## Speaker hopes she can help people overcome nightmare

When Elly Danica talks, there is no sense of confusion. No sense of being lost. No shyness. Nothing hidden.

She knows exactly what she is doing — and what comes next.

The nightmare of her early life has given her a sense of direction and purpose. Now, she hopes to help others get in touch with, and work through, their own nightmares.

Danica is the author of *Don't: A Woman's Word* which was published two years ago and focuses on the sexual abuse she suffered as a child at the hands of her father.

(Danica will be reading from her book this Friday night at Mahon Hall, beginning at 8 p.m.)

Danica's father began fondling her when she was four years old. By the time she was nine, it had progressed to pornographic photos taken in the basement of her Moose Jaw home. But the worst abuse occurred when she was 11: a doctor, a lawyer and a judge paid her father to first fondle and then have sexual intercourse with his daughter.

Danica describes her father as a "petty household tyrant" who believed he could do what he wanted with his children and his wife.

On the outside, she says, he appeared to be a normal and charming human being — someone completely

different from the person she knew at home.

A "split personality," she says, is common among men who sexually abuse their children.

Danica's father justified his actions by claiming he was a "sexual pioneer." He said he was training his daughters to be obedient and subservient.

"There is no treatment for those guys. They don't even take responsibility for what they do. Even when they're in jail, they think the only thing they did wrong was get caught."

A six-week reprieve from the

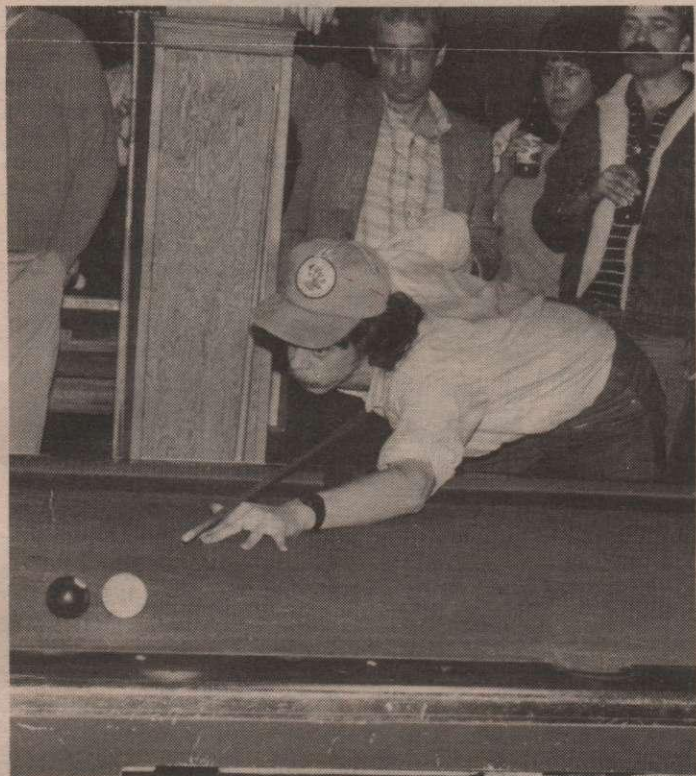
abuse, which took place when Danica was nine, occurred when she contracted hepatitis.

"For that six weeks, it was a real oasis. It meant that for however long I was sick, no one would touch me."

But at the same time, no one asked how a nine-year-old girl could have contracted hepatitis. Nor did anyone ask why a bright girl was withdrawn, depressed and an underachiever at school.

"I was constantly underachieving, but no one asked me what it was like or what was going on around me."

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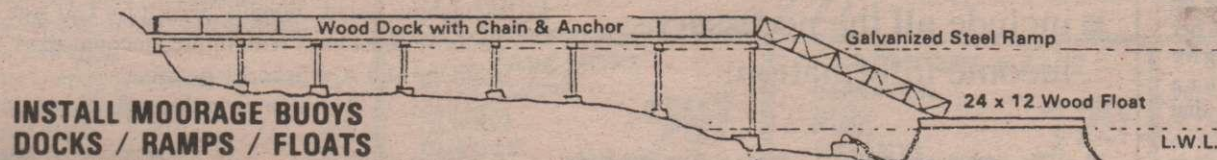

# Getting well is an intense process which will never quit says Danica

Danica says she tried several times to find help, but people either wouldn't believe what was going on, or said her father had certain rights. She once tried to explain the situation to her mother, but was told to accept what was going on.

