Meeting expresses concern over potential tax increase

When organizers of ArtSpring, the proposed arts centre for Salt Spring, explained the concept to the Chamber of Commerce last week, the inevitable question came up.

Islander Claire Nutting posed the question. He explained he had been watching the progress of the organizers "with interest for quite some time." But Nutting, as with many other interested observers, feared the proposal "might go the same way as the swimming pool."

"Is this going to raise my taxes?" he asked, expressing the concern of many people.

Laurie Neish, chairman of the Islands Arts Centre Society, offered an answer. He explained that organizers of the proposal to create an art centre had taken a close look at two such facilities in the American San Juan Islands.

The centre at Friday Harbour, he noted, began on a grand scale and faced a \$4 million capital debt.

The art centre at Orcas, which was used as the model for the Salt Spring proposal, began modestly and worked each year within a modest budget. After four years of operation, that centre was debt free.

It requires no tax support, Neish claimed. He said the Orcas centre grew larger each year, yet remained without a deficit.

Salt Spring businesses fear competition from ArtCraft

Business owners in Ganges view the proposed art centre with scepticism.

ArtCraft, they fear, will become a 12-month operation, cutting into their sales, and no amount of reassurance seems to ease those fears. Art-Craft, the annual show and sale of paintings and crafts from local artists and craftsmen, currently operates during the summer months at Mahon Hall.

Sharon Crouse, of Sharon's on Lower Ganges Road, reiterated concern about an extended ArtCraft at a recent meeting of the Chamber of Commerce. She voiced the opinion that the Windfall Fund grant being sought for ArtSpring, was public money being used to subsidize unfair competition to Ganges businesses.

She expressed opposition to ArtCraft moving into the display area of the proposed art centre and monopolizing it.

Peggy Grim, of Ewes Three on Hereford Avenue, told the meeting the business community of Ganges feels left out of the process of creating ArtSpring.

Group of local women lobby for second female physician

Several local women are hoping to bring another female physician to Salt Spring Island by encouraging the hospital to increase the number of women doctors it has on staff.

One woman involved in the movement, Karen Brown, says there are several reasons why there is only one woman doctor (Dr. Janet MacPhail) on Salt Spring. Firstly, she

says, any new physician coming here — female or male — could not access the facilities at the Lady Minto Hospital.

Brown also says that because MacPhail's patient load prevents her from accepting new clients — except in special circumstances — it feels as if there is no female physician here at all.

In an attempt to persuade the hospital to open its doors to a second woman doctor, Brown and several other women have been asking residents who share their concern to write the hospital board.

The group also plans to meet with board administrators later this spring.

Centre appeals for health worker

The Salt Spring Community Centre is waiting to hear whether its application to bring a mental health worker here has been approved.

Director Barbara Jordan-Knox said the centre applied to the Victoria Health Project last March for funds to hire a mental health worker. At this point, Jordan-Knox understands the request has been forwarded to the regional health advisory committee in Victoria. The community centre itself has heard nothing final.

Jordan-Knox said there is an increasing need for a mental health worker here as the number of clients,

especially those needing acute care, continues to grow.

While the island has a mental health nurse, two community workers and a number of other counsellors doing more specialized work — such as alcohol and drug counselling — there is no one working specifically in the mental health area.

Some Salt Spring clients diagnosed as needing psychiatric help are often turned away from hospitals in Victoria where the diagnosis may not be the same.

The growth in the number of people needing help, Jordan-Knox said, can largely be attributed to growing problems among the island's young. Jordan-Knox said the number of teenagers with emotional problems has grown dramatically in the last few years.

She added that counsellors are now treating previously unseen problems such as severe eating disorders.

One of the frustrations encountered by counsellors and others in the helping professions, Knox said, is providing psychiatric services and having acute-care patients ad-

mitted for help in Victoria.

She said that many times, clients who are diagnosed as needing psychiatric help are turned away from hospitals in Victoria. She added that psychiatrists refuse to come here because they are not compensated for their travel time or travel expenses.

In an attempt to alleviate some of

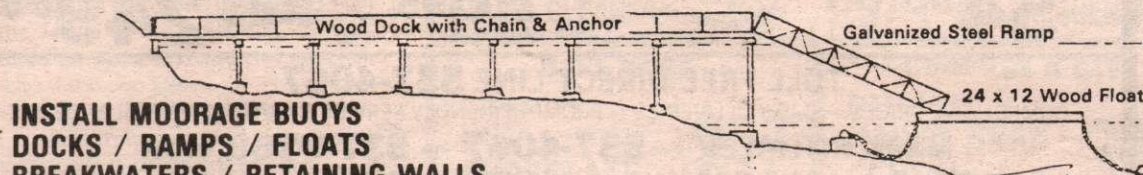

What's in a name?

