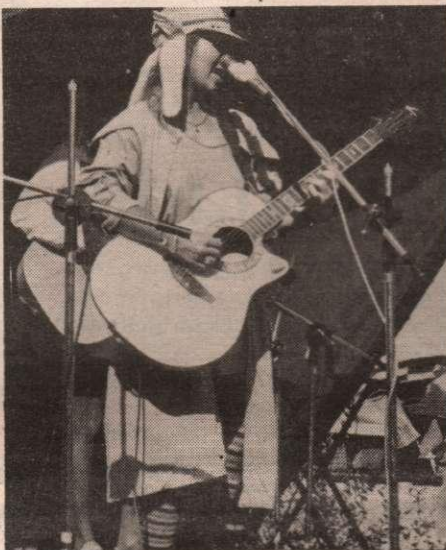

"Like stepping back in time"

Perfect celebratory weather and the enthusiasm of participants combined to make the second annual Avalon Fair a definite success.

Attendance was up from last year's fair. Organizers estimate 3,000 adults and children took in the activities from Wednesday through to Sunday evening.

Performers, vendors of unusual wares and practitioners of the metaphysical poured onto the island to participate in the fair at Shady Willows Resort.

Many fairgoers accepted the invitation to dress in medieval or fantasy costume, creating a visual delight on their own.

About 55 booths were on the fair site, down slightly from the 65 expected by organizers. Several unscheduled performers came to the fair, hoping to do impromptu presentations.

Jackson Barker displays gladiolus creations

Local known as hybridizer and grower of quality glads

Jackson Barker's paintings may be well-known to many on Salt Spring, but one has to either walk through his backyard or travel much farther afield to find evidence of his other creative talent.

The Cedar Lane resident is known throughout North America as a quality hybridizer and grower of gladiolus flowers.

Barker has not had enough time to compile a list of the awards he has won at glad shows, but every fertilized match he has ever made is recorded in a series of "bibles" — notebooks filled with flower names, dates and numbered codes.

As a hybridizer he engages in breeding gladioli with shapes and shades of colour never seen before. Each cultivar born of his efforts is an original.

Like many great works of art, a new gladiolus takes time to produce.

"It takes one year to make a seed, and three more years before you succeed in seeing what you've got," he says.

Up to 10 years of work is required to produce enough bulbs to market the cultivar.

The bulbs must then be sent to trial gardens in the United States and grown there to determine their health and quality before they can be sold on the market.

"They've got to stand up to conditions and have enough buds blooming and they have to do it consistently. You can't afford the space to grow *would be's*," says Barker.

His wife Ruth notes that the cleanliness and health of the glads are considered most important at a show. Rules set by the show's regulatory body and the judges' personal preferences also determine their placing.

The couple laughs recalling Barker's first impression of glads. He thought they were odd because the flowers only grew up one side of the stem.

Jun gladiolus hybridizers.

He started with a 7.5-metre by 30.5-metre (25- by 100-foot) garden space and learned the art from neighbourhood growers. One day he found a note tucked into one of the blooming flowers. It read: "This is a good one. Keep it."

The money Barker made from selling his first successful cultivar — a prolific producer called *Green Ice* — paid for the 20 double truckloads

You can't afford the space to grow "would be's," Barker says.

of dirt needed to fill a huge hole at the property the Barkers bought on the south side of the St. Lawrence River near Greenfield Park.

He has been told "fields" of *Green Ice* are now grown in Holland.

Barker expanded his hybridizing activities in Greenfield Park until he moved to British Columbia to retire.

The Barkers bought their Cedar Lane property in 1976 and built their home and gardens there.

They had intended to "keep quiet" about his glad growing on Salt Spring until he was discovered by someone who had once heard him give a lec-

ture. After that he was approached by an islander who asked him to do some hybridizing for the North American Gladiolus Council.

Barker is still as much involved in hybridizing as he ever was.

One of Barker's biggest show prize-winners is a striking smoky, rose and white glad called *Ganjeese*, which he put on the market in 1986.

Barker entered four different baskets of *Ganjeese* at shows in August this year and won prizes for all of them.