"When I would try to tell the story, people would tell me to shut up. There is this Christian believe that said I had to do what he wanted.

"I was horrified by what was going on — I knew I didn't like it, I knew that in a moral sense it was wrong, but that was worth beans."

Now she is older (43), Danica has

a better understanding of why her mother failed to stop the abuse.

For one thing, Danica was the oldest of 10 children. "Doing something" may have meant losing the family's only source of income. Danica also suspects her mother was harassed in different, equally horrific, ways.

"I think she was absolutely abused by this man. If she would have tried to do anything, it would have had an impact on everyone."

Finally, at the age of 18, Danica escaped the home and the family by marrying an army lieutenant and erasing that whole period of her life. While it may have disappeared from her conscious memory, it remained in the back of her mind, affecting her feelings about herself and others.

## New government agent fills the local position

Since moving into her new position two months ago, Virginia Bobroske has found her role as Salt Spring Island's new Government Agent a busy one.

And she expects that as the population continues to grow and as more people become familiar with the service, the number of inquiries coming into that office will grow.

"The role of this office has been growing all the time because the size of the community is growing. Once we advertise the range of service this office provides and people realize how much they can do here on the island without having to go to Victoria, this office will become that much busier than it is."

Bobroske took over her new position on December 18, coming here

At the age of 23, unable to cope with her husband and, by then, her son and herself, she left her home and with \$300 in her pocket, moved into the basement of a church near her family in Moose Jaw.

"I had this sense of unfinished business, but I didn't know what it was."

It was there, she started work on a journal which may have eventually saved her life.

Danica did not find the professional help she needed until she was 39 years old — after a series of bad relationships and excessive drinking. She sought help once when she 19, but the psychiatrist told her husband having a child would probably be the best cure.

At 39, however, after years spent living in isolation and selling weaving from her basement home, Danica became seriously ill. She decided it was time to come to terms with her problem.

"I was so transparent that I couldn't be around people because I didn't have a sense of who they were or who I was. I would absorb everything."

Alone, emotionally and physically ill and shut off from the world, Danica returned for counselling for a second time. And this time, she made a commitment to get well.

With the aid of counselling, memories of her childhood came flooding back after having been repressed for more than 20 years.

Now she understands that people only contributed to her craziness by not taking her seriously or by telling her that what was going on — wasn't. She learned to deny reality and had no sense of what was appropriate or inappropriate behaviour.

Most of all, she had learned to hate herself.

Getting well, has been an intense process and it's one, she says, "that will never quit.

"I feel much better. I feel more like a whole human being. But it's a life-long process. (The abuse) affects your practical values and mind set."

Her goal now is to find and help others, who may have suffered the same kind of abuse when they were young. She says the help she can give others, gives meaning and purpose to her life. She is also getting ready to start work on a second book which will focus on where women find their own voices and how they learn to become themselves.

"I have this incredible pressure to do things now because all of those years are gone. I need to find a balancing place where I can think more about it and where I can be happy and content."

And Danica is finally ready to leave the basement of her Moose Jaw home.

"I feel much better. I feel more like a whole human being . . . but I know it's a life-long process."

from Victoria where she worked in the Attorney General's land titles office for the past 12 years.

Bobroske says she saw the government agent's position in Ganges as one that would tie both her professional and personal lives together. She owns land on Galiano Island, which means that working here gives her the opportunity to work close to her home.

The principal role of the government agent is to act as a liaison officer between the community and the government. People can pay a variety of government-related billings at the office — including court and traffic fines — here instead of travelling to Sidney or Victoria.

Other services provided at the office include land title and lien searches, and birth and marriage registrations. It also handles the sale of marriage licences, fishing and hunting licences, and electrical permits.

Bobroske enjoys the fact her new position is more "people oriented," giving her the opportunity to interact with the public.

"The big thing is helping people resolve whatever issues are troubling them. If we can better serve the people in the community, then that is our objective."

Bobroske adds that the government agent's office in Ganges serves all of the Gulf Islands. She hopes to visit those islands in a professional capacity soon.

At this point, she says people on the Outer Gulf Islands can reach her by calling the operator and asking for 2959. She adds she has applied for a zenith line and hopes to have that available soon.

# Letter notes support

Amnesty International (AI) chapters do not generally have direct contact with the prisoners of conscience on whose behalf they work. Members write, telex or fax appeals together with other chapters, and are amply rewarded by bulletins from headquarters indicating such-and-such a prisoner has been released.