I'm positive that when I was attending school, a lifetime and more ago, I was taught that one of the kingdoms of Europe was Roumania. In later years the "O" was dropped by some and the "U" was omitted by others. None eliminated both vowels and the rest of us idly watched.

When it came to the late leader of Romania (which I'm told is the official spelling of the European nation's representatives in Canada.) I had difficulty spelling Ceausescu let alone saying it.

One of the highlights of my half-century in this province was Expo 86. One of the highlights of Expo 86 was the appearance in British Columbia of representation of so many countries rarely taking an active part in provincial life.

In 1986 I decided to find out for myself and I walked into the Romanian offering and asked the young lady in attendance how did she pronounce the name of her leader. She didn't know. Hurriedly she explained that she was a Canadian of Romanian origin, but without that language.

When the nation made a sharp change in its philosophy, at Christmas, the name of Ceausescu was on every electronic tongue. The chay sound of the initial letter was easy to line up with Roman. But it is commonly pronounced with an initial "c" pronounced like "CH" in pork chop. The middle consonant, "S" is then pronounced, also as "CH".

Now, Romania is a sovereign state with its own language and the privilege of pronouncing any word or any name just the way it wants to. But if the language originated with the Latin of Rome, how did that middle "S" get pronounced that way?

Maybe some reader knows.

Taking a token gift

Last year I was in Paris and I expect to be there again this year. Free-loading, of course! From the end of 1939 until the summer of 1940 I was stationed in northern France with the Royal Air Force and I was reminded last year by a return to the Marne of the first time I went back.

During the war I met a family in Epernay and when the war was over I kept in touch until, in 1947 I returned. It was a chaotic France in 1947. So much damage sustained during the invasion was still evident. Many coastal roads were temporary and ruined buildings were everywhere to be seen. We wanted to take them a gift and finally we decided to take coffee in token of the fact that France was, like most of Europe, desperately short of coffee.

My good friend Andre looked at the coffee in amazement.

"Do you know how much that is worth?" he asked. Of course I did; I bought it!

That coffee would buy new tires for his car, Andre told me. He listed other items for which he could exchange so much coffee on the black market. But he drank it.

Coffee, which was rivalled in Britain, in those days, by tea, was quite plentiful in the United Kingdom. Elsewhere it was the real currency.

Getting older?

I'm so old I can remember when jokes about getting old were funny. Like the story about the long-time director of the pathology lab at the North Saanich experimental farm, Dr. Bill Newton.

He was absent-minded and he would be chatting with Charlie somewhere. Along came Joe but the phytopathologist couldn't remember Joe's name. He would square it away with the hearty comment, "Of course you know Charlie!" The other two would introduce themselves and all was well.

I find the aging process is worse than Bill Newton's was. I am talking to Charlie and along comes Joe. But can I remember Joe's name? Not on your life! Quickly, while we are still talking, I cast my mind back and it comes to me. Of course, it's Joe! But by this time I've forgotten Charlie's name!

Brown says there are a number of women on Salt Spring who are currently going to Victoria or Vancouver to see female physicians. She says many women, and men, prefer a female doctor.

"It's an emotional thing . . . it's more comfortable talking to a woman, there's a bond there."

A statement released this week by hospital board chairman Peter Vida, however, notes it is unlikely the hospital will bring another female physician on staff.

The releases says eight general practitioners are currently working out of the Lady Minto and a recent review undertaken by the hospital's manpower committee concluded that eight practitioners is enough.

The release noted, "the committee recommended that since the patient/physician ratio on Salt Spring Island (is) considerably more favourable than both the regional and national ratios, the medical needs of the community are being well served with eight active staff G.P.s"

It went on to say that if a vacancy did occur, the committee would review the applications it had on file taking into account the needs of the community and the "desire for another female physician."

The memo concluded, however, there is nothing preventing a female practitioner from starting or taking over a practice on Salt Spring Island.

Brown says, however, that a new physician's inability to use the hospital discourages women doctors from coming here. As Brown notes, patients requiring hospital treatment would have to see one of the hospital's on-staff physicians.

Brown says that so far, the response to the letter-writing campaign has been good. Many people have suggested something should have been done about the situation some time ago.

"The point is there are women here without choice. (Dr. MacPhail) is a wonderful, dedicated person, but there is just more work than what one woman can do."

