Fraser's celebrate regiment

Canada became a possession of England in 1759 following the Battle of the Plains of Abraham at Quebec City.

The 78th Fraser Highland Regiment was at that battle. The Vancouver contingent of the Fraser's came to Salt Spring Island last weekend to celebrate their existence.

Now a ceremonial regiment, the Fraser Highlanders keep alive the honours and tradition of the oldest Highland regiment in Canada. And the ladies form an integral part of the Fraser's.

The ladies, under a king's warrant naming them "Miladies," had royal consent to follow the regiment "for the care and the comfort of the men in the field."

At Quebec, members of the Fraser's were used to trick the sentries at the path which lead from the St. Lawrence up the bluff to the plain. The battle, one of the most important in Canadian history, ranks as one of the shortest as well.

Wolfe had 4,300 men to face the French garrison of 10,000. Two volleys and a wild charge by the Scots ended the battle quickly.

Beyond Basics course teaches skills to single parent women

New fall programming at the Salt Spring Island Community Centre begins September 24 with a free 12-week course for single parent women.

Beyond Basics is a living skills program designed to empower women raising children on their own and help them make decisions about their future.

Participants in the course identify

assumptions they make about themselves and the environment they are currently operating under. With the benefit of new self-awareness, they affirm their abilities, interests and priorities.

Some of the topics covered are personal history, assertiveness, relationships, parenting and decision-making. Employment and educational opportunities are also ex-

plored.

However, course facilitator Susan Hogan says "the subject really is your life. You are the expert and we use the expertise of your own experience."

Hogan stresses that she is neither a therapist nor the teacher of *Beyond Basics*. As its facilitator, her role "is to provide information and a road map" for participants, she says.

Hogan says the women "learn about 10 per cent from me and 90 per cent from the group."

Through sharing and working together, the participants really get to know each other and become mutually supportive peers.

Panel discussion

Seniors attend talk on misuse of drugs

The use and misuse of prescription drugs by seniors was the topic of a recent panel discussion at the Seniors for Seniors office in Ganges.

Local pharmacist Maureen Ramsey led the discussion with a list of reasons indicating why the use of prescription drugs in the 55-and-older age group can cause concern. While this age group makes up 12 per cent of the population, it consumes 25 per cent of prescription drugs.

Body changes in older people, she said, can lead to increased adverse drug reactions and effects.

Individuals who are 50 and older often have a less efficient system of absorption and distribution of drugs, plus a slower metabolism rate. This means an older body cannot necessarily handle the same amount of a drug as a younger body. Therefore, the quantity of the drug intake must be decreased.

Physiological changes can increase an older person's responsive-

Island Rotarians accepting exchange student requests

Salt Spring Rotarians are accepting applications from students wanting to spend a year of study in a foreign country.

The successful applicant will spend a school year studying in one of more than 150 foreign countries. He or she will live in a Rotary-approved home and become a part of family life in that country.

The Rotary Exchange program has been ongoing on Salt Spring for close to 20 years, sending out approximately 18 students to countries such as Japan, Germany, Spain, Brazil, New Zealand and Australia.

For every student sent out — one

per year — another student is brought into the community.

The student applicant may be male or female and from a Rotary or non-Rotary home. He or she must be of secondary-school age — the program is designed for high school students only and not for post-graduate studies.

Applicants must be in the top one-third of their class and should consider why they want to enter the program. They will have the opportunity in personal interviews to note their participation in school, church or community activities and demonstrate their personality,

knowledge of community, province and nation, and their approach to world problems and affairs.

An applicant who is selected by the Salt Spring Rotary Club will then be further interviewed and selected by the Rotary District Committee.

One or both parents must accompany the student applicant to each interview session.

While it is best if the student has had the opportunity to study the language of the country in question, it is not a requirement. About 50 per cent of the students participating in the program over the past 30 years have not known the language of the country they travelled to. Most were able to make a breakthrough in the language in about six to eight weeks.

