

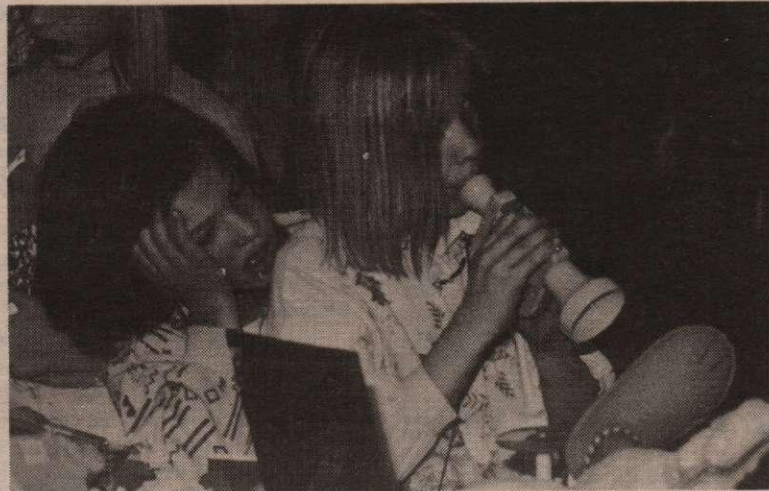

## Equestrian team in national final

A winning team from Salt Spring is preparing for the national spotlight in the equestrian field.

Meg Coombes, 17, riding coach Lynn Denton and Denton Farms' 11-year-old gelding Tory Hill, will be travelling to Toronto where Meg will be one of four western Canadian competitors in the Royal Winter Fair national equestrian championships on November 9. Four finalists from eastern Canada will round out the slate of competitors.

Coombes earned the right to compete at the national level by placing second in the Canadian Equestrian Team's Western Equitation Championship at the Western Regional Finals held October 5 to 7 in Langley.

The competition in Langley was vigorous. Coombes rode Tory Hill in complex flatwork, gymnastics and jumping classes. Judged as one of the top four riders in those categories, she then had to ride a set course four times - once on Tory Hill and the other times on three qualifying horses she had never ridden before.

Based on her performance in this final phase of the competition, Coombes was awarded second place. The first place winner was a 21-year-old rider from Alberta.

Denton says Coombes' riding instincts and adaptability came through in the winning round.

"She has the ability to ride anything I put her on."

Coombes was also not riding the horse she is most experienced with. Her own mare Karmen began exhibiting signs of soreness prior to the Langley event.

Earning the opportunity to compete in the national competition is the realization of a dream for Coombes and Denton. They entered the Western Regional Finals believing it would be a good learning experience and "with no expectations," says Coombes.

Because the competition took place relatively close to Salt Spring, they felt they had nothing to lose, says Denton.

Coombes has spent nine years of her life on the path to a once distant goal. She began taking riding lessons from Denton when she was eight-

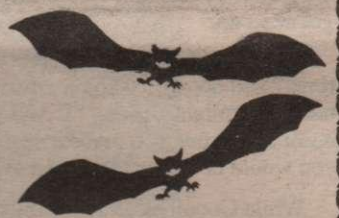

## New AIDS policy adopted

Gulf Islands school trustees recently adopted a policy procedure for dealing with students and employees who have been diagnosed as being infected with HTLV-III virus, or Acquired Immuno-Deficiency Syndrome, (AIDS).

The procedure is in place, not because there has been a reported case of AIDS in the Gulf Islands schools, but to be prepared.

Should a doctor inform the school district of the presence of AIDS — be it in a student or an employee — an assessment team will be formed to examine the case in detail.

The team, chaired by the superintendent of schools and including a district medical official, the individual's doctor, the parents or guardians as well as the principal of the school, will follow the most recent information and recommendations on the matter.

The team will weigh the danger to the health of others as well as the appropriate conditions under which employment, in the case of the employee, or education, in the case of a student, will be continued.

When the team has reached a conclusion on the case, it will report to

the school board.

All discussions of the matter at the assessment team and the school board level will be confidential.

The board will act on the recommendations of the team. If the child has to be removed from school, the school board will act under provisions of Section 109 of the School Act.

