## Save the Strait Marathon

# Islanders prepare to cross the strait

A group of Salt Spring Islanders will participate in the Save the Strait Marathon and Eco-Faire this weekend.

Islanders, joined by others from communities bordering the Strait of Georgia, will swim, canoe, kayak and row from Nanaimo to Sechelt this Saturday.

The marathon will help draw attention to the Save the Georgia Strait Alliance's plea to clean-up the Strait of Georgia, and a renaissance-style faire staged at Sechelt August 25 to 26 will re-emphasize the cause.

The marathon concept — as explained by writer Laurie McBride in the most recent edition of *The New Catalyst Quarterly* — evolved as a forum for bringing together existing environmental organizations, outdoor enthusiasts, native groups, families and entire communities in an effort to "create real change in our own backyard."

The purpose is to focus attention on the damage done to the Strait of Georgia at the hand of some 12 pulp mills, two mines, four refineries, six chemical plants, and 161 sewer outfalls which all pour toxic waste into the strait.

Organizers hope the marathon will "generate interest and motivation for people to do something about the damage."

Escorted by boats, participants in

the marathon will attempt to make the 16-kilometre crossing in any number of ways. Some will try to go the entire length, while others will cross using a relay-style format.

Each participant has gathered pledges — half the funds raised will be directed to the local sponsoring organization and the rest will be contributed to the alliance.

