Texada proposes Burgoyne project

Proposals to develop property in the Burgoyne Bay area by Salt Spring's single largest landowner will be given the "eagle eye" treatment by the community and the Islands Trust before proceeding.

Salt Spring's Trust committee voted last Tuesday to set up a task force to examine a nine-pronged property development proposal of Texada Logging Ltd.

A Trust staff report on the subject says proposals have been made because "the company believes it must expand its revenue base from its present use, which is log sorting and logging. The company believes that leasing of land is preferable over the option of increased logging activity in the area."

Proposals include establishing a bulk fuel tank operation, a boat repair and marina facility and a boat ramp in Burgoyne Bay.

A campground is also included in the bay area development scheme.

A leased soccer or baseball field is proposed for the start of Burgoyne Bay Road. Construction of a 1,000 - 1,500 square foot "kiosk" style building for lease at the corner of Fulford-Ganges and Burgoyne Bay roads has also been outlined.

Residents oppose proposal

Churchill Road residents have banded together to fight a proposed subsidized housing project that might be located in their neighbourhood.

The Churchill Road and District Residents' Association is opposed to the housing project and in a letter to the B.C. Housing Commission, association members said they will fight the rezoning, and are worried that an expensive sewer connection will bring more development, "changing significantly the rural character of the District."

Association members also feel the site is in a location dangerous for children, and that more suitable, less expensive sites are available. They feel the proposal, which they said was prepared in seven days, "would benefit tremendously from a more thorough investigation of those locations."

Copies of the letter were sent to local MLA Mel Couvelier, the Islands Trust, Capital Regional District director Julia Atkins, the Community Society, the island's Advisory Planning Commission, and the Salt Spring Island Rod and Gun Club.

Gwen Albhouse, secretary for the association, told the Driftwood Tuesday the proposed location for the 24-unit complex would lose its rural character if the development went

Petition seeking preservation of area near Vesuvius Beach

Opposition to docks in Vesuvius Bay has expanded with circulation of a petition for preservation of the area.

Vesuvius Bay resident Phil Swift said well over 200 signatures had been collected by last Friday on a petition asking that the bay be designated by the provincial government "as a natural recreational preserve," which would not allow "the building, installation or use of docks within the Bay area."

The petition was created in response to an application for a lease of Crown land in Vesuvius Bay made by property owner Josette Whist for the purpose of building a private dock.

Whist has since submitted an amended lease application, seeking a smaller area, farther away from the beach.

wide diversity of flora and fauna," the petition states that "installation of private docks will seriously impact and negatively affect all of the above uses and characteristics of Vesuvius Bay."

Swift said bay waterfront landowner Sheila Hoen and a Florida-based lawyer drafted the petition.

It is addressed to lands and parks minister Dave Parker, environment minister Dave Mercier, Graham Bruce as minister of municipal affairs, recreation and culture and to Robin P. Burnside, director-general of the western region of the Canadian Coast Guard.

Swift said signatures included all Vesuvius Bay neighbourhood residents except for three people. The feeling from many he has talked to indicates "that support in opposition to the dock is growing. They are getting more sure in their feelings about the bay

He said dealing with the lands and parks ministry has been "frustrating." Vesuvius residents requested a meeting with Crown lands officials, which was turned down, he said. Swift also said their responses to letters of concern "don't answer our questions."

Margaret Korrison received a reply to an August 6 letter sent to Premier Rita Johnston asking for consideration to residents' concerns but Swift said Johnston only passed the matter over to lands and parks minister Dave Parker.

The Ombudsman's office was also contacted, he explained, but said it will not get involved "until after Lands decides and if it decides in favour of the Whists despite overwhelming public opposition."

Crown lands officer Bill Hubbard, who is on the front lines of dealing with this application, told *Driftwood* an amended application for a foreshore lease had been submitted to his ministry by the Whists.

The new area is smaller, he said, and "further away from the swimming beach." Islands Trust assistant planner Linda Adams said instead of covering 0.06 hectares, the amended proposal asked for occupation of 0.025 hectares. Lease area width was halved to 20 feet and the length decreased from about 150 to 130 feet.

As an "amended" application it would not require a new legal advertisement, said Hubbard.

Adams said the local Trust office recently sent a letter to all people who wrote expressing opposition to the Whists' application and dock proposal. The letter outlines the revised plans and invites a meeting with trustees and staff.

Salt Spring's Trust committee has until September 15 to make its comments to the lands ministry as a referral agency, said trustee Bob Andrew.

Hubbard said he did not know when a decision would be made by the ministry. "It is very definitely still under review and will continue to be for some time," he said. "These things are definitely not pushed through."

In the meantime, Hubbard's office is now processing a second application made by Leroy Jensen for Crown land disposition in Vesuvius Bay.