Naming his creations is part of the pleasure derived from developing new cultivars.

Ruth says when a seedling has bloomed for the first time they will bring it into the house, sit down for a break together and come up with a name for it. "You have to think about what to call it for a while, and then suddenly out of the blue a word comes that is just right for the flower," says Barker.

He says with determination: "What I'm after now is a ruffled green."

An appreciation of beauty is his motivation for all of the effort involved in growing, breeding and caring for the bulbs and flowers.

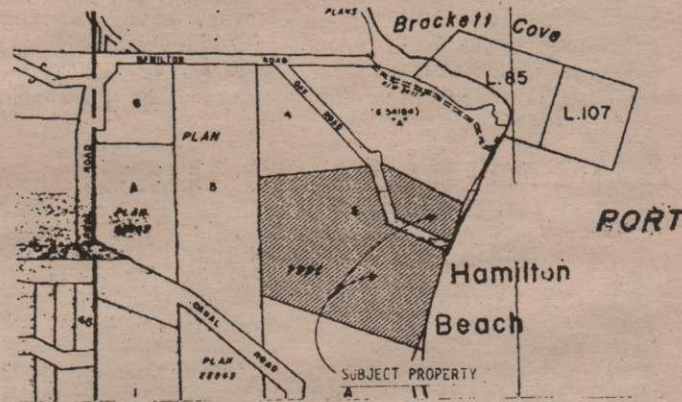
"I enjoy seeing them here on the table like this," Barker says gesturing to a vase full of glads. "It's a lot of beauty other people don't have a chance to see."

Funds distributed

Money will help endeavours on the Gulf Islands compliments of the Capital Regional District's grants-in-aid program.

CRD director for the Outer Gulf Islands Vern Roddick received approval to hand out \$50,200 through the grants-in-aid fund. Julia Atkins has cheques worth \$15,500 for Salt Spring.

Roddick arranged grants of \$15,000 each for the Fire Societies of North and South Galiano Island. The Health Care Society of that island will get \$10,000, while the transportation committee has \$200 for expenses.

On Pender Island, the Recycling Society will receive \$3,000 and the Lions Club, \$2,000. Emergency Ser-

vices for Pender will get \$1,900.

In addition, the emergency Communications and the Neighbourhood House on Mayne Island will each receive a grant of \$1,000 while the Trincomali Property Owners Association will have \$1,000 to spend.

On Salt Spring, the Beaver Point Hall folks will continue renovations to the old facility at the south end of the island with the second instalment of \$10,000 from a Windfall grant totalling \$30,000.

The Mary Hawkins Library receives \$5,000 to help buy books and the Handicap Society has \$500 to continue the advocacy work.

Atkins also announced a grant of \$120,000 to the Art Centre society to help cover costs incurred to date.

All-candidates meetings

Salt Spring Island's Community Planning Association will sponsor two all-candidates meetings prior to the November 17 elections.

Candidates vying for the five school board positions will speak at a public meeting on Thursday, November 8.

Claire Nutting will moderate the event.

Islands Trust candidates will par-

ticipate at a meeting moderated by Gordon Sloan on Friday, November 9.

Both meetings will start at 7:30 p.m. in the Activity Centre at Salt Spring Elementary.

The CPA's agenda does not include sponsorship of an all-candidates meeting for those vying for the position of Capital Regional Director.

Offering marks reunion

In the spring of 1945 when the war in Europe ended, a staff sergeant of the postal corps guided a group of 21 soldiers back towards England on the way home.

They stopped in the small Dutch city of Haaksbergen just across the border from Germany and arranged to obtain billets.

The staff sergeant stayed with a family named Odink and in that family, a seven-year old boy, known as Derik, befriended the sergeant.

Each day, for the three weeks the group of Canadian soldiers stayed in the city, young Derik would wait for the sergeant to return for the evening. The boy waited because he was being taught how to speak English and because the sergeant carried in his pocket a piece of hard candy.

At the end of his stay with the Odink family, the staff sergeant had forged a lasting friendship, with the family and with the boy.

