Islanders extend challenge

The cause is serious but the efforts to raise money can be fun.

Terry Fox Run '90 organizer Sharlene Betts recently described the slate of events planned to raise dollars for cancer research.

Beginning on Friday, September 14, golfers will chase errant golf balls around the island course as their part of the fund-raising event.

The next day, Saturday, September 15, the folk at Vesuvius Inn prepare for a horseshoe pitching tournament.

The sailing club unfurls sabot races on September 16, between 10 a.m. and noon. Terry Warbey, 537-9820, is the co-ordinator of the water fun.

And then the main event: on Sunday, September 16, the 10th annual Terry Fox Run unfolds.

Betts urges islanders to get involved. The 10-kilometre course should not daunt anyone, she stressed. Islanders can walk, run, bike, jog, or use any means of getting around the course.

Extensive scouting group kicks-off season this week

The four scouting divisions on Salt Spring Island re-commence annual activities this week.

The Cubs, for boys aged eight to 10, hold their first meeting September 11 at St. George's Anglican Church on Park Drive. They will meet every Tuesday night from 6:15 to 7:45.

The two older groups — Scouts and Ventures — will meet on Wednesdays at the Farmers' Institute on Rainbow Road at 7 p.m.

The first meeting of the Beavers takes place on Wednesday, September 12 at St. George's Anglican Church from 6:15 to 7:15 p.m.

Registration for all divisions may be done at any meeting or at the Fall Fair on September 22 to 23.

The Beavers group is designed for boys aged five to seven and one-half or eight. Co-ordinator Jean Albert says the boys gain environmental awareness and do non-competitive activities which emphasize sharing and the teaching of self-respect and respect for others. They learn to be co-operative, to help each other and "none is singled out above the others," says Albert.

"If one gets an award, they all get an award."

Albert has just completed an intensive ten-day course in Scout training, which has made her a "Gilwell Scouter." She is assisted in leading the Beavers by Heather Howard, Milly Sinclair and Leah Little.

Barry Urquhart, Leanoir Hearsey and Karen Gordon are the Cub leaders who worked with 26 boys last year.

Cubs commence the badge system to measure their skill development. Through the Cub program and

Due to the large number of Cubs on Salt Spring, the participation of more adult leaders would be appreciated.

A group of boys aged 11 to 14 will form the Sea Scouts division this year.

Scouts have been a land-based group on Salt Spring for the past six

years, says co-ordinator Terry Owen, but will make the switch to a sea theme in 1990-91.

"We needed something extra here," says Owen, "and water is part of our natural habitat."

done in the past, but will use boats to get to the sites. Water skills like safe navigation will enhance the outdoor skills they normally develop.

Completion of the Canadian Sailing Association's White Sail I sailing course and a four-day excursion on the *Robertson II* are also on the Sea Scout agenda.

Dave Kempling, Serge Landry and Nolan Magnus will help Owen run the Sea Scouts program.

A Ventures group for boys aged 14 to 18 also forms a division in the island's scouting organization.

The Ventures program is set up and run by the participants who independently develop a program of interest to themselves. The boys run their own meetings and organize ac-

tivities with the assistance of an adult advisor as requested.

The Ganges RCMP detachment has been approached regarding sponsorship of the Ventures program. The first RCMP sponsorship program was initiated 20 years ago, and for the past two years it has been RCMP policy that a Ventures group be sponsored by detachments in larger centres. RCMP participation is encouraged but not mandatory in less populated communities.

Branch 92 of the Royal Canadian Legion is the general sponsor of the scouts on Salt Spring Island.

Although age designations are made for all groups, these are not fixed, say the scouting leaders. Depending on his maturity and level of experience, a boy can participate in the division above or below the one his age would normally put him in.

Owen says he has met some people who incorrectly perceive the scouts to be "a para-military organization" or unconcerned about ecology because they have an annual fund-raising Christmas tree sale. Environmental awareness is and always has been a dominant theme of Salt Spring's scouts, he says, and is reflected in their approach to outdoor activities.

Scouting also aims "to better prepare our youth for tomorrow," says Albert, "and is about teaching skills that make better citizens." Further information may be obtained from Barry Urquhart at 537-5431 or 537-9966, Jean Albert at 537-5843, or Terry Owen at 537-2252 or 537-3351.