Proposed centre based on a "very low budget"

The proposal for Salt Spring was based on the same type of "very low budget," he said.

"It's a neat island solution to an island problem," he stated.

Neish went on to say the Island Arts Centre Society had considered asking the Parks and Recreation Commission for a yearly grant of \$3,000. The Community Arts Council was among the few cultural organizations in B.C. which did not ask the provincial government for money, he said.

He stated the arts centre would not involve the use of taxes, other than the possible grant from the parks commission. Later in the meeting, Neish said the arts centre would be owned by the Arts Society and if the centre failed, the taxpayers would not be held responsible for any debt incurred.

The capital budget for Artspring has been estimated at \$1,314,500. Of that amount, acquisition of land costs \$324,500. The construction cost of the building has been set at \$735,000 with the fixtures and equipment costing a further \$185,000.

Project management would cost \$10,000 while professional fees are set at \$60,000.

The land had been appraised at a total of \$329,070 of which the five lots to be subdivided from Mout Park were valued at \$148,500. The two other lots to be acquired through a private sale were valued at \$180,570.

Neish indicated the society is determined to proceed. Of the capital budget, he said, only the fixtures and equipment costs could be cut. This would be achieved if they did not

purchase items such as seats for the theatre.

The price of the park land plus the savings agreed to in the private land deal translates in the funding budget of land value through donations at \$174,500.

The society is seeking GO B.C. funding for a further \$434,000 and has been assured the amount is forthcoming. Federal funding through cultural grants from the department of communications had been set at \$185,000.

The society has learned that applications for grants for 1990 are closed off. It has been encouraged to apply for the allotments for 1991.

The society had also asked for \$200,000 from the Capital Regional District (CRD) Windfall Fund. Salt Spring CRD director Julia Atkins has said she will not release the funding until she is assured of the centre's viability and sufficient wide-spread support for the project.

Neish told the Chamber audience

the society and Atkins are not at loggerheads as some had claimed.

"It's quite a happy relationship," he said.

Bill Curtin, a director of the society, talked finances to the Chamber meeting. He said of the capital budget, "I don't think anyone has any doubt about its accuracy or obtainability."

The remaining portion of the funding budget, \$321,000, is to come through community effort, Curtin explained. The society is close to reach-

ing that amount, Curtin explained, but could not give an estimate of what amount was required to meet the goal.

Curtin went on to explain the financial impact the arts centre would have on Salt Spring. He was careful to stress that money was not the sole reason behind the quest for a centre.

"To substitute the economic value of the arts for their aesthetic value is to deny their true social purpose," he said.

He stated that each dollar spent to showcase the arts spills over into the community — resulting in at least \$1.80 to \$2.50 more being spent on other things.

She also spoke of the perceived competition from ArtCraft.

Laurie Neish, Bill Curtin and April Curtis, three of the directors of the Islands Art Centre Society at the Chamber meeting, explained the concept of ArtSpring.

Curtin said ArtCraft draws people to Salt Spring. "I think the number of people who come here for Artcraft helps the business community," he said. He explained that with approximately \$340,000 being spent directly on ArtCraft, the financial spin-off throughout the community would be close to \$610,000 for total spending of close to \$950,000.

The meeting was told that when ArtCraft began, at least 20 years ago, there were no arts and craft outlets on the island. Eventually one craft store opened for business and currently, 14 stores offer local crafts for sale.

Neish pointed out that ArtCraft was operated each year by a volunteer staff and required many hours of preparation.

"No one in their right mind would keep ArtCraft going for 12 months," he said.

Through his involvement in the Community Arts Council, Neish said, he thought Mahon Hall was the ideal place to stage ArtCraft and that the intention was to keep the affair there for the foreseeable future.

In answer to Grimm's concerns about the business community being left out of the process, Curtin said that the Island Arts Centre Society offered an open invitation to anyone who wanted to join.

"We're trying very hard to include everyone in the community," he said.

Salt Spring Crown Land alternative

Multiple Use land management offers harmonious, ecologically sound option

This past week we all received a flyer in the mail, dealing with the status of Salt Spring Island's parcels of Crown Land. As the Government is studying the disposition of these lands, our input is vital to seeing them kept in public ownership, for access and use by all Islanders.

This information sheet locates and discusses the various pieces of land and gives an overview, but I feel compelled to write on this issue to discuss the virtues of Multiple Use management, and a harmonious approach toward all users having access to all parcels of land, based on sound ecological principles and balanced decision-making.