Staff Sergeant Stan Wakelyn arrived back in Vancouver by January of 1946. Over the years, he continued to write to the family. He sent them parcels of food and often included leather soles for shoes which were in short supply in Europe at that time.

In 1951, Wakelyn, who worked for the CPR, moved to Port Coquitlam and lost contact with the family.

Time passed and Wakelyn retired to Salt Spring. This spring, as he watched evening television, the telephone rang and when he answered, the flood of memories of those three weeks in the spring of 1945 poured across the line.

Derik Odink, now a 52-year-old businessman had come to Canada on business. He was in Quebec and had met a fellow businessman from Vancouver. The West Coast businessman agreed to try to track Wakelyn for the visitor.

The next day, using the information from his fellow businessman, Odink phoned. He had to return to Holland but he invited Wakelyn to visit.

In the summer, Wakelyn began the trip into memories.

And so he arrived at Maastricht with no clothes except what he had been wearing. He also wore a yellow flower to help the Dutch businessman identify him at the airport.

There, at the airport, the two men met again after 45 years. Wakelyn offered his hand. In his fist he held a piece of hard candy.

The gesture brought on the tears.

He shakes his head in bewildered wonder. "He spent all those years trying to get me."

As the saying goes: what goes 'round, comes 'round. One wonders in amazement as time flees, at being hooked on the horns of a quandary which must have affected adults who survived our young antics in the '50s and '60s.

As Robert Zimmerman was wont to sing: "Something's happening here and you don't know what it is, do you Mr. Jones."

In the '50s, we rebels cared not a hoot what the world thought. Our attitude stated bluntly: take us as we are, this is as good as it gets. We didn't want to change the world, we merely wanted the world to accept us.

Into the '60s, the situation called for more dramatic action. We protested segregation, social conditions and the Vietnam fiasco. We continued to do our own thing. Part of that experience rested with marijuana and such interesting chemicals as LSD. Alcohol, of course, played its part.

Toward the end of that decade of flower power, Lighthouse played a farewell concert in Nathan Phillips Square in Toronto. We showed up, 50,000 of us, to enjoy the day, the music and the experience.

Didn't agree with the law

Before the concert started, an individual sat isolated by himself near the centre of the square. He rolled a joint and began to smoke it. The police, of course, moved in and tried to arrest him.

Tried but did not succeed because very quickly they were surrounded by at least 1,000 indignant people. We didn't agree with the law which stated use of marijuana was illegal. And while we didn't agree with the law, we disagreed with the blatant way the individual invited the police to arrest him.

Granted, as the concert unfolded and the air turned aromatic, smoking a proffered joint was acceptable. After all, would they arrest all 50,000 of us?

A moot point to remember in this affair is that we, the seekers, were into our 20s and long past the teen years.

No older than 15

Now, however, the emphasis shifts.

Last Friday evening, three young fellows sat on the sidewalk in Ganges. They each rolled a cigarette with heavy concentration on the task as if creation of the cigarette would bring profound meaning into their lives.

The ingredients of the cigarette was tobacco.

Shortly after, a nubile young girl approached and one of the youths asked for a manufactured cigarette. He squeezed tobacco from the end of it and tried to drop a piece of hashish into the tube. It fell to the ground and he got down on his knees to try to recover the small piece.

Sunday, at the Fall Fair, another group of youths bragged of a party the previous evening. Beer, of course, was the staple of the party but LSD was also readily available.

The moot point to remember in these two occurrences is that the participants were teens, no older than 15 at the most.

Re-inventing the wheel

Something is happening here and its an ominous shift in emphasis.

How does one reconcile youthful rebellion of the '50s and '60s when, early on, the drug of choice came from a liquor bottle? How does one reconcile the use, in the '60s, of marijuana in the cause of ending the war?

Do we watch silently, knowing that anything said will be perceived as interference in youthful quest for maturity?

For many, many years, the call has echoed for a teen drop-in centre. A place where teens can do their thing, where they would be in charge and success or failure depended upon themselves.

Nothing happens.

Teens still gather in the village centre. Teens still find trouble.

One wonders why each generation must re-invent the wheel.