An information and registration booth will also be set up at the Fall Fair.

Island Fall Fair entry deadline approaches

Time winds close to the deadline for entries to the Salt Spring Fall Fair.

Most entry forms should be in the hands of Fall Fair Committee members or the section co-ordinator by Saturday, September 15.

The exceptions are for the pet show and the photography competition.

Entry forms for the photography events should be handed to co-ordinator Betty Peters or Salt Spring Photo on McPhillips Avenue before Sunday, September 9. The actual photos should be in for judging by Wednesday, September 19.

Pets and their owners should show up at the Rainbow Road fair ground in time for the event at 10 a.m. on Sunday, September 23. Entry is limited to children 12 years-old or younger and any pet is eligible, even hefflumps.

Once the entry form has been filled out and entered, contestants wait until Friday, September 21 to put their displays in place. Livestock and 4-H entries are to be on the grounds before 8:30 p.m. on September 22.

The entries in the Scotch Egg section, to vie for the Mrs. J. Broughton Perpetual Trophy, must contain six examples of the fine culinary endeavour.

Fairgoers should exercise patience and forgiveness when, on fair day, the entry plates are empty. The special judges for this section — the 1979 Security Group — tend to take their responsibility seriously. While they no longer act in the capacity of night watch for the Fair, they do judge the Scotch Eggs.

Patrolling the building and grounds qualifies as hungry work, even if they no longer take part. Indeed, the intrepid '79 Security Group must sample the entries to ensure quality is maintained.

The tradition of fall fairs on Salt Spring began in 1896. In that year,

the Islands Agricultural and Fruit Growers Association began the event.

The association drew its membership from Thetis, Kuper, Moresby, Provost, Saturna, Pender, Mayne, Galiano and Salt Spring.

The purpose of the fair was "to stimulate further activity among the ranchers both commercially and scientifically." Membership in the association cost \$1.50 per individual and allowed free entry of exhibits.

Non-members had to pay 50 cents entrance fee in each class.

Membership also granted "the person . . . and his wife to admission" to the fair.

By 1919, prize money for sections varied from \$1 down to 50 cents for first place and 50 cents down to 25 cents for second. Some categories carried prizes of \$2 and others, such as grains, offered a top prize of \$5.

That same year, admission to the grounds was 25 cents, with children under 12 years-old paying 10 cents.

There was no mention in the program of Scotch Eggs competition.

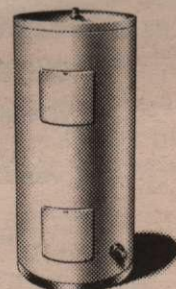

Joanne Barrett of Island Magic Hair Salon will have her group out and moving. She challenges other

hair care businesses to match pledges of \$500.

Pledge forms can be picked up at various locations around the island, such as the *Driftwood*, or the B.C. Hydro office on Rainbow Road. The forms are also available at Patterson's in Fulford as well as a

dozen other outlets around Ganges.

This year, the pledge forms contain an added portion. Individuals who can't take part in the run, can fill in the form to indicate a donation. Any chartered bank will accept donations beginning September 1.

Up to March 31, 1990, The Terry Fox fund has given close to \$45 million to various phases of cancer research. More than \$85 million has been raised.

Terry Fox lost his right leg to cancer when he was 18-years-old. As he recuperated, he decided to run across Canada to raise money for cancer research.

"We need your help," he told the Canadian Cancer Society. "The people in cancer clinics all over the world need people who believe in miracles.

"I'm not a dreamer and I'm not saying that this will initiate any kind of definitive answer or cure to cancer, but I believe in miracles. I have to."

And so on April 12, 1980, he ran — for 5,372 kilometres from St. John, Newfoundland to Thunder Bay, Ontario. He sought to raise \$1 for every citizen of Canada. At that time there were 24.1 million people in the country. The amount raised from the *Marathon of Hope* stood at \$24.17 million by the end of 1980.

Although his marathon ended on September 1, 1980, he sparked a determination in Canadians to help find a way of beating cancer.

Terry Fox died June 28, 1981 but his belief in miracles lives on.

On the Terry Fox weekend in September, islanders will have the opportunity to join the spirit of the *Marathon of Hope* to ensure that "somewhere the hurting must stop."

