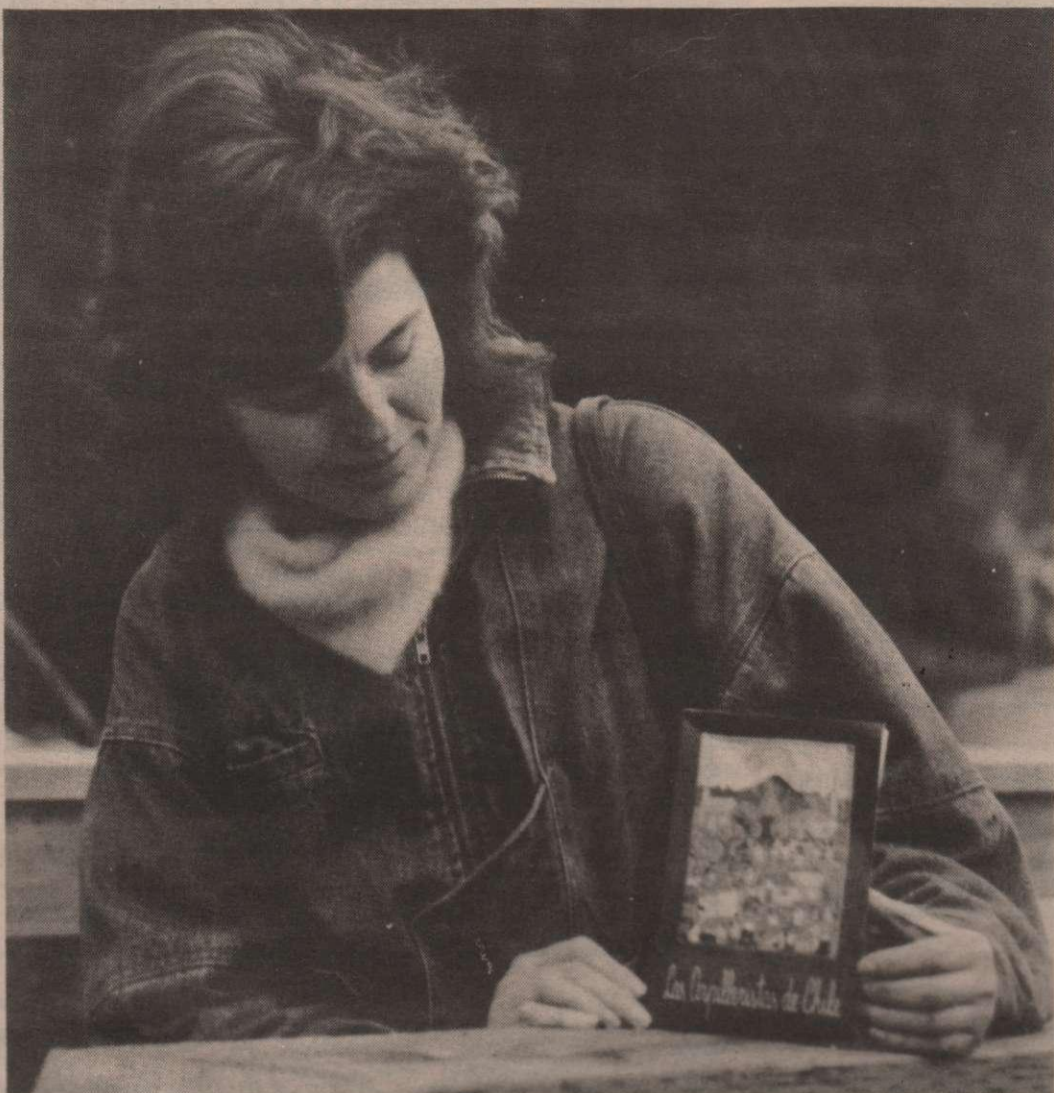

## VOW distributes new calendar

Chilean women renowned for their colourful arpilleras have transformed cloth to paper in creating a calendar diary for 1991.

The calendar is called *Las Arpilleristas de Chile* and includes black and white photographs of arpilleristas — the women who make arpilleras — and colour reproductions of arpilleras themselves. Adjacent to the photographs are bilingual quotes from the women about their experiences, dreams and arpilleras work.