Lynda Jensen explained that while it is common knowledge the Jensens do not intend to build a dock, applying for a huge foreshore lease indicates what could happen in Vesuvius Bay if the Whist application is accepted.

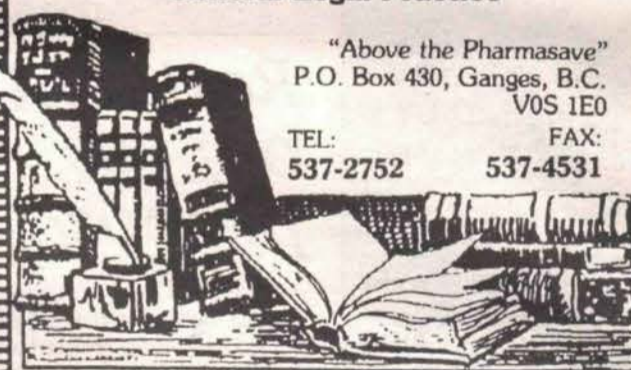

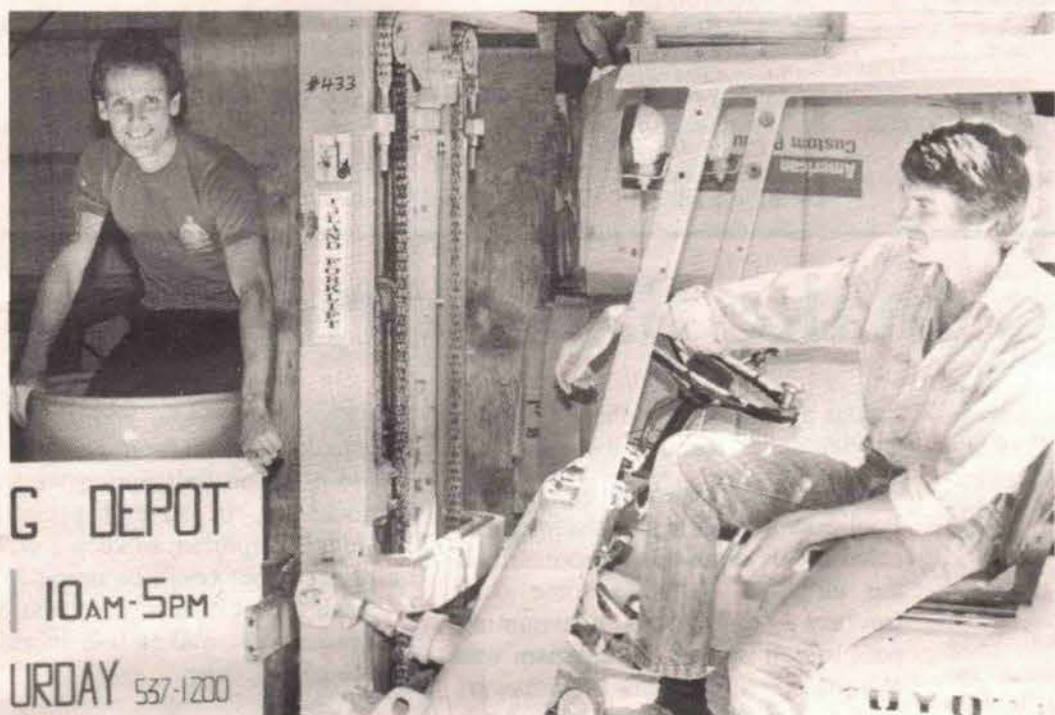

Telephone fraud on the rise

Island residents are being warned not to give out credit card and social insurance numbers over the phone because individuals and companies can use the numbers for fraudulent purposes and to severely overcharge for goods.

Resident Delores Bird told *Driftwood* she was contacted August 26 by a company which said she had won a major prize: to claim her prize, she had to give the caller her credit card number.

In return, a gold pen and pencil set would be sent to her right away and the large prize would be sent later. The price? \$698.

"Some old person is going to think they've really won and give their credit card number over the phone," she said.

Bird said she spoke to the Better

Business Bureau which indicated the company — Chatelaine Business Design of Montreal — is on the edge of being a legitimate business because it sends the pen and pencil.

"They (The BBB) said there's not too much they can do about it now," Bird said.

Corporal Gary Ardiel of the RCMP's commercial crime division said a great deal of this type of telephone solicitation is happening right now in Western Canada. Calls usually come from companies based in Ontario and Quebec.

Ardiel said the caller typically tells the victim he or she has won one of five major prizes. He or she further states that if the individual buys a product he will receive the prize. One prize is worth less than the value of what the victim pays, he said.

"Anything that sounds too good to be true usually is," he said.

A credit card number is usually requested to pay for the goods, and a debit to the victim's VISA or MasterCard usually goes through within hours, he said.