As Mr. Zimmerman also said, "The answer my friend is blowing in the wind, the answer is blowing in the wind."

Meditation group adds session

Salt Spring Island's Christian meditation group is expanding its activities.

The group began meeting on Monday afternoons several months ago, but increased interest has caused members to add a second weekly session on Thursday evenings starting at 7:30 p.m.

The practice of Christian meditation originated in the 4th Century A.D. and was revived more recently in Canada by the late Dom John Main. Main was a Benedictine monk who founded the Benedictine Priory in Montreal in 1976.

In one of Main's books, he says:

"In Meditation our stillness, silence, is not a state of mere passivity, but a state of full openness, full wakefulness to the wonder of our own being, full openness to the wonder of God, the author and the sustainer of our being, and a full awareness that we are at one with God."

One of the organizers of the Salt Spring group is Margaret Haines. She says "Christian meditation has become quite amazingly popular all of a sudden."

Haines was raised in the Christian tradition and became a Zen student as an adult. The emergence of Main's meditation movement made it possible to combine her experiences and return to her Christian "roots."

"Anyone interested in getting closer to their centre might find it helpful," she says.

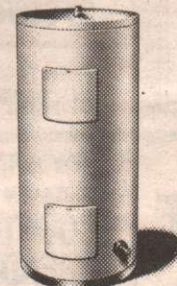

UNICEF official Wah Wong meets with island director

Lured by Salt Spring's recent media attention, UNICEF official Dr. Wah Wong visited the island recently after meeting with his organization's regional volunteers in Duncan.

While on the island, he met with local UNICEF coordinator Margaret Haines.

Wong devoted 31 years of his life to active service work in UNICEF, an international non-governmental organization administering aid to Third World countries. He was posted to Thailand, Pakistan, the Philippines and India between 1955 and 1984.

He is currently on the board of directors of UNICEF Canada and a member of the communications committee for UNICEF British Columbia.

One of the topics Wong discussed with volunteers was his last overseas visit to a UNICEF-funded project in north-east Thailand. He was in that country as part of a Canadian International Development Agency (CIDA) evaluation team earlier this year.

UNICEF had introduced an integrated program in 600 villages six years ago. Wong told *Driftwood* he was pleased with what they discovered.

The project addressed four problem areas — water supply, latrine use, nutrition and women's income.

Women's committees were formed in the villages and seed money provided by UNICEF for income-generating ventures. The women grew vegetables, bought livestock to raise and sell and had silkworms produce silk thread for weaving.

Most families in the villages now have clean water, latrines separate from their homes and child malnutrition is almost non-existent, says Wong.

UNICEF's experience is that integrated programs implemented in smaller areas worked better than trying to ameliorate one problem in a whole country.

"We had to accept that you can't do everything for everyone," says Wong.

He notes the importance of bringing positive reports to UNICEF volunteers. "When you work in an organization like this, you need to have it validated and know where the money you raise is going."

UNICEF is a non-political and non-religious organization and the current chair of a lobby group of

several Third World aid agencies. About 75 per cent of its funding comes from government sources and the rest is raised through fund-raising campaigns.

Wong says Canada raises more money for UNICEF than any other participating country. Forty thousand volunteers across the country make this possible, he says.

The sale of UNICEF cards and a program where children collect donations while "trick or treating" on Hallowe'en are the agency's two major fund-raising events.

Local UNICEF coordinator Margaret Haines is currently one of three vice-chairmen of the agency's provincial committee. Haines can provide information on UNICEF and its activities by calling her at 537-4789. She could also use more volunteers for local UNICEF work.

"It's a very small world now," says Wong. "What happens in one part certainly affects all of us."



Kites and power lines a bad mix

B.C. Hydro safety officials are reissuing the age-old warning: don't fly kites or model airplanes near power lines.

Even brushing a kite or model airplane control line against a hydro power line can cause electrocution, says Hydro's manager of Corporate Safety, Tom Bailey.

"Remind children to stay clear of power lines every time they head out," he says, "and check that the kite lines are dry." String becomes a better conductor when wet.