Arpilleristas meet in sewing workshops, providing mutual support in all aspects of their lives. The importance of co-operative efforts to the women is strongly reflected in the calendar diary.

Salt Spring Voice of Women member Willo Stevenson says in light of political oppression and grief experienced in Chile, "(the women) started to realize their power and salvation would come from working together" and they now have "a wonderful support system."

Stevenson emphasizes that just because the Pinochet regime no longer rules in Chile it does not mean the end of poverty and strife for the people of that country.

"While blatant human rights abuses have stopped," she says, "we

sure don't want to give people the idea they don't need support."

As with the arpilleras project started by the island's VOW group five years ago, distribution of the calendar diary is handled by VOW.

Half of the gross proceeds from the diaries' sale go to the women in Chile who produced the book. Forty per cent covers costs, duties and taxes. Salt Spring's VOW has also decided to give 10 per cent to the Community Centre's food bank fund.

VOW's sponsorship of the arpilleras project will be winding down at the end of this year. The exhibition called *Threads of Survival: Chilean Arpilleras of Resistance* — which has toured across Canada for over

two years will soon return to Salt Spring. VOW plans a final exhibition and celebration of the project on the island in January.

Stevenson says VOW committee members felt distributing the arpilleristas' calendar was "a nice way to say thank you to the community and to send off the project."

Donating proceeds to the food bank also makes a connection between less fortunate people in all communities whether they be in Chile or next door to us.

*Las Arpilleristas de Chile* can be purchased at et cetera, through island churches, the food bank auction at Central Hall on December 1 and at Fulford Hall craft fair next weekend.

## S.S. Centre opens building to public

Salt Spring Centre School on Blackburn Road celebrated its new quarters with an open house Sunday afternoon.

Parents, students and interested community members streamed through the building looking at displays of work in progress and facilities that opened in September. The school's two teachers were on hand to give additional information.

The new building was once a schoolhouse located in Alert Bay which Salt Spring Centre member Roland Emery spotted four or five years ago while working in that area. Transforming the building and putting it on a foundation commenced last October.

True to the spirit of the school, students were involved in the plan-

ning process. Grades One-Three teacher Usha Rautenbach says plans were changed after a group of kids took measurements and discovered the space allotted for her office would be too small to accommodate her desk. The office was subsequently removed from the plans.

Students also interviewed construction workers and tradesman and created a journal with photographs of the building's progress.

Salt Spring Centre School is an independent school which receives half of its funding from the ministry of education. Unlike many other private schools, it is not based on specific religious beliefs, is neither a

Waldorf nor Montessori school and is not solely parent-run.

Curriculum guidelines follow those set by the education ministry and students participate in the same field trips and artistic programs as public schools.

The main difference at the school is the mixed age classes (Grades One-Three and Four-Seven) and the interaction of all students in a cooperative family atmosphere. More time is spent learning outside in the natural environment, and responsibilities for activities, problem solving and housekeeping duties are shared by everyone.

Students also meet in the Great Room once a week to discuss problems and school policies and rules with each other and staff.

Margaret Leier is a new teacher at Salt Spring Centre School this year, having moved to the island from Victoria. She points to a display of quilt squares in progress as an example of how all students work together and what can arise from a weekly meeting.

Feeling too much negativity was coming up at their meetings, Leier says "we thought maybe we should be thinking about good things instead." The quilt idea with a theme of "I am happy when . . ." was chosen as an uplifting project giving space to everyone's ideas and creativity.

"There were no limitations except the ones the children imposed on themselves," says Leier. They were allowed to work on their quilt square at home and seek assistance if desired.

She says "I can't believe how

wonderful the people are in sharing with children on this island." In doing a study of extinct animals, children called ecological reserve managers for information, who then came to the school to work with children.

Rautenbach, Leier and parents all say the children have fun while learning at school. "Fun is not something that starts after 4 o'clock," says Leier.

One of Juliette Laing's children has gone to Salt Spring Centre School for two years. She feels the school provided "a more gentle transition from home to school," and "Usha is great," she adds.

Parent Chris Haas has two children in the school. He believes students there "are about one year ahead of where kids in public school are." Haas is also a parent representative on the school's board known as the Ganges Educational Society. He emphasizes the school is fully accredited.