Many victims realize they have been "duped" and are ashamed to identify themselves, Ardiel said.

Another Salt Spring resident said a person, claiming to be a representative of the income tax department, phoned and asked her for her social insurance number and her birth date, according to RCMP Constable Pat Wilkinson.

If someone gets another's social insurance number and date of birth, the options for fraud are wide open, Wilkinson said.

She said some of her neighbours bought property in the area after looking at the Ganges plan, and saw the area was zoned rural. For anyone else the land would not be rezoned, she charged, "but for low-cost housing you can bend the rules."

Association members are also upset about the way the Community Society presented development plans to neighbours. Churchill Road residents were only given three days notice before the meeting in which the proposal was unveiled, Albhouse said.

When residents arrived at the meeting it was a "fait-accompli. The plans were on the wall and the engineering work was done," she said.

Albhouse is concerned about the cost of the project, including the land — "an enormously expensive property for that kind of development" — and the cost of sewers and

water hook-ups to the property, and sidewalks and lighting.

"We're just holding the line paying taxes now."

CRD director Julia Atkins said objections raised by the Churchill Road Association are valid, "but it doesn't matter which piece of land you choose there will be valid objections. Nowhere is perfect."

She said the community society had at least one real estate agent looking for land in the Ganges core and in the sewered area. "This one seemed to have the fewest problems."

Much of the opposition stems from the need to extend the sewer to bring this property into the sewered area, which is "not a big deal," she said.

Expansion of the sewer will have to occur because of growth anyway, she noted, but not because of the community housing project.

Re: EMO

To the Editor,
I read with interest the letter to the editor in the *Driftwood* newspaper of July 3, 1991, concerning the topic of water quality and the electric motors only (EMO) boating regulation.

The primary focus of the letter was that the present EMO boating regulation would serve the community (and the water utility) well as it acts as a "quarantine" that will serve to eliminate the trailered boats most likely to carry Eurasian Milfoil.

I find it unfortunate that the writer is justifying a boating restriction on a fear of milfoil introduction. The elimination of gas powered motors on the lake will not significantly reduce the "threat" of milfoil introductions, as the vast majority of past recreational boaters transported boats on a car or truck top.

Eurasian Milfoil is found in only four locations on Vancouver Island. The ministry is actively pursuing measures to reduce any threat of transporting the weed from these locations. These facts concerning the spread of milfoil to St. Mary Lake do not, in my opinion, justify a banning of power boats.

The fisheries program of the Ministry of Environment has participated with the North Salt Spring Waterworks District in an aeration program to rehabilitate water quality in the lake. The system, built and maintained with the proceeds of Habitat Conservation monies, is a strong commitment to water consumers and other water users (recreation sport fishermen, swimmers, and boaters).

We are very concerned that the EMO regulation discriminates against certain recreational users from participating in an activity which will have no measurable impacts on water quality. The elimination of power boats could severely reduce the recreational sport fishery during the fall/winter/spring periods, as this lake is prone to strong winds.

The fisheries program of the ministry has long been on record that a compromise to the issue is a 10-horsepower limit.

More on EMO

To the Editor,

In reply to Peter Law's letter of August 19, the North Salt Spring Waterworks District is aware there are a number of facts that suggest we should be concerned about the introduction of Eurasian Milfoil to our lakes.

Government has not been notably successful in preventing the spread of milfoil. It occurs widely in the United States, and in Canada, in Quebec, Ontario and British Columbia. Closer to home, milfoil infests an area on Pender Island and is found near Duncan and Nanaimo.

The Ministry of Environment has said milfoil spread in British Columbia has been mainly through transportation on boating equipment. The 1978 Ministry of Environment survey of Okanagan Valley boat launch ramps found that 24 per cent of boaters leaving infested areas were carrying Eurasian Milfoil (mostly on boat trailers).

The EMO on St. Mary Lake serves to greatly reduce the use of larger, trailered boats which pose the greatest risk of carrying milfoil fragments (on the trailer and in the bilge). Small cartop boats are not so likely to be a problem.

Milfoil has proven almost impossible to eradicate, once established, so prevention of its spread to our island lakes is very important.

The expert advice that I have received is that milfoil would certainly add to our water quality problems if it became established in St. Mary Lake.

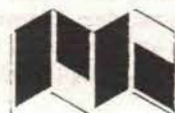

VICTORIA — For God's sake, Madam Premier, call the election. This is no way to run a province.

First you thought that hanging on to your predecessor for dear life might save your party and your government. Eventually, you thought, the tide would turn in Bill Vander Zalm's favour, and the voters would forgive and forget. After all, they've forgiven and forgotten so many times before.

But it didn't work this time. The public neither forgot nor forgave, and Vander Zalm was forced out of office. He left behind a government in disarray and a party in tatters.