Students interested in becoming applicants should obtain a form from the Student Exchange Committee (chairman Walt McConville) and study the rules and regulations before applying.

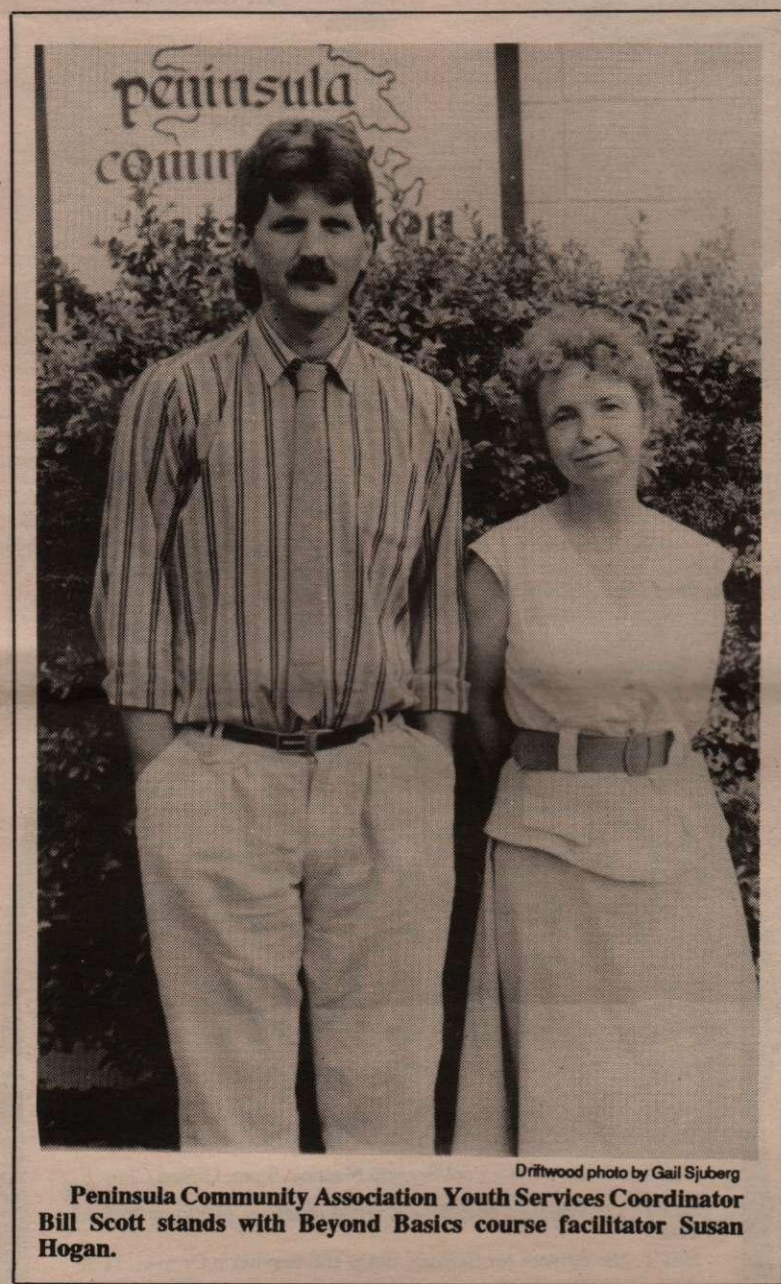

He says the course "challenges the assumption of helplessness" often felt by those supported by Social Services. Such feelings are emphasized when "people say to them, you're on assistance, what can you expect from life?"

Beyond Basics has made its way to Salt Spring Island because of expressed interest from the island for this type of program. Three women from Salt Spring commuted to Sidney to join the last session. Scott approached the SSI Community Society and received a positive response to running the course here.

Scott says he is always impressed by the effort people give in completing the program. "It takes a big commitment and dedication."