Rautenbach was the school's teacher when it started with 12 pupils in 1983. Classes took place in a room in the Centre's main building.

The new building comfortably accommodates the 30 students currently enrolled. If more room is needed, however, students are working on a solution.

Rautenbach explains that an outside play area and equipment was discussed and the children agreed a sheltered area would best suit their needs and local weather. They took measurements, made a plan and a scale model of the structure. One student dealt with the CRD building inspector's office and a permit was received. They have also helped with

actual construction of the building.

Dispelling any myths that centre school students are "different," Leier says "the children are normal — rambunctious, enchanting and annoying."

# Parcel service offers advice on mailing Christmas gifts

Those sending a holiday gift across town or around the world should pack it carefully and ship early, says United Parcel Service Canada Ltd.

To ensure holiday packages reach their destinations on time, send them no later than December 12.

"It's also important to package gifts well in order to protect them during shipping," says Curt Brown, UPS Region Customer Service Manager.

This year, from the first week in December through December 22, the average delivery volume at UPS worldwide is expected to jump from 12 million packages to a peak of between 20 and 21 million.

UPS will prepare for the extra volume by leasing an additional 10,000 package delivery cars, for a total fleet of nearly 70,000 vehicles; chartering 35 extra airplanes, for a total fleet of nearly 400 planes; and hiring approximately 70,000 seasonal employees.

To ensure your Christmas parcels arrive safely:

- use corrugated cartons in good, rigid condition, with all flaps intact and no punctures, tears, rips or corner damage. Select a carton large enough to allow room for adequate cushioning on all sides of the contents;

- use enough cushioning material inside the carton so that the contents cannot move easily when shaken. Good cushions can be made from popcorn (environmentally friendly), heavy brown grocery bags or newspapers, crumpled and stuffed several inches all the way around the item. Use extra cushioning for fragile items, especially near the corners and sides of the carton;

- to close a carton securely, use a strong tape that is two inches or more in width. The best tapes are pressure sensitive plastic tape, water-activated paper tape at least three inches wide, and water-activated reinforced tape. Masking tape or cellophane tape are *not* strong enough. String and rope are *not* effective closures and may snag on automatic sorting equipment. UPS Canada does not

accept packages secured with string, rope or ribbon;

- when addressing packages, keep these points in mind:

- always include the Postal Code of the receiver with the complete street address. If the complete street address is not available, be sure to provide the receiver's telephone number on the label.

- include the apartment number for all multi-unit dwelling addresses.

- place the delivery label on the top of the carton.

- use only one address label.

Remove or cross out old address labels or markings on a used carton.

- do not place the label over a carton seam or closure, or on top of sealing tape.

- always include a complete return address, including Postal Code and full street address.

- for added protection, place a duplicate label or other delivery information inside the package.

## New halibut regulations introduced

Fishing season for halibut will be longer and safer in 1991 with proposed changes to the quota system.

Federal fisheries will try a two-year trial for halibut quotas moving to individual vessel quotas from current fleet quotas. Vessels will be allowed a set share of annual catches based on past performance as well as vessel size.

This year, halibut season lasted six days and fishermen went out despite the weather and/or condition of their vessel. Many boats were overloaded and men put in long hours without rest to get as many fish as possible.

In addition, a short season resulted in a market glut of halibut with a resultant lowering of landed price.

Quotas for each boat will mean each season will last much longer with more safety on fishing grounds, a better landed price for fish by avoiding market gluts and an expected higher quality product.

Individual quotas came as a result of consultation between fishery officials and fishermen who suggested the method. The system will be monitored closely and an annual

**French francs**

There is something about foreign currency that haunted me for years. It revolved around French francs at the beginning of the second war and again at the war's end.

When I was stationed with the Royal Air Force in France in 1939 we had a special rate of exchange and we received a premium on the sterling we swapped for francs. It didn't take us long to discover that we could multiply our funds by buying sterling at a French bank and selling the sterling through the Naafi system at a profit. I think it was the Naafi that did the exchange, but after half a century I could be out on that.

It went like a dream. We were minting money, in very small doses without raising a finger.

One day we had a stern lecture. Various brass hats accompanied by French bankers showed up at the station to explain that our system of profits was a criminal offence and that if it were to be pursued we would be in more trouble than we could comfortably accommodate.