There is, however, another category of prisoner — Adopted Prisoners. These are cases of human rights abuses so flagrant that extraordinary efforts are needed. In such cases one or more chapters, usually from widely separated parts of the world, are given a prisoner to "adopt". Then AI members make sure the punishing authorities are frequently reminded that we know what is going on. It can be a very salutary experience for them.

Salt Spring Island's Chapter 72 has had various such prisoners. Lately, its prisoner in the USSR was released from long time detention in one of the notorious psychiatric institutions. The group was overjoyed, and was not disappointed when it heard nothing from the released prisoner — the fact is (or perhaps was, in the case of the USSR) released prisoners are carefully watched.

The local group's most recent prisoner was a young woman (as a matter of prudence, her country and her name will not be given) who was charged with being a member of a Women's Organization, with no record of violence, actual or advocated.

After two years, she was released, almost certainly because of the appeals from the Salt Spring group and another group overseas.

AI members know, however, her release does not mean punishment cannot still be inflicted upon her. She was a teacher, and now cannot teach, but must take whatever menial occupations she can get.

To help her over this difficult period, the local chapter has supported her financially, in a very modest way. The group knows its support has been reaching her because it has received two letters. The second was received a few days ago by Cindy Allen, Salt Spring AI treasurer, together with a picture of the woman's daughter and the gift of a macrame purse, knitted while in prison.

Excerpts from her letter follow:

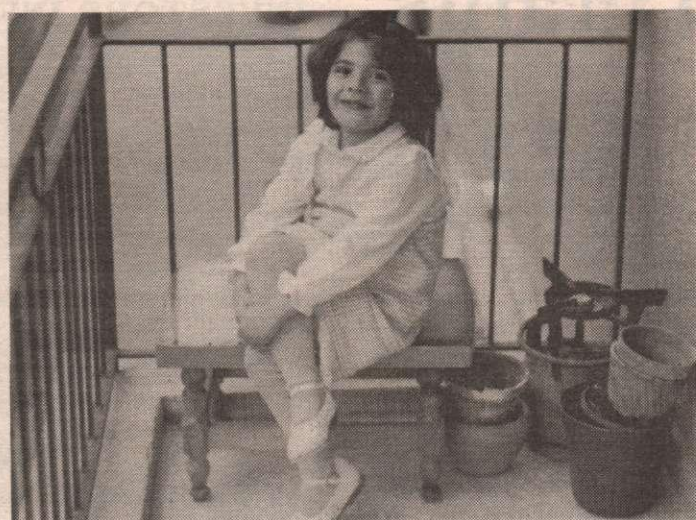
To hear from you is so beautiful. Thank you for your card . . . I and my daughter is fine. My daughter is four and one-half years old now . . . but now she lives with my mother. Because she is more closer to my mother, than me because I was sentenced when my daughter was one year old and I was three she had been three years old. I couldn't see her during that time. My mother had looked after her.

I am divorced when she had been six-months old. My husband couldn't stand my problems. These events happened without my control estranged her to me. Now I'm trying to enclose her.

Thanks for the photographs. Your children look pretty, energetic and healthy. You must be proud of them. This is your right.

Your country is so beautiful. Here we can't breathe fresh air even more in winter days.

# Groups receive CRD grants

The above grants for Salt Spring do not include distribution of any Windfall funds.

Grants-in-aid allows CRD representatives in the non-municipal areas to financially help organizations "contributing to the general interest or advantage of electoral areas."

Up to five cents per \$1,000 taxable assessment can be levied for the grants-in-aid budgets. Groups interested in applying for grants-in-aid should contact the appropriate Gulf Islands CRD director.

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March 1, 1990 will be the last day that contributions can be made to an RRSP to qualify as a write-off against 1989 taxable income. The limit for both 1989 and 1990 is still 20 per cent of earned income to a maximum of \$7,500 for those with a self-directed plan and \$3,500 in a non-contributory pension plan.

Investments that compound on a tax free basis grow magically. Assuming a rate of interest of just over 7 per cent, this year's RRSP contribution will double over this decade. At a more realistic rate of 10 per cent it will double in only 7 years. And the earlier you contribute the more you save! \$7,500 contributed on January 1, 1989 will have already sheltered at least \$900 in income and saved \$300 in tax (assuming a 12 per cent return and a 30 per cent tax rate).