I asked you some months back whether becoming premier was worth the sacrifice of a friendship, and you wouldn't answer. I could have told you at the time that nothing is worth sacrificing a friendship for, not even the footnote in the history books you will have earned.

A party in its death throes

But here you were, premier for better or worse. So far it was for worse. The session of the legislature that followed your selection as premier by your caucus didn't do much to enhance your image, and I wasn't surprised. You had become leader of a party that was in its death throes, and all the image-makers and spin doctors in the world couldn't change that.

But you still had a card left, and as the good poker player you are, you were determined to make the best of it. Surely, your confirmation as leader at the convention would turn things around. So you thought, but it didn't work that way, did it?

The hatchet job Mel Couvelier did on your rival, Grace McCarthy, also did you in. Again, you had achieved your objective at too great a price. Instead of launching the party on a path of renewal and unity, the convention turned out to make short shrift of what little there was left of it.

Why didn't you get better advisers?

But if you thought the downhill slide was over, you were in for a rude awakening. What puzzles me is why you didn't get better advisers. You knew that many of your predecessor's problems stemmed from bad advice, as well as his unwillingness or inability to accept good advice. You had a chance to solicit good advice. Instead you listened to people like Elwood Veitch. He couldn't wait to sell you on that train caper.

You should have told Veitch to take a hike. Instead you took the train, ostensibly to "bring government to the people" of the Interior. What a laugh.

Did you really think you could gain political mileage from that train journey? Well, you found out very quickly that it was not one of the more brilliant schemes, but what's done is done.

Ah, yes, your trip to Quebec. Wasn't that a bit of a disaster, but for this one, too, you've only got yourself to blame. What on earth were you thinking when you said that British Columbians needed some educating about Quebec?

Didn't it occur to you that the life-support system of the average Socred runs on anti-Quebec posturing? To tell them they need to be educated about Quebec is like telling a bull to ignore a red cloth.

Last chance to make an impression

And here you are, back from the premiers' conference which was your last chance to make an impression on the electorate. You didn't, did you?

You squandered the few opportunities you had to convince people that you're really concerned about their grievances. Instead of meeting with a couple of bus-loads of seniors who braved the rain and wind outside the swanky Whistler hotel, you waxed wise, if not eloquent, about the injustices Ottawa keeps inflicting on the provinces.

These people knew all about injustices. They were troubled by federal cuts in transfer payments to the provinces. They feared that the health care system would be affected by it.

Your excuse that you couldn't come out because you had to run a meeting didn't wash with the seniors, and frankly, it doesn't with me either. What would it have cost you to go out and talk to them? Five minutes of your time? Ontario's Bob Rae found time, didn't he?

To sum it up, things keep getting worse, not better, don't they? So, what are you waiting for? Your mandate to govern is somewhere between thin and non-existent, and any further delay can only be interpreted as a rather pathetic attempt to stay in power for as long as possible.

Like I said, at the outset, Madam Premier, do us all a favour and call the election.

"Wealthy"

I'm writing regarding the comment in your paper about having to be "wealthy" in the future in order to live on Salt Spring Island.

I hate to be stigmatized for having worked hard all my life and having been forced to make the extreme effort to get a roof over my head while paying up to two and one-half month's take-home pay (on 400 hours of hard work) for property taxes, which didn't leave much to pay for mortgage, food and clothing etc.

Most of us Canadians over 60 years old could not afford to rent a self-contained dwelling, only shared accommodation and since our social demands required to make provision for ourselves and families, we had to forfeit all personal freedoms. All one's energies and efforts had to go into buying a home, and otherwise live very, very frugally not having the smallest luxury and mostly having only two weeks holiday a year.

If one finally ends up with a bit of security (if all debts can be paid off) and can hang onto one modest home in spite of property taxes, when the home is in a nice area, I would hate to so be labelled "wealthy" — the word having a derogatory ring in its usual mysterious meaning.

But maybe, hopefully, the real meaning of "wealthy" should be people working all their lives, while raising a family and being gracious, cheerful, generous and tolerant and even when older still putting all their efforts into improving lives for others as well, as I find all people I know on Salt Spring Island.

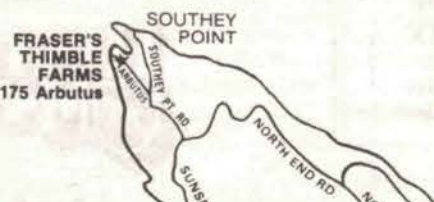

School portables still en route

Classroom space will be tight for "a few weeks"

Classroom space on Salt Spring will be at a premium for the first few weeks of September, as two portable classrooms missed their planned arrival date.

School district secretary-treasurer Ken Starling gave trustees an update on the anticipated space squeeze at last Wednesday's board meeting.

Trustee David Eyles was concerned to learn the portables would not be here in time for school opening on September 3 and asked Starling to explain why this was the case.