Bailey says parents should stress to children the importance of leaving a kite or model airplane alone if it does entangle in a pole or power line. Removing it is a job for a trained lineman with the experience necessary to work near high-voltage electrical equipment.

All overhead wires should be avoided, says Bailey. Some people believe that wooden poles carry only telephone wires but most of them also carry high voltage power lines.

Later lived in Victoria while being employed for three years with B.C.F.P. at Port Renfrew.

In the summer of 1977, took a three month tour of Europe and Great Britain. Upon his return was employed at the Institute of Ocean Sciences at Pat Bay, until his demise. It was an occupation that privileged him to build a three-quarter Spitfire. He was also instrumental in the forming of the Sidney Aviation Museum, where he has donated all his aviation possessions. Donations are being gratefully received at the Museum. A plaque will be unveiled in his memory, during which time his ashes will be flown from a plane — the high untrespassed sanctity of space. 



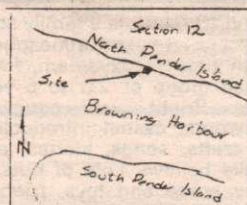

CAPITAL REGIONAL DISTRICT

Pursuant to Section 817.1 of the Municipal Act, the following text of Bylaw No. 1851, cited as "Capital Regional District Clean Air Bylaw No. 1, 1990", is hereby published as at third reading and prior to submission to the Ministry of Health.

A BYLAW TO REGULATE THE CONTAMINATION OF THE ENVIRONMENT BY TOBACCO SMOKE

A summary of the bylaw is provided below:

I. REASONS FOR CLEAN AIR BYLAW

There is increasing medical evidence that Environmental Tobacco Smoke (E.T.S.), second hand smoke (exhaled) and sidestream smoke (smoke from idling cigarettes, cigars and pipes) is harmful to the health of those who are involuntarily exposed. Environmental Tobacco Smoke and sidestream smoke can cause illness, disease or premature death.

II. PURPOSE OF CLEAN AIR BYLAW

- The overall intention of the Clean Air Bylaw is:
- to promote a clean air environment
 - to create comfortable, safe and healthy environments free of tobacco smoke
 - to improve the health of the population in the CRD

III. EFFECTS OF CLEAN AIR BYLAW

A. PROHIBITION

Smoking is prohibited in all parts of all buildings, except for:

1. Private residences; and
2. Designated smoking areas.

B. DESIGNATED SMOKING AREAS

1. A person who operates or carries on a business may decide to make the premises non-smoking or may designate smoking areas.
2. Designated smoking areas are only permitted in the following places and are subject to certain conditions concerning ventilation, size and location:
 - extended care and longterm care facilities
 - restaurants, and
 - licensed premises
 - restaurants and licensed premises in educational institutions
 - bowling alleys, and
 - bingo halls
 - workplaces, but only until January 1st, 1992, at which time workplaces will be completely smoke free.

C. HIGHLIGHTS OF PLACES THAT WILL BE COMPLETELY SMOKE FREE

- personal service establishments, which include, in part:
 - beauty parlours, hairdressers and barber shops
 - health spas, gymnasiums and tanning salons
- public premises, which include, in part:
 - corridors, stairwells, elevators, escalators and public washrooms
 - reception areas and lobbies
 - retail stores, shopping malls, hotels
 - hospitals
 - financial institutions
 - bus shelters and laundromats
 - recreation centres, arenas and video arcades

D. HIGHLIGHTS OF PLACES TO WHICH GREATER RESTRICTIONS WILL NOW APPLY

- restaurants
- licensed premises, which include, in part, bars, taverns, pubs, cocktail lounges, nightclubs and cabarets.
- bingo halls and bowling alleys
- extended and longterm care facilities

DOWN THE YEARS

Thirty Years Ago

Members decided to support the protest of local business people against the method of removal and destruction of the small floats by the federal department of public works. The Chamber also planned to protest the rumoured removal of the Ganges ferry dock.

• A full crowd attended the Chrysanthemum Society and Garden Club Fall Flower Show at the Fulford Community Hall.