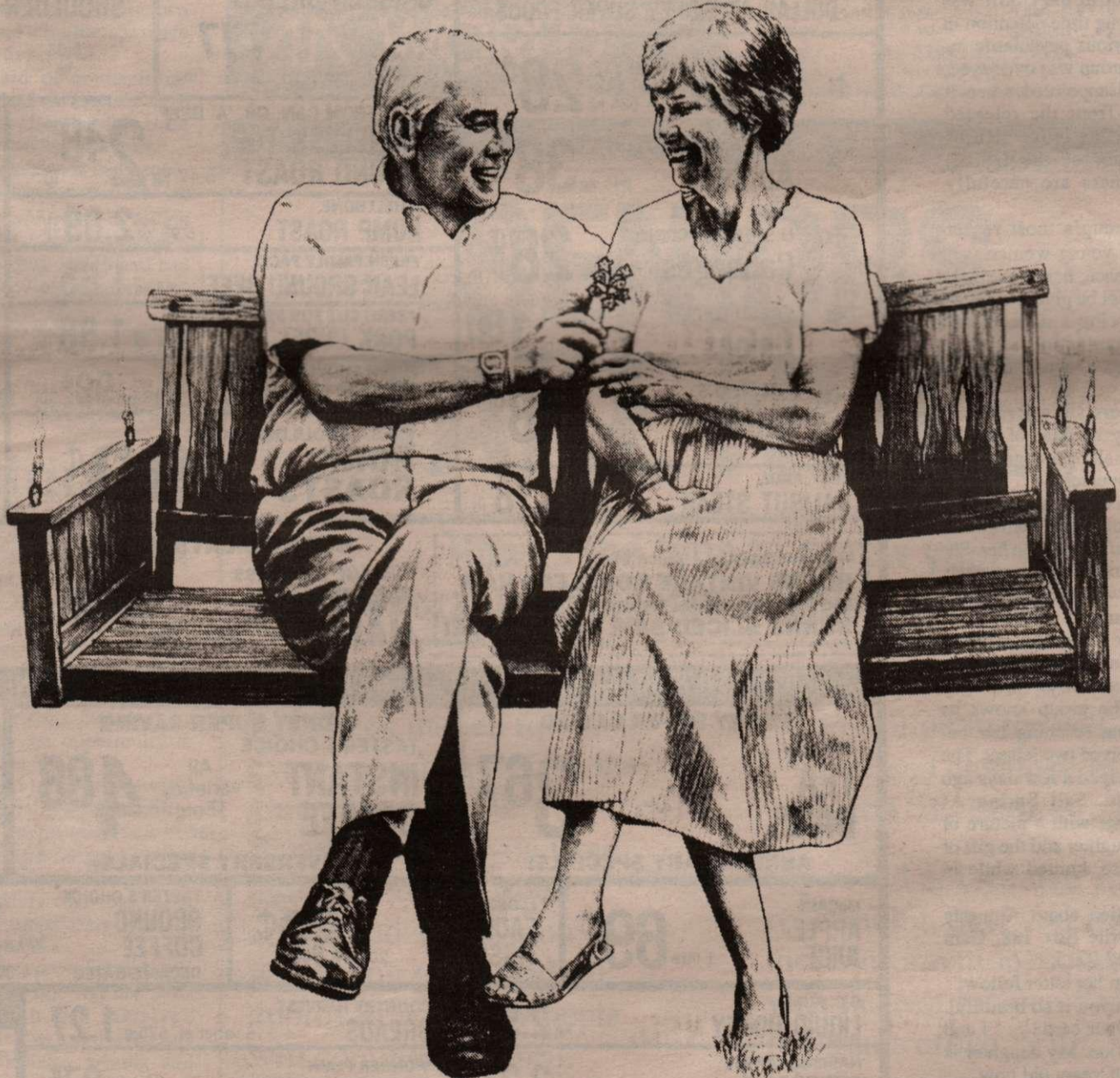
Another good reason for making an RRSP a priority is inflation. Assume it takes \$30,000 per year to support your current lifestyle. In ten years at a 5 per cent rate of inflation, it will take about \$50,000 to provide the same lifestyle.

A balanced portfolio combining the magic of compound interest and the proven long term performance of good equities will provide the growth in your retirement fund necessary to help assure the financial independence required later in life.

So, if you are serious about building for retirement, an RRSP is your first priority. Even if retirement is several decades away, you owe it to yourself to take advantage of the tax man!