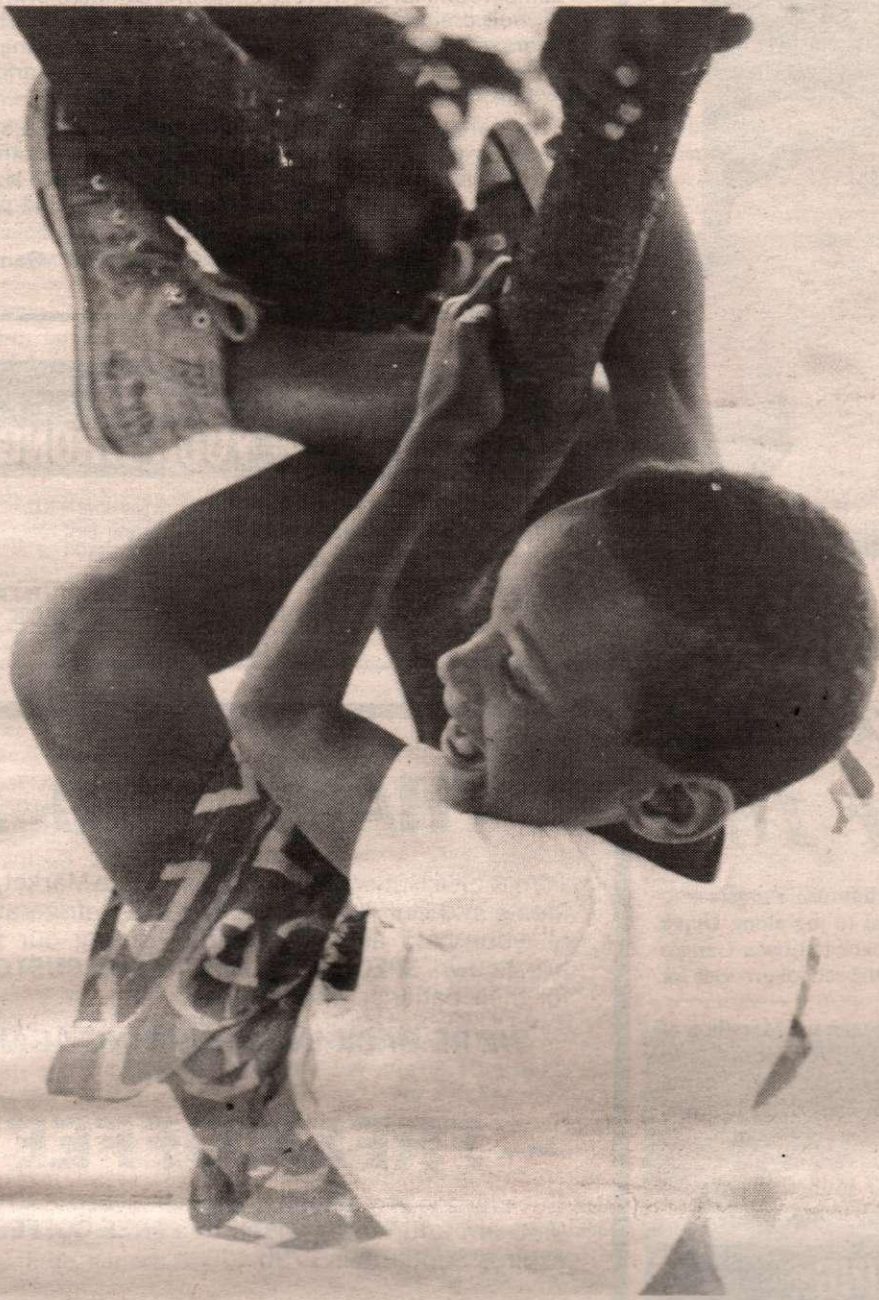

Over 45 organizations, including Green Islands on Salt Spring, have endorsed the marathon and faire.

The two-day renaissance-style faire will take place on Indian land in Sechelt. The event will feature native arts and ceremonies, environmental booths, information, music, theatre and speakers.

The Save the Georgia Strait Alliance has brought together numerous groups in an effort to in-

## Fox run organizer extends challenge

While she has only begun to tackle the task of organizing the run, Betts has issued a call for help and a challenge.


She feels she needs anywhere from 15 to 20 people to commit time and energy to the event to continue the success of past runs.

**Photo contest clarified**

Listings for the trophies in the Salt Spring Fall Fair catalogue may be creating confusion, Jetta Martinez pointed out this week.

The Salt Spring Photo Perpetual Trophy for high aggregate points in the photo division as well as the new Leo Martinez Memorial Perpetual Trophy should be in the amateur section, she said.

The Leo Martinez Trophy, created to honour the late islander's 14- years of effort in the photo division of the fall fair, will be awarded to photographs of either a sunrise or a sunset. Anyone of any age can enter the competition — as long as he or she is an amateur in the field.

Similarly, Martinez said, the Salt Spring Photo trophy will be presented to the individual scoring the most points in the amateur section.

Her son, she said, encouraged youth to become involved in photography and she urges youngsters to try for the Facca Construction Trophy given to the person 15-years-old or younger, who gathers the most points in the competition.

Deadline for applications in the photo section is September 19. Entries can be left at Salt Spring Photo on McPhillips Avenue on or before that date.

stigate clean-up action in Georgia Strait.

The strait, which stretches 220 kilometres between Vancouver Island and the mainland, is in imminent danger of collapse, the alliance says, pointing to "shell-fishery closures; rising levels of dioxins, organochlorines and PCBs in fish; threatened salmon and lingcod extinction; high rates of cancer among residents and workers in pulp mill towns; public beach closures; tumours and lesions in fish" as warning signs.

Green Islands member Randy Thomas has been actively touring communities on the Strait of Georgia, working to increase the awareness of local residents, and solicit support for the alliance.

Included in the alliance's "plan of action" is a major conference next February and the creation of a citizen's regulatory body to enforce the protection and clean-up of the Strait.

of their employees as possible on the route.

The 10th annual Terry Fox run takes place on September 16: "Not on fall fair weekend," Betts points out.

The route will be the same as for previous events. The runners begin at the school grounds of Salt Spring Elementary, run along Rainbow Road to Booth Canal Road and up the twisting hill to Lower Ganges Road.

With sharp left turn, runners continue to Central to jog along Upper Ganges Road back to Lower Ganges and then on to the school grounds for the finish.

Terry Fox began his Marathon of Hope on April 12, 1980. He managed to run as far as Thunder Bay, Ontario. He died June 29, 1981. His run raised \$25 million for cancer research.

Last year, in various runs across the country, \$7 million was raised including \$710,000 in B.C.

Ever try to find your way around the suburban delights of Vancouver? Don't try!

The other day I wanted to drive from Tsawwassen to West Vancouver. Nothing to it! You follow the signs to the ferries and Horseshoe Bay. When the signs go missing you know you're on the wrong road. But the worst is yet to come!