• A fleet of Victoria Power Squadron boats visited the Beaver Point area led by a boat carrying three Scottish pipers. A barbecue, children's games and dinghy races for adults and children were also held at the resort of Grace Gillson.

Twenty Years Ago

• Construction of a lacrosse box commenced on the Ganges school grounds. Geoff Howland initiated the project and was aided by several volunteers.

• A reunion of the Maxwell family was held on Salt Spring Island. The first Maxwell came to the island in 1860.

Fifteen Years Ago

• The Islands Trust's newly formed policy was published in a 14 page manuscript.

• An estimated 700 eligible voters on Salt Spring Island and 600 from the Outer Islands were suspected missing from the voter's list for the November CRD election. Nearly 4,000 voters living in unorganized territory in the Capital Regional District were thought to be excluded.

• Regional Director George Heinekey reported that a sewer for Ganges was still under investigation by the regional engineering department.

Ten Years Ago

• School buses were being considered for use in a public transportation system. Gulf Islands School Board chairman Ivan Mouat said he would favour any change which might relieve the board of the responsibility for transportation.

• Six southern Gulf Island trustees declared their candidacy for re-election in the November Trust vote. Saturna's John Gaines, North Pender's Emile Leblanc and Gordon Wallace, Joan Noble and Bill Norton of South Pender, and Jim Money from Saturna.

• A California resident sent a \$100 cheque to *Driftwood* asking the paper to administer a goat cheese contest. The writer said "Salt Spring goats don't seem to be as well known as they should be."

Five Years Ago

• The Salt Spring Transportation Committee obtained agreement from the B.C. Ferry Corporation for a minor change to the Fulford Harbour-Swartz Bay schedule. It was agreed that the last sailing to Fulford would leave at 9:10 p.m. instead of 9 p.m. to allow a better connection for people trying to get to Salt Spring from Tsawwassen.

• Luke Harrison resigned his position as Salt Spring Island Trustee. He

• A committee studying problems at Centennial Park recommended charges for the use of Saturday Market and mid-week vending space. It was suggested that \$2 be charged for a space about the same size as a car parking space, with an additional \$8 charge for a second space. The committee further recommended that farmers have

priority for space up to 9 a.m. in a delineated area.

• A fish and wildlife branch official said the aeration system in St. Mary Lake was installed primarily to improve fishing, not water quality. Shawn Hay told *Driftwood* that the system sets up a current bringing oxygen to all parts of the lake, thus improving the habitat for fish.

DENTAL SPECIALISTS

To practise general dentistry in British Columbia, students are required to complete four years of intensive education at a dental school after taking three to four years of sciences at a college or university. However, there are still circumstances where extra knowledge, skill and training are needed to treat particular dental problems and hence the rise of the dental specialist.

Dental specialists require an additional two to three years of schooling in their chosen field. Your need for a specialist will depend on the complexity of the dental problem and your dentist, since general dental practitioners treat many of the same problems as specialists. However, while the general practitioner is familiar with all facets of dentistry, the specialist has the skills and instrumentation to better care for non-routine situations.

The following is a list of some of the dental specialists, for your information:

Orthodontists: Correct crowding of the teeth which affect a person's bite; sometimes alter the size and relationship of the jaws.

Periodontists: Treat diseases of the gums and bone supporting the teeth (often through surgery).

Oral and Maxillofacial Surgeons: Perform surgery on the teeth and jaws, including extraction of troublesome wisdom teeth, and frequently treat fractured jaws caused by accidents. Oral surgeons receive additional training in sedation and general anesthetic techniques.

Endodontists: Treat root canals, including procedures that involve surgically removing the end of the root of a tooth when required.

Prosthodontists: Specialize in replacing lost teeth with bridges, partial dentures or full dentures. They may also construct crowns for badly damaged teeth. Some prosthodontists now place dental implants, working in conjunction with other specialists.

Pedodontists: Provide dentistry for children, especially in cases of serious dental problems, or when there are patient management or behavioural problems.

Although the majority of dental treatment can be handled routinely by a general dentist, it's nice to know that there is help available in the cases where it's really needed.
