots are killed by the salt, and some moisture stresses occur.

Some wells give water which is quite alkaline, and over the course of the summer, the pH of the soil will be changed from neutral or acidic, right through to a basic or alkaline pH, with the resultant symptoms of chlorosis, nutrient deficiency, and general anaemia. Periodic, over-generous waterings, flushings and

soakings of the soil will dissolve the minerals and carry them down below the root zone and out of harm's way.

The winter's rains will flush them even deeper and correct the salt problem, but in order to lower the pH again, you will have to resort to some acidifying chemicals or apply an acidifying mulch.

Thirdly, comes the questions about what colourful shrubs or ground-covers can be planted at this time to spruce up the appearance of the beds.

The first shrub which comes to mind is the hydrangea with its large clusters of flowers, and wide range of available colours including pink, mauve, pale purple, almost red, pale blue, rich blue, white, pale pink, and almost any combination thereof. Another, the broad-leaved evergreen Abelia with its mildly-fragrant, bell-shaped, pinkish blooms, will carry on flowering right on through to the first fall frosts.

The lavender is just finished flowering, but the mauve-lavender flower spikes still add colour and texture to the garden. The mauve and purple varieties of butterfly bush (Buddleia) are just at their peak and the white is soon to follow. The various escalloniae are putting out their best floral show now, and with the range of shrub sizes, coupled with colours of pale pink, through richer tones to red, the selection is good for many situations and garden styles.

The "Anthony Waterer," "Shirobana," and "Goldflame" spireas are blooming nicely, as are several varieties of potentilla.

The rich golden tones of the very fragrant Spanish broom (Spartium junceum) are a most welcome sight, and its being drought tolerant is a secondary bonus. If properly pruned

in autumn, the shrub will develop tight form, strong, self-supporting branches, and a most spectacular floral show. The timing of the fall pruning will determine the relative commencement of the blooming period in the next growing season. The later the pruning, the later the start of flowering.

In the shade garden, the fuchsias are going full tilt, and with the range of colours and heights, a delightful showing can be had without too much effort. The hardy fuchsias are in full blooming splendour right now, and they will carry on until first frosts hit. Shades of pink, fuchsia, white, red, and purple combinations are available. From the dwarfs "Papoose" and "Santa Claus" on up to the tall F. riccartoni, gracilis, and magellanica species, the selection is broad. For the blooms which most resemble the basket type varieties,

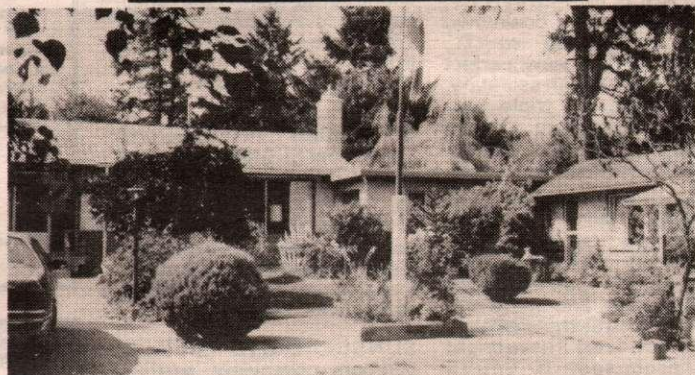
choose "Double Otto," and don't worry, they are all indeed hardy, only needing to be cut back to live tissue in the spring.

Another shrub which does well in shade or partial sun is summersweet (Clethra alnifolia), with its long clusters of small, richly fragrant white blooms.

For choices which will work well in rockeries, or borders consider Anagallis monelli "Pacific Blue", Lithospermum diffusa "Grace Ward", heathers, heaths, and thymes of all sorts. With their compact growth habits, and abundant showings of pink, rich blue, lavender, and rose colours.

Hopefully our fine weather will hold for a few more weeks and the string of guests will leave a few breaks for enjoyment of the peace and quiet. Until next time, Happy Gardening.

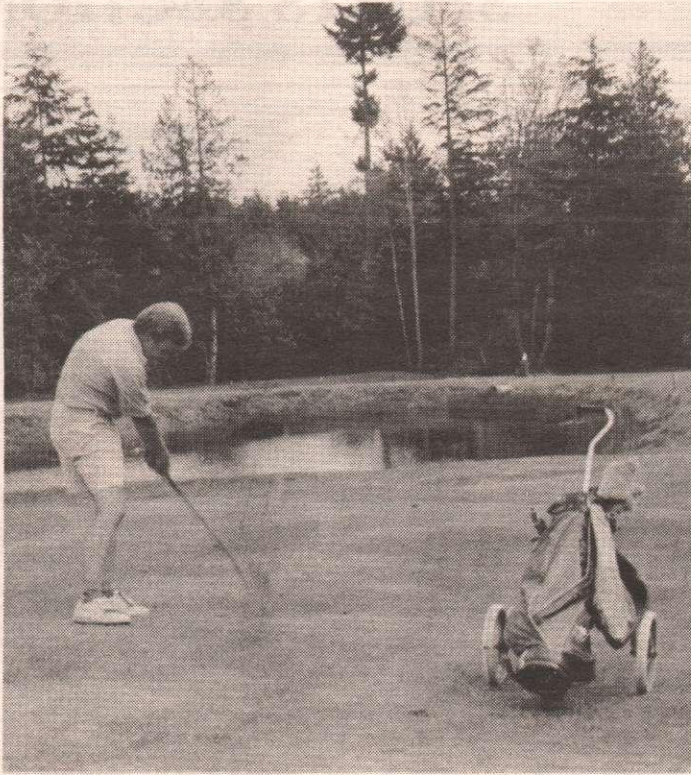