The virtues and values of all other uses such as recreation in its many forms, watershed protection, water quality preservation (for human and salmonid use), wildlife habitat, public education, environmental studies and tourism cannot be underestimated or ignored for they are all significant uses in a multiple use approach toward planning and management of our Crown Lands.

If you wish to have any input on these issues, and seek to help identify the Islanders' position, then plan to attend the public meeting on Thursday, March 1, at 7:30 p.m. in the Band Room of the Ganges High School.

Just as the land base of Salt Spring Island is a limited resource, so too are

the forests which grow upon it. The Crown Land parcels on the Island presently being studied by CLUC have the potential to substantially increase the amount of land available to the public for a multitude of uses.

These lands have a diversity of stand composition (mix of tree species), lesser vegetation associations (smaller plant groupings), soils, and products, being representative of most of the Island's forests and ecotypes.

At least two of the parcels have an apparent suitability for use as community woodlots and demonstration forests for educational values, while on several others, forest management would comprise a lesser or secondary use. Some parcels should be excluded from logging or harvesting, but not from the sound principles of forest management.

Contrary to the opinions of many, the forest resources of the Island are renewable and can indeed be managed on a long-term harvesting cycle without gross clear-cutting and environmental or aesthetic damage.

The practicalness and possibilities of small-scale and selective logging have already been proven on several forest tracts in our coastal forests. Woodland managers such as Merv Wilkinson have demonstrated the efficiencies and capabilities of this approach toward renewable, sustainable resource management.

By determining reasonable rotation ages (the number of years that it takes to regenerate and grow a tree to mature or harvestable size), a realistic, honest figure can be calculated to yield a safe, constant supply of wood.

We have nothing to fear but our own ignorance and our inability to take a stand on the right side of the issue; we should be the guardians and managers of our own resources.

The roles of foresters and resources managers are to be the stewards of both the land and the forests, ensuring that every piece or unit of land is assigned its highest and best use, enabling such use or uses in perpetuity, without permitting damage to the environment.

Without question, some of the sites must be viewed as protection forests, fragile in their balance, and not harvestable due to the possible risks of damage to soils, indigenous flora and fauna, and water quality. In these untouchable forests, their existing state must be viewed as their highest and best use for their value in providing erosion control, wildlife habitat, recreational values, and environmental improvement (air and water) values.

On the same count, the safe stands where soils and slopes permit, productive forests should be utilized to provide the wood and wood products we all demand in our society.

For two reasons, forest management and controlled harvesting should be considered as a vital component in a multiple use approach toward managing these Crown Land parcels. Rather than constantly criticizing the large-scale system currently responsible for the wholesale clear-cutting, we islanders should demonstrate our convictions and beliefs by our deeds, proving that sustainable, ecologically responsive

forest management and harvesting can be practiced on a small scale to maintain a healthy environment while still providing employment and wood products for our everyday needs.

We as Islanders should make a concerted effort to produce our own products heading toward greater self-sufficiency, and not keep up with our role of abetting and financing less than acceptable logging practices in some distant forests.

The second value in practicing sound forest management with these forests is to demonstrate and educate, offering a model for other private landowners to follow, as well as educating students of the environment, young and old alike. Revenues and royalties generated by proper forest management could be used locally to promote education, silviculture, and encourage proper management on all lands of the Island, both public and private.

It would be unfortunate and naive if we should attempt to exclude forest management and harvesting from our Island's forests, as it has been and continues to be such a vital part of our history and heritage, as well as our economy. Our forests afford us the opportunity to study and understand the greater issues of resource depletion, proper multiple-use management, and the impact of our activities on the environment.

For those of you who feel that this article has little or nothing to do with gardening, you may be partially right, but as a forester, I feel that the trees are part of my garden, and the forest is part of my landscape.

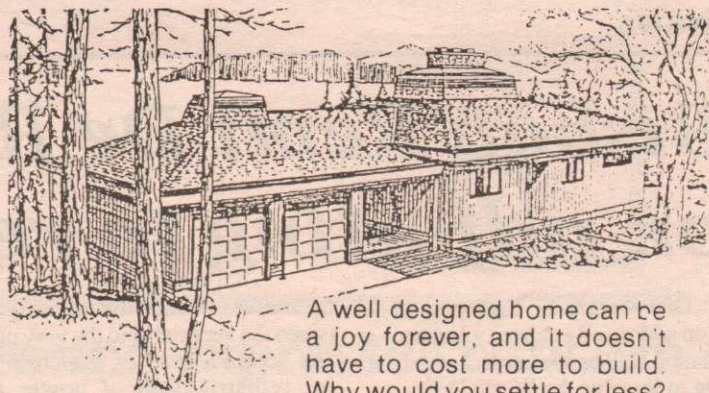

Bishop Remi De Roo speaks on adjusting to resolve debt

On February 15, Bishop Remi De Roo addressed a capacity audience at Mahon Hall on the subject of Adjusting to Resolve the World Debt.