Hogan is a single mother and certified life skills coach with extensive experience in course facilitation. Life

At one time she worked in an office and found herself spending her spare time volunteering for non-profit social service agencies. She realized she was using her private time doing what she really wanted to do for a living, so she enrolled in the Employment Orientation for Women at Camosun College. Upon completion of the course, the instructor hired her to work in the program.

Just as Hogan made the transition from "the basics" to her own priorities, women in her program learn to "focus on the issue about what's important for you," she says.

Beyond Basics runs from 9:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. on Monday, Wednesday and Friday for 12 weeks commencing September 24 at the Salt Spring Island Community Centre.

A NEW NATIVE LAND CLAIMS POLICY FOR BRITISH COLUMBIA

MADE-IN-BC POLICY BASED ON FAIRNESS, BALANCE, AFFORDABILITY.

The provincial government has developed a new "made-in-BC" policy for negotiating and settling Native land claims in British Columbia. Under this new policy BC will — for the first time — join the federal government and BC Native people at the negotiating table to work out settlements which are fair to everyone. The province will assist the Government of Canada in meeting its obligations to fully settle Indian land claims.

This new approach to land claims is based on recommendations from the Premier's Council on Native Affairs. The Council has spent the past year travelling the province and meeting with Native Leaders.

FEDERAL GOVERNMENT RESPONSIBLE FOR CLAIMS

The Canadian Constitution makes the government of Canada solely responsible for "Indians and Indian lands." Ottawa has the ultimate legal and financial responsibility for land claims in British Columbia. In British Columbia the federal government has accepted 19 claims for negotiation, has three more under review and is expecting eight others. These claims extend over every region of the province.

BC SHOWS LEADERSHIP ON NATIVE CLAIMS

The province is joining land claims negotiations to right a historical wrong and to ensure fair treatment for all British Columbians.

Current federal policy allows only one negotiation at a time in BC. That's not good enough — this "made-in-Ottawa" policy doesn't allow for the large number of claims we face in British Columbia. The provincial government will join BC Natives in pushing Ottawa for a more realistic "made-in-BC" negotiating process which allows us to settle more than one claim at a time.

WHAT WE'RE DOING

The province has announced:

- a new Claims Registry to receive land claims proposals which have been accepted by the Government of Canada;
- a new Claims Negotiations Unit in the Ministry of Native Affairs.

This will ensure an orderly and consistent claims negotiation process.

At the same time, following another recommendation of the Advisory Council, the province will provide the public with additional information on land claims. For further information please write:

BACKGROUND

Seniors group looks at peer counselling class

The Seniors for Seniors organization on Salt Spring hopes to establish a training session for seniors interested in becoming peer counsellors or peer helpers.

A recent notice sent out to members outlines the roles played by peer counsellors and requests input from those interested in participating in a training program.

Peer counselling has become a popular method of helping people of all ages through difficult periods.

As the Seniors for Seniors' *News N' Views* newsletter notes: "Those who are most in need are often the most difficult to reach. These are the people whose social world has shrunk and whose degree of social participation is dependent upon the proximity of friends, neighbours churches and stores."

Being independent is important, the newsletter notes, and asking for help is not easy.

The peer counselling program is based on people helping people — peers assisting peers and in this case, seniors helping seniors. Sharing an experience or a troubling time with a peer often means sharing with someone who has experienced a similar situation. This makes it easier to talk

and listen.

A peer counsellor is described as someone who is willing to listen, and talk about his or her feelings, without giving advice, but genuinely caring and providing non-judgmental empathy. Peer counsellors also share a code of ethics regarding confidentiality.

Peer counselling courses offer training in the following areas: listening and communication skills; learning through role playing; learning through discussion of hypothetical cases; understanding the importance of confidentiality; understanding other responsibilities involved; benefiting from feedback and supervision.

The courses are taught by certified trainers and usually involve small groups of five to 10 people.

If Seniors for Seniors arranges for such a course volunteers would be referred to as "peer helpers" rather than "peer counsellors" as the latter denotes a professional person.

take to ensure the safe use of prescription drugs.