"It seems that right now things will be chaotic because the space isn't there," said Eyles. He wondered why the portables were not ordered earlier and asked "what can we do to make sure this doesn't happen again?"

Starling said he was presently creating a "facilities profile" which would assist in planning for the future.

He said the portables were ordered as soon as funding was assured

on July 9. "The company promised delivery before the end of August and did not live up to that commitment," he said.

Two new portables are scheduled to come off the "assembly line" on September 5 or 6 and be delivered within a few weeks, said Starling.

The district received education ministry funding specifically for one new portable to service Gulf Islands Secondary School. A second new portable for Fernwood Elementary School will be funded from the district's capital budget, said buildings and grounds committee chairman Charles Bazzard.

Bazzard added that an existing portable at Salt Spring Elementary could be transferred to Fernwood, depending on actual enrolment at both schools this week.

GISS space will also be in flux, explained Starling, although the United and Catholic Church halls and agricultural barn could be used, he said.

Bazzard said Mahon Hall is not expected to be ready for classroom use for about two weeks. It is currently being modified to accommodate two classrooms.

District superintendent Mike Marshall put the space problem into a provincial context.

"The space concerns we are feeling are not particular to the Gulf Islands," he said. Other districts "are trying to do the same thing we are trying to do," he noted, and have to order new portables at the last minute because of funding uncertainty.

Marshall suggested the district might "overcompensate for that in the future, and take some gambles and hopefully have them (portables) where we need them."

Trustee Allisen Lambert said even the best of long-range planning could not ensure no problems would arise and "it is going to require a bit of understanding on the part of everybody for the first few weeks."

High school plans complete

Plans for the new Gulf Islands Secondary School have been completed and are poised for shipment to the Ministry of Education, school trustees learned last week.

Buildings and grounds committee chairman Charles Bazzard reported that plans called for an 8,279 square metre school designed to accommodate up to 750 students.

Final space was reduced in size from the 9,115 square metres submitted earlier in the planning process; larger floor space and its extra costs were put aside at a later date.

Bazzard said refined input came from June meetings with GISS teachers, which trustee Allisen Lambert and GISS principal Eric McMahon pulled together in July.

The new school will include a cafeteria, he confirmed, and at least a 900 square metre gymnasium area.

Whether or not the gym could be made larger with community funding was discussed at the meeting. Bazzard said funding approval for a larger gymnasium would have to come through a referendum initiated by the Parks and Recreation Commission.

In order to accommodate the possibility of the gym size being increased at a later date, trustees passed a motion directing architects Marshall Garyali to design the high school gym so it can be added to in future.

Lambert commended architect Shiv Garyali for creating an "integrated environment" and sense of a

"community school" with input-gathering classed as a priority.

"There are actually four distinct flow areas and it looks more like a community site than a school," explained Lambert.

Bazzard said one of the steering committee's primary aims — to make the school fit 600 students now and up to 750 in future — was achieved in the plans. This flexibility means "it could be totally reorganized inside in the future," he explained.

Lambert agreed that being able to get education ministry funding for a 750-student capacity school was an accomplishment.

"The thrust of this is we are really pleased to have received funding for 750 students," she told *Driftwood*.

Fire chief issues safety reminder

This is the time of year people start lighting up their stoves and Salt Spring fire chief Les Wagg says chimneys and stoves should be cleaned prior to use.

He also urges people to have their oil furnaces and stoves checked and says it is a good time to clean out basements, attics and all those hidden areas.

Anything that will burn should be thrown out, he said, such as rubbish, boxes, paper, and rags.

Two island men rescue grounded marina boats

Two Salt Spring men helped "save the day" when they rescued two sailboats untied and left to drift from Fulford Marina last week.

Ganges RCMP are investigating the incident in which culprits untied five boats at the marina sometime between 11 p.m. August 27 and 7 a.m. August 28.

Three of the five boats drifted from the area. A 16-foot run-about rental boat eventually ran aground on the beach across the street from the Fulford Inn. Two sailboats, between 40- and 45-feet in length, ran

aground in the vicinity of the stone church in Fulford Harbour.

Fraya from Port Alberni and *Wild Spirit* from San Francisco were rescued by islanders Al Davidson and Gene Drzymala.

Police said *Fraya* could not be dislodged from the tidal flat and the men used planks to support the vessel and prevent it from tipping over when the tide ebbed.

Police were unable to provide an estimate of damage sustained by the vessels. They are continuing their investigation into the matter.

A golf course, driving range, practice green and service amenities for the Lee's Hill area is also proposed.

Improvements to Burgoyne Bay Road form part of the plan, with Texada Logging offering dedication of a public right of way. The company hopes the highways ministry will handle road work.