Under that section the school board is responsible for protecting children from exposure to communicable diseases.

Depending upon the recommendations of the assessment team, acting under advice from the district medical health officer, the child will be able to return to classes, be in partial isolation within the school or be confined to home study with a home visiting teacher.

years old and has trained and competed regularly since then.

Denton said, "She has been the keenest kid I've ever taught on the island. She works for everything."

"She motivates herself really well. This is all self-motivation on her part. It's really lovely for a trainer to work with," she adds.

Coombes went to 10 equestrian shows in B.C. and Washington State this year. She says learning from other riders is a benefit of participating.

"Watching them helps you get a mental image of what you want to look like."

Coombes doesn't expect the pressure of the high-level competition to be a problem for her. "I don't seem to get nervous or anything because you think about everything and analyze it so you don't have time to get nervous."

She plans "to take each class at a time," and not worry about any mistakes she might make. "If you got upset every time you made a mistake you would be devastated," she says.

While Coombes and Denton will fly to Toronto in early November, Tory Hill will be trucked to the city lights. Denton says the horses often need several days to recover after such a long trip and perform better if they are comfortable in their new surroundings.

The Canadian Equestrian Team provides funding for the transporting of horses from Vancouver to the Royal Winter Fair, but Coombes will be paying for all other expenses. These include airfare, accommodation and meals for herself and Denton, insurance, shoeing and boarding costs for Tory Hill and competition entrance fees. Denton will be waiving all coaching fees related to the event. She says the required financial output is extremely high and donations would be appreciated.

Coombes and Denton say this opportunity would not have been possible without the support of both their families. Coombes also says her school teachers have been helpful by accommodating her competition schedule.

The Grade 12 GISS student plans to go on to university after she graduates, while continuing to pursue her love for riding. If possible she would like to be a member of the Canadian Equestrian Team.

Being a national finalist brings her closer to that goal. Denton says Coombes is well-known in B.C. and Alberta, and her Ontario debut will obviously increase her exposure.

Coombes will be in Toronto without a band of supporters the eastern competitors could muster. In lieu of a local presence at the Royal Winter Fair, Denton is hoping for "positive vibrations from Salt Spring on November 9."

Present PRC chairman Kelly Booth says "a wide range of representation" encompassing a balance of interests is desired on the board.

Salt Spring's CRD director will make the appointments prior to January of 1991.

## If CRD bylaws are ignored wallets could be lightened

Ignoring certain Capital Regional District bylaws could cost money.

CRD directors recently adopted a bylaw setting out penalties for bylaw infractions. The board also named individuals who have authority to write tickets covering those infractions.

Geoff Pearce is the manager of municipal services for the CRD. Operating under him is Miles Drew as chief bylaw enforcement officer, Michael Tovey as animal control officer and Brian Anderson as the chief building inspector.

Drew, along with Wilf Marquis and Kathy Haynes investigate complaints about bylaws being ignored anywhere in the district including the Gulf Islands. The officers can be reached at 478-0624.

Assistant animal control officers operate from most of the Gulf Islands. Don Grant works on Mayne while Howard Byron covers Salt Spring and Gerald Pare is animal

control on Pender Island. Bob Forde holds the position on Galiano.

Building Inspection for Salt Spring is handled by Dick Stubbes. Wayne Schoenenberger carries out the job on the Outer Gulf Islands.

A bylaw enforcement officer would have to visit the Gulf Islands to check on complaints under the *Un-sightly Premises Bylaw*. Infractions under that bylaw covers unsightly premises, \$200 fine; failure to remove discarded material, allowing unwholesome material to collect on a property and depositing glass or rubbish in open places. Each of the last three infractions carries a penalty of \$100 in fines.

The building inspector checks provisions of the building regulation bylaw. Infractions such as building without a permit, occupying without a permit or failure to obey a stop work or demolition order each carry a \$100 fine. Working contrary to approved

plans and altering, removing or defacing a posted notice cost \$50.

The animal control bylaw, for the most part, covers dogs. If an owner doesn't buy a licence, the fine could be \$100 while not displaying the tag on the dog costs \$25. If the dog is running at large, the owner faces a possible \$100 fine while a vicious dog must be kept muzzled and on a leash to avoid a similar fine.