- Give your pharmacist all necessary information such as age and medical condition. Ramsey said people are often reluctant to provide this information but without it, she cannot tell if the dose is reasonable.

- Always ask questions. Find out from your doctor why you are taking the prescription drug.

- Make sure you know how to take the drug — whether it is for permanent or temporary use — and if it should be taken with food.

Ramsey said she is frequently questioned about the side effects of a drug.

"You can't be too liberal in telling people what the possible side effects are," she said, "because they seem more likely to get them."

It is very important for a pharmacist to determine drug interactions, Ramsey said: sometime the use of different drugs at once can be safe if the situation is monitored; some are beneficial and some are highly dangerous.

Ramsey documented two cases of individuals hospitalized for irregular, psychotic behaviour. In both situations, the symptoms were set off by use of two incompatible drugs. In one case, the patient was borrowing prescription drugs from a neighbour — something one should never do.

Ramsey also described a case where a 85-year-old woman died from a drug-overdose in hospital, after receiving drugs which should not have been administered together in her case.

Both Ramsey and Dixon discussed the dangers of sleeping pill use by seniors.

As Ramsey noted, everyone differs in the amount of sleep needed. The range varies from three hours per night to nine or 10. Sleeping pills tend to build up and cause a "hang-over" effect such as drowsiness or dizziness, which can lead to falls or other accidents. As Dixon noted, drowsiness from pills is a common cause of broken bones in the elderly.

Furthermore, most people eventually become tolerant of sleeping pills and a sudden stop could lead to worse insomnia, nightmares and restlessness.

Panel member and social worker Lorcan Pitchen noted the importance of finding methods of dealing with health problems through means other than the use of drugs. Stress management, diet and exercise are three important alternatives, he said.

All three panel members agreed on the importance of establishing communication between doctor, patient and pharmacist.

"Drug misuse occurs through a lack of communication," Dixon said, "and a need to read and follow directions."

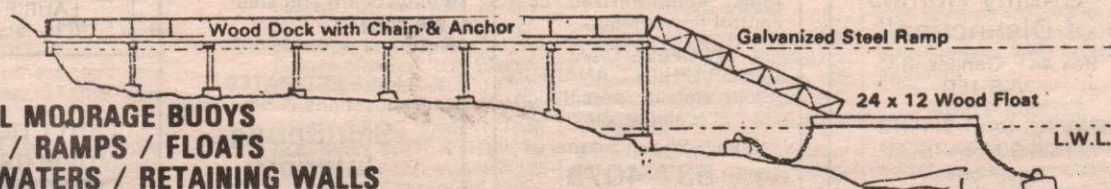

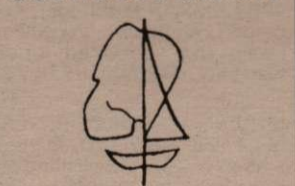

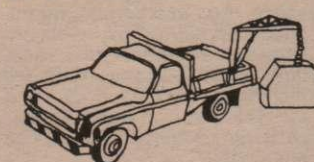

While waiting in the parking lot for the 6 p.m. sailing of the *Bowen Queen* my son fell and hurt his arm. Ferry staff immediately provided assistance and advice in a professional manner, while displaying a genuine concern for my son. They were there within seconds of him falling, and quickly provided a tentative diagnosis of a broken wrist.

I took my son to the Saanich Peninsula hospital, where his arm was quickly x-rayed, the suspected break confirmed and his arm casted. We returned to the terminal in time to get caught in the overload for the 7:30 p.m. sailing, and ferry staff again provided ready assistance to get us on that sailing.

While many of us on Salt Spring have mixed feelings about some of the actions of the BC Ferry Corporation, I found that the people who run our ferry's provide an excellent service above and beyond the call of duty.

Thirty Years Ago

• CCF, Liberal and Social Credit candidates visited Salt Spring as part of the provincial election campaign. Colin Cameron (CCF), Hugh Heath (Liberal) and George Gregory (SC) all spoke to islanders at different meetings.