A Trust staff report confirms the road would require upgrading if the company's developments proceed and notes "road alignment and constructed width will be an issue, as there are environmentally sensitive areas along the route, as well as potential conflicts with existing residential and farm structures."

The report concludes that due to the magnitude of the Texada Logging proposals, "the question of future land use and compatibility of uses in the Burgoyne Bay area needs to be addressed in greater detail with more public input before any serious consideration is given to any rezoning applications."

In addition to establishing a task force to examine the entire development proposal, trustees moved to not accept the Lee's Hill golf course application, after some discussion.

Trustee Bob Andrew agreed with staff recommendations that the committee not accept any proposals for golf courses until it has adopted the golf course policy now in progress.

Trustee John Stepaniuk did not think one of the proposals should be singled out as all "should really have a thorough review before we accept or reject any."

"I am not a golfer but I feel people who enjoy this activity should have access to this activity," he added.

Andrew stressed that Texada's proposed course was not the only one before the committee and that none should be considered until the planned policies were completed.

Stepaniuk said in general "there are some good positive steps in the Burgoyne Bay proposals and some we would not be so happy with."

Update for the Galiano Island Solid Waste Referendum to be held October 19, 1991

CAPITAL REGIONAL DISTRICT

The following summary of the text of Bylaw No. 1953, cited as "Food Handler Bylaw No. 1, 1991", is hereby published as at third reading and prior to submission to the Minister of Health.

A BYLAW TO REGULATE THE OPERATION OF FOOD SERVICE ESTABLISHMENTS

WHEREAS pursuant to Division XI of the Letters Patent the Board can exercise the powers conferred upon the Council of a Municipality by Section 692 of the *Municipal Act*;

AND WHEREAS the Board has deemed it expedient and in the public interest to require food service establishments to ensure that at least one supervisor at the establishment has successfully completed the Provincial Food Safe program;

NOW, THEREFORE, the board of the Capital Regional District in open meeting assembled **HEREBY ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:**

DEFINITIONS

1. For the purposes of this Bylaw, unless the context otherwise requires:

- (a) 'Food Safe Training and Certificate Program' means the Provincial Food Safe program;
- (b) 'Food Service Establishment' means
 - (i) those food premises, permanent or temporary, fixed or moveable, in which food is prepared or similarly made ready for eating, or
 - (ii) any eating or drinking establishment where draught drink or prepared food is served to the public;

Including any restaurant, coffee shop, cafeteria, short-order cafe, luncheonette, grill, tea room, sandwich shop, soda fountain, bar, tavern, pub, beer parlour, cocktail lounge, dining room, night club, catering kitchen, industrial feeding establishment, commissary, concession or other similar place.

2. No person, being the operator of a food service establishment, shall permit the handling and preparation of food unless there is at least one supervisor on duty in the food preparation area, during the times when the food service establishment is operating, who has obtained a certificate indicating successful completion of the Food Safe Training and Certificate Program.

3. The on-duty supervisor shall post their Food Safe Training Certificate in a prominent place in the food service establishment to which it relates.

4. This Bylaw shall take effect on April 30, 1992.

5. Any person who violates any of the provisions of this Bylaw shall, upon summary conviction thereof, be liable to a penalty of not more than **TWO THOUSAND (\$2,000.00) DOLLARS.**

PRC votes for appointment of Sports Society chairman

Parks and Recreation Commission members passed a motion Thursday night recommending the Capital Regional District director appoint the chairman of the Salt Spring Sports Society to the PRC.

Society chairman Malcolm Legg told the *Driftwood* Friday he would be willing to sit on the commission. He said he would use his position to influence decisions regarding recreational land use.

The society will "not actually spend money but recommend the PRC upgrade facilities, and (advise on) how to get better usage and a better return from them as well," said Legg. "In essence, they are looking at us for direction."

"The decisions are made by the recreation commission. They will try to fit our recommendations within the framework of their budget."

CRD director Julia Atkins said she supports appointment of the

society chairman on the commission because he represents people concerned and involved with Salt Spring recreation.

"This is listening to the voice of the people."

The society is a newly formed group composed of volunteers representing various sports groups on Salt Spring. The group is focusing on identifying future priorities for island recreation, said Legg.

"We asked groups to come up with a wish list for the next one, three, five, and 10 years, for facilities needed on island," he said. However, because the society formed at the beginning of August, 1991, it has not formulated a direction yet.

He said most of Salt Spring's sports and recreation groups have been contacted by the society, and "I'm expecting groups to put in time and effort to help direct us to what they need."

Society members also want to improve maintenance of facilities in regards to irrigation, aeration, fertilization, and cutting. Legg cited Portlock Park as an area where

repairs to the facilities are "money down the drain" because a proper maintenance program was not followed.

"We feel as a group there has been a lot of money wasted over the years," he said.

By bringing many sports groups into one organization, the society hopes the chances of getting government funding for island recreation projects will improve.

