## Course will reduce guilt

Compassionate child-rearing is the focus of a course being offered in Ganges commencing November 12.

Group facilitator Kathleen Towne will guide parents of children aged two to 10 through five classes revolving around the highly-acclaimed Firestone video series. The course is co-sponsored by the Community Centre and School District 64.

The videos are based on the work of American psychologist Dr. Robert Firestone and follow the discussions of a group of parents over a period of several years. Firestone discovered parents benefit in several ways when they shared their child-rearing experiences.

Towne says benefits included a reduction in guilty feelings about having "unacceptable" emotions toward their children, a more constructive attitude about themselves and their children, and the development of an intuitive sense of what to do in stressful situations with a child.

In his book called *Compassionate Child-rearing*, Firestone looks at the difference between "constructive discipline" and "punishment" and why parents respond to children in the ways they do. He says their own experiences as a child have a strong influence on their behaviour as parents.

As an example, he says "if parents themselves are subjected to inconsistent parenting, to harsh forms of discipline (punishment), to being overprotected, to not being treated with respect as a person, to being lied to and misled about basic facts of life and death and illness, then they will be limited in how much nurturing and constructive discipline they can offer their children, despite their strong desires to provide the best for their children."

Towne says psychologist and writer R.D. Laing has called Firestone's theories "some of the

most interesting and innovative work to come out of North America in the last 20 years." "I think we are lucky to have the series," says Towne.

She holds a Master of Social Work degree and is currently filling in for one of the Community Service Workers at the Community Centre. With broad experience in facilitating workshops and parenting issues, Towne says she would like to be instrumental in improving networking opportunities for parents on Salt Spring and the Outer Gulf Islands.

While the upcoming group is aimed at parents of children aged two-10, Towne says she has allowed for some flexibility in that area. Parents of a newborn, for example, would be welcome. In addition she plans to hold two similar groups for

parents of children aged 10-12 and 12-18 this winter and spring of 1991.

Towne is pleased with what she sees as the local school board's "strong commitment to prevention" of family problems by its co-sponsorship of the courses with the Community Centre.

The fee for the November course is \$40 for one person and \$65 for a couple. Some subsidies are available. A limited childcare service for the five Monday evening classes will be offered if parents have no other resources. Participants must register early if childcare is required.

"Annual income 20 pounds, annual expenditure 19, nineteen six, result happiness. Annual income 20 pounds, annual expenditure 20 pounds ought and six, result misery." — Mr. Micawber.

Many people I know measure their annual happiness with as much gravity as Mr. Micawber, but in avoirdupois, not pounds sterling. The inevitable consequence of this kind of calculation is a fascination with diets.

All diets undertaken with the object of losing weight are a waste of time unless they are accompanied by a regimen of exercise. After the sedentary can stand (or sit) through no more half-starved days, they always make up for lost time by a period of delighted feasting and so return, like rock pools at high tide, to their former dimensions.

The melancholy fact remains that most people who are overweight have enjoyed too much food in exchange for the calories they have not been able to burn off. Like the bank rate, itself a reflection of government gluttony, the numbers on the bathroom scale inevitably rise.

Evasive action

If, however, the spectres of running, playing soccer, or riding a bicycle leave you speechless, then take evasive action.

Be careful never to read the weight charts in doctors' offices. I suspect they are published by insurance companies anyway, and actuaries have a capital, not a medical, interest in keeping you thin.

Don't read the labels on "convenience" foods, unless you want to major in chemistry.

Look at pictures of people painted by Renoir or Reubens, not Picasso.

Watch wrestling on TV instead of the Triathlon.

If you wish to grow thinner, diminish your dinner,

and take to light claret instead of pale ale;

Look down with an utter contempt upon butter,

And never touch bread till it's wasted — or stale.

But it is a mistake to make too much of advice like this; you may finish up losing more than your weight. M.F.K. Fisher, for example, once had a friend who decided to live for five months on a diet of hen mash. "He said he felt fine at the end and was fatter in the purse than he could possibly have been otherwise, and that the only eggs he had laid were on magazine editors' desks." Cluck.

Esoteric diets

Certain esoteric diets currently in vogue are named after famous people. The Pierre Elliot Trudeau Diet consists of a daily serving of supercilious oysters pirouetting on Royal Dalton, and seasoned with just a shrug of tabasco.