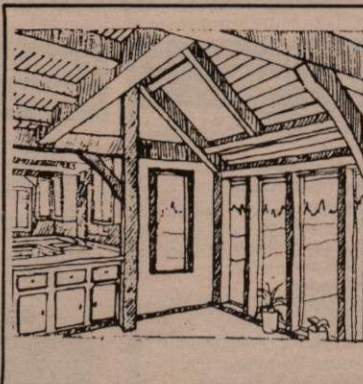

Sauce for the gander?

I've entertained a houseful of people this summer and I've enjoyed the experience. But after the feast comes the reckoning and I had a heap of empties to get rid of. And that's the odd thing about bottles.

You drink beer and each can and every bottle may be hauled back to the liquor store or elsewhere to be bought back. But you drink wine or hard liquor and the bottles are your problem. I know that the beer drinker tends to carry his sauce further afield than the home-loving whisky Johnny. And most wine accompaniments meals where bottles are also less prone to being shattered in dangerous places.

You drink cider and the bottle is yours.

Same goes for soft drinks and mixers. Some containers are returnable and others are not. Mind you, it's your money you're after! If the bottle is returnable, you bought it when you made the original purchase. But it's sure puzzling to the new housewife like me.

It should not be!

I have my bill from the B.C. Hydro. As usual, it is remarkably high, but, as usual, I shall pay it and carry on. There is one aspect to it that gripes me.

For the past 50 years I have lived with this state of the economy we call inflation. Since the second war I have been embroiled in the spiral of wages and prices until I'm dizzy. It is not surprising to find that prices are on the up and up. They have been for years.

I am marked about the practice of levying a surcharge on bills already paid and forgotten. I am to be billed, as are all my neighbours, for a 1.5 per cent retroactive increase since April. Why?

Why should a Crown corporation have the right to come back on me for more money after having billed me at a lower rate and accepted my cheque? It is wrong and improper and the legislators, my masters, should correct it.

If every agency were to be granted this same authority, we could not survive. At any time we might be faced with a demand for retroactive corrections on bills long paid and forgotten.

It is an abuse of power and I'm one of the abused. And I don't like it!

Not my recollection

It is, after all, the 50th anniversary of the outbreak of World War Two and many a veteran has been reminded of this fact by his own recollections of a long strife. With all these fine thoughts in mind I tuned in to the Public Broadcasting System's "Piece of Cake."

I was sorry I did.

The show takes the viewer back to the early years of the war when the Royal Air Force was stationed in France, during the "Phony War." But the air force depicted is not to be identified with Winston Churchill's "So Few." We see a gathering of small-minded, petty and dishonest pilots under the command of an equally small-minded commanding officer.

I don't write as a distinguished veteran of the Royal Air Force. I served without distinction or bravery. I did what I had to and went where I was sent. Nevertheless, I was never ashamed to tell anyone that I served during that war in the Royal Air Force.

After watching two episodes of this movie I could never admit my service if I found truth or accuracy in this saga of dishonesty and cowardice in a service notable for its great contribution to the cause of honour and decency.

I don't like the portrayal of the RAF as a group of thieving, lying poltroons and it is strange that this slanderous interpretation should have been exported from Britain.

Last week I was host to a gathering of Royal Air Force women veterans. They were four ex-Women's Auxiliary Air Force members who met up for the second time in half a century. Meeting over a celebratory dinner and reminiscing over a wine glass, they also commented on this movie. Their indignation equalled my own.

Lorna Waight, of Harrogate, England; Pat Haveruk, of Comox; Beryl Waterman, of West Vancouver and Sheila Galliano, from Roseville, in California, spent an evening harking back to the years of war, but their memories were of a large group of proud and courageous men who did their part in writing the history of the allied air forces.

DOWN THE YEARS

Thirty Years Ago

Progressive Conservative candidate Ted Strongtharm paid a visit to Salt Spring Island during the provincial election campaign. He promised he would do everything possible to make the ferries part of the provincial highway system and to get cheaper power to the islands. He also said a major overhaul of the provincial taxation system was necessary.