## A new ambulance crew chief takes on Salt Spring position

The Ganges ambulance service has a new chief.

Don McDermid and wife Pat, who arrived here recently from MacKenzie, said they are looking forward to life on the island.

"I'm pleased to be on Salt Spring," McDermid said. "It's a pretty good place to be."

Born and raised in Surrey, the new

chief nevertheless served three years with the Canadian Navy on the east coast. There he worked with sonar and as a diver.

McDermid joined the ambulance service in Vancouver nine years ago. He spent two and a half years as unit chief in MacKenzie, a town located 200 kilometres north of Prince George. The crew served a large area

and covered most of it by airplane.

As to why he joined the ambulance service, McDermid noted, "It's an exciting career. You have to be a people person and care. It's not the kind of thing you can do if you're not interested in it."

As he became acquainted with the Salt Spring crew, he explained, he became impressed with it as "an excellent crew."

"They're a well-trained enthusiastic bunch."

In addition to McDermid and Cliff LeBlanc as full-time ambulance attendants, there are 10 islanders serving on a volunteer basis. McDermid said the Salt Spring crew responded to 700 calls last year. He would like to see the volunteer crew expanded.

If islanders don't supply ambulance service, he said, the job doesn't get done. He issued a call to any interested individual to contact him to volunteer for service.

## CWL presents money

The National Council of the Catholic Women's League (CWL) presented three scholarships this year to women from developing countries.

Those women were: Santa Das of Kerala, India; Rose Nayiga of Uganda; and Joyce Walima of Zambia.

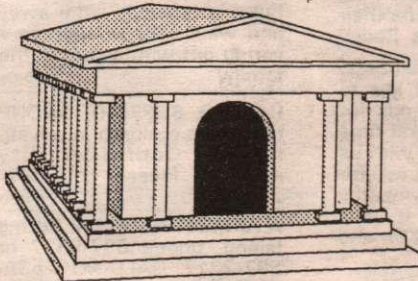
For several years the League has donated \$10,000 annually through donations from local councils (which includes the Salt Spring Island Council) to the Coady International Institute in Nova Scotia.

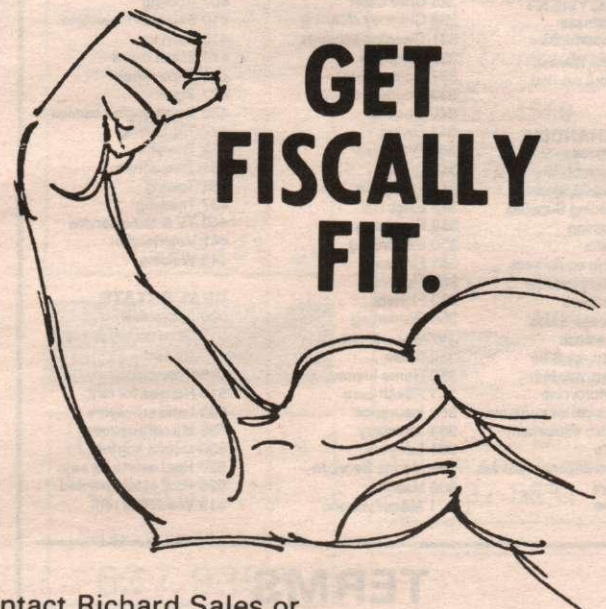

Dismay

To the Editor,  
From time to time I'm annoyed at the ignorance of grammar and spelling (and sheer usage) demonstrated by those who should know better — even teachers. Passing sarcastic remarks to one's companions doesn't really accomplish much, besides reinforcing their opinions of my crustiness. Writing to your paper, which is not guiltless either, may at least get this dismay off my chest for awhile.  
For instance: why do so many spell barbecue with a "Q" — i.e. barbecue? I'll accept the shorthanded "bar-b-q" as a whimsy, but the other is sheer ignorance. Then there's the