The theory is that one organization, such as baseball, applying for funding will be less likely to receive funding than if the application was made by baseball, soccer, tennis, and other sports groups, said Legg.

A lot of people in different sport groups are dissatisfied with the way recreation facilities on Salt Spring have been run, said Legg, and the society is considered an organized way of expressing grievances and solutions to the PRC.

"We're taking a bunch of different groups to be cohesive and we know that will take time and there is no guarantee it will work," he said. "So far, it has been positive."

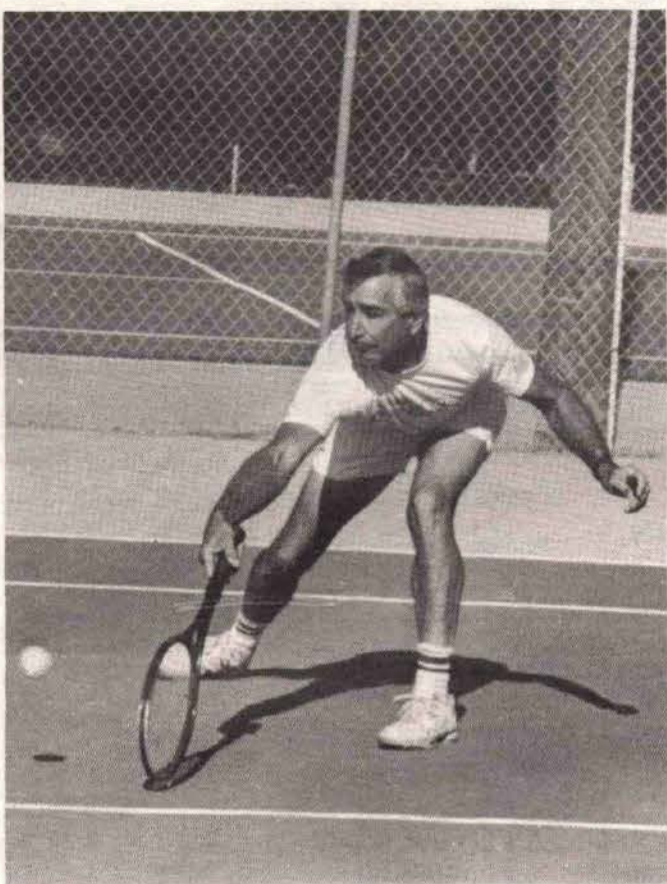

Choices makes request

Clients of Choices — a business that helps mentally disabled people move from institutional to community life — want to participate in sports at the same time and place as able people.

Choice representative Val Aloian brought that message to the Parks and Recreation Commission at an August 29 meeting.

She said the mentally disabled have not had that kind of opportunity in the past, and such an arrangement would make them feel good.

"They don't want special activities, at special locations, at special times," she said.

PRC chairman Kellie Booth said that in places like Victoria, where four courts can be used at once to accommodate all skill levels, it is possible to have people of different skill levels competing at the same time.

However, on Salt Spring, "We just don't have that kind of space here in one place."

Aloian said mentally disabled people cannot participate to a high, intense skill level, which restricts them in playing certain sports. However, rules, balls and boundaries can be adapted to improve a disabled person's ability to compete.

Also, clubs such as the Trail and Nature Club, which have walks for seniors, can include the mentally disabled.

Like able people, the mentally disabled have different preferences in recreation, and she urged commission members to ask disabled people what their preferences are.

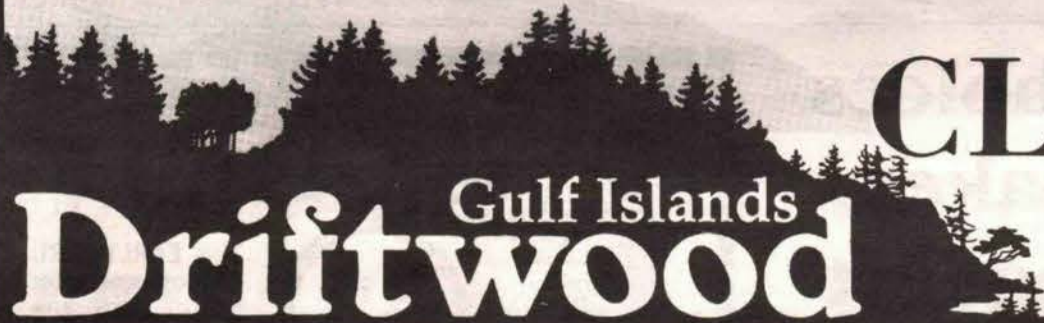

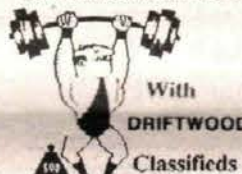

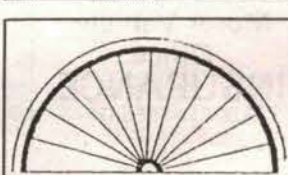

And sometimes I can't — put up with it, I mean. When that happens, I have a failsafe cure. I reach for my Fractured English file.