Another seafood diet is the Arnold Swartzenegger. It consists of steamed mussels for breakfast, lunch and dinner, accented by a fistful of tough herbs. Conversation is discouraged during this diet.

In one respect diets resemble other bad habits. They try to make you feel guilty. But since I stopped answering the phone when a friend is over, reading American bestsellers, accepting junk mail, blowing up the woodshed making home-brew beer, or listening to politicians, things have been looking up. I just can't be bothered to eat too much any more, either.

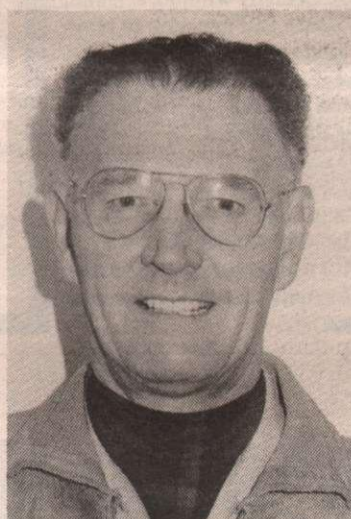

**Victory streak comes to end**

Salt Spring F.C. took to the field last Sunday looking to extend their unbeaten streak to five, but now has a new streak to worry about after a 3-1 loss to Oak Bay.

The defeat means F.C. has failed to win a game at home this season after four attempts, something that not only disappoints their many sup-

porters, but has the players frustrated as well.

Away from home, F.C. has shone with some fine plays and a record of two wins and a loss, but the lads have really struggled at their home field in Ganges, which leads us all to wonder why.

One major problem at home has been that the team starts nervously, creating plays that look scambly and hurried, as though they are under pressure to perform. Last weekend was a classic example of this as the

defence was caught running around, allowing an Oak Bay forward a scoring chance and a desperate tackle from Villadesen to save. Unfortunately, the Oak Bay player took a dive, worthy of high points in any Commonwealth Games, and even more unfortunately the referee felt an infraction was committed which called for a penalty shot and Oak Bays' first goal.

F.C. went into shock, as any team would on a disputed call, and their play became more disjointed than it had been. Oak Bay sensed this and came in for the kill and a second goal.

F.C. looked more organized in the second half. Other than one defensive miscue, they controlled a lot of play, but in the end, even the hails to Advil could not overcome a smart Oak Bay squad.

Although losing, there were some bright spots; the return of Lyle Brown at full-back was a welcome sight after a two-year absence, the strong performance from newcomer Greg Peterson in mid-field and the excellent header by Hengstler from a Webb corner for our only goal.

Unfortunately, the loss left a lot of the players frustrated with their own play as well as the team's, a frustration that should not be there.

F.C. has to take the pressure of winning, especially winning at home, off their backs and get back to playing the game for fun. If the team relaxes and gets back to the basics, fluidity and creativity will re-appear, as well as the victories.

In one sense it is therefore a relief that we take our show back on the road this weekend, with a game against the Athletics at Central Park (2:15 p.m.) and a chance to find that magical formula that disappeared for two games.