"i.e./e.g." syndrome. Many seem to have no idea when to use them — they are different, you know, and not synonymous. What about the use of "lay" instead of "lie" ("lay down")? Then there's the carelessness in spelling technicalities like "chlorofluorocarbons", which elicits a condescending snort from me. Does anyone else notice? Bring the pedantic nigger to the attention of the people concerned? Get any results?  
This sort of thing (and there's a lot of it) arouses my ire and my pessimism. I get an uneasy feeling that people don't care about the language, and an even uneasier one that teachers aren't doing much about it. They can even carelessly mislead the

kids, spelling "led" as "lead", for instance, and resorting to the all too common usage of treating "bacteria" as a singular.  
By the time a child is in high school, (s)he should be able to spell; this is one of the areas that ought to be covered very well at the elementary level. However: too many kids of my acquaintance make shockingly illiterate mistakes, and they can't all be stupid and lazy. So the problem must lie with either the curriculum or the teaching thereof. Which is it? English teachers at G.I.S.S. don't have time to redo what should have been covered before. Teachers of other subjects should be vigilant, however, and point out such errors in

written assignments. I don't think this is done; correct me if I'm wrong.  
I'm reminded that a certain Minister of Education (now elevated to higher responsibilities) got some notoriety by a remark about wanting the students of B.C. to read and write good. With that sort of leadership, I shouldn't really be surprised; but saddened, certainly.

Many intelligent, aware British Columbians have given thanks that they have been born and live in a place of such wealth of nature. They know that one day, our forests of giant cedars might, like the famed "Cedars of Lebanon", be just a memory. They realize that the state of our valuable trees is very much the same as the state of the fish in the Atlantic fishery. Already international lumber corporations, small local logging outfits, native people, nature lovers and the tourist industry are squabbling over the remaining forests.

They see little 12-inch diameter trees being hauled to the mills. The mothers of these little pulp trees were

giants three, six, and 12 feet across. Only one or two generations back, when there weren't so many people on the planet, we cut down most of the ancient trees. There are precious few left on the earth.

So very few people realize that our trees are as valuable to the countries of the world as the oil of Saudi Arabia is to the world. Every day there are many more people on the planet and far fewer trees.

Our ancient growth forests, what used to be "virgin" forests, are as rare in this world as are the herds of endangered elephants of Africa. As large as they seem to be when one walks through the forests, they are but a small dot on the face of the

planet. Where else on the whole earth are there stands of two, four, eight hundred year old stately spruce, cedar or douglas firs?

The Carmanah Valley on the west coast of Vancouver Island is a jewel on a tarnished planet. It adjoins the Pacific Rim National Park and through it the open ocean. It holds in its protective custody the largest remaining spruce tree in the world. That this Carmanah Valley be for the next generation nothing but a tree museum is something to cry over, that it be cut down for boards and pulp might be something well worth fighting for.

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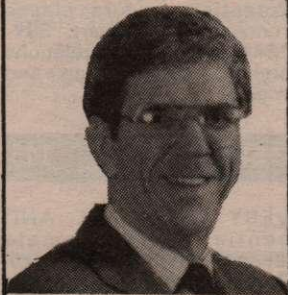
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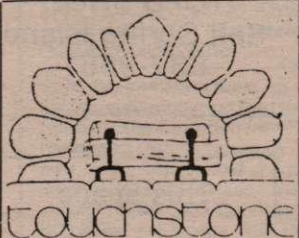

# Chamber meeting addresses three issues of local concern

- The Chamber has been successful in its bid for another job development grant. Four "persons Friday" will be trained by working with Susan Monahan of T.G. Agencies for a 20 week period, beginning February 26.

- In a continued effort to promote public awareness, the Chamber will again sponsor an information meeting. The proposed Art Centre will be addresses at the February 21 meeting, scheduled for 7:30 p.m. at the Harbour House Hotel.

In addition, the bylaw establishes a new policy for "Recreational Parks and Trails" which will allow for a small increase in density in return for significant park or trail dedication. This extra density would not exceed a one lot bonus, unless larger acreage are being dedicated for each five acres donated in the Rural Zone, or 20 acres in the Upland and Forest Zone if the land is acceptable to the Islands Trust and/or the Capital Regional District.

**BYLAW NO. 257**, cited as "Official Community Plan, Salt Spring Island, Amendment Bylaw No. 2, 1990", amends Schedule "A" Policy 1(a) by limiting two family dwellings in areas serviced by community sewer and water systems. In addition, the proposed bylaw allows one single family dwelling or one seasonal cottage to be created on a parcel of land if a parcel of land is 1.2 hectares (3 acres) or more in area. In addition, the policy change with regard to two family dwellings necessitates text changes to Policy 2(a) "Comprehensive Development Areas".