Along the Upper Levels Highway the visiting driver is impressed with the fast, smooth way out of the cities. Unless he wants to stop off on Marine Drive. Two hours later I found where I wanted to go. The resident of the mainland, steeped in Vancouver geography well knows that the traffic sign directing him to Milk St. is really the instruction that all southbound traffic must go along Milk St.

And he knows that the sign indicating 10,987th St. really means "Turn left for Marine Drive."

Better take a taxi!

I collect paper. I have a desk deep in bits of paper and I have cupboards loaded with the same materials, all stored away in case I might want to refer to it at some unknown later date. A lot of the collection is made up of bills, mostly paid but occasionally forgotten.

**These little words in Welsh**

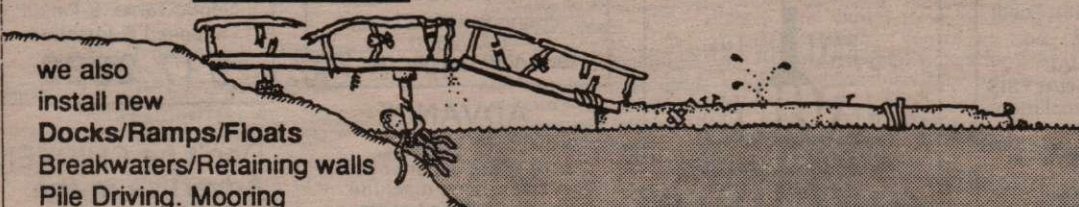

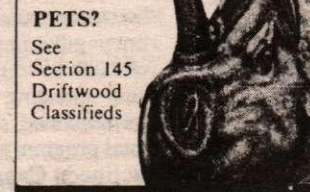

# News from OTTAWA

Big business has been hugely successful in convincing opinion leaders in Canada that high interest rates are good for the country. The government and the media are convinced that the government's debt problem is responsible for dizzyingly high interest rates and only when the deficit is under control will we see rates come down.

The Governor of the Bank of Canada, John Crow, echoes this line by suggesting that the spending habits of Canadians are out of control. Consumer-led demand is fuelling inflation and keeping interest rates high. Overindulgence and a legacy of profligate government spending have brought us to the economic crisis we face today.

Another favourite defence of high interest rates is the myth that only by keeping rates high can we guarantee foreign investment in Canada and keep our dollar strong. An examination and analysis of the rates, however, might lead one to a different conclusion.

Canadian interest rates have historically been between one and two

percentage points higher than those in the United States. The spread today is five percentage points.

John Crow and his political masters in the Conservative Cabinet warn that a precipitous and unsettling drop in the value of our dollar would surely follow a decline in interest rates. Indeed, a signal that rates should fall did cause the dollar to weaken on international markets just a few months ago. The government lost its nerve and moved to push interest rates up at an ever-increasing pace.

The obsession with a strong Canadian dollar is anything but healthy. Canada's economic strength is built on trade. Our economic prosperity is tied to the strength of our exports. A strong dollar undermines this strength. According to the Canadian Exporters Association, every one cent increase in the value of our dollar costs us \$1.3 billion in exports. In the lumber trade alone, every one cent appreciation in the dollar costs the industry \$100 million.

Our dollar has increased by almost 20 percent in value over the last four years. That increase of 14 cents has extracted a heavy toll on the

Canadian economy. We are now experiencing an unprecedented deficit in our trade balance with our trading partners.

The suggestion that government spending is out of control and must be cut is, on the surface, a valid point. The problem, however, is not with the many social programs the Mulroney government is targeting for restraint. In constant dollars, government spending on social programs has remained static since 1984-85. Total program spending has actually declined. Canada has a growing operating surplus.

Debt is rising because of high interest rates. Since 1984-85, overall expenditures have risen from \$137 billion to \$143 billion because of interest payments on our debt. They ballooned from \$27.7 billion to \$39.4 billion. Meanwhile, childcare needs go unfunded, pensions are clawed back, and our health care system is crumbling under a funding crunch.

Attacks on social programs, propaganda about government spending and the ritual defence monetary policy are protecting the high interest rates that are squeezing Canadians and sabotaging our economy.