• Vandals hit Salt Spring Island in a series of incidents. Ken Dods' jeep was found with all the window glass broken, the radiator filled with sand and all the instruments smashed inside.

• Vancouver's Jericho Tennis Club invaded the Harbour House Hotel on the Labour Day weekend. The frolicking group arrived in two float planes and did not stop flying all weekend.

Twenty-Five Years Ago

• Salt Spring Islanders had been confident that the island's beer supply would last until the brewery strike ended. When news of the brew's availability spread, thirsty visitors from off-island invaded and the Salt Spring supply was quickly depleted.

• A private home on Salt Spring was renovated for temporary use as a classroom due to overcrowding at Salt Spring Elementary. Glenn Woodley's 26 Grade Six students set to work in the facility.

• Highlights of the Fulford Festival were the Fulford Hall dance and the softball games in which the Fulford Ladies clearly outshone the Salt Spring Grandfathers. The winner of the best baby contest was one-year-old Kristina-Leigh Spencer.

Twenty Years Ago

• The Department of Transport was looking into an oil slick discovered off the north end of Salt Spring Island near Southey Point. Ships using the waters in the area were being investigated.

• Salt Spring Island highways foreman Hector Gerow announced his department was planning the construction of a sidewalk from the Pioneer Village area to Ganges village.

• A cougar roaming Salt Spring Island was finally cornered and killed. The cougar had killed sheep, lambs and goats in several areas of the island. Douglas McDonald located the cougar on the Lacy farm on Isabella Point Road and called Ted Akerman and his dog to assist him. When the cat had been treed, McDonald shot it.

Fifteen Years Ago

• The Salt Spring Island Planning Association approved a resolution asking for a referendum on updating the zoning bylaw and other factors related to the subdivision bylaw.

• B.C. Tel was nearing completion of a \$109,600 program to expand and improve telephone service to telephone customers on Salt Spring Island. The plan involved the placement of 13 miles of aerial telephone, nine of which was dedicated to improving telephone lines between Ganges and Fulford Harbour. • Total enrolment figures for Gulf Islands schools were released. Salt Spring Island Elementary had the most students, with 435. Gulf Islands Secondary School had 318 students.

Pender's elementary school had 67 pupils enrolled; there was 65 at Mayne, 50 at Galiano and 29 at Saturna. Trustees also confirmed that students from Saturna would be paid their costs of flying to school at Ganges.

• An estimated 40 per cent of B.C. Hydro's customers in the Gulf Islands refused to pay the municipal transit levy, said Hydro district manager Terry Anderson.

MLA Hugh Curtis told Salt Spring Island regional director Yvette Valcourt that he was reviewing the situation with a view to exempt certain areas from the levy.

• Parks and Recreation Commission chairman Glenn Woodley told *Driftwood* that the construction of a community recreation centre on Salt Spring Island would cost \$2,120,000 to build, with annual operating costs of \$153,000. Financing of the centre was estimated to increase property taxes by eight mills.

• The wharf at Bennett Bay on Mayne Island was the subject of court action. The Islands Trust was appealing a court decision which noted that the wharf was legal but could not be used for commercial purposes. The Trust objected to the wharf being constructed without a permit over water zoned for non-commercial purposes.

Five Years Ago

• The Gulf Islands School Board approved a capital budget of \$2,029,200, which included \$356,000 for additional classrooms at Gulf Islands Secondary School.

A new floor for the Activity Centre, expansion of Fernwood Elementary's library and gymnasium and an improved school board office were also contemplated by the budget. • The Salt Spring Transportation Committee proposed amend-

ments to the Fulford Harbour-Swartz Bay ferry schedule to allow better connections with the Swartz Bay-Tsawwassen ferries. The group noted that if the ferry left 15 minutes earlier for each run, it would allow residents enough time to make the

transfer to the mainland boat.