A car crashed into the side of the Log Cabin Cafe just as manager Archie McCowan was pouring pancake batter onto the griddle for some customers. He apparently thought he was in the middle of an earthquake, dumped the rest of the batter and ran to safety.

The official opening of the Salt Spring Island Trading Company's modern meat department was being planned by store owners.

Twenty-Five Years Ago

The two-year-old son of Mr. and Mrs. Emory of Mayne Island was rushed by water taxi to the hospital on Salt Spring Island when it was discovered the boy had swallowed some turpentine. Dr. Jarman was returning to Salt Spring from Galiano at the same time and he was intercepted in Active Pass to administer immediate medical treatment.

One hundred dollars raised by the Galiano Garden Club's garden party was handed over to the Pioneer Village fund this week. This aroused the competitive spirit of the Saturna Women's Club who said they had every intention of making more money for the fund than Galiano had managed.

Three young local boys were found to be responsible for damage caused to the Galiano Rod & Gun Club facilities. The boys' parents were ordered to make restitution.

Twenty Years Ago

The Capital Regional District reluctantly told disgruntled Pender Island residents that it could do nothing to control the noise of a practising

acid rock group on Hooson Road. When it was suggested the CRD create a bylaw to deal with noise on the island, Esquimalt Mayor Art Young said "it's no good having a bylaw you can't enforce."

Mrs. Harry Williamson reported that the passengers and crew all witnessed an unexplainable brilliant light in the sky above the ferry as it left Swartz Bay on its final trip. Mrs. Williamson said it was not an aircraft because there were no other navigation lights. The light was too brilliant to examine through a telescope and it veered off at sharp angles.

When the ferry docked at Fulford Harbour the light was approximately overhead, but there was no clear way to explain its presence.

One hundred and twenty-five people attended the inaugural meeting of the Salt Spring Island Ratepayers' Association. Elected directors were Bill Sawyer, president; Wayne Pearce, vice-president; Bram Oudshoorn, treasurer; A.S. Marr, recording secretary; Dorothy Sneddon, corresponding secretary.

Fifteen Years Ago

The Islands Trust's subdivision bylaw for Salt Spring Island was set aside for another month while the shortcomings alleged against it were investigated. Bylaw committee members Quentin Wilson and Nonie Guthrie expressed frustration and blamed Trust planners at a public meeting held to discuss the bylaw. Wilson said the planners had done nothing with the several pages the committee had submitted to them.

With an unprecedented 5.66 inches of rainfall and a mean temperature of 51.9 degrees F., the month of August was the wettest and coldest on record in the Gulf Islands. Local RCMP attributed a decline in the amount of vandalism from the previous year to the poor weather conditions.

The Gulf Islands School Board approved payment of tuition fees for Pender Island students attending

schools in the Saanich school district. Trustees also confirmed that students from Saturna would be paid their costs of flying to school at Ganges.

Ten Years Ago

The rezoning of property at Mouat Park was considered by the Salt Spring Islands Trust Committee. The rezoning of the property to allow the construction of a recreational complex was debated by committee members, who decided to set an October public hearing on the matter.

The cement was poured for the foundation of the Pender Islands Health Care Centre. The Lions Club of the Penders was praised for its spearheading of the project.

The Salt Spring Island Trust Committee was told St. Mary Lake needed to be flushed with chlorine. W.E. Delmonico told members the lake's use as a water supply since 1978 had reduced its run-off and resulted in suspended solids. Delmonico also advocated the return of power boats to the lake.

Bruce Fiander won \$100 as the winner of the Rotary Club's fishing derby. His 20 lb., 15.5 oz. salmon was the largest catch of the derby. The largest codfish was netted by Bill de Long.

Five Years Ago

Crew members of the Salt Spring Queen had a horrendous week at work. The ramp had to be cranked by hand on one day due to the power being cut off in the Vesuvius area, a passenger suffered a heart attack on the boat, and two vehicles were unable to off-load because of dead batteries. The cardeck also had to be swabbed when the entire contents of a motorhome's sewage holding tank were released due to a broken valve. Over 200 people attended a meeting to hear representatives of MacMillan Bloedel present their plans for the land they own on Galiano Island.

CRD directors voted against a proposed extension of the Ganges sewer area. The addition of 33 properties on Seaview Avenue and in the area of Swanson's pond had been proposed.