# Driftwood

## DOWN THE YEARS

### Thirty Years Ago

- The Gulf Islands School Board met and no member of the public other than the *Driftwood* reporter was present. A motion to hold most of the meeting in committee was tabled after lengthy discussion.
- The Mayne Island Fall Fair was a success. Close to 400 people milled through the exhibits after the minister of agriculture, Newton Steacey opened the event.
- The Journal of Anthony Tripp, found on a derelict farm on Mount Maxwell, revealed that the Tripps purchased two oxen from Mr. John Maxwell.

When the young Tripp attended at the Maxwell farm, he was cautioned about the hired hand, Mr. Walch. Maxwell had lost five prime beefs to cattle thieves, and Walch was "rumoured to be cattle thief and worse."

- The Liberals of Salt Spring held a picnic. Almost 80 party supporters showed up to talk to Hugh Heath of Nanaimo who would carry the party colours in the election.

### Twenty-Five Years Ago

- The Pioneer Village fund-raising efforts received a pleasant surprise. The cast and crew of *Hello Dolly* donated \$50 to the project. Ted Gear had befriended the electrician for the show, Willard Shaffar who collected the money to repay the friendliness of the islanders on his visit here.
- Marie Stark Wallace celebrated her birthday, making her — at 98 — the oldest resident of Salt Spring. She was born on August 15, 1867, the daughter of Louis and Sylvia Stark who were among the first settlers of the island in 1860.

- A petition calling for installation of a sewage system in Ganges would be circulated. When the department of health checked 32 septic fields at random in the village, not one field was operating properly.

Cost of the sewer was the big drawback. The minimum cost to householders would be \$5.66 per month and the cost would rise depending upon the size of the property involved.

### Twenty Years Ago

- The Chamber of Commerce on Salt Spring sought help in efforts to bring a sewer to Ganges. The newly created Capital Regional District would be asked to supply technical and financial aid to the village to solve the long-standing dispute about the need for a sewer.
- Papajohn reported from Saturna

that residents were concerned about the building inspector being a "foreigner." The island folk would grudgingly accept a Salt Spring Islander, but drew the line at the borders of the Gulf Islands.

- The Arts and Craft Show held at the Port Washington hall on Pender Island was a popular success. More than 200 people jostled and milled through the showing of handiwork of Penderites.

### Fifteen Years Ago

- The provincial pollution control board cancelled the permit of the Capital Regional District to discharge sewage into Ganges harbour. A different method of sewage disposal would be sought.

- The Salt Spring Lions received \$10,000 in grant money from the province to finish work on the recreation park at Central. They would need the money. At least three vehicles drove across the newly surfaced tennis courts scarring the surface. Top soil, to be spread around the fields, was being stolen.
- David Stupich, minister of agriculture, opened the 50th version of the Mayne Island Fall Fair. He had officiated at an opening 10 years previously. Special guests for the day were Mayne Islanders who had been at the first fair.

### Ten Years Ago

- The islands residents would have to pay the transit levy for buses which did not run on the islands, the Capital Regional Board decided. The Gulf Islands, by a previous vote of CRD directors, had been excluded from the levy but the board reconsidered and the islands were back in.

- The Inspector of Municipalities would investigate allegations that CRD director for Salt Spring, Yvette Valcourt had misused her office to stifle development in lower section of Ganges adjacent to the harbour.

- Once again the Mayne Island Fall Fair unfolded to enthusiastic crowds. Margaret Bennett opened the 55th version of the fair. Students from Sri Lanka, visiting the island courtesy of Canada World Youth, presented a cultural show.

### Five Years Ago

- A bucket brigade on Wallace Island quelled a fire at the building housing the generator for the island. The Coast Guard from Salt Spring and Gabriola rushed to the Trincomali Channel island but the fire was under control when they arrived.

Residents formed the bucket line from the ocean to the building to prevent the blaze from spreading to the trees. Damage was estimated at \$10,000.

- Population growth at the north end of Salt Spring resulted in creation of Rural Route Four by the Canada Post. The new mail route split RR One in two with the area from Central to Fernwood south to Robinson Road being in the new route.

- The Exits, a rock group claiming to be one step beyond the Doors, encouraged aging hippies to Flash-back to the '60s. With the help of Deliberate Fabrications, the group, (otherwise known as Club Mongo), helped celebrate the 16th anniversary of Woodstock.