If the dog is a bitch, it must be confined when in heat. The fine for ignoring that provision has been set at \$75. Permitting a dog on a prohibited beach carries a penalty of \$50.

The fine for a noisy animal is \$100 while if the animal is not kept healthy or if the pen is not clean and sanitary, the owner faces fines of \$100 on either count.

Mayne, the Penders and Salt Spring each have noise bylaws. The RCMP or the bylaw enforcement officers investigate allegations under those restrictions.

On Salt Spring the bylaw covers such irritants as noisy disturbances, loud electronic equipment, unmuffled engines or vehicles. Mayne and Pender noise bylaws add truck loading as well as construction disturbances in quiet hours.

Each of the possible offences on the islands carries a \$100 fine.

### Schools cannot ignore copyright laws

Gulf Islands school trustees have said no to a request to copy audio tapes.

The trustees reaffirmed a district policy regarding pirating of audio or video tapes as well as computer programs.

The new policy states simply: "It is the intent of the Gulf Islands School District to adhere to the provisions of the copyright laws."

# Garbage dump tipping fees will increase by 50 per cent

Tipping fees at the Hartland Road garbage dump will be increased to \$45 per tonne as of January 1, 1991 with another increase slated for next spring.

The tipping fee currently sits at \$30 per tonne. The spring increase, recommended at \$20 to bring the fee to \$65 per tonne, will be discussed at Capital Regional District budget time and would go into effect on July 1, 1991.

The increase in fees is slated to help cover costs of certain initiatives to be put in place by the CRD. While some of these initiatives will not affect the Gulf Islands, islanders will benefit from the telephone book recycle program.

The CRD has set a budget of \$31,500 for 1991 to recycle phone books. Containers will be located at the recycling depots for two months,

January and February for collection of the used books.

Community groups and non-profit organizations will be paid 10 cents per book by the CRD which in turn will market them. The region hopes to collect up to 95,000 used books across the district.

The Blue Box program will be expanded to include seven more materials by October 7, 1991. Currently, the program deals with glass, tin cans and newspapers.

By next October, glossy paper and magazines, box board and cardboard, milk cartons, mixed paper, plastics as well as the telephone books will be added to the list of recycled materials.

Certain improvements to the Hartland Road site will also form part of the initiatives. Vents will be installed to deal with methane gas and a chipper will be brought to the site to handle wood waste.

Wood is currently being burned at the dump and the chipper will permit the waste to become part of the proposal for composting at Hartland.

In addition, the CRD intends to offer advice on home composting.

## Highways slice Mobrae's curves in effort to reduce danger

Highways maintenance crews are working to make the infamous and dangerous Mobrae corner safe.

The corner — a curve of more than 90 degrees on the Vesuvius Bay Road — has gained a reputation over the years as a dangerous stretch of highway, particularly in the late evening.

Many vehicles have come to grief on the curve and there has been at least one fatal accident here in recent years.

Victoria Highway Maintenance crews are slicing the high bank on the westerly side of the curve to permit a longer sight line for southbound traffic. A culvert will be buried to accommodate a wider shoulder on that side of the bend in the road.

The work, part of an effort by the maintenance crews to increase safety on some of the worst parts of Salt Spring's road system, will facilitate the rebuilding and widening of Vesuvius Bay Road when the highway renovation program resumes on the island.

Meanwhile, with more room to manoeuvre and better sight-lines, southbound traffic should be safer on the curve.

### The lottery: a tax on fools — Henry Fielding

Sometimes a picture really is worth a thousand words. A few weeks ago the newspapers carried a photograph that said more about the idiocy of lotteries than a hundred-page manifesto from Gamblers Anonymous.

The photo showed a guy lying on the hood of his car which was parked in front of a Florida convenience store. He was staying there all night so that he could be first in line when the store opened in the morning. He intended, the photo caption said, to spend his last \$800 on lottery tickets.

It was part of the latest outbreak of Lottomania which occurred in Florida last month. The top prize in the state lottery was worth over \$100 million, and suddenly people were buying ten, fifteen tickets at a time. Some hopefuls spent their rent money. Others arranged bank loans.