This was the final presentation in a series co-sponsored by Continuing Education and Ten Days for World Development, on the theme Global Debt and the Third World. In previous weeks Professor Anthony Waterman addressed the perspective of economics, Lynn Hunter, M.P., spoke on political realities, and a panel exposed the view from the third world.

Building on the groundwork established in these previous meetings, Bishop De Roo identified a number of basic principles that need to be recognized in working towards equitable solutions.

We cannot expect the whole world to have our set of values; we have to respect that different peoples may have values other than our own, he said. Self reliance must be expected; each country has to be the principal in working out its own solutions. There must be equity among nations, and priority needs to be given to the very poor. In particular, Bishop De Roo decried lack of compassion, and the dehumanization of peoples.

In practical terms he identified responsibilities that need to be accepted by debtor and creditor nations for adjustment to resolve world debt. Debtor nations should seek to achieve greater social justice among

themselves, reduce the disparity between the very rich and the very poor, and accept a level of responsibility for redistribution of power and wealth. Creditor nations, banks, multinationals, and private investors require fulfilment of responsibilities for education for justice, and acceptance that debtors can only be expected to pay back what they can stand and still have basic needs of their poor looked after.

People are not powerless to deal with world crises

Bishop De Roo stated clearly that people are not powerless to deal with world crises, and that real solutions are possible. A critical appraisal is needed of what constitutes real development, in which everyone participates. Governments will have to listen. Ultimately the only lasting solutions will come from the poor.

Typical of Salt Spring audiences, the question period revealed a great depth of understanding of world issues, and led to the development of some specific ideas. A new economic world order is needed. Rather than being developed as a separate entity the United Nations should be the governing body. To be functional it will require strengthening and streamlining, as well as higher ethical standards.

What about the countries of Eastern Europe, who are apparently recognizing the superiority of the western economic order? The global

market economy by which we have been living is a disaster. The market economy that governs Russia, to a great extent China, and other countries that are under communist domination is fundamentally no different.

They have the same banks, the same principles of exploitation. The fundamental difference is that they have state capitalism, and we have individual. But the fundamental economy is the same that governed the Industrial Revolution in Great Britain. If they merely ape the private capitalism of the west instead of state capitalism it is not going to be any better.

Bishop De Roo stated that he is not the expert, nor is there any single expert who can tell us what to do. Solutions will be achieved by being able to test new models in a climate of freedom. Politically we are far ahead. We have the freedom of speech, the freedom to publish, and the freedom to elect.

But economically if these countries do not see the weakness of the global market economy, they will be no better off than we are, and will in fact compound the problem of the world debt crisis.

Although Bishop Remi De Roo's presentation completed the series, (tapes can be made available at cost by phoning 653-4606), enough interest was sparked to hold a follow-up discussion.

A meeting to discuss the points raised throughout this series will be held March 13 at St. George's Church Hall, beginning at 1 p.m.

Logging is opposed

A delegation of five people from Salt Spring Island spent 45 minutes with Claude Richmond, the Minister of Forests, last week urging him to prevent more logging in the Carmanah Valley.

Lynda Laushway, a representative from the Green Island environmental group, said the delegation also requested the ministry do an independent audit of tree license 44 which covers the Carmanah and is held by MacMillan Bloedel.

She said that while the minister was receptive to the suggestion the ministry release the technical information it has on the 6,700 hectare valley, Richmond would not "commit himself to anything."

Environmentalists throughout the province are concerned that more logging in the valley would endanger one of the few remaining Sitka spruce stands left in B.C.

At this point, MacBlo is proposing to log all of the valley except for 538 hectares (or seven per cent) which would be set aside as a reserve area for the spruce.

Laushway said the suggestion from the minister was that "British Columbians would be happy with the decision."

Richmond is expected to release a decision outlining a logging plan for the Carmanah within the next two weeks.

Laushway said in the meantime, that her group is encouraging residents who are concerned about the valley to write or phone their MLA's.

"It's a critical time right now," said Laushway adding that the group just has to "trust and hope he is going to do the right thing."