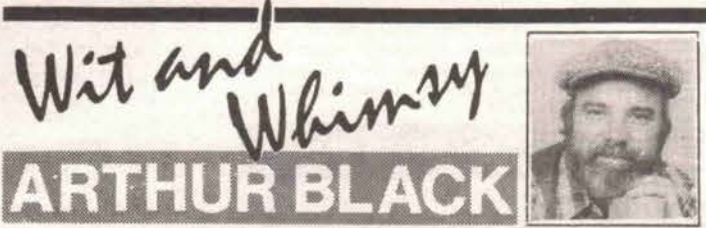

DOWN THE YEARS

Thirty Years Ago

A simple but dramatic ceremony September 1 would see the assumption of service of the Gulf Island Ferry Ltd. by the British Columbia Toll Authority Ferry System.

The brief ceremony was scheduled for Premier W.A.C. Bennett to receive the vessel *Motor Princess* from Gavin C. Mouat, president of the company. In exchange, he would hand over a cheque in full payment for the company's three ferries.

The Salt Spring Island Chamber of Commerce wrote Dr. A.N. Beattie, director of the government health unit in this area, requesting information concerning the "swimmers' itch" in St. Mary Lake.

In answer, Beattie wrote that the rash sometimes seen on swimmers results from penetration of the human skin by larval forms of the blood flukes of birds.

These larvae develop in and emerge from freshwater snails. The small parasite is barely visible to the naked eye. When it leaves, the snail is looking for waterfowl, but finds the swimmer instead.

The itch may be avoided by rubbing oneself vigorously when coming out of the water, to prevent penetration.

Twenty-Five Years Ago

The Galiano Community Hall was packed to the doors when the Galiano Club held its first auction of the year to aid the purchase of new recreational equipment for the winter months.

Over \$300 was raised from the sale, including a \$50 bid for the purchase of a purebred Rhodesian Ridgeback puppy donated by the John Rees family.

Eddie Bambrick and Tommy Carolan were auctioneers, keeping the crowd in a hilarious mood as the items were knocked down.

Twenty Years Ago

Final government approval was given to construction of a new wing at Lady Minto Hospital. The \$285,543 contract was awarded to Farmer Construction.

The project had been pared down in order to bring it within the figure allowed by the B.C. Hospital Insurance Service.

The Salt Spring Island library was repleved. Notice was given by the Library Development Commission of Victoria that until that time Salt Spring either became a municipality or was offered an opportunity to join a larger library system, the annual matching grant would be continued.

The Saturna Free School changed principals, with W. Sheffield taking over from Tom Durrie. Durrie, Lynn Curtis, and Judy Pruss all left the school.

Fifteen Years Ago

Lady Minto Hospital was making good use of an exercise bicycle donated by Branch 92 of the Royal Canadian Legion.

The therapy bike, which cost \$287, was presented to the physiotherapy unit of the hospital. It was to be used by patients for general fitness purposes as well as to strengthen back or leg muscles of those who had suffered such injuries.

Gulf Island residents complained about paying 87.7 cents for a gallon of gasoline. Gas prices on Vancouver Island were 79.7 cents a gallon. Local dealers justified the price difference by noting that distance and a small market add at least seven cents per gallon to the cost of transporting fuel to the island.

Ten Years Ago

RCMP investigated at least one obscene letter which was received by a Salt Spring Island resident. The anonymous writer, who professed to be in favour of the Ganges sewer plant, warned of bloodshed and violence should opposition to the sewer continue.

The recipient of the letter was a member of the Sewer Alternative Committee.

Ganges RCMP indicated no charges would be laid in connection

with the theft and subsequent damage to an outhouse stolen at Ganges.

The outhouse, which was on a trailer and set up in Centennial Park, was being used to protest the Ganges Sewer Project. Police said some local youths removed the outhouse and trailer, but later replaced the trailer at the park.

Five Years Ago

Steve Harris, holidaying on South Pender, suffered second degree burns to his forearms from flames that blew up when he lit a gasoline fire to extinguish a wasp nest.

Harris' wife, Barbara, contacted the fire warden when Harris realized

he could not fight the blaze alone. Fire warden Russ Pomahac said the flames were about one and one-half feet high in the dry, grassy area, and that in a matter of minutes, Harris could have been faced with a serious fire and inadequate equipment to

combat flames in a wooded thicket. "Five minutes more and it would have been game over," Pomahac said.

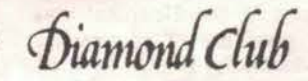