Just think of the sub-human level of logic. Some of these folks wouldn't have bothered to buy a ticket if the prize had been, say, \$100 million? Florida looked like a shark feeding frenzy. Despite the fact that every ticket sold increased the odds against winning, the lineups of hopefuls stretched for blocks.

### Happy about six hours a week

It's a strange addiction, Lottomania. Some people live for their weekly fix. I know a lady who lays out twenty bucks every Thursday morning at the corner store. All Thursday afternoon she's as high as gyrfalcon, humming Broadway tunes and chattering about faraway places.

Then comes Friday morning. She's lost again and she's down in the dumps. Which is where she stays until another Thursday morning rolls around.

I figure she's happy for about six hours a week. Hell, most drugs give a better return than that. I've thought of telling her that I know an easy way she could save a thousand dollars a year, but a little voice tells me she doesn't want to hear it. Lottomanics do love their vice.

### Stress of winning killed him

Even though it can kill them. Bill Curry, a 37-year-old Boston cafeteria worker won \$4 million and change in the Massachusetts lottery last month. He died of a heart attack two weeks later. His sister-in-law said Curry's health began to go downhill the day he found out he'd won. He was hounded by old acquaintances who suddenly became best friends, by self-appointed financial advisors and strangers seeking money for everything from major surgery to Madagascar tin mines.

"It was the stress of it that killed him," says the sister-in-law. That's the trouble with easy money: in the long run, it's not that easy.

Pauline Glassman knew that. She's a Toronto woman who, ten years ago, was a bag lady sleeping in parks and eating out of restaurant dumpsters, wandering through the alleys and laneways of downtown Toronto.

### Didn't want the money

In 1982 she disappeared and was given up for dead. Then, just a few weeks ago, a private detective found her alive and married, on welfare, in a tiny apartment in a subsidized housing project in Toronto.

At first she denied being Pauline Glassman, but the detective had done his homework. As well he might. The detective was being well paid by a large trust company that urgently wanted to find Pauline Glassman.

To tell her that, due to an inheritance, she was now a millionaire.

But the best part is — Pauline Glassman didn't want the money! She said that the past five years with her new husband had been "the best years of my life" — so wonderful that not only did the prospect of wealth not tempt her, she feared it might ruin all the joy she'd found.

Smart lady. Alas, smooth talkers in charge of the estate convinced her otherwise. Pauline Glassman gave in and is now a

### Whose agenda?

To the Editor:  
Murray Cyprus has recently graced the *Driftwood* with his prose, pleading for the public to support the "right" candidates in upcoming elections, and for zoning that would make it simpler for him to push through his own agenda of growth, development and expansion.

I moved to a lovely little neighbourhood (Kitsilano) in Vancouver in 1983. I bought an old house beside a park and fixed it up.

In 1988 we sold our business (Cosmopolitan Sports), said goodbye to 60 employees, neighbours and friends, and moved to Salt Spring. By the time we left, a girl had been raped in the park, a drunk driver totalled eight cars on our street and the police came a day later, an Asian youth gang grabbed a businessman out of his BMW at a stoplight and stabbed him the 7-11 parking lot around the corner for fun, and over 100 teenagers, several identifying themselves as members of the Ku Klux Klan had a gang war on our lovely little street, smashing many vehicles (including mine), ripping down fences and stair railings and smashing windows. The police stayed a block away and no arrests were made.

Sounds like Detroit doesn't it? But it's only 40 miles away! When I took my car in to ICBC I found out that over 60 per cent of ICBC claims in Vancouver are for vandalism (smashed windows, antennas, paint, and kicked in panels). Of seven heritage-age houses on our side of the street only two were left when we left, the rest of the lots now sprouting huge houses, all selling in \$400,000 range. That lovely little neighbourhood changed dramatically in the same name of growth, development and expansion (and profit and greed).

Salt Spring's population has quadrupled in 15 years, increasing 8.5 per cent in the last year alone.

Cyprus want us to stand back and let a few, including himself, continue to demand the right to upzone, subdivide, develop, and increase the population at this staggering rate, supported by simpler zoning, and right wing candidates who support those who like you vote with their wallets instead of their hearts.