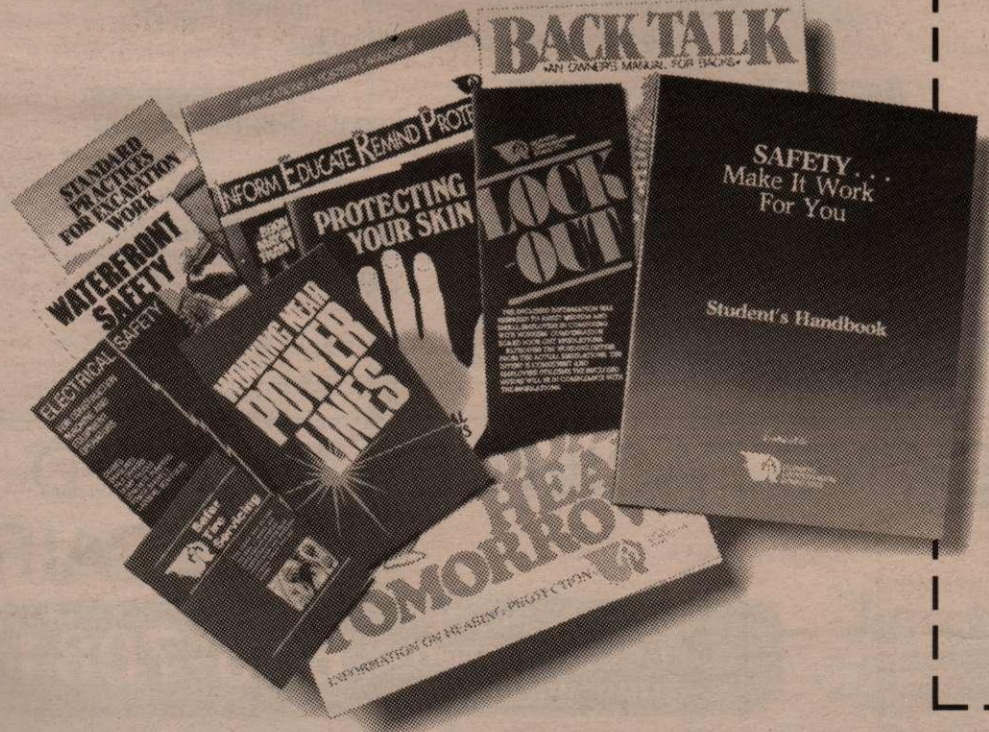

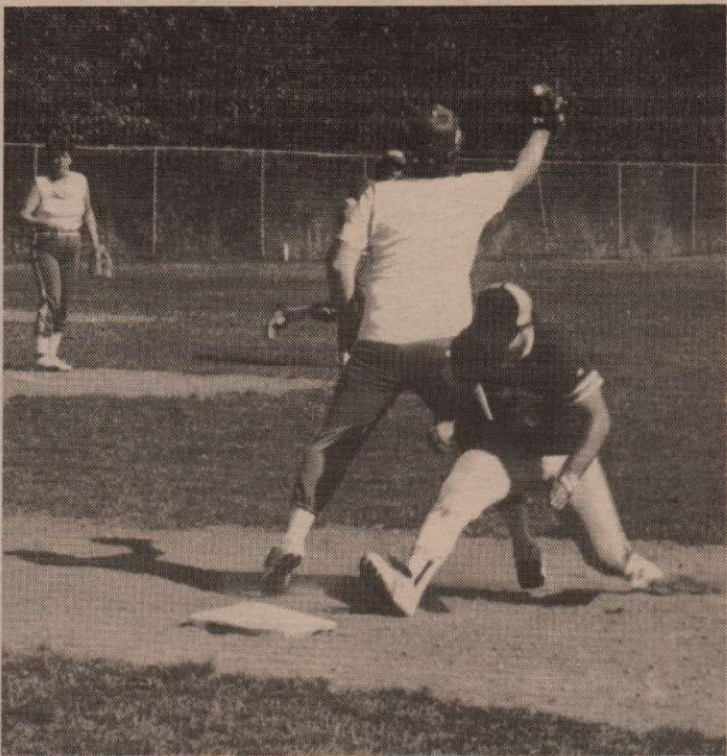