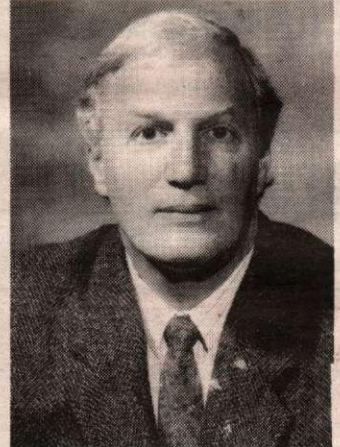

# PROVINCIAL ROUNDUP

## Help for fruit growers

The B.C. government announced last week that it will provide \$13.2 million to pay Interior fruit growers four cents a pound for all varieties of fruit on the 1989 crop.

Premier Vander Zalm said the money was to alleviate some of the immediate financial concerns of growers. The money is in addition to \$2.6 million in National Tripartite Stabilization payments made recently to orchardists.

## Too costly

The opening ceremonies for the 1994 Commonwealth Games will not be held in Victoria's Inner Harbour, as originally scheduled, but at the University of Victoria's Centennial Stadium.

The decision to relocate the ceremonies was announced last week by the organizers of the games after officials reviewed independent reports on the feasibility of holding the ceremonies in the harbour.

"The bid committee had the vision of staging the opening ceremonies in a novel setting, but independent studies have provided pervasive evidence that the inner harbour concept costs too much," said Victoria 94 board chairman John Walton.

## Cabinet road show

In what appears to be a pre-election campaign mode, Premier Bill Vander Zalm is taking his cabinet on the road. The first meeting away from Victoria took place last week in Powell River.

Another meeting is scheduled for Comox (Aug. 21-22). Additional stops will be announced for the Southeast Interior, the Upper Fraser Valley, the Fraser Canyon, Northwest B.C., the Okanagan-Similkameen area, and Greater Vancouver.

## Principal group payments

Finance Minister Mel Couvelier announced last week that the government was processing 50,000 cheques for a total of \$14.6 million under the government's settlement agreement with investors of First Investors Corporation Ltd. and Associated Investors of Canada Ltd.

The payments represent an additional 1.3 cents on each dollar of valuated claim for B.C. contract holders who have settled with the B.C. government. When combined with the advance payment of 4.9 cents per dollar, payment to date is 6.2 cents per dollar.

## Smith report imminent

Results of an RCMP investigation into the Bud Smith tape affair are expected to be released by the end of August, according to Deputy Attorney General Ted Hughes.

In a brief note to the legislative press gallery, Hughes said last week he expects a report from Alberta Deputy Attorney General Neil McCrank between August 15 and 25. McCrank has been asked by Hughes to decide whether or not charges should be laid against the former B.C. attorney general for possible obstruction of justice.

## Day care rate increase

The government last week announced a four per cent increase in the maximum rates for day care subsidies. The increase will go into effect September 1.

Low-income parents who qualify for day care subsidies can now get a maximum of \$312 a month, an increase of \$12, for a child 19 to 36 months old. Group day care for children in the same age category will increase to \$432 from \$415 a month.

During the 1989-90 fiscal year, day care subsidies totalled \$33.5 million. With the latest increase, that figure is expected to top \$35 million in the next fiscal year.

### DENTAL PATIENTS' RIGHTS

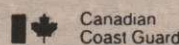
Inadequate communication with their dentist is a common complaint of dental patients. Important information such as the steps involved in planned dental procedures, possible complications and the cost of treatment is often not relayed as clearly as it might.

The Canadian Dental Association has formulated an outline of the rights of dental patients which addresses some of these concerns. It encourages informed consent of treatment and two-way dialogue between patient and dentist. Every dentist in Canada should have seen a copy of this document, and consumers of dental care should be aware of it also. For your information, here it is:

#### Dental Patients Charter of Rights

- Patients have the right to be examined and diagnosed by a licensed dentist.
- Patients have the right to an explanation of treatment alternatives and costs before treatment.
- Patients have the right to receive treatment according to the standards of the profession.
- Patients have the right to be treated in a safe and healthy environment.
- Patients have the right to be cared for by the dentist of their choice.
- Patients have the right to receive prompt emergency care.
- Patients have the right to an avenue by which to express complaint.