The thousands of people who have moved here moved to a quality of life that they can't find anywhere else, and once here, like myself, will battle to maintain it. Elitist? Not at all. We have already seen what Salt Spring could become — a place of racial tension, of very restless youth, rampant drug abuse, and the huge increases in vandalism that accompany an anomalous populace. A doubling of our population will guarantee a new highway (racetrack) like Long Harbour Road, from Fernwood to Isabella Point and new ferries making it very easy to get on and off Salt Spring, day and night.

With this will also come the complete end of "island life" and the conversion of Salt Spring from a rural farming community to a true suburb of Victoria, and the anonymity that will come with it. We will have to get used to not letting our kids out at night and letting our daughters walk to town by themselves; to locking all our doors and windows, and cars, putting in security systems, and being on edge throughout fire season (more than we already are).

We will have to get used to the

sounds of honking horns, screeching tires, stoplights at Central, and through town, and seeing sexist and drug oriented graffiti on every blank wall. The vandalism we see now is absolutely nothing compared to what will come.

Murray, most people consider that we have good police protection here on the Island. We have one police officer for every 1300 people. In Victoria, it's one per 446. In Vancouver the ratio is one for 380, and for your information, one person out of every 120 in Detroit is a cop. If we are married to Victoria, then we are married to a city of 200,000 and all its problems that require three times as many police officers as we have here.

If you don't want to see this hell in "your" future Murray, then you don't have to, but over half the population of Salt Spring has seen and lived it already in Vancouver, Victoria, Penticton, Kelowna and Toronto — and we don't want to live it any more. That's why I'm here.

I'm not going to vote for Cyprus' two choices — those who want to sacrifice this refuge from hell, through pro-development zoning. I hope Cyprus is very surprised on the morning of November 18.

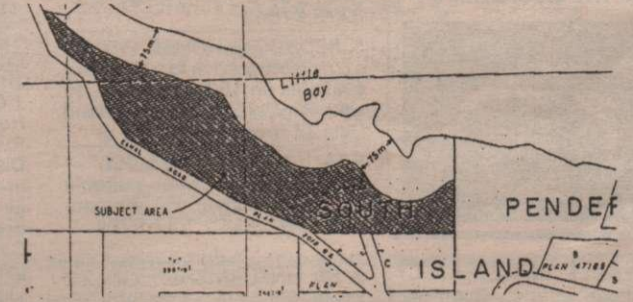

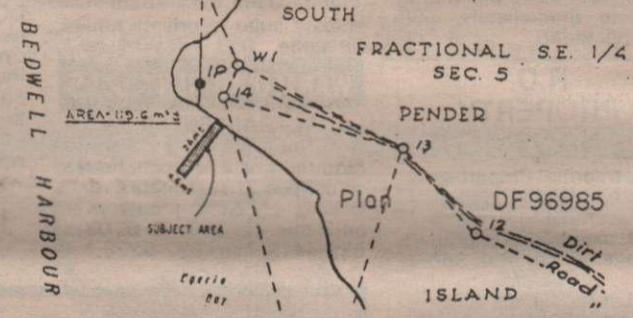
In general terms the intent of the following proposed bylaws is as follows:

1. Proposed South Pender Island Trust Committee Bylaw No. 37, cited as "Zoning Bylaw, South Pender Island, 1980, Amendment Bylaw No. 4, 1990", is a bylaw that changes the zoning classification of that part of the North 1/2 of the SE 1/4 of Section 4, Pender Island, Cowichan District, except Plan 19529, shown on the following sketch, from Rural (R1) to Forest and Wild Land (F).

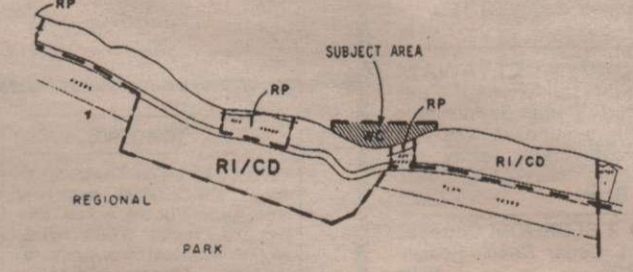


2. Proposed South Pender Island Trust Committee Bylaw No. 41, cited as "South Pender Island Subdivision Bylaw No. 1, 1976, Amendment Bylaw No. 1, 1990", is a bylaw that establishes regulations with respect to boundary adjustment of any parcel of land.