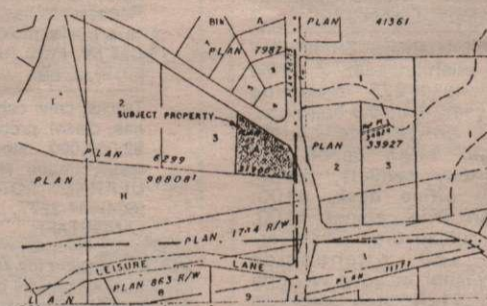
**BYLAW NO. 258**, cited as "Zoning Bylaw, Salt Spring Island, 1985, Amendment Bylaw No. 1, 1990", amends provisions within Sections 4, 5, 6, 7, 8 and 17 by deleting reference to two family dwellings as a permitted use in the Rural, Rural Residential 1, Rural Residential 2, Rural Residential 3 and Upland and Forest zones. Two family dwellings constructed prior to adoption of the proposed bylaw would be considered a permitted use within the above noted zones.

**BYLAW NO. 259**, cited as "Zoning Bylaw, Salt Spring Island, 1985, Amendment Bylaw No. 2, 1990", amends the Agriculture 1 and Agriculture 2 zones by deleting Golf Course use as a permitted use within the zones.

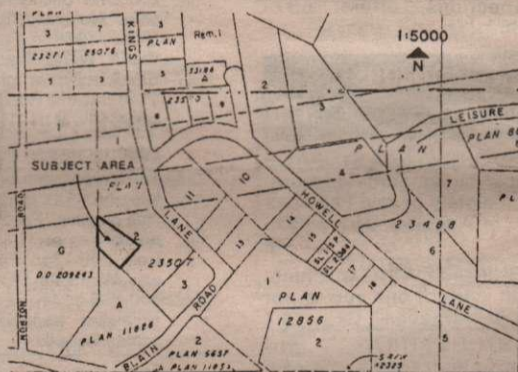

**BYLAW NO. 247**, cited as "Zoning Bylaw, Salt Spring Island, 1985, Amendment Bylaw No. 12, 1989", amends the Rural 1 Zone (R1) and Upland and Forest Zone (UF) by establishing setbacks for dog kennel use and establishes a minimum parcel size of 4 hectares (9.88 acres) for pet boarding facilities and kennel boarding facilities.

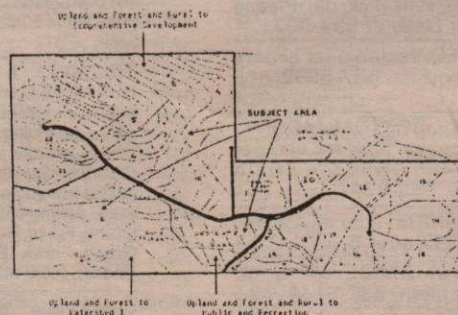
**BYLAW NO. 248**, cited as "Zoning Bylaw, Salt Spring Island, 1985, Amendment Bylaw No. 13, 1989", amends Section 29.B.5 of the Commercial Service Zone by adding a provision that allows a residential use as an accessory use to service commercial uses on parcels of land greater than 6,000 square metres (1.48 acres). **BYLAW NO. 261**, cited as "Zoning Bylaw, Salt Spring Island, 1985, Amendment Bylaw No. 4, 1990", changes the zoning classification on a part of the north west 1/4 of Section 73, South Salt Spring Island, Cowichan District, from Upland and Forest Zone (UF) to Watershed 1 Zone (W1) as shown on the following sketch. In addition, the proposed bylaw establishes a Comprehensive Development 7 Zone (CD7) for the purposes of permitting single family dwelling home occupations, farm use and forestry and logging excluding any processing. ## DOWN THROUGH THE YEARS

### Twenty Five Years Ago

• Ganges is flooded as a result of heavy run-off from snow, high tides and high rain. A front-page story about the situation notes "We are informed by reliable authorities that this run-off water is surfaced with all and sundry kinds of lethal microbes that can cause serious illness."

The run-off is also seen as one of the reasons septic tanks in the village are not effective. Notes the *Driftwood*: "Septic tanks just cannot operate when the soil area around them is already saturated with moisture. . . . The situation goes from bad to critical causing the effluent from septic tanks to back up in the drainage tile and overflow causing serious health hazards."

A sewage system which would alleviate the problem and which was proposed a few years earlier was ruled out because of the \$6 it would cost individual householders.

• The Groundhog is the bearer of bad news, failing to see his shadow when he made his annual appearance on February 2.

• Vandals go on a weekend rampage breaking into three homes, two businesses and two government offices. While the buildings are damaged during the break-ins, nothing is stolen.