• An unoccupied U.S. fishing vessel running at three-quarter throttle was discovered jammed against the rocks at Java Islet near Saturna. An extensive search for the occupants was undertaken.

Unromantic life of an oyster

Source of rejuvenation powers may be "ease" of consumption

"Indeed, I cannot think why the whole bed of the ocean is not one solid mass of oysters, so prolific the creatures seem. No doubt there are natural enemies which limit the increase... you and I, Watson, we have done our part."

—Sherlock Holmes.

A lot of nonsense has been written about oysters. Conan Doyle, at least, was doing it on purpose. In *The Adventure of the Dying Detective*, Watson discovers his friend lying in bed and raving about oysters. This performance is part of an elaborate plot in which Watson, and then the criminal in the case, are the dupes.

But even in the pretended extremity of his fever Holmes tells us that he loves to eat oysters.

People go wrong when they eat oysters in order to love, and they make a second mistake when they rave about it afterwards.

All the claims for the rejuvenate powers of oysters are derived not from the oysters themselves, which are, I am certain, utterly indifferent to the human condition as they drink happily through the tides, but from the ease with which oyster-lovers are able to consume them.

We may attribute our fertility to these excellent shellfish, but consider the facts. Firstly, the oyster can change its sex from season to season. This behaviour obviously is not to be encouraged. Secondly, the oyster may produce hundreds of millions of eggs during a single, warm summer. They are fertilized by the milt of an unknown father and then the oyster larva, or spat, spends a fortnight swimming aimlessly in the sea before it finds something hard to grow upon.

None of this procedure seems particularly attractive to me, and I don't see why Lord Byron, and Tom Jones, and the Emperor Trojan were excited about it.

After its brief odyssey the oyster's life becomes, if possible, even less romantic. Attached by its foot to a rock, or a shell, or a piling, or the traps of an oyster-farmer, the tiny mollusc, immobilized and beset by enemies, tries to reach maturity.

Sometimes help is offered by men and women who tend an oyster lease but, like the logging companies who

"harvest" our forests, people encourage the growth of one species, and exclude others, only in order to consume the fruit of each generation more quickly.

Then the starfish find the oysters and drag their shells apart with relentless strength. Oyster drills and sponges make holes in their armour, and then, hideously, there are the leeches. Other shellfish, the salubrious mussels for example, may, like dwellers of apartments built on farmland, so colonize the oyster shells as to choke off the life beneath THEIR feet. Oyster-catchers feed upon the growing oyster while crows and gulls fly into the sky and drop the defenceless shells onto the rocks below.

In fact, the chief virtue possessed by the oyster, after its marvellous taste and adaptability in the kitchen or on the beach, is its supreme digestibility. A pleasant feeling in the stomach will benefit whatever activities you undertake afterwards. Eating too many guarantees the opposite.

The abundance of oysters on our rocky shores has recently declined, not so much through the effects of pollution and the attentions of natural enemies, but rather through the glutony, commercial and otherwise, of people.

Shallot Sauce for Oysters
1/2 cup butter
2 shallots, cut very fine
1/4 tsp tarragon
1/2 tsp black pepper
2 tbsp parsley, chopped
1/4 cup lemon juice
Briefly saute the shallots in butter.

Season them with tarragon, pepper, parsley and mix with lemon juice. Serve a tablespoon of the sauce, hot, over each oyster.

Oyster Stew with Wine
3 cups shelled oysters
1/2 tsp black pepper

1 tsp celery seed
1 tsp white wine vinegar
2 tsp olive oil
1/2 cups white wine
1 1/2 cups oyster stock

Put the magnificent molluscs into a pan and season with pepper and celery seed. Add vinegar, olive oil, wine and the strained oyster stock. Simmer for half an hour, stirring occasionally.

This recipe is taken from my book *Roman Cookery*. You may wish to create a chowder from it by adding a few chopped clams and tomatoes and a couple of tablespoons of bacon. Thicken with egg yolks and flour.