3. Proposed South Pender Island Trust Committee Bylaw No. 42, cited as "Zoning Bylaw, South Pender Island, 1980, Amendment Bylaw No. 5, 1990", is a bylaw that establishes a "Water A—RECREATIONAL ZONE (WA)" and a "Water C—WHARVES ZONE (WC)". The Bylaw describes the permitted uses and buildings prohibited within the respective zones. In addition, the WATER C—WHARVES ZONE prohibits commercial, industrial and residential use. The Bylaw also changes the zoning classification of land, shown on the following sketch, from "Water A" to "Water C—WHARVES".

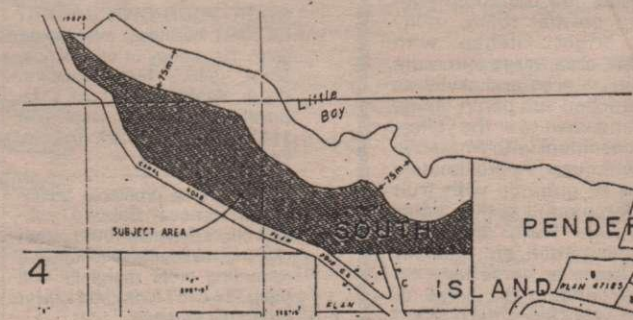


The bylaw also changes the zoning classification of lands shown on the following sketch from "Water C" to "Water A—RECREATIONAL".



4. Proposed South Pender Island Trust Committee Bylaw No. 43, cited as "Zoning Bylaw, South Pender Island, 1980, Amendment Bylaw No. 6, 1990", is a bylaw that defines bed and breakfast and adds to Section 4.6 "Home Occupations", regulations pertaining to bed and breakfast home occupations. The Bylaw permits bed and breakfast use only in the following zones: Rural (R1), Rural 1 Comprehensive Development (R1/CD), Agricultural (A), Resource Protection (RP) and Forest and Wildland (F).

5. Proposed South Pender Island Trust Committee Bylaw No. 44, cited as "South Pender Island Official Community Plan Bylaw No. 28, 1989, Amendment Bylaw No. 1, 1990", is a bylaw that changes the land use designation of that part of the North 1/2 of the South East 1/4 of Section 4, Pender Island, except Plan 19529, shown on the following sketch, from Small Holding Rural Residential (SHR) to Forest (F).



A copy of the proposed bylaws may be inspected at the Islands Trust Office, 1106 Cook Street, Victoria, B.C. between the hours of 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., Monday to Friday inclusive, excluding statutory holidays, commencing Wednesday, October 17, 1990 and up to and including Tuesday, October 30, 1990.

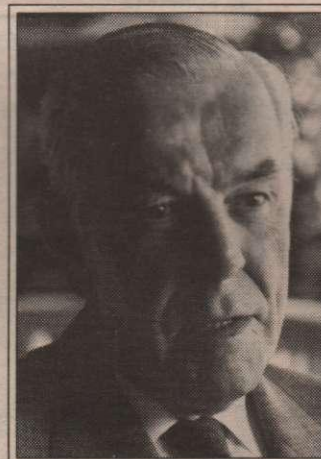
changes the majority of people want and expect. And they need to find out what changes we've already made.

Doesn't the public know what you're doing?

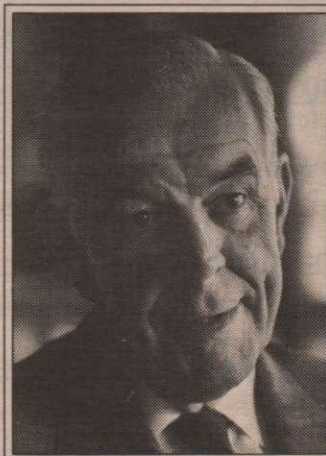

And they need to know.