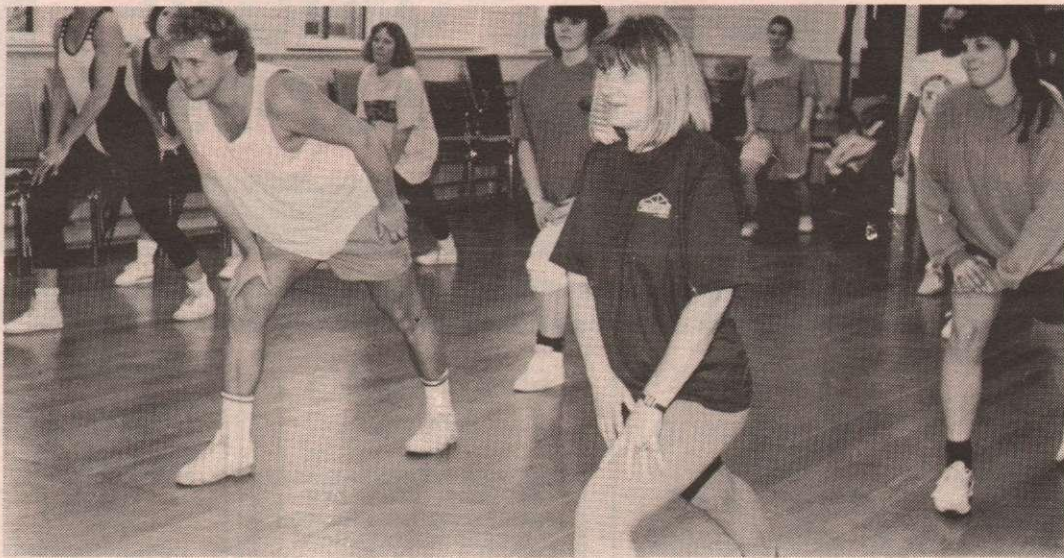

Thanks to years of coaching from the community the Gulf Islands are now on the soccer map.

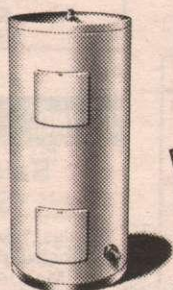

**CAPITAL REGIONAL DISTRICT BYLAW NO. 1855**

**A BYLAW OF THE CAPITAL REGIONAL DISTRICT TO AUTHORIZE THE BORROWING OF ONE HUNDRED NINETY THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$190,000) FOR THE PROVISION OF COMMUNITY USE LAND, FACILITIES & EQUIPMENT FOR NORTH & SOUTH PENDER ISLANDS**

**WHEREAS** the Capital Regional District, by bylaw No. 1854, established a Local Service Area within Electoral Area G (Outer Gulf Islands) for the purpose of providing community use facilities for North and South Pender Islands;

**AND WHEREAS** pursuant to Section 813.1(1) of the Municipal Act, the Regional Board may, by bylaw, borrow money for capital purposes within its powers;

**AND WHEREAS** the Regional Board intends to create the debt hereby authorized for the purpose of acquiring land, designing, constructing and equipping community use facilities;

**AND WHEREAS** it may be deemed desirable to purchase land for the subsequent provision of such facilities;

**AND WHEREAS** the amount of debt intended to be created under this bylaw is a sum not to exceed \$190,000;

**AND WHEREAS** the amount of existing, outstanding debenture debt of the Regional District authorized as at the 31st day of July, 1990:

- (i) Under Sections 813 and 813.1 is \$74,188,854.71; and
- (ii) Under Section 815.1 is \$45,005,176.97;

**AND WHEREAS** the amount of debenture debt that is authorized, but is not issued as at the 31st day of July, 1990:

- (i) Under Sections 813 and 813.1 is \$15,241,400.00; and
- (ii) Under Section 815.1 is \$40,206.00;

**AND WHEREAS** the amount of principal or interest that is, at the date of this Bylaw, in arrears on debt created either under Section 813, 813.1 and 815.1 is nil;

**NOW THEREFORE** the Board of the Capital Regional District in open meeting assembled, enacts as follows:

1. The Regional District is hereby empowered and authorized to undertake and carry out or cause to be carried out the acquisition, design, construction, equipping and maintenance of community use facilities herein before described and to do all things necessary in connection therewith and without limiting the generality of the foregoing:
  - (i) To borrow upon the credit of the Regional District a sum not exceeding \$190,000.
  - (ii) To acquire all such real property, easements, rights-of-way, licenses, rights or authorities as may be requisite or desirable in connection with the provision of the said facilities.
2. The maximum term for which debentures may be issued to secure the debt created by this bylaw is 20 years.
3. The entire net annual cost of providing land, the community use facilities and equipment shall be recovered by the requisition of money under Section 809.1 of the Municipal Act to be collected by a property value tax, to be levied and collected under Section 810.1(1).
4. This Bylaw may be cited as "Pender Islands Community Use Facilities Loan Authorization Bylaw No. 1, 1990".

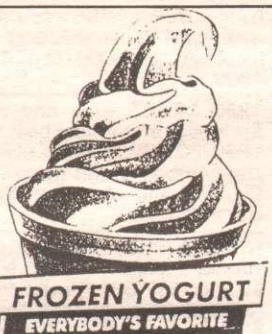

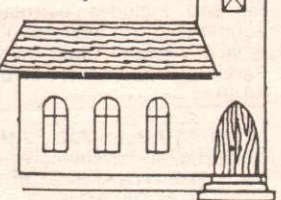