• The *Driftwood* is accepted as a "bona fide" newspaper and admitted as the newest member of the Canadian Weekly Newspaper Association.

### Twenty Years Ago

• Planner Henry Schubart tells a planning enquiry in Ganges that the Gulf Islands will be the escape route for the Pacific Coast from the growing urban centres in the United States and Canada.

He suggests that within the next 20 years, the area from California to Vancouver will become a "giant metropolitan area" and that the American government will need to build new cities along the coast to meet the demands of a burgeoning population.

Schubart suggests the Gulf Islands declared a national park.

• The "pay later" plan comes to the islands when the Bank of Commerce announces that it will introduce Chargex to Ganges within the next few weeks.

• A local resident tells a planning enquiry there should be more than one north-south route linking the two ends of the island. Mrs. E. Worthington notes that "should there be an accident, the island is virtually cut in half."

### Fifteen Years Ago

• Island resident Mary Williamson gets some results this week after a year-long battle with the department of human resources to build a day-care centre in Ganges.

The result comes about after Williamson returned a Christmas card to Human Resources Minister Norman Levi addressed to the "Salt Spring Island Day Care Centre."

Notes the *Driftwood*, "Back came a phone call, very quickly. . . I value Christmas cards the irate housewife assured the minister, *But I also value good government.*" Levi promises to look into the matter.

• D.L. Fier, retired school superintendent, is appointed co-ordinator for the analysis of educational needs and methods for the Outer Islands. Fier's role will be to interview parents, pupils and teachers and carry out an assessment of educational needs in terms of attending high school at Ganges, a middle school on one of the Outer Islands or new provisions for special mobile classrooms or other methods of bringing junior high school courses to isolated island communities.

• A request for 10-acre minimum lot sizes in watershed areas by local Mike Larmour receives overwhelming support at a public meeting in Ganges. Larmour, an Island Trust trustee, had been asking for an increase in minimum lot sizes because

While a study into contamination levels has been started by the province, the results of that study are not expected for five years. Larmour suggests that the sale of 10-acre lots would cut the number of homes being built along the shore line in half.

However, Norman Mouat suggests that larger lots could mean that the land will be used by livestock.

### Ten Years Ago

• Islanders are advised to eat chicken with discretion by farmers here who fed their birds grain contaminated with PCBs last summer. A recent government-sponsored test of fat from local chickens showed that the PCB level was below the acceptable U.S. minimum. However, chicken producers are still advising islanders limit the amount of chicken they eat and avoid eating the fat.

The contamination comes about as a result of a PCB spill in the States last year which resulted in contaminated feed being sold to a variety of feed wholesalers, including some on Salt Spring Island.

The concern now is that the way in which the contaminated poultry was tested by Agriculture Canada was inefficient. The fat from birds collected from six farms on the island were tested together rather than individually.

• NDP leader Dave Barrett tells islanders it is time the Liberals and Conservatives stop living common law and tie the knot. Barrett was in Ganges campaigning for Jim Manly, a candidate in the upcoming Cowichan-Malahat-The Islands election.

Among his other election statements, Manly suggests the time has come for equal pay for equal services and that more daycare services should be provided throughout the country.

• A stalled vehicle delays the sailing of the *Queen of the Islands* ferry at Swartz Bay.

While some passengers and crew members had offered to push the car off the ferry at Fulford, the captain following company policy, ordered

that the car be towed off the ship in Swartz Bay. The captain later changed his mind.

### Five Years Ago

• It's announced that the first phase of the Centennial Park redevelopment project will get underway in March and should be finished before the start of Sea Capers this fall. The initial phase of the project will include the building of a boardwalk along Centennial Park and a bandshell.

Funding for the project comes from a Canada Works grant.

• The Gulf Islands School District may lose six teachers as a result of a reduced operating budget. The budget for the year had been set at \$5.1 million of which \$3.8 million

was allocated for salaries. However, the ministry indicated that the board would only receive \$4.9 million which would cover the salaries of 68 teachers instead of the current 74.

• The school board offers its tentative support in the search for a solution to the problem of sewage disposal on Salt Spring. In introducing the motion, school board trustee Ron McQuiggan said he wanted to end the debate among school trustees and the public about the position of the school board on the issue. He said that while the sewer debate went on, the school district was "dumping raw sewage on a beach in Ganges." School board trustees agree to help find a solution so long as that solution met with restrictions set out by the ministry of education.