Most of us could take a hint.

I had no trouble until I left France in a hurry through Nantes aboard the Polish liner, the Sobieski, whose home port was Gdynia. That was 1940, 50 years ago.

On the train from Falmouth to Weston-Super-Mare I lost my wallet. A week or so later it was forwarded to me by the fellow passenger who found it. But by the time the deadline on changing French money into sterling had been left in history. This was a burden, because the going rate by that time was in the vicinity of 400 francs to the pound, whereas the military rate had been 180.

The foreign exchange control board decided that in the face of the evidence that I had lost my wallet they would approve the better rate in my case.

Then came peace. In 1947 I went to France with my late wife and my father to stay with friends I had made during the war. We spent an enjoyable holiday with Andre Rosman, a member of the French Resistance who had rescued a host of Allied airmen brought down in France.

A few weeks after our return to England we were under investigation by the police and the Foreign Exchange Control Board. We had gone to the European continent with French money and travellers' cheques. Why had we, the police asked, brought back more currency than we had left with? And we had done just that.

Such an action was against the law and once again, I was teetering on the beginning of a career in crime. And once again the powers-that-were decided to be lenient in my favour. There were no charges laid.

It was, of course, a technicality, but one that was vigorously enforced where large amounts of money were involved. The small pockets of the casual traveller were subject to the same controls, but few travellers were aware of the restriction and fewer would normally return with cash instead of hoarding their travellers' cheques.

**That slippery disc!**

I slipped a disc the other day. It was while I was in White Rock, climbing steps from the tracks to the highway. A lifelong experience of back troubles has left me unsurprised at the pain of a slipped disc but very pained.

At the weekend I was in the post office lobby in Ganges when I dropped my keys. The only way I could recover them was to kick them to somewhere I had support while I bent down. That I did. As struggled to reach the floor and then to rise again, a fellow pensioner entered the lobby.

"Who called it the *Golden Age*?" she enquired sweetly.

And how would a silver-haired fellow like me know that?

**Important role discussed**

Woodlot owners could play a key role in environmental protection.

That message was given to the annual general meeting of B.C. Federation of Woodlot Association held in Kamloops last weekend by Michael Champagne, parliamentary assistant to the federal minister of forests Frank Oberle.

More than 200 woodlot owners (including Ken Renaud of Salt Spring) from five western provinces gathered at Kamloops. A prime concern to the meeting centred on discussions of the ongoing review of the woodlot licence program being carried out by the provincial forestry ministry.

David Gillespie, of Kamloops, acts as commissioner for the study and he explained what was happening in the review as well as some of the concerns uncovered during visits to various woodlot associations.

Other topics discussed were concerned with production of industrial wood fibre, fencing materials, growing mushrooms, harvesting maple syrup and wild berries.

The two day event featured speakers from both the federal and provincial ministries of forests.

Champagne was greeted with an enthusiastic response when he told the meeting small scale forestry operators held the key to intensive forestry operations and would be key players in environmental protection, community involvement and social stability across Canada.

Following the business discussions of the meeting, woodlot operators went for a field excursion

to visit a woodlot, owned by Geoff Bodman, just north of the city.

In a press release, F.B.C.W.A. president Peter Sanders said, "The

outcome of the meeting was regarded as highly productive, very positive and a significant improvement in the B.C. woodlot program is expected."

# Important Changes to Unemployment Insurance

Below are the highlights of changes to the Unemployment Insurance (UI) Act. These changes will affect most claims that start on or after November 18, 1990.

### ● Qualifying for benefits

After November 18, you will need 10-20 weeks of work within the past year to qualify for regular UI benefits. The exact number of weeks you will need and how long you will be able to collect these benefits will depend on the unemployment rate in your area.

### ● Maternity/ Parental benefits

Parents may be eligible for 15 weeks of maternity benefits (available to the mother) plus 10 weeks of parental benefits (available to either the mother or the father).

Parental benefits are also available in the case of an adoption.

### ● Leaving a job

Individuals who leave their job without "just cause", are fired for misconduct or refuse a suitable job offer, can be penalized by losing from 7 to 12 weeks of benefits and having the amount of benefits reduced.

### ● Working after age 65

If you work after age 65, you may now be eligible for UI. This change will be retroactive to September 23, 1988.