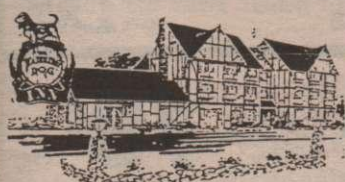

# DOWN THE YEARS

## Thirty Years Ago

• It was considered a crime that Salt Spring school buses had to operate on horse 'n' buggy roads. The school bus route to Beaver Point, driven by Jack Smith, was a case in point. In some places the Beaver Point Road wasn't wide enough to let two wagons pass, Smith said. And on most of the corners, he could not stay in his own lane because he had to swing wide to avoid hitting stumps, trees or telephone poles with the back of the bus.

• Community Tag Day was held on Salt Spring island for the benefit of the Canadian National Institute of the Blind. This community effort was organized by the IODE with nearly all organizations on the island taking part. A total of \$195.50 was collected.

## Twenty-Five Years Ago

• The Salt Spring Island Chamber of Commerce planned to write to the B.C. Ferry Authority requesting it move the Fulford ferry terminal to Isabella Point. They said the travel time would be reduced by as much as 20 minutes and could result in more trips per day if needed.

• Premier W.A.C. Bennett officially opened the new government building and courthouse at Crofton Road on Salt Spring Island. As the premier stepped up to speak, the sun burst from behind a cloud as if to emphasize his early remark that "the island is the finest place in North America for a holiday."

• IODE officials reported that \$505.98 was raised from Community Tag Day supporting the Canadian Institute for the Blind.

## Twenty Years Ago

• Building permits issued in the Gulf Islands during the month of September totalled \$194,426 for 16 permits. Six permits for dwellings were issued on Salt Spring, two on Mayne Island and five on the Penders.

• Laurie Auchterlonie was given a farewell party by the Salt Spring Island highways department. He retired September 1 as foreman of the Pender and Saturna highways crews.

• A restriction on the sale of firecrackers was coming into effect on the Gulf Islands with the onset of Hallowe'en. The exploding type of mini-bombs would not be sold in stores, though the brightly firing and sparkling ones would still be available.

• Concrete had been poured for the new grocery store next to Mouat's Trading Co. but construction was not proceeding. R.M. Toynbee said approval of the designs was holding up the issuance of building permits.

## Fifteen Years Ago

• Salt Spring Island received funding for a full-time ambulance operator from the provincial government. William Simpkins, owner of Bill's Taxi on the island, took a 10-week training course and was appointed to the position. The Lions Club had previously operated the service.

• A proposed recreation complex at Central was to be thrashed out at a public meeting. The proposal called for an expenditure of \$1,350,000 for the construction of an ice rink, swimming pool and other activities at the site acquired earlier by the island Lions Club.

• Volume II bookstore was opened by the Kesters in the old location of Auntie Viv's. Poet and CBC radio contributor Phyllis Webb was to be the operator of the new venture.

• The HMS Ganges, for which the Salt Spring village is named, was retired as an active Royal Navy training vessel.

## Ten Years Ago

• Salt Spring's fire department was urging residents to ensure their house numbers were clearly displayed. Numbers had been available for a year and many homes were still not identifiable by a street address.

• Galiano School was the subject of examination by three government officials. An assistant fire marshal, health inspector and BCTF staff member surveyed the building to determine its present inadequacies. The Galiano School committee hoped their report would aid its request for a new school.

• Gulf Island residents would be asked to vote on a new Holiday Shop-

ping Regulation Act at the November 15 polls. The new act would prohibit the opening of retail businesses in B.C. on Sundays and holidays unless they fell into categories exempted under the act. An area could be exempted from regulations if property owners voted in favour of doing so.

• Despite fears of overdevelopment expressed by some Pender Island residents, the Driftwood Centre's proposed expansion received a nod from the Islands Trust after a public hearing on the matter. Most speakers at the public hearing felt the present facilities at the centre

were inadequate.

• Islands '86, an organization formed to promote tourism to Vancouver Island and the Gulf Islands during Expo year, announced it was broke. The group was asking the provincial government for \$450,000 to keep its operations rolling. \$900,000 raised in lotteries had already been spent.

• David Williams and incumbent Hugh Borsman announced their candidacy for the CRD director position on Salt Spring. Pender's Vern Roddick declined to run again for the Outer Islands CRD position. Kelly J. Scott of North Pender decided to enter the race.
